#### HITTER OF THE WEEK

##### BLAKE BENEFIELD, MIDDLE TENNESSEE

Freshman, OF, Murfreesboro, Tenn.  
 Benefield hit .563 (9-for-16) in four games last week, hitting home runs in three straight games at Old Dominion, becoming the first Blue Raider to hit home runs in three consecutive outings since March, 2010. He had seven RBI in Middle Tennessee's 10-5 win vs. ODU on Saturday, tying for second on the school's single-game list. Each of Benefield's home runs staked MT to 2-0 first-inning leads. The Murfreesboro, Tennessee, native delivered in clutch, as 11 of his 14 RBI came with two outs, including 9-of-11 vs. ODU. Benefield was also named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball on Monday.

#### PITCHER OF THE WEEK

##### JON DUPLANTIER, RICE

Junior, RHP, Katy, Texas  
 Duplantier posted 11 strikeouts in 6.2 innings Friday vs. No. 17 Florida Atlantic in a series-opening 9-1 win on Friday night. The Katy, Texas, native scattered four hits and four walks, but allowed just one run with some inning-ending strikeouts and a big double-play in the fifth. Duplantier's 11 strikeouts marked the sixth time in his 12 starts this season he has reached double-digit Ks (and he had nine strikeouts on two other occasions). This is the second time this season he has earned C-USA Pitcher of the Week honors.

## C-USA NOTEBOOK

### CHARLOTTE

The 49ers won two games in the series at UTSA before inclement weather forced the cancellation of the final game of the series. Backed by an 11-run fifth inning, Charlotte opened the series with a 22-4 win on Friday night. Five different players drove in three runs apiece and two hit back-to-back homers all in an 18-hit attack. The 11 runs put up in the fifth inning was the first double-digit inning since the 49ers posted 13 against Winthrop in the third inning on March 25, 2003. Friday marked the seventh game where Charlotte scored at least 10 runs and the second time this season scoring at least 20. Junior 1B **Logan Sherer's** 12th home run of the season hit on Friday is the most since Ryan Rivers put up 13 back in 2010. Junior OF **T.J. Nichting** and sophomore SS **Hunter Jones** each extended their hitting streaks to seven games. Junior LHP **Holden Capps** picked up his fifth win of the season Saturday after going seven strong innings, allowing two runs on seven hits.

### FIU

The Panthers won all three games at UAB over the weekend, their first road series sweep in C-USA play since May 2-4, 2014 at East Carolina. In Saturday's 11-0 win, junior RHP **Chris Mourelle** improved to 4-0 with a 0.68 ERA in four career starts against UAB, striking out three in seven scoreless innings pitched. Mourelle has pitched 26.1 career innings against the Blazers and has allowed two earned runs (both were allowed in FIU's 2015 C-USA Championship game win. Sophomore OF **Jack Schaaf** was 6-for-14 (.429) in the series with five RBI and three runs scored. Junior C **Zack Soria** Leads team in hits (60) and is second in average (.311), total bases (82) and stolen bases (10). He has produced at least one hit in 39 of 49 games played this season.

### (17) FLORIDA ATLANTIC

The Owls split a pair of games at No. 14 Rice last weekend before Sunday's game was rained out in the fifth inning, prior to becoming an official game. All nine Florida Atlantic starters hit safely in a 10-3 win in the game that was completed Sunday morning. Senior LHP **Devon Carr** earned his first save of the season in the on Sunday. Carr, who leads C-USA with 28 outings, allowed just one hit with two strikeouts. Junior RHP **Cameron Ragsdale** has now converted 13 consecutive saves, pitching 17.0 consecutive scoreless innings over that span. Freshman DH **Tyler Frank** finished the week having reached base safely in nine consecutive games, including a four-game hitting streak. Junior SS **CJ Chatham** batted .357 (5-for-14) in three games last week with a .400 on-base percentage. He hit two doubles and a home run to go with three RBI. FAU has reached double-digit scoring 12 times this spring.

### LOUISIANA TECH

Louisiana Tech won the series opener at No. 16 Southern Miss before dropping the final two games of the series. The Bulldogs are now 16-11 in league play (tying the school record for most conference wins in a single season, set by the 1978 Bulldog team). The 34 overall wins are the most by a LA Tech team since 2011. Despite the two losses at Southern Miss, Louisiana Tech has now won 16 of its last 20 games overall. The two midweek wins over Northwestern State gave the Bulldogs five wins against top 50 opponents on the season. Friday's 7-5 win at Southern Miss marked the third different top 25 team that LA Tech has defeated on the road this season. Junior SS **Chandler Hall** has now reached base safely in 20 consecutive games. The Louisiana Tech pitching staff ranks third in C-USA with a 3.58 team ERA (down nearly one run per game from last season's 4.52 ERA) and leads the league in strikeouts with 404.

### MARSHALL

Marshall posted its third straight sweep in Conference USA, taking all three games at WKU this past weekend. The Thundering Herd has now won nine straight games, while it has won 12 of its last 13 Conference USA games. The nine game win streak ties the longest streak since the 1988 season. Marshall tied a program record on Sunday with its 30th win of the season, matching the 2008 Herd club. The Herd has hit 53 home runs so far this season, second-most in C-USA. Over the previous four seasons, the Herd hit a combined 56. Junior SS **Leo Valenti** finished the series going 8-for-12 (.667) with three doubles, three home runs, five RBI and six runs scored. He also added his 13th sacrifice bunt of the season, the most any Marshall player has produced since joining the league. Senior OF **DJ Gee** hit a home run in all three games at WKU, and finished the series going 6-for-14 (.429) with five RBI, six runs scored and five extra-base hits. In Friday's opener, senior RHP **Chase Boster** went six innings and allowed one run on four hits to earn his fourth straight win. Boster has 18 career wins for the Herd, which places him in a tie for third all-time.

### MIDDLE TENNESSEE

The Blue Raiders offense exploded in both wins last week, scoring a season-high 17 runs in a midweek win at Austin Peay and posting 10 runs in the middle game of the series at Old Dominion. Freshman OF **Blake Benefield** hit .563 (9-for-16) in four games on the week, hitting home runs in three straight games vs. ODU, becoming the first Blue Raider to hit home runs in three straight games since March, 2010. He had seven RBI in Middle Tennessee's 10-5 win vs. ODU on Saturday, tying for second on the school's single-game list. Benefield delivered in clutch as 11 of his 14 RBI came with two outs, including 9 of 11 vs. ODU. Freshman RHP **Carson Lester** earned the win in both of the Blue Raiders victories last week, allowing one run on three hits in 6.1 innings pitched.

### OLD DOMINION

The Monarchs won two-of-three at home against Middle Tennessee over the weekend, their third consecutive series win. The two wins moved Old Dominion past the 30-win mark (now 31) on the season and, combined with other results in C-USA, clinched a C-USA Championship berth for the Monarchs. Junior LHP **Adam Bainbridge** pitched a complete seven innings in relief for the Monarchs in Sunday's 6-2 victory, a feat that no ODU pitcher has accomplished the season. During his time on the mound, he allowed just four hits, while forcing three straight three up, three down outings in the sixth, seventh and eighth innings for his third win of the season. Junior SS **Zach Rutherford** was 6-for-14 (.429) in the series and leads the team with a .327 average on the season. With 74, the Monarchs have stolen more than twice as many bases as their opponents (36). Junior OF **Nick Walker** leads the way with 18, while senior OF **Connor Myers** has 17.

### (16) RICE

Rice is 32-16 overall and 19-7 in C-USA league play. Both records are the exact same marks the team had through the same number of respective games played last season and the Owls sit one half game out of first place in the league standings. Rice and Florida Atlantic split a pair of games over the weekend and had the final game of their series last weekend cancelled due to rain. The score was 4-4 before a full 5.0 innings could be completed. True freshman SS **Ford Proctor** extended his current hitting streak to 11-straight games. Proctor earlier had a hitting streak of 18 games. The rookie from Beaumont, Texas, is batting a steady .351 for the full year and .370 in C-USA league games. In Friday's 9-1 win over C-USA foe FAU, Rice hit two home runs in a game for the first time all season. Junior RHP **Jon Duplantier** posted 11 strikeouts in 6.2 innings Friday vs. FAU. He has reached double-digit strikeouts in six of his 12 starts this season and averages 11.5 per 9.0 innings. Rice next plays crosstown rival Houston on Tuesday (May 19) in the final regular season game for the annual Silver Glove Trophy. Like the big rivalries in college football, Rice and UH play a regular season series to determine the collegiate city champion. This year the series is tied 1-1 heading into the final game, which will be held at the neutral site of Constellation Field in Sugar Land, Texas.

### (13) SOUTHERN MISS

Southern Miss won its seventh of nine league series' in 2016 and finished its home record in conference play at 13-2, after taking two of three from Louisiana Tech over the weekend. The Golden Eagles now have won 20 league games for the first time since 2005 and for the fourth time in their 21-year history with the league. The program improved to 13-0 in weekend series finales with its 2-0 win over LA Tech on Sunday. It was the fourth shutout for the Golden Eagles this season. Southern Miss also improved to 13-0 this season in games that junior RHP **Kirk McCarty** has started. McCarty improved to 6-0 on the year, by limiting the Bulldogs to three runs on seven hits and one walk with three strikeouts Saturday. Sophomore IF **Daniel Keating** currently enjoys his longest hitting streak of the year at eight games after hitting safely in all three LA Tech contests, including a three-hit game in the opener. Senior 1B **Tim Lynch** went over the 50 RBI mark with a pair over the weekend against LA Tech and becomes the first Golden Eagle to notch at least 50 runs driven in since current Golden Eagle player and current assistant coach B.A. Vollmuth knocked in 70 in 2010. Senior SS **Nick Dawson** doubled twice and homered in the middle game of the series as he also drove in a pair of runs in the contest. It was Dawson's second homer of the season and the team's 58th of the year.

### UAB

The Blazers dropped all three games against FIU over the weekend. Senior OF **Griffin Gum** extended his hitting streak to nine games with a hit in each game of the series, producing a pair of multiple-hit outings. Of the Blazers' 51 games played, freshmen OF **Brewer Hicklen** and 2B **Carter Pharis** have started every contest. Hicklen leads the UAB offense with a .415 on-base percentage, totaling 53 hits and drawing 36 walks. Pharis leads the team in batting average (.298), in doubles with 13 and has driven in a team-best 31 runs. Senior RHP **Thomas Lowery** has posted eight saves while striking out 43 batters in 44.1 innings pitched over 21 appearances.

### UTSA

The Roadrunners fell to Charlotte twice, before the series finale on Sunday was rained out. Junior OF **J.T. Gilmore** led the Roadrunners lineup in Saturday's game that was delayed by more than six hours by rain, going 3-for-3 with a run scored and a RBI. Freshman IF **Bryan Arias** now has 14 multiple-hit games this season. He leads team with a .313 batting average, is second in hits (56) and tied for first in C-USA with four triples. Senior OF **Matt Hilston** has set a new UTSA single-season record with a league-high 56 walks this season.

### WKU

The Hilltoppers dropped all three games against Marshall over the weekend. Senior 3B **Danny Hudzina** had a productive final game at home on Sunday, going 2-for-4 with a double and a run driven in. For the series, he finished 6-for-11 (.545) and reached base eight times total. Hudzina is leading C-USA in batting average (.415) and hits (86), attempting to become the first .400 hitter in the league since 2011. In the past four C-USA series, sophomore OF/DH **Kaleb Duckworth** has gone 20-for-51 (.392) with 12 runs, 12 RBI, eight extra-base hits, five doubles, two triples and a homer.
