LADY MONARCH MOMENTS:

- The Old Dominion women's basketball claimed the CAA regular season title and the top seed at the upcoming CAA Women's Basketball Tournament with a 80-70 victory on Thursday night at GSU Arena. It is the 13th regular season title for the Lady Monarchs since joining the league 16 years ago in the 1991-92 season.
- Old Dominion improved to 20-8 overall and 16-1 in the CAA in their eighth straight win since their lone CAA setback to James Madison. It is the 27th 20-win season for the Lady Monarchs including the last 16 consecutive seasons.
- Three Lady Monarchs reached double figures led by junior T.J. Jordan with a game-high 22 points. Senior Sherida Triggs from nearby Norcross, Georgia and playing in front of family and friends, poured in 14 points and narrowly missed a double-double with a team-high nine boards. Freshman Jessica Canady came off the bench for a career-high 12 points.
- In the battle for first place in the CAA standings, the Old Dominion women's basketball came out on top with a 62-57 victory over No. 22/25 James Madison last Sunday afternoon.
- Old Dominion took the top spot in the CAA standings for the first time this season, improving to 19-8 overall and 14-1 in the league race after Sunday's win over JMU. The victory was also the Lady Monarchs' first victory over a ranked opponent in five attempts. The victory also upped ODU's overall record at the Constant Center to 65-12 and 13-2 for the 2006-07 season as they played in their final regular season home game.
- The game remained close until the final seconds of the contest with clutch free throw shooting coming through for the Lady Monarchs. Leading by just one, 56-55, with 1:18 remaining, Old Dominion would go 6-of-8 from the charity stripe while allowing James Madison to reach the hoop just once. Wilson, who missed two free throws during a critical stretch in the final moments of last week's William & Mary game in Williamsburg, remained calm, cool, and collected as she sunk all four attempts in the final moments. Junior Shahida Williams, who has also struggled from the line, hit 1-of-2 with :41 on the clock putting the game out of reach for the Dukies at 61-57.
- Old Dominion junior T.J. Jordan became the 25th Lady Monarch to reach 1,000 career points as the Lady Monarch women's basketball team defeated George Mason, 80-52, on February 22nd at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. Jordan finished the night with 15 points and connected on a three-point, her third of final of the night, at the 4:39 mark to reach the 1,000 point mark.

ABOUT OLD DOMINION:

The Old Dominion women's basketball team has won eight straight heading into its final regular season game. The Lady Monarchs will take on UNC-Wilmington in their regular season finale and ironically it will be the first time ODU will be facing the Seahawks this season. Old Dominion is coming off an 80-70 victory at Georgia State which gave ODU the CAA regular season title for the 13th time in history. The Lady Monarchs had moved into first place in the CAA for the first time this season on last Sunday with an 62-57 win over No. 22/25 James Madison at the Constant Center. Junior guard T.J. Jordan currently leads the Lady Monarchs in scoring averaging 14.7 points per game, ranking 10th in the CAA in the category. She also is third in the country in three-point field goals made averaging 3.1 per game. Green leads ODU's rebounding corps with 6.4 per game. She is 19th in the conference. Old Dominion will open CAA Tournament action on Friday at noon taking on the winner of No. 8 Georgia State/No. 9 Drexel in the quarterfinals.

ABOUT UNC-WILMINGTON:

The Seahawks of UNC-Wilmington enter Saturday's contest with a 7-21 overall and 3-14 Colonial Athletic Association mark. UNC-Wilmington will be the 10th seed at the upcoming CAA Women's Basketball Tournament and will meet No. 7 Towson a first round match-up. The Seahawks have dropped their last eight straight contests including Thursday's 50-79 loss to Hofstra. UNC-Wilmington is led by senior guard Lori Drake who is averaging 14.1 points and a team-leading 8.3 rebounds. She is 12th in the league in scoring and 18th in rebounding. Sophomore guard/forward Sasha Taylor is second on the stat sheet pouring in 12.3 points and 6.3 rebounds per game.

SERIES WITH UNC-WILMINGTON:

The UNC-Wilmington Seahawks are winless against the Lady Monarchs with Old Dominion owning a 33-0 all-time record. The two teams became rivals when the Lady Monarchs joined the CAA back in the 1991-92 season and outside of the regular season have faced each other five times during the CAA Tournament. Several games in recent memory have been close affairs with the Lady Monarchs escaping Trask Coliseum in 2003 with a 51-48 overtime victory and edging out the Seahawks at Trask, 59-55, in 2005. Saturday will be the first and only regular season meeting between these two teams

LAST TIME VS. GEORIGIA STATE:

The Old Dominion women's basketball cruised to its 13th straight win with a 78-51 win over UNC-Wilmington on February 17th at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. T.J. Jordan poured in 19 points shooting 5-of-7 from three-point range. Tish Lyons registered 11 points. Shantel Wilson led the rebounding department with seven. Both Wilson and former Lady Monarchs Lawona Davis each tied their career-high with seven assists. For UNC-Wilmington, leading scorer Sahsha Taylor was the lone Seahawk in double figures with 11. She also hauled in a team-high six boards. Old Dominion led from beginning to end starting the game off with a 7-0 run. Alex Stewart, a product from nearby Chesapeake and Great Bridge High School, and leading scorer Sahsha Taylor followed by putting in back-to-back buckets to cut the UNC-Wilmington deficit to three, but that would be the closest the Seahawks would get all night. With 9:10 remaining in the first half, Shahida William added in the first of her nine points to put Old Dominion, 19-8, as the Lady Monarchs opened up a double figure lead for the rest of the night. At half, the Lady Monarchs were holding a 36-21 edge. It was more of the same in the second half. A Paula Muxiri fast break lay-up with 11:41 saw the Lady Monarch extend their lead to over 20 points with a 50-29 advantage. Old Dominion held as much as a 30-point lead in the closing minutes of the game. The Seahawks almost became the fifth straight team to be held to 50 points or under by the Lady Monarchs. However, Stephanie Fernald hit a three-pointer with 25 seconds remaining, UNC-Wilmington's lone points from downtown, to give the Seahawks 51 points for the night.

PHEW:

The Tribe were looking for their first win over the Lady Monarchs since 1976, but sophomore Tiffany Green would not allow it back on February 18th. She iced two free throws with 11 seconds left in the game to give the Lady Monarchs not only it first lead, but the lead for good, with 11 seconds remaining in the game. Green entered the game shooting just 48.4 percent from the charity stripe, but made both attempts for a 54-52 Old Dominion lead.

TAMING THE TIGERS:

Old Dominion had its largest victory of the season in an 82-42 win over Towson on February 15th. It was the fifth time the Lady Monarchs reached the 80+ point mark this season. Old Dominion shot a blistering 60.4 percent (32-of-53) against the Tigers, not only a season-high, but the Lady Monarchs' best shooting percentage since hitting 61.1 percent (33-of-54) against Hofstra in the quarterfinals of the CAA Tournament back on March 13, 2003.

CHICKEN SOUP FOR THE SOUL:

The stomach bug has managed to get a hold of two members of the Old Dominion women's basketball team. Sophomore Jazzmin Walters missed the February 8th game against Northeast. With Walters' sickness, head coach Wendy Larry used a new line-up for the first time in 12 games. Larry used the line-up of Shahida Williams, Sherida Triggs, Tiffany Green, Tish Lyons, and T.J. Jordan which was last used in a Dec. 17th loss to Charlotte. The sickness then traveled to T.J. Jordan for the Sunday's showdown with Delaware the following game. Jordan started at the point and posted 11 points and two assists despite feeling under the weather. Junior Tamara Ransburg was the latest victim of the stomach sickness February 22nd. Despite her illness, Ransburg had six points, nine rebounds, and went 4-of-4 from the line against George Mason.

DOWNING DELAWARE:

Old Dominion defeated Delaware on February 11th to move into second place in the CAA standings. Delaware, who entered the game winners in 10 of their last 11, had a four-game win streak snapped. The 47 points were the fewest the Blue Hens have scored all season and the fewest since netting only 41 in a 41-55 setback at UNC-Wilmington back on January 6th. Additionally it was Delaware's largest loss since a 27-point setback at James Madison, 57-84, back on February 1, 2004. The Fightin' Blue Hens shot a season-low 24.6 percent from the field (14-of-57), went just 2-for-13 from the three-point line. Additionally, Old Dominion outscored the Delaware bench, 21-4.

BEYOND THE ARC:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan netted a career-high 34 points, on February 8th at Northeastern. She surpassed her previous high of 28 captured at Delaware on February 11, 2005. It was the most points since Shareese Grant (2001-2005) exploded for 35 points in the 2005 CAA Tournament final, an overtime victory over Delaware. Jordan also set a new school and CAA record for three's made with 10 and set a new school mark for three's attempted with 22. The previous mark was held by Aubrey Eblin when she went 9-of-16 against UNC-Wilmington on Feb. 17, 1998. Her 10 three-pointers are also the most made by a Division I women's player this season.

FROM DOWNTOWN:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan is third in the country in three-point field goals made with 3.1 per game and is 69th in three-point field goal percentage at .356. She has 1,031 career points which puts 25th on the all-time scoring list. She has 87 three-point field goals this season and 229 for her career. Aubrey Eblin holds the school record in both categories with 97 treys made during the 1997-98 season and 250 made during her career.

SWISH:

It looked like the Lady Monarchs had their best free throw performance of the year at Northeastern on February 8th as they went 14-of-16 to finish the night at a 87.5 percent clip. Senior Sherida Triggs led the way going 4-of-4 from the charity stripe as one of five Lady Monarchs to go perfect from the line. However, that stat didn't last very long as the Lady Monarchs reset it the following game in a Feb. 11th victory over Delaware. The Lady Monarchs went 11-of-12 from the charity stripe to shoot a season-high 91.7 percent. Both Triggs and sophomore Tiffany Green went a perfect 4-of-4. Triggs had a span of 10 free throws in contests at Hofstra, Northeastern, and at home against Delaware.

CLUTCH:

Junior Megan Pym and senior Sherida Triggs hit a crucial jumpers in the closing minute to help the seal a 69-62 victory at Hofstra back on February 4th. The Lady Monarchs led by as much as 13 in the second half and were leading 63-52 with 5:37 left in the game. The Pride followed by going on an 8-0 run to pull within three with a mere 1:28 left in the game. Pym's pull up jumper at the free throw line put Old Dominion up by five, but managed a bucket on their turn down the court to once again cut the ODU lead to three with 52 seconds remaining. On the next possession, Triggs got underneath the basket to capture a miss from Jazz Walters and in the midst of Hofstra defenders manage to put the ball up and over the rim to seal the win with 24 seconds left.

DISH IT TO ME:

Sophomore Jazzmin Walters continues to grow in her role as the Lady Monarchs starting point guard. The second year Lady Monarch dished out eight assists, tying both her career and season-high while committing only one turnover against Virginia Commonwealth on January 25th. With four dishes against Hofstra on February 4th, Walters cracked the top 10 sophomore assists leaders list. She is currently in ninth place with 88 assists in her second year in the ODU uniform. She needs two to move past current assistant coach Marie Christian for eighth place.

CRASH:

Old Dominion hauled in a season-high 57 rebounds in a 63-47 win over William & Mary back on January 28th in the first meeting between the two teams. Sophomore Tiffany Green hauled in 15 rebounds to tie her career mark.

FIRST TEAM TARGETS:

The Old Dominion defense kept two members of the First Team All-CAA in check. The Lady Monarchs held Hofstra's Vanessa Gidden to one point on 0-of-7 shooting from the floor in the first meeting with the Pride and CAA Preseason Player of the Year Kyra Kaylor to just two points on 1-of-11 shooting. Coming off a career-high equaling 30 point night in a win at Georgia State, Kaylor was held scoreless through the first half and didn't notch her first points until the 15:20 mark of the second half. Kaylor entered the game averaging 14.6 points per game and was ninth in the league in scoring. James Madison's Meredith Alexis did manage to score 21 points against the Lady Monarchs. Alexis was held only to five field goals, with 11 of her game-high 21 points coming from the free throw line.

LOOKING AT THE BENCH:

Since beginning CAA action on January 4th, the Lady Monarch bench as been producing three times the amount as the opponent bench. Through 13 conference games, ODU's bench has collected 328 points as compared to their opponent's 106. Against Georgia State, ODU outscored the Lady Panther bench, 32-6, and outscored Hofstra's bench 24-4 the following game and 19-1 in the rematch. The Delaware game saw the Lady Monarchs outscore the Fightin' Blue Hen bench, 21-4.

CAA LOSSES:

Losses aren't very common for the Lady Monarchs, but they do happen. The 50-79 loss to James Madison is just one of 16 losses ODU has suffered since joining the CAA back in the 1991-92 season. Of those 16 losses, six have come at the hands of James Madison. Old Dominion has suffered at least one CAA loss in 11 of 16 seasons in the league. There are still five opponents in the CAA though that have not defeated the Lady Monarchs. The 29-point loss to the Dukes however was the largest CAA loss for the Lady Monarchs. Its previous largest margin of defeat in conference action was a 17-point erring a 57-71 loss at East Carolina on February 22, 1992.

STARTING FIVE:

With the Lady Monarch roster as deep as it is in recent memory, its hard to pick just which Lady Monarch will get the starting nod. Through twenty four games, 10 different starting combos have been used with Sherida Triggs being the only Lady Monarch to have started every single game. The line-up of

Triggs, Tay Ransburg, Shahida Williams, T.J. Jordan, and Jazzmin Walters have been used the most going 10-2 with wins over Rutgers, VCU, Drexel, Georgia State, Hofstra, George Mason, and William & Mary.

TALE OF THE TURNOVER:

Old Dominion is working on cutting down on its turnovers, but in the season series against Drexel, the Lady Monarchs forced the turnovers. The Dragons committed 30 miscues leading to 26 Lady Monarch points in the 70-45 first meeting in Norfolk and then committed another 30 against ODU in the 83-51 meeting in Philadelphia resulting in 46 Lady Monarch points. The 30 turnovers are the most committed by a Lady Monarch opponent this season. ODU followed the first Dragon meeting by collecting 31 points off of 25 Georgia State miscues the following game.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE:

Three Lady Monarchs have double-doubles under their belt. Redshirt sophomore Tiffany Green became the first Lady Monarch to perform a double-double this season with a 17-point, 12-rebound effort against Chicago State on Dec. 9th. She followed with her second double-double in the following game with 11 points and 10 rebounds on Dec. 17 at Charlotte. She currently has three under her belt as she poured in 15 points and hauled in 11 boards on February 22nd in the second meeting with George Mason. Junior Tay Ransburg 13 points and 12 rebounds on Jan. 11 against Georgia State for her first double point and rebounding effort as a Lady Monarch. Senior Sherida Triggs had 14 points and 10 boards in the series finale with VCU on Jan. 25th for her first double of the year and 10th of her career. She collected her second double-double effort with 12 points and 11 rebounds in a victory over Delaware on February 11th. That win moved Old Dominion into second place in the league standings.

HEAR ME ROAR:

Senior Tish Lyons started the year's first eight games, but for the next 13 games came off the bench. As a starter she only averaged 7.3 points and 2.8 rebounds a game but from coming off the bench beginning with the contest at Middle Tennessee State, Lyons averaged 9.4 points and 2.8 rebounds per game. Against Rutgers and in the CAA opener at Virginia Commonwealth, she poured in a season-high 14 points and also dished out a career-high six assists against the Rams. Lyons returned to the starting five five games ago and has averaged 9.8 points and 4.0 boards. Lyons poured in a season-high 19 points in a 20-point victory over Towson back on February 15th.

HOME SWEET HOME:

Since the doors opened at the Ted Constant Convocation Center in 2002, the Lady Monarchs have enjoyed a 65-12 record.

RANK 'EM UP:

Old Dominion has seen action against four Top 25 teams and six teams receiving votes in the polls so far. Old Dominion got its first win over one of those teams with a 72-55 win over Rutgers and followed with a 74-59 victory over CAA rival Hofstra. The Lady Monarchs got their first ranked win of the year against #22/25 James Madison on February 25th in a 62-57 victory. Other wins over teams in the "receiving votes" category include a 63-47 win Delaware on Feb. 11 that put ODU into second place in the CAA. Ranked teams on the schedule have included No. 5 Tennessee, No. Duke, No. 21 (AP)/24 (ESPN/USA Today) Kentucky, and No. 25 James Madison. ODU fell to the Wildcat squad 55-69 in their home opener back on November 18th, fell 40-89 to #5 Duke on their home court on November 30th, and was defeated by #5 Tennessee 59-75, although the game was tied with just 1:31 left in the first half. ODU was also edged by #25 JMU, 79-50. Virginia, Penn State, and Middle Tennessee have also been seen in the "receiving votes" categories in both polls. ODU fell 72-92 at Virginia in the season opener, lost at Penn State, 77-80, despite overcoming a 20-point second half deficit, and was edged out 71-86 by Middle Tennessee.

THE 500 CLUB:

With the 77-38 win over Chicago State on December 9th, Old Dominion head coach Wendy Larry became the 30th all-time Division I coach and 23rd active Division I coach to reach the 500-victory milestone. In 23 years as a head coach, she has compiled a 516-190 mark. Now in her 20th season at the helm of the Old Dominion program, Larry holds a 467-159 mark at her alma mater. Coach Larry just recently captured her 450th victory as the head coach at her alma mater with a 57-46 win over Delaware State on November 25.

WELCOME BACK:

Earlier this season, Old Dominion welcomed back former Lady Monarch Angela Jackson, the head coach of the Chicago State Cougars. Jackson was a member of the Lady Monarchs in 1989 and 1990, helping the Old Dominion women's basketball team to two second round appearances in the NCAA. As a senior in 1990, she was named First Team All-Sun Belt averaging a team second best 16.6 points per game. Additionally in 1990, Jackson led the Lady Monarchs with 4.1 assists per game (126 total) and is tied with Sharese Grant on the senior all-time assist leaders list. As a junior, she poured in 513 points to rank sixth on the junior all-time scoring leaders list.

FORMER LADY MONARCHS IN THE COACHING RANKS:

Former Lady Monarchs Wendy Larry ('77) Angela Jackson ('90) aren't the only Lady Monarch to have gone from player to coach. Chris Critelli ('80) - head coach Brock University in Canada, Maura McHugh ('75) - head coach Stony Brook, Anne Donovan ('83) - head coach WNBA's Seattle Storm & US Senior National Team, Rhonda Rompolo ('81) - head coach Southern Methodist, Kim McQuarter ('88) - head coach Malcolm X Junior College, Regina Miller ('84) - head coach UNLV, Inge Nissen ('80) - Co-Head Coach Florida International, Cindy Russo ('75) - Co-Head Coach Florida International, Aubrey Eblin ('99) - assistant coach University of San Diego.

WELCOME BACK MARIANNE:

Another familiar face returned to Norfolk when Rutgers visited. Scarlet Knight assistant coach Marianne Stanley was at the helm of the Lady Monarch program from 1977-1987 leading Old Dominion to three national titles (1979 - AIAW, 1980 - AIAW, 1985 - NCAA) and coaching legends Nancy Lieberman, Inge Nissen, Anne Donovan, and Tracy Claxton. Coming to ODU in 1977, Stanley became one of the youngest Division I head coach in the country at the age of 23. By the time she left, she built the Lady Monarchs into one of the nation's premiere programs posting a 269-59 (.820) record.

ON THE GLASS:

Although junior Tay Ransburg was held to only two points, both from the line, she hauled in a nine boards as Old Dominion outrebounded Georgia State, 47-31, on January 11th. She followed that performance with her first double-double as a Lady Monarch netting 13 points and grabbing a season-high 12 rebounds. She helped Old Dominion win the battle of the boards against the Pride, 40-36, after the Lady Monarchs were outrebounded in the first half, 23-15.

HALFTIME HIGHS & LOWS:

Old Dominion held a 34-16 first half advantage against Georgia State marking the lowest scoring output by a Lady Monarch opponent this season. The 18-point ODU halftime lead also tied the Lady Monarchs largest halftime lead this year. Old Dominion also held an 18-point, 35-17 advantage over Chicago State in head coach Wendy Larry's 500th career victory over Chicago State back on December 9th. Additionally, the Lady Panthers tied its season low for scoring in a half with its 16 points.

CAA OPENERS:

Old Dominion became 16-0 in CAA openers as they opened the conference slate at Virginia Commonwealth last Thursday night. Here's how the Lady Monarchs have done in all their 16 CAA openers, four of which have come against the Rams:

ENDING AND BEGINNING WITH RUTGERS:

Last season, guard Jen Nuzzo's season ended right before ODU's match-up at Rutgers with a stress fracture in her leg. This season, Nuzzo had a coming out party of sorts against the Scarlet Knights. Nuzzo served as a spark plug off the bench as the Lady Monarchs were down by 12 points in the first half. She ended the game with five points, two assists, three rebounds, and a steal in 16 minutes of action in what has been perhaps her best effort to date.

JUST LIKE MIKE:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan has led the team in scoring in all but eight games this season - at #5 Duke, at Middle Tennessee, vs. #5 Tennessee, vs. Rutgers, vs. Georgia State, vs. William & Mary - twice, Delaware. At Charlotte, Jordan collected her first career double-double with 16-points and a career-high 10 rebounds.

THE DUNKS:

Tennessee's Candace Parker didn't dunk against the Lady Monarchs in their meeting, but ODU's homecourt will always be a special place for Parker. The Lady Vols played its first and second round games of the NCAA Tournament at the Ted Constant Convocation Center in 2006 enroute to the Elite Eight. It was during their first round game vs. Army that Parker collected her first dunk (and would dunk again). It was the first dunk in a women's game during NCAA Tournament action and the first time a woman dunked twice in a game.

HOW LOW CAN YOU GO?:

The 38 points scored by Chicago State were the fewest points collected by an ODU opponent since the Lady Monarchs' 85-33 win over William & Mary on February 26, 2006.

BOARDING:

The Lady Monarchs have collected a season-high 27 board rebounding margin. Old Dominion collected 56 rebounds against both Charlotte and Chicago State while holding both teams to just 29 boards.

KEEPING THE BALL:

Old Dominion's 32 turnovers at Charlotte and 29 turnovers at Middle Tennessee certainly aren't numbers it would like to see on the stat sheet again this season. The good news is those were not school records. The most turnovers in a game in Lady Monarch history was 37. That happen twice - against Kansas on January 20, 1978 and against Tennessee on January 13, 1994.

ONE FOR THE ROAD:

After beginning the season 0-5 away from the friendly confines of the Ted Constant Convocation Center, the Lady Monarchs earned its first road win with an 81-70 victory over Virginia Commonwealth at the Siegel Center in Richmond on January 4th.

CAA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

T.J. Jordan:

01/08/07: Jordan averaged 21.5 points per game last week as she led the Lady Monarchs to their first two conference victories of the season. The third year Lady Monarch poured in a season-high 25 points against Virginia Commonwealth in ODU's CAA opener last Thursday. It was the fourth time this season she has scored 20 or more points in a game. She also shot a blistering 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from the floor, including a career-tying seven three-pointers. She was just two treys shy of tying the school record. Jordan followed with a game-high 18 points in the win over Drexel last Sunday in ODU's first home CAA win of the 2006-07 season. Against the Dragons she shot a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line, the fifth time Jordan has gone perfect from the charity stripe.

02/12/07: Junior guard T.J. Jordan set new records in school and CAA history as she helped the Lady Monarchs to victories over Northeastern and Delaware last week averaging 22.5 points per game. At Northeastern, Jordan ignited for 10 three-pointers setting new marks in both the ODU and CAA record books in categories and finished with a career-high 34 points. It was the first time since March 11, 2005 when CAA Tournament MVP Shareese Grant exploded for 35 points that a Lady Monarch reached the 30 or more point mark. In the following game, Jordan battled a stomach bug to become one of four players in double digits in a victory over Delaware moving the Lady Monarchs into second place in the league race. Jordan notched 11 points.

STREAKING:

The Charlotte 49ers won their 15th straight home contests dating back to last season with its 68-64 win over Old Dominion on December 17th. The streak began right after Old Dominion beat the 49ers 79-69 back on December 18th, 2005. The Lady Monarchs certainly know about streaks. Old Dominion held a 115 game CAA win streak from 1992 to 2001 and currently have a 44 game CAA Tournament win streak with 15 straight CAA titles. Additionally, Old Dominion had a 64 home game win streak at the old ODU Fieldhouse from 1976 to 1981. Also the Lady Monarchs had a 122 game CAA home win streak from 1992 until 2005.

LESSON LEARNED - ON TO THE FUTURE:

Old Dominion has already put it 40-89 loss to #5 Duke behind them. The Lady Monarchs' 11 first half points tied the school record for fewest points scored in a half with the original record set back in December of 1972 with 11 second half points in a 23-12 victory over James Madison. The Lady Monarchs scored only 12 points in the first half of that game. Additionally, Old Dominion shot a low of 25.0 percent (13-of-52) from the floor, its lowest since shooting 26.0 percent (17-of-65) against Virginia in 1975. Old Dominion didn't repeat its poor performance when it came out in its next game against Penn State and shot 46.9 percent (30-of-64) against the Lady Lions.

SO WE MEET FOR THE FIRST TIME:

When you look at the Old Dominion Lady Monarch schedule, you can always count on familiar teams such as Tennessee, Rutgers, and Penn State along with various other teams they play on again and off again. Three teams grace this years schedule who the Lady Monarchs have never met. First up is Delaware State, who the Lady Monarchs handed a 57-46 loss at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. ODU also had a 77-38. win over Chicago State in its first meeting with the Cougars. Old Dominion also took on Middle Tennessee for the first time in school history, falling 71-86 to the Blue Raiders in Murfreesboro.

0-2...SO WHAT?:

The Lady Monarchs may have started the 2006-07 season 0-2, but that's no reason to think the sky is falling. Last season, Old Dominion opened the season 0-2 and finished the year with a 22-9 overall mark and their 15th straight CAA title. The 2003-04 Lady Monarchs opened 0-2 and picked up ranked wins over #7 Penn State and #12/13 North Carolina. They finished 25-7 along with the CAA title. The 2002-03 Lady Monarchs opened 0-3 but managed a 20 win season going 21-9 with a CAA title. The 2000-01 season saw Old Dominion go 0-2 and also finished with a 21-9 mark and a CAA title. The 1992-93 women's team started the year off 0-4, but ended the year 22-8 overall, with yes...another CAA title and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

OPEN THE DOOR:

The Lady Monarch women's basketball team helped the Virginia Cavaliers open their new building - The John Paul Jones Arena - in ODU's first regular season contest on Saturday, November 12th. It was Virginia back on November 22nd, 2002 that helped Old Dominion open the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

BREAKING DOWN THE OPENERS:

The Lady Monarchs are 25-13 in season openers, suffering a 72-92 set back in this year's opener at Virginia. Of the previous 38 season openers, Old Dominion has opened the season three times with Virginia with a win in 1977, a loss in 2002 with the opening of ODU's Ted Constant Convocation Center, and a loss in 2006 at the opening of UVA's John Paul Jones Arena. In home openers, the Lady Monarchs are 27-11 including a 2-3 mark at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. Old Dominion fell to #21/24 Kentucky in its 2006-07 home debut, 55-69.

STREET & SMITH:

Street and Smith Magazine has listed the Old Dominion women's basketball team at No. 18 in its in their annual College Basketball Yearbook which went on sale on Oct. 1. Included on this year's schedule are five teams also appearing in Street and Smith's list including No. 5 Tennessee, No. 7 Duke, No. 14 Rutgers, No. 15 Kentucky and No. 20 Virginia.

BACK TO THE POLLS:

The Lady Monarchs received votes in both the Preseason Associated Press and WBCA/USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll. The Lady Monarchs have received votes over the last few seasons and are looking to return to the Top 25 in both polls. Old Dominion's last Top 25 ranking in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll was November 18th, 2003. Old Dominion's last appearance in the Associated Press Top 25 was the final poll of the 2002 season as the Lady Monarchs danced their way to the "Elite Eight".

WHAT THE LADY MONARCHS WELCOME BACK:

The Old Dominion women's basketball team welcomes back four starters and nine letter-winners from last year's team that went 22-9 overall and captured its 15th consecutive Colonial Athletic Association title. Seventy two percent of the offense returns including four of the five leading scorers and three of the four leading rebounders from a season ago. This year's group of seniors - Tish Lyons, Sherida Triggs, Shantel Wilson - enter the 2006-07 season having collected three CAA titles, three NCAA appearances, a 69-25 overall record and 49-5 mark in CAA matchups. Triggs joins junior guard T.J. Jordan on the Preseason Second Team All-CAA list. Triggs led the CAA in field goal percentage, was second on the ODU squad in scoring, and led the Lady Monarch rebounding corps. Jordan led the team in scoring and reset the single season three-point attempt record.

UP NEXT:

The Lady Monarchs head to Newark, Delaware and the Bob Carpenter Center for the 2007 Colonial Athletic Association Women's Basketball Tournament. Old Dominion will be the top seed and meet the winner of the Georgia State/Drexel match-up on Thursday, March 8th at noon. The Lady Monarchs are in the NCAA record books for capturing the most consecutive conference championships. In league play, Old Dominion holds a 287-16 overall record, which includes eight seasons of undefeated play. The Lady Monarchs hold a 152-2 record at home and a 135-14 road record. Only two CAA losses have occurred on Old Dominion's homecourt. The first was back at the ODU Fieldhouse, the former Lady Monarch homecourt from 1969-2002, against Richmond, now of the Atlantic-10, with a 70-74 defeat on February 19, 1992 and the second versus Delaware with a 70-73 setback on January 9, 2005. Five schools in the league have yet to beat the Lady Monarchs - Georgia State (4-0), George Mason (41-0), Northeastern (3-0), UNC-Wilmington (33-0), and Towson (10-0).

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team opened the 2006-07 season with a 92-72 loss at in-state rival Virginia on Sunday afternoon at the brand new John Paul Jones Arena.

The game marked the opening of the Cavaliers brand new facility. Virginia had helped open ODU's new home, the Ted Constant Convocation Center, back when the door opened in 2002.

The loss dropped Old Dominion to 0-1 in their first showing of the regular season. Virginia improved to 2-0.

Virginia jumped out to a 14-point lead, 24-10. The Cavaliers built its lead to 21 points, 36-15 with 6:38 to go in the half and entered the locker room with a 14-point edge, 44-30, paced by senior Siedah Williams' 15 points.

In the second half, Virginia maintained its double-digit lead, going ahead by as many as 21 points.

Junior guard T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) led the Lady Monarch squad with 21 points, all coming from three-point range. The third-year Lady Monarch shot 6-of-19 from the field, including 6-of-17 from three-point range setting new career-highs in field goals and three-pointers attempted.

Senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) sat out most of the first half in foul trouble and scored all 15 of her points in the second half.

Redshirt sophomore Tiffany Green (Chesapeake, Va.) collected a game-high 10 boards as Virginia only held a slight one rebound margin over Old Dominion, 43-42.

Sophomore Lyndra Littles led Virginia with a career-high 23 points and 12 rebounds for her second double-double of the season and seventh of her career. She went 13-of-14 from the line. Williams followed with 21 points. Junior Denesha Kenyon came off the bench for a career-high 13 points, while freshman Monica Wright rounded out the double-figure scoring with 11 points. The frosh also added six boards, four assists, and three steals in her second start.

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team fell to 0-2 on the season falling, 55-69, to No. 21 (AP)24 (ESPN/USA Today) Kentucky on Homecoming at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The Wildcats improved to 2-1 on the season and picked up their first victory in Norfolk in five trips to Hampton Roads.

In the first half, neither team enjoyed more than a five-point lead. Old Dominion led for much of the first half holding on to a 15-12 edge with 8:19 left in the half. From there Kentucky took a 7-0 run to take over a lead they would never relinquish. Old Dominion did manage to tie the game up late in the half. A T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) lay-up with 1:36 remaining tied the game at 23-23 and the Lady Monarchs ended the half down only 27-23.

Kentucky had a hot hand in the second half. After the Lady Monarch defense held the Wildcats to just 27.3 percent shooting in half number one, Kentucky ignited for 15-of-23 to hit 65.2 percent from the floor in the second half.

Old Dominion cut the Kentucky edge down to one twice in the opening minutes of the second half, but the Wildcats bumped up their margin to eight, 27-39, with 13:16 remaining. The Lady Monarchs only managed to nudge the Wildcat lead down to five. On the next two plays, a Jordan free-throw and a Sherida Triggs lay-up, Old Dominion got as close to the Kentucky lead, 47-42, as it would get the rest of the game.

Guards Carly Ormerod and Samantha Mahoney helped Kentucky take a 6-0 run to give the Wildcats a double digit lead it would hold on for almost the rest of the game. Senior forward Jennifer Humphrey hit two free throws giving the Wildcats its largest lead of the game, a 16-point 65-49 advantage.

Jordan was the team's leading scorer for the second straight game and the lone Lady Monarch in double figures. Jordan netted 11 with six points coming from the line. Sophomore Jazzmin Walters (Norfolk, Va.) added in nine.

Kentucky's Jenny Pfeiffer came off the Wildcat bench to lead all scorers with 22 points. Two other Wildcats joined Pfeiffer with double digit scoring. Ormerod added in 18 points, while Mahoney poured in 12.

Old Dominion won the battle of the boards by one, 42-41. Junior Megan Pym (Newfield, N.Y.) hauled in seven rebounds in just six minutes, but missed the rest of the game while on an injury.

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team got its first win of the 2006-07 season by handing former CAA rival East Carolina a 77-66 loss at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The win snapped a two-game losing streak for the Lady Monarchs as they head into Saturday's game with Delaware State sporting a 1-2 record. East Carolina, in their first appearance against Old Dominion since switching from the CAA to Conference USA, fell to 1-3 overall.

Junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) led the team in scoring for the third straight game with 16 points, connecting on 4-of-7 from the field, 3-of-6 from three-point range, and a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line. Junior Tay Ransburg (Kansas City, Mo.) netted 14, while senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) added 11 with 10 of those points coming in the first half.

East Carolina also saw three in double figures with Cherie Mills leading the way with 17 points. Jasmine Young collected 16 points, while LaCoya Terry dropped in 13.

In a rare occurrence, the opposition outrebounded Old Dominion. The Pirates held a 45-33 advantage on the boards, which included holding the Lady Monarchs to just seven offensive rebounds. Ransburg led the squad on the glass with six rebounds. East Carolina saw Mills and Jessica Slack record nine.

Old Dominion had a 39-27 lead at the half and led by as many as 18 in the opening stanza. Sophomore Jen Nuzzo (Newport News, Va.) came off the bench to hit one of her two treys of the evening to give the Lady Monarchs a 12-9 edge and the lead for good at the 14:31 mark.

The Lady Monarchs managed to hold off a second half comeback by the Pirates. With Old Dominion leading 46-33 and enjoying a 13-point edge, East Carolina used a 12-2 run to pull within three with 9:56 left in the game. Ahead 48-45, Old Dominion turned the table and took a run of its own. Outsourcing the Pirates 13-2 sparked by nine straight points by Jordan, the Lady Monarchs push their lead to 14, 61-47, with 5:50 left. During the run, Jordan hit two three's and was fouled on an attempt where she went to the line to hit all three free throw attempts. Additionally, senior Shantel Wilson (Washington, D.C.) went perfect from the line as well.

The Pirates did not go away and still had another run left in them. Ransburg helped the Lady Monarchs to their largest lead of the half on a jumper to give ODU a 15-point advantage, 68-53, with just 2:43 remaining in the game. Over the next minute and a half, East Carolina outscored Old Dominion 10-2, making it a seven-point ball game. The Pirates would only score three more points in the game and would foul the Lady Monarchs to close out the game. While Mills only connected on one of a three-shot award from the line and Slack put in a lay-up, the Lady Monarchs went 7-of-10 from the stripe to hold on to the win.

DURHAM, N.C. -- Old Dominion women's basketball coach Wendy Larry will have to wait one more game to see if she reaches her 500th career victory as the fifth-ranked Blue Devils downed the Lady Monarchs, 89-40, at Cameron Indoor Stadium on Wednesday night.

The loss, ODU's second to a ranked opponent this season, brings the Lady Monarchs to 2-3 overall. The Blue Devils remain perfect at 6-0.

Duke rushed out to a 9-0 lead and never looked back. At the half, the Blue Devils held a commanding 43-11 lead. The 11 points scored by the Lady Monarchs tied the school record for fewest points in a half. Old Dominion only hit four field goals and had three points from the line. Junior Tamara Ransburg (Kansas City, Mo.) led ODU at the half with four points. The Lady Monarchs' top two scorers, junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) and senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.), were both held scoreless.

Old Dominion had a stronger second half but was outscored by Duke, 46-29.

Senior Tish Lyons (Newport News, Va.) was the lone Lady Monarch in double figures. Lyons finished the night with 11 points, nine of them coming in the second half.

Five Blue Devils reached double digits led by Abby Waner with 16 points. Carrem Gay poured in 13, including 11 first half points, followed by Joy Check with 12, Keturah Jackson with 11, and Alison Bales with 10.

The Duke defense held Old Dominion to 25.0 percent (13-of-52) shooting for the game, while going on to record a season-high 59.0 percent (36-of-61) from the floor.

The Blue Devils also won the battle of the board, 36-33. Lyons and junior Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) both grabbed four in the loss. Bales hauled in a game-high seven for the Blue Devils.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. -- The Lady Monarchs rallied from a 20-point second half deficit and outscored the Lady Lions, 44-33, in the second half in its 77-50 loss to Penn State on Sunday afternoon at the Bryce Jordan Center.

Behind 55-35 a minute and a half into the second half, Old Dominion conceded to take a 16-4 run to cut the Lady Lion lead to single digits. During the final stretch of the run, Old Dominion managed to score 10 unanswered points to trail just 59-51 with 12:30 remaining in the game.

Free throws by Amanda Brown and a jumper by Kamela Gissendanner helped Penn State bump their lead to 12, 63-51 at the 11:33 mark, but Old Dominion managed to take another run and cut into the Lady Lion lead. Old Dominion outscored Penn State, 7-2, over the course of the next two minutes. Junior Tay Ransburg (Kansas City, Mo.) converted the traditional three-point play to pull the Lady Monarchs to within three, 65-62, with 9:23 left.

The Lady Monarchs refused to go away and continued to chip away at the lead until junior Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) converted her jumper to tie the game at 68-68. After each team traded baskets on respective turns down the court, junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) drained one of her five three's to give Old Dominion its first lead since 13:41 mark of the first half. Jordan's trey gave the Lady Monarchs a 73-72 advantage with 5:02 remaining in the game.

The final 2:14 saw two ties, two lead changes, and ten free throws, with eight of them taken by Penn State going 6-of-8. A 77-76 Lady Monarch lead at the 1:13 mark would be Old Dominion's final of the night. Penn State closed out the game hitting free throws to regain the lead and win. Meanwhile, Jordan had two different looks at shots from beyond the arc to try and win the game for the Lady Monarchs. Her first came with 36 seconds remaining being tightly guarded by the Lady Lions and her second came at the buzzer but fell short.

Jordan led the Lady Monarchs with a season-high 24 points. It was her second 20+ point effort of the year. Ransburg and Williams joined Jordan in double figures. Ransburg had 17 points, 7-of-7 from the field and 2-of-2 from the line. Williams added in 17.

Penn State was led by Tyra Grant with 29 points followed by Amanda Brown with 18 and Gissendanner with 12.

Old Dominion won the battle of the boards, 39-33. Williams grabbed a game-high eight rebounds in the loss.

The Lady Monarchs rebounded from its 26.0 percent shooting performance at #5 Duke to finish the night at 46.9 percent (30-of-64), including a 52.9 percent (18-of-34) second-half.

NORFOLK, Va. -- Head coach Wendy Larry collected career win number 500 on Saturday night at the Ted Constant Convocation Center as the Old Dominion women's basketball team defeated Chicago State, 77-38.

The win, which snaps a two-game losing streak, improves Old Dominion to 3-4 overall. Chicago State, coached by former Lady Monarch Angela Jackson, falls to 3-6 overall.

With the win, Larry becomes the 30th all-time Division I coach and 23rd active Division I coach to reach the 500 victory milestone. In 23 years as a head coach, she has compiled a 500-186 mark. Now in her 20th season at the helm of the Old Dominion program, Larry holds a 451-155 mark at her alma mater.

Sophomore Tiffany Green became the first Lady Monarch this season to perform a double-double. Green netted 17-points, which included a 7-of-7 mark from the field. She also hauled in 12 rebounds.

Joining Green in double figures was junior T.J. Jordan with a game-high 21 points. For the second straight game and third time this season, Jordan had a 20+ point game.

Old Dominion collected a season-high 56 rebounds - 23 offensive, 33 defensive - as they out-rebounded the Cougars by 27.

The Lady Monarchs held a two point lead, 14-12, with 8:53 remaining in the first before exploding for a 21-5 run to close out the half. Junior Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) got the run started as Old Dominion scored 10 unanswered points to begin. Williams would also score at the 4:28 mark to give Old Dominion a double figure lead for good. The Lady Monarchs entered the half up, 35-17.

Old Dominion outscored Chicago State, 42-21, in the second half registering a game-high 41-point lead in the late in the game.

The 38 points scored by Chicago State were the fewest points collected by an ODU opponent since the Lady Monarchs' 85-33 win over William & Mary on February 26, 2006.

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. -- Middle Tennessee State used a late second half run to earn a 87-71 victory over the Lady Monarchs Tuesday night at the Murphy Center.

Old Dominion drops its second straight contest falling to 3-6 overall, while Middle Tennessee improves to 9-3 overall.

The Lady Monarchs were led by starting point guard Jazzmin Walters (Norfolk, Va.) with a career-high 13 points along with four steals and three assists. Both juniors Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) and T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) added in 12.

During the next three minutes the game would endure four lead changes and Old Dominion would see its last lead at the 8:09 mark. Williams converted the traditional three-point play for a 62-60 Old Dominion advantage.

MTSU's Jackie Pickel sparked a Blue Raider 15-3 run with back-to-back three-pointers to return the lead back to Middle Tennessee. The Blue Raiders had a 10-point, 75-65, edge with 2:58 remaining.

The Lady Monarchs fought back to within six with a minute and a half to go, but were charged with an intentional foul giving the Blue Raiders two free throws and possession of the ball. Middle Tennessee scored its final nine points from the line.

NORFOLK, Va. (AP) -- Candace Parker had 32 points and 10 rebounds and No. 5 Tennessee overcame a stiff defensive test from longtime rival Old Dominion on Friday, beating the Lady Monarchs for the 11th consecutive time, 75-59.

Parker, who made history in Norfolk last season when she dunked twice in an NCAA tournament game against Army, entered the game with three dunks this season, but was booed by the crowd when she passed on a chance for another one late in the first half.

Tennessee (11-1) won its fourth in a row since a 13-point loss at second-ranked North Carolina on Dec. 3. It improved to 31-9 in its history against Old Dominion.

The Lady Monarchs (3-7) lost for the fifth time in six games. Coming off a 15-point loss at Middle Tennessee State, Old Dominion will host Rutgers next Saturday before moving into Colonial Athletic Association play seeking its 16th consecutive title.

Sherida Triggs led the Lady Monarchs with 13 points, and T.J. Jordan had 11, all in the first half. Old Dominion forced 18 turnovers, but committed 24.

Tennessee led 38-33 at halftime and didn't move comfortably in front until Parker's three-point play and jumper sparked an 11-2 run to give the Lady Vols a 58-45 lead.

Parker was 12-for-18 from the field and 8-for-8 at the foul line.

The Lady Monarchs closed within 10 twice shortly thereafter, but Tennessee finally pulled away, using a significant height advantage and more depth to wear out ODU.

Shannon Bobbitt added 13 points and Alexis Hornbuckle 10 for Tennessee.

The game drew a crowd of 7,108, the third-largest for a women's game at the Constant Convocation Center. The largest - 7,758 - also came for Tennessee on Jan. 7, 2003, the year the arena opened.

Before the game, Tennessee coach Pat Summitt took part in a ceremony to present Old Dominion coach Wendy Larry with the game ball from her 500th career victory, which came Dec. 9 against Chicago State.

The Lady Vols scored the last five points of the first half to lead 38-33. The last two came on a steal and breakaway layup by Parker, who drew boos when she didn't dunk. The game was tied at 31-31 with 1:31 left in the first half.

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team returned to the win column on Saturday afternoon at the Ted Constant Convocation Center with a 72-55 victory over Rutgers, a team receiving votes in both national polls.

The win snaps a three-game ODU losing streak as the Lady Monarchs improve to 4-7. It was the first game in seven tries that Old Dominion walked away the winner in teams either ranked or receiving votes in the Associated Press or ESPN/USA Today polls. The Scarlet Knights meanwhile fell to 5-6.

The visiting Scarlet Knights held a 12-point, 25-13, lead with 5:41 left in the first before the Lady Monarch came storming back. Senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) sparked a 16-2 run with the traditional three-point play to tie the game at 29-29 with 2:18 remaining in the half. Rutgers did manage to close out the half on a 6-0 run and entered the locker room ahead, 35-29.

Rutgers led by as many as eight in the second half, but after Brittany Ray hit a three to give the Scarlet Knights a 45-37 advantage with 16:52 left, Old Dominion took over the game. From that point, the Lady Monarchs would outscore the Scarlet Knights, 35-10.

Following Ray's three, Old Dominion went on a 17-2 run holding Rutgers without a field goal for over five minutes. Triggs, who went perfect from the line, returned the lead for good to Old Dominion hitting four consecutive free throws. Her final shot from the charity stripe gave Old Dominion a 48-47 lead at the 12:59 mark and from there the lead only grew for the Lady Monarchs.

After Triggs' points from the line, Old Dominion went ahead by seven, 54-47, before Rutgers' Kia Vaughan finally put an end to their scoring drought. The Scarlet Knights would only score six more points in the game over the final 9:50. Down the stretch Rutgers was held to only one field goal and shot just 4-of-10 from the free throw line.

Old Dominion shot 47.9 percent for the game including a blistering 52.2 percent in the second half. Rutgers was held to 22.2 percent shooting from floor in half number two after hitting 48.1 percent in the first half.

The Lady Monarchs also had a hot hand from the free throw line. After shooting just 33.3 percent (2-of-6) from the charity stripe in the first half, Old Dominion connected on 78.3 percent (18-of-23) from the line in the second. Triggs hit 6-of-6, while sophomore Jazzmin Walters (Norfolk, Va.) went 4-of-4.

Overall four Lady Monarchs registered double figures. Senior Tish Lyons (Newport News, Va.) came off the bench to tie Triggs with a team-high 14. Junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) and sophomore Tiffany Green (Chesapeake, Va.) each scored 10.

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team made it three in a row as they defeated Drexel, 70-45, on Sunday afternoon at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The Lady Monarchs have put back-to-back-to-back victories together for the first time this season to improve to 6-7 overall and 2-0 in Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) play. Meanwhile, the Dragons fall to 5-9 overall and 0-3 in conference action.

Old Dominion led much of the way. After a back and forth battle in the opening minutes, junior Tay Ransburg (Kansas City, Mo.) collected the first of her nine points on a bucket which would give the Lady Monarchs the lead for good. Her jumper put the Lady Monarchs ahead, 5-4, with 17:23 on the clock.

The foul plagued second half saw the Lady Monarchs go to the line 13 times, making 11 shots. They shot 84.6 for the half from the charity stripe and a season-high 76.0 percent for the game.

Jordan once again led the Lady Monarchs in scoring pouring in a game-high 18 points which included a perfect 5-of-5 effort from the line and three made shots from downtown. Drexel had two in double figures with Gabriela Marginean and Narissa Suber each contributing 10 points each.

Old Dominion held a slight edge on the boards, 36-34.

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team improved to .500 on the season with its fourth straight win, a 75-54 victory over a visiting Georgia State squad on Thursday evening at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The Lady Monarchs improve to 7-7 overall and 3-0 in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), while the Lady Panthers fell to 9-6 overall and 1-3 in the CAA.

Old Dominion held a 34-16 advantage marking the lowest scoring output by a Lady Monarch opponent this season. The 18 point ODU halftime lead also tied the Lady Monarchs largest halftime lead this year. Old Dominion also held an 18-point, 35-17 advantage over Chicago State in head coach Wendy Larry's 500th career victory over Chicago State back on December 9th. NORFOLK, Va. -- Junior Tay Ransburg (Kansas City, Mo.) collected her first double-double as a Lady Monarch as she was one of six Lady Monarchs in double figures in Sunday afternoon's 74-59 win over Hofstra at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The win, Old Dominion's fifth straight, puts the Lady Monarchs above .500 for the first time this season. McCollin, who only had three points at the half and exploded for 17 in the second half, led the Pride with a game-high 20 points. Murphy had 16 points and dished out five assists, while Harshaw rounded out the Pride double figure scorers with 13.

Old Dominion won the battle of the boards, 40-36, after being rebounded in the first half, 23-15.

The Lady Monarchs shot a season-best 52.9 percent (27-of-51) from the field. From the line, Old Dominion overcame its 42.9 percent showing in the first half to hit 11-of-12 in the second half to connect for 91.7 percent.

Old Dominion swept the season series with the Dragons after taking the previous meeting back on January 7th, 70-45. NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team kept CAA Preseason Player Kyra Kaylor in check, holding her to two points total, as they collected their ninth straight victory in Sunday's 63-47 win over William & Mary Sunday at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

Old Dominion improved to 12-7 overall and 8-0 in Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) play as they head into Thursday's showdown for first place at James Madison. William & Mary meanwhile falls to 13-7 overall and 5-4 in the CAA with their two-game win streak coming to a halt.

The game opened with the Lady Monarchs holding the Tribe without a bucket for seven and half minutes as they raced out to a 15-0 lead. Kaylor, coming off a career-high equaling 30 point night in Thursday's victory at Georgia State, was held scoreless through the first half and didn't notch her first points until the 15:20 mark of the second half. Kaylor entered the game averaging 14.6 points per game and was ninth in the league in scoring.

HARRISONBURG, Va. -- No. 25 James Madison remained undefeated in Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) action as they defeated the Old Dominion women's basketball team, 79-50, to snap the Lady Monarchs' nine-game winning streak.

The loss drops the Lady Monarchs to 12-8 overall and 8-1 in CAA play. It was the largest margin of defeat in CAA play since entering the league in the 1991-92 season and suffering a 57-71 loss at East Carolina. Sophomore Jazzmin Walters (Norfolk, Va.) connected on a jumper at the 18:45 mark bringing the score to 37-27, but the Lady Monarch deficit would rise from there. Following the Walters' bucket, James Madison took a 30-7 run with only senior Tish Lyons (Newport News, Va.) and freshman Jessica Canady (Williamsburg, Va.) hitting a field goal apiece with the Lady Monarchs' other three points coming from the line. The Dukes' Shirley McCall recorded a jumper with 7:19 left in the game to give James Madison its largest lead of the game, a 33-point 67-34 lead.

Lyons and sophomore Tiffany Green (Chesapeake, Va.) led the Lady Monarchs with 10 points each. Green also hauled in a team-high eight rebounds.

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team moved into second place in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) race as they handed the University of Delaware a 63-47 loss on Sunday afternoon at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

Delaware, who entered the game winners in 10 of their last 11, had a four-game win streak snapped as they fell to 20-4 overall and 11-2 in the CAA. The 47 points were the fewest the Blue Hens have scored all season and the fewest since netting only 41 in a 41-55 setback at UNC-Wilmington back on January 6th. Additionally it was Delaware's largest loss since a 27-point setback at James Madison, 57-84, back on February 1, 2004.

The Lady Monarchs had their best performance from the line all season shooting 91.7 percent (11-of-12) from the stripe. Green, who at times has struggled from the line, went a perfect 4-of-4 as one of three Lady Monarchs to go perfect at the charity stripe.

NORFOLK, Va. -- Senior Tish Lyons (Newport News, Va.) captured a season-high 19 points as she helped the Old Dominion women's basketball team to its best shooting percentage in a game in nearly four years and its largest margin of victory this season in an 82-42 victory over Towson Thursday night at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The win marks the Lady Monarchs' fourth straight win, upping their mark to 16-8 overall and 12-1 in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). Towson meanwhile falls to 16-8 and 7-7 in the league.

The entire Old Dominion roster scored as Lyons was one of four in double figures. She was joined by sophomore Tiffany Green (Chesapeake, Va.) and junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.), each with 12, and junior Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) with 10.

Towson was led by senior Kelly Robinson with 14 points, moving her into seventh all-time on the Tiger scoring leaders list.

Old Dominion shot a blistering 60.4 percent (32-of-53), not only a season-high, but the Lady Monarchs' best shooting percentage since hitting 61.1 percent (33-of-54) against Hofstra in the quarterfinals of the CAA Tournament back on March 13, 2003.

The 40-point victory was also the largest for the Lady Monarchs this season, surpassing its previous high of 39 in a 77-38 win over Chicago State on December 9th.

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. -- The Tribe of the College of William & Mary were looking for its first win over the Old Dominion women's basketball team since 1976, but sophomore Tiffany Green (Chesapeake, Va.) would not allow it. She tied two free throws with 11 seconds left in the game to give the Lady Monarchs not only its first lead, but the lead for good, with 11 seconds remaining in Sunday's 56-52 victory at Kaplan Arena.

The Tribe opened the game on a 9-0 run and led by as much as 13 in the first enroute to a 40-35 halftime advantage.

The second half had the Lady Monarchs clawing their way to the lead. CAA Preseason Player of the Year Kyra Kaylor nailed a three to give William & Mary a five-point, 49-44, lead with 9:39 left in the ball game. It would be nearly another three minutes before either team would find the cup.

Junior Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) grabbed her own missed shot and put the ball up and in and hit one of two free throws two minutes later to cut the Lady Monarch deficit to two, 49-47, with 4:21 remaining.

William & Mary had immediate answer as Devin James caught a touchdown pass for an uncontested lay-up to put the Tribe up for four just moments later.

Old Dominion then cut the William & Mary lead to one. Sophomore Jazzmin Walters (Norfolk, Va.) went to the line going 1-of-2 and managed to steal the ball on the ensuing Tribe possession to find Megan Pym (Newfield, N.Y.) for the open jumper. The Lady Monarchs trailed just 51-50 with 2:34 left.

James then went to the line for the Tribe where she had been 5-for-5. James made the first basket, but missed the second. Senior Tish Lyons (Newport News, Va.) grabbed the rebound and promptly fouled. The fourth year Lady Monarchs went to the charity stripe, hitting both of her shots, and tied the game at 52-52 with 1:15 left in the game.

Kaylor had a chance to put the Tribe ahead but missed a lay-up amid the Lady Monarch defense. Senior Shantel Wilson (Washington, D.C.) was fouled putting her at the line with just 16 seconds remaining. Wilson missed both shots, but the rebound on her second miss went to the Lady Monarchs.

Green was fouled putting her at the line for a chance at the lead with just 11 seconds on the clock. Green entered the game shooting just 48.4 percent from the charity stripe, but made both attempts for a 54-52 Old Dominion lead. Green has now made her last nine free throws.

Kaylor had one last shot for the Tribe, but missed, forcing William & Mary to foul. Walters went to the line to seal the win with two free throws.

Lyons and junior Tay Ransburg (Kansas City, Mo.) led the Lady Monarchs with 10 points a piece. Lyons went a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw lines. Ransburg along with Wilson led Old Dominion on the boards with seven.

NORFOLK, Va. -- In the battle for first place in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) standings, the Old Dominion women's basketball came out on top with a 62-57 victory over No. 25/22 James Madison Sunday afternoon at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The victory was also the Lady Monarchs' first victory over a ranked opponent in five attempts. The victory also added ODU's overall record at the Constant Center to 65-12 and 13-2 for the 2006-07 season as they played in their final regular season home game.

The first half alone endured seven ties and two lead changes. The Lady Monarchs opened the game scoring seven unanswered points, but it wasn't long before James Madison caught up. After two free throws by the Dukes' Jennifer Brown at the 4:46 mark gave the half's final tie at 25-25 apiece, the Lady Monarchs scored six straight points for its largest lead since its game-opening run. Senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) put the ball up and in underneath the basket, followed by a three-pointer by senior Shantel Wilson (Washington, D.C.), and junior Megan Pym (Newfield, N.Y.) hitting one of two from the charity stripe to give the Lady Monarchs a 31-28 lead with 1:12 left in the half. James Madison's Andrea Benvenuto closed the gap to three with a shot from downtown just moments later. With Old Dominion holding on to a 31-28 lead, the Dukes had a chance to pull even closer to lead as Brown headed to the foul line in the closing seconds, but missed both her shots to give the Lady Monarchs the three-point halftime advantage.

The second half saw another three ties and two lead changes. After Old Dominion established a five-point lead early on in the second half, the Dukes continued to chip away at the Lady Monarch lead until taking over at the 8:17 mark on free throws by Tamara Young. Moments later, Young gave James Madison a four-point, 46-50 edge with 7:45 left in the game on the traditional three-point play.

Then it was Old Dominion turn to chip away at the lead. Following Young's free throw, James Madison would be held scoreless for nearly five minutes. The Lady Monarchs took a 8-0 run capped by a three-pointer from downtown specialist T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) and never looked back. Three times the Dukes would pull within one, but would never regain the lead.

The game remained close until the final seconds of the contest with clutch free throw shooting coming through for the Lady Monarchs. Leading by just one, 56-55, with 1:18 remaining, Old Dominion would go 6-of-8 from the charity stripe while allowing James Madison to reach the hoop just once. Wilson, who missed two free throws during a critical stretch in the final moments of last week's William & Mary game in Williamsburg, remained calm, cool, and collected as she sunk all four attempts in the final moments. Junior Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.), who has also struggled from the line, hit 1-of-2 with :41 on the clock putting the game out of reach for the Dukes at 61-57.

ATLANTA, Ga. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball claimed the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) regular season title and the top seed at the upcoming CAA Women's Basketball Tournament with a 80-70 victory on Thursday night at GSU Arena. It is the 13th regular season title for the Lady Monarchs since joining the league 16 years ago in the 1991-92 season.

Old Dominion improved to 20-8 overall and 16-1 in the CAA in their eighth straight win since their lone CAA setback to James Madison. It is the 27th 20-win season for the Lady Monarchs including the last 16 consecutive seasons. Georgia State meanwhile falls to 15-14 overall and 7-11 in the league.

Three Lady Monarchs reached double figures led by junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) with a game-high 22 points. Senior Sherida Triggs from nearby Norcross, Georgia and playing in front of family and friends, poured in 14 points and narrowly missed a double-double with a team-high nine boards. Freshman Jessica Canady (Williamsburg, Va.) came off the bench for a career-high 12 points.

The Panthers also had three in double figures. They were led by senior Kelcey Roegiers-Jensen who had 17 points in her final home appearance. Marquitta Head added 14 points and registered 11 boards for a double-double, while Vatai Smith came off the bench for 10 points.

Old Dominion led from start to finish and enjoyed a five-point, 38-33 halftime lead.

Georgia State managed to pull within four on eight occasions in the second half, but each the Lady Monarchs had an answer. With 6:22 left in the game and ODU leading by eight, 54-62, the Panthers' Roegiers-Jensen nailed one of her three three-pointers of the night and saw Tabitha Davis hit two free throws to close the gap to within three.

Like they had all night, Old Dominion did not waver and rattled off a quick five unanswered points thanks to free throws by senior Tish Lyons (Newport News, Va.) and a shot from downtown by Jordan.

Over the final 4:05, the Panthers' were held to just nine points on two fields goals and four made free throws. Meanwhile Old Dominion collected 13 points which included a 7-of-10 performance from the line as Georgia State fouled down the stretch.

Old Dominion would extend its lead to double figures over the last minute.
