Super Sunday CAA Action

ODU looks to improve on their 4-1 CAA record when the face the Patriots of George Mason this Sunday at 11:00 am. Following the dual against GMU, ODU will travel to nearby Washington, D.C. for a match against the Eagles of American. Both teams boast at least one nationally ranked grappler, and American will wrestle the #1 ranked 197-pounder in the nation.

The 22nd ranked Monarchs start against Mason, a team that has started 9-3-0 in duals this season and is 5-2 in CAA action. Freshman Cayle Byers is ranked and will face junior David Mendoza at 197 lbs. Mendoza will then be tested against American as he has to face #1 Josh Glenn.

ODU leads the all-time series against American by a commanding 26-4 margin while they trail the all-time series with George Mason by just one dual, 8-9.

Leading the Nation

Redshirt sophomore Kaylen Baxter has backed up his success as a freshman with an even better second year. He leads the nation in wins with 34 total and has only lost nine matches this season.

Right behind Baxter in the nationwide leaders in wins is teammate Ryan Williams. The junior has totaled 32 wins and is leading the team in major decisions with 10.

Both wrestlers are in the program's top 20 in career wins. Williams ranks 9th with 91 total victories and Baxter is tied for 20th with 68.

Coming to the Ted

ODU will host one more home match at the Ted Constant Convocation Center this season. Earlier this season, ODU earned the biggest win ever in the building, dropping Delaware State 48-0. They followed up that win with their first ever victory over Bucknell, 30-6.

For the final home match of the season, the Ted will play host to its first ever Colonial Athletic Association wrestling match on February 10, as ODU hosts Rider University immediately following the women's basketball game against William & Mary. The match will begin at approximately 5:00 pm as the teams battle for the edge in the all-time series, currently knotted up at 3-3-1. Old Dominion dropped the Broncs twice last season.

Top 25 Team

ODU earned its first national ranking since the 1990-91 season earlier this year as W.I.N. Magazine ranked the Monarchs 22nd in the nation. Since then, ODU has been a staple in the top 25 and has recently earned the programs best ever national ranking, at 19th in the nation by W.I.N.

The Monarchs are also ranked 22nd in the nation in the USA Today/InterMat/NWCA rankings. Old Dominion has been in InterMat's Top 25 for eight straight rankings.

Nationally Ranked Individuals

For the first time in school history, Old Dominion had six grapplers ranked nationally by Amateur Wrestling News. Much of the starting lineup has been in the national polls for the duration of the season. Only at 157 and Hwt have the Monarchs not been listed by a poll at least once this season.

Three Monarchs are ranked by all four national polls. James Nicholson (125), Kyle Hutter (133) and Chris Brown (165) are ranked by InterMat, AWN, W.I.N. Magazine, and wrestlingreport.com. Kyle Hutter remains in the polls after upsetting his third nationally ranked opponent in his last three events. He dropped #13 Dan Mitcheff (Kent State) and #15 Eric Albright (UVa) by decision at the Duals and last weekend pinned #15 David Marble of Bucknell.

Kaylen Baxter, Ryan Williams and Brown have maintained slots in the top 25 throughout the season. Brown dropped #1 Hawkeye 165-pounder Mark Perry earlier in the season, boosting his personal record and Baxter has tallied a nationwide best 34 wins already this season.

Champions Developing the Future

Head Coach Steve Martin has led the Monarchs to a 48-32-2 mark through the start of his fourth year at the helm. In the CAA the Monarchs have dominated with a 20-5-1 mark. Martin comes from a powerhouse of high school wrestling in Great Bridge High School in Chesapeake. In 14 years as head coach, the Great Bridge Wildcats won 13 state championships.

Martin is assisted by Mike Dixon, Jon Sioredas and Matt Storniolo. Dixon brings great recruiting skills and knowledge of the CAA coming from James Madison. He has experience coaching championship contenders while at the University of Indianapolis.

Sioredas is a second-year coach with a wealth of knowledge about the sport. Named an All-American and ranked as high as 2nd nationally at the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga, Sioredas is now using his skills to teach.

Storniolo is mirroring Sioredas' career, jumping right into coaching after graduation. He was a two-time All-American at the University of Oklahoma, as well as the Big East Rookie of the Year at Penn State.

All four coaches are wrestling champions in their own right and are building a championship future.

A Will To Win

Ryan Williams has been the most consistent wrestler under head coach Steve Martin since he took over the starting job midway through his freshman year. He's the go-to at 141 lbs and was an NCAA Qualifier in 2006, just missing his second trip a year ago as he dropped a decision to CAA Champion and NCAA All-American Charles Griffin.

He has a career .726 winning percentage with 91 wins through this point in his junior season. He is currently 19h all-time in wins and if he finishes his career with the same consistency, he has the potential to become the Monarchs all-time leader in wins, currently set at 135 by Jeff Rusak.

Alaskan At The Top

Kaylen Baxter, from Fairbanks, Alaska, leads the nation in wins as the only grappler in the country with 34 wins. He has a team-best 34-9 record, including a win of the 149-lb. weight class at the Michigan State Open and Virginia Intercollegiates and a placing effort at three other tournaments. He is ranked by four national polls and has 68 career victories in just over a year and a half of wrestling for Old Dominion.

First Year Bookends

The Monarchs have been using youth to win for several years and 2007-08 is no exception. True freshman Andy Totusek and redshirt freshman James Nicholson will see the most time at the 285 and 125 weights respectively.

Totusek was wrestling unattached for much of the season until three weekends ago, when the coaches decided to pull him out of his redshirt. The true freshman responded with his first tournament win, going 2-0 at the Virginia Intercollegiates.

At the other end of the scale, James Nicholson has started the season with a 25-9 record and was named the Most Outstanding Wrestler at the Virginia Intercollegiates two weeks ago. He's been named CAA Rookie of the Week twice and he recently inserted himself into all the national polls with an upset of the 9th ranked 125-pounder in the nation at the Southern Scuffle, where he finished 3rd for ODU.

Hometown Brown

Redshirt sophomore Chris Brown, from nearby Chesapeake, Virginia, has continued to impress as a second-year wrestler. He is 28-9 with nine major decisions and one pin. Brown already has 68 wins in his short career and has slid up to the 165-lb weight class this season. He has started this year much like he did a year ago, when he was named CAA Rookie of the Week three times. Brown leads the team in dual wins with 14 on the season.

By Weight Class:

For the first time in Steve Martin's coaching tenure, there will be a former NCAA Qualifier, HS All-American, or FILA Cadet All-American starting at EVERY weight.

125: RS freshmen James Nicholson and Billy Chamberlain will platoon at 125. Nicholson was an alternate on the FILA Jr. World Team this summer and compiled a 23-8 record unattached a year ago. Chamberlain will also see time, as he was ranked as high as 4th in the nation in high school.

133: Kyle Hutter will bump up a weight class and be the goto starter at 133 lbs. He recently inserted himself into the national rankings, as high as 14th by AWN, with wins over #13 Dan Mitcheff (Kent State), #15 Eric Albright (Virginia) and #15 David Marble (Bucknell). He'll be backed by Justin Belanger, the Rhode Island Wrestler of the Year in 2006-07, and Zeke Donahay, a Florida state finalist.

141: Ryan Williams has been the most dependable starter in the lineup since taking over the job at 141 as a freshman. He was an NCAA Qualifier in 2006 and is ranked in the Top 20 this season. Cam Watkins has sufficient collegiate experience to step in and relieve Williams at any point during the season.

149: Kaylen Baxter leads the nation in wins with 34 and also has a history of knocking off top competition. He had wins against four nationally ranked wrestlers and seven NCAA qualifiers as a RS freshman and is already among the career leaders in wins as a RS sophomore. In the wings will be returner Joey Metzler and newcomer Buffy Okigbo.

157: Redshirt freshman Dan Rivera has been the go-to this season at 157, but true freshman Tel Todd and Lester France will also press for mat time. Rivera was named CAA Rookie of the Week two weeks ago with a 5-1 effort in duals. He earned a takedown against the #1 grappler in the nation from Illinois, Mike Poeta. Todd was ranked as high as 8th in the nation in high school as a Montana state champion, while France coupled an enormous 217 wins with just 13 losses in his prep career.

165: Chris Brown, the team leader in wins and major decisions in 2006, will wrestle at this slot. He is nationally ranked by four polls and has already tallied 68 wins in his young career. Newcomer Derek Peperas will back up Brown.

174: 2007 NCAA Qualifier and ODU's lone senior, Nick Pullano, will bump up to the 174-lb. weight. He'll look to return to the tournament after a very successful junior campaign, leading the team in technical falls with seven. T.C. Pendleton and Sam Hunt will vie for mat time at this weight as well.

184: Jesse Strawn continues to match his success from a year ago with 28 wins headed into this weekend. He had 11 pins as a true freshman and is second on the team with four this season. Scott Cust will provide depth at 184, and will push Strawn to maintain success throughout the season.

197: Junior David Mendoza will strive to make the NCAA Tournament for a second consecutive season, as he went 32-12 last season, including leading the team in pins. He's faced stiff competition early in the year and will look to make a run in the second half of the season.

HWT: True freshmen Roy Dragon III and Andy Totusek will battle for the starting job at 285. Dragon went 148-12 with 111 pins in high school while Totusek was 132-31 in high school.

ODU won its third straight Virginia Intercollegiate State Tournament with six champions in the ten weight classes and at least one placewinner in eight of the nine weights ODU entered a wrestler.
