GEORGIA STATE (2-5, 1-2) vs. OLD DOMINION (3-4, 2-1) Saturday, Oct. 29 | 3 p.m. | Center Parc Stadium | ESPN+

THE KICKOFF: Georgia State returns home to host Old Dominion for Homecoming Saturday at 3 p.m. at Center Parc Stadium.

- > Super senior running back Tucker Gregg needs just 37 yards to become Georgia State's all-time leading rusher. The super senior from Chatsworth, Ga., enters the game with 2,113 yards as he chases Tra Barnett's school record of 2,156 yards from 2016-19.
- > Gregg is already the GSU career leader in rushing attempts (422) and rushing touchdowns (23), and he ranks second to Albert Wilson (26) in total touchdowns.
- > CB Quavian White, who is No. 6 in FBS with four interceptions, was named last week to the Midseason All-America team (honorable mention by Pro Football News. The super senior had two interceptions at South Carolina, along with two tackles for loss including a sack, a pass breakup and five tackles. He added picks vs. Charlotte and Georgia Southern.
- > White has 11 career interceptions, the Georgia State record and tied for sixth among all active FBS players. Safety Antavious Lane has nine career picks.
- > In the back-to-back victories over Army and Georgia Southern, the Panthers rushed for a total of 634 yards. GSU gained 299 yards vs. Army and then 335 vs. Georgia Southern, including back-to-back 100-yard games by Jamyest Williams (106/129) and Tucker Gregg (124/111).
- > The Panthers lead the Sun Belt and rank No. 10 in FBS in rushing with 232.4 yards per game. GSU has rushed for 200-plus yards in 13 of the last 15 games.
- > With 15 turnovers forced, Georgia State is No. 9 in FBS in turnovers gained. The Panthers tied school records with four interceptions and five takeaways vs. Georgia Southern.
- > Senior ILB Jordan Veneziale is tied for the NCAA lead with three fumble recoveries. His five career fumble recoveries are tied for the GSU career lead.

- > Old Dominion features the nation's leading receiver in Ali Jennings, who is first in FBS with 129.3 receiving yards per game and second with 6.7 catches per game.
- > Jennings leads the Sun Belt with eight TD catches, while GSU WR Robert Lewis is third with six. Lewis has seven touchdown catches in the last eight games.
- > Since taking over the starting role in Game 3 of 2021, QB Darren Grainger has accounted for 37 touchdowns in 18 starts (31 passing, 6 rushing).
- > Head coach Shawn Elliott's squad has played in three straight bowl games, including back-to-back wins in the 2020 LendingTree Bowl and 2021 TaxAct Camellia Bowl. The Panthers have played in bowl games in four of Elliott's five seasons.

CROWDED BACKFIELD: Senior running backs Tucker Gregg (second) and Jamyest Williams (fourth) both rank among the top five career rushers in GSU history

- > Gregg (2,113 yards) is No. 2 in Georgia State annals, just 36 yards behind Tra Barnet's record of 2,156 yards, while Williams (1,525) has moved up to No. 4.
- > Since the start of the 2020 season, Gregg (1,974) and Williams (1,525) have combined for 3,499 yards, including 1,812 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2021.
- > QB Darren Grainger topped 1,000 yards in a Georgia State uniform last game, currently ranking 11th with 1,054 yards. Counting his time at Furman, he has 1,407 career rushing yards.

SERIES VS. OLD DOMINION: Georgia State and Old Dominion are both relative newcomers to the sport of football as ODU started its program one year before the Panthers launched in 2010. Both schools were members of the Colonial Athletic Association in other sports at that time.

> Georgia State faced Old Dominion in each of its first three seasons, but the Monarchs won all three contests, including a 53-27 win in the last meeting in 2012 at the Georgia Dome. The teams also met in 2010 at ODU and in 2011 at the Georgia Dome.

PICK 'EM: Senior cornerback Quavian White and junior safety Antavious Lane rank No. 1-2 in Georgia State history in career interceptions.

- > Only five active FBS players have more career interceptions than White with 11.
- > Lane is tied for 11th with nine picks.
- > White also ranks second among active players with 41 passes defended (interceptions plus breakups).

CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM is the home of Georgia State football. The

Panthers took over this iconic property, formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and then Turner Field, for the 2017 season.

The facility was renamed Center Parc Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers are in their fifth season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including practice, weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.

Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

The redevelopment of this iconic property also includes the Georgia State University Convocation Center, opening this fall at the north end of the property, and new Georgia State baseball and softball facilities to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

- > Sumter (48 starts), Bartlett (49) and Travis Glover (43) and have combined for 140 career starts.
- > That trio has started every game since the start of the 2019 season (43 straight), helping the Panthers average 225 yards rushing per game over that stretch.
- > During his string of 43 straight starts, the versatile Glover has started at right tackle, left tackle and left guard.

SUPER-DUPER SENIOR: The Georgia State roster includes 10 "super" seniors who are utilizing the extra season of eligibility granted after the pandemic. Of those 10, five also redshirted and are in their sixth year of college and four are in their fifth year.

But tight end Aubry Payne is actually a seventh-year senior who started his college career in 2016 at Western Carolina.

Payne, who is married and turned 25 last week, is just five days younger than his position coach, Dan Ellington.

TAKING THE LEAD: Super senior center Malik Sumter, senior quarterback Darren Grainger, super senior inside linebacker Blake Carroll and junior outside linebacker Jamil Muhammad were elected the 2022 team captains.

HIT STICK: Junior safety Antavious Lane is a two-time All-Sun Belt Conference selection, and he ranks second in GSU history in career interceptions with nine.

> Lane owns the GSU season record with five picks in 2021. He finished the season-

- with interceptions in the each of the final three games, including a pick six in the bowl game victory over Ball State.
- > He stands sixth in program history with 203 career tackles.
- > Nicknamed Hit Stick, Lane is first-team Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference selection and a member of the preseason watch lists for the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Georgia State's 2022 schedule includes eight opponents who reached post-season play in 2021 (seven bowl teams plus FCS semifinalist James Madison), including two Power 5 opponents for the second straight year.

- > Georgia State is one of only four non-Power 5 programs in the nation not playing an FCS team this season, along with Old Dominion, Houston and UTEP.
- > Georgia State is one of only eight non-Power 5 programs that will play back-toback games against Power 5 opponents. Only GSU, App State and Kent State opened the season against back-to-back Power 5 teams.
- > GSU is playing two Power Five foes in a season for the second straight year and the fourth time in its history, along with 2013 (West Virginia and Alabama), 2014 (Washington and Clemson) and 2021 (North Carolina and Auburn).

2021 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Georgia State won seven of its final eight games in 2021 to finish with a school-record eight wins, capped by a 51-20 victory over Ball State in the TaxAct Camellia Bowl.

- > The Panthers ranked No. 8 in FBS in rushing, averaging 226.4 ypg, the second highest figure in program history. All-Sun Belt Conference running backs Tucker Gregg (953 yds, 9 TD) and Jamyest Williams (859 yds, 9 TD), who combined for 1,812 yards and 18 touchdowns, and quarterback Darren Grainger led all Sun Belt signal callers with 660 yards.
- > Grainger passed for 1,715 yards and 19 touchdowns with four interceptions to complement a rushing attack that ranked No. 8 in FBS in rushing, averaging 226.4 ypg, the second highest figure in program history.
- > The Georgia State defense set school records with 38 sacks and 92 tackles for loss while forcing 21 turnovers.

RUN IT BACK: Georgia State's success at running the football has been a key factor in the Panthers three straight winning seasons and bowl berths under head coach Shawn Elliott.

> The last three years have been the three best rushing season in program history, including a school-record 3,141 yards (241.6

HEAD COACH SHAWN ELLIOTT

In his 25 seasons as a Division I coach, Shawn Elliott has been part of 22 winning seasons and 20 postseason appearances, including four bowl games in his five years at Georgia State.

A coaching veteran who brought 20 years of experience in winning programs, Shawn Elliott was introduced as Georgia State's third head football coach by then-President Dr. Mark Becker and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Dec. 9, 2016. He came to GSU after highly successful stints at South Carolina, where he served as the co-offensive coordinator, offensive line coach and interim head coach, and Appalachian State, where he coached the offensive line.

In 25 seasons as a Division I coach, Elliott has been part of 22 winning seasons, 20 teams that reached the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game, and three consecutive NCAA FCS titles from 2005-07.

That success has continued at Georgia State, where Elliott has led the Panthers to bowl games and winning seasons in four of his five years in Atlanta, including the first three bowl victories in program history.

Elliott's 2021 squad won seven of its last eight games to a set the program record with eight victories. The Panthers achieved their third straight winning season at 8-5 while earning Georgia State's third straight bowl berth, also firsts in program history. GSU capped the season with a resounding 51-20 victory over Ball State in the TaxAct Camellia Bowl to win back-to-back bowl games for the first time.

After facing one of the toughest schedules in the Group of Five, Georgia State fought back from a 1-4 start to set the school-record for

Belt Conference victories with a 6-2 mark, good for second place in the East Division.

The 2021 team achieved another milestone with the program's first win over a nationallyranked opponent as the Panthers knocked off No. 21 Coastal Carolina 42-20 on the road.

The Panthers featured one of the nation's top rushing attacks, averaging 226.4 yards per game to rank No. 8 in FBS, along with an aggressive defense that set school records 38 sacks and with 92 tackles for loss. Thirteen Panthers were named to the 2021 All-Sun Belt Conference team.

Elliott and his staff navigated the unique challenges of 2020 to steer the Panthers to a winning season, capped by a victory in the LendingTree Bowl, marking the first backto-back winning records and bowl berths in school history.

The 2020 Panthers featured another prolific offense that averaged a school-record 33.3 points per game and an opportunistic defense that ranked in the top 10 in the nation in sacks with 35, the school record at the time, and turnovers forced with 21. Along the way, a program-record 14 individuals earned All-Sun Belt honors.

Other highlights of Elliott's first five years at GSU include the first bowl victory in school history, Georgia State's first winning season as an FBS program, and then-school record seven-win campaigns in both 2017 and 2019.

The 2019 season began with another major

Panthers earned a dominating 38-30 victory over Tennessee at Neyland Stadium for the school's first win over a Power 5 opponent.

Elliott was named the Dodd Trophy National Coach of the Week, and his Panthers were recognized as the FWAA Reveal Suits National Team of the Week. That is the third time that Elliott has been part of the National Team of the Week; his Appalachian State team was recognized for its 2007 victory at Michigan and his South Carolina squad for its 2010 win over No. 1 Alabama.

The win over Tennessee launched a recordsetting 2019 season as the Panthers won seven games in the regular season for the first time and achieved their best home record with a 5-1

Bolstered by one of the top rushing attacks in the nation, the 2019 team set numerous team and individual records, most notably establishing new season standards for points,

touchdowns, rushing yards and total offense.

Following the regular-season, 10 Panthers were named to the 2019 All-Sun Belt Conference squad, and the team earned a berth in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Despite taking over a Georgia State program playing just its eighth season of football in 2017, Elliott not only guided GSU to a bowl game in his first year at the helm, but he led the Panthers to their first bowl victory, 27-17 over Western Kentucky in the AutoNation Cure Bowl. That win gave the program a then-school record seven victories in Elliott's first season.

Under Elliott's watch, the Panthers achieved benchmark performances on both sides of the ball. The 2017 GSU defense set season records for fewest points allowed per game, and fewest rushing yards allowed per game (136.4). The defense also recorded the first shutout in school history.

On offense, the Panthers established new marks, since broken, for highest completion percentage (64.2) and fewest interceptions (9) in a season, as well as most total yards in a game (670) and most points vs. an FBS opponent (47).

Nine Panthers earned All-Sun Belt honors in 2017. Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan shined in the classroom and on the field as Georgia State's first football Academic All-American and the first Panther to be invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl.

Sullivan, one of three 2017 seniors to sign NFL free agent contracts, is now with the Green Bay Packers.

After inheriting a senior-dominated roster for his first season, Elliott's second campaign proved to be a rebuilding year as the Panthers were forced to play numerous freshmen.

Still, there were many positives during the 2018 season. First-year quarterback Dan Ellington passed for more than 2,000 yards, led the team in rushing and set a school record for fewest interceptions.

Punter Brandon Wright ranked No. 3 in FBS in punting average and net while setting the Sun Belt record at 48.3 yards per kick. The Ray Guy Award semifinalist is GSU's first semifinalist for a major college football award.

Standout receiver Penny Hart finished his career ranked fourth in Sun Belt history in receiving yards and eighth in receptions. He signed a free agent contract with the Indianapolis Colts, as did linebacker Chase Middleton. Hart is now with the Seattle Seahawks.

Individual honors in Elliott's first four seasons include 40 All-Sun Belt Conference honorees, Georgia State's first two players selected to the Reese's Senior Bowl, seven former players signed to NFL free agent contracts and a first-round selection in the CFL draft.

The accolades extend to the classroom with GSU's first Academic All-American* as well as five Academic All-District* selections. The

Panthers posted a program-record 3.03 GPA in Elliott's first semester and nearly matched that with a 3.0 for the spring 2020 term.

Before taking over the Georgia State program, Elliott worked seven seasons (2010-16) at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up a school-record 452.3 yards per game.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of the Year.

In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokevious Watkins.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State, his alma mater. In 13 seasons there, he was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 as well as the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached All-American and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients.

Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10 NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

Elliott was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from an automobile accident in 2000.

The two head coaches under whom Elliott spent the bulk of his time as an assistant coach, Spurrier at South Carolina and Jerry Moore at Appalachian State, are both enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a four-year letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.

SOUTH CAROLINA 35, GEORGIA STATE 14

Game 1: Sept. 3, 2022 • 7:30 p.m. (ESPN+/SECN+) Williams-Brice Stadium • Columbia, S.C.

Georgia State fell in its season opener at South Carolina, 35-14, at Williams-Brice Stadium.

GSU rushed for 200 yards, including 76 yards by Jamyest Williams, and cornerback Quavian White led the defense with two interceptions, but the Panthers hurt themselves with special teams miscues, including two blocked punts returned for touchdowns.

"I thought offensively and defensively, we went toe to toe with them, but we can't have those special teams mistakes. It's unacceptable," said head coach Shawn Elliott, who grew up near Columbia and spent seven seasons as assistant coach at South Carolina, serving as the interim head coach in 2015 following Steve Spurrier's retirement.

"We went out there and moved the ball, and we made plays defensively. I thought our guys busted their tails and fought hard, like I knew we would."

Georgia State outgained the Gamecocks 311 yards to 306. The GSU defense held South Carolina to 79 yards rushing on 32 carries, the fourth straight opponent that the Panthers have held below 100 yards rushing.

Trailing just 12-7 at the half, White, the Greer, S.C., native, intercepted South Carolina quarterback Spencer Rattler on the second play of the third quarter to give the Panthers possession at the USC 32.

Williams, who transferred from South Carolina, gained 20 yards on a short pass to the 12. Quarterback Darren Grainger converted on third down with a 7-yard run to the 2-yard line and scored two plays later on a 4-yard run around the right side to give Georgia State a 14-12 lead with 11:43 remaining in the third quarter.

South Carolina answered with a touchdown to regain the lead at 20-14 with seven minutes to play in the third quarter before the two blocked punts led to the final margin.

White intercepted Rattler again late in the third quarter, giving him nine career interceptions to equal teammate Antavious Lane for the GSU career lead.

Down 9-0, Georgia State got on the board late in the second quarter with a 6-play, 75-yard drive on which Grainger had two huge completions. He opened the march by finding Jamari Thrash down the right sideline for 28 yards, and he capped the drive with a 17-yard touchdown strike over the middle to Robert Lewis to pull GSU within 9-7.

South Carolina managed a late field goal to take a 12-7 lead into the locker room.

NORTH CAROLINA 35, GEORGIA STATE 28

Game 2: Sept. 10, 2022 • 7:30 p.m. (ESPNU) Center Parc Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State scored 25 straight points in the second and third quarters to take a 28-21 lead on North Carolina, but the Tar Heels managed a 35-28 victory at Center Parc Stadium.

With GSU hosting a Power 5 opponent for the first time, sophomore wide receiver Robert Lewis caught two touchdowns for the Panthers (0-2) and recorded career highs with seven receptions for 115 yards, while Jacorey Crawford and Jontrey Hunter led a GSU defense that forced three turnovers.

"I never, ever question what we do as a football team as far as effort," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Some of our execution could have been better, but man, what a team that we have. The way we played against the University of South Carolina and the University of North Carolina, we're going to hold our heads high and come back next week as a better football team.

"We had the opportunity to take that game, but we didn't make the plays that we needed to. Some critical plays, both offensively and defensively and on special teams. It was certainly a team loss. We made plays, but didn't make enough of those plays."

Trailing 21-3, Georgia State got in the end zone with five minutes left in the first half as Darren Grainger found Kris Byrd for a 6-yard scoring pass and the first career touchdown for the sophomore tight end to pull within 21-10 at the half.

The Panthers took the opening kickoff of the second half and drove 75 yards, capped by Grainger's 49-yard touchdown pass to Lewis, bringing GSU within 21-17.

On the next play, Crawford intercepted UNC (3-0) quarterback Drake Maye at the GSU 43, setting up Michael Hayes' 45-yard field goal, and the Panthers were within 21-20 with 10 minutes to play in the third quarter.

Crawford came up with another turnover on the Tar Heels' next possession, recovering a fumble at the GSU 26, but the Panthers could not convert. However, the GSU defense got a third-down sack from Javon Denis for a three-and-out.

After the punt, Georgia State was pinned at the 2-yard line, but the Panthers drove 98 yards on 10

plays, capped by Grainger's 29-yard TD to Lewis. Grainger then hit Jamari Thrash for the 2-point conversion, and Georgia State led 28-21 with two minutes left in the third quarter.

Lewis, the sophomore from Covington, Ga., has now caught four touchdown passes in the last three games.

But UNC managed back-to-back touchdowns, regaining the lead on Omarion Hampton's 2-yard run with 10:42 to play.

Georgia State put up 421 yards of offense with 235 yards rushing and 186 yards passing. Grainger finished 16-for-24 with three touchdowns and rushed for 75 yards. Tucker Gregg led the Panthers with 79 yards on the ground.

Game 3: Sept. 17, 2022 • 7 p.m. (ESPN+) Center Parc Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State rallied to take the lead on Darren Grainger's 32-yard touchdown pass to Jamari Thrash with 1:39 left, but Charlotte scored with just 17 seconds to play to come away with a 42-41 win at Center Parc Stadium.

Chris Reynolds' 2-yard scoring pass to Grant DuBose for the winning score spoiled prolific nights by Grainger, who passed for a career-high 343 yards, and Thrash, who broke the Georgia State singlegame receiving yardage record with 213 yards on 10 catches. The previous high was 191 yards by Penny Hart in 2017.

Georgia State (0-3) piled up 602 yards of offense, the fourth-highest figure in program history, as Grainger completed 22 of 34 passes with four touchdowns while the Panthers rushed for 259 yards, including an even 100 by Tucker Gregg, 94 by Marcus Carroll and 54 by Grainger. Sophomore tight end Kris Byrd caught two touchdown passes.

But the Panthers had trouble stopping Charlotte (1-3), which gained 501 yards, including 401 through the air as Reynolds was 31-for-43 for 401 yards and five touchdowns.

Trailing 35-33, GSU took over at its own 26 with 4:21 to play. Four straight runs by Carroll moved the bll out to the GSU 49, and then Gregg rushed three times to give the Panthers a first down at the Charlotte 32, setting up Grainger's TD pass to Thrash. Grainger then rushed for the two-point conversion to give the Panthers a 41-35 lead with 1:33 left.

Reynolds moved Charlotte into the red zone, and then a pass interference penalty in the end zone gave the 49ers a first-and-goal at the 2. On third-andthree, Reynolds found DuBose over the middle for the go-ahead score.

"It was a poorly executed football game, starting with me," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It starts with myself and it goes down to our assistant coaches, to our captains and our seniors and to everyone in that locker room. Offensively, defensively and special teams. It's 42-41 and we missed an extra point, gave up a sack fumble and gave up 500 yards of offense. We didn't execute at all today."

Georgia State started fast with a touchdown on the opening possession, driving 75 yards in 11 plays, capped by Grainger's 9-yard TD pass to Byrd.

The Panthers also scored on their second possession as Grainger connected with Robert Lewis for a 49-yard scoring play to take a 14-7 lead with 6:21 left in the first quarter. That was Lewis' fourth TD catch of the season and fifth over the last four games.

Charlotte moved ahead 21-14 with back-to-back touchdowns, including a sack-fumble returned for a score. Georgia State answered with Tucker Gregg's 2-yard touchdown run, but a missed extra point left the Panthers trailing 21-20 midway throught the second quarter.

Gregg's TD was set up by a 73-yard pass to Thrash for Grainger's longest completion in a Panther uniform and the longest pass for any GSU quarterback since 2016 (Conner Manning to Glenn Smith for 78 yards).

Super senior cornerback Quavian White grabbed his 10th career interception to take sole possession of the Georgia State career lead, moving ahead of junior safety Antavious Lane (9).

Georgia State fell to Coastal Carolina 41-24 in a Thursday night game at Center Parc Stadium.

Darrén Grainger passed for 231 yards, and outside linebacker Jontrey Hunter had a school-record 77-yard interception return for a touchdown, but the Panthers' (0-4) potent running game was limited to 78 yards

Coastal Carolina (4-0) got off to a hot start with a pair of quick touchdowns to take a 14-0 lead just three minutes into the game before Georgia State got on the board with an 87-yard touchdown drive. Tucker Gregg scored on a 4-yard run for his 19th career rushing touchdown to tie the GSU record set by Tra Barnett (2016-19). That pulled the Panthers within 14-7 with midway through the first quarter.

Late in the first half, Robert Lewis hauled in a 29-yard touchdown pass to bring the Panthers within 27-17 with 44 seconds left in the first half. The sophomore receiver has caught a TD pass in five straight games, including two against North Carolina for six scores in his last five contests.

Georgia State opened the second half with the ball, but a promising drive ended with an interception and the Coastal 16, and the Chanticleers converted the turnover into a long touchdown drive for a 14-point swing and a 34-17 lead.

That remained the score until Hunter grabbed his first career interception and raced for the end zone, pulling the Panthers within 34-24 with 7:28 to play. But Coastal sealed the win with a touchdown drive.

"I credit Coastal Carolina. They've got a good football team, and they play extremely hard," Elliott said. "You just can't make the mistakes that we made.

"It was a very disappointing night. We were shorthanded a little bit, but there are capable players to go out there and play. A couple of missed assignments right from the get-go just got us behind very very quickly."

After losing top LB Blake Carroll to a seasonending injury, the Panthers also played without their top three offensive tackles.

GEORGIA STATE 31, ARMY 14

Game 5: Oct. 1, 2022 • 12 p.m. (CBSSN) Michie Stadium • West Point, N.Y.

Tucker Gregg and Jamyest Williams each rushed for over 100 yards, and the Georgia State defense came up with a huge goal-line stand in the fourth quarter to lead the Panthers to a 31-14 victory at Army Saturday afternoon at Michie Stadium.

With the Panthers holding a 17-14 lead in the fourth quarter, Georgia State (1-4) stopped Army (1-3) on fourth down inside the 1-yard line to preserve the lead with nine minutes to play and then stopped Army one more time on fourth down with three minutes left.

The GSU offense took over at midfield, needing one first down to seal the win, and on 3rd-and-5 at the GSU 43, quarterback Darren Grainger connected with Ja'Cyais Credle down the right sideline for a 57-yard touchdown and a 24-14 lead with 2:59 left.

"It was a great way to win," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We faced some adversity in the second half and we had to dig down and find out what we're made of to make a stop. They had about six inches to go for that touchdown. Then to see us finish the game offensively the way we did, it was a great way to finish.

"We still have a long way to go, but what you saw out there today was what I had envisioned for our first four contests."

Gregg put the exclamation point on the victory with a 56-yard touchdown run with 55 seconds left. Not only did that run give him 124 yards for his fifth career 100-yard game, but it was his 20th career rushing touchdown to give him sole possession of the Georgia State record.

Williams had 106 yards rushing, including a 33-yard TD run in the second quarter that put the Panthers up 17-0. Grainger rushed for 48 yards with a 13-yard touchdown, and Marcus Carroll added 28 yards as Georgia State put up 299 yards on the ground.

Grainger threw just 12 times, completing eight for 157 yards and one touchdown.

Leading the Georgia State defense was inside linebacker Jordan Veneziale, who had a career-high 13 tackles, two fumble recoveries and two pass breakups. Redshirt freshman linebacker Jordan Jones, making his first start in place of injured star Blake Carroll, made 12 tackles.

The Panthers shut out Army in the first half, but then had to hold on as the Black Knights got their running game going in the second half. On the fourth down play at the goal line, a host of tacklers led by Shamar McCollum stuffed Army's 260-pound fullback up the middle.

"I don't know what we'll do from here on out, but that goal-line stand just may be the doggone click that we needed," Elliott said. "This team decided we were not losing today and they rallied around one another and pulled for one another and won for one another."

Once the defense came up with those two fourth-down stops, the offense sealed it with the gutsy call that resulted in the Credle's 57-yard touchdown

"The call was win the game," Elliott said. "He said, if the shot is there, do you want to take it, and I said, Yes sir, we're taking it.

"It was so nice to see that ball go up in the air and land in those hands and run into the end zone."

GEORGIA STATE 41, GEORGIA SOUTHERN 33

Game 6: Oct. 8, 2022 • 2 p.m. (ESPN3) Center Parc Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State piled up 335 yards rushing, including 100-yard games by Jamyest Williams and Tucker Gregg, and the GSU defense forced a school-record five turnovers as the Panthers defeated Georgia Southern for the third straight year with a 41-33 victory at Center Parc Stadium.

Georgia Śtate (2-4, 1-1 Sun Belt) improved to 6-3 in the all-time series against Georgia Southern (3-3, 0-2).

Williams and Gregg each topped the 100-yard mark for the second straight game, combining for 240 yards and three touchdowns. Williams finished with a career-high 129 yards, including a 6-yard touchdown run, while Gregg had 111 yards and two scores, topping the 2,000-yard mark for his career. The senior from Chatsworth, Ga., now has 2,020 career yards, 136 yards behind Tra Barnett's GSU record of 2,156.

Quarterback Darren Grainger added 70 yards rushing while passing for 186 yards and two touchdowns.

Georgia State tied its school record with four interceptions as Quavian White, Jamil Muhammad, Jontrey Hunter and Jordan Jones came up with picks. Hunter also caused a late fumble that was recovered

by Jordan Veneziale, who has three fumble recoveries in the last two games. The four interceptions and five turnovers forced equal the school records set vs. South Alabama in 2011.

"This game means a lot," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It was a great football game. There were times when I thought we were going to pull away, but credit to that football team and their coaching staff. They kept fighting back, and we had to go out there and win it."

The Panthers took the lead for good on a pair of Michael Hayes field goals in the first quarter to go up 13-7 with a minute left in the period.

In the second quarter, Williams, the senior from Athens, Ga., gained every yard on a 6-play, 75-yard scoring drive. He started the march with a 42-yard run and finished it with a 6-yard touchdown for a 20-10 lead with 10 minutes left in the first half.

Hunter's interception at the GSU 21-yard line set up another quick scoring drive as Grainger hit Tailique Williams for 16 yards and then connected with Jamari Thrash for a 53-yard scoring play and a 27-10 lead.

Georgia State entered the third quarter with a 27-17 lead and marched down the field on its opening possession, capped by Gregg's 3-yard touchdown. That put the Panthers up 34-17 five minutes into the third quarter.

Georgia Southern managed a pair of touchdowns, but Justin Abraham blocked an extra point for the Panthers to keep Georgia State's lead at 34-30 with two minutes left in the third quarter.

Then the Panthers answered with a 9-play, 75-yard scoring drive as Gregg broke through the middle for a 33-yard touchdown run, extending the lead to 41-30 with 13 minutes to play.

After holding Georgia Southern to a field goal, the GSU defense came up with a pair of huge turnovers late in the game. Jones intercepted Georgia Southern quarterback Kyle Vantrease at midfield with five minutes left, and after a Georgia State punt, Hunter punched the ball away from Khaleb Hood, and Veneziale recovered at the Georgia Southern 34.

After three runs by Gregg netted nine yards, the Panthers went for it on fourth down and sealed the win with Gregg's 3-yard run for first down.

"That last fourth-down play, when you gotta get the first down, there was really no question what we were going to do. I thought we controlled the line of scrimmage all day," said Elliott, whose squad has rushed for 534 yards over the last two games.

"It feels very good to have two wins in a row, from where we started. I'm very proud of our football team."

Playing a Wednesday night Sun Belt Conference game at Appalachian State, Georgia State fell 42-17 to the Mountaineers at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Running back Tucker Gregg rushed 93 yards and a touchdown and quarterback Darren Grainger added 92 yards and a score to lead the Panthers (2-5, 1-2 Sun Belt). Georgia State rushed for 228 yards, but turned the ball over four times and struggled in the passing game as Grainger was 7-for-23 for 73 yards.

Gregg's 93 yards moved him closer to the Georgia State career rushing record. The super senior from Chatsworth, Ga., now has 2,113 yards, just 43 yards behind Tra Barnett's school record of 2,156 yards. Gregg also scored his 23rd career rushing touchdown, adding to his GSU record.

Georgia State started fast, scoring touchdowns on its first two possessions. First the Panthers drove 79 yards on 11 plays, capped by Gregg's 4-yard touchdown. After forcing App State to punt, Georgia State extended its lead to 14-0 on Grainger's 26-yard scoring run with four minutes left in the first quarter.

On that run, the GSU quarterback topped the 1,00yard rushing mark for his Georgia State career.

App State scored late in the first half, and Georgia State took a 14-7 lead into the intermission.

The Panthers opened the second half with the ball and quickly moved down the field for a first down at the App 34. But a penalty on first down led to a sack and fumble on third down, and App State (4-3, 2-2 Sun Belt) converted the turnover into the tying touchdown.

"The opening drive of the second half was really critical," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We came out and got a big run. You've got first-and-10 and you get a false start penalty. Now it's first-and-15 and that leads to the doggone fumble, and then they take advantage of it."

"I try to tell these guys, you can't give a good football team hope. We had them at that particular point, but we gave them momentum and they took advantage of it.

"We played hard, and we played with great effort. We just couldn't hold up."

App State forced a punt on the Panthers' next possession and drove for the go ahead touchdown, moving ahead 21-14 with four minutes left in the third quarter on a 1-yard scoring run by quarterback Chase Brice. An interception deep in Georgia State territory led to another App touchdown and a 28-14 lead late in the third quarter.

In his first game back from injury, running back Camerun Peoples rushed for 168 yards to lead App State
