## THE STORYLINES . . .

- Tulsa is in its 125th season of Tulsa football ... Old Dominion is in its 13th year with a football program and ninth on the FBS level.
- Tulsa has the smallest FBS enrollment with 2,929 undergraduate students (based off 2020-21 statistics) ... Tulsa's overall enrollment is 3,961 ... Old Dominion is 19,622.
- Tulsa finished in a 3rd-place tie in the AAC after being picked 6th in the preseason ... Tulsa has placed in the top-3 in back-to-back years.
- This is the first meeting between Tulsa and Old Dominion.
- The Myrtle Beach Bowl is Tulsa's 23rd bowl game appearance in school history, while Old Dominion is making its second bowl appearance.
- Both teams are on winning streaks – Tulsa three games and ODU five games.
- Coastal Carolina is 322 miles from Conway, while Tulsa is 1,137 miles.
- Tulsa senior RB Shamari Brooks needs 29 more yards to move into a second-place) on the school's all-time rushing list ... he is currently third with 3,622 yards.



## TULSA'S BOWL GAME HISTORY . . .

- Tulsa is making its 23rd bowl game appearance in school history.
- The Hurricane has 10-12 bowl record and has won 5 of its last 8 bowl contests.
- Tulsa is making its 12th bowl appearance in the last 19 seasons.
- Tulsa was the first school to appear in five straight New Year's Day Bowl Games – 1942 Sun Bowl (1-1-42), 1943 Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), 1944 Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), 1945 Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and the 1946 Oil Bowl (1-1-46).
- This is the first bowl game in the state of South Carolina for Tulsa ... the Hurricane has played seven bowl games in Texas, five in Louisiana, three in Florida, two in Alabama and Tennessee and one each in Idaho, California and Hawaii
- Tulsa has played in six bowl games multiple times — Sugar Bowl (1944, '45), Bluebonnet Bowl (1964, '65), Independence Bowl (1976, '89, 2015), Liberty Bowl (2005, '12), Armed Forces Bowl (2006, '11, '20) and the GMAC Bowl (2008, '09).

## ABOUT THE OPPONENT . . .

- Old Dominion is located in Norfolk, Virginia.
- The Monarchs did not have a season in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic.
- After six seasons at Penn State, Head Coach Ricky Rayne (pronounced Ronnie) is in his second at ODU, but 2021 was first time the Monarchs played under his tutelage.
- ODU began its football program as an FCS program in 2009 ... the Monarchs transitioned to the FBS in 2013, entered Conference USA in 2014.
- Old Dominion made the schools only other FBS bowl game appearance in the 2016 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl, defeating Eastern Michigan by a 24-20 score.

## MONTGOMERY IN BOWL GAMES . . .

- Philip Montgomery is making his fourth bowl game as Tulsa's head coach.
- Montgomery's four bowl appearances rank as the second-most bowls for a Tulsa head coach in school history... Henry Frnka's five appearances from 1941-45 is the best.
- Montgomery's team defeated Central Michigan 55-10 in the 2016 Miami Beach Bowl and fell to Virginia Tech 55-52 in the 2015 Independence Bowl and 28-26 to Mississippi State in the 2020 Armed Forces Bowl.
- In 19 years as a collegiate coach, this is Montgomery's 13th bowl game appearance.

### COMEBACKS . . .

- In the regular season finale at SMU Tulsa trailed by 17 points in the second quarter and mounted its third come-from-behind victory of the season.
- Tulsa also had comeback wins this year against Arkansas State (7 points), Memphis (6) and 14 at South Florida.
- In the Montgomery era, Tulsa has had 20 comebacks since 2015.
- \* The largest comeback in school history and the second biggest in NCAA DI history (at the time) was coming back from a 31-0 deficit to defeat Fresno State 48-41 in overtime in the 2016 season.
- In the past seven seasons, 17 of the comeback wins were from double-digit deficits.

### PHILIP MONTGOMERY IN SEVENTH SEASON LEADING TULSA FOOTBALL PROGRAM . . .

- Philip Montgomery is in his 7th season as the Golden Hurricane head coach and has an overall 37-46 head coaching record.
- Montgomery is making his fourth bowl game in his seven years at Tulsa, which is the second-most bowl game appearances for a Tulsa coach
- Of Montgomery's losses, 18 of those have been by seven or less points, 12 losses are under five points and three losses of 3 points or less came against top-25 teams.
- He became the 29th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2014.
- Montgomery grabbed his first coaching win against a ranked opponent in his 14th game against a top-25 team with a 34-26 win over #11 UCF in the 2020 season ... he became the first TU coach to defeat two top-25 ranked teams in the same season when Tulsa defeated #19 SMU.
- Montgomery was named The Dodd Trophy Coach of the Week, as named by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation after Tulsa's 21-point comeback over SMU in 2020.
- He ranks 7th on the school's all-time head coaching wins list with 37 victories.
- \* He took the 2020 team to the Lockheed-Martin Armed Forces Bowl for his third bowl game as the Tulsa head coach.
- Montgomery completed his second season in 2016 leading the Tulsa football program to a 10-3 record and a win in the Miami Beach Bowl.
- Montgomery claimed his first career head coaching victory in the 2015 season opener with a 47-44 overtime win over FAU.
- In his first year, he led Tulsa to six wins and to the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.
- Before coming to Tulsa, he spent seven years at Baylor, where he spent the final three seasons as the offensive coordinator/QB coach.

### BROOKS IS 29 YARDS SHY OF SECOND PLACE ON TULSA'S CAREER RUSHING CHART . . .

- Running back Shamari Brooks, who missed the 2020 season with an ACL injury, became just the fifth player in school history to surpass 3,000 career rushing yards.
- He reached the 3,000-yard mark on his third carry against Memphis (10/9).
- Brooks ranks third on the school's all-time rushing chart with 3,622 yards on 767 career attempts in 44 career games ... his 767 carries is a school record.
- He surpassed both Trey Watts (3,515, 2010-13) and Micheal Gunter (3,536, 1980-83) with 60 yards against Temple for third place.
- Brooks needs 29 more yards to tie Tarrion Adams (3,651, 2005-08) for second place on the career list.
- Brooks also needs 78 yards to reach 1,000 yards on the season, which would give him two 1,000-yard rushing seasons ... he had 1,046 yards in 2019 before missing last season with an ACL injury ... it will be the 22nd time in school history a runner went over 1,000 yards in a single season and he would be the sixth to do it twice.
- The senior from Tulsa's Union High School came into the 2021 season ranked 5th on the school's career rushing list with 2,700 yards.
- Brooks has 16 career 100+ rushing games, including four this season — 132 yards at Cincinnati, 145 yards at South Florida, 126 yards vs. Memphis and 155 yards vs. Arkansas State.
- He has scored six rushing TDs this season to give him 29 career rushing touchdowns ... he is now in 5th place on the school's career list for rushing TDs, and one shy of moving into 4th place.
- Brooks has a total of 30 touchdowns – 29 rushing and one receiving – to rank 9th on the school's all-time TD chart.

REVISITING CONFERENCE USA . . .

- Tulsa is playing in its 23rd bowl game, but it's the first time the Hurricane has faced a Conference USA team in a bowl.
Tulsa was a member of Conference USA from 2005-2013 before moving to the American Athletic Conference.
As a C-USA member, Tulsa posted a 49-23 record, won the C-USA West Division in four seasons outright and shared one West division crown as a 9-year league member.
Tulsa played in four C-USA Championship games ... Tulsa defeated UCF in Orlando in its first year as a league member in 2005 and defeated UCF again in 2012 for the league title ... Tulsa fell to UCF in 2007 and East Carolina in 2008 in the championship game.

ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS . . .

- Tulsa had two second-team all-AAC selections as voted by coaches — DL Jason Player and OT Tyler Smith ... both players were first-team performers in 2020.
The Hurricane had two honorable mention selections, including OT Chris Paul and LB Justin Wright ... both Paul and Wright earned second team honors a year ago.

QUICK HITS . . .

- Tulsa has six players who have played in 50 career games – Robert Revels III (59), Adam Higuera (57), Tyarise Stevenson (55), Cristian Williams (55), Tiller Bucktrot (52) and Treyvon Reeves (52).
The 17-point comeback win at SMU was the fourth of the year and second on the road.
Tulsa has had a different defensive starting lineup in all 12 games this season.
Tulsa's 44 points vs. Temple was a season-high and the most since scoring 49 points in the 2019 season finale at East Carolina ... it was also the most points scored at home since scoring 49 points vs. UConn on Nov. 3, 2018.
Tulsa has six 200+ rushing games this year, – 247 vs. UC Davis, 308 vs. Arkansas, 235 vs. Memphis, 269 vs. USF, 297 vs. No. 9-ranked Cincinnati defense and 216 vs. Temple.
Tulsa has had five plays for scrimmage of 60 yards or more — 88, 78, 75, 63 and 61 — including three that went for touchdowns.
Anthony Watkins had Tulsa's first special teams score since the 2012 season when he had 97-yard kickoff return against Navy ... in 2012, Tulsa had a punt and kickoff return for a TD.
Davis Brin is the 15th different quarterback in school history to reach 2,000+ passing yards in a single season ... he now has 2,984 yards on the season to rank 10th on the school's single season passing chart.

THIRD DOWN DEFENSE . . .

- Although Tulsa's third down conversion defense has been pretty good this season, the final three weeks was outstanding ... Tulsa's third down defensive conversion rate is .380 for the season.
In the final three regular season games, Tulsa's defense has held its opponents to just a 17.8-percent third down conversion rate.
In the previous nine games, the opponents third down conversion percentage was .452 (57-of-126).
Tulsa held Tulane, Temple and SMU to a combined 8-of-45 on third downs, including 1-of-14 at Tulane, 2-of-14 by the Owls and 5-of-17 at SMU.
Tulsa's defense held its last three opponents to 14 three-and-outs on 38 possessions.

WHAT A WEEK . . .

- The week of Nov 15-20 was quite the week for senior offensive lineman Chris Paul.
He made his live musical debut as the artist "Seventh" on Tuesday, Nov. 16.
Said Paul ... "It was held at Notion, an underground coffee shop in downtown Tulsa. "They have a huge black box on the inside so that's where we performed. It was packed. There were so many people there. It was such a special moment. It was energetic."
A day later (Nov. 17), Paul received and accepted an invitation to the Reese's Senior Bowl.
Paul celebrated his 23rd birthday on Friday of that week (Nov. 19) and although he was unable to play a day later (Nov. 20) due to injury, Tulsa defeated Temple 44-10.

COMEBACK WINS . . .

• Since Philip Montgomery took over as head coach in 2015, Tulsa has had 20 games in which the Hurricane has trailed and come back to win . . . in the 2015 season, 11 points against SMU was the biggest deficit that Tulsa came back to win . . . Tulsa also trailed by 10 points vs. FAU in the season opener, and twice against Tulane to come back to win . . . in 2016, Tulsa had its biggest come-from-behind win in school history and second-biggest in NCAA Division I history (now 3rd), trailing 31-0 at Fresno State in the second quarter and winning 48-41 in overtime . . . the next largest comeback win was 21 points in 2020 against SMU.

THE SENIORS . . .

• A total of 25 Tulsa seniors made their final appearance at H.A. Chapman Stadium in the home finale against Temple on Nov. 20.
• Eighteen of those seniors had already received their degrees and this semester have been either working on a second degree or a master's. (LIST OF SENIORS ON PAGE 25)

MISSING PIECES . . .

• Tulsa has missed some integral pieces of its offense and defense this year.
• Defensively, starters DE Cullen Wick (6), SAF Kendarin Ray (6), NKL Cristian Williams (4), SAF TieNeal Martin (1), LB Justin Wright (1) and NG Tyarise Stevenson (1) have all missed games this season . . . Ray (Ohio State 1st half) and Jaxon Player (Houston 1st half) missed one half of a game due to targeting calls.
• On offense, WR Keylon Stokes (8), RB Deneric Prince (3), WR Sam Crawford Jr. (3), RT Chris Paul (2) and LT Tyler Smith (1) have missed games.
• Ray, Stokes, Crawford as well as Deven Lamp and Dante Bivens will miss the Myrtle Beach Bowl, while Wick and Paul are questionable.
• Tulsa is also without defensive coordinator/LB coach Joseph Gillespie and offensive line coach Zach Hanson, both of whom have taken other coaching positions.

COMEBACK OVER SMU IN REGULAR SEASON FINALE . . .

• Tulsa took on the AAC's top offense (471.4) in the season finale and the second-best scoring offense (39.1) on SMU's home field.
• The Hurricane handed the Mustangs their first home loss of the season and only the second loss in their last 14 games with a 34-31 victory.
• Tulsa trailed 17-0 in the second quarter, but finished the first half by scoring twice in the final 1:06 . . . the first coming on a 7-yard Anthony Watkins run that capped a 10-play, 89-yard drive . . . the second on a 32-yard TD toss from Davis Brin to Josh Johnson that capped a 2-play, 50-yard drive in just 0:16.
• Tulsa opened the second half with a 75-yard, 9-play scoring drive to take a 21-17 lead and never relinquished that lead, making it 28-17 and 31-17 before SMU would score again.
• SMU gained 405 yards, 66.4 yards below its season average, and was held to 8.1 yards below its scoring average.

TULSA GOES TO OT FOR WIN OVER TULANE . . .

• For the second straight season, Tulsa went to overtime to defeat the Tulane Green Wave 20-13 . . . this year, Shamari Brooks scored on a 15-yard run on Tulsa's first possession and the Hurricane defense held Tulane on their first OT possession.
• Tulsa improved to 11-6 in overtime in school history and 3-0 over Tulane in OT.
• Philip Montgomery's career record improved to 6-1 in overtime games.

TAKES NO. 2 CINCINNATI TO THE WIRE . . .

• On Nov. 6, Tulsa took the nation's second-ranked Cincinnati Bearcats down to the wire in a matchup of last year's AAC Championship participants.
• The Bearcats jumped out to the early 14-0 lead . . . Tulsa dominated the second quarter to make the halftime score 14-12.
• UC scored on its first two second-half possessions for a 28-12 lead.
• At the 8:10 mark of the fourth quarter, Tulsa made the score 28-20 on a 21-yard pass from Brin to JuanCarlos Santana and two-point conversion.
• From there, the Hurricane defense forced a Cincinnati punt and the offense took possession at their own 23-yard line with 5:28 on the clock. Tulsa marched to the UC 6-yard line and a 4th-and-5 pass fell one yard short of the first down.
• Tulsa had one more chance as Cincinnati fumbled the snap from their own 2-yard line on the first play with 1:11 to play . . . Tulsa took over from the UC 3-yard line but on 4th-and-1 the ball was fumbled into the end zone and recovered by the Bearcats to end the game.



**100 OR MORE . . .**

- Tulsa has had three different runners rush for 100+ yards this season for a total of eight 100+ rushing games.
- In addition, three Hurricane receivers combined for eight 100+ receiving games.
- On the ground, Shamari Brooks has four 100-yard rushing games (155 vs. Arkansas State, 126 vs. Memphis, 145 at South Florida and 132 at No. 2 Cincinnati) ... Deneric Prince had 151 yards against UC Davis and 110 vs. South Florida ... Anthony Watkins had 115 yards against Arkansas State and 105 at No. 6 Cincinnati.
- There have been three games with two Tulsa running backs each totaling over 100 yards – Arkansas State, USF and No. 2 Cincinnati.
- Thru the airways, Josh Johnson has had over 100 yards in five games — 149 vs. Ohio State, 127 vs. Arkansas State, 140 vs. Memphis and a career-high 159 vs. Temple.
- Sam Crawford had back-to-back receiving games with 105 vs. Arkansas State and 101 vs. Houston, while JC Santana had his only 100+ receiving game of the season with 109 yards against Navy...

**IN THE AMERICAN . . .**

- RB Shamari Brooks is ranked third in the AAC for rushing (76.8 ypg)
- Sophomore punter Lachlan Wilson ranks second in the AAC for punting with a 45.9 average, trailing Tulane's Ryan Wright's 47.5 average.
- WR Josh Johnson is third in the AAC for receiving yards per game (82.0 ypg) ... Johnson is second for receptions per game with a 6.25 average.
- SAF TieNeal Martin is ranked sixth in the league for interceptions with four (0.36 pg).
- PK Zack Long is ranked first for field goals (19-of-20) for a 1.58 average and for field goal percentage (95.0) ... Long is seventh for scoring (7.4 ppg) and fourth for kick scoring (7.4 ppg).
- CB Travon Fuller has a team-high 10 pass breakups with three interceptions to rank fourth in the AAC for passes defended per game with 13 (1.08 pg).
- QB Davis Brin is fourth in the league for average passing yards per game (248.6) ... Brin is also ranked sixth for total offense (253.2).
- LB Justin Wright is ranked 9th in the AAC for tackles with 77 (7.0 pg).

**MISLEADING STAT . . .**

- Statistically, Tulsa ranks 78th nationally for points allowed, giving up 27.4 points per game this season.
- A closer look at the stats show that Tulsa's defense has allowed 4.1 points less at 23.3 points (280) per game.
- Tulsa opponents have scored four times on special teams for 28 points and three times on defense for another 21 points for a total of 49 points.
- Without the defensive and special teams scores, the 23.3 points allowed per game would rank Tulsa 44th nationally.

**UNDER MONTY . . .**

- In 83 games under Philip Montgomery, Tulsa has scored over 40 points 26 times and has posted a 21-5 record when doing so.
- Tulsa has gone over 500 yards of total offense in 28 games under Montgomery for a 19-9 record.
- The Golden Hurricane has gone over 600 yards 10 times under Montgomery, including this year's 663 this year against Arkansas State ... Tulsa had a high game of 667 yards in 2017 against Louisiana-Lafayette.
- Tulsa has 14 300+ yard rushing games in the Montgomery era, with a school record eight in 2016, three in 2017, two in 2019 and one this season (308 vs. Arkansas State).
- Tulsa is 12-2 when two players have gone over 100 rushing yards in the same game since 2015 under Montgomery.
- Tulsa has three 400+ rushing games under Montgomery, two coming in back-to-back games in 2017 (424 vs. Louisiana, 423 at Toledo) and one in 2016 (470 vs. UConn).



**DREW PEARSON IS FOURTH-TULSA PLAYER TO JOIN PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME . . .**

- Dallas Cowboy legend and Tulsa star receiver Drew Pearson was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2021 on Aug. 8.
- Pearson became the fourth former Tulsa student-athlete to receive induction into the Hall of Fame.
- The Tulsa alumni that Pearson joined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame are Bob St. Clair, a 1990 inductee, and 1995 inductees Jim Finks and Steve Largent.
- Pearson became just the 22nd undrafted player to ever make the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
- Mr. Clutch as he became known signed as an undrafted free agent by the Dallas Cowboys in 1973.
- He went on to an 11-year NFL career and had 489 receptions for 7,822 yards and was selected to the All-Pro team three years.
- Pearson was named to the NFL's 1970s All-Decade team and played on three Super Bowl teams with the Cowboys.

**WHERE TULSA'S FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMERS RANK . . .**

- Tulsa is one of 173 schools with at least one Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee.
- Tulsa has 4 inductees – Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks, Steve Largent and Drew Pearson.
- There are only 21 schools that have 5 or more Pro Football Hall of Fame inductees, and another 10, including Tulsa with 4 inductees.
- Pro Football Hall of Famers from schools in the State of Oklahoma .... Oklahoma (5), Tulsa (4), Oklahoma State (2).
- Here's the count in the American Athletic Conference ... SMU (5), Tulsa (4), Navy (2) and Memphis (1) ... Wichita State, which no longer sponsors football, has one.

### DEFENSE TOTALING UP TACKLES FOR LOSS . . .

- In 12 games, Tulsa's defense has totaled 71 TFL for -220 yards.
- Among Tulsa's total TFL this season, 24 have been credited as sacks for -123 yards.
- A total of 18 players have recorded at least one TFL for lost yards ... tackle Jason Player leads the way with 12.5 TFL for -32 yards, followed by end Cullen Wick with 7.5 for -23 TFL in just six games.
- Tulsa turned in high games of 10 TFL for -31 yards and 6 sacks for -25 yards vs. Arkansas St.
- The Hurricane had nine TFL in each of the first two games, including nine TFL for -20 yards in the season opener against UC Davis and nine TFL for -32 yards at Oklahoma State.

### POWERS, A CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT PICK . . .

- Senior defensive back Bryson Powers was named to CoSIDA Academic All-District® VII football team last week.
- Powers finished his undergraduate degree in mechanical engineering in May 2021 with a 3.72 grade point average ... he is currently working on his master's degree in business.
- He has earned American Athletic Conference academic all-conference honors each season
- For his senior project, he and his group designed a nano brewery that could brew 2 ½ gallons.
- Powers is now eligible to earn CoSIDA Academic All-America honors.

### NOT THE GOOD KIND OF RETURNS . . .

- Tulsa opponents have returned three kicks, one punt and three interceptions for scores this season against the Hurricane.
- Tulsa gave up a kickoff (93) and punt return (63) against Arkansas State, and a kickoff return (100) and interception return (69) by South Florida for touchdowns ... despite the scores, Tulsa won both games.
- Against Oklahoma State, a 98-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter was the difference in a 5-point loss to the Cowboys.
- Opponents average 27.4 points against the Hurricane this season, but only 23.3 of those points has been given up by the defense ... an average of 4.1 points this season for the opposition has come from special teams or defensive returns.

### TWO OF OUR OWN . . .

- Tulsa has scored off an interception and a kickoff return this year as well.
- LB Justin Wright had a 55-yard interception return for a TD against Oklahoma State, and Anthony Watkins had a 97-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the Navy game this season.
- In school history, Tulsa has had 10 more kickoff returns longer than Watkins' 97-yard, including four 100-yarders and six covering 98 yards.

### 500+ IN TOTAL OFFENSE . . .

- Tulsa has gone over 500 yards in total offense in four games and over 400 yards seven times.
- Tulsa gained a season-high 663 yards on 74 plays for a 9.0 average per play against Arkansas State ... the Hurricane gained 343 yards passing and 308 yards on the ground.
- A week before, Tulsa totaled 501 yards against No. 9-ranked Ohio State, throwing for 428 and rushing for 73 yards.
- The last time Tulsa had back-to-back 500+ total offensive games came in 2017 with 667 vs. Louisiana and 548 yards at Toledo.
- The last time Tulsa went over 600 yards in a game came in the 2019 season finale with 669 yards at East Carolina.
- Tulsa also had 535 yards against South Florida and Temple
- Tulsa has now gone over 500 yards in the Philip Montgomery era in 28 games, registering an 19-9 record.

### ON THE OTHER SIDE OF 500 . . .

- In the last 45 games, Tulsa's defense has given up more than 500 total yards just 3 times.
- Two teams — Ohio State and Memphis — have accomplished that feat this year ... OSU gained 508 yards and Memphis had 614 on 99 plays.
- Currently, Ohio State ranks first in the nation for total offense (551.4 ypg) and Memphis is ranked 37th (434.9 ypg)
- The previous 500+ total offensive game in that stretch was by Oklahoma State with 506 yards in 2019.

- Δ The average class size is 20

### QUICK STRIKE . . .

- Tulsa has had seven scoring drives under one minute this season ... three against Arkansas State, two at South Florida and one each vs. Memphis and SMU.
- Against Arkansas State, Tulsa had four scoring drives less than 1:20, including one that covered 1:13 and three drives under one minute.
- Before that game, Tulsa had zero drives under one minute and only four under two minutes.
- Tulsa's three sub-one-minute drives in the ASU game were also one-play drives ... Tulsa scored 21 points in 0:29 on those one-play drives.
- Tulsa scored in 0:12 on an 88-yard pass from Davis Brin to Sam Crawford ... Brin hit JC Santana on a 34-yarder in 0:06 ... Anthony Watkins' 75-yard run took just 0:11 off the clock.
- Tulsa's fourth sub-one-minute scoring drive vs. Memphis came right before halftime, taking only 0:27 off the clock.
- The Hurricane turned in a 4-play scoring drive that took 0:58 off the clock and another one-play, 37-yard drive in 0:06, both at South Florida.
- Against SMU, Tulsa had a 0:18 scoring drive to end the first half and cut the Mustangs first-half lead to 17-14.

### Gadlin Awarded \$10,000 in Tuition from CFP Foundation and Dr Pepper . . .

- Tulsa offensive lineman X'auvea Gadlin was named by the AAC, in partnership with the CFP Foundation, the conference's Go Teach Dr Pepper Tuition Giveaway grand prize recipient.
- Gadlin will receive a \$10,000 scholarship as the conference's winner in addition to a \$2,500 scholarship as Tulsa's institutional nominee.
- The tuition giveaway awards one grand prize from each FBS conference to student-athletes pursuing careers in education.
- On Nov. 23, Gadlin was surprised by the AAC on a zoom call, which he thought was just a normal interview
- Gadlin said, "Great teachers inspire students to become just like them and they can provide life-changing experience for students. Some of the greatest people I've ever known have been my teachers and I just want to be able to give that to students.
- He added, "This lets me know that I'm doing what I'm supposed to be doing and I'm where I'm supposed to be. I am honored and excited to be the recipient."
- Gadlin has played in 28 career games with 21 starts, including seven starts this year at left guard.

### THE WRIGHT CHOICE . . .

- Junior linebacker Justin Wright leads Tulsa in tackles with 77 stops, despite missing the season opener.
- \* Over the last seven games, Wright has totaled 61 tackles, 5.5 TFL for -20 yards, 3.5 sacks for -16 yards, one forced fumble, one PBU, one fumble recovery, one QB hurry and was named the AAC Defensive Player of the Week twice.
- Wright was an AAC honorable mention all-conference selection.
- Against Tulane, Wright totaled 12 tackles, including 10 solos, and had one TFL for -3 yards.
- In a 32-31 win at South Florida, Wright had a team-high 7 tackles, 2.5 TFL for -9 yards and one QB hurry ... he was named the AAC's Defensive Player of the Week for his performance.
- Against Memphis, Wright had a career-high 14 tackles, while adding two TFL for eight yards, one sack for -7 yards and one forced fumble.
- Wright has been in the starting lineup since last year for 20 games and has tallied 132 tackles in those starts ... he has also totaled 14.5 TFL for -43 yards in those 20 starts.
- Earlier this year, Wright had his first career interception, a 55-yard TD return against Oklahoma State.

CB DAVIS AMONG TACKLE LEADERS . . .

- Senior cornerback Tyon Davis ranks third on the Hurricane for tackles with a total of 72 stops, but has a team-high for solos with 59.
He had a career-high 11 tackles twice this year - Arkansas State and Memphis ... Davis had nine solos and two assists vs. ASU and 10 solos and one assist vs. Memphis.
He also has nine pass breakups, which ranks second on the team ... Davis had a career-high three PBUs against South Florida.

FULLER, THE DEFENDER . . .

- Texas A&M transfer Travon Fuller is in his first season at Tulsa and has started all 12 games at cornerback.
Fuller has 40 tackles, including 24 solos, to rank sixth on the team for stops.
The first-year player has a team-high of 10 pass breakups and his three interceptions gives him a team-high 13 passes defended.
He ranks fourth in the AAC with 13 passes defended.
Against Memphis, Fuller had a 44-yard interception return and four pass breakups, while adding four tackles.

JAXON'S A PLAYER . . .

- Senior defensive tackle Jaxon Player has been a solid force for the Tulsa defense since his true freshman season of 2018.
Player has totaled 130 career tackles, 29.5 TFL for -71 yards, 6 sacks for -21 yards, two fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and one PBU in 39 career games.
He has totaled 44 tackles, 12.5 TFL for -32 yards, 3 sacks for -15 sacks, six QB hurries, one PBU, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery this season.
Player ranked fourth on the team in tackles and was third in the AAC for TFL.
Against South Florida with the Bulls leading 31-26 and 3rd-and-1 from their own 42-yard line he and teammate Treyvon Reeves shut down Jaren Mangham for no gain ... on the next play, 4th-and-1 from the same spot, Player made the stop on Mangham again for no gain ... Tulsa took possession at the USF 42 and scored the game-winning TD in a nine-play drive.
Player had four stops and 1.5 TFL for -6 yards in the regular season finale vs. SMU.
Player earned second-team all-conference honors in 2021 and was a first-team all-AAC performer last year.
He was named to the watch lists for the 2021 Chuck Bednarik Award and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, going to college football's top defender.

BRIN NEARING 3,000 PASSING YARDS . . .

- Before this year, Davis Brin's only significant playing time resulted in a 266-yard performance last year against Tulane.
Brin became the 15th different player in school history to surpass 2,000 passing yards in a single season and the 25th time it has happened.
In his 11 career starts, all coming this year, Brin has completed 222-of-377 passes for 2,984 yards and 16 TDs.
He has thrown for over 200 yards in eight of 12 starts, including two games over 350 yards ... he has surpassed 200+ yards in the first half in three games this season.
Brin threw for 355 yards against Arkansas State, giving him his second straight game throwing for over 350 yards ... he also threw for a career-high three TDs in the ASU game, as his TD throws covered 88, 34 and 17 yards.
A week before, Brin had a career-best 428 yards and two TDs against No. 9-ranked Ohio State in just his 7th career game.
The 428 yards is the 11th best passing performance in school history and just the 19th time a Tulsa quarterback went over the 400-yard plateau.
Brin's 31 completions and 54 attempts at OSU were also career highs for the Tulsa junior.
His 428 yards was the most passing yards for a Tulsa quarterback since Dane Evans threw for 421 yards against Memphis on Oct. 23, 2015 against #17 Memphis.

### JJ 15 YARDS AWAY FROM 1,000 RECEIVING YARDS, 21 FROM 2,000 CAREER YARDS . . .

- Josh Johnson enters the Myrtle Beach Bowl needing 15 more yards to hit the 1,000-yard plateau on the season.
- He has caught 75 passes for 985 yards and five TDs, all season highs.
- Johnson would become just the 22nd player in school history to surpass 1,000 receiving yards in a single season.
- He also is just 21 yards shy of reaching the 2,000 career receiving mark at Tulsa ... he would become the 19th receiver in school history to reach 2,000 career yards.
- Johnson currently has 1,979 career yards and 12 TDs on 157 receptions.

### GROUP EFFORT BY RECEIVERS . . .

- With 2,500+ career receiver Keylon Stokes out since the fifth game due to injury, the Hurricane passing game has been a group effort by Tulsa receivers.
- Four Tulsa receivers have combined for eight 100+ receiving games and have also combined for 2,460 yards and 15 TDs on 177 receptions.
- Josh Johnson leads the way with 75 receptions for 985 yards and five TDs, followed by JC Santana with 614 yards and three touchdowns on 45 catches, Sam Crawford Jr. with 472 yards and 4 TDs on 27 receptions and Ezra Naylor II with 30 receptions for 389 yards and three TDs.

### WATKINS BUSTS OUT . . .

- Tulsa runners have 15 runs for 20+ yards this season, while Anthony Watkins has five of those, including the two longest runs from scrimmage.
- Watkins had a 75-yard TD run against Arkansas State and a 78-yard run against Navy.
- He also added the longest kickoff return since 2012 when he took a kickoff against Navy back 97 yards for a touchdown.
- On the year, Watkins averages 7.6 yards (579) on 76 rushing attempts and a 23.1 return average (277 yards) on 12 kickoff returns.
- He is second on the team in rushing with 579 yards and has two 100+ rushing games.

### TULSA HAD TWO MAYO CLINIC COMEBACK POY CANDIDATES WITH YOHANCE BURNETT AND SHAMARI BROOKS . . .

- Tulsa senior linebacker Yohance Burnett and senior running back Shamari Brooks were nominees for the Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Award this season.
- Burnett has suffered two ACL injuries since joining the Tulsa football team from Navarro Junior College in 2018.
- He suffered his first ACL injury to his right knee during the 2018 preseason camp ... last year in preseason camp, Burnett tore his left ACL forcing him to miss his second season in three years.
- Brooks suffered an ACL injury the week prior to the 2020 season opener.
- Ten times during the 2021 college football season, three inspiring student-athletes from all levels of college football who have overcome injury, illness, or other challenges, will be recognized as Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Nominees.

### GRADUATE TRANSFERS DEBUT . . .

- Tulsa had two graduate transfers in the starting lineup defensively in the season opener.
- Jon-Michael Terry, a transfer from Oklahoma, started at linebacker and Texas A&M graduate transfer Travon Fuller was a starting cornerback.
- Terry had nine tackles and one sack for a 3-yard loss against UC Davis.
- Fuller had three tackles, all solos, one TFL for -4 yards and two pass breakups for the Hurricane.
- Fuller started at Oklahoma State and Ohio State, while Terry came off the bench at linebacker in those two contests.
- Before coming to Tulsa, Terry played in 42 games and had eight starts at Oklahoma with 52 tackles ... Fuller played in 40 games at A&M but did not have a start ... he totaled 21 stops in his A&M career.
- Terry has since been sidelined with a season-ending injury. ... in four games, Terry has 15 tackles, two TFL for -5 yards and one sack for -3 yards.
- On the year, Fuller has 40 tackles, 4.5 TFL for -11 yards, 10 pass breakups and three interceptions for 60 return yards in 12 games.

### PRINCE GOES FOR 100+ TWICE . . .

- Junior Deneric Prince opened the season with a career-best 151 yards and one TD against UC Davis.
- He averaged 10.8 yards per carry in the opener with his second career 100+ rushing game.
- Prince also had his second career rushing TD of 55+ yards with a 59-yard touchdown run in the third quarter ... he had a career-long 62-yard TD run last season against USF.
- He had his second 100+ rushing game of the year and third of his career with 110 yards on 19 carries vs. South Florida.
- Prince missed the Houston, Memphis and Cincinnati games.
- In nine games this season, Prince has totaled 480 yards and five TDs on 89 carries for a 5.4 average per carry.

### GRADUATES . . .

- Tulsa had 20 total players this season who already graduated, including 17 who have spent their entire careers at Tulsa.
- There are three graduate transfers among the group of 20 graduates playing this season.
- The offensive players include Abe Anderson (TE), Dante Bivens (OG), Seth Boomer (QB), Dylan Couch (OG), Sam Crawford Jr. (WR), Cannon Montgomery (WR), Ezra Naylor II (WR) and Josh Stewart (WR).
- \* Defensively, the graduates are Yohance Burnett (LB), Tyon Davis (CB), Deven Lamp (DL), TieNeal Martin (S) Bryson Powers (NKL), Treyvon Reeves (LB) Robert Revels III (LB), Jon-Michael Terry (LB), Elijah Taylor (DL) and Cristian Williams (NKL).
- Special Teams players include Adam Higuera (DS) and Zack Long (PK).
- The graduate transfers are Naylor II, Terry and Taylor.
- Bivens, Crawford, Lamp, Terry and Stewart will not play in the bowl game.

### LONGEVITY FOR CRISTIAN . . .

- Tulsa's nickel safety Cristian Williams is in his seventh season in a Tulsa uniform.
- Williams redshirted as a freshman in 2015, played in 13 games in 2016 and 12 in 2017.
- He played in the first two games of the 2018 season and following the second game (Texas), it was revealed that his playing career would come to an end when diagnosed with Arnold Chiari Type 1 malformation.
- He had taken to the whistle helping coach the rest of the season, but in February 2019 decided to have a surgery that could land him back in uniform.
- Williams was cleared to return to the football field in July 2019.
- Since then, he has started all 28 games that he has played in, 12 in 2019, eight in 2020 and eight this season ... Williams missed the Oklahoma State, Ohio State, South Florida and Navy games this year.

### CHRIS PAUL MORE THAN A FOOTBALL PLAYER . . .

- A three-year starter, Chris Paul has started 38 contests in 42 career games played ... he has started games at right tackle, left guard, right guard and left tackle in his career.
- He missed most all of the Tulane game after suffering a first quarter injury and did not play against Temple and SMU.
- Paul earned honorable mention American Athletic Conference accolades this year and was a second-team all-AAC selection in 2020 at right tackle.
- Paul is a member of the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee, a committee he was named to this past July.
- Last February, he was added to the NCAA Committee to Promote Cultural Diversity and Equity (CPCDE).
- Paul also serves as the chairperson of The American's SAAC executive board through the 2021-22 academic year and is the AAC's representative to the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.
- Paul has personified the meaning of student-athlete, excelling academically and athletically while serving the community.
- A top-10 freshman in 2018-19, Paul has volunteered at the Children's Hospital at Saint Francis, Read Across America, Lift Up America and at the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma.

## WHY GOLDEN HURRICANE?

Enter the name Howard Acher as the Tulsa head coach in 1922. When he took over the position, Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Kendall football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was elevated meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from quarterback Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.

- Tulsa has a total of nine players on the offensive line that have at least one college start.
- Only 9 teams in the nation came into the season with 9 or more players with starts, including Minnesota with 10 each ... other schools with 9 are Arkansas State, Florida State, Fresno State, Miami (Fla.), Michigan State, SMU and UTSA.
- Tulsa entered the year with 121 starts among its 9 players on the offensive line, with 110 at Tulsa and 11 by Bryce Bray at Oklahoma State ... among those 9 players, Tulsa now has 161 starts among the offensive linemen.
- Tulsa starts looks like this ... Chris Paul (38), Gerard Wheeler (32), Dylan Couch (29), Tyler Smith (22), X'Zauvea Gadlin (20), Bryce Bray (18, including 11 at OSU), Dante Bivens (16), Tiller Bucktrot (5) and Jaden Muskrat (1).

**NEVER PLAYED FOOTBALL UNTIL COMING TO AMERICA "TULSA" . . .**

- Tulsa punter Lachlan Wilson and place-kicker Zack Long never played American football before coming to Tulsa.
- Long was already attending Tulsa when in the spring of 2019 he decided to give kicking on the collegiate level a try and walked on to the Hurricane roster ... he played prep soccer in Missouri and came to Tulsa in 2017 to attend school.
- Long handled kickoff duties in 2019 and added placements in the 2020 season.
- Long is a graduate student working on his MBA... he was put on scholarship the week of the season opener.
- Wilson came to Tulsa in 2019 from Melbourne, Australia, without a scholarship and redshirted that year before receiving a scholarship.
- He had never played American football, but did play Australian Rules Football for the Heidelberg Football Club.

**HIGUERA LEGACY AS TULSA LONG SNAPPER FOR 9 OF LAST 10 YEARS COMING TO AN END . . .**

- The 2021 season is the fifth straight year that Adam Higuera handles Tulsa's long snapping duties.
- It's the ninth season out of the last 10 that a Higuera has been Tulsa's long snapper.
- Adam's older brother, Rey, was Tulsa's long snapper from 2012-15, playing in 51 career games since starting his first game as a freshman at Iowa State.
- The only year there wasn't a Higuera snapping on placements and punts was in 2016 when those chores were handled by Robert Hill.
- The younger Higuera started his first career game as a true freshman in 2017 at Oklahoma State as he scored a TD in that game on a fumbled punt.
- Adam Higuera has now played in 57 career games.
- A Higuera has handled long snapping duties at Tulsa in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 and now 2021.

**SEVENTH YEAR FOR TWO TULSA PLAYERS . . .**

- Two Tulsa players are in their 7th years of college football — Cristian Williams and graduate transfer Elijah Taylor.
- Williams, a nickel safety, has spent his entire career in a Tulsa uniform, first stepping on campus in 2015 – the first season for Tulsa head coach Philip Montgomery as well.
- Williams is one of only 10 FBS players competing in their 7th season at the same school.
- Others are: Bryce Harris, Toledo, OL ... Jonathon Hodoh, ULM, WR ... Ken Marks, Louisiana, OL ... Danzel McKinley-Lewis, Toledo, WR ... Kyle Pugh, NIU, LB ... Tyrone Riley, NC State, OL ... Ralfs Rusins, Liberty, DL ... Tyrell Smith, VA Tech, OL ... Tre Tipton, Pitt, WR
- Elijah Taylor is in his first year at Tulsa as a graduate transfer and is in his seventh year on a college football roster ... he began his career in 2015 at Notre Dame and played there through the 2017 season.
- Taylor went to Eastern Kentucky and played in 21 games with 49 career tackles from 2018 to 2020.

**1** Zack Long is tied for first in the nation for field goal percentage at 95.0%... all three players tied for first have converted 19-of-20 field goals.

**4** Tulsa has had 4 one-play scoring drives this year ... Tulsa went 88, 34 and 75 yards, all on one play, against Arkansas State ... the Hurricane also scored on a 37-yard pass play on one play at South Florida.

**50** Tulsa has 6 players who have played in 50 career games in a Tulsa uniform — LB Robert Revels III 59, DS Adam Higuera 57, NG Tyarise Stevenson 55, NKL Cristian Williams 54, OL Tiller Bucktrot 52 and LB Treyvon Reeves 52.

**97** Anthony Watkins had a 97-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Navy ... it was the longest kickoff return since Raymond's Taylor's 67-yard return on Oct. 7, 2016 against SMU ... it was the first KO return for a TD since Oct. 6, 2012 when Trey Watts had a 95-yard return against Marshall.

**428** Davis Brin's career-best 428 passing yards against #9 Ohio State is the 11th highest individual passing game in school history.

### FIVE OR MORE . . .

- Tulsa has a total of 10 players playing in at least their fifth season, including 7 at Tulsa and 3 graduate transfers.
- NKL Cristian Williams has now played in 6 seasons after redshirting in 2015.
- LB Robert Revels III has now also played games in 6 seasons ... he received a medical redshirt season in 2018 after playing in 2 games.
- The players who are in their sixth years, but playing in their fifth seasons after a redshirt year are OL Tiller Bucktrot, LB Treyvon Reeves, DL Tyarise Stevenson and graduate transfer Jon-Michael Terry ... graduate transfer Travon Fuller was at Texas A&M for 5 years and played 4 years ... WR Josh Stewart would have been in the same situation but suffered a season-ending injury in preseason.
- \* Fifth-year returnees, DS Adam Higuera and WR Keylon Stokes, did not redshirt as true freshmen and have now played in 5 seasons.

### FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICAN TYLER SMITH BACK FOR SOPHOMORE SEASON . . .

- Sophomore left tackle Tyler Smith started all nine games in 2020 as a redshirt freshman and ended up earning Freshman All-America honors by the FWA and The Athletic.
- Smith was also an American Athletic Conference first-team selection.
- In the AAC Championship game at No. 6 Cincinnati, Smith perhaps had his best game when he graded 94 percent on 72 offensive snaps.
- Smith missed the 2021 season opener, but returned to start at left tackle at Oklahoma State and has started the last 11 games.
- Smith was named second-team all-AAC this season.

### DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT SINCE MOVING TO 3-3-5 . . .

- Since the 2018 season when Tulsa's defense transitioned to the 3-3-5 scheme, the Hurricane has shown immense improvement since the 2017 campaign.
- In that first season of the 3-3-5, Tulsa held opponents to 121.2 yards less in total offense, 89.3 yards less in passing, 31.9-yards less in rushing and 10.4 less points.
- The Hurricane finished that 2018 season ranked 8th in NCAA for fewest passing yards allowed, 10th for 4th down conversions, 22nd for fumbles recovered, 41st for pass efficiency defense and 44th for red zone defense.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, Tulsa has allowed only three of its last 45 opponents over 500 yards of total offense as compared to 7 games in 2017 (506 yards by OSU in 2019; Ohio State 508 yards and 614 yards by Memphis, both in 2021).
- In 2019, Tulsa held the opposition to 394.8 yards of total offense, which was the first sub-400+ yearly offensive total since the 2012 season (347.8 ypg).
- Tulsa allowed 333.6 yards in 2020 which was the fewest for an opposing offense since 296.8 yards in 2006.
- In the 2020 season, Tulsa's defense ranked among the nation's best — 18th for passing yards and 19th for total defense.

### WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).
- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.
- Four former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks, Steve Largent and Drew Pearson
- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.
- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium and dedicated before the 2013 spring game.
- Zaven Collins may have staked claim to the greatest Tulsa football player when the consensus All-America linebacker was also named college football's top defender in 2020 by winning the Chuck Bednarik and Bronko Nagurski awards.
- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.
- Other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.
- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears and Tampa Bay Buccaneers).
- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).

### A LOOK AT TULSA'S CONFERENCE HISTORY

- Tulsa is in its 7th season as a member of the American Athletic Conference
- Tulsa began its membership in The American on July 1, 2014 after nine years as a member of Conference USA.
- Tulsa opened its' tenure in the American Athletic Conference with a 38-31 double overtime victory against Tulane in the 2014 season opener.
- The American is the sixth conference affiliation for the Tulsa football program, while the previous five include: Oklahoma Collegiate Conference (1914-28), Big Four Conference (1929-32), Missouri Valley Conference (1935-85), Western Athletic Conference (1996-2004) and Conference USA (2005-13).
- Tulsa was an independent for 12 years, coming between the Missouri Valley and its entrance into the WAC in 1996.
- In nine years as a C-USA member, Tulsa compiled a 49-23 regular season league record and a 2-2 mark in C-USA Championship Games – Tulsa was 2-1 against UCF in C-USA title games and 0-1 against East Carolina, both now members of the American Athletic Conference.
- Tulsa made its first AAC Championship game appearance in 2020, falling to No. 6-ranked Cincinnati 27-24 on a field goal as time expired.

The "Juju" hat debuted in Tulsa's 42-13 win over USF. The hat is used as a reward for scoring a touchdown and any other game-turning play.

UC Davis 19, Tulsa 17

Sept. 2, 2021 (Thursday) • H.A. Chapman Stadium

TULSA, Okla. — Three turnovers and 122 yards in penalties was enough to seal defeat for the Tulsa Golden Hurricane on a Thursday night against the FCS' 23rd-ranked UC Davis Aggies by a score of 19-17 at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

The Aggies scored its lone touchdown on the game's opening possession and were held to four field goals the remainder of the game. Tulsa scored on a 41-yard Zack Long field goal, a one-yard run by Steven Anderson and a 59-yard rush by Deneric Prince.

Prince ended the contest with a game-high 151 yards, while Shamari Brooks added 80 yards as the Hurricane outgained UC Davis on the ground 247 yards to 88. UC Davis did its damage through the air, collecting 311 yards.

Tulsa held a 448 to 399-yard edge in total offense. The Aggies converted 10-of-19 third downs, while Tulsa managed just 2-of-10 on third downs.

The Hurricane threatened to take control of the game several times but turnovers came at the UC Davis 18, 47 and 8-yard line.

With the score tied 10-10 at halftime, Tulsa's opening second-half drive went just 13 yards in six plays. The Aggies took its possession 87 yards in nine plays and took a 13-10 lead on an Isaiah Gomez's 22-yard field goal. Tulsa wasted little time in taking the lead, scoring 1:20 later, when Deneric Prince raced 59 yards for a touchdown, capping a 4-play, 78-yard drive.

UC Davis cut Tulsa's lead to one point, 17-16, on Gomez's third field goal of the night with 11:09 remaining.

The Aggies second interception put the ball at the Tulsa 5-yard line, and again the Hurricane defense bowed up and held UC Davis to three points, but it was enough for the visitors to take a two-point lead at 19-17 with 7:35 remaining in the contest.

Tulsa took the subsequent possession 74 yards in eight plays to the UCD 12-yard line when Keylon Stokes hauled in a reception at the 8-yard line but a forced fumble saw the ball bounce out of the end zone, thus ending any Tulsa scoring opportunity.

Oklahoma State 28, Tulsa 23

STILLWATER, Okla. — Tulsa made it a five-point game with three minutes remaining in the contest but fell 28-23 to the Oklahoma State Cowboys in the Bank of Oklahoma Turnpike Classic.

Tulsa held the Cowboys to just seven points in the first 45 minutes, but the home team scored 21 in the fourth quarter to claim its ninth straight series win in front of 52,127 fans at Boone Pickens Stadium.

The Hurricane took a 17-14 lead at the 10:56 mark on the game clock, but OSU returned the kickoff 98 yards to take a four-point lead, 21-17. The Cowboys added another score for an 11-point lead before the Hurricane cut the deficit to single digits with a 75-yard, seven-play drive with just over three minutes to play.

It was a game expected to be dominated by the defense and that's exactly what happened for the first 40 minutes Saturday afternoon. After totaling just 224 yards and 14 points between them in the first 30 minutes, the two teams combined for 37 points and 395 yards in the second half.

For the second straight week the Tulsa offense out-gained its opponent as the Hurricane put up 347 yards to OSU's 313. Davis Brin completed 19-of-27 passes for 224 yards, while rushing for a team-high 37 yards. JuanCarlos Santana caught four passes for 61 yards and Sam Crawford Jr. was next with three receptions for 57 yards.

## GAME 3

Ohio State 41, Tulsa 20  
Sept. 18, 2021 • Ohio Stadium

**COLUMBUS, Ohio** — Tulsa had the No. 9-ranked Ohio State Buckeyes on the ropes late in the fourth quarter before the home team added two scores in the final three minutes for a 41-20 victory at Ohio Stadium.

The Hurricane amassed 501 total yards with 428 of those coming through the air. Davis Brin completed 31-of-54 yards and added two touchdown tosses.

TreVeyon Henderson led the Ohio State offense with 277 rushing yards and three touchdowns, but the heralded Buckeyes receiving corps was held intact with only 185 yards through the air.

Ohio State led 13-6 at halftime, but Henderson put some separation on the scoreboard with a 48-yard scamper on the Buckeyes' first second-half possession to give the home team a 20-6 lead.

The Hurricane scored its first TD of the game when Brin connected with Cannon Montgomery on a 21-yard catch and run to cut its deficit to seven points at 20-13, capping a 48-yard, 5-play drive with one minute remaining in the third quarter. But, the Buckeyes relied on their offensive star of the day when Henderson tallied his third rushing TD with a 52-yard jaunt to put the Buckeyes up by a score of 27-13.

**TULSA, Okla.** — Tulsa put up over 600 yards of total offense and the defense had two takeaways in a 41-34 win over Arkansas State in front of 14,881 fans at H.A. Chapman Stadium. Tulsa put up its first win for a 1-3 record and ASU fell to 1-3 on the season.

Three of Tulsa's touchdowns came in a span of 29 seconds, as the scores covered 88, 34 and 75 yards and all coming on the first play from scrimmage.

Tulsa ended the first half by scoring 17 points in the final 3:23 to take a 24-14 lead into the locker room at halftime. The Hurricane began the second half with a 6-play, 75-yard scoring drive as Brin threw his third touchdown of the day, a 17-yarder to Sam Crawford for a 31-14 lead.

The two teams combined for three scores in a 25-second frame in the third quarter. ASU scored on a 76-yard, 6-play drive at the 10:34 mark, followed by Tulsa's Anthony Watkins going 75 yards on the first play from scrimmage to score with 10:23 on the clock. At 10:09, ASU's Alan Lamar took back the kickoff 93 yards to make the score 38-28. A-State added a field goal in the quarter to make the score 38-31 at the end of three.

Tulsa controlled the ball for 12:25 of the fourth quarter and split field goals with the Red Wolves. After Arkansas State made the score 41-34 on a 50-yard field goal, Tulsa's offense ran out the final 6:34 for the victory.

For the 10th time in the Philip Montgomery era, Tulsa tallied more than 600 yards with 663 total yards and for the 14th time the Hurricane rushed for over 300 yards under Montgomery. Tulsa improved to 20-5 in the Montgomery era when scoring over 40 points.

The Hurricane defense totaled season-highs of 10 TFL for -31 yards and six sacks for -25 yards, while recording its second straight game with a season-high of two takeaways.

**TULSA, Okla.** — Tulsa scored 21 second-half points and held off a late Memphis drive to claim a 35-29 victory in front of a Homecoming crowd of 17,593 fans at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

NEW ORLEANS, La. — Shamari Brooks scored on a 15-yard run in overtime to give Tulsa a 20-13 victory over the Tulane Green Wave in front of 22,784 fans at Yulman Stadium.

Tulsa improved to 4-6 overall and 3-3 in American Athletic Conference action, while Tulane fell to 1-9 and 0-6. The Hurricane improved to 11-6 in school history for overtime games, 3-0 over Tulane and is now 6-1 under Montgomery in the extra session games.

Brooks ended the game with 71 rushing yards, while Ezra Naylor II led Tulsa receivers with 62 yards on seven catches, as both players scored Tulsa's touchdowns. Defensively, Justin Wright had 12 tackles, 10 solos and one TFL for -3 yards and Jaxon Player tallied four solo tackles, three TFL for -8 yards and two sacks for -3 yards.

Ahead 13-3 late in the contest, Tulsa was looking to close out the game, but a Tulane offense that was stagnant all night, thanks to the Hurricane defensive unit, came to life. The Green Wave marched 95 yards in four plays and just 0:57 to make the score 13-10. Tulane recovered the onside kick and settled for the game-tying field goal on 4th-and-goal from the Tulsa six-yard line.

Now tied 13-13, Tulsa threw its third interception of the game with one minute on the game clock. Tulane took over from the Tulsa 24-yard line and looked to get an apparent come-from-behind victory but Merek Glover's 26-yard field goal missed wide right, thus forcing overtime.

Tulane won the overtime coin toss and elected to play defense first. It took the Hurricane just four plays to cross the goal line with Brooks carrying for the final 15 yards and a 20-13 lead after the Long's PAT.

As they did most of the day, the Hurricane defense stopped Tulane's opportunity to force a second OT when a Michael Pratt pass was broken up by Tyon Davis and fell incomplete on the 4th-and-10 play, securing the victory for Tulsa.

Tulsa's defense held the Green Wave offense to just 139 yards on its first 12 drives before Tulane's offense woke up to pick up 154 yards on 11 plays on its two late fourth quarter scoring drives.

### Tulsa 44, Temple 10

**TULSA, Okla.** — Tulsa scored a season-high for points in its 44-10 home finale victory over the Temple Owls Saturday afternoon in front of 16,731 fans at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

The Hurricane scored on its first four possessions for a 20-0 lead and five of its six first-half possessions to take a 27-0 lead over the Owls at halftime. Tulsa out-gained the Owls 513 to 293 yards for the game, while gaining 297 through the air and 216 yards on the ground.

The Hurricane defense held Temple to 2-of-14 on third downs and 2-of-5 on fourth downs for the game.

To open the game, Tulsa's offense marched down the field on its first possession and put the ball across the goal line for the second straight week on its opening drive. Davis Brin threw the final 21 yards of a seven-play, 83-yard drive to JC Santana for the score.

The Hurricane made the score 10-3 on a Zack Long 44-yard field goal, capping a 73-yard, 12-play drive on Tulsa's second possession.

Tulsa scored on its third straight possessions going 69 yards in 14 plays as Brin threw the final eight yards to Josh Johnson for the score. Zack Long added a 47-yard field goal on Tulsa's next possession to cap a seven-yard, 42-yard drive and put the Hurricane ahead 20-0 with 8:52 left in the first half.

At halftime, the Hurricane out-gained Temple 306 to 98 total yards, while Brin threw for over 200 yards in in the first 30 minutes for the third time this season.

Temple capitalized on a Tulsa fumble, marching 65 yards for a field goal to make the score 27-3. Tulsa went ahead 34-3 on a Brin one-yard run and added a field goal and Deneric Prince TD run after Temple scored their 10th point.

## GAME 12

### Tulsa 34, SMU 31

Nov. 27, 2021 • Gerald J. Ford Stadium

**DALLAS, Texas** — Trailing 17-0, the Tulsa Golden Hurricane had its fourth comeback win of the season and 20th in the Philip Montgomery era with a 34-31 victory over the SMU Mustangs at Gerald J. Ford Stadium.

Tulsa improved to 6-6 on the season to become bowl eligible and 5-3 in the American Athletic Conference.

SMU jumped out to a 17-0 lead early in the second quarter, but the Hurricane cut its deficit to three points by halftime (17-14) with two touchdowns in the final 66 seconds.

The first Tulsa score came on a 10-play, 89-yard drive that was capped by an Anthony Watkins' seven-yard run. After the Hurricane defense held the Mustangs to a 3-and-out in taking just 0:27 off the clock, Tulsa's offense took over possession at the 50-yard line with 0:18 left before the half and Brin threw 32 yards to Josh Johnson for Tulsa's second straight touchdown.

The second half opened with Tulsa taking the kickoff 75 yards in nine plays for a 21-17 lead as Prince scored from one yard out.

With SMU marching, Tulsa's Travon Fuller intercepted a Tanner Mordecai pass, Fuller's third of the season, and took it 16 yards to the Tulsa 40-yard line, where the Hurricane offense took possession. However, a tipped throw by Brin was intercepted and gave SMU possession at their own 40-yard line.

Tulsa's defense stopped SMU on 4th-and-3, while the Tulsa offense went 47 yards in four plays as true freshman Braylon Braxton scored his first career touchdown on a nine-yard run to give Tulsa a 28-17 lead.

Tulsa went 53 yards in 13 plays on its next possession and scored on a 36-yard Zack Long field goal for a 14-point Hurricane lead at 31-17. The Mustangs responded to get within a touchdown at 31-24 with 11:00 remaining.

Long knocked through his second field goal of the game with a 27-yarder at the 4:06 mark for a 34-24 lead before SMU responded with a 69-yard drive to make the score 34-31.
