





breath, loses his prana through exhalation. A yogi can attain unsplit

breath only through sadhana.

Because of these reasons, the products obtained from cows are also

considered sacred.

During abhishekam, milk is poured over the deities, thereby these

idols are protected from the heat of agni mandala. To keep the idols in a cool state, the abhishekam ritual is also done with tender coconut water, turmeric powder and sandalwood paste.

Milk, curds, ghee have a great amount of oxygen in them, and idols do absorb Prana from this.

Cow dung is burnt to make sacred ash. When this sacred ash or Vibhuti is adorned on the forehead, which is also called Pranava Peetam, it is protected from ultraviolet rays. Sacred marks of Vibhuti at specific points in our body are said to control wastage of prana shakti through the hair follicles.

The prana shakti can now be used to control the mind through deep contemplation.

Our Gross body needs food. Food nurtures and protects the body. The devas reside in a subtle body and derive their food through the Havis offered in the yaga or homa.

When ghee is offered in the homa fire, it becomes prana shakti and food for gods.The celestials protect mankind from various calamities.

Nala reunited with his wife in the fourth year after losing his kingdom,


