Brian O. Hemphill, Ph.D., Old Dominion University's ninth president effective July 1, 2021, is an unwavering champion for access and opportunity, as well as innovation and research, with a deep commitment to forward-focused leadership. President Hemphill is proud to lead ODU with a steadfast dedication to excellence, a firm commitment to accountability and transparency, and — most importantly — a strong focus on diversity, equity, and inclusion, as well as student success.

President Hemphill's road to ODU has taken him from the University of Arkansas-Fayetteville, a flagship university, where he served as Associate Vice Chancellor and Dean of Students; to Northern Illinois University, a large, public, research university, where he served as Vice President for Student Affairs and Enrollment Management and Associate Professor for eight years; West Virginia State University, a public, land-grant, research university, where he served as the 10th President and Professor for four

years; and, most recently, Radford University, a comprehensive university, where he served as the seventh President and Professor for five years.

President Hemphill earned a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration and Policy Studies from the University of Iowa, a Master of Science degree in Journalism and Mass Communication from Iowa State University of Science and Technology, and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Organizational Communication from Saint Augustine's University. President Hemphill is a published author with a multitude of writings covering topics related to gun violence and threat preparedness on college campuses; emerging financial concerns affecting the collegiate sphere; STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) and economic-related issues pertaining to education; and a myriad of additional scholarly perspectives pertinent to the higher education environment. President Hemphill co-edited a book, titled "College in the Crosshairs: An Administrative Perspective on Prevention of Gun Violence." He is a highly sought-after keynote speaker, guest presenter, and panelist with frequent appearances across the country.

President Hemphill's passion for life and unparalleled commitment to excellence begins at home where he shares his life with his loving and supportive wife, Dr. Marisela Rosas Hemphill, who proudly serves as ODU's First Lady. The Hemphills are the proud parents of energetic twins, Catalina and Cruz. President Hemphill also has two adult children, Jada, a public school teacher in Fort Worth, Texas, and Jordan, assistant director of athletics development at the University of Iowa. Above all else, President Hemphill cherishes the time he spends with his children who are so very precious to him. The Hemphill family resides in the Jacobson House. President and First Lady Hemphill, as well as their entire family, actively engage both on the campus and in the community by attending a variety of activities and events in support their fellow Monarchs!

DR. CAMDEN WOOD SELIG



Dr. Camden Wood Selig is in his 14th year as Director of Athletics at Old Dominion University, where his "Championship Effort" philosophy has helped guide the department as one of the most respected and successful intercollegiate programs in the nation. Of the 133 FBS Athletic Directors, Selig is the 13th longest FBS tenured in the country. He is in his 25th year as a Division I AD.

During his tenure, Selig has directed the University's move through two FBS conferences and has Old Dominion positioned strongly in the Sun Belt Conference. He has overseen the transition of a startup FCS football program to the FBS level, led major athletic facility expansion and enhancement for virtually all 18 programs, and added women's volleyball in 2019.

One needs only to visit the ODU campus to see Selig's contributions to the growth and improvement of Monarch athletic venues with well over \$100 million invested in Intercollegiate athletic facilities since his arrival. Projects completed and initiated under Selig include:

- ODU opened the \$67.5 million Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium on Saturday, August 31, 2019 against Norfolk State. The stadium rebuilding was completed in nine months.
- A \$20 million baseball renovation began in the fall of 2022. The new stadium, which should be complete for the 2026 season, will be called the Ellmer Family Baseball Complex.
- The Bernett & Blanche Mitchum Basketball Performance Center, a privately funded \$8.4 million state-of-the-art facility, is complete and is the new training center for the ODU men's and women's basketball teams.
- The \$3.5 million repurposing of the arena in the Jim Jarrett Athletic building is now the brand-new 900 seat home of the ODU women's volleyball program.
- A \$3.5 million expansion of L.R. Hill support facility for football, women's field hockey, and women's lacrosse, including a new state-of-the-art weight room.
- The addition of a \$2.3 million video replay scoreboard, LED ribbon panels, and digital tables at Chartway Arena.
- The \$600,000 Paul A. Keyes Indoor Hitting Complex, which opened in the fall of 2014.

As collegiate athletic costs continue to rise, Selig has placed a premium on increasing privately generated revenue. Since his arrival in 2010:

- Total ODAF philanthropic gifts for athletics have surpassed \$140 million.
- Corporate sponsorship revenue has surpassed \$33 million.
- Staff giving to the Old Dominion Athletic Foundation (ODAF) has remained at 100% for thirteen consecutive years.

And, in ODU's first year in the Sun Belt Conference, they led in attendance for men's and women's basketball and set a single-season ODU record for football.

One of the most dramatic and gratifying accomplishments for Selig has been the academic success of the 18 teams. Highlights from 2022-23 include:

- An ODU record 197 student athletes (49%) earned Dean's List honors with a 3.4 or higher GPA.
- An ODU record 3.26 cumulative GPA for all 475 student-athletes.
- At least a 3.0 GPA recorded by 71% of student-athletes.
- A 3.0 GPA or higher for 16 of 18 teams.

Monarch teams have performed well on the playing fields under Selig, highlighted by:

- Fifteen Conference Championships since 2010, including back-to-back championships for women's soccer and three straight conference championships for women's tennis.
- ODU's three Sun Belt Conference Championships in 2022-23 were the second most in the league and the most of the four new arrivals (ODU, James Madison, Marshall, Southern Miss).

In Selig's tenure there have also been numerous firsts and achievements that haven't been accomplished in many years, including:

- Linebacker Jason Henderson in 2022 became the first ODU football player to earn All-America honors at the FBS level.
- In 2016, ODU participated in its first bowl game in the Bahamas. In 2021, went to its 2nd bowl game in Myrtle Beach.
- Women's soccer won its first C-USA Championship in 2022 and first conference championship since 2006.
- In June 2022, baseball first baseman Matt Coutney was named C-USA Player of the Year and honored on four All-American teams. Additionally, he earned CoSIDA Academic All-American honors becoming the first baseball player in 17 years to be named an Academic All-American.
- In May 2021, the women's tennis team won the Conference USA Championship for the first time, its first conference championship since 2001. They have since won three-straight conference championships and have won an NCAA first round Tournament match

three-straight years, including wins over Arkansas and South Carolina, and has advanced to the final 32 each of the last three seasons.

- Over the 2021 and 2022 baseball seasons, ODU was one of just 11 schools in the country and the only school in Virginia to have back to back 40+ win seasons.
- ODU baseball has the 17th best winning percentage in the country since 2021.
- The baseball team won its first C-USA Championship, earned a No. 1 seed at the NCAA Regionals and received its highest final ranking in July 2021 of No. 16 in the Top-25 poll.
- Nineteen baseball players have been drafted under current head coach Chris Finwood, who Selig hired in 2010.

Hampton Roads Community outreach and support has been a staple under Selig's leadership:

- Selig spearheaded the return of the annual Khedive Shriners' Oyster Bowl game to Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium in 2011 and helped raise over \$250,000 for the Shriners' Children's Burn Hospital since that time.
- In 2022-23, ODU student-athletes were ranked #9 in the country with 5,321 total community service hours in the NCAA TeamWorks Challenge for all Division 1 schools.

Selig spent 11 years directing the Western Kentucky University Hilltopper athletic program, which won 70 Sun Belt Conference Championships from 2000-2010 and a national record 19 crowns in two seasons, 2008-2010. He also led WKU from FCS to FBS and is the only AD in the country to lead two institutions in this transition.

Prior to his stint at WKU, Selig served as the Senior Associate Athletic Director at the University of Virginia from 1988-1999, overseeing external operations his last five years. He began his athletic career as the Director of Ticketing at VCU, where he served from 1985-1988, finishing his stint as Assistant to the Athletic director.

Selig was a four-year member (2006-2010) of the NCAA Women's Basketball Committee and served as Chair of the Final Four site selection committee. He served as Chair for both the Sun Belt Conference Athletic Directors and the Men's Basketball Committees during his tenure at WKU. He has served on the prestigious Division I Championships/Sports Management Cabinet representing the CAA and is currently on the Elizabeth River Trail Board of Directors and serves on the executive committee for the Norfolk Forum and was recently named the groups secretary. He is a two-time winner of the Tom Fergusson Metropolitan Person of the Year award by the Norfolk Sports Club (2014, 2023), symbolic of his impact on the region's sports profile.

Selig was born in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, and raised in Norfolk, Virginia, where he attended Norfolk Collegiate School. He holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Washington and Lee University, a master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University and a doctorate in educational leadership from the University of Virginia, with a minor in business from the UVA Darden School of Business. His dissertation "The Study of Donor Predictability Among Alumni Athletes", won the 2002 CASE Outstanding Doctoral Dissertation.

Selig and his wife Ellen of Annapolis, MD, have three children, Lex, 26, Nick, 24 and Julianna, 19.







Chartway Arena

Chartway Arena, an 8,600 seat facility, is the home for the Old Dominion University basketball programs.

Building Location

Hampton Boulevard, across from the Batten Arts and Letters Building. The arena is the cornerstone for a 67-acre University Village that features shopping centers, restaurants, a variety of retail shops, research labs and residents.

Number of Seats

The arena has 8,600 fixed seats, including a super box with mini-suite for entertaining 40 to 50 guests and club level priority seating. In addition, there are 16 suites with 12 seats each, a group box on the private concourse level and 85 barrier free seats with 85 companion seats in the facility. When seating is added on the floor, capacity is about 10,000.

Building Size

The arena has 215,000 gross square-feet and consists of four parts- the seating bowl, multiple spaces for support functions for patrons, "back of the house" spaces to support center operations and a 10,000 square foot area of multi-purpose rooms that can be used for conferences, meetings, pre-and post activity gatherings, etc.

Flexibility

The bowl has been designed to allow 'downsizing' for a variety of University events ranging in size from 1,500 to 2,000 attendees and up. Retractable seating allows for events such as concerts, lectures and commencements.

Technology

Chartway Arena is alive with a new center-hung HD video scoreboard, LED ribbon displays and digital signage, and a newly branded 4400 Club premium seating area, all designed to provide entertaining game experiences for Monarch fans.

Highlighting the video package are four main video displays, four center- hung corner displays, a lower center-hung ring display, two end wall ribbon displays, two side wall ribbon displays, four vomitory displays, 16 scorer's tables and a three-sided outside marquee.

Parking Facilities

Two parking garages are located adjacent to the facility, and a shuttle bus system transports people from a variety of campus locations to the arena's events.

MITCHUM PERFORMANCE CENTER



Old Dominion University is committed to providing state-of-the-art facilities for student athletes that support dual goals for academic and athletic success. Part of the long-term campus master plan, the new Bernett and Blanche Mitchum Basketball Performance Center, informally known as "The Mitch," reflects this shared focus and prepares both the men's and women's Division I NCAA basketball programs for a bright future.

The Mitch is a \$8.5 million dollar state-of-the-art practice facility for both the ODU men's and women's basketball programs. The 24,000-square foot performance center opened in the Spring of 2017 and now currently serves as the home facility for the Monarch basketball players and coaches with locker rooms, offices and much more.

It puts ODU at the "top of the food chain" of facilities in Conference USA, AD Wood Selig said. "It screams commitment," Selig said during the dedication for the facility in May of 2017.

Standing at the corner of 43rd Street and Monarch Way, The Mitch is adjacent to the Chartway Arena, providing players and coaches easy, walkable access between their practice facility and their home on gameday.

Located on a small site next to The Ted, the desired programming called for the design team to reimagine how these spaces could work together, ultimately delivering a remarkably comprehensive facility despite the tiny footprint. The Mitch features a dedicated strength and conditioning room, sports medicine suite complete with hydrotherapy pools, hydration room, film room, men's and women's players' suites, office space, a main court with three cross courts, and a shooting court. Notably, the facility allots the exact same number of square feet to both the men's and women's programs, reflecting ODU's emphasis on equality.

The facility's exterior aligns with its surrounding context, with materiality reflective of the Ted, while the Monarch Way façade is reminiscent of the mixed-use storefronts of University Village. The use of glazing supports goals for transparency on the interior of the facility, bringing natural light into the corridor and coaches' office suites

On the interior, the coaches' offices provide direct visual connection to the practice court, promoting a collaborative environment between coaching staff and student athletes. The players' suites offer both traditional locker room amenities as well as lounge space where players can bond over gaming consoles or focus on academics.

The Basketball Performance Center advances ODU toward its goals to attract, retain, and support the highest level of academic and athletic talent. The Clark Nexsen/AECOM team partnered on the building design, sharing a vision for an environment of transparency and collaboration. The Basketball Performance Center is designed to LEED Silver certification.

\$8.5 million state-of-the-art facility was completed in Spring of 2017.

JEFF JONES - Monarch Head Coach



Head Men's Basketball Coach Jeff Jones begins his 11th season at Old Dominion with a 200-125 (.615) ODU record, including a 122-31 (.797) home record at Norfolk's Chartway Arena.

In his 31-year career, the legendary coach and former player boasts an overall record of 557-412 (.575), ranking him among the Top 100 D1 College Basketball Coaches with the most wins of all time

One of the most respected teachers in the collegiate ranks, Jones has been a consistent winner at every school, coaching his teams to 13 postseason appearances, including eight NCAA Tournament appearances. He has taken three schools in three different conferences to the NCAA Tournament, including an Elite 8 run in 1995 and a 1993 Sweet 16 appearance. He is a two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year (2002, 2009) and a Conference USA Coach of the Year (2019).

At ODU, Jones has led the Monarchs to a 2019 Conference USA Regular Season Championship, a 2019 Conference USA Tournament Championship, and a first-ever Top 25 ranking in 2015. Among his other overall wins: the Vegas 16 Championship (2016); two Patriot League tournament championships (2008, 2009); four Patriot League regular season championships (2002, 2004, 2008, 2009); and an ACC regular season championship (1995).

Jones remains the winningest head coach in American University history, and as the youngest head coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history, he took the University of Virginia to six postseason appearances in eight years.

Jones played in the Final Four as the starting point guard for UVA in 1980 and coached in the Final Four as a UVA assistant in 1984. He is the first person to have won the National Invitational Tournament Championship as both a player (1989) and as a head coach (1992).

Jones has also developed over 100 players who have played or are still playing professionally, including eight in the NBA (Ahmad Caver, Andre Ingram, John Crotty, Cory Alexander, Jamal Robinson, Bryant Stith, Junior Burrough, and Courtney Alexander). Eight of his former assistant coaches went on to become head coaches. Additionally, three of Jones' players have played in the NFL.

A leader among leaders, Jones was a longtime board member and the past president of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (2016-2017), representing over 5,000 coaches from all levels of the sport.

Old Dominion University (2013-2023) Overall: 200-125 (.615) Leagues: 113-63 (.642) Sun Belt: (11-7) C-USA: (102-56)

Jones was named the 13th head men's basketball coach at 01d Dominion University on April 4, 2013. In nine seasons in C-USA, 0DU ranked first in the league in overall road wins (57) and road wins within C-USA play (41). 0ld Dominion ranked second in the league for total wins (181), as well as home victories (63) and overall C-USA wins (102). During those nine seasons, Jones' teams finished in the top three six times.

Under Jones, the Monarchs have played in the NCAA Tournament, the NIT (including a trip to Madison Square Garden for the semifinals in 2015), the CBI semifinals, and won the Vegas 16.

His ODU teams held the longest road win streak in 2018 and the

5th longest home win streak in 2016. ODU meanwhile has led both the C-USA and the Sun Belt Conference in attendance at home games at Chartway Arena during Jones' tenure.

Jones' Monarchs received an NCAA Public Recognition Award from NCAA President Mark Emmert after reaching a four-year APR score of 990, which was 26 points higher than the National Average APR for men's basketball. The honor is given to teams with an APR in the top 10% of all teams in their respective sports.

2022-2023: Jones' 10th ODU season saw the Monarchs re-join the Sun Belt Conference and finish 19-12 overall and 11-7 in Sun Belt play. ODU ended the regular season knocking off the top two teams heading into the final weekend, Southern Miss and Marshall, at home. The Monarchs played their share of tight contests, going 6-2 in games decided by three points or less, including an Imo Essien buzzer-beating jumper at Texas State for a one-point win. Chaunce Jenkins was named to the Second Team All-Sun Belt Conference squad. Jones notched his 200th ODU win on February 24, 2023, in Chartway Arena.

2021-2022: The Monarchs finished the '22 season 13-19 with an 8-10 mark in C-USA play. Austin Trice was named to the Second Team All-C-USA squad, while Imo Essien, P.J. Gill, Jaylin Hunter, Jadin Johnson and D'Angelo Stines were named to the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll.

2020-2021: In his eighth season, Jones put together a 15-8 overall record and an 11-5 mark in league play, which earned the Monarchs a #2 seed in the C-USA Tournament and a first-round bye. Malik Curry earned All-C-USA Second Team and NABC All-District Team honors. Austin Trice was named the C-USA Sixth Player of the Year. Three student-athletes garnered C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll accolades, while Jaylin Hunter was the recipient of the John R. Broderick Award and a C-USA Commissioner's Academic Medal.

2019-2020: ODU finished Jones' 7th season with a 13-19 overall record and a conference record of 9-9. Forward Aaron Carver was named to the C-USA All Defensive Team. Jones earned career win number 500 at Northeastern on Nov. 16, 2019.

2018-2019: Jones' sixth season was a banner year for the Monarchs, which claimed the C-USA regular season title, as well as the C-USA Tournament crown, punching Old Dominion's first ticket to the NCAA Tournament since 2011. The team fell to Purdue in the first round in Hartford, Ct., but finished with a 26-9 record and 13-5 conference mark. ODU's B.J. Stith was named the C-USA Player of the Year, and he was joined by point guard Ahmad Caver on the C-USA All-Conference Team. Xavier Green was named to the C-USA All-Conference Defensive Team. Jones was named the C-USA Coach of the Year.

2017-2018: Jones compiled a 25-7 overall record in his fifth season at 0DU, his third season in four years with 25 or more victories. His 96 games over the previous four seasons ranked 27th nationally. Old Dominion went 15-3 in C-USA play and finished in second place, marking another year in excellent conference play. The fewest points ever allowed in 0DU history came in an 82-33 victory against UTEP. Ahmad Caver was named to the All-C-USA First Team and All-Defensive Team. B.J. Stith was named to the All-League Third Team. Five players were named to the C-USA Academic Honor Roll and the program was recognized by the NCAA for its APR.

2016-2017: In his fourth season at the helm in Norfolk, Jones and the Monarchs finished third in the C-USA with a 12-6 mark and a 19-12 overall record for the season. Old Dominion ranked No. 6 in the country for scoring defense, allowing just 61.2 points per outing. Ahmad Caver was named to the All-Conference Team, while Zoran Talley was tabbed as Sixth Man of the Year and Denzell Taylor garnered All-Defensive Team honors. The program marked a 55-14 record (80% winning percentage) when playing at home over the past four seasons.

2015-2016: Between the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons, Jones led ODU to 52 wins, which ranked in the top 20 nationally. In its third season leading Old Dominion, Jones and the Monarchs won a total of 25 games, including 15 of its last 18 contests. The Monarchs fell just two points shy of punching their ticket to the NCAA Tournament, losing a 55-53 heartbreaker to Middle Tennessee in the C-USA Championship, but the team went on to win the championship of Vegas 16 Tournament postseason. Point guard Trey Freeman earned First Team All-C-USA honors for the second straight season, and his scoring ranked No. 11 in the country. Freeman also led the entire country in made field goals with 323. Also in 2016, forward Brandan Stith was named

to the C-USA All-Defensive Team, while teammate Zoran Talley was named to the C-USA All-Freshman Team.

2014-2015: In just his first two seasons as head coach at ODU, Jones guided the Monarchs to 45 wins, including a 27-8 mark in 2015. The Monarchs finished second in C-USA in their second year in the league. During the regular season, Jones' Monarchs notched several big victories, as ODU took down nationally-ranked VCU and eventual NCAA Tournament team, Georgia State. His squad churned out 10 straight wins from Nov. 24 to Jan. 17, which included wins against C-USA foes Marshall and Charlotte as well as in-state rivals VCU, George Mason and William & Mary. ODU advanced to the semifinals of the NIT at Madison Square Garden after reeling off wins over Charleston Southern, Illinois State and an epic three-point buzzer-beating victory over Murray State. Redshirt junior Trey Freeman was named C-USA Newcomer of the Year, was an All-League first team selection and earned C-USA All-Academic Team honors. ODU won 32 straight games at home dating back to the 2013-14 season, which was the fourth-longest active home winning streak in NCAA Division I Basketball. Jones eclipsed the 400 collegiate wins milestone in the Monarchs' NIT-opener on March 18, 2015.

2013-2014: In his first season as the head coach at ODU, Jones guided the Monarchs to 18 wins, leading the nation with the biggest turnaround in total victories as compared to the year before , when the Monarchs had gone 5-25. ODU finished sixth in its first season in C-USA and advanced to the semifinals of the College Basketball Invitational postseason tournament.

American University (2000-2013) Overall: 211-182 (.537) Patriot League: 111-73 (.603)

Jones had a 211-183 record in 13 seasons at American University and took the school to its first-ever NCAA Tournaments with back-to-back appearances in 2008 and 2009, after guiding the program to the 2002, 2004, 2008 and 2009 Patriot League championship games.

Four of Jones' last six teams at American won 20 or more games. Among the highlights:

Jones led the Eagles to a 20- win season in 2011-12 and advanced to the Collegelnsider.com postseason tournament. His 2010-11 squad went 22-9 with 11 non-conference wins, and advanced to the Patriot League semifinals.

The 2008-09 AU team capped off the season with a 24-8 overall record, matching the program's record for wins, and a 13-1 Patriot League mark. The Eagles led the nation in road wins that season with 11, and their 59.1 points per game allowed average ranked 11th nationally. Jones was named Patriot League Coach of the Year and NABC District 13 Coach of the Year in 2009.

In the first round of the NCAA Tournament, despite holding a 14-point lead early in the second half, the 14th-seeded Eagles fell to Villanova in Philadelphia.

The 2007-08 Eagles captured the Patriot League title and advanced to AU's first-ever NCAA appearance after compiling a 21-12 record, which included a 67-59 win at the University of Maryland, the school's first win there in 80 years. His team faced the Tennessee in Birmingham in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, but despite leading early on, they lost 72-57. Previously, the Eagles became the first Patriot League team to beat an ACC team with a win over Florida State.

In 2001-02, AU won the regular season Patriot League title with an 18-12 record.

During his tenure at AU, Jones developed 21 players who were named All-Patriot League, 23 who went on to play professionally, two who earned Patriot League Rookie of the Year honors (Andre Ingram in 2004 and Derrick Mercer in 2006), and two Patriot League Players of the Year (Patrick Doctor in 2002 and Derrick Mercer in 2009).

Prior to American, Jones served as an assistant coach under Jerry DeGregorio at Rhode Island during the 1999-00 season.

University of Virginia (1990-1998) Overall: 146-104 (.584) ACC: 59-67 (.468)

Jones spent 20 years at the University of Virginia as a starting point guard, an assistant coach under Terry Holland (1982-1990), and for eight years as the head coach beginning in 1990.

After being named the youngest head coach in ACC history at the age of 29, Jones compiled 146 wins in eight years (146-104) for a .584 winning percentage. He led the Cavaliers to six postseason appearances (five NCAA, one NIT), including a 1995 NCAA Elite 8, a 1993 NCAA Sweet 16 appearance and an NIT championship in 1992, as well as one regular-season ACC championship, and four 20-win campaigns.

Virginia's win over Virginia Tech during the 1994-95 regular season gave Jones his 100th career victory, making him the second-fastest coach in school history and the fifth-fastest in ACC history to accomplish that feat. He also directed the Cavaliers to five of their top six seasons for field goal percentage defense at the time.

During his tenure as an assistant, Jones was a part of the Cavaliers' overall record of 162-95 (.630), participating in six NCAA Tournaments while advancing to the Final Four in 1984 and the Elite Eight in 1989.

As a four-year starting point guard for the Cavaliers (1979-1982), Jones was known as a leader and prolific passer. With Jones directing the potent offense, UVA compiled an overall record of 102-28 (.785) while leading the Cavaliers to two NCAAs and two NIT tournaments. With Jones as point guard, Virginia captured the 1980 NIT title and advanced to the Final Four in 1981.

Jones finished his career as Virginia's all-time assist leader (598) while also setting the single-season record with 200 assists during the 1979-80 season. Later, he saw both of those records eclipsed by his own player, John Crotty. Jones served as team captain as a senior during the 1981-82 season and played in 129 games during his career. During that time he averaged 6.6 points and 4.6 assists per game while shooting 52.2% from the field and 74.3% from the free-throw line

Jones graduated UVA in 1982 with a Bachelor of Science degree in psychology. He was selected in the fourth round of the 1982 NBA draft by the Indiana Pacers. A native of Owensboro, KY., Jones had a standout career at Apollo High School, where he was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame.

Off the Court

- Jones is an active volunteer for Coaches vs. Cancer, a partnership between the NABC and the American Cancer Society, and he serves on the national board of the Coaches vs. Cancer Council. With his wife, Jones has helped to raise more than \$100,000 since 2018 for the American Cancer Society, which honored him in 2019 with a Champion of Hope Award. He has supported many groups working to raise prostate cancer awareness, including ZERO Cancer's Grow & Give campaign.
- Jones actively supports veterans and has visited military bases in the Middle East three times as part of the Troops First Foundation's "Operation Hardwood." In 2008 and 2009 he traveled to Afghanistan and Iraq, and in 2023 he coached troops in a tournament at Camp Arifjan in Kuwait.
- Jones was honored nationally as the 2015 Barefoot Coach of the Year for his work, contributions, and creation of awareness for Samaritan's Feet, which provides shoes to impoverished children domestically and around the world.
- As part of his years of service on the National Association of Basketball Coaches board, Jones organized the annual Reese's College All-Star Game at the Final Four, choosing the players and coaches and sometimes coaching himself. At the end of his NABC board presidency in 2017, Jones was honored with the group's Newton S. Hillard award.
- Jones' father, the late Bob Jones, won the 1973 NCAA Division II National Title as the Head Men's Basketball Coach at Kentucky Wesleyan University (1972-1980).
- Jones is the father of three children, Meghann, Madison, and Jeff, and three grandchildren, Boyd, Bess, and Langley. He and his wife, the former Danielle Decker of Virginia Beach, live in Norfolk.

Malik Curry earned All-Conference USA Second Team honors, while Austin Trice was named the C-USA Sixth Player of the Year.

In his first season as an assistant coach, Kovensky helped senior Aaron Carver earn Conference USA All-Defensive Team and All-Academic Team accolades. Coach Kovensky was also part of history when Jeff Jones earned his 500th career win at Northeastern in 2019.

Coach Kovensky has served as a skills instructor to numerous highly touted players after they exhausted their collegiate eligibility, highlighted by Kent Bazemore (ODU), Trey Freeman (ODU), Dorian Finney-Smith (Florida), Frank Hassell (ODU), Cam Thomas (LSU), Matt Coleman (Texas) and Andre Jones (Winthrop).

Kovensky was the head coach of Monarch Nation in the 2018 The Basketball Tournament (TBT).

In 2011, he was a graduate manager for the Monarchs, while completing a M.S. degree in sports management from Old Dominion.

Prior to coming to ODU, Kovensky played collegiate football and basketball at Albright College, where he graduated with degrees in fine arts and business administration. A native of Hollidaysburg, Pa., Kovensky is the son of Susan Kovensky.



JAMAL ROBINSON - Assistant Coach

Jamal Robinson, now in his second season with the Monarchs, joined the Old Dominion coaching staff in August of 2022 after two years at LaSalle University.

Robinson, who played for Jones at the University of Virginia, enjoyed a 13-year professional career that included several teams in the National Basketball Association.

The 2022-23 season saw the Monarchs rejoin the Sun Belt Conference and finished 19-12 overall and 11-7 in league play. ODU ended the regular season knocking off the

top two teams heading into the final weekend, Southern Miss and Marshall, at home. The Monarchs played their share of tight contests going 6-2 in games decided by three points or less, including an Imo Essien buzzer-beating jumper at Texas State for a one-point win. Chaunce Jenkins was named to the Second Team All-Sun Belt Conference squad.

A native of Jamaica, Queens, New York, Robinson joined the collegiate ranks as an assistant at Hampton University in 2018. With the Pirates, they advanced to the Big South Conference finals in 2020 after defeating the top-seeded Radford Highlanders on their home court in the semifinals.

Prior to Hampton he had a successful stint as a developmental skill instructor. For almost a decade, Robinson worked directly with various elite basketball camps, including the Nike Pre-Draft Camp, along with assisting in the development of high school, college and professional basketball players.

Before that, Robinson enjoyed a massive amount of success as a player for over 13 years playing professionally at the highest levels in the world.

Robinson trained with various NBA teams, including the Portland Trailblazers, Miami Heat, Milwaukee Bucks, Cleveland Cavaliers, Orlando Magic and the Washington Wizards, before ultimately signing a two-year contract with the Miami Heat. He would also play in the CBA, the NBA Developmental League and internationally for over a decade, winning multiple league championships and individual accolades.

As a college player at Virginia, Robinson received ACC All-Tournament Team accolades as a freshman after helping the Cavaliers to the title game. He averaged 16.0 points per game over three contests, totaling 19 points and scoring the game-winning layup in a victory over No. 1 Duke. UVa would make the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 1994 and advance to the Elite Eight of the 1995 NCAA Tournament during his sophomore season.

A graduate of Monsignor McClancy in Queens, Robinson was named First Team All-City by the New York Daily News, the New York Post, and Newsday. Following his senior year, he was selected to play for the U.S. All-Stars in the Capital City High School All-American Game at the University of Maryland's Cole Fieldhouse against the Maryland All-Stars. Robinson became the first Monsignor McClancy Memorial High School alum to ever play in the NBA.

"I am looking forward to becoming a part of the Old Dominion staff and learn more from my college coach Jeff Jones," said Robinson. "Old Dominion is a proud program, and I am excited to work along with the other coaches to help our players reach their potential on and off the court."



JORDAN BROOKS - Assistant Coach



Experience: 2nd Season at ODU

College: Hampton '11

Jordan Brooks joined the coaching staff in August of 2022 serving as an assistant coach after serving as the Director of Recruiting after a year at Xavier University.

"We are very fortunate to have Jordan join our coaching staff. He is a young, energetic coach with a very bright future. His work ethic and ability to connect with people will have a positive impact on our Monarch program," said Jones.

ODU ended the regular season knocking off the top two teams heading into the final weekend, Southern Miss and Marshall, at home. The Monarchs played their share of tight contests going 6-2 in games decided by three points or less, including an Imo Essien buzzer-beating jumper at Texas State for a one-point win. Chaunce Jenkins was named to the Second Team All-Sun Belt Conference squad.

At Xavier, Brooks helped the Musketeers finish 23-13 and win the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) defeating Texas A&M in the finals.

Prior to Xavier, he served two years at Southeastern Louisiana and two years at Howard. While at Howard, Brooks recruited R.J. Cole, who went on to win MEAC Rookie of the Year and MEAC Player of the Year honors during his career. He also recruited and helped develop All-Conference players Chad Lott and Charles Williams.

Brooks helped Howard to a seven-game turnaround in his second season, as the Bison finished 17-17 overall and 10-6 in conference play. The Bison finished third in the MEAC and recorded their first winning regular season in four years. He has also helped the program receive its first post-season bid in over 20 years, making the College Basketball Invitational (CBI).

Upon the completion of that season, Brooks was recognized as one of the Nation's top young coaches as the National Association of Basketball Coaches named Brooks to its NABC 30-Under-30 Team.

Before Howard, Brooks coached and recruited at the 14U, 15U, and 16U grassroot levels developing several NCAA Division I student-athletes from top programs around Washington, D.C., including DC Assault, Team Takeover, Team Durant, and Team St8ment.

Brooks played his collegiately at Hampton (2007-2011), including the first three seasons under former Howard men's basketball head coach Kevin Nickelberry and last under Buck Joyner.

In 2011, he earned his bachelor's degree in sport management at Hampton. A year later, Brooks finished his MBA at Goldey-Beacom College, specializing in marketing management.

Brooks attended Charles Herbert Flowers High School in Springdale, Md., in the Washington, D.C., area, where he earned All-MET and All-PG County First Team honors.

"I am really excited about having the opportunity to work and learn from Coach Jeff Jones here at ODU. The program here has a lot of history and tradition and I am happy to be a part of it," Brooks said. "I can't wait to get to work and join an unbelievable staff of a great program, but to also help and develop the young men here on and off the court."



KIERAN DONOHUE - Special Asst. to Head Coach



Experience: 11th Season at ODU

College: Virginia '97



Kieran Donohue is in his 11th season at ODU, serving as a Special Assistant to the Head Coach for the Monarch basketball squad and has helped turnaround a program that won just five games in 2012-13 through his day-to-day operations.

During his time at ODU, Donohue has helped the Monarchs to a 2019 Conference USA Regular Season Championship, a 2019 Conference USA Tournament Championship and a first ever Top 25 ranking in 2015.

Since Donohue's arrival in 2013-14, ODU ranks first in the league for overall road wins and road wins within C-USA play. Old Dominion ranks second in the league for total wins since 2013-14, as well as home victories and overall C-USA wins.

The 2022-23 season saw the Monarchs rejoin the Sun Belt Conference and finished 19-12 overall and 11-7 in league play. ODU ended the regular season knocking off the top two teams heading into the final weekend, Southern Miss and Marshall, at home. The Monarchs played their share of tight contests going 6-2 in games decided by three points or less, including an Imo Essien buzzerbeating jumper at Texas State for a one-point win. Chaunce Jenkins was named to the Second Team All-Sun Belt Conference squad.

The 2021-22 season saw the Monarchs finish 13-18 with an 8-10 mark in league play. Austin Trice was named to the Second Team All-Conference USA squad, while Imo Essien, P.J. Gill, Jaylin Hunter, Jadin Johnson and D'Angelo Stines were named to the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll.

In 2020-21, Old Dominion compiled a 15-8 overall record and an 11-5 mark in league play, which earned the Monarchs a No. 2 seed in the Conference USA Tournament and first round bye. Malik Curry earned All-Conference USA Second Team and NABC All-District Team honors. Austin Trice was named the C-USA Sixth Player of the Year, while Jaylin Hunter was the recipient of the John R. Broderick Award and a Conference USA Commissioner's Academic Medal.

After going 25-7 in 2017-18, ODU had won 96 games over the previous four seasons, averaging 24 victories per year, which ranked 27th nationally. Old Dominion went 15-3 in C-USA play and finished in second place in 2017-18.

In 2016-17, ODU led Conference USA in attendance. The Monarchs defense ranked sixth in the country for defensive scoring, allowing just 61.2 points per contest.

In 2015-16, Old Dominion advanced to the Conference USA Championship, before winning the inaugural Vegas 16 Championship, while compiling a 25-13 overall record.

The Monarchs posted a 27-8 mark in 2014-15 and reached the NIT Semifinals at Madison Square Garden after defeating Charleston Southern, Illinois State and Murray State in the opening rounds.

His duties entail the overseeing the coordination of all day-to-day operations such as team travel, equipment, and scheduling for men's basketball, interface with the Old Dominion Athletic Foundation as it relates to donors and fundraising events for men's basketball and acts as the liaison with other campus and department areas.

While at American, Donohue was involved in all aspects of the American program, including on-court coaching, game and practice planning and recruiting. He worked with players in both team settings and on an individual basis to help them improve their playing skills. Donohue's role

also included scouting opponents for upcoming games, arranging and editing scouting films, writing scouting reports and coaching scout teams during practice. He also worked with evaluating and recruiting new players for the team. In addition, he was in charge of overseeing and administering the team's budget.

During his tenure at American, he helped develop two Patriot League Players of the Year, two Patriot League Rookies of the Year, 11 All-Patriot League First Team selections, seven All-Patriot League second team selections and 12 Patriot League All-Tournament Team selections. Donohue also helped lead the Eagles to two Patriot League Championships and NCAA Tournament appearances, four Patriot League regular season championships, five Patriot League

Championship game appearances and 20-win seasons in four of the last six years.

Prior to his appointment at American, Donohue spent two seasons as an administrative assistant for the men's basketball program at Boston University. His duties with the Terriers included travel and transportation organization, film exchange policy and personnel management. He also helped direct the BU summer basketball camps.

Donohue is no stranger to head coach Jeff Jones' successful system, after serving on his staff at the University of Virginia. During Jones' tenure at Virginia, Donohue served the program in several different capacities, beginning as a student manager in 1993 and continuing through 1998.

Donohue earned a bachelor of arts degree in history from Virginia in 1997. He attended Regis High School in New York City, where he played point guard on the 1993 championship team and 1992 runners-up for the New York State Class C title.

Donohue and his wife, the former Erika Helmrich, an American alumnae and former lacrosse player for the Eagles, have two daughters, Molly and Nora.

Socha joined the Monarchs after eight years as the Head Strength and Conditioning Coach for Football at the University of Washington. He was responsible for overseeing the design, implementation and organization of the strength and conditioning program for football.

While with the Huskies, the football program won two Pac-12 championships, a North Division championship and appeared in a New Year's Six Bowl for three straight years. In that stretch was the 2016 season when the Huskies made the College Football Playoff and participated in the Peach Bowl. WHY MONARCHS



For many years, the athletic teams of the Norfolk Division of the College of William & Mary (as Old Dominion was formerly called) were known as the Braves. This was a derivation of the William & Mary nickname of Indians. As Old Dominion achieved its own four-year status and saw its enrollment surpass that of its Williamsburg neighbor, it was no longer suitable or acceptable to have its teams called the Braves.

The name Monarchs evokes much of the early history of the Commonwealth of Virginia and of Old Dominion's mother institution, the College of William and Mary. The nickname "Old Dominion" was first coined to the Virginia colony by King Charles II after Virginia's loyalty to the crown during the English Civil War. Furthermore, William III and Mary II, whose patronage helped found the College of William and Mary in Virginia in 1693, ruled England at the invitation of Parliament as "joint monarchs."

The Monarch used by Old Dominion has a royal crown on a lion's head, representing an historic past and a strong future.





The Sun Belt Conference (SBC) has established itself as a leader among intercollegiate athletics leagues since its move to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2001.

Founded in 1976, the Sun Belt now features 14 dynamic member institutions across 10 contiguous states. The Sun Belt boasts broad-based excellence across its 18 sponsored sports, in the classroom and in the communities across the league's footprint.

The 2022 campaign will mark the first as a 14-member football conference. In the College Football Playoff era (since 2014), the Sun Belt paces the FBS with a .649 bowl winning percentage. Consider the Sun Belt's impressive football accomplishments:

- The Sun Belt is home to three of the top-15 teams in the FBS in winning percentage since 2020 more than the rest of the Group of Five combined: Louisiana (23-2, .920), Coastal Carolina (22-3, .880) and App State (19-7, .731).
- In 2021, three Sun Belt teams accumulated double-digit wins during the regular season for the first time in league history. Two programs (Coastal Carolina and Louisiana) finished in the final AP Poll, Coaches Poll and College Football Playoff Rankings for the first time in conference history.
- The Sun Belt had 17 student-athletes in 2021 combine to earn 42 All-America honors with eight programs producing at least one All-America honoree.
- The Sun Belt has had at least one selection in 14 consecutive NFL Drafts and has claimed multiple picks in 13 of the last 14. With five players taken by the 161st overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft, that marked the fastest the Sun Belt reached five selections in conference history. Four times, the Sun Belt has produced six-or-more NFL Draft picks in a single year (2010, 2012, 2020, 2022).

The Sun Belt's success extends far beyond the football field and into a number of team and individual successes in each of its sports:

- The Sun Belt has been a multi-bid league in both baseball (4 in 2022) and softball (4 in 2021) over the past two seasons.
- Six Sun Belt men's basketball programs made postseason appearances in 2022.
- Melissa Jefferson of Coastal Carolina track & field is the reigning women's indoor 60-meter NCAA National Champion. She recently captured the 2022 U.S. Championship in the women's 100-meter dash, setting an all-dates, all-time collegiate record for the women's 100 meters.
- The Sun Belt's nine men's soccer programs have combined for more than 100 all-time NCAA Tournament appearances.

The Sun Belt Conference is showcased nationwide through a media rights partnership with ESPN that runs through the 2030-31 academic year. The Sun Belt enjoyed a viewership of 18.2 million during the 2021 football season. During the 2021 regular season, three games featuring Sun Belt Conference teams surpassed one million viewers. Each of the four bowl games in which Sun Belt programs participated this past season also saw a viewership of greater than one million. For the 11th consecutive year in 2022, every Sun Belt home football game will appear on an ESPN platform.

The Sun Belt Conference has transitioned to a neutral-site model for many of its championship events to provide an enhanced experience for student-athletes and fans. Pensacola, Fla., will serve as home for the Sun Belt Men's and Women's Basketball Championships through the 2024-25 season and ticket sales for that event increased 30 percent in 2022. Women's soccer (Foley, Ala.), volleyball (Foley, Ala.) and baseball (Montgomery, Ala.) have also established long-term agreements.



As part of the Sun Belt's commitment to racial justice, the conference launched BE THE CHANGE during the summer of 2020 – focusing attention on American civil rights, promoting civic engagement, and creating dialogue with law enforcement. The conference also established and encouraged its teams and fans to visit the Sun Belt Conference Civil Rights Trail, which highlights historic sites and landmarks found within the league's geographic footprint.

The Sun Belt supports more than 5,500 student-athletes in sponsoring 18 NCAA sports.

The Sun Belt's 14 member institutions are App State, Arkansas State, Coastal Carolina, Georgia Southern, Georgia State, James Madison, Louisiana, ULM, Marshall, Old Dominion, South Alabama, Southern Miss, Texas State and Troy.

LEO ANTHONY (1957-61)

Leo Anthony became the school's first All-American (third team) in 1959 when Old Dominion was known as the Norfolk Division of the College of William and Mary. Anthony concluded his career with 2.181 career points which is second on the school's all-time scoring

list. His career average of 26.6 points is the best ever at Old Dominion. He holds the school record for career free-throws (643), and scored 35 or more points 12 times during his career. He broke the 30-point barrier 29 times. Anthony is a charter member in the Old Dominion Sports Hall of Fame in 1980.

JOEL COPELAND (1970-74)

Joel Copeland earned first-team All-American honors (1973-74) his senior year and second-team All-American honors as a junior. During his four-year career, Copeland scored 1,657 points and grabbed 929 rebounds. He still holds school records for points (682) and most field goals attempted (568) for a single season.

Copeland was drafted in 1973 by the NBA New Orleans Jazz, and played professionally in Sweden from 1975-78. He was inducted into the Old Dominion Sports Hall of Fame in 1982. His jersey number 32 was retired.

KENNY GATTISON (1982-86)

Kenny Gattison was a two-time Sun Belt Conference All-Star and in 1986 was the league's Player of the Year. During his four seasons at Old Dominion, the Monarchs advanced to two NCAA Tournaments and two National Invitation Tournaments. Gattison still holds the Sun Belt career rebound mark of 963 which ranks

him fourth on the Monarchs all-time list. He set the school's single season field goal percentage record of .637. He is currently eighth on the Old Dominion all-time scoring list with 1623. He is sixth in field goal percentage (.552) and played the most games (122). Gattison earned honorable mention All-American honors twice in 1985 and 1986. He was drafted in the third round by the Phoenix Suns. He was inducted into the ODU Sports Hall of Fame in 1991. His jersey number, 44, was retired at Scope in 1992. Kenny served as an assistant coach with the New Orleans Hornets for six years. Former assistant coach with the Atlanta Hawks.

DAVE TWARDZIK (1969-72)

Old Dominion's first ever first-team All-American (1972), Dave Twardzik holds several school assist records, including single-game (20) and single-season average (11.4), career assists average (10.7), single game free throws (24) and free throw attempts (26). A third-team All-American as a junior, Twardzik went

on to play five years of professional basketball with the Portland Trailblazers, leading them to the 1977 world championship. He was inducted into the Old Dominion Sports Hall of Fame in 1981. His jersey number 14 was retired in 1972 in the Fieldhouse. Twardzik also played for the Virginia Squires of the now-defunct ABA. He was inducted into the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame in 1995.

WILSON WASHINGTON (1975-77)

Wilson Washington became Old Dominion's first Division I All-American in 1977 after earning Division II All-American honors in 1975 (third team) and in 1976 (first team). In two and a half years at Old Dominion, Washington scored 1,366 career points, grabbed 1,011 rebounds and blocked 363 shots. He grabbed a career high 24 rebounds against Roanoke in 1976. Washington was selected as the NCAA's Division

Il tournament's Most Valuable Player in 1975 when Old Dominion defeated New Orleans for the NCAA crown in Evansville, Indiana. A second-round draft pick by the Philadelphia 76ers (1977), Washington played two seasons for the New Jersey Nets. His jersey number, 52, was retired in 1978. He was inducted into the Old Dominion Sports Hall of Fame in 1983.





MARK WEST (1979-83)

Mark West was named honorable mention All-American by The Sporting News in 1981

and by the Assocciated Press in 1982 and 1983. He was also named by Basketball Weekly to its 1980 Freshman All-American squad. West led the nation in blocked shots twice and was a first team All-Sun Belt conference selection as a senior. He grabbed a career high 23 rebounds

in 1980 against Texas Wesleyan. He is Old Dominion's all-time blocked shot leader with 446, second in career rebounds with 1,113 and in field goal percentage at .559. West began his NBA career with the Dallas Mavericks, played 17 years in the NBA and is now Assist. Coach with the Phoenix Suns. His jersey number 45 was retired in 1984 in Scope and the Petersburg, Virginia, native was inducted into the ODU Sports Hall of Fame in 1988 and inducted into the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

ODELL HODGE (1992-97)

Odell Hodge is one of only four Virginia Division I collegians to score over 2,000

career points and haul in over 1,000 career rebounds. Hodge was named CAA Player Of the Year and Tournament MVP in 1994 and 1997. In 1997, he was the recipient of the CAA's prestigious Dean Ehlers Award

for his sportsmanship, leadership and community service. Hodge completed his career at ODU with 2,117 career points and 1,086 career rebounds. He was named to the CAA's All-Defensive squad in 1997 and ranks sixth all-time in CAA scoring, second only to David Robinson in career blocked shots with 286, and third in CAA history in rebounds. He also earned Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American honors and NABC first team All-District honors in 1997. Hodge was the CAA Rookie of the Year in 1993 and freshman All-American. Hodge was selected to the CAA's 25th Anniversary team and his jersey was retired at ODU on Feb. 13, 2010 at halftime of the George Mason contest. The Martinsville, Va. native was also the all-time scorer in Virginia High School league history.


KENT BAZEMORE (2008-12)

In 2011, Bazemore was named the Lefty Driesell National Defensive Player of the Year. He was named to the All-CAA Team in 2011 and 2012, while garnering All-Defensive Team honors in 2010, 2011 and 2012. Bazemore was named the CAA Defensive Player of the Year in 2011 and 2012.

On ODU's all-time lists, Bazemore ranks first for most games played in a career with 140, tied for first for most wins in a career with 101, second for steals with 250 for a 1.8 average, 16th for assists with 379 for a 2.7 average and 21st for scoring with 1,416 total points for a 10.1 average.

Bazemore helped lead Old Dominion to back-to-back CAA Championships in 2009-10 and 2010-11. In the First Round of the 2010 NCAA Tournament, Bazemore and the Monarchs upset No. 6 seeded Notre Dame in New Orleans, giving ODU its first NCAA Tournament win since 1995. His jersey was honored on Dec. 10. 2016.

POST-SEASON RESULTS

Old Dominion University has been a regular in post-season play. The Monarchs made its biggest impression in the 1995 NCAA tournament with a stunning, 89-81 triple overtime victory over third seed and Big East Champion Villanova, in Albany, NY.

In 2010 ODU knocked off sixth seeded Notre Dame, 51-50 in New Orleans.

Old Dominion made its initial appearance in the NCAA Division I tournament in 1980, dropping an 87-74 decision to eventual NCAA tournament runner-up UCLA. Old Dominion's second NCAA tournament game came in March of 1982 with a 74-57 loss to Wake Forest. In 1985, Old Dominion lost to SMU in Hartford, CT. In 1986 the Monarchs defeated West Virginia in the first round, 72-64, before losing to NCAA runner-up Duke in the second round. In 1992, Old Dominion lost to NCAA quarterfinalist Kentucky in the NCAA East Region at

The Monarchs appeared in the National Invitational Tournament in 1977, 1979, 1981, 1983, 1984, 1988, 1993, 1994, 1999, 2006 and 2015. In 1979, the Monarchs advanced to the quarterfinals with wins over Wagner, and Clemson, before losing at Purdue. In 1994, the Monarchs reached the second round of the NIT. In 2006 and 2015, the Monarchs reached the mecca of college basketball, the semifinals in Madison Square Garden.

ODU competed in the College Basketballl Invitational (CBI) in 2008 and 2014 and captured the inaugural CIT, College insider. com tournament title in 2009, before winning the inaugural Vegas 16 chmapionship in 2016.

The Monarchs won the C-USA regular season and tournemant title in 2019, punching the program's first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 2011.



COACHES & CAPTAINS

Old Dominion University has enjoyed an impressive basketball tradition. Since fielding its first team in 1930, Old Dominion has won 1,385 games in 88 years, a winning percentage of .593.

Founded in 1930 as the Norfolk Division of the College of William and Mary, the institution gained independence in 1962 and became Old Dominion College. In 1969, University status was granted and the name was changed to Old Dominion University.

Sonny Allen was named head coach at Old Dominion in 1965, following athletic director Bud Metheny's outstanding career. In ten years, Allen led the Monarchs to 181 wins, and a second place national finish at the 1970 NCAA Division II championships. In 1975 his Monarchs took the ultimate prize with the National Championship.

Paul Webb took control in 1975-76 and led the Monarchs to a fourth place finish at the NCAA Division II nationals. Webb successfully guided the Old Dominion program to one of the nation's premier Division I basketball programs. In ten seasons, Webb won 196 victories and took the Big Blue to nine national post-season tournaments.

In 1985, the reigns were turned over to Tom Young and he guided the Monarchs to a 23-8 mark in 1986 and an NCAA bid. The Monarchs advanced to the second round for the first time ever. In 1987-88, Old Dominion was 18-12 and earned a NIT bid. In 1991-92, former captain Oliver Purnell returned to his alma mater and led Old Dominion to the CAA title and a trip to the NCAA. In 1993 and 1994 the Monarchs advanced to the second round of the NIT. Jeff Capel took over in 1994-95 and guided the Monarchs to the second round of the NCAA after a stunning victory over third seed Villanova, 89-81 in triple overtime. Capel again guided Old Dominion to a CAA title and NCAA Tournament play in 1997.

In April of 2001, Blaine Taylor became the Monarchs fifth Division I head coach. He guided ODU to the school's most wins in a single season (28) in 2004-05, winning the CAA crown and advancing to the NCAA tournament. The following year, ODU won another 24 games and reached the semi-finals of the NIT at Madison Square Garden.

The 2007 Monarchs won another 24 games and advanced to the NCAA tournament as an at-large team. In 2008, ODU reached the quarterfinals of the inaugural College Basketball Invitational (CBI).

In 2008-09 the Monarchs won the championship of the inaugural College Insider. com tournament with a 25-10 record.

In 2009-10, ODU captured its fifth CAA title and advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament after beating sixth seeded Notre Dame, 51-50.

In 2010-11, ODU won its second straight CAA crown and lost at the buzzer to Butler in the NCAA Tournament. In 2011-12, ODU advanced to the Quarterfinals of the CIT

Jeff Jones took over the reign eight years ago and led the Monarchs to the nation's biggest turnaround in wins and advanced to the semifinals of the CBI Tournament in year one. The following season, Jones led ODU to all the way to Madison Square Garden for the semifinals of the NIT. In year three, the Monarchs claimed victory in the first ever Vegas 16 post-season Tournament. In year four, Jones led ODU to a 19-12 record, which was good for a third place finish in the league. In year five, Jones and the Monarchs went 25-7 overall and 15-3 in league play, which was good enough for a second place finish in the conference. In 2018-19, Jones led the Monarchs to a 26-9 overall record, as they won the C-USA regular season and conference championship, punching the program's first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 2011.

Twenty-two players have been accorded All-American honors since 1958, including first team selections Wilson Washington (1975-76), Joel Copeland (1973-74) and Dave Twardzik (1972-73).
