

# CREEPING BENTGRASS

*Agrostis palustris*

## DESCRIPTION

Creeping Bentgrass is a stoloniferous, somewhat rhizomatous, cool-season, perennial grass. It is typically used for putting greens, bowling lawns and erosion control. Of the cool-season grasses, it is the finest-bladed, lowest-growing, and highest-maintenance. Establishment for this soft, dense grass is slow to normal and it requires a well-prepared seed bed with good drainage. Creeping Bentgrass spreads laterally requiring more controlled management and making its use in home lawns and parks limited. This long-lived turf grass performs great when closely mowed at 1/8 to 1/2 inch, fertilized, and mowed consistently. Creeping Bentgrass grows best in full sun but will survive in light shade.
