Brian O. Hemphill, Ph.D., Old Dominion University's ninth president effective July 1, 2021, is an unwavering champion for access and

opportunity, as well as innovation and research, with a deep commitment to forward-focused leadership. President Hemphill is proud to lead ODU with a steadfast dedication to excellence, a firm commitment to accountability and transparency, and — most importantly — a strong focus on diversity, equity, and inclusion, as well as student success.

President Hemphill's road to ODU has taken him from the University of Arkansas-Fayetteville, a flagship university, where he served as Associate Vice Chancellor and Dean of Students; to Northern Illinois University, a large, public, research university, where he served as Vice President for Student Affairs and Enrollment Management and Associate Professor for eight years; West Virginia State University, a public, land-grant, research university, where he served as the 10th President and Professor for four years; and, most recently, Radford University, a comprehensive university, where he served as the seventh President and Professor for five years.

President Hemphill earned a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration and Policy Studies from the University of Iowa, a Master of Science degree in Journalism and Mass Communication from Iowa State University of Science and Technology, and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Organizational Communication from Saint Augustine's University. President Hemphill is a published author with a multitude of writings covering topics related to gun violence and threat preparedness on college campuses; emerging financial concerns affecting the collegiate sphere; STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) and economic-related issues pertaining to education;

and a myriad of additional scholarly perspectives pertinent to the higher education environment. President Hemphill co-edited a book, titled "College in the Crosshairs: An Administrative Perspective on Prevention of Gun Violence." He is a highly sought-after keynote speaker, guest presenter, and panelist with frequent appearances across the country.

President Hemphill's passion for life and unparalleled commitment to excellence begins at home where he shares his life with his loving and supportive wife. Dr. Marisela Rosas Hemphill, who proudly serves as ODU's First Lady. The Hemphills are the proud parents of energetic twins, Catalina and Cruz. Dr. Camden Wood Selig is in his 14th year as Director of Athletics at Old Dominion University, where his "Championship Effort" philosophy has helped guide the department as one of the most respected and successful intercollegiate programs in the nation. Of the 133 FBS Athletic Directors, Selig is the 13th longest FBS tenured in the country. He is in his 25th year as a Division I AD.

During his tenure, Selig has directed the University's move through two FBS conferences and has Old Dominion positioned strongly in the Sun Belt Conference. He has overseen the

transition of a startup FCS football program to the FBS level, led major athletic facility expansion and enhancement for virtually all 18 programs, and added women's volleyball in 2019.

One needs only to visit the ODU campus to see Selig's contributions to the growth and improvement of Monarch athletic venues with well over \$100 million invested in Intercollegiate athletic facilities since his arrival. Projects completed and initiated under Selig include:

- ODU opened the \$67.5 million Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium on Saturday, August 31, 2019 against Norfolk State.
 The stadium rebuilding was completed in nine months.
- A \$20 million baseball renovation began in the fall of 2022. The new stadium, which should be complete for the 2026 season, will be called the Ellmer Family Baseball Complex.
- The Bernett & Blanche Mitchum Basketball Performance Center, a privately funded \$8.4 million state-of-the-art facility, is complete and is the new training center for the ODU men's and women's basketball teams.
- The \$3.5 million repurposing of the arena in the Jim Jarrett Athletic building is now the brand-new 900 seat home of the ODU women's volleyball program.
- A \$3.5 million expansion of L.R. Hill support facility for football, women's field hockey, and women's lacrosse, including a
 new state-of-the-art weight room.
- The addition of a \$2.3 million video replay scoreboard, LED ribbon panels, and digital tables at Chartway Arena.
- The \$600,000 Paul A. Keyes Indoor Hitting Complex, which opened in the fall of 2014.

As collegiate athletic costs continue to rise, Selig has placed a premium on increasing privately generated revenue. Since his arrival in 2010:

- Total ODAF philanthropic gifts for athletics have surpassed \$140 million.
- Corporate sponsorship revenue has surpassed \$33 million.
- Staff giving to the Old Dominion Athletic Foundation (ODAF) has remained at 100% for thirteen consecutive years.
 And, in ODU's first year in the Sun Belt Conference, they led in attendance for men's and women's basketball and set a single-season ODU record for football.

One of the most dramatic and gratifying accomplishments for Selig has been the academic success of the 18 teams. Highlights from 2022-23 include:

- An ODU record 197 student athletes (49%) earned Dean's List honors with a 3.4 or higher GPA.
- An ODU record 3.26 cumulative GPA for all 475 student-athletes.
- At least a 3.0 GPA recorded by 71% of student-athletes.
- A 3.0 GPA or higher for 16 of 18 teams.

Monarch teams have performed well on the playing fields under Selig, highlighted by:

Fifteen Conference Championships since 2010, including back-to-back championships for women's soccer and three
straight conference championships for women's tennis. ODU's three Sun Belt Conference Championships in 2022-23 were
the second most in the league and the most of the four new arrivals (ODU, James Madison, Marshall, Southern Miss).

In Selig's tenure there have also been numerous firsts and achievements that haven't been accomplished in many years, including:

- Linebacker Jason Henderson in 2022 became the first ODU football player to earn All-America honors at the FBS level.
- In 2016, ODU participated in its first bowl game in the Bahamas. In 2021, went to its 2nd bowl game in Myrtle Beach.
- Women's soccer won its first C-USA Championship in 2022 and first conference championship since 2006.

- In June 2022, baseball first baseman Matt Coutney was named C-USA Player of the Year and honored on four All-American teams. Additionally, he earned CoSIDA Academic All-American honors becoming the first baseball player in 17 years to be named an Academic All-American.
- In May 2021, the women's tennis team won the Conference USA Championship for the first time, its first conference
 championship since 2001. They have since won three-straight conference championships and have won an NCAA first
 round Tournament match three-straight years, including wins over Arkansas and South Carolina, and has advanced to the
 final 32 each of the last three seasons.
- Over the 2021 and 2022 baseball seasons, ODU was one of just 11 schools in the country and the only school in Virginia to have back to back 40+ win seasons.
- ODU baseball has the 17th best winning percentage in the country since 2021.
- · Nineteen baseball players have been drafted under current head coach Chris Finwood, who Selig hired in 2010.
- The baseball team won its first C-USA Championship, earned a No. 1 seed at the NCAA Regionals and received its highest final ranking in July 2021 of No. 16 in the Top-25 poll.

Hampton Roads Community outreach and support has been a staple under Selig's leadership:

- Selig spearheaded the return of the annual Khedive Shriners' Oyster Bowl game to Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium in 2011 and helped raise over \$250,000 for the Shriners' Children's Burn Hospital since that time.
- In 2022-23, ODU student-athletes were ranked #9 in the country with 5,321 total community service hours in the NCAA TeamWorks Challenge for all Division 1 schools.

Selig spent 11 years directing the Western Kentucky University Hilltopper athletic program, which won 70 Sun Belt Conference Championships from 2000-2010 and a national record 19 crowns in two seasons, 2008-2010. He also led WKU from FCS to FBS and is the only AD in the country to lead two institutions in this transition.

Prior to his stint at WKU, Selig served as the Senior Associate Athletic Director at the University of Virginia from 1988-1999, overseeing external operations his last five years. He began his athletic career as the Director of Ticketing at VCU, where he served from 1985-1988, finishing his stint as Assistant to the Athletic director.



Selig was a four-year member (2006-2010) of the

NCAA Women's Basketball Committee and served as Chair of the Final Four site selection committee. He served as Chair for both the Sun Belt Conference Athletic Directors and the Men's Basketball Committees during his tenure at WKU. He has served on the prestigious Division I Championships/Sports Management Cabinet representing the CAA and is currently on the Elizabeth River Trail Board of Directors and serves on the executive committee for the Norfolk Forum and was recently named the groups secretary. He is a two-time winner of the Tom Fergusson Metropolitan Person of the Year award by the Norfolk Sports Club (2014, 2023), symbolic of his impact on the region's sports profile.

Selig was born in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, and raised in Norfolk, Virginia, where he attended Norfolk Collegiate School. He holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Washington and Lee University, a master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University and a doctorate in educational leadership from the University of Virginia, with a minor in business from the UVA Darden School of Business. His dissertation "The Study of Donor Predictability Among Alumni Athletes", won the 2002 CASE Outstanding Doctoral Dissertation.

Selig and his wife Ellen of Annapolis, MD, have three children, Lex, 26, Nick, 24 and Julianna, 19.



ABOUT THE MONARCHS

ODU (17-6, 8-4 Sun Belt) is coming off a 2-0 week that saw the Monarchs defeat Troy at home 63-59 last Wednesday and earn an 82-76 road win against Kent State in the second round of the MAC-Sun Belt Challenge. Jordan McLaughlin was voted the conference Player of the Week on Tuesday after leading ODU with 38 points and shooting a combined 14-for-16 (.875) from the free-throw line to clinch both wins. ODU enters the week at the No. 119 spot in the latest NET rankings and the team also returned to Collegelnsider. com's Mid-Major Top 25 Poll on Tuesday, landing at the No. 24 spot. The Monarchs are averaging 63.4 points per game and lead the Sun Belt in scoring defense with 59.0 points allowed per game. ODU is also tied with Marshall for the league's best winning percentage and is 25th in the country in steals per game (10.8) and 26th in turnovers forced per game (20.52). The Monarchs are shooting a combined .373 from the field, including a .271 clip from distance, and .676 at the line. With six games remaining in the regular season, ODU is currently tied for fourth in the conference standings alongside Georgia State.

DeLisha Milton-Jones, the 2022 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame with a decorated professional career in the WMBA and overseas and former head coach at Pepperdine University, was announced as the new head coach of the Old Dominion women's basketball program by Director of Athletics Dr. Camden Wood Selig on April 17, 2020.

The 2022-23 season saw ODU transition to the Sun Belt Conference, with the Monarchs reaching the semifinals of the conference tournament championship in Pensacola, Florida and finishing 22-12 overall with a 12-6 mark in Sun Belt play. Amari Young earned All-Conference Second Team honors and represented ODU on the All-Tournament Team. Kaye Clark was the league leader in both steals (85) and steals per game (2.50). ODU also landed on Collegelnsider.com's Mid-Major Top 25 poll four times throughout the season, ranking as high as No. 18.

In her second season, the Monarchs finished with a 24-10 overall record and a Conference USA ledger of 12-6 in 2021-22. ODU opened by splitting its first four games with a pair of wins at home, including a Power 5 win over SEC member Auburn. The Monarchs then closed out 2021 with eight straight wins that saw them register another Power 5 win by knocking off Texas Tech in the Van Chancellor Classic en route to winning its bracket there. That streak went to nine to start 2022 as they opened conference play winning at UTSA. ODU also scored a road win over eventual Conference USA Champion Charlotte in late January.

The Monarchs did close their C-USA tenure with a feat only accomplished by the first team in the C-USA as Iggy Allen and Ajah Wayne earned First Team All-C-USA honors. The last time that was done was in 2013-14, the first year the Monarchs were members. Allen was also a First Team All-VaSID choice as ODU ended its season in the second round of the WNIT after scoring a road win at Towson.

Milton-Jones guided the Monarchs to a 13-11 overall mark and a Conference USA Tournament Semifinals appearance in 2020-21. She notched her first win on the Monarchs' bench on Dec. 3 with a 70-47 result over William & Mary in ODU's home opener. Just three days later, she picked up another win over an instate opponent — beating eventual Atlantic 10 champion VCU 81-76 in overtime. The Monarchs closed out the regular season with four wins in their last five games, including a 74-57 triumph on the road at C-USA Champions Middle Tennessee. Milton-Jones' Monarchs carried that momentum with them to Frisco, Texas for the C-USA Tournament. ODU won three games in as many days, including a pair of overtime victories, to reach the semifinals as the No. 6 seed out of the east. ODU took Rice, the west's top seed, to the brink before eventually falling 62-60. In all, the Monarchs were 7-2 in their final nine games.

Under the tutelage of Milton-Jones, three Monarchs earned significant accolades in 2020-21. Victoria Morris and Amari Young both placed on the all-conference second team. Young was also on the C-USA All-Defensive Team and the VaSID All-State Second Team. Wayne played her way on to the C-USA All-Tournament Team. ODU also found success in the classroom in 2020-21 with nine players featured on the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll.

Milton-Jones has excelled at every stop of her basketball career. She started her college coaching career as an assistant at Pepperdine in 2016-17. After one season, she moved into the head coaching role and led the program to unprecedented success. In the 2017-18 season, she guided Pepperdine to 10 wins, the most at the Malibu school since 2012. In her second year, the Waves finished 22-10, winning 12 more games than the previous year in one of the best turnarounds in the country. The Waves' 22 victories in 2018-19 also marked the program's most since 2002. Pepperdine earned a WNIT bid for the program's first postseason tournament appearance, and then advanced to the Sweet 16 with wins over St. Mary's and Cal Baptist.

She left Pepperdine for the assistant coaching role at Syracuse following the 2019 WNIT run. Milton-Jones joined the staff of veteran head coach Quentin Hillsman. With Milton-Jones on the bench, the Orange put together a 16-15 mark, highlighted by wins over No. 5 Louisville and No. 8 Florida State.

Milton-Jones's coaching career followed a long and successful professional and international basketball career. Drafted fourth in the 1999 WNBA draft, she played 17 years in the league, retiring from the WNBA in 2016 after setting the record for most games played in league history with 499, which was later broken by WNBA great Sue Bird. She helped lead the Los Angeles Sparks to back-to-back WNBA Championships in 2001 and 2002. She was selected to the WNBA All-Star team in 2000, 2004 and 2007. In all, Milton-Jones played for Atlanta. New York, Washington and San Antonio, in addition to

Los Angeles. Her 5,571 career points still rank ninth in WNBA history. She also made stops in Spain, Italy, Turkey, South Korea, the Czech Republic and Russia to play professionally.

On the international stage, Milton-Jones helped the United States win Olympic gold medals in 2000 and 2008. In the latter, she was coached by former ODU legend, Anne Donovan. She

Milton-Jones's first venture into coaching came when she was named interim coach of the Los Angeles Stars midway through the 2005 American Basketball Association. She became just the second woman to coach a men's professional basketball team.

missed the 2004 Olympics with an injury. While playing for the national team, Milton-Jones

also helped Team USA win FIBA Championships in 1998 and 2002.

Milton-Jones, who played for four years for Carol Ross at Florida, had one of the most remarkable college careers at Florida, capped off her senior year when she was named the 1997 Wade Trophy Winner, the 1997 EC Player of the Year and a First Team All-American selection amongst other highly-touted accolades. She scored 1,858 points during her career, helping the Gators to four straight NCAA tournament appearances. Ironically, her final collegiate game was a 53-51 loss to Old Dominion in the 1997 NCAA Elite Eight. She was named to the Florida Gator Hall of Fame in 2007.

Coastal Carolina (8-17, 2-10 Sun Belt) has dropped its past two games, falling 80-70 to App State on Feb. 3 and losing a close game to Texas State, 52-49 last Wednesday. CCU was off this past Saturday as the team did not participate in this season's MAC-Sun Belt Challenge. Coastal is currently 239th in the most recent NET rankings and the team is averaging 66.6 ppg while giving up 72.9 ppg. The Chanticleers come into Wednesday's game shooting .396 as a team, .266 from the perimeter, and .631 at the charity stripe. CCU's best statistical category is in free-throw attempts, ranking ninth in the country with 23.32 per game. The Chants are also third in the Sun Belt in free throws made per game (14.72) and blocks per game (3.3). Coastal is currently 13th in the league standings and will play at James Madison on Saturday.



ALCOHOL POLICY

Guests are not permitted to bring alcohol into the facility, nor are they permitted to leave with alcohol beverages. Beer and wine will be sold at concession stands. Virginia State laws prohibit the consumption of any alcoholic beverage by any persons under the age of 21. We reserve the right to refuse service to anyone without proper identification.

ANIMALS

ELEVATORS

There are three elevators located in the venue. Two VIP elevators are located behind Sections 107 and 207 on the north end of the building (facing 45th Street). A patron elevator is located behind Section 113 on the east side of the building (facing Monarch Way).

FIRST AID

If medical assistance is required, notify the nearest Chartway Arena representative and he/she will escort you to the first aid station. Our first aid facility is fully equipped to handle all minor injuries.

FAN BEHAVIOR

Individuals attending athletic events at Old Dominion University are expected to conduct themselves in a manner respectable of the nature and character of the University. Persons acting in a disruptive, disrespectful, or disorderly manner may be asked to leave the premises or be subject to criminal sanctions. Students may also be subject to sanctions of the University's Code of Student Conduct.

Any non-Follett vendor that is selling merchandise on the campus will be served with a cease and desist letter, will have their merchandise seized and be asked to leave the campus by University Police. Any vendor that is selling merchandise off the ODU campus should have the appropriate peddler's license from the City of Norfolk. The Norfolk Police Department will patrol the outlying areas of campus to make sure vendors have the appropriate license. Any vendors without a license will be written a citation by the Norfolk Police. Only merchandise items bearing the CLC approved hologram emblem on the tag are official ODU licensed items. If an item does not have this hologram, it is not an Old Dominion University authorized item. If interested in becoming an ODU licensed vendor to sell merchandise off campus, please visit ODU.edu/licensing.

RE-ENTRY

Guests may not leave the center and then re-enter.

RESTROOM FACILITIES

All restrooms in the Chartway Arena have diaper-changing stations available and are accessible to persons with disabilities. The Chartway Arena also has family (gender neutral) restrooms in the main concourse and suite level.

SMOKING

The Chartway Arena is a non-smoking facility, except in designated smoking areas. All seating areas are classified as non-smoking. E-cigs are not allowed inside the building. The designated smoking area is located outside the main lobby.



FAN BEHAVIOR NCAA Guidelines

NCAA GAME DAY ENVIRONMENT AND FAN CODE OF CONDUCT

NCAA Sportsmanship and Ethical Conduct Best Practices identify reasonable efforts to ensure the fan experience is safe and enjoyable. To this end, proactive measures to encourage positive behavior must be balanced with strict consequences and swift measures to deter and remedy unruly behavior. Policies and media should target two outcomes:

1) recognize responsible behavior; and

2) communicate the message that inappropriate behavior in violation of NCAA, conference, school, team, or facility rules, endangers or threatens others, or is otherwise detrimental to others will not be tolerated.

NCAA GAME DAY ENVIRONMENT

The NCAA and its member institutions are committed to creating a safe, comfortable and enjoyable game day experience. The NCAA and member institutions pledge to protect a fan's right to:

- · Watch the game in a safe, clean and healthy environment.
- Be treated in a courteous, consistent and professional manner.
- Be treated with dignity and respect by other spectators attending the game and those organizing the event.
- Support his or her team, provided the support is in good taste and does not adversely impact the event experience
 of fellow spectators or negatively impact the game.
- Expect displays of good sportsmanship.

THE NCAA EXPECTS FANS TO:

- Cheer, sing, and otherwise support their team while remaining respectful and courteous to their fellow patrons, referees, opposing team fans and players.
- Enjoy the game experience free from fighting, thrown objects, attempts to enter the playing field, political or
 inciting messages, and disorderly behavior, including foul, sexist, racial, obscene or abusive language or gestures.
- Comply with requests from athletics facilities staff regarding stadium policies and emergency response procedures.
- Conduct themselves in a lawful manner to avoid incidents in the stadium and in the parking lots.

For any game where alcohol is available, at tailgating or inside the venue, fans who consume alcoholic beverages will do so in a responsible manner. Intervention with an impaired, intoxicated or underage guest will be handled in a prompt and safe manner.

NCAA FAN CODE OF CONDUCT

- The following violations should be identified as actions that may result in sanctions:
- Behavior that is reckless, dangerous, disruptive, or illegal in nature.
- Demonstrating signs of impairment from alcohol or other substances.
- Foul or abusive language or obscene gestures.
- Interference with the progress of the game (including entering the field of play or throwing objects onto the field).
- Failing to follow instructions of stadium personnel or law enforcement officers.
- · Verbal or physical harassment of the opposing team's players or fans, field officials, or stadium personnel.

Fans have several options to report their concerns, to include alerting the nearest usher or a member of the game management staff, or sending a text to 757-617-7457 with your seat location and concern during the game. A member of the game management staff will respond to the message immediately.
