The Monarchs lost at Hofstra, 60-51. Gerald Lee led with 20 points and seven rebounds. Keyon Carter came off the bench to score 15 points. ODU shot .275 (19-69) from the floor, while Hofstra shot .385 (.20-52). Charles Jenkins led the Pride with 15 points, while Nathaniel Lester added 11 points and 10 rebounds. Hofstra outrebounded the Monarchs, 48-39. Lee has scored 108 points in his last five games for ODU (21.6). ODU ended it's two-game road swing with a split.

SERIES VS. VCU

VCU leads the series, 40-37.

The Rams defeated the Monarchs back on Jan. 17, 61-44 in Richmond. Larry Sanders led VCU with 16 points, while Eric Maynor scored 14 with nine assists and Brandon Rozzell had 12. Ben Finney led ODU with 12 points and six boards, while Gerald Lee scored 10 with 11 rebounds. ODU shot .345 (20-58), while VCU was at .435 (27-62). There were only 12 free throws taken between the two teams. Last year, ODU defeated VCU in Richmond, and the Rams beat the Monarchs in the Constant Center.

ON THE RADIO

The Monarch games are aired on WXEZ 94.1 FM, a 40,000 watt station with a signal strength that stretches to the Northern Neck and Eastern Shore, west to Richmond and south to northeastern North Carolina. In addition, selected games will be simulcast on WGAI AM 560 in Elizabeth City, increasing the coverage area to the Outer Banks of North Carolina.

All-Access Pass. Audio of all Old Dominion's contests both home and away are available over the internet while all home games will be videostreamed live from the Constant Center. Fans can enjoy both for a monthly fee of \$7.95 or \$49.95 for the 2008-09 athletic season. Users may have to install Microsoft Silverlight.

Erla Dagg Haraldsdottir (Njardvik, Iceland) swam the 100 breast and 200 IM in Beijing this past summer.

The Olympian and 24-time Icelandic champion holds 11 Icelandic records including the 50, 100, and 200 breast, the 200 and 400 individual medley, and the 200 fly in the 25-meter pool, as well as the 50, 100, and 200 breast, 200 individual medley, and 200 fly records in the 50-meter pool. Haraldsdottir also won 11 medals participating in the Small Nation Games in 2003, 2005, and 2007. She brought home a total of seven gold and four silver.

Arni Mar Arnason (Mosfellsbaer, Iceland) swam the 50 free in Beijing for Iceland this past summer. Arnason holds the Icelandic record in the event having captured a time of 22.81. An Icelandic champion multiple times throughout his career, he won the Nordic Junior Championships in the 100 breast in 2005 and also competed at the European Junior Championships.

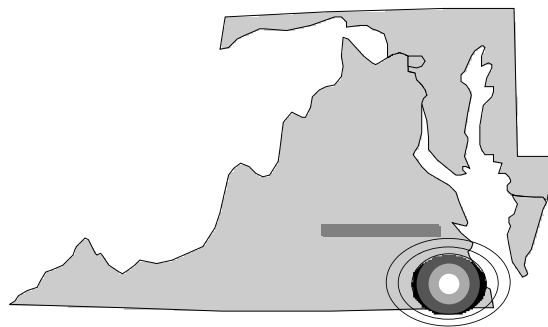

The pride of Old Dominion University and its athletic programs reflects the...

Recognition of the excellence of our program...

- For more than 25 years, 90% of Old Dominion's student-athletes that have exhausted their eligibility have graduated, a percentage far above the national average.
- Old Dominion University athletic teams have captured 28 team national championships and four individual titles, including a men's basketball crown in Division II in 1975, three titles in women's basketball, nine in field hockey, 15 in sailing, and individual championships in wrestling and women's tennis.
- Old Dominion has been the site of five NCAA women's national championships including the 1982 and 1983 basketball "Final Four" and the 1985, 1986 & 2000 field hockey tournaments.
- Old Dominion was selected as one of 45 institutions nationally for the NCAA Pilot Certification Program, a pioneer program that looked at the athletic department's overall operations, including philosophy, academic requirements, competition, etc.
- Old Dominion was among one of the first institutions to implement a successful drug testing and education program, now entering its 13th year.
- The SACS Committee commended the University and the Athletic Department on its program of high integrity, honesty, fiscal soundness and effective management, noting that excellent people, facilities and services are in place
- Old Dominion University was the first institution in Virginia to offer grants-in-aid for women athletes, beginning in 1974.
- Old Dominion's nine national titles in field hockey are unprecedented in NCAA record books for most titles in that sport by the same school.
- Old Dominion has had 107 first team All-Americans and 124 Academic All-Americans since 1976.
- Old Dominion has been the host site of four ICSA Sailing national championships, including 1985 Team Race, Dinghy, Women 1993 Team Race, 2001 men's and women's singlehanded and the 2007 Women's Dinghy.

Reaching the pinnacle of achievement and honor within sport...

- Seven former Old Dominion coaches or athletes have been inducted into national sports halls of fame. Former Old Dominion basketball standout and three-time Olympian Anne Donovan was inducted into the GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American Hall of Fame in May of 1994, was inducted into the Hall of Fame on May 15, 1995, and received the NCAA 25 year award in 2008. Nancy Lieberman-Cline was inducted into the Basketball Naismith Hall of Fame in 1996 and both Nancy and Anne were in the first class of inductees in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 1998. In 2002, former women's basketball coach Marianne Stanley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. - Three former Old Dominion University women's basketball players have been recognized as national players of the year; Nancy Lieberman - 1979 and 1980 Wade Trophy winner and Honda-Broderick Cup winner in 1980 (nation's top female athlete); Anne Donovan - 1983 Naismith Award winner; and Ticha Penicherio - 1998 Wade Trophy winner.
