NEW BRUNSWICK PARKING AUTHORITY RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PURCHASE CONTRACTS WITH CERTAIN APPROVED COOPERATIVE PRICING SYSTEMS

Whereas, the New Brunswick Parking Authority is a party to a cooperative purchasing agreement with various cooperative pricing councils, a cooperative purchasing program organized pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 11-10 and N.J.A.C. 5:34-7.11; and

Whereas, Local Public Contract Law authorizes a municipality to purchase goods and services through duly-formed cooperative purchasing systems without advertising for bids; and

Whereas, the procurement of goods and services through a cooperative purchasing program is considered to be an open and fair process under the New Jersey Pay-To-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq.; and

Whereas, the New Brunswick Parking Authority has a need to purchase, on a timely basis, goods or services utilizing cooperative purchasing agreements with the following cooperative pricing councils during the year 2022:

Education Services Commission of NJ (ESCNJ) NJ Parking Co-op (NJPC) Somerset County Co-op (2SOCCP) Sourcewell Co-op New Jersey State contract (NJ Start)

Whereas, the New Brunswick Parking Authority plans to utilize the cooperative purchasing program with the above listed cooperative pricing councils and such transactions shall be subject to all conditions applicable to the current cooperative pricing agreement.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, by the Board of the New Brunswick Parking Authority, that the Qualified Purchasing Agent is hereby authorized to purchase goods and services in 2022 utilizing the cooperative purchasing program with the above listed cooperative pricing councils, pursuant to all conditions of the individual cooperative purchasing agreement; and

Be It Further Resolved, that pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-5.5(b), prior to placing any order for goods or services in accordance with this resolution, the Chief Financial Officer shall execute a certificate of available funds, which shall either certify the full maximum amount against the budget at the time the contract is awarded, or no contract amount shall be chargeable or certified until such time as the goods or services are ordered or otherwise called for prior to placing the order, and a certification of availability of funds is made by the Chief Financial Officer and attached to the purchase order or similar document.
