Campbell is coming off a record-setting performance to open the season.

Campbell set a new program record for points and three-point field goals made in a game as the Camels opened the season with a 122-56 win over St. Andrews inside Gore Arena Tuesday night.

Campbell's (1-0) 66 point margin of victory marked the thirdlargest at home in program history and the largest ever on opening night. The Camels' largest ever home scoring margin came on December 18, 1983.

Kianna Speight and Taya Bolden both poured in a game-high 18 points while Shy Tuelle and Brittany Staves added 15. Faith Price rounded out the five Campbell double-digit scorers with 12.

Campbell was able to bucket 58 points off 34 St. Andrews turnovers on the night to pair with 70 points off the bench.

St. Andrew's scored the game-opening bucket but Campbell then scored 13 straight as a part of an eventual 33-8 run over the opening half.

The Camels were able to hold their opponent without a field goal over the final 4:07 to help surpass the previous school record of 116 points in a game which was also set against Davidson in 1983.

The Camels are led offensively by Hayley Barber and Shy Tuelle who shared the scoring load and both averaged 9.1 points per contest. The pair recently were named to the Big South All-Conference Preseason Second-Team.

CAMELS IN THE WBI

- Campbell's 2019 WBI appearance marks the program's third postseason berth all-time and the second in three years under Ronny Fisher. The Camels also made the NCAA Tournament in 2000 after winning the A-Sun title.
- The Camels (23-12) tabbed a 70-62 win over Tennessee Tech in the WBI quarterfinals in Buies Creek. Hayley Barber posted a career-high 23 points in the win, hitting 8-of-10 shots, including 2-of-3 three pointers while adding a 5-of-6 clip from the free throw line. The junior also dished out four assists with two rebounds.
- CU began its WBI run with a 58-54 road win at former Big South rival Coastal Carolina, with Barber pouring in 17 and Tuelle adding 14 off the bench. The win marked Campbell's first ever postseason victory. CU also became the first Big South program to win a game in the WBI (since 2010; the Big South is now 2-7 in the WBI all-time). This is Campbell's second trip to the WBI, also participating in 2017 when the Camels hosted Saint Francis, falling 79-68.
- The Camels were one of two Big South squads in the 2019 WBI, joined by UNC Asheville, which fell to Appalachian State in the first round, 57-55.
- Last year marked Campbell's second trip to the WBI, also participating in 2017 when the Camels hosted Saint Francis, falling 79-68.

CAMELS MAKE BIG SOUTH CHAMPIONSHIP GAME RUN

- The Camels, seeded sixth in the tourney, made the run to Big South title game starting with a 54-49 first round win over No. 7 seed Longwood in Buies Creek.
- CU then moved on to High Point, N.C., topping No. 3 seed Hampton 85-63, leading by as many as 32 in the win, shooting 53 percent from the floor (31-for-58) and 57 percent (13-for-23) from distance, landing five in double figures, including 21 from freshman guard Shy Tuelle and 20 from senior guard Caroline Bowns.
- A day later, Campbell met No. 7 seed Charleston Southern, with Bowns leading the way with 25 points in a 55-44 victory. Bowns hit 7-of-9 shots, including 6-of-8 from distance, adding a 5-for-5 effort from the free throw line. The senior added eight rebounds, two blocks, a steal and an assist.
- At Radford in the championship game, the Highlanders held off the visiting Camels 57-45 for their 18th-straight win. Hayley Barber and Caroline Bowns were both named to the Big South All-Tournament Team.

BARBER, CARTER & TUELLE RECEIVE ALL- BIG SOUTH HONORS

Junior Hayley Barber was tabbed Honorable Mention All-Conference, while rookies Lauren Carter and Shy Tuelle have been named to the Big South All-Freshman Team, as announced by the league office on Monday. Barber also repre-

sented CU on the All-Academic Team.

- In conference games, Barber averaged 9.8 points, 2.4 assists and 4.1 rebounds per game. She finished tied for 14th in the conference with a 2.6 assists per game average and she owned the 11th-best free throw percentage at .728 (75-for-103). Barber also ranked in the top-15 in three-point field goals made per game (1.3).
- For the second-straight season, the Camels had two rookies Carter and Tuelle named to the Big South All-Freshman Team; last year, Kyra Davis and Ashlyn Hampton received the merit.
- Carter, a High Point, N.C. native reached double-figures 11 times during her rookie season and averaged 9.5 points per contest. In overall scoring, she ranked second among Big South freshmen and 18th overall. She was one of 14 Big South players to send back 20 or more shots, ranking her 14th in the league with 20 blocks, third among rookies.
- Tuelle, a two-time Big South Freshman of the Week, averaged 10.2 points per conference game, which finished tied for 24thh overall and third among Big South rookies. In conference play, she also owned the top three-point field goal percentage (.379) among league rookies. She made 39 three's in conference action and averaged 1.9 per game, which ranked fifth.

FISHER WINS 150TH CAREER GAME

Campbell's 76-67 win at Winthrop on March 2 marked the 150 victory for Campbell head coach Ronny Fisher. Fisher is in his third season at Campbell, going 59-37 as head coach. Prior to his time at CU, Fisher spent 2008-16 at Presbyterian, going 97-144 overall, including winning seasons in three of his last four years with the Blue Hose.

EARLY START

 Campbell's November 5 start date marks the earliest season opener in program history. The Camels opened up last season on November 6 against Old Dominion.

CAMPBELL VS. NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

- The Fighting Camels have fared well against non-conference opponents during the Ronny Fisher Era, racking up a solid 28-15 mark
- Since the 2016-17 season, Campbell is 7-0 against non-Division I opponents
- Campbell is 12-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the regular season

DEFENSIVE CAMELS

- Campbell finished second in the Big South and 18th nationally in scoring defense, holding opponents to 56.3 points per game. In conference-only games, Campbell held a 56.3 points allowed per game clip, which stands third in the Big South. The mark helped the Camels to its third straight top-20 defense nationally
- No Campbell opponents shot 50.0% or better from the floor last season for the second straight year

TOP DEFENSES UNDER FISHER

- Under Ronny Fisher, CU has finished in the top three in the NCAA in points allowed each of the past two years.
- In 2016-17, the Camels claimed the program's first-ever NCAA statistical championship by holding opponents to a Division I-low 49.6 ppg.
- The 2017-18 squad finished 15-15, again fielding an elite defense, allowing 51.9 ppg, which ranked third in all of NCAA Division I.

MARGINAL REBOUNDING

Campbell's +3.3 rebounding margin ranks third in the Big South. The Camels stand third in the league in offensive (40.2) rebounding percentage and second the defensive end (36.2).

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

- Campbell participated in a weeklong service mission to the Dominican Republic in August—the trip was parts service, basketball and team bonding.
- The Dominican Republic is an island nation of 10 million people where the average annual income is \$5,000.
- Campbell played three games during its tour—one against local team Hato Mayor Select and two against the Dominican Republic National Team.
- Senior **Alyshia Allison** on the impact of the trip: "I instantly realized how blessed and grateful I am. The families loved on us as if we were their own and the people in the towns would wave and blow kisses to show

BOWEN GETS HOMETOWN HALL CALL

- Campbell assistant coach Lindsay Bowen was inducted into the Greater Lansing (Mich.) Area Sports Hall of Fame on July 26, 2018.
- Bowen, whose credentials include a National Championship appearance at Michigan State and a season with the WNBA's New York Liberty, was one of 10 individuals and three teams enshrined during the ceremony.
- A 2,500-point scorer at Dansville High School before matriculating to Michigan State in 2001, Bowen kept the pace in a Spartans uniform, racking up 1,739 points, which ranks third all-time in the MSU record books.

WHY THE FIGHTING CAMELS?

- While many stories exist, the most prevalent is the result of a misunderstanding after a fire destroyed much of Campbell's original campus. As the school's founder and president, Dr. James Archibald Campbell be-moaned the fate of the institution, Mr. Z.T. Kivett encouraged him, "Your name's Campbell; then get a hump on you! We've got work to do." Dr. Campbell thought that Mr. Kivett said, "You're a camel, get a hump on you."
- Campbell's athletic teams were originally named the "Hornets." At the time, other references to the athletic teams were "The Campbells" or the "Campbellites."
- The changing of the mascot to a camel came in late 1933 or early 1934.

ABOUT CAMPBELL UNIVERSITY

- Founded as Buies Creek Academy on Jan. 5, 1887 by James Archibald Campbell
- Since then, Buies Creek Academy has evolved to become Campbell Junior College (1926), Campbell College (1961), and Campbell University (1979)
- ▶ 1,500 acre main campus located 30 miles south of Raleigh
- ▶ Fields 23 NCAA Division I athletics programs

HEAD COACH RONNY FISHER

FOURTH SEASON AT CAMPBELL | 11TH SEASON IN THE BIG SOUTH CONFERENCE

Entering his fourth season at the helm of the Campbell women's basketball program, head coach Ronny Fisher took his 2018-19 squad to unprecedented heights.

Fisher led his squad to the program's first and second ever postseason victories. The Camels are no stranger to postseason play under Fisher's leadership as Campbell's trip to the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI) marked the second appearance in three years for the Camels.

Campbell notched its first postseason win in program history in the opening round of the WBI on the road at Coastal Carolina, 58-54. The Camels went on to claim their second win in the tournament back at home with a 70-62 win over Tennessee Tech before advancing to the semifinals.

The Camels' appearance in the semifinals of the WBI also marked the first time a Big South team has ever appeared in the semifinal round of the tournament.

Campbell's success in the postseason under Fisher led to the Camels matching a program high in wins with 23 as a part of a 23-13 overall record and a 10-8 mark in league play. The 23 wins marked the program's ninth 20 win season and the second in three years under Fisher.

Campbell's run to its second postseason appearance in three years started with a run in the Big South Conference Tournament. The Camels drew the No. 6 seed entering the league tournament but reeled off three straight wins over Longwood (54-49) in Buies Creek as well as a pair of wins in High Point, N.C. over Hampton (85-63) and Charleston Southern (55-44) to advance to the title game against eventual champion Radford.

Fisher's most recent team was led by All-Big South Honorable Mention honoree Hayley Barber and All-Freshman team member Shy Tuelle.

Under Fisher's guidance, Campbell posted new statistical program-bests in four separate categories including most field goals made (747) and attempted (2,044) to pair with a program best mark in rebounds (1,431) and blocked shots (215).

Amidst all of the team accolades in the 2018-19 season, Fisher amassed a career milestone of his own during the 2018-19 campaign by notching his 150th career win on March 2, 2019, with a 76-67 victory over Winthrop.

Under Fisher, the Camels have posted a 59-38 overall record. Fisher's 94 Big South wins serve as the highest among active Big South coaches which ranks sixth all-time and his 156 total victories sit seventh all-time in league history.

Fisher's squad continued their strong play on the defensive end this past season by posting the 18th best scoring defense in the nation by allowing just 56.3 points per game to mark the third straight season the Camels have ranked among the nation's leader in points allowed. Campbell also finished eighth in the nation in three-point field goal defense by holding opponents to just 26.5% shooting from behind the arc. Over the Camels' 23 games the defense was able to hold its opponents to shooting under 50% in 22 contests.

Fisher's squad's prowess on the defensive end this past season added to the success in recent seasons. In 2016-17, the Camels claimed the program's first-ever NCAA statistical championship by holding opponents to a Division I-low 49.6 points-per-game. The 2017-18 squad again fielded an elite defense, allowing 51.9 points-per-game, which ranked third in all of NCAA Division I.

Only the fourth head coach in program history, Fisher made an immediate impact in his first season at Campbell in 2016-17,

piloting the Camels to the eighth 20-win campaign in program history and their first in four years. The eight-win improvement from the 2015-16 season was enough to propel Campbell to a berth in the Big South Tournament and the opportunity to host a first-round game in the WBI.

For his efforts, Fisher was named the 2016-17 Big South Coach of the Year. Junior MaKala Rouse was named the league's defensive player of the year and picked up an all-conference honorable mention selection while junior Summer Price earned all-conference second-team honors. Senior Brianna Cribb was named to the all-academic team.

In Fisher's second season, Campbell earned a first-round bye in the Big South tournament.

Price and Rouse were selected to the Big South second and honorable mention teams, respectively, with forwards Kyra Davis and Ashlyn Hampton garnering all-freshman honors.

Fisher, who led Presbyterian College to success over eight seasons, was announced as the Camels' head coach on April 5, 2016.

Prior to his tenure in Buies Creek, Fisher led Big South rival Presbyterian College, earning winning seasons in three of his last four years with the Blue Hose. He was named Big South coach of the year in 2012-13 as he led his team to a 19-12 record and a 14-4 mark in the conference. That team earned a post-season bid to the Women's Basketball Invitational, the program's first postseason appearance since joining the Big South in 2007.

Fisher took over as PC head women's coach in 2008 after serving as an assistant coach for the men's team for 11 seasons. He was the associate head coach for former PC men's coach Gregg Nibert and helped lead the Blue Hose team in its transition from NCAA Division II to Division I.

Among the many milestones achieved by the PC women's team during Fisher's tenure were a record four Big South allconference selections this past season, including the Big South Conference freshman of the year for the second straight year. PC finished the 2015-16 season with an 18-13 record (13-7 Big South) and advanced to the semifinals of the conference tournament, losing to eventual champion UNC Asheville. Fisher's most recent PC team swept the season series with Liberty and Winthrop for the first time in school history.

After Campbell re-joined the Big South Conference in 2011-12, Fisher led the Blue Hose to six victories in 10 meetings with the Camels, including a sweep of the season series during the 2015-16 campaign.

A native of Fairview, N.C., Fisher is a 1990 graduate of Furman University, where he served as a student assistant coach under Butch Estes. After earning his B.A. in physical education in 1990, he worked as assistant men's coach at Presbyterian from 1990-93 and again from 2000-07 before being promoted to associate head coach in 2007-08.

He also served as an assistant coach at North Greenville University and as head coach at Conway (S.C.) High School, where his team reached the quarterfinals of the state tournament.

Fisher is married to the former Julie Dickert of Taylors, S.C. She is a former basketball player at Charleston Southern University. The Fishers are parents of two sons, Harrison and Jake, and a daughter, Sydney. They reside in Angier, N.C. where they attend Trinity Baptist Church.
