At some point in time, now what? The lady just woke up from *dhyan* and looked at the side to see the one with three eyes still in *dhyan*. She was wondering what is He meditating on. She looked into His 3rd eye and somehow felt that He is not in His regular meditative state. Normally, Shiva's meditation would be deep and unmoving.

She realised that Her chest was rising and falling much faster than usual, this would normally happen when someone is in trouble. Someone was calling Her. Though She has thousands of names, this time it was not one of those, this name was more sweeter to Her than Her other names (which are also honeylike).

She sensed that this is from planet Earth. This call is from the same boy who also got the milk of wisdom from Her. Though She is Unnamulaiyal/Abithakujambal, She blessed this child before. This time also, the call was with a crying tone. Amma...Amma... She was wondering with Her protection around, nothing can happen to that boy and why is he crying now.

She looked into his head to see what he is seeing. She realized that the child is seeing the place where he stands as Shivalogam and also, everything around him looked like Shivalingams. So many tiny lingams spread across everywhere, that the child didn't have a place to put his feet on. For he didn't like to step on the Shivalingam. She realized who is doing the mischief. By this time, She walked past Shiva and without turning to look at Him, She knew that there would be that familiar playful smile on His lips.

She crossed Thiruvengadu and left the child Sambandar in the border. There is still a statue of the Goddess in the temple, called Pillai Idukki Amman.

Demystifying Science...

All of us have, at some point in our growing years, been exposed to stories of avatars of Gods and Goddesses. In the famous Dasha Avatars of Lord Vishnu, He reincarnates in different forms - from a fish, a turtle, a boar, a half-man half-lion, to the final stage of a human. Basically these avatars have actually depicted the evolution of life on this Earth! Let us begin with Matsya Avatar. Matsya avatar portrays the beginning of life forms on Earth, which started in water. Koorma Avatar - the turtle, depicts the adaptation of life in both land and water. The advent of the mammal stage - Varaha, illustrates the advancement of life forms into the next phase, not only in terms of habitat, but also the progression from egg-laying creatures to mammals. Narasimha Avatar - the half man half lion, beautifully describes the transition from animal to man.



The subsequent avatars show how man himself has evolved from the small statured Vamana, to the more developed Parashurama, followed by the perfect man in Lord Rama, progressing through to the intellectually enlightened Lord Krishna, and the yet to come Kalki Avatar. This clearly elucidates how we have come a long way, not just in terms of the physically and structurally visible aspect of evolution, but also how the mind has progressed over the ages. Through the Dasha Avatars, our scriptures silently explain the evolution of man to his intellectually advanced form that exists today. Indeed, science strongly supports our legendary stories, and we should be proud of them!

- 5. In the year 1909, I suffered from a serious health complication, but my family could not afford the surgery to remedy it. Finally, a doctor volunteered to do it for free.
- 6. In early 1912, I managed to a get a temporary job at the Madras Accountant General's office, with a salary of 20 rupees per month.
- 7. I travelled to England in the year 1914.
- 8. I collaborated with G.H. Hardy an English mathematician at Cambridge.
- 9. I was awarded a Bachelor of Science degree by Research for my work on 'Highly Composite Number'.
- 10. My mentor and colleague Hardy once exclaimed about me "He can only be compared with Euler or Jacobi".
- 11. I always credited my acumen to the blessings of my family Goddess, Mahalakshmi of Namakkal.
- 12. At the age of 31, I became a Fellow of the Royal Society one of the youngest in its history.
- 13. Plagued with health problems and alien weather conditions, I returned to India in 1919.
- 14. During my short lifetime (untimely death at the age of 32), I compiled nearly 3900 results (mostly identities and equations).
- 15. The number 1729 was associated with one of my famous anecdotes.
- 16. My birthday is celebrated as National Mathematics Day in India.
- 17. Recently, a biopic titled "The Man Who Knew Infinity" was released.

Srinivasa Ramanujan

was a mathematical genius from South India, who did some exemplary work in the field of Number Theory, Infinite Series and Continued Fractions. Ironically, he had no formal training in pure Mathematics. He braved so many health hardships and economic adversaries to finally stamp his authority in the world of Mathematics. He continues to be a big source of inspiration to many from this country, who strive to walk in his footsteps.

Since each *nama* represents a unique nature and quality of Sri Balambika, it can be interpreted and discussed to cater to the different needs of an individual. Along with a direct meaning of each *nama*, Smt. Asha Manoharan has provided us with intriguing commentary and examples that a common man can relate to and apply in everyday life. So the next time we chant Sri Bala Sahasranamam, we will not only know the literal meaning of the *stotram*, but will also find a unique way to connect and relate to Sri Balambika.

mahālakṣmīḥ mahāśaktiḥ mahāvidyā svarūpiṇī / maheśvarī mahānandā mahānanda vidhāyinī //

Mahalakshmi: one who provides good fortune

The word Mahalakshmi strikes a bell as giver of money and riches. God is not an ATM and Her blessings are just not about money and wealth.

The subject of blessing and good fortune is always thought to go hand in hand. Some of us think, that if we put in the right amount of prayer, praise, worship, faith and good work - out comes the blessing of Ambal, and with Her blessing comes money. Blessing and good fortune is more than that.

Blessing and good fortune is all about peace and prosperity. Ambal thoughts concerning peace and good fortune is much higher than you imagine.

It is Her desire to bring peace and prosperity by giving you Her,

- 1. Favour
- 2. Grace
- 3. Protection

let us look at them one by one.

Favour: Is to afford you with comfort of joy, pleasure, delight, sweetness, charm and loveliness. She is like the big fat hen which keeps her chick under her wings.

Grace: To lead very joyous life you need Her grace; you don't need money to have Her grace. You may have a lot of money, if your children are irresponsible or your parents are always sick and unhappy, if your wife is whiny, can you be happy? She chose you not because of what you are or who you are, only because she loves you.

Protection: She is the protector of this Universe. She protects you every day, from every trap. She is like the army at the borders, who fights for us every day without we knowing about it, but the battle goes on; she fights the enemies like that.

Ambal has not promised to protect you from everyone you might define as your enemy, but she has promised to protect you from the ultimate enemy - your sinful deeds, because they are the ones which pushes you into rebirth again and again, deterring you from dissolving into the Maha Supreme.

Since she provides these kavasam she is deliberately Mahalakshmi.

Mahasakthi: super power

Ambal is the superpower of this Universe. Her power is seen in our own galaxy. The amount of power displayed in the sky is overwhelming. The Sun lights our days so we can see nature all around us. Even the visually impaired can feel the warmth.

It is our Mahasakthi's law of physics, that visible light is the best energy for chemical reactions related to the different processes in life. It is also the foundation of all food chains on Earth. Here powers have extended wonders, great and small, that we observe in our awesome Universe.

Power of Ambal is unlimited.

Many of us want to understand her ways, her work, her divinity etc., For example, the oceans are immensely abundant source of water, but a tanker has only limited capacity to take on its water. Like that we have only limited capacity to take God's power. What is limited here is the capacity of the tanker, not the water in the ocean.

She has such tremendous amount of energy which she uses only for productive purposes, not for destruction. When I say that I hear you murmuring about the natural calamities, is it not destruction?

I would say No.

Look at man made disasters and God sent. Look at Hiroshima disaster created by man, the place cannot be fertile again. But on the other hand, look at volcanic eruption - it enriches the soil and breathes new life into people.

Think about any natural happenings, they all end up being productive and more productive.

Mahavidya: super knowledge

Knowledge of Ambal is the foundation of all true education and all true services. This is the only one which safe guards us against temptation.

To achieve this we need to do the following:

- 1. Transformation of character
- 2. Purity of life
- 3. Efficiency in service
- 4. Adherence to correct principles

Let us see how each of the term can help,

1. Transformation of character:

We need to transform our character to understand Her ways, to enjoy the freedom of joy, to experience true holiness and righteousness. That is what we symbolically do when we visit the temple: we adhere to dress code, we walk long distances, we take special items as offerings, we are offering it to Ambal to let her know we are ready to transform ourselves to know Her.

2. Purity of life:

Leading a disciplined life is a must for every individual to lead a harmonious existence within the family and with the society. For example, if a person is filled with vices like telling lies or immersing themselves in bad habits, gambling, drinking, shouting, screaming etc., - then they cannot earn respect from others within the family and outside the family. We purify ourselves through vrathas and nombus to assure ourselves that we can get rid of the vices, that it is within our reach.

3. Efficiency in service:

This is all about karma yoga. To do one's work, big or small, with utmost dedication. This is demonstrated in our daily rituals like taking bath in the mornings, praying to god after bath, doing our poojas both morning and evening etc.,

4. Adherence to correct principles:

To reach Ambal this quality is very important.we should test ourselves to see whether we can get over temptations, understand the concept of dharma and detach ourself when we come in contact with adharma. This constant examination by us will help in moving or adhering to the path of dharma always. Dharma does not change, but it depends on the view point we take. That is why some of our festivals are based on the concept of good over evil, be it Navarathri or Deepavali.

When we follow the above principles, it automatically leads us to the Maha knowledge which is Ambal herself. The above mentioned points destroys our ignorance. When ignorance is lifted, Ambal appears as Mahavidya. So dispel ignorance and get prepared to receive Ambal as Mahavidya.

Svarupini: one who represents our own form

Ambal is represented in two forms,

- 1. Cosmic form
- 2. Human form

The cosmic form is described by great sages and rishis like Veda Vyasa in Devi Gita. The human form is explained by great poets, old and new alike.

Varuguna Pandiyan (16th Century) wrote Ambigai Malai; Abhirami Bhattar (18th Century) - Abhirami Anthathi; Adi Shankara-charya (8th Century) wrote Soundarya Lahiri and the list goes on.

Here, I am tempted to quote a tamil poem on Bala Tripurasundari whose translation is as follows:

"Dressed in red, wearing a half moon on Her hair, shining like the morning sun, holding a spatika mala, book, and seated in a abhaya vajra posture on an opened red lotus, is Bala Tripurasundari on whom I meditate."

Siddas like Konkanar and Karuvurar were Ambal devotees. Konkanar worshipped Ambal in the form of Valai Ambigai (Bala Tripurasundari). The siddhas who practiced medicine and alchemy worshipped Bala Tripurasundari and even named the process of distilling medicine as valai, after the Goddess Bala.

Konkanar has sung a poem on valai, which is called Valaikummi in 110 verses in Kummi Metre. Ambal has been revered in human form throughout history.

Why does She appear in human form?

- 1. Ambal the Mother, responds to the calls of Her devotees. It is a part of Her energy that descends on Earth, which is as powerful, as graceful, as loving as Her. Ambal Herself doesn't come down because the energy level is so high that mankind cannot stand before it. It is like the sun. You cannot go near it, but it's rays are important for everyday life. It is like that.
- 2. When man starts to disconnect with Ambal by not trusting or listening to Her, She descends down in human form to get reconnected to mankind.
- 3. Ambal has given humanity a special place in Her creation. Our duty is to bring peace and harmony in conjunction with Her creation. When we fail to do this, She appears in human form to direct us into that path.
- 4. Her love for mankind is so divine and amazing that She descends down only to give Her love and take our love, even though we are unaware of it.

Mahesvari: consort of Shiva

Ambal in Mahesvari form is the destroyer of greed.

Greed is both biological and social based. Greed is nothing but excess desire for resources; excessive in possessing something to such a degree that is harmful. For example, excessive drinking of alcohol leads to liver diseases. Excessive eating leads to obesity. These are harmful to the individual self biologically.

The next question is how could desire for wealth be harmful?

Greed is a trait of an individual. It makes him fight for food, shelter and space, and it was an instinct for survival. But it is bad for a society, because God has created everything to be shared equally; be it water, air, food, space etc.

So here some is best, more is less better, and too much is greed.

- 1. We need only 5 or 6 feet to sleep and lesser space when we walk around. Even when we are dead, we need only that much of space or no space at all.
- 2. Though Ambal has created a body with 66% of water, a person can drink only 6 litres of water per day, beyond that it leads to rehydration death.
- 3. Average man needs only 2500 calories of energy per day.
- 4. He needs only 6000 ml of air to fill his lungs.

So during creation, this is the standard that Ambal has set. So why do we need more?

Accumulation of wealth is nothing but greed, and it restricts and depletes natural resources. For example, a person needs only one house to live in. If he has more than one, he is depriving someone of a home. So to build more houses, we need to destroy forests and farm lands to build more houses, which leads to shortage of grain crops, in turn leading to shortage of food, which leads to famine and poverty. So an individual's greed becomes a social issue.

So Mahesvari destroys this greed by instilling the feeling of satisfaction, both biologically and socially, thereby removing the pains of karma not only from us, but also ensuring greater good to the society.

Maha Nanda: one who bestows great happiness

First of all let us look at happiness. Happiness according to a psychologist is associated with extraversion and low neuroticism.

Extraversion and its emotions, such as happiness is mediated by a brain chemical called Dopamine, which is produced in response to evidence, that progress is being made towards a valuable goal and which reinforces the systems of perception, thought and action that brings about a desired end.

Basically people live under two assumptions:

- 1. Being happy is my goal.
- 2. I will be happy, if my desires are fulfilled (if my needs are met).

These two driving motives have made them the most unhappy and unfulfilled people on earth. Why? Because these two innocent assumptions are not the ways of Ambal.

When you ask for these two things, She will help you gather and accumulate - but only to hand it over to the one who follows Her ways.

People believe that fulfillment is joy. Fulfillment comes from alternate lifestyles, partying, cheating and other activities that may promote it. Ambal's ways can be none of these. Her ways doesn't give joy to the body, it gives joy and happiness only to

the soul.

So instead of running around to make sense of your life, why don't you submit your life to Ambal and walk with Her humbly. If you allow yourself to be transformed in mind and heart, you will start appreciating the gift of happiness that comes from Ambal. I know it is not easy, but honesty, patience and endurance will help you get nearer to Her; the happiness which you get out of it is Maha Nanda.

Vidhayini: one who radiates knowledge

Ambal radiates knowledge to mankind, which otherwise is called the grace of God.

Ambal allegedly out of love forgives man, if he regrets for his mistakes.

This attitude however, mistakes Ambal's love for weakness and completely denies the divine justice.

According to the law of reciprocal action, everything good or bad returns back to man. Nothing can be forgiven, but all must be paid back.

You may ask me, when Ambal has forgiven me, why not divine justice?

The reason is when a person commits a mistake and regrets in a couple of minutes, he thereby considers the whole thing terminated. He does not try to make any effort to change his inner self.

Why would he do it? After all, he was told to only regret and say a few prayers as a sign of regret and the grace of Ambal would put everything back in order.

The real change should come from within us, not within our thoughts. Regretful thoughts are too shallow to touch the spirit and change something at the level of human nature. If you want to change, you have to feel the disharmony inside you, in your heart. It is not enough that you know you acted improperly, you should feel so deeply, so truly, that you will never be able to do it again, only then will Ambal's grace work.

This law is seen in the material world also:

- 1. You cannot drill a hole in water.
- 2. You cannot bend an iron rod by blowing air through it.
- 3. You cannot catch radio waves with a butterfly.

The law also applies to the spiritual realm.

This is the knowledge that Ambal imparts and hence, She is rightly called Vidhayini.
