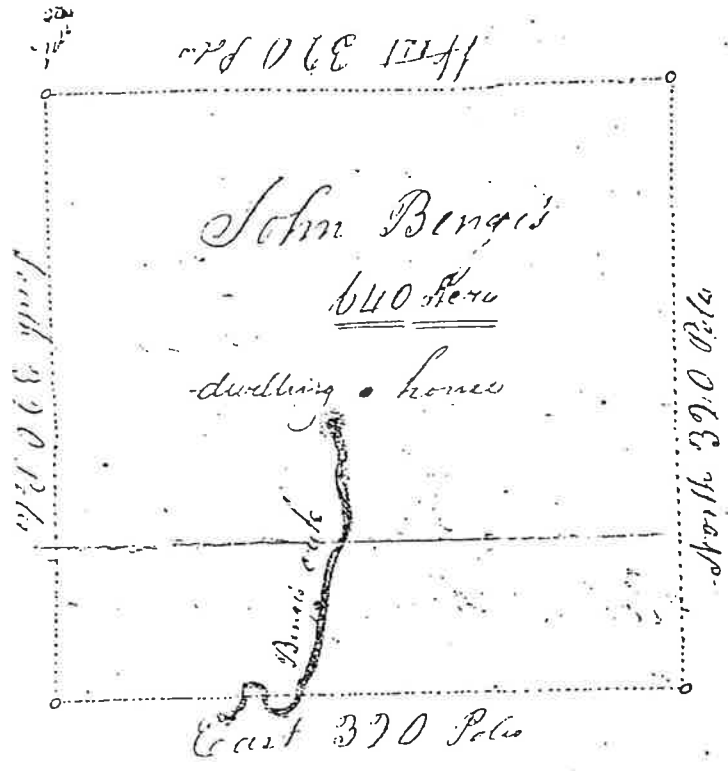

State of Tennessee.

The undersigned Commissioner and Surveyor (duly-authorized) have agreeably to the terms of the late Cherokee Treaty concluded at the city of Washington on the twenty-seventh day of February one thousand eight hundred and nineteen; surveyed and laid off to John Benge six hundred and forty acres of land on the North side of Tennessee River. Beginning at a small hickory the North west corner of said John's survey; thence South three hundred and twenty poles to a black oak and post oak sapling; thence East three hundred and twenty poles to

a post oak (erecting the central ninety four, one hundred  
and three and at one hundred and twenty poles) thence  
North three hundred and twenty poles to a post oak; thence  
West three hundred and twenty poles to the beginning;  
including his improvement as near the center as possible.

Surveyed the 14<sup>th</sup> day of February 1828.
