#### ODU Travels to FIU

> Old Dominion lost its seventh-straight game, falling to Florida Atlantic 41-3 last Saturday. The Monarchs dropped to 1-7 on the year. FIU lost at Middle Tennessee 50-17, dropping to 4-4 overall and 2-3 in Conference USA.

> Junior quarterback Messiah deWeaver started for the second-straight game, completing 15-of-29 passes for 134 yards and an interception. The 134 yards is a career-high.

> Wide receiver Eric Kumah registered career highs in both receptions and yards, catching 10 passes for 99 yards. Of his 10 catches, seven went for first downs.

> Jordan Young led the defense with a game-high 10 tackles and a tackle for loss.

> Kaleb Ford-Dement registered a career-best seven tackles and notched his second interception of the season.

> Bobby Wilder is 77-52 in his 11th year as head coach at Old Dominion.

Bobby Wilder begins his 13th season as head coach at Old Dominion University. Wilder, the only coach in program history, grew the football program from the best FCS start-up to an FBS program in just six years and an FBS bowl champion in eight years. Hired on February 13, 2007, Wilder led the Monarchs to a 17-5 record in the first two seasons in program history, a 2012 Colonial Athletic Association Championship, a bowl championship and a win over Virginia Tech in his first 10 seasons as the only head coach of the football program.

quarterbacks to throw 30 or more touchdown passes and five or less interceptions (Zach Terrell/Western Michigan).

Wilder is the 11th longest tenured head coach in FBS and the second longest in Conference USA (Rick Stockstill, Middle Tennessee). Wilder has led the Monarchs to a 76-45 record in nine seasons, two playoff appearances and the program's first bowl game in 2016.

The Monarchs made an immediate splash in their first season in Conference USA, defeating the defending C-USA Champions Rice in the first conference game in school history. Wilder led ODU to a 6-6 overall record and went 4-4 in league play, including winning three-straight games to end the season.

In the summer of 2018, Wilder was inducted into the Maine Sports Hall of Fame. The induction into the hall of fame was not only due to Wilder's coaching prowess, however, the 30-year coaching veteran was a multi-sport athlete in high school in Madison, Maine, earning All-State honors in football and basketball, before starring at the University of Maine. Wilder graduated as the school's all-time leader in passing.

Wilder led the Monarchs to a school-record 11-2 mark in 2012.

Under Wilder's tutelage, the Monarchs led the FCS in scoring offense, total offense and passing offense in 2012 as the Monarchs won the Colonial Athletic Association Championship in their final season in the FCS. In the always tough CAA, ODU defeated four ranked opponents and was ranked in the top-10 all season.

Wilder led the Monarchs to one of the biggest upsets in college football history, with a 49-35 triumph over Virginia Tech on Sept. 22 in Norfolk. The win was ODU's first over a ranked FBS program and the first over an ACC foe. Quarterback Blake LaRussa threw for 495-yards, the second most ever allowed by a tech defense.

ODU earned the No. 4 national seed in the FCS Playoffs, advanced to the quarterfinals and ranked No. 6 in the final "The Sports Network" and coaches polls.

The Monarchs made national headlines twice more in 2018, as ODU and WKU had a finish never seen before in college football. It involved three untimed downs, an Isaiah Harper 83-yard return on a missed field goal and a 26-yard game-winning field goal by Nick Rice to give ODU a 37-34 victory on the third and final untimed down.

Top honors were not just awarded to Wilder's players, as Wilder was named American Football Monthly Coach of the Year and CaptainU Coach of the Year. In 2011, the Monarchs concluded the year at 10-3 overall and ranked No. 10 in The Sports Network/Fathead.com and FCS Coaches Final Polls, the fastest climb to the top-10 of any start-up program. In the first season of conference play in the Colonial Athletic Association, considered by many the toughest FCS conference in the nation, ODU went 6-2 against league opponents. Picked to finish 10th in the CAA Preseason Poll, ODU ended the year in a tie for second place in the CAA, a conference which sent five teams to the post-season. The Monarchs were among those five teams advancing to the FCS playoffs where they defeated MEAC Champions Norfolk State in first round action and advanced to the second round of the playoffs against Georgia Southern in one of the most thrilling games of the Division I Football Championships.

In the second to last game at Foreman Field, ODU fell behind North Texas 28-0, but came from behind to top the Mean Green 34-31. Travis Fulgham had 155 receiving yards and true freshman Lala Davis scored the game-winner from a yard out with 15 seconds left to lift the Monarchs to another improbable victory.

Wilder and his staff's inaugural season of play at the Football Championship Subdivision level went well beyond expectations. From the celebrated kickoff versus Chowan, to the heart pounding first FCS road victory against Jacksonville, to ensuring a winning season at Savannah State, to extending the win-streak to six in the season finale at VMI, history was made every step of the way. The Monarchs concluded the 2009 season at 9-2 overall.

For the first time in its 10-year history, the Monarchs sent players to the Reese's Senior Bowl, the nation's premier senior all-star football game, as Oshane Ximines and Travis Fulgham played in the game. Fulgham and Ximines also became the first teammates to be invited to the NFL Scouting Combine, as ODU double their participation in the combine to four.

Prior to his arrival at ODU, Wilder served on the Maine staff for 17 years and was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator in 2000, before moving to associate head coach in 2001.

ODU had five players on the All-Conference USA squad, including Oshane Ximines has a back-to-back first-team All-C-USA defensive end, and Isaiah Harper as a two-time first-team kick returner. Jonathan Duhart and Travis Fulgham earned second-team All-C-USA honors at wide receiver, while Harper was named second-team punter returner, and quarterback Blake LaRussa earned honorable mention accolades.

Wilder was named the Assistant Coach of the Year by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston in 2004, which is presented annually to the top assistant coach in New England.

Wilder led the Monarchs to a 10-3 record and a 24-20 win over Eastern Michigan in the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl. ODU landed a bowl game in their eighth season of football and just second season of bowl eligibility. ODU was one of 26 FBS programs to total 10 or more wins in the 2016-17 season. The Monarchs won nine of their last 10 games and finished the season on a six-game winning streak, tied for the sixth longest winning streak in the country.

A 1987 graduate of Maine with a degree in physical education, Wilder captained the Black Bears to the Yankee Conference Championship his senior year. An All-New England quarterback in 1985, he left Maine as the school's all-time leading passer with 4,493 yards, and is currently sixth behind Mike Buck, Emilio Colon, Fein, Eaton and Whitcomb on the career passing list. Wilder coached four of those former players and played with the fifth.

The Monarchs finished in the top-10 in the country in six categories, including second only to Western Michigan in fewest turnovers with just 10. ODU tied for fourth in FBS with a +13 turnover margin. Wilder helped guide quarterback David Washington to one of just two FBS

Upon graduation, Wilder served as a graduate assistant coach for two seasons under Jack Bicknell at Boston College, where he earned his master's degree in educational administration in 1990.

## Monarchs Defeat Norfolk State, 24-21 in Season Opener

**NORFOLK, Va.** - Quarterback Stone Smartt's 31-yard pass to Eric Kumah in the final minutes set up a La La Davis game-winning touchdown as Old Dominion rallied past Norfolk State (0-1), 24-21, Saturday night in front of a sellout crowd of 21,944 at the new Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Old Dominion (1-0) jumped out to an early lead behind touchdown runs from Kesean Strong and Smartt, which gave the Monarchs a 14-0 lead after the first quarter. The Spartans answered in the second quarter with a 57-yard Da'Kendall James touchdown. ODU led at the half, 14-6.

Nick Rice opened the second half with a 26-yard field goal to expand the Monarch lead. The Spartans responded with back-to-back touchdowns to take a 21-17 lead with 5:56 remaining.

Smartt handed the ball to Davis, whose touchdown run gave the Monarchs a 24-21 lead with 3:21 remaining.

The Spartans final drive ended with an interception by ODU's Lance Boykin, which clinched the Monarchs first victory in the new stadium. ODU did a \$67.5 million renovation in that last nine months in which the two sets of sideline seats were demolished and replaced with two decks of seating on both sides.

Smartt, in his first career start as a Monarch, finished with 158 passing yards and completed 17-of-23 passes. Davis led the ODU ground game with 62 yards. Monarch newcomer Kumah finished with four receptions for 65 yards.

Defensively, Marcus Haynes and Juwan Ross picked up key sacks on the Spartan quarterback. Lawrence Garner and Geronda Hall led the team with eight tackles.

The Monarchs travel to Virginia Tech on September 7 at 12 p.m. The Monarchs upset the No. 13 ranked Hokies last season, 49-35.

## Monarchs Fall at Virginia Tech, 31-17

**BLACKSBURG, Va.** - A young and inexperienced Old Dominion football team kept it close against Virginia Tech Saturday, and barring a few miscues, might have won.

ODU was only down a touchdown after the Monarchs scored on consecutive second-half drives to trim what had been a 24-3 margin to 24-17 with 13 minutes to go.

But then the Hokies scored quickly after a 71-yard kickoff return by Terius Whitley, and held ODU on downs on its next four drives, to claim a 31-17 victory over the Monarchs.

The game was a rematch of ODU's stunning, 49-35, victory over the then No. 13 Hokies last season in one of the last games at Foreman Field. Coach Bobby Wilder called that the biggest victory in ODU's 10 years of football.

No such upset was in the cards this year for the Monarchs, who lost more than 30 players from last season, have 47 players who hadn't played a down for ODU and had 13 new starters in last week's 24-21 victory over Norfolk State.

Tech (1-1) also lost a number of players, but was picked to finish third in the ACC Coastal Division and was a 28-point favorite over the Monarchs.

While ODU (1-1) didn't win, the Monarchs showed they can be competitive with an ACC team on the road. And that's good news for a team that is so inexperienced and was picked to finish sixth or last, depending on the prognosticator, in the Conference USA East Division.

Following a solid performance against Norfolk State, quarterback Stone Smartt showed flashes of brilliance against Tech. He keyed both second-half touchdown drives with smart decision-making and an accurate arm. He passed for 43 yards and ran for 18 more, including a 3-yard run for a touchdown, to key a 75-yard TD drive that narrowed the lead to 24-10.

ODU's defense then held Tech on downs for the second time of the game, and the Monarchs took just 1:35 to score. Kesean Strong and Smartt opened the drive with long runs – 26 for Smartt and 33 Strong. Smartt then finished off the drive with a 15-yard run that cut the lead to 24-17.

The back to back touchdowns quieted what had been a raucous crowd of 57,282. Meanwhile, chants of "ODU, ODU" could be heard from the Monarch faithful seated in the nosebleed seats at Lane Stadium.

But Wheatley returned the ensuing kickoff 71 yards, and the Hokies took just three plays to score on 13-yard pass from Ryan Willis to Phil Patterson.

Smartt completed 16 of 30 passes for 122 yards and rushed for 48 more. Lala Davis led the Monarchs in rushing with 81 yards.

Wilder has often said there are no moral victories in football and said there was no celebrating in the ODU locker room.

"We're disappointed that we lost," he said. "When we got it down to 24-21, we had all the momentum. This is a game we could have won. But then we didn't get the kickoff in the right spot and they get the kickoff return.

## Game Three Recap - Virginia 28 Old Dominion 17

### ODU Jumps Out Early, Falls to UVA, 28-17

**CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va.** - This was not a game that Old Dominion was expected to win, nor a game which was expected to be competitive. But the Monarchs played with heart and went toe-to-toe with the University of Virginia physically. And for much of the game, the Monarchs appeared to be the better team.

But ODU committed critical mistakes, and simply could not move the ball in the second half, as the Cavaliers rallied from a 17-0 deficit to down the Monarchs, 28-17, in a game nationally televised on ESPN2.

The score was in itself a bit of an upset. ODU was a four-touchdown underdog and for much of the game, appeared to be on the way to its second victory in two years over a ranked in-state ACC opponent. ODU stunned then 13th-ranked Virginia Tech, 49-35, last September.

In both games, ESPN gave the Monarchs a 1.8 percent chance of winning.

ODU (1-2) led 17-7 Saturday night at the half, largely because of its stalwart defense and Stone Smartt's accurate throwing arm. However, U.Va. opened the second half by blitzing ODU on every down and Monarchs simply had no answer.

"We simply could not block them in the third and fourth quarter," coach Bobby Wilder said.

It was the second loss to an in-state ACC team on the road, and in both games, it was competitive late in the fourth quarter. ODU lost at Virginia Tech, 31-17, two weeks ago.

The game's key play came five minutes into the third quarter. Smartt was being rushed out of the pocket and tossed an ill-thrown pass directly into the arms of linebacker Zane Zandler, who returned it 22 yards for a touchdown. That trimmed ODU's lead to 17-14.

As ODU's offense was being stymied, so was Virginia's. The Cavs were held on downs on their first two possessions and Keion White, a tight end turned bandit, blocked a 37-yard field goal attempt on the third.

"I felt like he was the best player on the field, for either team," Wilder said of White, who had six tackles, including a sack and 3 1/1 tackles for a loss. Early in the third quarter, U.Va. began blocking him with two players, to little avail.

U.Va. finally took its first lead after ODU failed to make a first down on fourth down and short at its own 29.

The Cavs rolled 29 yards to for a TD, with Wayne Taulapapa rolling into the end zone for a 7-yard TD rush.

U.Va. (4-0) then put the game virtually out of reach with 7:33 to play on a 25-yard TD pass from Bryce Perkins to Joe Reed.

The Monarchs stunned a Scott Stadium crowd of 44,573 in the first quarter by totally dominating play, offensively and defensively.

ODU's Blake Watson returned the opening kickoff 90 yards to the U.Va. 4, but that was negated by a holding penalty. Undaunted, the Monarchs drove 74 yards in 7:22 and took an early 3-0 lead on a 21-yard Nick Rice field goal.

The defense then held the Cavs on downs and ODU's offense marched 48 yards in 5 plays with Smartt rushing 10 yards for the touchdown. The Monarchs led, 10-0, heading in the second quarter.

After the defense held U.Va. on downs again, the Monarchs drove 89 yards in nine plays, with Smartt finding Matt Geiger for a 47-yard touchdown pass.

Although Smartt threw a good pass, this was Geiger's TD, as he broke a tackle and juke some defenders and strolled into the end zone making it 17-0 ODU with 10:40 left.

But as was the case in ODU's loss at Virginia Tech two weeks ago, poor tackling on the ensuing kick finally gave the Cavaliers some life. Reed returned the kickoff 57 yards to the ODU 33, and the Cavaliers score quickly, with Perkins rolling out to pass, and then eluding three tackles for a 8-yard TD run with 7 minutes left.

ODU's defense not only held the Cavaliers to three touchdowns, the Monarchs limited the Cavs to 244 yards and Perkins to 175 yards passing and 35 rushing yards. That's the least total yards ODU has allowed against a Power 5 school.

ODU next plays Saturday night against East Carolina at 6 p.m. at Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

## Game Four Recap · ECU 24 ODU 21

### ODU Falls to ECU, 24-21

**NORFOLK, Va.** - It was tantalizingly close.

Old Dominion University's football team pulled within three points of East Carolina with a little more than two minutes left when Kesean Strong leaped over a pair of ECU defenders for a one-yard touchdown run. Quarterback Stone Smartt, who set up the touchdown with a 45 yard pass, then passed to Chris Cunningham for the 2-point conversion..

But ODU's attempted onside kick was recovered by the ECU's C.J. Johnson and the Pirates used good time management to run out the clock and claim a 24-21 victory Saturday night at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Smartt played well for ODU, completing 20 of 30 passes for 203 yards and two interceptions and rushing 22 times for 76 more.

"I thought Stone played a gutsy game," coach Bobby Wilder said. "He was courageous. He got hit a on a regular basis and he never backed down. He completed 67 percent of his passes and if you take out the sacks, he rushed for more than 100 yards.

"We're going to win a lot of games with him at quarterback. He's a good player and proved how tough he was out there."

ODU trailed, 17-3, at the half, but quickly began to whittle down the ECU advantage.

After ODU went three and out on its first drive, ECU's Tyler Snead muffed the punt and it was recovered by ODU's Demetrius Stitmon at the 36. Five plays later, Smartt was rushed from the pocket and ran 5 yards for the touchdown. Nick's Rice's conversation kick narrowed the lead to 17-10.

Minutes later, linebacker Jordan Young intercepted a pass and ran it to the ECU 47, setting up another Rice field goal, this one from 39 yards, narrowing the Pirates' lead to 17-13.

But ECU then expanded the lead to 11 on a 75-yard, 8-play drive in which Ahlers completed 4 of 5 passes for 54 yards, including a 5-yarder to Anthony Watley for the touchdown with 10:40 left in the half that expanded the lead to 24-13.

In the first half, East Carolina scored first on a 29-yard field goal which was matched minutes late when Rice booted a 26-yarder for ODU.

Then, 12 minutes into the first quarter, came the first of two huge first-half breaks for ECU.

As ODU was attempting to punt deep in its own territory, Warren Saba rushed through an empty lane and blocked Bailey Cate's put, and pounced on it in the end zone.

Then two minutes into the second quarter, ECU wide receiver Blake Proehl got open on single coverage and quarterback Holton Ahlers found him for a 72-yard touchdown that gave ECU a 17-3 lead.

After ODU's Geronda Hall intercepted a pass and returned it to the 10, ECU then got its second big break.

On third and goal from the 1, Smartt appeared the carry the ball just beyond the end zone and fumble. The officials ruled it a fumble, recovered by ECU, and the call stood after the replay.

Hasaan Patterson led the Monarchs with a career-high four catches for 41 yards, while Strong had four receptions fo 33 yards.

Lawrence Garner had a game-high 10 tackles for ODU.

It was the Conference USA opener and the fourth loss in a row for ODU (1-4, 0-1 C-USA).

ODU's defense held the Hilltoppers at bay until late in the fourth quarter when the Monarchs ran out of gas.

WKU almost totally shut down ODU's offense in the first half, as the Monarchs gained just 59 yards. Even though the defense twice forced turnovers in Hilltopper territory, the Monarchs came away with just three points on a Nick Rice field goal and WKU led, 10-3.

Western Kentucky extended the lead to 13-3 on their first drive in second half with a 32-yard, Cory Munson field goal.

ODU's first play in the second half was a 29-yard pass from Smartt to Nigel Fitzgerald, and the Monarchs then drove to the 25. But on first down a short gain was negated by a blindside block, moving the Monarchs back to the 40. Nick Rice then missed a 51-yard field goal.

On its next drive, ODU drove from its 47 to the WKU 32. A fourth-down 11-yard pass from Smartt to Fitzgerald appeared to give ODU a first down. But it was nullified by a holding penalty and the Monarchs were forced to punt.

ODU never got close to the end zone thereafter, and the Hilltoppers put the game out of reach midway through the fourth quarter on a 12-yard pass from quarterback Ty Storey to Joshua Simon.

ODU finished with 160 yards, its third worst offensive game ever. Smartt completed 11 of 27 passes for 105 yards.

Wide receiver Eric Kumah, ODU's top offensive playmaker, and offensive tackle Nick Saldiveri missed the second game in a row with injuries. It isn't known when they will return.

Tailback Lala Davis, who missed last week's loss at East Carolina, played sparingly.

ODU took a 3-0 lead thanks to two turnovers forced by the Monarch defense.

Harrell Blackmon intercepted a Ty Storey pass at the 36 and returned it 22 yards to give the Monarchs a first and 10 at the 14.

Three plays later Smartt was sacked at the 35 and WKU's Jaylon George scooped the ball up after he Smartt hit the ground ran untouched for what he thought was a touchdown. But replay officials ruled Smartt was down and the Monarchs punted.

Four plays into WKU's next possession, linebacker Lawrence Garner forced running back Gaej Walker to fumble and Geronda Hall recovered at the 16. ODU was force to settle for a 24-yard Rice field goal.

WKU then mounted a 67-yard drive to the ODU 14, but was forced to settle for a Cory Munson, 31-yard field goal.

However, on ODU's next series, Ta'Corian Darden picked off a Smartt pass at the Monarch 32. ODU's Calvin Brewton then intercepted a Storey pass, but it was nullified by two penalties.

The Hilltoppers then scored on Walker's 1-yard run and took a 10-3 lead into the half.

## UAB Falls at UAB, 38-14

**BIRMINGHAM, Ala.** - UAB capitalized on an anemic first half performance by Old Dominion's offense, and then held off a Monarch comeback attempt in the third quarter, to claim a 38-14 victory Saturday evening in a Conference USA game played at historic Legion Field.

ODU's offense finally began to move the ball with some consistency in the third quarter, but after digging themselves into a 28-0 hole, the Monarchs didn't have enough in their gas tank to come back.

UAB (6-1, 3-1 C-USA) is the defending C-USA champion, and is a tough team to beat at home. The Blazers have won 16 games in a row at Legion Field since UAB re-instituted football in 2017. UAB has also won 19 of its last 23 games. The win over ODU made the Blazers bowl eligible.

ODU trailed, 28-0, and had generated only 12 offensive yards with 56 seconds left in the first half, when Monarch offense finally began to click.

Messiah deWeaver began the drive with a 42-yard pass to Darrell Brown. But the drive stalled at the UAB 23 and Nick Rice kicked a 39-yard field to get the Monarchs on the scoreboard. He had a big assist from holder Bailey Cate, who took a high snap and placed the ball down perfectly.

Keion White got the second half off to a positive start for the Monarchs, intercepting pass from UAB quarterback Tyler Johnston III and returning it to the UAB 44.

Six plays later, with ODU facing another fourth down, Rice kicked a 23-yarder to trim the lead to 28-6.

ODU needed a defensive stop on the next drive but didn't get one. Johnston passed for 51 yards and ran for 15 more to lead a 75-yard drive that gave the Blazers a 29-point lead and appeared to put the game out of reach

ODU's offense replied with its finest drive of the game. The Monarchs used some trick plays, a 15-yard deWeaver scramble on third down and three UAB penalties to score their first TD of the game on a 1-yard run by LaLa Davis. deWeaver then passed to Steven Williams Jr. for the 2-point conversion to trim the UAB lead to 35-14.

The game began poorly for ODU, as the Monarchs fumbled on their first two possessions, which led to two UAB touchdowns in the first 6:24.

Blake Watson returned the opening kickoff 42 yards on the opening kickoff, and then deWeaver passed 7 yards to Hassan Patterson on the game's first play.

But on the next play, deWeaver threw a backwards pass that Garrett Marino recovered at the ODU 31, and it took the Blazers just three plays to score on a Lucious Stanely 2-yard run.

The teams then exchanged turnovers, with Lawrence Garner recovering a Myron Mitchell fumble at the UAB 38.

Two plays later, the ball was punched away from deWeaver by UAB's Tony Fair, who recovered and ran 30 yards to the ODU 34. UAB scored on five plays, all on the ground, with Stanley scoring from the 1 to make it 14-0.

UAB made it 21-0 three minutes into the second quarter, capping a 51-yard drive with a 14-yard TD pass from Johnston to Kendall Parham. UAB then made it 28-0 on a 74-yard, 13-play drive that ended with Johnston's 16-yard pass to Mitchell with less than a minute left in the first half.

# ODU Struggles In Homecoming Loss to FAU

**NORFOLK, Va.** - Florida Atlantic University rolled over Old Dominion University, 41-3, Saturday night in a Conference USA football game at S.B. Ballard Stadium, spoiling homecoming for the Monarchs and sending them to their school record seventh defeat in a row.

With four games to go, ODU (1-7 overall, 0-3 C-USA) is assured of its third losing season in a row. FAU (5-3, 3-1) is tied for first in the C-USA East Division.

Wide receiver Eric Kumah, playing for the first time since ODU lost at Virginia on Sept. 21, was a bright spot for ODU. He caught a career-high 10 passes for a career-high 99 yards.

ODU's Darrell Brown returned a punt 82 yards for an apparent touchdown early in the first half, but it was negated by a block in the back that was apparently away from the play. Instead, ODU had a first down at its eight, lost a yard on three plays and then got off a poor punt.

FAU needed just six plays to drive 36 yards for its first touchdown, which came on a 15-yard pass from quarterback Chris Robinson to John Raine.

FAU then held ODU on downs and punter Bailey Cate drilled a 47-yard put to drive the Owls back to the 18 yard line. Yet it only took FAU six plays to drive 82 yards for a touchdown. Tailback Malcolm Davidson rushed 21 yards untouched for the touchdown to give the Owls a 14-0 lead.

Cornerback Kaleb Ford-Dement then gave ODU a huge dose of momentum by interception a pass and returning it 22 yards to the FAU 49. But has often been the case this season, the Monarch offense failed to turn the turnover into a touchdown.

Quarterback Messiah deWeaver found Kumah and Steven Williams Jr. for two passes, giving ODU a first down on the 15. Three plays later, ODU faced fourth down at the 13 and was forced to settle for a 30-yard Nick Rice field goal three minutes into the second quarter.

FAU's Robinson led the Owls on an 82-yard touchdown drive, completing six passes for 76 yards, including a 14-yard TD pass to Harrison Bryant that gave FAU a 21-3 lead.

deWeaver tossed a 19-yard pass to running back LaLa Davis that gave ODU an apparent first down at the 16. However, ODU was called for pass interference, and the Monarchs were pushed back to the 50 where they faced a third and 22. deWeaver was sacked on the next play.

A Vladimir Rivas 25-yard field goal as time expired gave FAU a 24-3 halftime lead.

FAU's Deangelo Antoine rushed for a 48-yard touchdown late in the third quarter that put the game for out of reach.

The decision to redshirt Kumah is good news for next season, when the Monarchs return 62 of the 70 players who played against FAU.

Kumah came off of knee surgery in the spring, but Wilder says he never fully recovered. "I never felt like he was running right, that he ever got healthy," Wilder said.

Kumah said Wilder told him "that's what's best for me and I always listen to my coaches.

"I'll take this offseason, and this'll be my first offseason to do everything to get healthy, so I feel like this is a good move," Kumah said.
