LAST GAME

ODU's Nick Wright scored 16 points, but Richmond defeated the Monarchs, 80-53 Tuesday night. UR was led by Cedrick Lindsay with 19 points. The win was the first ever for the Spiders in the Constant Center and their first win against ODU in Norfolk since beating the Monarchs, 77-73 in double overtime in 2000-01 at Scope. Joining Lindsay in double figures were Greg Robbins and Darien Brothers with 14 points each. Richmond shot .574 (31-54) for the game while the Monarchs shot .317 (19-60). The Spiders led throughout the contest. DeShawn Painter hauled down a game high 10 rebounds for ODU.

MONARCHS SIGN TWO CAGERS

Head coach Blaine Taylor announced two standout recruits who will be joining the Monarch family after signing National Letters of intent today for the 2013 14 season. They are: 6-7 forward Denzell Taylor (Toronto, Canada), and 6-2 guard Jordan Baker (Hampton, VA.) from nearby AAA State Champion Hampton High School.

"It's obviously well known that we have a nice group of young players on this year's squad and I think this group really adds to that. Their attributes across the board make them a nice fit for our program. They are winners from very successful programs. They are fine students, they defend, and rebound and know how to be good teammates." – Head Coach Blaine Taylor

Baker averaged 9.1 points, 5.2 rebounds and 3.2 steals per game last year for Hampton's AAA State Championship team. A clutch performer, Baker's three-pointer put the Crabbers in the lead late in its quarterfinal win over Nansemond River, then he scored 10 points in the fourth quarter against Petersburg High in the State Championship game.

Denzell Taylor's High School team, St. Benedict's Prep in Newark, NJ. went 35-3 last year. He averaged 10.6 points and led the team with an 11.4 rebounds per game average. He also played for CIA Bounce, a Toronto based AAU squad who reached the Nike's Elite Youth Basketball League Summer league championship.







The Department of Intercollegiate Athletics is home for Old Dominion University's 18 varsity programs for men and women. MEMORABLE GAMES FROM THE ODU-VCU SERIES

Feb. 15, 1979 • 72-71 (overtime) • Richmond Coliseum ODU

The teams split two earlier games during the season with ODU winning 70-68 in the finals of the Richmond Times Dispatch Tournament as Ronnie Valentine scored 23 for the Monarchs. VCU then won in Norfolk, 95-87. VCU had the lead and the ball in overtime with five seconds left, but couldn't get the ball in bounds and got a 5 second call. ODU's Tommy Conrad hit the jumper at the buzzer for ODU's win. Tommy Branch (Adrian's brother) led ODU with 19 points and 13 rebounds. Dana Kirk was VCU's head coach. ODU coached by Paul Webb would later that year reach the NIT quarterfinals, beating Wagner coached by PJ Carlissimo at home, then Clemson at Clemson in double overtime, before losing at Purdue led by Joe Barry Carroll.

March 3, 1985 • VCU 87, ODU 82 • Sun Belt Conference Final in Hampton, Va.

A day after ODU rallied from 19 down with 9 minutes left against UAB in the semi-finals, VCU and ODU battled to what many considered the best league final ever. There were numerous lead changes in the game. Rolando Lamb led VCU with 21 points and Calvin Duncan added 18, while was led by Mark Davis with 23 and Kenny Gattison with 21 points. ODU shot .627 (37-59) from the floor, while VCU shot .588 (30-51) from the field, Both teams advance to the NCAA.

March 18, 1993 • ODU 74-68 • NIT first round

The two teams had met earlier in the season with ODU winning. ODU led most of the game and took an 11-point lead with 8:55 left at 63-52. The Rams fought back to cut the lead to two (68-66 with 1:39 left). Keith Jackson and Odell Hodge both hit two Free throws each in the final 26 seconds and ODU held on to a 74-68 win. VCU was in the Metro and ODU was in the CAA. Sherron Mills led VCU with 24 points and 14 rebounds, while Keith Jackson scored 26 and Odell Hodge 16 points with 10 boards.

Feb. 1, 2003 • VCU 72, ODU 69 • Constant Center

In front of a sellout crowd of 8418. ODU bolted out to a lead of as many as 13 (31-18) with 3:04 left in the first half, but VCU cut it to four at halftime, 33-29. In the second half VCU led by as many as 12, 66-54 with 5:53 left, but the Monarchs rallied and tied the game with 1:38 left at 67. Ricardo Marsh answered with a basket with 44 seconds left to make it 70-69 VCU. After a VCU miss, Ricardo Marsh came down and was called for a charge with 3 seconds left. Willie Taylor then scored as time ran out for a 72-69 victory for the Rams. Marsh led ODU with 28 points, while Dominic Jones led VCU with 19 points and 9 rebounds.

Jan. 21, 2004 • VCU 75, ODU 67 • Constant Center

The Monarchs fell to VCU, 75-67 decision at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. Alex Loughton (Perth, Australia) led Monarch scorers with 17 points, and added 11 rebounds for a double-double.

The first half was marked by nine lead changes, and neither team was able to able to grab higher than a four- point lead. Alex Loughton's jumper to gave the Monarchs the 20-17 lead by the 7:49 mark, and held a 25-21 lead-- off a Hunter three-pointer--by the 6:51 mark. Down 33-32 with 1:41 remaining, Valdas Vasylius (Klaipeda, Lithuania) connected on a jumper to give the Monarchs the 34-33 halftime lead.

Isaiah Hunter scored the first points of the second half, as he dunked the ball to give the Monarchs the 36-33 lead with 19:28 left in the game. By the 18:06 mark, ODU was leading 40-35 after Alex Loughton connected on

a jumper, but a Troy Godwin jumper and a made free throw cut the lead down to two points, 40-38, with 17:54 remaining. The lead was back up to five, 45-40, by the 16:05 mark, as Loughton was good on a lay-up attempt, but a subsequent dunk by Troy Godwin and a jumper by Jesse Pellot-Rosa cut the advantage down to just one point, 45-44, with 15:16 left in the game. With 14:34 left, the Monarchs once again pulled out to a five-point lead, 49-44, and by the 10:41 mark, ODU took their largest lead of the game, 56-50, off an Alex Loughton lay-up and a John Waller three-pointer. VCU then went on a 8-0 run to grab a 58-56 lead with 8:18 left in the game. VCU was led by Derrick Reid's three points and Michael Doles' five points in the run. Loughton tied the game up at 58 with a layup, but with 2:54 left in the game, VCU took their largest lead of the game to that point, five points, 66-61, with Domonic Jones capping off the 8-3 Rams run. The Monarchs came back to within two points of VCU, 66-64, with just over a minute left in the game, but ODU was unable to get any closer as Michael Doles drained a three-pointer with 33 seconds left in the game. Six Rams' free-throws closed out a hard-fought game, with VCU winning 75-67.

March 7, 2005 • ODU 73, VCU 66 (overtime) • CAA Final • Richmond Coliseum

CAA Player of the Year Alex Loughton scored six of his 28 points in overtime and ODU hit 12 of 13 free throws in the extra period for the win. VCU trailed by 11 several times early in the second half, but fought back with a 14-2 run to take a 40-39 lead with 11:51 remaining. ODU came back as the lead changed hands eight more times in the final 2:30 minutes of regulation.

Feb. 17, 2008 • ODU 67, VCU 66 • Siegel Center

Seniors Brian Henderson and Brandon Johnson accounted for ODU's final eight points in the last 1:59 of the game to lead ODU to a come-from-behind, 67-66 victory over CAA archrival VCU Saturday night on ESPN2. This was the Monarchs first ever win in the Siegel Center and third straight win overall.

VCU took a six point lead (63-57) with 2:10 left in the game as it looked like the Rams were going to beat ODU for the ninth straight time in the city of Richmond. But the ODU seniors had a different idea. Brandon Johnson gets a steal and is fouled. Johnson calmly hits both to put ODU up, 64-63 with 1:05 left. After another VCU turnover, Brian Henderson nails another trey to give the Monarchs a 67-63 lead with just 16 seconds left. VCU's Jamal Shuler hits a three to cut the lead to one at 67-66. VCU fouled freshman Darius James and he missed both free throws with seven seconds left. Maynor tries to take it to the basket, but is stripped by Brandon Johnson (The CAA Defender of the Year).

March 7, 2010 • ODU 73, VCU 69 (overtime) • CAA Semi-Finals

Old Dominion overcame a 12-point second half deficit and senior Gerald Lee scored a career-high tying 26 points in a thrilling 73-69 overtime win against VCU in the semifinals of the 2010 Virginia 529 College Savings Plan CAA Men's Basketball Championships Sunday afternoon. The game was played in front of a sell-out crowd of 11,200 fans at the Richmond Coliseum. VCU led 52-40, but Marsharee Neely's put-back with 2:46 left capped the Monarchs rally to tie the game at 60-60, then Gerald Lee tied it again to send the contest to overtime at 62. In the overtime a Bazemore steal gave the Monarchs its first lead, 68-60 and ODU hung on from their for the win.

Mar. 7, 2011 – ODU 70, VCU 65- Richmond Coliseum-CAA Championship Game

Frank Hassell scored 22 points and grabbed nine rebounds and Old Dominion withstood a furious second-half rally by VCU and defended its Colonial Athletic Association tournament title with a 70-65 victory. The victory was ODU's sixth overall CAA Tournament crown, two more than any other school in the league and the first back-to-back champion since UNC Wilmington did it in 2002 and 2003. A sellout crowd of 11,200 were in attendance at the Richmond Coliseum.

Kent Bazemore added 14 points as the Monarchs (27-6) won their ninth straight and 13 of the last 14 to claim the league's automatic NCAA tournament berth. The Rams (23-11) trailed by 18 in the second half, but got within 55-54 with 4:26 left before the Monarchs scored on consecutive possessions, rebuilding the lead to five, and hung on. Bradford Burgess led VCU with 19 points. As Ben Finney stepped to the line with 15.3 seconds left and his team ahead 69-62, the contingent of Monarchs fans chanted "O-D-U! O-D-U!" to celebrate the Monarchs' league-best sixth tournament title.
