Q & A WITH SMT. ASHA MANOHARAN

PUNNIYAM:

Today, we are going to talk about a topic which everyone knows and has questions about. Before we jump into this topic, let's first talk about what we all ask for in life. All of us pursue happiness and pray that we are always contented. However, each one of us has different likes and dislikes at various stages of our lives, and only if we get these wants and needs appropriate to that age, will we be happy. If we are able to get what we desire and enjoy the benefits, that means that we are blessed with "punniyam" or good karma. This applies to all materialistic things. To acquire this punniyam, we need to follow the path of Dharma, make sure we don't do something that hurts another person, and take the correct decision at the correct time. Just like bad karma or pavam, we continue to stack up on punniyam, just like money inherited in righteous ways.

Just like we can either choose to spend the money or save it for the future, punniyam can be used for our personal happiness and pleasures which is called "Preyas", or utilized for the goodness of mankind, which is called "Shreyas". Most of us follow the Preyas path, as it is the easy way. However, it only leads to temporary peripheral happiness. In contrast, the Shreyas path, which is more difficult, leads to everlasting happiness, and is good for the Atman. The Kathopanishad (verse 1.2.2) clearly states that given the paths of shreyas and preyas, the wise one always chooses shreyas.

Therefore, as we walk through life, if we pay careful attention to our everyday actions and decisions, and fine tune it to benefit others, we will automatically follow the path leading to eternal happiness, and break the cycle of birth and death, attaining Moksha.

KNOW YOUR MYTHOLOGY: THE SIGNS OF KALI YUGA

After the Mahabharat war, Yudhisthira was ruling Bharathavarsham. People were finally experiencing peace and stability. The Pandavas managed to create both love and respect all around. Trade and business was improving. Bheema was engaged in talking to the people and addressing their concerns and grievances. But, he still continued to have a few fights here and there.

A farmer met Bheema, seeking his advice on something strange that he had observed. The farmer described to Bheema that a fence in his field had moved further into his neighbor's field. Bheema asked, "Did you see any Asura or Rakshasa?" The farmer replied that he did not see anyone or witness any disturbances. Since these are not the kind of issues that Bheema deals with, he sent the farmer to Yudhisthira.

After a few nazhikas (an hour or so), another educated pandit came to meet Bheema. Strangely, he was carrying a big pot full of water and several small empty pots. Bheema knew this person, and wondered what was going on. The pandit said that he has a question, and got started on a kind of demo for Bheema. The pandit poured water from the big pot into those small pots, until the big pot became empty. He then started pouring the water back from the small pots back into the big one. After the pandit poured water from all the small pots, the big pot only had half of the water it had earlier. Bheema asked, "What does this mean? Are you showing me some magic?" The pandit asked, "That was my question, I am trying to understand what this means." Puzzled, Bheema directed him to Yudhisthira.

In some time, Bheema saw another person approaching him. It was a slight relief for Bheema that this person did not carry pots or anything. This person told Bheema that he saw something strange. Bheema thought, "Here we go again." The person started explaining, "I saw a huge elephant pass through the eye of a needle." Bheema asked, "Did the elephant get out?". The person said, "No, its tail was stuck." Bheema gently told him to go to Yudhisthira.

Bheema thought about going to the forest. Seems like these city dwellers are pondering about too many things. Now, a fourth person approached Bheema. The person started explaining, "I saw huge rocks in the street." Bheema smiled and said, "No worries, I will come and remove them for good." The person continued, "Those rocks got removed." Bheema almost lost interest. The citizen continued, "Many wrestlers could not remove them. However, a small Sadhu waved his hand and said something, and the rocks moved." Bheema accompanied him to meet Yudhisthira. Yudhisthira said that all these four questions are related and symptoms of the ending of "Dwapara Yuga" and beginning of "Kali Yuga". He started explaining, "the fence moving into the neighbour's field is an indication that people will be interested to know about others and would want to take what is in other's possession by any means."

"The transfer of water from the big pot to the small ones and then back again from the small ones to the big pot, resulting in only 50% of water, is an indication that people will get only half of what they give to others. This includes love and affection."

"A big-elephant going through a needle, and only getting stuck at the tail, means people will spend a lot of their earnings for sensual pleasures, but will hesitate or would not spare much for good deeds like Temples and helping the needy."

"Big rocks that cannot be moved by great wrestlers, indicate the problems and the resulting Karma. A Sadhu being able to effortlessly move the same, indicates the solution. In other words, only the holy names of God and devotional practices will protect people from the impacts of Kali Yuga".
