ON THE ROAD:

The ODU Football Monarchs hit the road for the first time in 2010, heading to Buies Creek, North Carolina to face Campbell. In their inaugural season, the Monarchs went 3-1 on the road with wins at Jacksonville (28-27), Savannah State (38-17), and VMI (42-35). The lone setback away from the friendly confines of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium was a 34-29 loss at Fordham. Saturday's game will be the first of four road games this season for the Monarchs, who

have return dates with Monmouth and North Carolina Central, as well as a jaunt over the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel to face Hampton.

LEARN FROM THE MISTAKES AND MOVE FORWARD:

While ODU certainly wished there was a different outcome in last week's 35-25 loss to Jacksonville, the Monarchs are learning from their mistakes and moving on. Head Coach Bobby Wilder has noted that some of the biggest improvement you see out of a team occur between weeks one and two.

WHO'S WHO IN THE BOOKS:

One of Colby Goodwyn's (Hampton, Va.) kick returns against Jacksonville was the second highest return in the brief ODU history. He dashed 68 yards in the second quarter. Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) is ahead of Goodwyn on the list having returned a 76-yard kick in the historic opener vs. Chowan last year.

AIR RAID:

Redshirt quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) passed for a career-high 334 yards, the first time he has passed for over 300 yards in a game. It was the fourth time he had a 200+ yard passing game in his ODU career.

TD'S FOR TD:

Thomas DeMarco on his 1-yard jaunt over the endline to pull the Monarchs within three points, 28-25, with 8:28 remaining in the Jacksonville game was his 18th rushing touchdown of his career.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.) was named the National Kick Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) for the week ending September 5th. Goodwyn totaled 86 yards on a pair of kickoff returns in last Saturday's season opener against Jacksonville. He dashed 68 yards in the second quarter, the second highest return in the brief history of the ODU program. After week one of play, Goodwyn's average of 43 yards per kick return places him fourth in FCS national stats. Over the course of this season, CFPA will be recognizing national performers of the week. At the end of the season, CFPA will recognize several national performers of the year. TOUGHEST TICKET IN TOWN:

Response for Monarch football has been overwhelming. 14,377 season tickets were sold with season ticket applications made available in Feb. 2008. The school had to unfortunately turn away 296 season ticket orders for a total of 1,065 season tickets due to demand in the first season. The Monarchs enjoyed a 92% percent renewal rate for year number and went to the waiting list and promptly sold out of season tickets. A limited number of six-game packages were also available for purchase. Those tickets went on sale at 10 a.m. August 17th and sold out. Just under 500 tickets were scooped up in a little more than two hours. Tickets are also heavily in demand among the student population. Over 1,200 ODU students were in line when distribution began on Monday, August 24th at 8 a.m. for the inaugural game vs. Chowan on September 5th and over 2,500 student tickets were handed out on the first day. By the next night, only approximately 100 student tickets were available. The Monarch student population one-upped themselves this year as ticket distribution for the home opener vs. Jacksonville on September 4th were made available on Monday, August 30th at 7 a.m. and were completely gone by 2:30 p.m. that day. When the ticket windows opened, the line wrapped around the Ted Constant Convocation Center as head coach Bobby Wilder, his assistant coaches, and the 2010 captains were on hand to hand out donuts to those first in line.

ABOUT CAMPBELL:

- Campbell went 3-8 last season and 2-6 in Pioneer Football League play. The Camels showed great improvement in the second year of the program under head coach Dale Steele and tripled the victory total of the inaugural campaign.
- Campbell returns a more experience roster than at any point in the program history and sports 48 players that have earned letters in at least one of the first two seasons. CU also brings back each of the four top rusher from the leading rushing team in the conference last season. The 2009 Camels averaged 189.73 yards per game to lead the Pioneer Football League and rank 13th nationally.
- In their season opener, Campbell's redshirt senior quarterback Daniel Polk was able to scamper in with the game-winning touchdown from a yard out with 0:08 seconds left in the game to secure a thrilling 20-16 come-from-behind victory over UVA Wise. Polk completed 17 passes for 179 yards and ran 13 times for 45 yards and two scores.
- Junior running back Rashaun Brown led the Campbell effort with 85 yards on 12 carries. Redshirt junior Harrison Jordan totaled seven catches for 73 yards. Campbell defense was led by redshirt senior Lee Stanley's 14 tackles. Freshman Taurean Lynch made an immediate impact with two sacks for the Camels.
- The UVA-Wise victory improved Campbell to 2-1 all-time on the season's opening day. The win was CU's second in four tries at night since the program was restarted in 2008.

2010 NOTABLE FIRSTS:

Linebacker Deron Jasper (Dunwoody, Ga.) had the first interception of the 2010 season, while Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) had the first touchdown. Both notables were also the first for each in a Monarch uniform.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING:

The Monarchs made history on September 5th when a three-year dream became a reality. On May 31, 2006, the ODU board of visitors voted to add football and 1,293 days later, the Monarchs kicked off their first season of Division I FCS play. ODU played an 11-game schedule, including seven home dates at the \$24.8 million renovated Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. The schedule was a mix of both D-II and D-I FCS opponents to help the Monarchs transition into not only its first year of football, but also to get ready for entering the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in 2011, the toughest FCS conference in the nation.

OPENING WITH A BANG:

And no, we're not talking about the howitzer you hear being shot off before the Monarchs run onto Foreman Field. Old Dominion scored on its opening drive in the 2010 season opener against Jacksonville making it the eighth time in the 12 game history of the program the Monarchs have done so.

12th MONARCH MOMENTS:

There may be 11 Monarchs on the field, but the 12th Monarch is in the stand. Thanks to all the noise of being "Loud and Proud" from the 12th Monarchs at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium, the opposition was charged with 41 penalties last season and seven so far in 2010.

SO MANY MONARCHS. SO MANY OPTIONS:

In 2009, 16 different Monarchs put points onto the scoreboard. "It's not necessarily one or two guys who are forcing the defense to defend multiple personnel and different personnel groupings," said head coach Bobby Wilder. "It's making us a team that's able to do different things. We're not an easy team to defend on offense right now." Through the first game of 2010, four different Monarchs have lit up the scoreboard.

SERVING ON AND OFF THE FIELD:

For the second straight year, redshirt junior defensive lineman Chad King (Springfield, Va.) was selected to attend the All American Bowl as an escort for this year's high school athletes. King, who is a cadet in ODU's Army ROTC program, is a member of a unit that encompasses six different states and over 40 ROTC programs that are in South Carolina, North Carolina, Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, and West Virginia. Two cadets from the unit were selected as escorts with King ranked as number one cadet of those nominations submitted due to his athletic and academic successes. While at the All American Bowl, King will serve as a mentor to the high school athletes helping to escort the players throughout the weekend to each event and give advice to those about to enter the college ranks about the experiences of a collegiate student-athlete.

"HUMBLE AND HUNGRY":

The theme for the 2010 team is to be, "Humble and Hungry." "We are proud of what we accomplished in 2009. Having a 9-2 record, a six-game winning streak to end the season, and being recognized as the best first-year program in FCS history is something we are all proud of," explained head coach Bobby Wilder. "However, we realize that last year's success will not make a difference in the score of our games this year. If anything, we realize our opponents will look at our team differently in 2010." "We have all decided as a team we will be Humble based on our success last year," continued Wilder. "We will be grateful for the support we received. We think often of the 20,000 12th Monarchs that filled Foreman Field for seven Saturday's last fall. We will realize that we had success because we worked together as a team to accomplish our goals." "At the same time, we have decided we will be Hungry for more in 2010," noted Wilder. "We realize our schedule will be more challenging. We realize we have set the bar high for future success and expectations. We want to be the best team we can be in 2010 and we will work to improve everyday as people, students, and football players."

WHITE OUT/BLUE OUT:

The Monarchs' game with William and Mary on September 18th will be a "White Out" and the Homecoming Game on October 23rd against Georgia State will be a "Blue Out". The ODU Bookstore will be producing a game specific shirt for each game and will be available in the Bookstore starting in early September.

OUT FOR THE SEASON:

Sophomore cornerback Markwell Wilkins (Hampton, Va.) will miss the 2010 season with a torn ACL suffered while working out with Phoebus teammate Reid Evans last week. "You feel awful for the kid," said Wilder. "If there is a silver lining, he does have a redshirt year available." Last season, Wilkins appeared in all 11 games making 28 tackles, including 21 solo stops.

I GET BY WITH A LITTLE HELP FROM MY FRIENDS:

Head coach Bobby Wilder praised the improvement of his squad's communication this preseason, which is evident among many of the returning Monarchs. "What's great is that you see our veterans coaching up either the new guys or guys new to their position," he noted.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION - BSN ON CAMPUS:

Big Screen Network was on campus during the Monarchs' media day the first week of preseason to film many of the video elements fans will see up on the video board at today's game. BSN is an award-winning production company that has produced, developed, and directed in-stadium shows for nearly every major event in sports including the Olympics, NFL, and NCAA Championships.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS:

FOX43 and ODU Football have teamed up to debut The Old Dominion Football Show with Bruce Rader and Coach Bobby Wilder on Friday September 10th. Sponsored in its entirety by Priority Automotive, the weekly show will be broadcast every Friday night at 10:45 pm during the college football season exclusively on FOX43 and WAVY.com.

MAYDAY:

Last year coach Wilder would yell out "Sudden Change", throwing the squad into drills they sometimes were not expecting. Today "Mayday" was called out and that sent the PAT/Field goal team scrambling onto the turf. "If we need a field goal to win, don't have any timeouts, and say we were at third down and were tackled inbounds, we will yell "Mayday" and that alerts the PAT/Field Goal team to run out. We don't have time to call the protection, we just have to get set and kick the field goal to win the game."

ROAD TRIP?:

The Old Dominion University athletic department is offering season ticket holders the opportunity to order away-game tickets for the 2010 football season. The university will allocate tickets and assign locations based on the ticket priority order listing below. Requests will be processed based on priority points within giving levels, beginning with Royal Monarch members and on through Blue Lion members. All ticket orders must be received with payment three weeks prior to each game. Should any tickets remain after the allocation for donors, requests from non-donor season ticket holders, followed by alumni requests, will then be processed. To request season ticket holders' away-game tickets, click access the request form at ODUSports.Com. This form must be returned to the box office by the deadline noted above for the order to be processed.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN:

In a vote by their teammates, linebacker Craig Wilkins (Washington, D.C.), quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.), defensive end Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.), and defensive tackle Ronnie Cameron (Westbury, N.Y.) were named captains. Wilkins, who also served as a captain in the Monarchs' inaugural season in 2009, is ODU's returning leading defender having made 65 tackles, three interceptions, and seven pass break-ups a season ago. DeMarco, who is on the Walter Payton Award watch list, was the second leading FCS quarterback in rushing throwing for 21 touchdowns and running another 17 into the endzone. Mayo and Cameron both begin their first season on the Monarch roster after transferring from the disbanded Hofstra program and were among the Top FCS Transfers to Watch by The Sports Network.

HANDLING THE ADVERSE SITUATIONS:

One of the most challenging aspects of the 2010 preseason was the weather. "The adversity we've had with the rain and lightening this year hasn't even been close compared to the last two years of camp," commented Wilder. "They've handled it well though and pushed through it."

Old Dominion Suffers Season Opener Loss To Jacksonville, 35-25

NORFOLK, Va.-- With 45 seconds left in the game, Dorian Jackson (Colonial Heights, Va.) had a 32-yOld Dominion quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) was 22 of 40 for a career-high 334 yards and two touchdowns. DeMarco added another score on the ground after a 1-yard run, but three interceptions - two in the endzone - prevented the Monarchs from cutting into Jacksonville's lead.

Just like how the Monarchs started last in year in a number of games, ODU struck on the first drive. Drew Hareza (McDonald, Pa.) sailed the ball through the uprights on a 24-yard kick capping an opening 13-play, 66-yard drive to give the Monarchs the early 3-0 lead.

Back-to-back touchdowns by Jacksonville however saw the Dolphins take control of the lead for good and the Monarchs trying to be the "Comeback Kids" for the second straight time against their opponent from Florida.

Chris Kuck had a four-yard catch with 10:44 on the clock and on their next possession the Dolphins had the 14-3 edge. The second scoring drive for Jacksonville had the Dolphins backed up to their own 12, but that's when last year's leading rusher, Rudell Small, tore down the field for 45 yards and two plays later he was in the end zone.

Small would end the night will 118 yards.

Old Dominion, however, ended the half on a high note with the "one-minute drill". DeMarco connected with Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) for a 19-yard reception as ODU covered 50 yards on seven plays in 45 seconds. Gill's touchdown, the Monarchs' first of the 2010 season and Gill's first as a Monarch, cut the ODU deficit to 14-10 at the intermission.

Both teams traded scores in the third quarter. After ODU missed a 32-yard field goal attempt, Jacksonville followed with Josh Philpart on the receiving end of a 32-yard touchdown throw from Josh McGregor. Old Dominion quickly struck back though on the next drive needing just three plays to pull within four, 21-17.

Monty Smalley (Richmond, Va.) provided ODU with a 24-yard kick return to start the drive, Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) followed with a 21-yard run, Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) had a 31-yard catch, and then Dorian Jackson (Colonial Heights, Va.), who scored last year's game-winning touchdown, had a 44-yard reception to keep the Monarchs in the hunt.

The fourth quarter opened with Jacksonville going ahead, 28-17, with Dolphins covering 80 yards to end with Small scoring his second touchdown of the evening.

The Monarchs were immediately poised to cut into the deficit again, but an interception in the end zone put a stop to the ODU comeback. DeMarco threw a 34-yard pass downfield intending to hit Chris Lovitt (Stafford, Va.) in the end zone, but the ball got into the hands of Jacksonville's Andre Addison for the touchback.

ODU's next possession would indeed cut into the deficit and have the Monarchs trailing by just three points with 8:23 left in the game. The Dolphin's Logan Chipperfield managed just nine-yards on his punt and ODU started from their opponent's 34-yard line. Getting to the one-yard line, DeMarco ran the ball and Jackson was on the receiving end of the two-point conversion. The Monarchs trailed just 28-25 midway through the final quarter.

The next Jacksonville drive lasted just four downs before the Monarchs had the ball back. ODU made its way down the field, but another interception in the end zone, this time by the Dolphin's Jordan Dewhirst, thwarted ODU's chances again.

Jacksonville made the most of getting the ball back into its possession, scoring on a 19-yard pass to Philpart, his second touchdown catch of the game.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

OPENING WITH A BANG:

And no, we aren't talking about the howitzer you hear being shot off before the Monarchs run onto Foreman Field. Old Dominion scored on its first drive to kick off the 2010 season with Drew Hareza kicking the ball through the uprights for a field goal. The Monarchs have scored in their first drive in eight of its 12 total games played.

NOTABLE FIRSTS:

Linebacker Deron Jasper (Dunwoody, Ga.) had the first interception of the 2010 season while Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) had the first touchdown. Both notables were also the first for each in a Monarch uniform.

WHO'S WHO IN THE BOOKS:

Colby Goodwyn's (Hampton, Va.) kick return was the second highest return in the brief ODU history. He dashed 68 yards in the second quarter. Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) is ahead of Goodwyn on the list having returned a 76-yard kick in the historic Chowan game last year.

AIR RAID:

Redshirt quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) passed for a career-high 334 yards, the first time he has passed for over 300 yards in a game. It was the fourth time he had a 200+ yard passing game of his ODU career.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK: Football Monarchs Take 28-17 Victory In Battle Of The Newcomers

NORFOLK, Va. -- In the battle of upstart programs, the ODU football team had two touchdown receptions by Nick Mayers (Va. Beach, Va.) and a season-high 145 yards rushing from Desmond Williams (Windsor, N.C.) to lead the Monarchs to a 28-17 victory over Campbell at a blustery Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium Saturday night.

For the fifth game last season, the Monarchs scored on its opening drive, needing just two minutes and 41 seconds to light up the scoreboard. Starting the contest at their own 25, six plays later Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) tore down the field on a 42-yard touchdown reception run. For Evans, it was the leading Monarch receiver's first touchdown catch. Following the Drew Hareza (McDonald, Pa.) extra point, Old Dominion was ahead 7-0 with 12:19 on the clock.

Starting the second quarter, it was Campbell's turn. The Fighting Camels drove 91 yards and capped their drive with Rashaun Brown running into the end zone on a 14-yard carry.

On their next possession, the Camels' used a 36-yard field goal from Adam Willets to go ahead with 8:02 left in the opening half of action.

The second half however belonged to Old Dominion, outscoring Campbell 21-7.

Mayers collected the lone touchdown of the third quarter and then opened up scoring in the fourth quarter on his second touchdown reception. Quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) connected on a 14-yard pass to the redshirt freshman wide receiver with 5:23 remaining in the third quarter to put ODU ahead for good with a 14-10 advantage. Opening up the final stanza, Mayers missed the first pass from DeMarco following a Camel punt, but made good on the second with a 41-yard touchdown reception.

Williams rounded out the Monarch scoring on the night with just over four minutes remaining in the game. Williams owned the drive, accounting for 70 of the 94 yards on Monarch possession. Getting to within three yards of the end line, DeMarco tried carrying the ball through the middle but was just short of another ODU touchdown. On the third attempt, DeMarco handed the ball off to Williams who scooted to the left and muscled his way in for the score and a 28-10 Monarch lead. Campbell scored late in the fourth quarter for the final total. The Camels needed just over a minute following the previous ODU tally with Daniel Polk using the keeper for a yard to capture the touchdown.

Defensively, ODU was led yet again by Mychael McJunkins (Kansas City, Mo.). He led the Monarchs with eight tackles, including six solo stops. McJunkins has led the team in tackles in five of ODU's seven games.

DeMarco completed eight of his 14 passes for 145 yards, connecting with Mayers three times for 65 yards and Evans three times for 64 yards. Polk finished the night with 185 yards completing 16 of his 23 attempts.
