C-USA NOTEBOOK

CHARLOTTE

The 49ers won two-of-three at No. 12 Florida Atlantic over the weekend, the team's first wins over a ranked opponent this season. Charlotte clinched the series with a 7-6 win in 15 innings on Sunday in the longest game in the history of 49ers baseball. The Niners out-hit FAU 15-8 on Sunday, recording their sixth-straight double-digit hit performance. It marked the 19th game this season with 10 or more hits for Charlotte. Sophomore 2B Brett Netzer extended his hitting streak to 10 games on Sunday while junior OF T.J. Nichting pushed his to eight. Freshman OF Drew Ober's increased his streak to six while freshman OF Reece Hampton, who had the game-winning hit in the series-clincher, advanced his to four. Junior LHP Holden Capps tossed a career-high 7.1 innings, all in relief, stifling the Owls offense by throwing a two-hit shutout with six strikeouts on Sunday. He worked five of his seven innings in 1-2-3 fashion, recording 12-straight outs from the bottom of the tenth to the bottom of the 14th.

FIU

The Panthers dropped all three games at home against Old Dominion over the weekend. After a 4-for-12 series against ODU, sophomore IF **Eddie Silva** continues to lead the team in hitting with a .365 average. Silva also leads the team with 46 hits, 13 doubles and is tied with sophomore OF **Jack Schaaf** for second with 19 RBI. Freshman OF **Kenny Meimerstorf** leads FIU with 23 RBI. Junior C **Zack Soria** is now second on the team with a .328 average. Soria finished 4-for-11 against the Monarchs. FIU continues to struggle getting extra base hits. The Panthers had 31 hits against ODU on the weekend, but 27 of the hits were singles.

(16) FLORIDA ATLANTIC

The Owls suffered their first series loss of the season last weekend, dropping a pair to Charlotte, including a 7-6 loss in 15 innings Sunday, the longest game in Florida Atlantic history. Junior SS CJ Chatham went 5-for-6 with seven RBI, three runs scored and a home run to give FAU a 17-8 win against Charlotte on Saturday. For the week, Chatham tallied nine RBI on eight hits with six runs scored, a home run and a double. Sophomore RHP David McKay dealt six shutout innings of work at UCF on Tuesday, fanning four batters while allowing just two hits as the Owls posted their sixth shutout of the year (5-0 in 11 innings) - one of the best totals in the nation. FAU has five starters hitting at least .298 with a team average of .301 and an on-base percentage of .400. The Owls have outscored their opponents 209 to 104 on the year with 55 doubles, eight triples and 17 home runs, along with 142 walks. Florida Atlantic pitchers have allowed a league-low 77 walks in 266 innings pitched.

LOUISIANA TECH

The Bulldogs won two-of-three at WKU this past weekend, marking the program's first series victory on the road in league play since joining C-USA for the 2014 season. Junior 2B **Jordan Washam** recorded multiple hits in all four contests last week, including a 4-for-6 outing with a double, three RBI, two runs scored and a stolen base in LA Tech's 12-9 victory over WKU on Saturday. Overall, Washam tallied 11 hits in four games while driving in six runs and recording a .737 on base percentage. Over the course of a week, Washam raised his batting average 89 points to move into second on the team with a .380 average on the season. Junior OF **Chase Lunceford** has now reached base safely in 19 consecutive games. Senior RHP **Adam Atkins** made three appearances and clinched three victories for the Bulldogs, while earning three saves in 5.0 innings pitched. In those three outings, Atkins struck out eight while allowing just one run.

MARSHALL

The Thundering Herd won its third consecutive Conference USA series, taking two-of-three at UTSA over the weekend. Marshall now sits alone in fourth place in the league standings at 7-5 and are 17-13 overall. The Herd's 17-13 record is the team's best 30-game start since the 2001 team also went 17-13. Junior RHP Burris Warner was a key part of the Marshall's success at UTSA this past weekend with one save and a win. On Friday, he came into the ballgame with the bases loaded and no outs and struck out the side in the eighth and gained a save. On Sunday, Warner went three innings in relief after a lightning delay. He allowed just one run on three hits in the outing, and earned his first win at Marshall. Warner is tied for first in saves with eight in Conference USA. Sophomore 3B Tyler Ratliff extended his hitting streak to eight games over the weekend, while senior 2B Aaron Bossi and senior OF DJ Gee have each hit safely in sevenstraight outings.

MIDDLE TENNESSEE

The Blue Raiders dropped all three games at Southern Miss. Freshman RF Austin Dennis had the rare inside-the-park grand slam in Sunday's 12-11 loss, his first career homer. Junior SS Riley Delgado registered eight hits in the series from his lead-off position, notching multiple-hits in each outing to give him 16 multi-hit outings on the season. He added three walks and drove in two runs, while scoring three times. Freshman OF Blake Benefield scored in each game at Southern Miss and had a four-hit effort in Sunday's series finale. Middle Tennessee had a season-high 16 hits in the win over Austin Peay on April 5 and then surpassed that total with 19 on Sunday.

OLD DOMINION

The Monarchs swept all three games at FIU over the weekend and are now 23-10 on the season with an RPI ranking of No. 29. Old Dominion recorded its first Conference USA road sweep since taking down Marshall in 2014. Junior OF Nick Walker led the Monarchs last week by hitting .533 with four runs batted in. He posted a hit in each contest and was a perfect 5-for-5 on the base paths, as he grew his team-leading total to 11 stolen bases on the year. Walker's three stolen bases against FIU in game one of the weekend series tied his career high. He brought his batting average over .300, as he is now second on the team with a .308 average after 33 games. Senior CF Connor Myers hit safely in each game last week and drove in two runs in each game of the FIU series. He reached base 10 times in 18 plate appearances (seven hits, three walks), doubled twice, homered once and scored eight runs. Senior LHP Grayson Bailey pitched twice out of the bullpen last week, throwing five innings of hitless ball, striking out six and walking one. He picked up his save of the season on Saturday with a season-high four innings of shutout ball.

(19) RICE

Rice went 3-1 last week to improve to 20-11 on the season and 9-3 in the C-USA standings. The Owls have exactly the same overall and C-USA record as the team did through the same number of games last season. Rice claimed a big 4-3 victory over No. 3 ranked Texas A&M on Tuesday night (April 5). The 5,478 fans at the A&M game was the second-largest regular season crowd in Reckling Park history. Owl head coach **Wayne Graham** won his 1,096th Rice game on Sunday, and now needs just four more victories to reach 1,100 in his Division I career. Senior C **Hunter Kopycinski** went a combined 3-for-9 (.333) catching four-straight games behind the plate last week to help the Owls go 3-1 overall. In addition to hitting a double, driving in two runs, scoring twice and registering a sacrifice bunt, Kopycinski also drew four walks last week for a .538 on-base average. Freshman DH **Dominic DiCaprio** went a combined 6-for-11 (.545) in three games at the plate last week.

(18) SOUTHERN MISS

Southern Miss registered its second walk-off victory this season in the finale of the Middle Tennessee series, scoring three times in the final frame and winning the game on a Blue Raider wild pitch to finish off a three-game sweep. The win was the Golden Eagles 10th consecutive in conference play this spring, and 21st in its last 22 C-USA games dating to April 25, 2015. It was the Golden Eagles' third consecutive conference series sweep this year and seventh-straight C-USA series victory dating to last season. The Golden Eagles have now won eight-straight over Middle Tennessee and are 8-1 in C-USA games since the Blue Raiders joined the league in 2014. This season, Southern Miss is now 3-0 in one-run games, 16-1 in day games and 16-2 at Pete Taylor Park. The Golden Eagles have currently won eight consecutive home games, which is tied for the eighth-best in the country. The Golden Eagles have hit 40 home runs this season, 12 more than any other C-USA teams. Southern Miss did lose its top home run hitter last week, sophomore 3B Taylor Braley, who has a league-high 10 homers, is out for an undisclosed amount of time with a left knee injury.

UAB

The Blazers went 1-2 at No. 25 Rice over the weekend. Freshman OF **Brewer Hicklen** had a big week, notching three multiple-hit games and extending his hitting streak to seven games before having it snapped in Sunday's series finale. He began the week with back-to-back two-hit games, including a homer at Jacksonville State on Tuesday. On Saturday, he was 4-for-5 with an RBI and two runs scored to lead UAB to a 6-2 win. Sophomore LHP **Ryan Ruggles** picked up his second-straight win in that game, allowing just four hits over 5.2 innings of work. He struck out four batters while giving up just two walks. UAB's pitching staff is ranked third in Conference USA with a 3.59 team ERA. The Blazers have posted five shutouts on the season, second-most in the league.

UTSA

The Roadrunners dropped two-of-three against Marshall over the weekend. UTSA's win came on Saturday when freshman OF Ryan Stacy hit one deep into left field with bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth to drive in the winning run in a 5-4 victory. Freshman 2B Bryan Arias hit safely in each game of the series and he smacked a pair of doubles in Sunday's finale. Sophomore RHP Chance Kirby struck out a season best seven batters in 7.1 innings on Sunday. Senior OF Matt Hilston drew three walks for the fourth time this season on Sunday, scoring one run.

WKU

WKU won the series opener with Louisiana Tech before dropping the final two games. Junior LHP Ryan Thurston continues to impress on the mound, boasting a 3-1 record with a 3.38 ERA. His 46 strikeouts are tied for second in the league, while he also ranks sixth in opposing batting average (.223), tied for ninth in fewest runs allowed (19) and tied for 10th in fewest hits allowed (37). As a staff, WKU ranks second in batters struck out in C-USA games and fourth in team ERA. Senior 3B Danny Hudzina, who has reached base safely in the last 36 games, continues to be one of the best hitters in the nation. His .445 batting average ranks in the Top 10 in the NCAA, and he came into last weekend tied for the most hits in the country. In his 83 career games, he has multiple hits in 39 of those contests and has had at least one hit in 71 games. Junior OF Paul Murray is the hottest hitter for WKU at the moment, holding a team-long seven-game hitting streak. His batting average was at .227 on March 18, and it now sits at .286 after the past 13 games.

The National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) has released its National Player of the Month awards for February and Southern Miss sophomore third baseman Taylor Braley was named National Hitter of the Month.

Braley has started the season on a tear, homering five times in Southern Miss' first seven games - two more blasts than he had in all of 2015 - and posting a sevengame hitting streak. - Conference USA has been ranked as the No. 5 baseball conference in the RPI in seven of the past 10 seasons. It was the No. 8 ranked conference in 2015.
- C-USA has placed at least four teams in the NCAA Championship nine times in the past 14 years, producing five teams on two occasions. The league placed three teams in the 2015 NCAA field.
- Rice made its 21st consecutive NCAA Regional appearance in 2015, the fourth-longest active streak in the nation.
- Rice spent the entire 2015 season nationally ranked and was joined in nearly all of the regular season rankings by Florida Atlantic. Both schools were in the final top 25.
