WHAT'S NEXT

After taking down No. 21/18 Nebraska Sunday afternoon at Welsh-Ryan Arena, Northwestern now turns its attention to two games this week, beginning with Thursday's contest at Indiana. Tip is scheduled for 6 p.m. CT at Assembly Hall in Bloomington, Ind. The week wraps up at home when NU welcomes Penn State to Welsh-Ryan Arena on Sunday, Feb. 2 at 1 p.m. Sunday's game marks the seventh time this year where the Wildcats have faced a ranked opponent as PSU is tabbed No. 12/13 in the latest polls.

LAST TIME OUT: NU UPENDS NO. 21/18 NEBRASKA, 63-59

It was an exciting game Sunday afternoon at Welsh-Ryan Arena as Northwestern upset No. 21/18 Nebraska 63-59. The game featured eight ties and 14 lead changes with the Wildcats prevailing down the stretch for their third win over a ranked opponent this year.

Nia Coffey led all scorers with 22 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for her sixth double-double of the season. Christen Inman added 12 and Ashley Deary chipped in 10 points. Maggie Lyon scored a key layup with 1:21 left in the game to break the eighth and final tie, putting NU ahead for good.

The Wildcats did a good job of containing Nebraska's leading scorer heading into the game, Jordan Hooper. She had 11 points in the first half and finished with 11 for the game. Tear'a Lauderhill led the Huskers with 18 points.

A bucket by Nebraska's Emily Cady tied things up for the final time at 57-57. Lyon's layup and another key 3-pointer by Inman gave NU a comfortable 62-57 lead. After two free throws by Lauderhill with seven seconds left put Nebraska within three, Inman drained one final free throw with five seconds left to ice the 63-59 Northwestern win.

COFFEY CLAIMS BIG TEN HONOR

After averaging 21.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 1.5 blocks for the Wildcats last week,

forward Nia Coffey has been named this week's Big Ten Freshman of the Week the conference announced Tuesday.

Coffey helped guide Northwestern to its third win over a ranked opponent with 22 points and 10 rebounds in Sunday's 63-59 win over then-No. 21/18 Nebraska. Earlier in the week, she posted 20 points, seven rebounds and three blocks against ranked Purdue.

Sunday's performance marked Coffey's sixth double-double of the season, which ranks eighth in NU single-season history. Her 21.0 points per game average last week ranked third in the conference while her 8.5 rebounds per game tied for fourth.

Additionally, Coffey was named to the Big Ten Player of the Week Honor Roll for her performance last week.

This is the third Big Ten Freshman of the Week honor for Coffey and first during the conference season.

KEEP THE COFFEY FLOWING

Freshman forward Nia Coffey has put up some impressive offensive numbers in the last few games. She is currently on a five-game streak of scoring in double figures, with three of those games coming as 20+-point outings. Here's a look at her numbers in the last five games compared to her season stats:

COHEN, DOUGLAS CONTINUE TO CLIMB ALL-TIME BLOCKS LIST

Junior Alex Cohen and sophomore Lauren Douglas both rank in the top 10 in Northwestern history for career blocks. Against Nebraska (1/26), Cohen tied a career high with five blocks (out of NU's seven as a team) to move into sixth in NU history. She is now tied with Nia Coffey for the team lead in blocks this year (44) and Lauren Douglas also is moving up the career record list for blocks. Here's a look at where they rank:

DOUGLAS DIALED IN FROM LONG DISTANCE

Sophomore Lauren Douglas has emerged as one of the best 3-point shooters in the Big Ten. The 6-2 forward ranks fifth in the conference, shooting .456 from long distance (26-of-57). Douglas has seven games this year with at least two made 3-pointers and the Wildcats are 5-2 in those contests. She currently is on a streak of 13-straight games with a 3-pointer, including two made in each of the last three games.

BALANCED ATTACK

Northwestern has had at least three players score 10+ points in each of the last four games. Against Nebraska, three freshmen finished in double figures with Nia Coffey's 22 leading the way. Christen Inman added 12 and Ashley Deary had 10 points. In total, the three freshmen combined for 69.8 percent (44 of 63 points) in NU's win over the ranked Huskers.

NEW B1G ASSIST LEADER: ASHLEY DEARY

Freshman guard Ashley Deary currently leads the Big Ten and ranks sixth in NCAA Division I Women's Basketball with 7.1 assists per game. In Big Ten-only games, Deary also is averaging a conference-best 8.1 assists per game, well-ahead of Iowa's Samantha Logic, who averages 7.4 assists per game.

More impressive is that Deary is the shortest player on the Wildcats this year and is one of the shortest players in the Big Ten. Listed at 5-4, Deary and Nicole Bell of Indiana are the shortest players in the conference. Her height has not stopped her from putting up impressive numbers. Here's a look at where Deary stacks up height-wise amongst the Big Ten assist leaders.

NORTHWESTERN HEAD COACH JOE MCKEOWN • SIXTH SEASON AT NU

Joe McKeown is one of the most successful coaches in NCAA women's basketball history. Now in his 28th season as a head coach, sixth with the Wildcats, he brings 580 career victories with him into the 2013-14 season and ranks amongst the top 15 in career wins amongst active Division I coaches. During his tenure, the Wildcats have established a number of program firsts, including Maggie Lyon's crowning as the 2013 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and Amy Jaeschke becoming the first Wildcat to be selected in the WNBA Draft (2011 WNBA Draft). Additionally, the Wildcats had the best back-to-back seasons in nearly 15 years under McKeown's watch. Combined, the 2009-10 and 2010-11 campaigns yielded 37 victories, two postseason appearances and milestone wins over nationally-renown Ohio State, LSU and DePaul.

Jaeschke, a local product from Wilmette, Ill., turned in not only one of the best seasons in Wildcat annals, but also one of the most storied careers. In the Northwestern record books, she finished her career ranked first in blocks and second in scoring and in rebounding. Jaeschke also was tabbed an Associated Press honorable mention All-American, marking the first time since 1998 that a Wildcat appeared on the prestigious list.

Northwestern's improvement from 2008-09 (7-23) to 2009-10 (18-15) was tied for the 10th best turnaround in the nation and ranked fourth among BCS schools. In winning percentage comparison, the Wildcats' above-.500 mark (.545) was a 31.2 percent improvement from last season. The success yielded NU's first postseason appearance in 13 years and a ticket to the WNIT, which led to two victories and a trip to the event's round of 16.

NEAR PERFECTION FROM INMAN

Through seven Big Ten games, Christen Inman is leading the conference in field goal percentage at .615. In Big Ten-only games, she is an impressive 40-of-65 from the field, including a perfect game (see next note) and an 8-of-9 showing against Wisconsin on Jan. 18. Overall, Inman has a .525 field goal percentage, which comes in at eighth in the conference.

Inman is tied for second on the team in scoring, averaging 13.0 points per game, which is 23rd in the Big Ten. Through seven Big Ten games, the Katy, Texas native upped her average to 13.4 ppg, which is tied for 19th and second amongst the Wildcats.

PERFECTION FROM INMAN

Against Nebraska on Jan. 2, Christen Inman went a perfect 8-8 from the field for 19 points. Inman is just the second Big Ten player this year to go 100.0 percent from the field with at least eight field goals as Darryce Moore of Ohio State went 9-of-9 vs. VCU. NU records list top single-game field goal percentages with a minimum of nine attempts but Inman's perfect game ranks up there with Patricia Babcock who went 10-10 vs. Wake Forest on Dec. 4, 1993 and Mary Murphy, who was 9-9 vs. St. Francis on Dec. 10, 1977.

COFFEY FILLS THE STAT SHEET

Freshman forward Nia Coffey is the only player in the Big Ten to rank in the top 10 in points, rebounds, steals and blocks. The Minneapolis, Minn., native averages 16.1 ppg to rank sixth, 8.3 rpg for sixth, 2.0 steals per game to tie for fourth and 2.2 blocks per game to tie for fourth. Additionally, Coffey is one of just three players in the conference to rank in the top 10 for points and rebounds, along with Nebraska senior Jordan Hooper and Wisconsin junior Michala Johnson.

COFFEY PODS

Freshman forward Nia Coffey leads Northwestern in points (16.1) and rebounds (8.3). Here are some quick hits on what Coffey has done in her short time with the Wildcats:

- Scored 10+ points in all but three games
- 6 double-doubles
- 10+ rebounds in seven games
- Grabbed 18 rebounds vs. Northeastern, which is a new high in the Joe McKeown era and most for a Wildcat player since Patricia Babcock McGraw had 18 on Feb. 18, 1995 ... 18 rebounds also ties for eighth in single-game history
- 20+ points in 6 games, including two 27-point outings

CLOSING IN ON 600

Northwestern head coach Joe McKeown has 593 career wins, meaning he needs just seven more victories to reach the 600-win milestone. Heading into the 2013-14 season, only one other Big Ten head coach had surpassed the 600-win milestone as Iowa's Lisa Bluder had 607 career victories entering the year. McKeown ranked second in the conference, bringing 580 wins into the season while the next closest was Coni Yori of Nebraska with 410 wins. Heading into the year, McKeown ranked 15th amongst active Division I head coaches with 580 career wins with Bluder ranking 14th.

BLOCKING #B1GCATS BEST IN #B1G

NU continues to lead the Big Ten and is second in the country in blocks, averaging 7.3 blocks per game. The Wildcats are behind NCAA leader UConn (8.6), but in the Big Ten, more than a block ahead of Penn State, who is second in the conference with 5.4 blocks per game. NU has 146 blocks this year, which is more than two times the amount for its opponents (54)

As of Jan. 26, two Wildcats rank in the top 50 in the country for blocks with Nia Coffey and Alex Cohen each averaging 2.2 blocks per game to rank 39th. Both of those Wildcats are tied for fourth in the Big Ten. Lauren Douglas also contributes on the block with 1.4 swats per game to rank 10th in the Big Ten.

CAREER NUMBERS FOR COHEN

Junior forward/center Alex Cohen has emerged as a starter this year for the Wildcats and is putting up career numbers. She is averaging 23.1 minutes per game and contributing 6.4 points and 4.5 rebounds. She also is shooting

a career-best .494 from the field and contributes a team-best 2.2 blocks per game. Through 20 games this year, Cohen has 90 total rebounds while last year, as a sophomore, Cohen had 83 total rebounds in 30 games played.

Cohen also has 44 blocks this year, including eight games of three or more blocks, which is more than her first two years combined (43). Her 87 career blocks moves her into sixth in NU history.

FIRST-YEAR CONTRIBUTIONS

Three freshmen are starting for the Wildcats and all three of them have contributed immensely during their short time in Evanston. Nia Coffey and Christen Inman rank No. 1 and No. 2 on the team, respectively, in scoring, while Ashley Deary is the team's leader in assists. The three of them combined are putting up big numbers for the Wildcats, scoring 703 of the team's 1,391 points, meaning they are responsible for about 50 percent of the Northwestern offense. In NU's win over No. 21/18 Nebraska on Jan. 26, the trio accounted for 44 of the team's 63 points. Here are some more numbers on freshmen Coffey, Deary and Inman:

- 50.5 percent of Northwestern's points – 703 of 1,391 total points
- 41.2 percent of Northwestern's rebounds – 302 of 733 total rebounds
- 65.1 percent of Northwestern's assists – 224 of 344 total assists
- 62.3 percent of Northwestern's steals – 119 of 191 total steals

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Against Nebraska on Jan. 26, Joe McKeown utilized a starting lineup with three freshmen, Nia Coffey, Ashley Deary and Christen Inman, along with two sophomores, Maggie Lyon and Lauren Douglas. Those five all rank in the top five in scoring for NU and account for 84.2 percent of NU's scoring so far this year (1,171 of 1,391 points).

SCOUTING INDIANA

2013-14 Record: 15-5, 2-5 B1G

All-Time Series Record: IU lead, 36-32; Northwestern won last meeting, 53-39, on Jan. 28, 2013 in Evanston.

Notable: This is the lone meeting of the year between the Wildcats and Hoosiers. Indiana also has a young squad featuring seven freshmen, two of which rank in the top three on the team in scoring. Guard Larryn Brooks has started all 20 games and leads the team in scoring with 17.4 ppg while fellow freshman Taylor Agler is third on the team, averaging 8.4 ppg. Indiana had a strong start to the season, opening the year with a 14-0 record, which included an 86-84 win over Iowa in the team's Big Ten opener on Jan. 2. Since then, the Hoosiers have gone 1-5 with their lone conference win in that span coming at home against Minnesota (83-78) in overtime.

DOUGLAS DELIVERS IN NEW ROLE

Sophomore forward Lauren Douglas started all but one game for the Wildcats a year ago, but this year, she has emerged as one of the top sixth players in the country. The Collierville, Tenn., native is usually the first player off the bench for NU and she has put up impressive numbers in a reserve role.

NEW LOOK TO THE WILDCATS

Northwestern returns three starters off of last year's squad, but only one of those players has started every game for the Wildcats so far this year. Sophomore guard Maggie Lyon, sophomore forward Lauren Douglas and junior guard Karly Roser are the three returning starters from a year ago with Lyon back in the starting lineup. Douglas has been a solid contributor as the first person off the bench while Roser, an All-Big Ten selection last year who had made 60-consecutive starts, has missed the start of the season with an injury.

This year's starting five has consistently featured three freshmen--point guard Ashley Deary, guard Christen Inman and forward Nia Coffey--along with junior forward/center Alex Cohen. Prior to this year, Cohen had made just two starts during her sophomore season.

DEARY STEALS THE SHOW

Freshman point guard Ashley Deary had a career-best six steals vs. Oral Roberts. That figure is tied for ninth in NU single-game history and is tied for the most steals by a player in the Joe McKeown era. Deary ranks second in the Big Ten with 2.4 steals per game, just behind conference leader, Dara Taylor of PSU who has 2.9 steals per game.

RECORD SETTERS

Northwestern drained 13 3-pointers against Loyola on Dec. 14, which matches a program record. The Wildcats were 13-of-25 with five players chipping in at least two from long-distance. NU also converted 13 3-pointers vs. UIC on Nov. 23, 1996 and at Minnesota on Jan. 19, 1997.

REBOUNDING LYON

Northwestern sophomore guard Maggie Lyon is known to score in bunches for the Wildcats, but this year, she has emerged as one of the top rebounders on the team. The 6-1 guard has made an effort to crash the boards this year as she is second on the team in rebounds, averaging 5.3 per game, which is an improvement upon her 4.0 average a year ago.

Last year, Lyon had nine games, out of 25 played, with 5+ rebounds. This year, she already has 12 games of 5+ rebounds through 20 games played.

DOUBLE-DIGIT LYON

Lyon also consistently scores in double figures for the Wildcats. She is tied for second on the team, averaging 13.0 ppg and has had a few lengthy double-

digit scoring streaks during her short stint in Evanston:

- 12 games - 1/20/13 -- 3/3/13
- 8 games - 11/9/12 -- 12/31/12 (missed 5 games in December due to injury)
- 7 games - 11/10/13 -- 12/1/13
- 5 games - 12/14/13 -- 12/29/13

In total, Lyon has scored 10+ points in 36 of her 45 games played, or 80 percent of her games with the Wildcats.

DEARY NAMED TO 2014 NANCY LIEBERMAN AWARD WATCH LIST

Northwestern freshman point guard Ashley Deary was named to the 2014 Nancy Lieberman Award Watch List, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced on Jan. 15.

The award recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. Candidates exhibit the floor leadership, play-making and ball-handling skills of Hall of Famer Nancy Lieberman. Deary is one of just two Big Ten point guards on this year's watch list, along with Iowa's Samantha Logic.

Previous winners of the Nancy Lieberman Award include last year's recipient Skylar Diggins (Notre Dame), Sue Bird (Connecticut), Renee Montgomery (Connecticut), Diana Taurasi (Connecticut), Lindsey Harding (Duke), Courtney Vandersloot (Gonzaga), Temeka Johnson (LSU), Kristi Toliver (Maryland), Ivory Latta (North Carolina), and Andrea Riley (Oklahoma State).

STRONG SECOND HALF GUIDES NU PAST NO. 21/20 PURDUE, 71-68

Northwestern took down No. 21/20 Purdue, 71-68, on Jan. 9 at Welsh-Ryan Arena in the Wildcats' first Big Ten home contest of the year. Despite trailing by as many as 11 points in the first half, the Wildcats used a strong second half to knock off their second ranked opponent of the season and improve to 11-4 on the year, 1-1 in the conference.

Sophomore guard Maggie Lyon saw 20 points to lead the team in scoring, including a perfect 3-3 from long distance. Christen Inman was close behind, scoring 18 points, just one shy of her performance against Nebraska. Freshman Ashley Deary broke a new career high with 11 assists. Lauren Douglas also scored in double digits with 11 points and seven rebounds off the bench while Alex Cohen chipped in another 10 points and four blocks. Senior guard La'Terria Taylor played valuable minutes, giving Deary a break, with a career-high five rebounds, two assists and no turnovers.

After two Nia Coffey free throws helped NU go ahead eight with 3:16 to play, Purdue's Courtney Moses drained a 3-pointer and KK Houser added another from long-distance, putting the score at 67-65 with 1:07 to play. A layup by Lyon gave the Wildcats a four-point cushion before Purdue drained yet another 3-pointer to pull within one (69-68) with just 17 seconds left.

Northwestern stayed strong as Deary went 1-for-2 at the line with 15 seconds left and Douglas added another with less than a second left to secure the 71-68 Wildcat win.

WILDCATS ROAR PAST NO. 25 DEPAUL, 82-79

In a battle of two Chicago-area women's basketball teams, Northwestern utilized a strong offensive performance to upset No. 25 DePaul, 82-79 at Welsh-Ryan Arena on Dec. 1. A game that featured 13 ties and 12 lead changes, including 10 ties and nine lead changes in the second half, Northwestern broke the final tie (79-79) in the last 30 seconds by scoring the final three points of the game to secure the win. The game vs. DePaul was part of the fifth annual Autism Awareness Game for the Wildcats and more than 1,200 fans in attendance saw a Northwestern victory.

DePaul was the second top-25 opponent of the young season for the Wildcats as the Blue Demons entered the game ranked No. 25 in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' Polls. Four Wildcats scored in double-digits, including a career-high of 26 points (8-11 from the field, 4-4 from 3-point range) for sophomore Lauren Douglas, who came off the bench.

Freshman Nia Coffey recorded her fourth double-double in seven games with 20 points and 10 rebounds. Freshman Christen Inman added 13 points and made some key shots down the stretch

while sophomore Maggie Lyon extended her double-digit scoring streak to seven games with 10 points. Freshman point guard Ashley Deary had nine assists.

NU's win over DePaul snapped the Blue Demons' 20-game winning streak over fellow Illinois schools.

'CATS MAKE APPEARANCE IN ASSOCIATED PRESS POLL

After taking down No. 25 DePaul, Northwestern made an appearance in the Associated Press poll that was released on Dec. 2. The Wildcats received five votes in the poll and made their first appearance since also receiving votes in the 2011-12 season.

CHICAGO'S B1G TEAM GOES 4-0 AGAINST AREA SCHOOLS

With NU's win over Loyola, the Wildcats improved to 4-0 against Chicago-area schools, also defeating UIC, Chicago State and DePaul during the nonconference portion of its schedule. This year was the first year during the Joe McKeown era that the Wildcats faced all four Chicago-area schools. In 2009-10, the Wildcats went 3-0 against Chicago-area competition, defeating DePaul, Chicago State and Loyola (did not play UIC).

NOTABLE NOVEMBER

Northwestern wrapped up the month of November with a 5-1 mark, which continues a

streak of quality starts for the Wildcats during the Joe McKeown era. Last year, NU went a perfect 6-0 in the month of November and in 2011-12, posted a 5-1 result. In fact, NU's loss at No. 17 California, snapped a streak of 11-straight victories in the month of November, which spanned three seasons. COFFEY HONORED BY BIG TEN AFTER NORTHWESTERN DEBUT

After leading the Wildcats with 19 points in the squad's 2013-14 season-opening victory against UIC, Nia Coffey (Minneapolis, Minn./Hopkins) was honored as Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week. Coffey shared the first weekly honor of the year with Indiana's Larryn Brooks.

The 6-1 forward made her first career start vs. UIC and scored a game-high 19 points to go along with another game-high of five blocks in 25 minutes. She also added four rebounds and three steals while shooting 58.3 percent from the field (7-of-12).

This is the first weekly accolade for Coffey and continues a lengthy string of Big Ten Freshmen of the Week honors for the Northwestern women's basketball team. Last year, Wildcat freshmen Maggie Lyon and Lauren Douglas were honored a combined six times as Lyon received the award four times and Douglas was recognized twice.

honors on Dec. 2. The 6-1 first-year forward averaged a double-double with 23.5 points and 10.5 rebounds in NU's wins over Lafayette and No. 25 DePaul.

Coffey had a solid start to the week, tying a career-high with 27 points, while adding 11 rebounds, four blocks, four steals and four assists in NU's 66-64 win over Lafayette. She then followed that up with 20 points, 10 rebounds, four assists, three steals and two blocks as the Wildcats upset No. 25 DePaul, 82-79 at Welsh-Ryan Arena on Sunday.

This is the first Big Ten Player of the Week honor for Coffey and the first for any Wildcat player since Amy Jaeschke won the award on Feb. 2, 2011. She is now a two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week honoree after winning the award following the first week of the season.

RARE COMPANY

Freshman guard Christen Inman joined rare company during NU's home-opener against UIC. She went a perfect 10-for-10 from the free throw line, making her just the third freshman in Northwestern history to go at least 10-for-10 from the line. She joins Mary Murphy (10-10, vs. Central Michigan, 3/10/77) and Brittany Orban (13-13, at Ohio State, 2/15/09) on that elite list but separates herself even further as she is the only Wildcat newcomer to go at least 10-for-10 from the line in her debut. Inman's perfect night at the line also is the 11th time a Wildcat has gone at least 10-for-10 from the line.

STRONG SCHEDULE

Northwestern has a strong regular-season schedule this year, playing 14 teams that qualified for the postseason a year ago (California, DePaul, N.C. State, Oral Roberts, IUPUI, Indiana State, Iowa, Michigan, Michigan State, Nebraska, Penn State, Purdue, Minnesota and Illinois). Included in that mix is a 2013 Final Four squad as NU visited California on Nov. 24. In total, 18 of Northwestern's 29 regular-season games feature an opponent that made either the 2013 NCAA Tournament or 2013 WNIT. Eight foes reached the NCAA tournament a year ago including Cal, DePaul, Iowa, Michigan, Michigan State, Nebraska, Penn State and Purdue.

STREAK SNAPPED

Junior guard Karly Roser had an impressive streak of 60-consecutive games played heading into the 2013-14 season. The All-Big Ten point guard suffered an injury during the preseason, which caused her to miss her first game in her Wildcat tenure as she was not on the court for NU's season-opener vs. UIC. In her first two years as NU's floor general, Roser started all 60 games and averaged 34.5 minutes per contest. Now a junior, Roser is one of three captains on the 2013-14 squad.

MEGHAN MCKEOWN NOMINATED FOR ALLSTATE/WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Senior captain Meghan McKeown is one of 202 nominees for the Allstate Good Works Team. In its second year, the Allstate WBCA and NABC Good Works Teams® honor players at all levels of college basketball who represent the sport's finest in the areas of leadership and charitable achievements amongst their peers. The student-athletes nominated for this prestigious award embody the true spirit of teamwork and giving back.

McKeown has played a key role in the Northwestern women's basketball program's effort to raise autism awareness. She, along with her teammates, regularly participate in the Walk Now for Autism Speaks event in the spring at Soldier Field, helped create a Knockout Tournament with proceeds benefitting Autism Speaks U and recently participated in the team's fifth annual Autism Awareness Game. She has volunteered her time at SAAC's annual Field Day and Canned Food Drive, has given back to the Salvation Army and assists with youth basketball clinics.

'CATS NAME CAPTAINS FOR 2013-14 SEASON

Seniors La'Terria Taylor (Chicago, Ill./Von Stueben) and Meghan McKeown (Fairfax, Va./Loyola Academy (Ill.)) along with junior Karly Roser (Hamilton, Ontario, Canada/Saint Mary's) have been named tri-captains for the 'Cats.

"I'm really excited about our captains," Northwestern head coach Joe McKeown said. "They bring great leadership, commitment and academic excellence to our program. All three had to overcome adversity during their careers and they have great respect from their teammates, the coaching staff and the Northwestern Community."

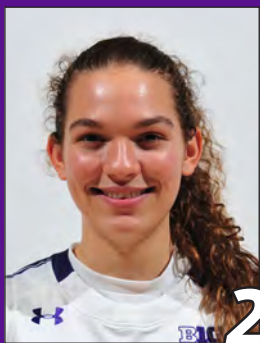

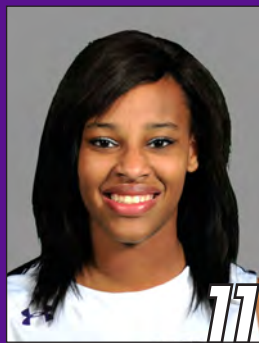
