HOKIES HEADING TO NORFOLK TO FACE ODU

- Virginia Tech (No. 13 AP/No. 10 USA Today Coaches) returns to action at ODU (9/22) after last week's contest vs. East Carolina was cancelled due to Hurricane Florence.
- VT is coming off a 62-17 win vs. William & Mary (9/8), while ODU suffered a 28-25 loss at Charlotte (9/13).
- This contest will only be the third true road non-conference game for Tech under Fuente. VT won a 64-17 contest at ECU (9/16/17) and twice rallied from 17-point deficits to register a 34-31 win at Notre Dame (11/19/16).
- Next week the Hokies have an ACC contest at Duke (9/29), while ODU is at East Carolina (9/29).
- The Hokies are 9-2 under Fuente in September games.
- Saturday's game will mark the first time ODU has faced an opponent ranked in the AP Top 25.
- Dating back to 1975, the Hokies have played five games in Norfolk against Temple, VMI and William & Mary.

KEY VT-ODU SCORING STATS TO WATCH

- Tech registered a 38-0 shutout in last year's meeting with ODU at Lane Stadium (9/23/17).
- Since Bud Foster took over as Tech's defensive coordinator in 1996, VT is 66-1 when holding non-conference foes to 17 points or fewer. That lone setback was a 16-13 loss to No. 3 Auburn in the 2005 Sugar Bowl.
- Under Foster's tenure the Hokies have pitched 34 shutouts, including an FBS-best three in 2017.
- Since joining the FBS ranks in 2013, ODU is 3-11 when being held to 17 points or fewer.
- Virginia Tech is 19-0 under Fuente when leading at halftime, including a 9-0 mark in 2017.
- Tech is 5-0 under Fuente when scoring 40 points or more. ODU has lost 16 straight games when permitting 40+ points dating back to 2014.

BEAMER BALL LIVES HERE!

- Virginia Tech's tradition of excellence on special teams, affectionately known as "Beamer Ball" is alive and well.
- Tech TE Chris Cunningham blocked a punt at FSU (9/3) that was recovered by WR Eric Kumah for a TD.
- Virginia Tech leads the ACC, averaging 32.3 yards per KO return, a figure that ranks sixth among Power Five clubs.
- Tech K Jordan Stout has launched 15 of his 16 kickoffs for touchbacks this season.
- Dating back to 1999, Miami (25) and Oregon (23) are the only two squads to return more punts for TDs than VT (22).
- Virginia Tech tied for the FBS lead with Arizona State and Texas A&M with five blocked punts in 2017.

DOMINATE OUR STATE

- Virginia Tech is 12-2 under Justin Fuente in games played in the Commonwealth of Virginia - 11-2 at Lane Stadium, 1-0 at UVA.
- After opening the season with a 24-3 win at Florida State (9/3), the Hokies will play 10 of their 11 final regular season games in Virginia or North Carolina. Tech's only scheduled trip outside the region is an ACC contest at Pitt (11/10).

POUND IT ON THE GROUND

- The Hokies are averaging 208.5 rushing ypg after two games.
- Tech racked up 305 rushing yards in a 62-17 win vs. William & Mary (9/8), the best total of the Fuente era and the most accumulated by Tech since producing 308 vs. Western Michigan (9/27/14).
- After producing 315 net rushing yards and three rushing TDs after the first two games of 2017, the Hokies have racked up 417 rushing yards and seven ground TDs in their initial two games of 2018.

THE 757 PLAYS HERE

- The Hampton Roads region (area code 757) is comprised of seven cities: Norfolk, Virginia Beach, Chesapeake, Portsmouth, Newport News, Hampton and Suffolk.
- While no means an exhaustive list, this area is home to some of the most noteworthy current & former performers in Virginia Tech history.

1986 OYSTER BOWL FLASHBACK

- Virginia Tech's most recent appearance in Hampton Roads came in the 1986 Oyster Bowl against Temple in the late Bill Dooley's final season as VT's head coach. Temple won the contest by a 29-13 margin (10/18/86), but later forfeited due to an ineligible player.
- Temple's head coach in that game was former Tech QB and current CBS analyst Bruce Arians, who would go on to earn NFL Coach of the Years honors.
- Tech (10-1-1) concluded the year with a 25-24 victory vs. NC State (12/31/86) in the Peach Bowl, Tech's first-ever bowl win.

MORE HOKIES HISTORY

- Led by Frank Beamer, Tech registered a 34-6 win vs. West Virginia (9/22/84) - 24 years prior to today's game. Tech would win its initial BIG EAST title under Beamer the following season, concluding the year with a 28-10 win vs. Texas in the Sugar Bowl.

THE #LPD = NASTY D

- Despite playing only two games, Tech's vaunted Lunch Pail Defense is second in the FBS, averaging 11.5 TFL per game.

- The #LPD is currently tied for ninth in the nation, permitting 10.0 ppg in 2018.
- The Hokies have outscored their foes 27-0 in the first quarter.
- No team in the nation has allowed fewer rushing first downs than Virginia Tech (4).

- Among teams that played two games, only Southern Miss (23) allowed fewer total first downs than Virginia Tech (24).

- Opponents have made six Red Zone trips against Tech, coming away with only one TD and two FGs. That Red Zone scoring percentage of 50.0% is tied for third among Power Five squads.
- Tech leads the ACC and ranks fifth in the FBS, allowing 64.0 rushing yards per game.
- Virginia Tech is third among Power Five teams with a +6 turnover differential (7 takes/1 give).
- Tech leads the nation among teams that have played only two games with seven takeaways.

FOOTBALL IS FAMILY AT VIRGINIA TECH

- Dating back to 1987, 27 sets of brothers have played at Virginia Tech. 2018 marks the 17th consecutive season that the Hokies have had at least one set of brothers on its roster - the longest known streak in the FBS.
- The Hokies made history in the 2018 NFL Draft when Tremaine Edmunds (16th overall - Buffalo) and Terrell Edmunds (28th overall - Pittsburgh) become the first pair of siblings ever selected in the first round of the same NFL Draft. The eldest Edmunds brother, Trey, played at Tech and serves as a RB for New Orleans.
- Tech boasts two sets of brothers on the current roster - identical twins (redshirt juniors) Kevin and Connor Kish, as well as senior DL Vinny Mihota and true freshman OL Louis Mihota. Current Hokies OL Kyle Chung (son of Eugene) and RB Coleman Fox (son of Rich) are following in the footsteps of their fathers who played for the Hokies.

INSIDE THE SERIES: VIRGINIA TECH VS. OLD DOMINION

- Saturday marks Virginia Tech's first non-conference road game in the state of Virginia that wasn't UVA since 1986 when Tech won 17-10 at Richmond on Nov. 8.
- This will be the second-ever meeting between Virginia Tech and Old Dominion.
- The Monarchs are 0-8 all-time vs. ACC programs.
- The Hokies are 18-6 all-time against opponents in the current configuration of Conference USA.

CONNECTIONS: VIRGINIA TECH-OLD DOMINION

- Old Dominion offensive line coach Chris Malone is a 1996 graduate of Virginia Tech and lettered for the Hokies from 1992-95.
- Malone started in 47 straight games on the offensive line for former head coach Frank Beamer, the second-longest streak in program history, and he was an All-BIG EAST performer as a senior in 1995.
- Malone also cut his teeth in coaching at Virginia Tech, where he served as an offensive line graduate assistant from 1999-2001.
- Virginia Tech running backs coach Zohn Burden was an assistant under head coach Bobby Wilder at Old Dominion from 2012-14 when he was the passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach.
- Burden is also a Virginia Beach native who graduated from Salem High School.
- Virginia Tech executive associate AD and football administrator John Ballein, who worked on Frank Beamer's coaching staff from 1989-15, earned his Master's degree from ODU in 1987 and also taught and coached at Woodrow Wilson HS and Western Branch HS in the 757.
- ODU Athletic Director Dr. Camden Wood Selig has a son that attends Virginia Tech and is in the Corps of Cadets.
- Old Dominion will be going up against 14 Hokies who came from their own backyard in the Tidewater region of the Commonwealth: Keshon Artis (Chesapeake), Jaevon Becton (Virginia Beach), Armani Chatman (Virginia Beach), Sean Daniel (Chesapeake), Daniel Griffith (Chesapeake), Hezekiah Grimsley (Williamsburg), Trevon Hill (Virginia Beach), Devon Hunter (Chesapeake), Adam Lytle (Yorktown), Deshawn McCleave (Chesapeake), Phil Patterson (Virginia Beach), Jovonn Quillen (Hampton), Nigel Simmons (Newport News), Ricky Walker (Hampton).
- The Hokies have a long history of recruiting the 757, having produced greats such as Bruce Smith (Norfolk), Michael Vick (Newport News), DeAngelo Hall (Chesapeake), Kam Chancellor (Norfolk), Tyrod Taylor (Hampton), Bryan Randall (Williamsburg), Darryl Tapp (Chesapeake) and Xavier Adibi (Hampton).

CONNECTIONS: VIRGINIA TECH AND NORFOLK

- Saturday's game will mark the 39th contest that Virginia Tech has played in the city of Norfolk.
- Tech's first game in Norfolk was an 18-4 win over UMBC on Nov. 6, 1897 and its last game was a 29-13 loss to Temple on Oct. 18, 1986.
- The Owls, led by former Tech QB and NFL head coach Bruce Arians, later had to forfeit the game due to playing an ineligible player.
- Overall, the Hokies are 21-16-1 in the city of Norfolk with eight of those games being the annual Oyster Bowl game.
- The Hokies played in the 1949, 1951, 1969, 1975, 1980, 1982, 1984 and 1986 installments of the Oyster Bowl with proceeds from the game going to local charities.
- When not playing in the Oyster Bowl, the Hokies returned frequently to play in Norfolk due to the strong alumni base in the 757 and the recruiting advantages.
- Tech's longest streak of playing in Norfolk was eight consecutive seasons between 1916 and 1923.

2016 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.
- Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.

- Named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015 after orchestrating one of the more dramatic program resurrections in recent college football history at Memphis.
- The Hokies are in their third season under Fuente in 2018, who has compiled a 21-8 record in Blacksburg, the most wins by any Tech coach in his first two campaigns.
- Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson is the only other active ACC head coach who can boast as many victories in his first two seasons at a conference school than Fuente (19).
- With 19 wins in his first two seasons at Tech, Fuente owns more victories than every Tech coach has accumulated in his first three seasons with the exception of B.C. Cabbage, who guided the program to 21 victories from 1921-23.
- The Hokies have finished back-to-back seasons in the final AP Poll for the first time since 2010-11. The Hokies will be seeking to conclude three straight seasons in the AP Top 25 for the first time since doing it eight consecutive years under Frank Beamer (2004-11).
- Fuente is one of only six FBS head coaches to register nine or more wins each of the past four seasons.
- Tech concluded the 2017 season with a 9-4 mark, finishing the year No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Amway USA Today Coaches Poll.
- Tech extended its streak of consecutive bowl appearances to 25 straight seasons in 2017 under Fuente, the longest active streak recognized by the NCAA. Should Tech earn its 26th straight bowl berth in 2018, that mark that would give VT sole possession of the third-longest streak in NCAA history.
- The Hokies have won 14 consecutive Commonwealth Cup games over Virginia, including both matchups under Fuente.
- Tech has won 19 consecutive games during Fuente's tenure when leading at halftime.
- VT owns a 7-2 mark under Fuente in games immediately following a loss.
- Fuente's well-deserved reputation for his work with quarterbacks became apparent once again in 2017 as QB Josh Jackson orchestrated the most prolific season of any freshman in Tech history.
- Jackson's 2,991 passing yards were a VT freshman record and the most of any FBS freshman in 2017, while his 20 TDs and 135.2 rating were second among FBS

freshmen behind Georgia QB Jake Fromm (24 TDs, 160.1 ranking).

- Tech's traditionally stout Lunch Pail Defense also lived up to its reputation in 2017, pitching three shutouts.
- The #LPD finished the 2017 season fourth in the FBS in scoring defense (14.8 ppg) and posted an FBS-best three shutouts, while only Michigan (26.1%) held foes to a lower third-down conversion rate than VT (25.2).
- Virginia Tech continued its special teams success under Fuente as the Hokies tied for second in the FBS with six blocked kicks, finished second with 413 punt return yards and led the nation in fewest return yards allowed with 335.
- In total, the Hokies registered five return scores in 2017 (two punt return TDs, two INT return TDs and one fumble return TD).

* Foster, who became the Hokies' co-defensive coordinator in 1995, is also the nation's longest-tenured DC.



The famed Virginia Tech Lunch Pail has come to symbolize the blue-collar approach of the Hokies' defense under longtime defensive coordinate Bud Foster.

- In 1995, Foster served as co-defensive coordinator with Rod Sharpless, whose mother-in-law found the original Lunch Pail in Mercerville, New Jersey. The pail once belonged to a coal miner and after a record-setting defensive season, the Lunch Pail became an iconic part of Hokies' lore.
- The Pail travels wherever the Hokies go and its care is only entrusted to a defensive leader.
- Before the start of every season, a signed mission statement from the defense is placed in The Pail. Then every week, unit goals, team goals and keys to success are placed in The Pail, plus the turf from any road victories.
- Since 2007, The Pail has also contained the names of the 32 fallen Hokies taken in the April 16 tragedy.
- Darryl Tapp is the only player who has ever earned lifetime possession of an incarnation of The Pail from Foster.

- Even though the namesake is no longer the big whistle in Blacksburg, Virginia Tech's BeamerBall philosophy has not waned under third-year head coach Justin Fuente.
- There have been 149 non-offensive touchdowns and 144 blocked kicks by Virginia Tech since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach in 1987.
- Under Fuente, the Hokies have scored nine non-offensive touchdowns – three punt return touchdowns, two fumble return touchdowns, two interception return touchdowns, one blocked punt return and one blocked field goal return.
- Since Fuente's hiring, the Hokies are tied for eighth in Power Five with seven combined punt return, interception return and fumble return touchdowns.
- The Hokies have blocked more kicks over the last three seasons under Fuente (11) than the previous five seasons combined (9).



BEAMER NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- Former Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was named College Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2018 in his initial year of eligibility.
- The induction is set for Dec. 4 in New York City.
- The winningest coach in Virginia Tech history, Beamer's 280 victories rank sixth overall in FBS history and are the 13th most by a college football coach at any NCAA division.
- He led the Hokies to their first ever national title game appearance as part of an impressive streak of 23 consecutive bowl berths in his final 23 seasons.
- Under Beamer, the Hokies posted five top-10 finishes and became one of only six programs in college football history to go to a bowl game in at least 20-straight seasons.
- A five-time conference Coach of the Year, Beamer won three BIG EAST titles and added four ACC titles in five conference championship game appearances.

- Head coach Justin Fuente and the Hokies pay homage to Frank Beamer and Virginia Tech's legacy of excellence on special teams by selecting a special teams player of the week who will wear No. 25.
- With Coach Beamer's blessing, his retired No. 25 was worn by a player who exemplified the role special teams played during Virginia Tech's rise to national prominence.

ECU VS. VT: THE GAME THAT NEVER WAS

- The Hokies' week three contest vs. East Carolina was the first canceled game for Virginia Tech since its season opener vs. Georgia Tech in 2000.
- Tech went on to go 11-1 that season with a victory over Clemson in the 2001 Gator Bowl.
- Ironically enough, the Hokies' week three opponent that season was also East Carolina.

OFFENSE HITS THE GROUND VS. W&M

- The Hokies' 305 rushing yards vs. William & Mary (9/8) was the highest total under head coach Justin Fuente.
- The last time the Hokies rushed for 300+ yards in a game was vs. Western Michigan (9/27/14) when Tech rushed for 308 yards.
- Tech's 586 yards of total offense against the Tribe ranks 10th in a single game in program history. Its the seventh most total yards of offense gained in Lane Stadium since 1987.
- The offense was so effective that sophomore P Oscar Bradburn didn't need to punt. The last time Virginia Tech didn't register a punt in a game was 9/11/10 vs. James Madison.
- Virginia Tech had three quarterbacks - Josh Jackson, Ryan Willis and Hendon Hooker - rush for a touchdown, a first in program history.
- This is only the second season since 1996 where Virginia Tech has had three different quarterbacks rush for touchdowns in a single season. 2015 (Dwayne Lawson, Michael Brewer, Brenden Motley) being the other.
- Tech's 22 first downs in the first half tied for the second most in a half in program history since 1987. The Hokies also had 22 first downs against Wake Forest on Oct. 16, 2010. The program record is 24 in the first half against UCF on August 31, 2003.
- Tech's 401 total yards in the first half was its third most in a half since 1987. the hokies had 420 total yards in the first half against Rutgers on 10/9/99 and the record is 434 against wake forest with 434 10/16/10.

NO SLYE? NO PROBLEM

- Joey Slye's big leg was a weapon for Virginia Tech the past four seasons in the return game but redshirt freshman Jordan Stout has seamlessly carried on the Hokies' success in winning the hidden yardage battle.
- 15 of the Honaker, Virginia native's 16 kickoffs have gone for touchbacks, a total that's tied for first in the FBS.
- Between Stout and punter Oscar Bradburn, Tech's opponents have only 25 return yards this season and an average drive starts at the 22-yard line, compared to the 41-yard line for the Hokies.

LPD LEADS TECH IN WIN AT FSU

- Virginia Tech's dominating 24-3 victory at Florida State was the Hokies' first win in Tallahassee since Nov. 16, 1974.
- The Hokies improved to 100-1 under Bud Foster at defensive coordinator when they hold opponents to 10 points or fewer.
- It was only the fifth time since 1996 under Foster and the third time on the road that the Hokies held a ranked opponent to three points or less.
- It marked the first time in program history that Virginia Tech opened with ranked opponents in back-to-back seasons and won both games after dropping its previous 10 matchups.
- The Hokies held the Seminoles to their lowest point total at home since 2008 when FSU also put up three points against Wake Forest.
- Justin Fuente moved to 4-0 all-time against Willie Taggart as a head coach.

FARLEY, ASHBY WIN ACC HONORS

- Following Virginia Tech's 24-3 victory over No. 19 Florida State on Monday night, Rayshard Ashby and Caleb Farley were named ACC Players of the Week.
- Ashby (5-10, 230) made his first career start and looked like a seasoned performer, tallying seven tackles, including 2.0 tackles for loss and a forced fumble against the Seminoles.
- Farley (6-2, 202) played in his first collegiate game after sitting out the 2017 campaign with a knee injury. His debut contest featured a pair of interceptions, a sack, two tackles.

FARLEY FIGHTS THROUGH ADVERSITY

- It's been a long and tumultuous road for redshirt freshman DB Caleb Farley, who started at cornerback for Virginia Tech in the season opener at Florida State (9/3).
- After racking up 78 yards of total offense (61 receiving yards, 17 rushing yards) in the 2017 spring game, Farley tore his ACL on the first day of fall camp that kept him out the remainder of the season.
- Off the field, Farley dealt with another major blow personally in January 2018 when his mother succumbed to nearly a decade-long battle with cancer.
- Farley, who cornerbacks coach Brian Mitchell called a "borrowed wide receiver", moved from wideout to cornerback in the spring and is listed as a second-string corner and is expected to return punts and kicks.

KUMAH BREAKS OUT VS. FSU

- Junior WR Eric Kumah registered his first career multi-touchdown game in unique fashion at Florida State by becoming only the third Hokie since 1987 to have a return and receiving score in the same game.
- Kumah's TD off of a blocked punt by r-junior TE Chris Cunningham was Virginia Tech's 149th non-offensive touchdown scored since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach.
- His game-sealing TD catch in the fourth quarter went for 49 yards, a new career-high.

THE BELL COW IS BACK

- With all of the talent on last year's Lunch Pail Defense that finished fourth in the nation in scoring defense and featured seven players currently on NFL rosters, defensive coordinator Bud Foster still called senior defensive tackle Ricky Walker the "Bell Cow" of his unit.
- After playing in 11 games as a true freshman, Walker took a redshirt year and came in 2016 as a redshirt sophomore where he racked up 28 tackles, 6.5 TFLs and four pass breakups.
- Last year was a career year for Walker who posted 41 tackles, 12.5 TFLs and 4.5 sacks in 13 starts.
- His performance helped him earn All-ACC Honorable Mention honors.
- Walker earned his degree in sociology in May and became a father over the summer.
- Walker's brother, Rijo, was a four-year letterwinner at UVA and is currently works on the staff with the College Football Playoff as its team operations coordinator.

HAZELTON MAKING AN IMPACT EARLY

- Expected to be make an instant impact at wideout for the Hokies entering the 2018 season, Ball State transfer Damon Hazelton has lived up to the hype in the early going.
- He registered his first 100-yard receiving game as a Hokie vs. William & Mary (9/8) and his first catch in a VT uniform was a 10-yard TD catch vs. Florida State (9/3).
- The Baltimore native racked up 51 catches for 505 yards in 11 games for Ball State as a true freshman.
- He transferred from Ball State and was recommended to Tech wide receivers coach Holmon Wiggins by Texas A&M wide receivers coach Aaron Moorehead, who coached wide receivers for the Hokies from 2013-14.
- He sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, redshirted, and made friends with New York Giants wide receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. while working out with trainer Jamal Liggins.

FOSTER WITH RETURNING STARTERS

- With only four starters back on defense, it's been a while since defensive coordinator Bud Foster has had a defensive unit this inexperienced when looking at career starts.
- The Hokies' 68 career returning starts are the fewest since the 2010 squad brought back 64 starts. The last time Tech brought back four starters on defense was 2008.
- Foster's fewest defensive starters since becoming defensive coordinator in 1996 was three following the National Championship game season in 1999.
- Despite the inexperience, Tech won the ACC Championship in both 2008 and 2010.

BEAMERBALL CONTINUES

- Blocked kicks and opponent return yards proved to be critical in Virginia Tech's success in 2017 and it struck early in 2018.
- With the Hokies holding on to a 10-3 lead in the second quarter at Florida State (9/3), Chris Cunningham blocked a punt at FSU's own three-yard line before Eric Kumah grabbed it out of mid-air and took it in for the score.
- Only Oklahoma (85), Georgia (77), Auburn (65) and Arizona (58) had more touchbacks on kickoffs than Virginia Tech (59) in the Power Five in 2017.
- Sophomore punter Oscar Bradburn allowed only 49 punt return yards, a total that ranked ninth in the Power Five in 2017.
- Overall, the Hokies led the Power Five with 335 total opponent return yards in 2017.
- Overall, the Hokies also dominated the hidden yardage battle when comparing drive start averages; opponents' average drive started on 24-yard line while the Hokies average drive start was just over the 35-yard line.
- Led by Jovonn Quillen's two blocked punts, Virginia Tech's six blocked kicks tied for second in the Power Five last season.
- Special teams coordinator James Shibest was named 2017 Special Teams Coordinator of the Year by FootballScoop.com, marking the second time he's won that honor.

O-LINE TECH'S VETERAN UNIT

- The most experienced position group for the Hokies is the offensive line who return 51 career starts between Kyle Chung (16), Yosuah Nijman (22) and Braxton Pfaff (13).
- Chung and Pfaff started and played in all 13 games last season while Nijman posted eight starts before an injury ended his season.
- For his senior season, Nijman (6'7", 314) will play at right tackle for the first time in his career.
- Chung, who was granted a sixth year of eligibility during the offseason, will move from right tackle to left guard.
- It won't be Chung's first go-around working inside as he started two games at center vs. Tennessee in the Battle at Bristol and the following game vs. Boston College in 2016.
- Chung is the son of Eugene Chung, an All-American for the Hokies in 1991 and a first-round draft pick of the New England Patriots. He's currently an assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles.

HOKIES MAKE HISTORY AT 2018 DRAFT

- The 2018 NFL Draft was a historic one for the Hokies as the program saw Terrell and Tremaine Edmunds become the 12th and 13th first round draft picks in school history.
- The Edmunds brothers were the first set of brothers to be drafted in the first round of the draft.
- Virginia Tech had two players picked in the first for only the second time in program history and the first time since 2004.
- Tech's five draft picks overall were its most selections since five Hokies came off the board in 2010.
- When including Adonis Alexander's selection by Washington in the NFL's Supplemental Draft, the Hokies had six draftees, their most since 2008 (8).

BLACKSBURG – Virginia Tech tailback Steven Peoples scored three touchdowns, including two before halftime, and Tech’s defense notched its second shutout of the season, as the No. 13 Hokies gradually pulled away from Old Dominion, winning 38-0 in a non-conference game played Saturday afternoon at Lane Stadium.

With the win, Tech moved to 4-0 on the season – its first 4-0 start since 2011. That year also marked the last time the Hokies won all their non-conference games. Old Dominion fell to 2-2 on the season.

Tech was sluggish for much of the first half, but came up with a big play when backup free safety Divine Deablo intercepted a pass in Old Dominion territory. That play led to a 17-yard touchdown pass from Josh Jackson to Peoples with 6:07 left in the first half.

On the Hokies’ next possession, they marched impressively 79 yards in 11 plays. With 40 seconds left before halftime, Peoples scored on a 1-yard run to give Tech a 17-0 lead.

Those two touchdowns drives sparked the Hokies’ offense, which scored touchdowns on five of six drives spanning the two halves.

Jackson completed 20 of 30 for 298 yards and three touchdowns, with an interception – his first of the season. Peoples finished with 135 total yards (73 receiving, 62 rushing) of Tech’s 582.

Tech’s defense allowed Old Dominion to get past midfield just one time in the game. The Hokies held the Monarchs to 149 total yards.

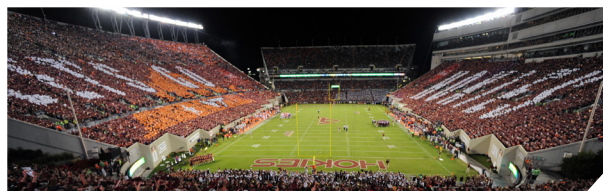

Lane Stadium doesn't blow people away by the brute strength of a massive stadium, but with knowledgeable fans that always reach a frenzied pitch at the right time, the Hokies make the most of their numbers.

Every good stadium has at least one end designed for deafening noise levels, and the enclosed South End Zone at Lane Stadium fits the bill perfectly. Holding more than 11,000 screaming Virginia Tech fans, the section amplifies noise and renders audibles useless. That's not to mention the isolation factor. With the nearest major airport nearly 45 minutes away, opponents' fans are never out in force at Lane Stadium.

LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 53rd year of football competition in 2017. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 24 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch – and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence."

ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer, Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the song for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." As the song played on one chilly evening prior to the team's entrance, members of the Marching Virginians began to jump up and down in rhythm in an effort to stay warm. The Lane Stadium crowd followed suit and the jumping hasn't stopped since.
