It took the ODU Football Monarchs until year three and 27 games to receive its first Top 25 ranking on October 3, 2011 coming in at No. 21 in The Sports Network Poll. Looking at other recent start-up programs, it took Coastal Carolina 32 games to achieve a national ranking when they came in at No. 24 in The Sports Network Poll in their third year on Nov. 8, 2005. That season the Chanticleers finished 9-2 and were the Big South co-champions.

When the ODU Football Monarchs take the field on Saturday at Georgia Southern, it will be as a nationally-ranked team in both The Sports Network/Fathead.com and FCS Coaches Polls for the eighth consecutive week and as a member of the Top Ten for the third straight week.

In another first for the ODU Football program, the Monarchs were ranked in the Top 25 for the first time in school history coming in at No. 21 nine weeks ago in The Sports Network/Fathead.com FCS Top-25 College Football Poll following a 48-33 win over then-#20 UMass, the Monarchs first ever Top 25 victory. Following ODU's 31-23 victory over Rhode Island the next weekend, ODU made its FCS Coaches Poll debut during week seven coming in at No. 22. ODU steadily moved up the ranks until it cracked the Top Ten at the conclusion of the season with a 35-31 win at nearby William & Mary to end the regular season on a four-game win streak and a 9-2 overall and a 6-2 record in its inaugural season of CAA play.

- Old Dominion enters Saturday's game after a 35-18 first round playoff victory over crosstown rival Norfolk State last Saturday. The Monarchs are currently riding a five-game win streak.

- The Monarchs will be a Top Ten program for the third straight week. Old Dominion is No. 10 in The Sports Network/Fathead.com poll for the second consecutive week and fell back a spot to No. 10 in the FCS Coaches Poll despite a bye week.

- Old Dominion restarted its football program in 2009 after a 69-year absence and in its three years has compiled an 27-7 overall mark as the best start-up in FCS history.

- Old Dominion went 9-2 in its inaugural season, 8-3 in 2010, and currently stands at 10-2 this season with victories over Campbell, Georgia State, Hampton, #20 UMass, Rhode Island, Villanova, #9/10 James Madison, Richmond, and William & Mary in the regular season and a first round playoff victory over Norfolk State last weekend.

- After playing two years as an independent in the FCS, the Monarchs joined the CAA, considered by many to be the best FCS conference in the nation. After no selection on the pre-season all-conference team and picked to finish 10th in the pre-season poll, Old Dominion tied for second in league play with a 6-2 CAA record and had 11 Monarchs honored on All-CAA teams announced on Monday highlighted by CAA Defensive Player of the Year Ronnie Cameron.

- Five of the CAA's 11 programs are in the post-season, the most of any conference - James Madison defeated Eastern Kentucky in other first round action and will play at North Dakota State in round two. New Hampshire, Maine, and Towson all received byes. The Wildcats face Montana State, Towson hosts Lehigh, and Maine is on the road at Appalachian State in second round action.

- Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium continues to be the place to be in Hampton Roads on Saturdays. The Monarchs' 21 home games, all have been sellouts. While the last two season's have averaged 19,782, additional seating has brought Foreman Field's capacity to 19,818. ODU is currently sixth in average attendance through Week 13.

- As a team through Week 13, the Monarchs are ranked in the Top 20 nationally in Net Punting (9th - 37.69), Scoring Offense (10th - 35.75), Sacks (11th - 3.00), Turnover Margin (13th - 1.00) Rushing Defense (16th - 115.92), Total Offense (17th - 429.17), and Passing Efficiency (18th - 147.91),

- Individually in the national stats this season Jonathan Plisco ranks second in Punting (46.12) and cornerback Eriq Lewis is tied for sixth in Interceptions (0.50)

FIRST MEETING

THE TRIPLE OPTION:

This will be the third time the Monarchs will face a triple option team. ODU first saw the triple option in its 2009 season finale at VMI exiting Lexington, Virginia with a 42-35 victory after the Keydets ran for 422 yards. Last season, the Monarchs fell at home to nationally-ranked Cal Poly, 50-37, as the Mustangs ran the ball for 326 yards.

The Eagles are currently second in the nation in rushing offense average 318.73 yards per game.

THE OLD AND THE NEW:

While the Monarchs are making their first NCAA Division I Championship playoff appearance, the Eagles have quite a bit of experience. Georgia Southern is the all-time winningest team in the FCS playoffs with a 41-11 record having brought home the national title six times - 1985, 1986, 1989, 1990, 1999, & 2000.

POST-SEASON AWARD WINNERS FOR THE EAGLES:

After winning the 2011 Southern Conference Championship, three members of the Georgia Southern Football team earned major SoCon Awards - Head Coach Jeff Monken - Coach of the Year, Brent Russell - Defensive Player of the Year, and Dominique Swope - Co-Freshman of the Year. In all, nine Eagles were named to the All-Southern Conference First and Second Teams, while three more were selected to the All-Freshmen Squad.

HONORED MONARCHS:

CAA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

9/12 - Running Back - Colby Goodwyn

Sophomore Colby Goodwyn picked up CAA Football Offensive Player of the Week honors and was named the College Football Performance Award National Running Back of the Week after leading Old Dominion to a 40-17 win at Georgia State during week two. The sophomore carried the ball 26 times for 184 yards and a touchdown, marking the second-highest rushing total in ODU's short program history. The yardage mark is also the highest CAA Football total since Delaware's Andrew Pierce rattled off 200 yards against Duquesne on Sept. 18 last season. Goodwyn, who also hauled in one catch for five yards, logged three rushes of 20-or-more yards in the win including a 53-yarder in the fourth quarter.

CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

9/5 - Wide Receiver - #5 Antonio Vaughan

Redshirt freshman wide receiver Antonio Vaughan was rewarded for his impressive Monarch debut against Campbell in week by being named CAA Football's Rookie of the Week finishing his Monarch debut with 191 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns in ODU's 41-14 win over Campbell in week one. He hauled in six catches for 97 yards, including a 34-yard second-quarter touchdown pass from Thomas DeMarco. Vaughan later showed his ground skills by scampering 30 yards to paydirt in the third quarter, boosting the ODU lead to 38-7. The CAA Football Rookie of the Week was also effective in the Monarchs' return game posting a 16-yard punt return and two kickoff returns for 48 yards. Vaughan was ODU's first ever CAA weekly award winner.

10/3 - Quarterback - #14 Taylor Heinicke

True freshman Taylor Heinicke was inserted into the Monarch offense after signal caller Thomas DeMarco, who had started all 26 games to-date was sidelined with an injury in the second half, to throw for 119 yards and two touchdowns in helping ODU to its first-ever CAA victory and first win over a ranked team in week five's 48-33 win over #20 UMass in week five. Heinicke completed eight of his 11 attempts, which included a then-school record 56-yard touchdown pass to Reid Evans. The true freshman also found Larry Pinkard on a 38-yard touchdown throw to kick off the first of three fourth quarter touchdowns. Heinicke also ran the ball five times for 24 yards in his Monarch debut.

10/31 - Quarterback - #14 Taylor Heinicke

The true freshman signal caller Taylor Heinicke helped lead his Old Dominion football squad to its first Top 10 victory in school history with a 23-20 victory over #9/10 James Madison in week nine. Heinicke was named the Oyster Most Valuable Player after passing for 236 yards and two touchdowns and was the Monarchs' leading rusher with 50 yards on 11 carries. The Atlanta, Georgia native connected with Larry Pinkard twice - first on a 17-yard pass to open up scoring and the second a 23-yard pass after scrambling well behind the line of scrimmage on fourth and two and lofting the ball to Pinkard near the end line in the second quarter.

11/7 - Quarterback - #14 Taylor Heinicke

Earning back-to-back CAA Rookie of the Week honors and his third overall CAA weekly honor, Taylor Heinicke continued to lead the Monarchs by throwing for a season-high 373 yards and three touchdowns in the Monarchs' 42-28 victory over Richmond in week ten. Heinicke completed 34 of his 47 attempts and posted his second 300+ passing game of his six appearances thus far. Heinicke opened up scoring by connecting with Larry Pinkard on a 14-yard pass and added a 29-yard touchdown throw to Prentice Gill with five minutes remaining in the second quarter. CAA SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

10/3 - Wide Receiver - #81 Jakwail Bailey

True freshman Jakwail Bailey blocked a UMass punt that led to a safety and returned the lead for good in ODU's 48-33 win over the #20 Minutemen in the Monarchs' first ever CAA win and win over a ranked opponent in week five. With the Minutemen at 4th and 12 and pinned back at their own 10-yard line, Bailey blocked the Monarchs' fourth punt this season. Having allowed the Minutemen to rattle off 26 unanswered points after the Monarchs had achieved a 25-0 lead, Bailey's blocked punt and safety gave ODU a 27-26 edge and a lead they would not relinquish.

CAA DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

11/14 - Cornerback - Eriq Lewis

Redshirt freshman Eriq Lewis became Old Dominion's first ever CAA Defensive Player of the Week as his two pivotal interceptions during William & Mary's final two drives helped seal a 35-31 victory for the Football Monarchs in Week 11. Lewis' first pick came on the Tribe's second-to-last drive of the game after ODU had taken a four-point lead. His second pick ended the game as William and Mary was again marching down the field in search of a game-winning touchdown with less than 30 seconds left on the clock. Lewis became the first Monarch to ever record two interceptions in one game. The redshirt freshman also forced a fumble on the Monarch goaline in the first quarter. The turnover, recovered by Carvin Powell, halted an eventual touchdown and resulted in a touchback.

THE SPORTS NETWORK/FATHEAD.COM NATIONAL ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

11/7 - Quarterback - #14 Taylor Heinicke

Taylor Heinicke continued to lead the Monarchs by throwing for a season-high 373 yards and three touchdowns in the Monarchs' 42-28 victory over Richmond. CFPA NATIONAL RUNNING BACK OF THE WEEK:

9/12 - Running Back - Colby Goodwyn

Coldby Goodwyn, who earned CAA Offensive Player of the Week honors as well, carried the ball 26 times for 190 yards and a touchdown, marking the second-highest rushing total in ODU's short program history in ODU's week two win at Georgia State. The yardage mark is also the highest CAA Football total since New Hampshire's Dontra Peters rattled off 197 yards against Central Connecticut State Sept. 4 last season. Goodwyn logged three rushes of 20-or-more yards in the win including a 53-yarder in the fourth quarter.

CFPA NATIONAL LINEBACKER OF THE WEEK:

10/10 - Linebacker - Craig Wilkins

Redshirt junior linebacker Craig Wilkins made seven tackles (4 solo, 3 assisted), including 3.5 for loss, in the week six victory at Rhode Island, which gave the Monarchs their first ever CAA road win. The Monarch co-captain also had a 12-yard interception return that led to the Monarchs' first scoring drive of the game.

CFPA NATIONAL DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK:

10/31 - Defensive Tackle - Ronnie Cameron

Redshirt senior defensive tackle Ronnie Cameron posted 10 tackles, including three of those for a loss of 12 yards in ODU's first ever Top 10 victory in the 23-20 win over #9/10 James Madison. His 10 tackles were just one shy of his season-high. Cameron and the Monarch defense held James Madison scoreless in the second half of play and held the CAA's leading rushing offense at 242.7 yards per game and 5.0 yards per play to 103 yards and 2.7 yards per carry

CFPA NATIONAL PERFORMER/QUARTERBACK OF THE WEEK

11/7 - Quarterback - #14 Taylor Heinicke

Taylor Heinicke continued to lead the Monarchs by throwing for a season-high 373 yards and three touchdowns in the Monarchs' 42-28 victory over Richmond. Heinicke completed 34 of his 47 attempts and posted his second 300+ passing game of his six appearances thus far. Heinicke opened up scoring by connecting with Larry Pinkard on a 14-yard pass and added a 29-yard touchdown throw to Prentice Gill with five minutes remaining in the second quarter. Midway through the fourth quarter with the score tied at 28-28, Heinicke helped orchestrate an 11-play, 67-yard drive from the Monarchs own 33 with 17 yards rushing and completing six of his nine passes, capping it off with a 1-yard pass to Antonio Vaughan to put ODU ahead for good.

Defensive Lineman - Ronnie Cameron - Redshirt Senior - Westbury, N.Y.
Cameron was second on the Monarch squad with 67 tackles (25 solo, 42 assisted) along with a team-leading 15.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks. He averaged 6.1 tackles per game, which was second among defensive lineman in the CAA and led the league in tackles for loss averaging 1.41 per contest. Cameron also led the Monarchs with eight quarterback hurries. He captured a career-high 11 tackles against CAA Champion Towson.

FIRST TEAM ALL-CAA PROFILES:

Defensive Lineman - Ronnie Cameron - Redshirt Senior - Westbury, N.Y.
Cameron was second on the Monarch squad with 67 tackles (25 solo, 42 assisted) along with a team-leading 15.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks. He averaged 6.1 tackles per game, which was second among defensive lineman in the CAA and led the league in tackles for loss averaging 1.41 per contest. Cameron also led the Monarchs with eight quarterback hurries. He captured a career-high 11 tackles against CAA Champion Towson.

Wide Receiver - Nick Mayers - Redshirt Junior - Va. Beach, Va.
Mayers led the Monarchs with 59.3 yards receiving a game, ranking fourth among all conference receivers, and totaled 593 yards on 51 catches with five touchdowns. His 5.10 receptions per contest ranked him sixth in the CAA. Mayers posted a pair of touchdowns against UMass in the Monarchs' first league win and first victory over a nationally-ranked opponent. He also logged scores in games with Rhode Island, Towson, and Villanova. He also captured 100+ yard receiving games with a school-record 166 yards against CAA Champion Towson and 101 yards in the regular season finale victory at William & Mary.

Punter - Joanthan Plisco - Redshirt Junior - Newport News, Va.
Plisco led the CAA and ranks second in the nation averaging 46.1 yards per punt. Of his 48 punts on the year, 19 went the distance of 50 yards or more and 11 were placed inside the opponent 20. Plisco also ran a pair of fake punt that picked up two key first downs against Delaware and Villanova.

Linebacker - Craig Wilkins - Redshirt Junior - Washington, D.C.
Wilkins collected 101 tackles (56 solo, 45 assisted), including 13.5 tackles for loss to lead the Monarch defense in 2011. Posted double figure stops in four games including a career-high 17 tackles against Hampton, Wilkins became the first Monarch to register over 100 tackles in a season. The redshirt junior also added 2.5 sacks, a pair of interceptions, a fumble recovery, and a forced fumble on the season. He also blocked a James Madison field goal as time expired to preserve ODU's 23-20 win over the Dukes and the Monarchs' first win over a Top Ten program. Wilkins averaged 9.2 tackles per game, ranking him seventh in the league.

SECOND TEAM ALL-CAA PROFILES:

Cornerback - Eriq Lewis - Redshirt Freshman - Washington, D.C.
Lewis, a member of the Jerry Rice Watch List for the FCS' most outstanding freshman, led the Monarchs with four interceptions and became the first Monarch with more than one interception in a game having two against William & Mary. Lewis, who missed three games with a high ankle sprain, posted 36 tackles, eight pass break-ups, and defended 12 passes in his nine games. He ranked fifth in the CAA in interceptions and was the top freshman in the category. Lewis also ranked third in fumbles forced, again the top performance by a CAA freshman defender.

THIRD TEAM ALL-CAA PROFILES:

Kicker - Jarod Brown - Redshirt Sophomore - Yorktown, Va.
Brown led the Monarchs in scoring accounting for 90 of Old Dominion's 394 points on the season. He connected on 14 of his 20 field goals attempts, which included a career-high 51-yard field goal against future CAA opponent Georgia State. He also only missed one PAT going 46-of-47 coming in second in the league at 97.9%. Brown averaged 8.2 points per contest ranking him third in the conference.

Defensive Lineman - Chris Burnette - Redshirt Junior - Baltimore, Md.
Burnette collected 43 tackles (17 solo, 26 assisted) and was among the team's leaders in tackles for loss with 7.0 and sacks with 3.5. His performance on the defensive line helped the Monarchs rank second in the league in rushing defense allowing just 122.55 yards per contest. Burnette also blocked a pair of field goals against Delaware and William & Mary.

Wide Receiver/Punt Return - Reid Evans - Redshirt Junior - Va. Beach, Va.
Evans averaged 48.1 yards receiving per game totaling 593 yards on 45 catches. Evans captured touchdown receptions in victories over Georgia State, UMass - in the Monarchs' first CAA win and first victory over a nationally-ranked opponent, and William & Mary. He captured a career-high 149 yards receiving on a school-record 12 receptions in the win over Richmond. He was also the Monarchs' go to on punt returns averaging 8.6 yards per return ranking him third in the conference.

Quarterback - Taylor Heinicke - Freshman - Atlanta, Ga.
Heinicke's name does not appear in the conference or national stats due to the fact he had not played in the minimum 75% of games played to qualify. However, his 252.9 passing yards per game would have ranked him second in the CAA and 19th nationally, his 155.0 pass efficiency rating would lead the conference and place him sixth nationally, and his 290.4 yards of total offense per contest would put his name second in the CAA and 10th nationally. A member of the Jerry Rice Watch list for the most outstanding freshman, Heinicke collected seven touchdowns in his seven appearances, the most of any CAA quarterback. He has played 32 quarters competing 165 of his 233 passes, making just one interception coming against Towson in the final minute of play.

Offensive Lineman - Jeremy Hensley - Senior - La Palma, Calif.
Hensley, the Monarchs' center, helped pave the way for ODU to rank ninth nationally and lead the CAA in scoring offense at 35.82 points per game. Hensley was a part of the offensive line which allowed the Monarchs to average 170.82 yards of rushing offense, third in the league, and 262.36 yards of passing offense, second in the league. In total, Hensley helped clear the way to have the Monarchs

START-UPS IN THE POST-SEASON:

How have recent start-ups fared in the post-season. The bench mark of the FCS has been Coastal Carolina, which made its first playoff appearance in year number four falling 42-28 to Appalachian State in the first round of the FCS playoffs in 2006. Robert Morris, who started their program in 2001 played for nine seasons before winning the inaugural NEC title in 2010 to head to the post-season. The Colonials fell to North Dakota State, 43-17 in the first round last season.

Other recent start-ups have gone from the FCS (or I-AA level) to FBC status and reached bowl games. Florida Atlantic, who played at the FCS level from 2003-2006, went to the New Orleans Bowl in its second season of FBS status where they defeated Memphis, 44-27. FIU, who also started at FCS status when they began their program in 2004, reached the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl last season in their fifth year as an FBC school where won against Toledo, 34-32.

S.B. BALLARD STADIUM - A POPULAR PLACE:

Old Dominion's home field of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium has sold out all 21 of its games to date. Last Saturday's total attendance of the Old Dominion-Norfolk State first round game surpassed the total attendance of the three other first round games combined.

The winner of the Robinson Award, presented by The Sports Network and sponsored by Fathead.com, will be announced at the national awards banquet on Friday, Jan. 6 in Frisco, Texas - the night before the national championship game. A panel of over 150 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will select the Robinson Award winner.

JERRY RICE WATCH LIST:

True freshman quarterback Taylor Heinicke was added to the Jerry Rice Watch list prior to the Monarchs' kick with Richmond in week ten.

The Rice Award will honor the outstanding freshman in the Football Championship Subdivision. The legendary Rice, who played in the FCS (then Division I-AA) at Mississippi Valley State, will present the award at the national awards banquet on Jan. 6 in Frisco, Texas.

Since taking over as the Monarchs' signal caller at halftime of week five against UMass, Heinicke has passed for 2039 yards completing 186 of his 263 attempts with just one interception (Towson). He has earned CAA Rookie of the Week three times this season and was named Third Team All-CAA.

Cornerback Eriq Lewis was also a member of the Jerry Rice Watch List earlier in the season being among the first freshman named to the awards' first ever initial list of potential Freshmen of the Year. Lewis missed three games with a high ankle sprain, but recently returned in the Monarchs' regular season finale with William & Mary to earn ODU's first ever CAA Defensive Player of the Week honor as his two pivotal interceptions during the Tribe's final two drives helped seal a 35-31 victory for the Football Monarchs.

WELCOME TO THE CAA:

Entering its inaugural season in the CAA, the ODU Football Monarchs were picked 10th in the conference's Preseason Poll announced at CAA Football Media Day at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore, Maryland and no Monarchs were named to an preseason all-conference team.

The Monarchs had a pair of blocked field goals in their playoff debut last weekend. Chris Burnette blocked his third field goal on the year and fifth of his career on a 37-yard attempt by the Spartans. In addition to thwarting field goals against the William & Mary and Delaware earlier this season, Burnette stopped a 37-yard field-goal attempt by Virginia Union and a 32-yard attempt by Presbyterian back in 2009.

Edmon McClam, who holds NCAA Division I record for most blocked PAT's by a single player in a game (FCS or FBS) with three against the Chowan Hawks in the inaugural game in 2009 and is just one blocked PAT shy of tying the FCS record for blocked extra points in a career, blocked his first field goal attempt on a 50-yard Spartan attempt.

In the regular season finale, Burnette kept a 35-yard William & Mary attempt going through the uprights on the Tribe's final drive of the second quarter with the score knotted at 14-14.

In week 10, Jakwail Bailey blocked his second punt of the 2011 season against Richmond.

In week nine, Craig Wilkins blocked a 47-yard James Madison field goal attempt in last moments of ODU's 23-20 win over the Dukes leading the Monarchs to their first Top 10 victory in school history.

In week five, Jakwail Bailey blocked a UMass punt that results in a safety, giving the Monarchs a 26-25 lead they would not relinquish late in the third quarter. For his efforts, Bailey was named the CAA Special Teams Player of the Week.

The Monarchs also blocked a 48-yard Delaware field goal attempt, recording a block for its third consecutive contest.

In week three's game with Hampton true freshman James Faircloth blocked a Pirate punt resulting in Larry Pinkard returning the ball five-yards for a touchdown to open up the fourth quarter in the 45-42 victory. It was the third time in the two-game series with the Pirates that ODU has blocked a punt attempted by Hampton.

In week two's 40-17 win at Georgia State, Alex Arain blocked his second career punt that was picked up by Blair Roberts and returned for a touchdown. Additionally, Paul Morant blocked a punt in the victory.

HOME/AWAY:

Old Dominion is currently 16-5 all-time and 6-1 this season at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium following its 35-18 victory over Norfolk State in first round playoff action. The Monarchs have won three straight at home following a 39-35 set back to Towson, which had snapped a six-game home game win streak for ODU that had dated back to Oct. 9th, 2010 in a 50-37 setback to Cal Poly.

In their last road outing, a 35-31 victory over William & Mary, ODU improved to 4-1 this season and 11-2 all-time on the road. ODU's last road loss was a 27-17 setback at #6/7 Delaware on Sept. 24 of this season after having won seven straight away from the friendly confines of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. Prior to the Blue Hen loss, the Monarchs last loss on the road was a 34-29 setback at Fordham on Oct. 3, 2009.

STOPPING THE RUN:

The Monarchs are second in the CAA in rush defense and 16th nationally allowing the opposing team just under 116 yards per game. Take a look at how ODU has shut down its opponent's run game.

The JMU Dukes came into week nine as the CAA's leading rushing offense at 242.7 yards per game and 5.0 yards per play and they were held to 103 yards and 2.7 yards per carry.

Richmond and William & Mary, has been the only school this season to rush for more yardage per carry than they were averaging entering the game.

WAITING FOR STATS APPEARANCE:

True freshman Taylor Heinicke's name does not appear in the conference or national stats due to the fact he had not played in the minimum 75% of games played to qualify. Appearing following the half of the Week Five game with UMass, Heinicke has appeared in eight of ODU's 12 games, resulting in him appearing in only 67% of the Monarchs contests played.

However, if his name did appear...his 254.9 passing yards per game would have ranked 19th nationally, his 160.2 pass efficiency rating would place him fifth nationally, and his 291.1 yards of total offense per contest would put his name 10th nationally.

MORE PEOPLE WATCH THE MONARCHS WIN:

A new attendance mark was set in the Monarchs' home opener against Campbell in week one thanks to new seats in the loge level of the Ainslie Game Day Building. 19,818 people were in attendance to witness the Monarchs' 41-14 victory over the Camels.

SOLD OUT:

The Old Dominion University football program begins its third season of competition and its first as an official member of the Colonial Athletic Association this fall, and for the third consecutive year the Monarchs have sold through their season ticket allocations at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Since starting football in 2009, Old Dominion University has sold out of all available season tickets, setting national attendance records for start-up Football Championship Subdivision programs. The Monarchs ranked fourth in both accumulated and average attendance in 2010 and a total

of 415,674 fans have entered through the turnstiles in the 21-games played at Foreman Field the last three seasons.

ODU fans purchased more than 14,000 season tickets for the 2011 season, with 400 of those tickets sold to 140 members of the football waiting list. The waiting list, created in 2009, currently has 1,710 members who are the first group contacted when season tickets become available.

MEETING OF NATIONAL CHAMPS:

The ODU Football Monarchs have had some experience with playoff teams this season. The Monarchs met three straight national champions the past few weeks. In week eight, ODU faced Villanova - winners of the 2009 FCS National Championship. Week nine it was James Madison - winners of the 2004 FCS National Championship. In week 10, it was Richmond, who won the title in 2008. Saturday's second round opponent - Georgia Southern - has won six national championships - 1985, 1986, 1989, 1990, 1999, 2000.

SO HONORED:

Quarterback Taylor Heinicke was recognized quite a bit following the Monarchs' week 10 42-28 victory over Richmond. After being among those added to the Jerry Rice Watch List, he lead the Monarchs by throwing for a season-high 373 yards and three touchdowns in the Monarchs' 42-28 victory over Spiders. Completing 34 of his 47 attempts and posting his second 300+ passing game of his six appearances thus far, he was not only named the Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week for the second straight week and third time overall, but was also named The Sports Network/Fathead.com National Freshman of the Week and the National Performance and Quarterback of the Week by the College Sports Performance Awards.

The true freshman signal caller was honored again by The Sports Network being named National Freshman of the Week for the second time this season following the 38-15 first round victory over Norfolk State. Heinicke completed 21-of-30 pass attempts for 269 yards and a school-record five touchdowns, connecting on touchdown throws of 3, 4, 24, 2 and 18 yards.

12TH MONARCH TIME:

The 12th Monarch, the nickname of the ODU faithful, certainly did their job of being "loud and proud" as the Norfolk State Spartans had 18 penalties call against them, the most of any ODU opponent in history, in last weekend's first round playoff match-up. The previous high was 11 at home against UMass on Oct. 1st in the Monarchs' first CAA win and first win over a ranked opponent, as well as on the road at Fordham and VMI in 2009.

SCORE....AND SCORE AGAIN:

It was the second time this season ODU had a pair of Monarchs with more than one touchdown reception in ODU's first round win over Norfolk State. It was Nick Mayers and Larry Pinkard with a pair of touchdown catches from quarterback Taylor Heinicke. The other game was a combo of Thomas DeMarco and Heinicke finding Mayers and Larry Pinkard twice against UMass, ODU's first CAA win and victory over a ranked squad.

TOUCHDOWN RECORD:

The five touchdowns thrown by true freshman quarterback Taylor Heinicke last weekend against Norfolk State were the most by a Monarch QB in a game. Heinicke's record of five surpasses the previous mark of four held by Thomas DeMarco in games with Cal Polly, Campbell, and Monmouth all last season.

THE TRIO OF TDs:

Angus Harpers' three touchdowns in the week 11 game against the Tribe is tied for the second best single-game performance. Thomas DeMarco holds the record with his four rushing scores against N.C. Central in 2009. DeMarco also had three touchdowns in games with Virginia Union, VMI, and Georgetown in 2009 as well.

WELCOME BACK E-LEW:

After missing three games with a high-ankle sprain (Villanova, James Madison, & Richmond), corner Eriq Lewis returned with some pretty impressive plays.

Lewis forced his third fumble of the season during the Tribes' first drive of the game with the William & Mary offense at the Monarchs' own 13. Lewis now has a team-leading three forced fumbles having also recorded forced fumbles in games with Hampton and Delaware.

His two late interceptions sealed the game for ODU as it was the first time in school history a Monarch defender has more than one interception in a game. Lewis is third on the list in career interceptions with Devon Simmons having made seven and Craig Wilkins six to-date.

After all the above, Lewis was honored by the conference office with CAA Defensive Player of the Week, the first Monarch to earn the distinction.

Lewis added another interception in ODU's 35-18 first round playoff victory over Norfolk State to bring his season total to five INTs, the most interceptions by a Monarchs in a season. Current safety Devon Simmons held the previous record with four interceptions in 2009.

TRICKERY:

Antonio Vaughan, who tied the game at 21-21 with his 27-yard pass to Reid Evans, is no stranger to throwing the football. The News-Herald Male Athlete of the Year at Hertford County High School completed 43 of 69 passes for 857 yards and 14 scores as signal caller before switching to wide receiver at Old Dominion.

CENTURY MARK:

Linebacker Craig Wilkins' eight tackles in the week 11 win over William & Mary helped him to become the first Monarch in the programs' history to accumulate 100 or more tackles in a season. Wilkins led the Monarchs with 74 tackles in 2010, while former Monarch Mychael McJunkins led the squad in 2009 with 85 stops. To date, Wilkins leads the Monarchs with 108 tackles (57 solo, 51 assisted) and has 247 tackles in his three year career.

ILL CATCH IT IF I CAN:

Redshirt junior wide receiver Reid Evans' 12 receptions in week 10 versus Richmond were the most in school history surpassing the nine catches by former Monarch Monty Smalley in last year's game against Georgia State as the ODU benchmark.

Reid Evans became the second Monarchs with over 100 yards receiving in a game this season with a career-high 149 against the Spiders. Evans' previous career-high was 111 yards on eight catches in last year's season finale at N.C. Central. Nick Mayers has ODU's only other 100+ yard receiving game this season with 166 against Towson.

E-Z PASS:

True freshman quarterback Taylor Heinicke's 373 passing yards against the Spiders in week ten were a season-high for the Monarchs and the third 300+ passing game for ODU this season. Thomas DeMarco, prior to his high ankle sprain injury, had 310 yards in the season opener at Campbell, while Heinicke had 360 yards against Towson in week seven.

LIKE TOTALLY:

The Monarchs' 587 yards of total offense against Richmond in week 10 was another ODU record. It resets the previous high of 518 captured against then-#20 UMass in the week five win over the Minutemen. ODU has had one other game of over 500 yards of total offense with 506 against Campbell in the season opener.

REPEATEDLY CATCHING:

Larry Pinkard had his third game with two touchdown receptions in the week ten 23-20 win over James Madison. Other games came against UMass and Rhode Island. Nick Mayers and Prentice Gill are the other Monarch with multiple receiving touchdowns in a game this season. Mayers had a pair against UMass in week five and last week against Norfolk State, while Gill had a pair of receiving TDs in the first round win over the Spartans.

THROUGH THE UPRIGHTS:

Jarod Brown connected on three of his four field goals, the most this season in the week nine over Top Ten James Madison. His career mark is 4-5 at N.C. Central in last year's season finale. He is now 14-of-21 on the season and 26-of-37 in his career in field goals. Brown was the only Monarch to score in the second half of week nine's Oyster Bowl. Trailing 20-14 at the intermission, Brown's three field goals led the Monarchs' to a 23-20 win and ODU's first over a Top 10 opponent.

DOUBLE DIGIT TACKLES:

Craig Wilkins led the Monarchs with 11 stops, while Ronnie Cameron added in 10 tackles, three of those for a loss of 12 yards in the week nine 23-20 win over James Madison. Wilkins now has a team-leading 93 tackles under his belt this season with his fourth double-digit tackling outing last week against Richmond making 10 stops. Entering Saturday's game, Wilkins is sixth in the CAA in the category. Cameron meanwhile upped his numbers to 57 tackles on the year and 15.0 tackles for loss. Entering Saturday's game with the Tribe, Cameron leads the conference and ranks 23rd nationally in tackles for loss and is fourth among CAA defender in sacks.

RUN, LORENZO, RUN:

True freshman running back Lorenzo Smith's 54-yard touchdown rush was the Monarchs' second longest rush from scrimmage in ODU's three-year history in the week eight win at Villanova. Three weeks ago against Towson, redshirt freshman Angus Harper had a 64-yard down field for the longest rush from scrimmage in the Monarchs' history.

SCORING BY THE HALF:

The 30 points scored by the Monarchs in the first half at Villanova during week eight were the most by the squad at the intermission this season as the Monarchs went on to a 37-14 victory. The previous high was 28 in the season opener against Campbell. The all-time record is 50 vs. Savannah State last season.

In the other direction, the Monarchs have help the opposition scoreless in second half of play in two of the last three games. James Madison in week nine and Villanova in week eight were both held to no points in the third and fourth quarters of play.

SPREADING THE WEALTH ON THE D:

In week eight against the Wildcats, defensively, 25 Monarchs got into the mix led by corner Aaron Evans and linebacker John Darr with four stops each. The ODU defense racked up five sacks and eight tackles for loss.

LONGEST PLAY FROM SCRIMMAGE:

Angus Harpers' 64-yard touchdown run in week seven against Towson was the longest play from scrimmage in ODU's history. But that record stood just briefly when Nick Mayers had a 93-yard reception from Taylor Heinicke late in third quarter.

The previous longest run from scrimmage was a 53-yard run by Colby Goodwyn at Georgia State this season, while the longest pass completion was 62-yards by Thomas DeMarco to Prentice Gill against Cal Poly on Oct 9, 2011. The play was also the longest by a Towson opponent this season.

SACK IT TO ME:

The six sacks, led by 2.5 by defensive lineman Ronnie Cameron, recorded by the Monarch defense in week seven against Towson were the most this season. Previous high was five against Campbell and then #20 UMass.

Cameron, the CAA Defensive Player of the Year, is averaging .65 quarterback takedowns a game is sixth in the CAA in the category.

PASSING MARK:

Taylor Heinicke's 373 passing yards against Richmond in week ten and 360 passing yards in week seven versus Towson were the second and thir most in ODU history just below Thomas DeMarco's 407 yards at Monmouth on September 25 2010.

Last time the Monarchs threw for over 300 yards in a game prior to Heinicke's performances was when current redshirt senior Thomas DeMarco, who is working his way back from a high ankle sprain, passed for 310 yards in a week one victory over Campbell.

Over the course of the Monarchs' 32 games played thus far, Old Dominion has passed for over 300 yards six times.

RECEIVING MARK:

Redshirt junior wide reciever Nick Mayer's 166 receiving yards versus the Tigers in week seven was another school record. The previous high was 154 yards by senior receiver Prentice Gill at Monmouth on Sept. 25 of last season.

It was Mayers' second 100+ yard receiving game. He was the first Monarchs to catch for 100 yards having done so in the Monarchs' loss at Fordham in 2009.

Through ODU's 32 total games played, a Monarchs has registered 100 or more yards of receiving six times.

WOW...WHAT A PLAY:

Midway through the thid quarter in week seven's game against Towson, the Monarchs took a 35-24 lead on one of the wildest plays in ODU history. Safety Carvin Powell intercepted a Tiger pass in the endzone setting up the Monarch drive to start at their own four-yard line. Then rookie Taylor Heinicke threw a 93-yard pass to Nick Mayers who tore down field but had the ball stripped at the Towson 3. As the ball rolled its way into the endzone, senior Prentice Gill jumped on top of it to score the touchdown for the Monarchs.

MORE SCHOOL RECORDS:

Taylor Heinicke's 56-yard pass to Reid Evans midway through the fourth quarter in week five's win over then #20 UMass was the longest in touchdown school history and the fourth 50+ passing touchdown in the Monarchs' young three year history.

MORE NEWBIES:

Making first appearance for the Monarchs were true freshman running back Tyree Lee and quarterback Taylor Heinicke in the Monarchs' week five victory over then-#20 UMass. Heinicke started the entire second half of the game throwing for 119 yards and two touchdowns en-route to CAA Rookie of the Week honores. Lee finished the game with 11 carries for the 38 yards. ODU has had 10 true freshmen taking the field this season, which also includes offensive lineman Josh Mann, running back Lorenzo Smith, wide receiver Blair Roberts, long snapper Rick Lovato, as well as Jakwail Bailey, Mitch Castlebery, James Faircloth, and Neal Anthony Hale on special teams.

WIN STREAK SNAPPED:

With the 27-17 loss to Delaware in the Monarchs' CAA debut in week four, Old Dominion saw it's FCS leading eight-game win streak come to an end. The Monarchs had not lost a game prior to the Blue Hen loss since a 50-37 setback to Cal Poly on October 9, 2010.

FUMBLE TO POINTS:

Chris Lovitt's fumble recovery in week four's contest with Delaware and Prentice Gill's fumble recovery in the endzone vs. Towson are a pair of fumble recoveries that have led to a touchdowns. Former Monarch Marquis Johnson has the only other fumble recovery that has led to a score in the Monarchs' history in ODU's loss at Fordham in 2009 recovering the ball in the end zone following a punt by the Rams.

FUMBLE, FUMBLIA, FUMBLEROOKSI:

Old Dominion had four forced fumbles and a pair of fumble recoveries in week three's win over Hampton. The four forced fumbles, which included a pair by senior defensive end Edmon McClam, were the most by the Monarchs in their three-year history.

ITS GOOD:

Jarod Brown had a 51-yard field goal in the opening ODU drive at Georgia State in week two as well as a 45-yarder. His 51-yard field goal capping off the Monarchs' ODU opening drive was the longest in school history. He surpasses his previous high of 48 at N.C. Central in last year's season finale.

OPENING WITH A BANG:

And no, we're not talking about the howitzer you hear being shot off before the Monarchs run onto Foreman Field. Old Dominion scored on its opening drive three times this season and 16 times in the 31 game history of the program. Larry Pinkard had a 17-yard touchdown reception against James Madison in week nine, Jarod Brown opening scoring in week five against UMass game with a 43-yard field goal and also drilled a school record 51-yard field goal to open up scoring in week two's 40-17 win at Georgia State.

I-N-T:

The Monarchs had three interceptions in its win over Georgia State in week two - Devon Simmons, Eriq Lewis, and Carvin Powell. The three int's were second most in school history. The school record is four against Presbyterian on Oct. 10, 2009.

COMING BACK AT YOU:

Devon Simmons captured a 32-yard interception return in the second quarter in week two's contest at Georgia State. It was Simmons' fifth interception, having had four in the inaugural season in 2009. It ties for the fourth longest interception return. Simmons's longest was a 37-yard interception return against Hampton, last season.

IMPRESSIVE DEBUT:

Wide receiver Antonio Vaughan finished his Monarch debut with 191 all-purpose yards (30 rush, 97 rec., 48 kick return, 16 punt return), the third highest total in the Monarchs' young history. Only Thomas DeMarco (224 yds. vs. N.C. Central - 2009) and Colby Goodwyn (356 yds. vs. Cal Poly - 2010) have had more. Vaughan gave ODU the 28-7 edge with 4:36 remaining in the second quarter, with his first career touchdown. He had his second touchdown on the play following a fumble forced by Keenan Terry and recovery by John Darr in the third quarter.

WELCOME NEWBIES

While the coaching staff has been excited about a veteran team taking the field for the 2011 inaugural CAA season, you can't forget about the newcomers who have made an impact since Week One. Nineteen Monarchs took their first snaps in the 41-14 win over Campbell in Week One and among them were a trio of starters in redshirt freshmen wide receiver Antonio Vaughan, running back Angus Harper and safety Eriq Lewis.

Vaughan received CAA Rookie of the Week honors after collecting 191 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns and making six catches for 97 yards and two touchdowns. Harper ran the ball 10 times for 28 yards and a touchdown. Lewis made four tackles and had a pass break-up. Also getting into the mix were true freshman Josh Mann, a local product from nearby Virginia Beach and Ocean Lakes High School, who played at right guard and Lorenzo Smith, who lead the rushing corps with 14 carries for 65 yards. Smith had only been a member of the running back crew for the last two weeks of preseason after moving from cornerback during preseason camp due to the injury to Mario Crawford.

Through the end of the regular season, 22 true or redshirt freshmen have taken snaps for the Monarchs.

GOOD WORK RONNIE CAMERON:

Old Dominion defensive tackle Ronnie Cameron was among the record 132 nominees announced for the 2011 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. The award recognizes the selfless contributions to volunteerism and community service made by college football student-athletes across the nation.

This year marks the program's 20th year honoring college football players at all levels of competition who stand out for their "good works" in the community. Since 1992, selection to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has become the gold standard for off-the-field character and leadership for college football players. The honor is widely considered the sport's pre-eminent community service award.

Away from the field, Cameron is active in the numerous Monarch Reachout programs including the annual National Marrow Donor Registry and the annual "Little Feet Meet" with ODU Special Olympics and has also participated in activities with the Make-A-Wish Foundation of Greater Virginia and the summer clinic with the Boys & Girls Club of Southeast Virginia. Cameron has also served as a volunteer at the United Methodist Church, homeless shelters and at the Westbury Recreation Center and volunteered at Leesville Middle School and Larchmont Recreation Center.

A Dean's List student, Cameron finished his undergraduate degree in three years and is currently working towards his MBA. In addition to being a captain of the ODU Football Monarchs, he is also a member of the ODU MBA Association and is a recipient of the Luke Hillier Endowment for academic and athletic success. Cameron also helped led, organize, and was a keynote speaker at the third annual Black Male Summit.

JOB WELL DONE:

Old Dominion football Coach Bobby Wilder has announced four promotions on his coaching staff this preseason. Dealton Cotton has been elevated to Assistant Head Coach, Keita Malloy has added the title Pass Game Coordinator, Ron Whitcomb will serve as the Monarchs' Recruiting Coordinator, and Jarod Dodson will add Assistant Defensive Coordinator to his duties.

FIRST MONARCH NFL SIGNEE:

Former Old Dominion defensive end Deron Mayo signed a free agent contract with the National Football League's Denver Broncos becoming the first Monarch to do so.

Mayo's impact at Old Dominion was immediate from the time he set foot on campus. Choosing to play his final season of collegiate football at ODU after Hofstra University disbanded its program, Mayo was named a "Transfer to Watch" by the Sports Network and in a vote by his teammates, was named a Co-Captain, showing their respect for the defensive end with Mayo not even having played a game in the Monarch uniform.

In 2010, Mayo was third on the ODU defense making 70 tackles and made five or more stops in 10 of the Monarchs' 11 games. He led the Monarchs in sacks, was second on the team in tackles for loss, forced a team-leading three fumbles, recorded a team second-best seven QB hurries, and tied for third among teammates with three pass break-ups. As a member of the special teams unit, Mayo blocked two kicks, including a punt at Hampton resulting in a Monarch score.

Mayo was released by the Broncos on Aug. 29.

TO THE MAX:

When the Monarchs reported to preseason camp on Aug. 7th, the roster was at the NCAA maximum for the first time in the ODU program's history as 95 Football Monarchs reported.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING:

The Monarchs made history on September 5th when a three-year dream became a reality. On May 31, 2006, the ODU board of visitors voted to add football and 1,293 days later, the Monarchs kicked off their first season of Division I FCS play. ODU played an 11-game schedule, including seven home dates at the \$24.8 million renovated Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. The schedule was a mix of both D-II and D-I FCS opponents to help the Monarchs transition into not only its first year of football, but also to get ready for entering the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in 2011, the toughest FCS conference in the nation.

SEASON OPENING VICTORY: Football Monarchs Dominate Campbell, 41-14

NORFOLK, Va. -- Antonio Vaughan had 191 all-purpose yards and scored two touchdowns as Old Dominion dominated Campbell 41-14 Saturday night at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Vaughan, in his Monarch debut, ran for 30 yards, picked up 97 yards receiving, and racked up 48 yards on kick returns. He caught a 43-yard pass from Thomas DeMarco on the first play of the game, and only improved from there as he scored on a 34-yard pass reception with four minutes remaining in the second quarter and later scoring on a 30-yard run to increase the Monarchs' lead to 38-7 with 10 minutes left in the third quarter.

Campbell scored first on a 15-yard pass from Braden Smith to Preston Dodson, capping an opening drive that saw the Camels cover nearly 60 yards. However, ODU came right back with a seven yard TD pass from DeMarco to Kai Blanco while defensively, ODU would only allow Campbell to gain three yards on their next drive and be pushed back for negative yardage on the following drive.

Angus Harper gave ODU its first lead with an 11-yard score while Demarco added a seven yard scamper before Vaughan's first score of the night.

Vaughan's first score of the night increased ODU's lead to 28-7 which it would take into halftime.

ODU came out of halftime and tacked onto the lead with a 32-yard field goal by Jarod Brown.

On the kickoff return following Brown's field goal, Keenen Terry forced the Camels' Brandon Chandler to fumble the ball with John Darr on the recovery setting up the Monarchs at the Campbell 30. On the next play DeMarco handed off the ball to Vaughan who tore 30-yards downfield for his second touchdown of the night.

Jordan Cramer caught a three-yard from Smith to get Campbell on the board in the second half, but it would be the only other time the Camels would score.

Brown added his second field goal of the night, with a 45-yarder to complete the scoring late in the third quarter.

DeMarco finished the night 29-of-38, for 310 yards with two touchdowns through the air, and one on the ground.

Lorenzo Smith led ODU with 14 carries for 65 yards on the ground while Harper had seven catches for 58 yards.

Ronnie Cameron led the defense with nine tackles and half a sack, with Devon Simmons making seven stops for the Monarch defense, and Chad King collecting six tackles, including 1.5 tackles for resulting in the Camels losing 11 yards.

Smith completed 20-of-40 passes for the Camels, for 172 yards and two scores.

Football Monarchs Pounce Panthers, 40-17

ATLANTA, Ga. - The Old Dominion Monarchs won their seventh straight game with a 40-17 victory over future Colonial Athletic Association rival Georgia State at the Georgia Dome Saturday.

The win, ODU's seventh straight, improves the squad to 2-0 on the year.

Jarod Brown drilled a pair of field goals in the opening quarter giving Old Dominion a quick 6-0 edge. Brown's first field goal, a 51-yarder on the Monarchs' opening drive, was the longest of his career, surpassing his previous high of 48 in last year's season finale at N.C. Central.

Turnovers would result in Georgia State getting onto the scoreboard.

The Panthers' score came following ODU fumbling after a punt. While Georgia State recovered the ball at the ODU 15, the Monarch defense would not allow the Panthers to go on further than the nine-yard line forcing the Panthers to kick a field goal. Christian Benvenuto's attempt was good from 26-yards cutting the Monarch advantage with 6-3 with 6:07 remaining on the clock in the first quarter.

ODU quickly responded though. In just over two minutes, Colby Goodwyn punctuated a six-play, 32-yard drive to give the Monarchs' a 13-3 advantage heading into quarter number two.

Devon Simmons quickly returned possession back to the Monarchs following Goodwyn's touchdown. Simmons had a 32-yard interception return, but as the Monarchs' worked their way into the red zone, ODU fumbled the ball at their own one-yard line with the fumble return setting up the Panthers up at the Monarchs' own seven-yard line. Donald Russell finished off the drive to give GSU its first touchdown, cutting the ODU lead to 13-10 in the closing moments of the opening quarter.

Old Dominion's "All-Star" team lit up the scoreboard to start the second quarter. Paul Morant blocked the punt and freshman Blair Roberts recovered and ran into the end zone to put ODU ahead 20-10. It was ODU's 13th block in history.

Each team would add another touchdown before concluding the opening half of action. Georgia State cut the deficit to three, 20-17, with six minutes remaining in the second quarter on a run by Travis Evans. Then with just over two minutes, ODU wide receiver Reid Evans lifted ODU to a 27-17 lead heading into the half.

Old Dominion captured the lone points of the third quarter. Quarterback Thomas DeMarco registered the 27th touchdown of his career to cap an 87-yard drive by the Monarchs to give ODU a 33-17 edge with just under five minutes remaining in the quarter.

The Panthers threatened to score in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter. At the ODU 12 on second and nine, the Monarchs' managed to flip the field as Eriq Lewis captured his first career interception.

On the ensuing drive, Colby Goodwyn raced downfield for 50 yards, setting up DeMarco to punch in the ball from two yards out and add to the ODU margin. With just over 10 minutes remaining in the game, ODU led 40-17.

Before the game was over, Carvin Powell would add another interception to keep the Panthers scoreless in the second half.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by Craig Wilkins with nine tackles (6 solo, 3 assisted) and John Darr with seven tackles (3 solo, 4 assisted). Ronnie Cameron also added a pair of sacks totaling 16 yards lost for the Panthers.

DeMarco finished the game completing 13 of his 21 attempts for 126 yards.

Goodwyn ended the game with 26 carries for 190 yards, the second most rushing yardage by a Monarch in the school's young history.

Football Monarchs Hang On for 45-42 Win Over Hampton

NORFOLK, Va. -- Larry Pinkard returned a blocked punt five yards and Thomas DeMarco ran for two touchdowns in the last seven minutes as Old Dominion hung on to defeat Hampton 45-42 night in Norfolk.

With Penn falling to Lafayette, 37-12, Old Dominion now brings the nation's longest win streak among FCS schools to its first Colonial Athletic Association contest at Delaware next week. The Monarchs have won eight straight games dating back to its 50-37 set back to nationally ranked Cal Poly back on November 9th of last season. They also improved to 12-4 all-time and 2-0 this season at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium and take a 20-5 record into their first conference contest.

The Hampton Pirates meanwhile dropped to 2-1 on the season.

ODU held a 17-14 halftime lead and quickly stretched the lead to 10 on a five-yard Angus Harper touchdown, but Hampton came right back, catapulted by a Justin Blake interception, with 13-straight points, two field goals by Taurean Durham and a 42-yard fumble return by Jeremy Jermin to take a 27-24 lead.

The Monarchs retook the lead as James Faircloth blocked a Jordan Stovall punt and Larry Pinkard returned it five yards for the 31-27 lead. It was the Monarchs' 15th blocked punt and the third time in the two meetings with the Pirates that ODU has blocked a punt.

The Pirates' Jorrian Washington gave Hampton the lead back briefly with a nine yard run, but DeMarco led ODU on two scoring drives, one a 14 play, 67-yard drive and the other a 10-yard drive after Edmon McClam sacked Hampton quarterback David LeGree and forced a fumble.

Hampton scored with just over a minute left, but the ensuing onsidess kick went out of bounds.

DeMarco finished the night 20-of-29 passing, with 172 yards, while rushing for 29 yards with two scores. Angus Harper and Colby Goodwyn comined to run for 199 yards, with Harper leading the way with 111 and two scores.

LeGree finished 25-of-35 passing for the Pirates for 260 yards with a touchdown. He also rushed for 66 yards and a score.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by redshirt junior linebacker Craig Wilkins with 17 stops, while Chad King recorded eight tackles, and Eriq Lewis had seven. McClam also finished the night with a pair of sacks.

As Delaware made its way downfield on their next drive, the Blue Hens attempted a 48-yard field goal, but the Monarchs' "All-Star Team" added another notch to its blocked kicks tally stopping Sean Baner's kick from going through the uprights and persevering ODU's 7-0 lead.

The momentum was shorted lived however as on the first play of ODU's ensuing drive, Thomas DeMarco's pass was intercepted. Delaware would find the uprights this time and score on a 40-yard field goal as Old Dominion led 7-3 at the end of the first quarter.

Delaware closed their deficit to one with Baner's second field goal of the afternoon, a 39-yard attempt with 9:13 left in the second quarter. Then as the second quarter was coming to close Nihja White capped of a 11-play, 64-yard-drive to put Delaware ahead 13-7 into the half.

The Blue Hens had a chance to add to the lead in the early minutes of the third quarter, however Baner's 25-yard attempt went wide right.

The Monarchs' followed by connecting on a field goal as Jarod Brown's attempt from 20-yards out was good and improved his mark to 6-of-6 for the year in field goals.

Baner had another crack at the uprights, as Delaware capitalizing a an ODU fumble at their own 20 in the closing seconds of the third quarter. With the drive continuing into the fourth quarter, Baner this time connected on a 20-yard attempt extending Delaware's lead to 16-10 entering the final quarter of play.

On the next drive, Old Dominion wasn't able to find its way past its own 23 and brought the punt team to the field. Plisco, who averaged 48.6 yards per punt in the game, ran the ball instead and continued the ODU drive. Back-to-back passes to Reid Evans , one 12-yards and another 28-yards, helped flip the field setting up freshman Antonio Vaughan for nine-yard reception, his second of the season.

Delaware punched right back though with a 60-kickoff return and followed with a Rob Jones 32-yard reception in the end zone. The Blue Hens made the two-point conversion and went ahead 24-17 with less than 10 minutes left in the game.

Old Dominion was four and out on its next drive and despite being able to move the chains twice on their next drive, the Monarchs were unable to get into Blue Hen territory.

Baner added a 43-yard field goal for Delaware in the closing minute for the final 27-17 margin.

WILD RIDE: ODU Scores 23-Straight to Pull Away, Tops No. 20 UMass 48-33

NORFOLK, Va. -- Old Dominion University football scored the first 25 points and after UMass took a 26-25 lead, scored 23-straight to take command and beat No. 20 UMass 48-33 Saturday night at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Old Dominion established a quick 3-0 lead off a 43-yard field goal by Jarod Brown on its first drive of the night and would go on to rattle off 25 unanswered points and keep the Minutemen scoreless until the final two minutes of the second quarter.

Nick Mayers, who did not have a touchdown last season for the Monarchs, captured two during the Monarchs' 25-0 run, which included a 17-yard and 35-yard pass from Thomas DeMarco. Also getting into the scoring was Larry Pinkard posting his first career touchdown.

Massachusetts scored late in the second quarter for the 25-12 halftime margin.

Kellen Page connected with tight end Emil Igwegau to cap a 14-play, 80-yard drive for the Minutemen. Although UMass missed the extra point, on ODU's next drive, Demarco threw an interception to return possession to the Minutemen. Five plays later, UMass's Julian Talley was in the end-zone.

The Monarchs would have to look to a new signal caller in the second half when DeMarco was sidelined with a leg injury. True freshman Taylor Heinicke was inserted into the offense and the Georgia Old Spice Player of the Year would shine in his debut. Heinicke would finish the game connecting on eight of his 11 attempts for 119 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

The second half of action between the Monarchs and Minutemen proved to be a battle. The Minutemen racked up 149 yards of total offense in the third quarter alone including a pair of touchdowns to take the lead. Julien Julmiste had a 20-yard touchdown reception and Jonathan Hernandez added an eight-yard carry over the endline to give UMass a 26-25 edge with 5:30 in the third quarter.

However after UMass's 26 unanswered points, the Monarchs punched back with by blocking a punt and registering a safety and three touchdowns to regain the lead and the victory.

The Monarchs finally stopped the Minutemen scoring barrage blocking their fourth punt of the season. Jakwail Bailey was the member of the "All-Star Team" making the block in the endzone and capturing the safety to return the lead to Old Dominion, 27-26, and return momentum back to the Monarchs' side.

The fourth quarter then started with Heinicke connecting with Pinkard for an 38-yard touchdown reception. It was Pinkard's second touchdown of the night.

Then at the midway point, Reid Evans posted a 56-yard touchdown catch, the longest in school history to put ODU up 41-26. True freshman Tyree Lee also got into the mix with his first career touchdown with three minutes remaining in the game on a 13-yard run.

The Minutemen scored in the game's final minute, but the contest was already out of reach.

FIRST CAA ROAD WIN: No. 21 ODU Defeats Rhode Island, 31-23

KINGSTON, R.I. -- The No. 21 Old Dominion Football Monarchs picked up their first win as a ranked squad and their first Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) road win in a 31-23 win over Rhode Island on Saturday at Meade Stadium.

Monarchs wasted no time in establishing a lead. After four and out on their opening drive, it was only four plays before the Monarchs regained possession. Craig Wilkins' first interception of the year put the Monarchs in Ram territory and six plays later true freshman quarterback Taylor Heinicke scored his first career touchdown run to put ODU up 7-0 at the 10 minute mark of the opening quarter.

However, Rhode Island tied the game up a little under seven minutes later using a 15-play, 76-yard drive with Ram quarterback Steve Probst connecting with wide receiver Trevor Turner in the end zone to tie the game at 7-7.

Scoring continued for the Rams early in the second half with Probst finding Frazier for an 11-yard touchdown reception and Rhode Island taking a 14-7 lead within the second quarter's first two minutes.

Before the half, the Monarchs were able to tie the game at 14-14. After possession was traded seven times, it became the two-minute drill for the Monarchs. ODU made its way down field 68-yards capped by a seven-yard Larry Pinkard touchdown catch to tie the score heading into the locker room.

The Rams took the lead over to start off the third quarter. After a failed on-sides kick attempt by the Monarchs, the Rams started their first drive after the half at the ODU 38. Moments later, Anthony Baskerville ran the ball four yards over the end line. The Rams' PAT attempt was no good and ODU trailed 20-14.

On ODU's next possession, the Monarchs took back the lead. Pinkard made his second touchdown reception of the game giving the Monarchs a 21-20 edge with 9:57 left in the third quarter.

But just like that, a 38-yard field goal gave the Rams a 23-21 advantage with 6:46 left in the third quarter.

The Monarchs punched back though on their next possession. Nick Mayers, on a nine-yard pass from Heinicke, capped the 11-play, 62-yard drive to give ODU a 28-23 lead.

In the only scoring in the fourth quarter, Jarod Brown sailed a 22-yard field goal through the uprights for the final 31-23 margin.

Heinicke, making his first career start, passed for 205 yards and three touchdowns along with running the ball eight times, including a score. Angus Harper led the ground attack with 45 yards on 15 carries, while Mayers had eight catches for 66 yards and Reid Evans finished the afternoon with 60 yards on six receptions.

The Rams' Steve Probst passed for 143 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by safety Carvin Powell and line-backer J.J. Williams, each with eight stops. All eight of Powell's tackles were solo stops. Linebacker Craig Wilkins added seven tackles, including 3.5 for loss as well as his interception.

No. 18/22 Football Drops Heartbreaker to No. 17/23 Towson, 39-35

NORFOLK, Va. -- Grant Enders hit Tom Ryan on fourth and 29 for a 63-yard touchdown pass to lift Towson over Old Dominion 39-35 in CAA action Saturday evening in Norfolk.

ODU sacked Enders and backup quarterback Peter Athens on consecutive plays to push the Tigers into third and long, but Enders came back in for fourth down and hit Ryan over the middle, who broke a tackle and just broke the goalline for the touchdown.

The Monarchs hoping to make last second comeback saw Taylor Heinicke's pass intercepted by Frank Beltre to clinch the game for the Tigers.

ODU took a 35-24 lead at the end of the third quarter. Starting first and 10 at their own four, Heinicke hit Nick Mayers down the left sideline, Mayers ran all the way to the Towson three, where he fumbled and Prentice Gill recovered in the end zone. The 93-yard play is the longest play in school history.

With time running down in the fourth quarter, the Tigers closed the gap when Enders capped a nine play, 75-yard drive with an eight yard run. Leon Kinnard converted a halfback option pass to Mike Evans for the two-point conversion to make the score 35-32 setting up the winning score for Towson.

Terrance West started the scoring in the first quarter for Towson with a 47-yard run.

ODU came right back as Tyree Lee capped a 10-play, 60-yard drive with a three-yard run to knot the score.

West came right back for Towson with a 54-yard score but ODU fought back again with a 64-yarder from Angus Harper to open the second quarter.

ODU gained its first lead of the night when Mayers hauled in a 36-yard TD pass from Heinicke.

D.J. Soven kicked a career-best 47-yard field goal with less than two minutes remaining in the first half to make the halftime score 21-17 in favor of the Monarchs.

In a game of back and forth, Towson got the opening kickoff of the second half and marched 64 yards in eight plays as Enders hit Tyler Wharton for a 26-yard score to regain the lead for the Tigers, but ODU punched right back as the Monarchs drove down the field and a 75-yard scoring drive was finished with a 14-yard pass from Heinicke to Gill for a 28-24 Monarch lead.

With Towson driving near the end of the third quarter, Carvin Powell intercepted Enders at the goalline and advanced the ball to the four to set up Gill's fumble recovery touchdown.

Heinicke finished the day with 360-yards passing on 22-of-37 with three scores and an interception, while Enders was 24-of-37 for 314 yards, throwing two TD's and a pick.

Harper rushed for 68 yards on just six carries for ODU and a touchdown while Terrance West carried 16 times for 151 and two touchdowns for Towson. Mayers finished the day with seven catches for a career-high 166 yards and a touchdown.

Kenton Powell had a team best eight tackles for Towson while Craig Wilkins had a game-high 13 tackles and a sack and Ronnie Cameron had 11 tackles and 2.5 sacks for ODU.

No. 21/22 ODU Football Returns to the Win Column Football Monarchs Down Villanova 37-14

VILLANOVA, Pa. -- The #21/22 Old Dominion Football Monarchs returned to its winning ways with its 37-14 win over the Villanova Wildcats Saturday in CAA Football action.

The win improved the Monarchs to 6-2 overall and 3-2 in the CAA football race. The Monarchs' victory drops Villanova to 1-7 overall and still looking for their first conference win at they drop to 0-5 in conference play.

On the opening Wildcat drive, B.J. McLaughlin forced the Wildcat fumble with Devon Simmons on the recovery to return possession back to the Monarchs. The on the next play, the Monarchs lit up the scoreboard as Antonio Vaughan raced the 42-yards downfield for the score. ODU tried for the two-point conversion, but Kai Blanco's run was just short of the goal line.

On the next possession, following the Wildcat punt into the end zone and the Monarchs starting at their own 20, Lorenzo Smith capped a seven-play, 80 yard drive by taking off for 54-yards for his first career score.

Joe Price got the Wildcats onto the scoreboard with a six-yard touchdown reception late in the opening quarter to cut the ODU lead to 13-7.

Two quick scores gave ODU a 23-7 edge midway through the second quarter. Jarod Brown connected on a 32-yard field goal and on Villanova's first play from scrimmage following the field goal, Devon Simmons stripped the ball while sacking signal caller Dustin Thomas. Linebacker Craig Wilkins recovered the ball for the Monarchs at the Wildcat three and three plays later Taylor Heinicke carried in the ball for a one-yard touchdown.

The Wildcats added their second touchdown of the afternoon using over five minutes to take the ball down field on an 11-play, 77-yard drive. Austin Medley broke through for a 23-yard touchdown.

The Monarchs however went up by another touchdown and had a 16-point advantage heading into the half. In the closing moments of the second quarter, Heinicke connected with Nick Mayers for 16-yard touchdown and a 30-14 edge heading into the locker rooms.

On the first ODU drive of the third quarter, the Monarchs used a fake punt by Jonathan Plisco to help move the chains into Wildcat territory but they were unable to move past the Villanova 45. Heinicke punted the ball 34-yards, but on the next play, Villanova quarterback Dustin Thomas got the ball into the hands of ODU's Craig Wilkins at the Wildcat 16. It was fourth and goal at the one before Angus Harper broke through to give ODU the 37-14 lead with 6:56 left in the third.

Heinicke finished the game passing for 204 yards and two touchdowns completing 23 of his 32 passes. For the receiving corps, Mayers had six catches for 51 yards, while Vaughan hauled in five catches for 75 yards. Smith led the run game with 76 yards on nine carries.

Defensively, 25 Monarchs got into the mix led by Aaron Evans and John Darr with four stops each. The ODU defense racked up five sacks and eight tackles for loss.

Dustin Thomas passed for 82 yards, connecting on 10 of his 17 passes for the Wildcats before Chris Polony came in late in the game passing for 61 yards. Polony also rushed for 52 yards.

OYSTER BOWL VICTORY: Monarchs Down #9/10 JMU, 23-20

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion football program garnered its first Top 10 victory with a 23-20 Oyster Bowl win over the #9/10 James Madison Dukes.

Old Dominion quarterback Taylor Heinicke was named the Oyster Bowl's "Most Outstanding Player" earning the Melvin Blassingham Trophy, named after the Shriner Potentate who created the Oyster Bowl back in 1946. Heinicke finished the game with 236 yards completing 22 of his 35 passes with a pair of touchdowns. The Atlanta, Georgia native was also the Monarchs' leading rusher with 11 carries for 50 yards.

Old Dominion wasted no time scoring on its opening drive for the third time this season as Pinkard collected a 17-yard pass from Heinicke on the first of his two touchdowns of the afternoon.

James Madison drove to as close as the ODU 10 on their first drive, but the Monarchs defense would not break. A mix of the Monarch defenders get into the mix holding the Dukes from posting a touchdown including J.J. Williams, Keenan Terry, Craig Wilkins, Dominique Guinn Bailey, and Fred Credle, resulting in the Dukes having to go to the field goal unit and kick a 32-yard attempt by Cameron Starke.

The Dukes then closed the quarter with a Dae'Quan Scott touchdown to go ahead 10-7.

Pinkard put the Monarchs ahead again on his second touchdown reception of the game. The Duke defense forced Heinicke to scramble deep into the backfield, looking to get rid of the ball and prevent ODU from a massive amount of loss of yardage, Heinicke spotted Pinkard in the end zone. The ball sailed through the air where Pinkard jumped right at the back line amid two JMU defenders to complete the 23-touchdown pass and give ODU a 14-10 advantage with 12:57.

Scott punched in the ball on the following drive for his second score of the day, giving JMU a 17-14 lead, one which they would hold until second half action.

Right before the half, James Madison got themselves deep into ODU territory. At third and one at the Monarch two, Markell Wilkins and Ronnie Cameron came up big pushing back Scott for a loss of four yards and forcing out the Duke field goal unit again. A 23-yard field attempt by Starke gave increased the JMU lead to 20-14.

With time left, the Monarchs had one last shot at cutting into the James Madison lead before the intermission. As time expired, Jarod Brown's 42-yard field goal was blocked by JMU's Teveion Cuffee.

Old Dominion reclaimed the lead thanks to a trio of field goals by Brown and holding the JMU offense scoreless in second half play.

Six minutes into the third quarter, Brown's 19-yard field goal sailed through the uprights cutting the Monarch deficit 20-17 with 9:45 and then with just over two minutes remaining in the quarter, Brown had a 40-yard attempt that tied the game at 20-20. Then with 12:14 left in the game, the Monarch kicker connected on his third straight field goal, this time from 25-yards out, to give Old Dominion a 23-20 edge.

Twice, the Dukes attempted field goals to tie the game but were unsuccessful. With 8:55 remaining, James Madison looked to tie the game on a 51-yard field goal attempt by Starke. The attempt, which was Starke's longest of the season, was short. Then on the last play of the game, Starke's 47-yarder was blocked by Craig Wilkins to seal the victory.

Jace Edwards passed for 239 yards for James Madison, with Brian Barlow making eight catches for 79 yards in the loss. Scott led the Dukes' run game with 77 yards and his two touchdowns. James Madison, who came into Saturday's as the CAA's leading rushing offense at 242.7 yards per game and 5.0 yards per play, was held to 103 yards and 2.7 yards per carry.

Senior Day Victory: No. 12 ODU Downs Richmond, 42-28

NORFOLK, Va. -- The No. 12 Old Dominion Football Monarchs improved to 8-2 overall and 5-2 in the Colonial Athletic Association with Saturday's 42-28 win over Richmond Saturday at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium in the Monarchs' regular season home finale.

For the second straight contest ODU struck on a Taylor Heinicke-Larry Pinkard combo to open up scoring. Heinicke, the reigning CAA Rookie of the Week Taylor, targeted Pinkard with a 14-yard touchdown throw and Thomas DeMarco then helped to put the Monarchs up 8-0 by diving into the end zone for the two-point conversion.

On their next drive, ODU took a 11-0 lead as Jarod Brown hit a 37-yard field goal.

The Spiders got onto the scoreboard before the quarter ended though needing just three plays. Aaron Corp found Kevin Finney for a 17-yard score with 1:01 left and Sam Roller made the two-point conversion on a pass from John Laub as the Monarchs led 11-8 at the end of one quarter of play.

Second quarter action saw scoring go back and forth between the two squads.

The Monarchs continued its drive to open the second quarter and moved downfield 83-yards over the course of nine to extend its lead. ODU leading rusher Angus Harper tallied his sixth touchdown of the year for the 18-8 Monarch lead.

Richmond responded with its next possession though and cut the ODU lead to three with 8:50 remaining until the half. The Spiders got out of trouble at third and 10 on the ODU 48 with a 25-yard reception by Tre Grey. Capping the drive was Ben Edwards on a five-yard touchdown reception for the 18-15 score.

Old Dominion punched right back on its next opportunity. Prentice Gill, who was one of the eight seniors honored prior to the game, gave his ODU squad a 25-15 edge on a 29-yard pass from Heinicke.

The Spiders had another attempt to cut their deficit before the intermission. Corp was sacked by Devon Simmons in the closing moments and after fumbling the ball, the Spiders were faced with second and 21 with time running out. The Spiders' Wil Kamin attempted a 41-yard field goal, but it went wide right for the Monarchs to hold on to a 25-15 halftime lead.

ODU took a 28-15 advantage midway through the third quarter. A 30-yard catch by Reid Evans, who tried to his best to keep his momentum from going out of bounds, got the Monarchs into the red zone and then saw Brown sail a 23-yard field goal thru the uprights for his second field goal of the afternoon.

On the ensuing possession, the Spiders were unable to move the ball past their own 45. On the punt, Jakwail Bailey blocked his second punt of the season and the fifth punt block by the Monarchs in 2011. Starting at the Spider 46, the Monarchs got to within striking distance thanks to a 19-yard run by Antonio Vaughan and a 12-yard catch by Evans. Heinicke just missed finding Pinkard for the second time in the end zone. On the next play, the Monarchs fumble and Doug Howell recovered the ball to run it back 96-yard for a Spider touchdown. With 5:14 left in the third, the Monarchs still led 28-22.

On their next time down the field, Brown's field goal attempt wide left for ODU, while the Spiders Stephen Barnette one handed a catch in the end zone to tie the game at 28-28. The extra point after Barnette's touchdown would have given Richmond its first lead of the game, but the ball hit the right upright and the two teams were tied at 28 all in the final quarter of action.

The Monarchs regained the lead immediately and even added on. Eleven plays after the Spiders tied the score, ODU took a 25-28 lead capped by an Antonio Vaughan touchdown reception. On the next Richmond drive, a Paul Morant interception put the Monarchs back on offense and Colby Goodwyn cap a six-play, 70-drive to give ODU the 42-28 edge with just over five minutes remaining in the game.

Junior redshirt wide receiver Reid Evans posted a career-high 149 receiving yards and a school record 12 catches in the Monarchs' regular season finale. Goodwyn led the ground attack with 83 yards on 18 carries. Heinicke finished the game completing 34 of his 47 passes for a season-high 373 yards.

Football Monarchs Victorious in Battle of the Silver Mace No. 11 ODU Defeats William & Mary, 35-31, and Prepares for First Playoff Appearance

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. -- The No. 11 Old Dominion Football Monarchs concluded the 2011 regular season at 9-2 overall and 6-2 in Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) action with its 35-31 victory over William & Mary at Zable Stadium.

Angus Harper, who finished the game with a trio of touchdowns, broke tackle on a seven-yard run with just under three minutes remaining in the game to give the Monarchs the 35-31 edge and corner Eriq Lewis, back after missing the last three games with a high ankle sprain, intercepted a pair of passes from Brent Caprio in the Tribes' final two drives in the closing minutes of the game.

After recovering a William & Mary fumble in their own end zone and keeping the Tribe deep in their own territory on the next time down the field, ODU opened up scoring. The Monarchs needed just four plays to cover 58 yards and go up 7-0 at the 4:27 mark. Starting their first scoring drive from their own 42, Taylor Heinicke connected with Larry Pinkard for a five-yard gain and followed by hitting Mayers for a 31-yard reception to the Tribe 11. Angus Harper then ran 11-yards to collect his seventh touchdown of the 2011 campaign to put ODU up 7-0.

William & Mary tied the game up at 7-7 on the ensuing possession to close out first quarter action. Leading rusher Jonathan Grimes, who ended the game day 227 yards on 38 carries, tore downfield for 25 yards to the left corner of the end zone for the first score on the day for the Tribe.

Heinicke, the three-time CAA Rookie of the Week, put the Monarchs back on top running and spinning into the end zone with the second quarter drive start. Making his third rushing touchdown of the season at the 12:15 mark of the second quarter, Heinicke saw the Monarchs use seven plays over 60 yards to take the lead 14-7.

However, just like Old Dominion's first score, the Tribe answered. Grimes punched in his second touchdown of the game with 8:53 remaining in the second quarter.

Both schools blocked field goals to keep the score knotted at 14-14. The Monarchs made their third blocked field goal of the season as Chris Burnette kept Drake Kuhn's 35-yard attempt from going through the uprights. Old Dominion had a chance to go ahead at the half with a 57-yard field goal attempt by Jarod Brown. The field goal, which would have been Browns' career mark, was blocked by Quincey Septemeber and the teams went into the intermission tied at 14-14.

The Tribe kicked off scoring in the third quarter. William & Mary took nearly five and half minutes on the drive to go ahead 21-14 for its first lead of the game. D.J. Managas capped the 11-play, 79-yard drive with a four-yard touchdown reception at the back of the end zone.

Old Dominion answered pulling out another play from its bag of tricks. Wide receiver Antonio Vaughan threw a 27-yard pass to Reid Evans tie the game up at 21-21 with 6:49 on the clock.

William & Mary made its way deep into ODU territory to close out the third quarter and continued its possession into the fourth quarter with Grimes pushing his way over the end line for his third touchdown of the season. Tying his career mark, he gave the Tribe a 28-21 advantage with 12:36 left in the game.

The Tribe's lead only lasted one minute and 43 seconds though. The Monarchs quickly got the ball down field in six plays thanks and ended with Angus Harper posting his second touchdown of the day.

However, William & Mary took a 31-28 lead on a 31-yard field goal with 6:44 left.

Harper carried the ball five times accounting for 42 of the Monarchs' following 74 yard drive resulting in the redshirt freshman's third and game-winning touchdown. The ODU charge downfield that gave ODU the 35-31 edge was aided by a 15-yard reception by Nick Mayers, and Hensley recovering a fumble by the Monarchs inside the red zone.

There was still time on the clock though for William & Mary to use. The Tribe had 2:48 to work with and got to within striking distance at the Monarchs' own 33. However, Tribe quarterback Brent Caprio's pass landed in the hands of Eriq Lewis.

ODU punter Jonathan Plisco made his first appearance of the game after the Monarchs were unable to move the chains. Punting the ball 35 yards, the Tribe still had a chance for the game starting at their own 41 with 1:23 remaining.

The Tribe again got to within striking distance at the ODU 37. Caprio went deep but found ODU's Eriq Lewis yet again to seal the victory for the Monarchs.

Monarchs Defeat Norfolk State, 35-18, In NCAA First Round

NORFOLK, Va. -- Old Dominion University freshman quarterback Taylor Heinicke threw for five touchdowns and passed for 269 yards to lead the Monarchs to a 35-18 over crosstown rival Norfolk State in the first round of the NCAA FCS Championships in front of a sold out crowd of 19,818 in Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

The Spartans struck first on their longest touchdown in school history just one play into the game. Derrick Demps took off for 98-yards on a pass from Chris Walley to put the Monarchs' crosstown rival ahead 7-0 just two minutes into the game.

However, from that point it was all Old Dominion as the Monarchs put together the next five scores.

Following the Spartan touchdown, the Monarchs' knotted the score at 7-7 on their next possession. A 42-yard pass to Prentice Gill put ODU into Norfolk State territory for the first time in the game and four plays later Taylor Heinicke found Nick Mayers for the first of his two touchdowns to tie the game.

The Monarchs took the lead for good in the latter moments of the opening quarter. A Carvin Powell interception kicked the drive off and after 10-plays and 66 yards, Heinicke connected with Larry Pinkard to give ODU a 14-7 edge with 2:29 in the first quarter.

Eriq Lewis, who leads ODU in interceptions, added to his total to close out the half and the Monarchs went ahead 21-7 on the first play of quarter number two. Heinicke posted his third touchdown pass on a 24-yard throw to Gill, the first of the senior Monarchs two scores.

Midway through the second quarter, the Spartans had a chance to go back onto the scoreboard as Ryan Estep attempted a 37-yard field goal. However the Monarch All-Star Team added another block to its total with Chris Burnette thwarting the attempt, his fourth blocked field goal this season.

Old Dominion wasn't done blocking field goals though. Coming out of the half, Norfolk State's Estep went for a 50-yard attempt on the Spartans' opening drive. However Estep's kick failed to go through the uprights, blocked by ODU's Edmon McClam.

The Monarchs meanwhile put away two more touchdowns on their next two opportunities down field. Heinicke found both Mayers and Gill again and Old Dominion took a commanding 35-7 advantage with just over five minutes remaining in the third quarter.

The Spartans ended their scoring drought on their first drive of the fourth and final quarter with Everett Goldberg connecting on a 48-yard field goal attempt. Norfolk State, on their ensuing possession, added their first touchdown since their first offensive play of the game on a five-yard Victory Hairston reception, but trailed 35-18 with 3:13 remaining.

Defensively, the Monarchs only allowed the Spartans 43 yards on the ground thanks in part to a team-leading 11 tackles by safety Paul Morant and as a team racking up eight tackles that saw the Spartans lose 55 yards. Linebacker Craig Wilkins added in seven stops and cornerback Markell Wilkins contributed six tackles.

For Norfolk State, Chris Walley finished with 363 yards and a pair of touchdowns, completing 28 of his 43 attempts. Victory Hairston and Reggie Garrett both lead the receiving unit with 63 yards each. Randy Maynes had seven carries for 35 yards.

Old Dominion was led on the ground by Colby Goodwyn with 14 carries for 41 yards. Mayers finished the game with six catches for 65 yards, Pinkard collected 95 yards on four catches, and Pinkard caught the ball three times for 56 yards.

HEAD COACH

BOBBY WILDER



When he was hired on February 13, 2007, Bobby Wilder's goal was to "AIM HIGH" in everything he did in resurrecting the Old Dominion football team from a 69-year absence. After two years of orchestrating every piece of the puzzle, Wilder's vision has become reality as he has built a program that has not only been the buzz of the Hampton Roads community, but has become the most successful start-up FCS program in history.

Wilder and his staff's inaugural season of play at the Football Championship Subdivision level went well beyond expectations. From the celebrated kickoff versus Chowan, to the heart pounding first FCS victory against Jacksonville, to ensuring a winning season at Savannah State, to extending the win-streak to six in the season finale at VMI, history was made every step of the way. The Monarchs concluded the 2009 season at 9-2 overall writing their way into history.

The Monarchs finished the year ranked in the top ten in five statistical categories as a team including second in sacks allowed, third in scoring offense, turnover margin, and net punting, and ninth in rushing offense. Individually, ODU had its first football All-Americans named in punter Jonathan Plisco and long snapper Dustin Phillips with Plisco leading the nation in punt yardage averaging 44.84 yards per contest. Quarterback Thomas DeMarco was also ranked in the top ten in scoring and was the second leading FCS signal caller in rushing. Wilder meanwhile received the Tom Fergusson Memorial Award at the 65th Norfolk Sports Club Jamboree named as the Metropolitan Person of the Year in Sports.

Year two proved to be just as successful. The Old Dominion football team finished its second season of football at 8-3 in 2010 and over the last two seasons has combined for a 17-5 mark as the winningest FCS start-up program in the books. The Monarchs, who upgraded their schedule in year two in preparation for joining the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), added a pair of ranked opponents in #12/13 William & Mary and #14/16 Cal Poly and continued to play in front of capacity crowds of 19,782 in all seven of its home games. Statistically speaking, the Monarchs finished their second season of gridiron action fourth in kickoff returns, ranked eighth in scoring offense, eighth in sacks allowed, and 15th in passing offense. Under Wilder's tutelage, punter Jonathan Plisco ranked second nationally in punting, quarterback Thomas DeMarco continued to rank among the top 10 in total offense, newcomer Colby Goodwyn ran this way to third nationally in punt returns, and Ronnie Cameron pushed his way into eighth overall among FCS defenders in tackles for loss.

In addition to his recruiting efforts, Wilder has also been an essential part in the planning and development of what are among the top football facilities in the country. The state-of-the-art \$17 million Powhatan Sports Complex that houses the ODU football offices,

athletic and strength training areas, locker rooms and two practice fields with artificial surface and the \$24.8 million Foreman Field Football Complex, which includes the Ainslie Game Day Building, Astoturf GameDay Grass 3D field surface, scoreboard, sound system, field enclosure and a contiguous parking garage, are among the best the FCS has to offer.

Wilder, his coaching staff, and the football Monarchs now gear up for the biggest challenge yet in 2011. The squad joins the CAA in 2011, the toughest FCS conference in the nation that featured four teams in this past season's playoffs including runner-up Delaware, as well as 2009 FCS champion Villanova, along with William & Mary and New Hampshire.

Since arriving in Norfolk, Wilder has hit the ground running and has not stopped in his quest to make Old Dominion one of the top programs in the country. Both on and off the field, the Monarch head coach is always making sure that the Old Dominion football program is visible throughout the campus, the community and the state. He has honored over 300 speaking engagements to a variety of organizations, but his most important talks have come with high schools coaches throughout the state. Wilder and his staff have made it a point to build a fence around the Hampton Roads community and the state of Virginia, with plans of building a first rate program with players a stones throw from the ODU campus.

Wilder has also been instrumental in getting his team active in the Hampton Roads Community. In what has become an annual event, the ODU Football Monarchs host a bone marrow registry drive and to date has helped register over 450 members of the ODU student body, faculty/staff, and the Hampton Roads community to the registry in an attempt to help save lives from life-threatening diseases nationwide. The Monarchs have also been active volunteering with Special Olympics, hosting youth clinics, and participating at reading and career days at many of the area's elementary and middle schools.





Prior to his arrival at ODU, Wilder served on the Maine staff for the past 17 years and was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator in 2000 before moving to associate head coach in 2001.

As coordinator, Wilder has orchestrated a balanced attack. The Black Bears averaged 29.1 points per game in 2004, and scored 29 or more in seven of 11 games. Wilder helped tutor running back Marcus Williams, who rushed for 1,077 yards during his senior season, which moved him into first place in school history for career rushing yards. Maine also threw the ball a lot during the campaign as eight different receivers each had double-digit receptions. Ron Whitcomb was at the head of the passing attack as his completions (213) and attempts (350) were the fourth most in a single season since 1950. His 22 touchdown tosses were tied for third most since 1950. Overall, the offense averaged an impressive 5.2 yards per play.

Wilder was named the Assistant Coach of the Year by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston in 2004, which is presented annually to the top assistant coach in New England.

In 2003, the Black Bears had over 2,000 yards rushing and passing with 4,142 total yards. The ground game was anchored by Williams and the passing game was in the hands of then-freshman Ron Whitcomb, who was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year as he posted 2,428 yards - the fifth most in a season at Maine.

The 2002 Black Bears finished the season with 4,702 yards in total offense, the most since a school-record 4,861 yards in 1989. In 2001, for the first time in school history, the offense boasted a 2,000-yard passer in Jake Eaton, a 1,000-yard rusher in Royston English, and a 1,000-yard receiver in Stefan Gomes.

Prior to moving to the coordinator post, Wilder served as quarterbacks coach during one of the most explosive eras in Maine history for Black Bear quarterbacks.

Wilder guided four-year starter Mickey Fein to 17 University marks, including the two highest season totals for touchdown passes. Fein ended his career as Maine's second all-time leading passer.

In 2000, Wilder's first full season as offensive coordinator, the Black Bears ranked third in the Atlantic 10 with 29.0 points per game. The rushing game increased its output by 41 yards per game from the previous season and Eaton garnered All-New England honors. Two wide receivers from that team, Dwayne Wilmot and Phil McGeoghan, signed pro contracts and were in NFL camps in 2001. In 2002, Maine tight end Chad Hayes signed with the Kansas City Chiefs and then played briefly with the Cincinnati Bengals.

A 1987 graduate of Maine with a degree in physical education, Wilder captained the Black Bears to the Yankee Conference Championship his senior year. An All-New England quarterback in 1985, he left Maine as the school's all-time leading passer with 4,493 yards, and

is currently sixth behind Mike Buck, Emilio Colon, Fein, Eaton and Whitcomb on the career passing list. Wilder coached four of those former players and played with the fifth.

A 1982 graduate of Madison High School in Madison, Maine, Wilder was a highly recruited quarterback his senior year. He opted to attend Maine and in his sophomore year and led the Black Bears to their first of five consecutive winning seasons.

Upon graduation, Wilder served as a graduate assistant coach for two seasons under Jack Bicknell at Boston College, where he earned his master's degree in educational administration in 1990.

Wilder and his wife, Pam, live in Norfolk with their sons, Derek (15) and Drew (10).






