### LADY MONARCH MOMENTS:

- Old Dominion moved into second place in the CAA race by defeating Delaware on Sunday, 63-47.
- The 47 points were the fewest the Blue Hens have scored all season and the fewest since netting only 41 in a 41-55 setback at UNC-Wilmington back on January 6th. Additionally it was Delaware's largest loss since a 27-point setback at James Madison, 57-84, back on February 1, 2004.
- Senior Sherida Triggs collected her second double-double of the year and 11th of her career with a team-high 12 points and 11 rebounds against the Fightin' Blue Hens. Triggs was one of four Lady Monarchs in double figures along with 11 from T.J. Jordan, and 10 from both Tiffany Green and Tay Ranshure
- Old Dominion posted a 89-75 victory over Northeastern on last Thursday night in their first ever trip to Solomon Court in Boston, Massachusetts.

It was the most points since Shareese Grant exploded for 35 points in the 2005 CAA Tournament final, an overtime victory over Delaware.
- T.J. Jordan also set a new school record for three's made and attempted as she went 10-of-22 from downtown. The previous mark was held by Aubrey Eblin when she went 9-of-16 against UNC-Wilmington on Feb. 17, 1998. The 10 three's are also most made by a Division I women's player this season

Jordan netted a career-high 34 points, surpassing her previous high of 28 captured at Delaware on February 11, 2005. It was the most points since Shareese Grant (2001-2005) exploded for 35 points in the 2005 CAA Tournament final, an overtime victory over Delaware. Jordan also set a new school and CAA record for three's made with 10. Her 10 treys are also the most by a Division I women's player this season. The 89 points scored by Old Dominion were also the most netted this season by the team. On Sunday, the Lady Monarchs defeated 2007 CAA Tournament host Delaware by a 63-47 score. The 47 points were the fewest the Blue Hens have scored all season Senior Sherida Triggs collected her second doubledouble of the year and 11th of her career with a team-high 12 points and 11 rebounds. Triggs was one of four Lady Monarchs in double figures along with 11 from T.J. Jordan, who was battling a stomach bug, and 10 from both Tiffany Green and Tay Ransburg. Old Dominion had a balanced attack as they outscored the Delaware bench, 21-4. The Lady Monarchs had their best performance from the line all season shooting 91.7 percent (11-of-12) from the stripe. ODU is led by Jordan, who is averaging 15.3 points per game to rank sixth in the CAA in scoring. Sophomore Tiffany Green leads the rebounding corps with 6.4 boards per game, ranking 20th in the league.

### **ABOUT TOWSON:**

The Towson Tigers enter Thursday's match-up with a 16-7 overall and 7-6 CAA mark and are coming off an 89-43 loss at Georgia State on Sunday. With 16 wins this season, Towson is getting nearer to its school record for wins in a season, getting closer to the 1983-84 Tiger team's record of 19-8. The Tigers are led by freshman guard Shanae Baker-Brice, who is seventh in the CAA in scoring at 14.9 points per game. Two other Tigers are averaging double figures in junior transfer Holly Mahan (10.5 ppg) and senior forward Kelly Robinson (10.0 ppg). Mahan also leads Towson on the boards grabbing 7.5 rebounds per game to place in 11th in the CAA in the category.

### **SERIES WITH TOWSON:**

The Tigers remain one of five CAA teams that have yet to defeat the Lady Monarchs. Old Dominion holds an 0-0 record all-time since the two teams became conference rivals when Towson joined the league in the 2001-02 season. The closest game between these two teams occurred on February 5, 2004 as the

Lady Monarchs escaped the Towson Center with a 68-64 victory. Last season, the Lady Monarchs captured a 69-56 win at the Towson Center. Overall, Old Dominion has averaged 22.2 point victories and 74.6 points per game against the Tigers.

### LAST TIME VS. TOWSON:

The Old Dominion women's basketball team captured a 69-56 victory over Towson University back on January 29th, 2006 at the Towson Center in the lone regular season match-up between the two teams. Sherida Triggs and senior Lawona Davis each tallied a team-high 15 points. The Tigers' Tierra Jackson led all scorers with 22 points going 10-of-16 from the field along with eight rebounds. Old Dominion enjoyed a 37-28 lead at the intermission but needed to thwart a second half rally by the Tigers. The Lady Monarchs' nine point half-time edge was whittled to four with 6:42 to play. However, Old Dominion used a quick 11-0 run from which Towson could not recover from and went on to outscore the Tigers 21-12 over the final 5:40 of the game. The Tigers were the first CAA team to outrebound the Lady Monarchs last season, and one of five, holding a slight 32-31 advantage on the boards. Old Dominion did manage one of their best shooting performances from the floor this season. The Lady Monarchs connected on 26-of-49 to end the afternoon shooting 53.1 percent.

The 47 points were the fewest the Blue Hens have scored all season and the fewest since netting only 41 in a 41-55 setback at UNC-Wilmington back on January 6th. Additionally it was Delaware's largest loss since a 27-point setback at James Madison, 57-84, back on February 1, 2004. The Fightin' Blue Hens shot a season-low 24.6 percent from the field (14-of-57), went just 2-for-13 from the three-point line. Additionally, Old Dominion outscored the Delaware bench, 21-4.

### CHICKEN SOUP FOR THE SOUL:

The stomach bug has managed to get a hold of two members of the Old Dominion women's basketball team. Sophomore Jazzmin Walters missed last Thursday's game against Northeaster. With Walters' sickness, head coach Wendy Larry used a new line-up for the first time in 12 games. Larry used the line-up of Shahida Williams, Sherida Triggs, Tiffany Green, Tish Lyons, and T.J. Jordan which was last used in a Dec. 17th loss to Charlotte. The sickness then traveled to T.J. Jordan for last Sunday's showdown with Delaware. Jordan started at the point and posted 11 points and two assists despite feeling under the weather.

### **BEYOND THE ARC:**

Junior guard T.J. Jordan netted a career-high 34 points, last Thursday at Northeastern. She surpassed her previous high of 28 captured at Delaware on February 11, 2005. It was the most points since Shareese Grant (2001-2005) exploded for 35 points in the 2005 CAA Tournament final, an overtime victory over Delaware. Jordan also set a new school and CAA record for three's made with 10 and set a new school mark for three's attemped with 22. The previous mark was held by Aubrey Eblin when she went 9-of-16 against UNC-Wilmington on Feb. 17, 1998. Her 10 three-pointers are also the most made by a Division I women's player this season.

### **CLUTCH:**

Junior Megan Pym and senior Sherida Triggs hit a crucial jumpers in the closing minute to help the seal a 69-62 victory at Hofstra back on February 4th. The Lady Monarchs led by as much as 13 in the second half and were leading 63-52 with 5:37 left in the game. The Pride followed by going on an 8-0 run to pull within three with a mere 1:28 left in the game. Pym's pull up jumper at the free throw line put Old Dominion up by five, but managed a bucket on their turn down the court to once again cut the ODU lead to three with 52 seconds remaining. On the next possesion, Triggs got underneath the basket to capture a miss from Jazz Walters and in the midst of Hofstra defenders manage to put the ball up and over the rim to seal the win with 24 seconds left.

### **CAA LOSSES:**

Losses aren't very common for the Lady Monarchs, but they do happen. The 50-79 loss to James Madison is just one of 16 losses ODU has suffered since joining the CAA back in the 1991-92 season. Of those 16 losses, six have come at the hands of James Madison. Old Dominion has suffered at least one CAA loss in 11 of 16 seasons in the league. There are still five opponents in the CAA though that have not defeated the Lady Monarchs. The 29-point loss to the Dukes however was the largest CAA loss for the Lady Monarchs. Its previous largest margin of defeat in conference action was a 17-point ering a 57-71 loss at East Carolina on February 22, 1992.

### **CRASH:**

Old Dominion hauled in a season-high 57 rebounds in a 63-47 win over William & Mary last Sunday afternoon. Sophomore Tiffany Green hauled in 15 rebounds to tie her career mark.

### DISH IT TO ME:

Sophomore Jazzmin Walters continues to grow in her role as the Lady Monarchs starting point guard. The second year Lady Monarch dished out eight assists, tying both her career and season-high while committing only one turnover against Virginia Commonwealth on January 25th. With four dishes against Hofstra on February 4the, Walters cracked the top 10 sophomore assists leaders list. She is currently in 10th place with 80 assists in her second year in the ODU uniform. She needs eight more to move past Mery Andrade (1995-96) into ninth place.

### FIRST TEAM TARGETS:

The Old Dominion defense kept two members of the First Team All-CAA in check. The Lady Monarchs held Hofstra's Vanessa Gidden to one point on 0-of-7 shooting from the floor in the first meeting with the Pride and CAA Preseason Player of the Year Kyra Kaylor to just two points on 1-of-11 shooting. Coming off a career-high equaling 30 point night in a win at Georgia State, Kaylor was held scoreless through the first half and didn't notch her first points until the 15:20 mark of the second half. Kaylor entered the game averaging 14.6 points per game and was ninth in the league in scoring. James Madison's Meredith Alexis did manage to score 21 points against the Lady Monarchs. Alexis was held only to five field goals, with 11 of her game-high 21 points coming from the free throw line.

### SWISH:

It looked like the Lady Monarchs had their best free throw performance this last Thursday at Northeastern as they went 14-of-16 to finish the night at a 87.5 percent clip. Senior Sherida Triggs led the way going 4-of-4 from the charity stripe as one of five Lady Monarchs to go perfect from the line. However, that stat didn't last very long as the Lady Monarchs reset it the following game in a Feb. 11th victory over Delaware. The Lady Monarchs went 11-of-12 from the charity stripe to shoot a season-high 91.7 percent. Both Triggs and sophomore Tiffany Green went a perfect 4-of-4. Triggs has now hit her last 10 free throws in contests at Hofstra, Northeastern, and at home against Delaware.

### **STARTING FIVE:**

With the Lady Monarch roster as deep as it is in recent memory, its hard to pick just which Lady Monarch will get the starting nod. Through twenty three games, 10 different starting combos have been used with Sherida

Triggs being the only Lady Monarch to have started every single game. The line-up of Triggs, Tay Ransburg, Shahida Williams, T.J. Jordan, and Jazzmin Walters have been used the most going 10-2 with wins over Rutgers, VCU, Drexel, Georgia State, Hofstra, George Mason, and William & Mary.

### LOOKING AT THE BENCH:

Since beginning CAA action on January 4th, the Lady Monarch bench as been producing three times the amount as the opponent bench. Through 12 conference games, ODU's bench has collected 268 points as compared to their opponent's 89. Against Georgia State, ODU outscored the Lady Panther bench, 32-6, and outscored Hofstra's bench 24-4 the following game and 19-1 in the rematch. The Delaware game saw the Lady Monarchs outscore the Fightin' Blue Hen bench, 21-4.

### **HOT HANDS:**

Old Dominion shot a season-high 52.9 percent (27-of-51) against Hofstra on January 14th, only the third time the Lady Monarchs have shot over 50 percent from the field this season.

### FROM DOWNTOWN:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan is third in the country in three-point field goals made with 3.3 per game and is 82nd in three-point field goal percentage at .357. She has 966 career points which puts on track to reach 1,000 points in about three games (or so). She has 76 three-point field goals this season and 216 for her career. Aubrey Eblin holds the school record in both categories with 97 treys made during the 1997-98 season and 250 made during her career.

### TALE OF THE TURNOVER:

Old Dominion is working on cutting down on its turnovers, but in the season series against Drexel, the Lady Monarchs forced the turnovers. The Dragons committed 30 miscues leading to 26 Lady Monarch points in the 70-45 first meeting in Norfolk and then committed another 30 against ODU in the 83-51 meeting in Philadelphia resulting in 46 Lady Monarch points. The 30 turnovers are the most committed by a Lady Monarch opponent this season. ODU followed the first Dragon meeting by collecting 31 points off of 25 Georgia State miscues the following game.

### ON THE GLASS:

Although junior Tay Ransburg was held to only two points, both from the line, she hauled in a nine boards as Old Dominion outrebounded Georgia State, 47-31, on January 11th. She followed that performance with her first double-double as a Lady Monarch netting 13 points and grabbing a season-high 12 rebounds. She helped Old Dominion win the battle of the boards against the Pride, 40-36, after the Lady Monarchs were outrebounded in the first half, 23-15.

### HALFTIME HIGHS & LOWS:

Old Dominion held a 34-16 first half advantage against Georgia State marking the lowest scoring output by a Lady Monarch opponent this season. The 18-point ODU halftime lead also tied the Lady Monarchs largest halftime lead this year. Old Dominion also held an 18-point, 35-17 advantage over Chicago State in head coach Wendy Larry's 500th career victory over Chicago State back on December 9th. Additionally, the Lady Panthers tied its season low for scoring in a half with its 16 points.

### **HEAR ME ROAR:**

Senior Tish Lyons started the year's first eight games, but for the last seven games has come off the bench. As a starter she only averaged 7.3 points and 2.8 rebounds a game but from coming off the bench beginning with the contest at Middle Tennessee State, Lyons averaged 9.4 points and 2.8 rebounds per game. Against Rutgers and in the CAA opener at Virginia Commonwealth, she poured in a season-high 14 points and also dished out a career-high six assists against the Rams.

### **DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE:**

Three Lady Monarchs have double-doubles under their belt. Redshirt sophomore Tiffany Green became the first Lady Monarch to perform a double-double this season with a 17-point, 12-rebound effort against Chicago State on Dec. 9th. She followed with her second double-double in the following game with 11 points and 10 rebounds on Dec. 17 at Charlotte. Junior Tay Ransburg 13 points and 12 rebounds on Jan. 11 against Georgia State for her first double point and rebounding effort as a Lady Monarch. Senior Sherida Triggs had 14 points and 10 boards in the series finale with VCU on Jan. 25th for her first double of the year and 10th of her career.

### **KEEPING THE BALL:**

Old Dominion's 32 turnovers at Charlotte and 29 turnovers at Middle Tennessee certainly aren't numbers it would like to see on the stat sheet again this season. The good news is those were not school records. The most turnovers in a game in Lady Monarch history was 37. That happen twice - against Kansas on January 20, 1978 and against Tennessee on January 13, 1994.

### **BOARDING:**

The Lady Monarchs have collected a seasonhigh 27 board rebounding margin. Old Dominion collected 56 rebounds against both Charlotte and Chicago State while holding both teams to just 29 boards.

### **D-D-D-DEFENSE:**

In their 57-46 win over Delaware State, the Lady Monarchs held the Hornets to 29.0 percent (18-of-62) from the floor, the lowest percentage by an ODU opponent this season.

### **HOME SWEET HOME:**

Since the doors opened at the Ted Constant Convocation Center in 2002, the Lady Monarchs have enjoyed a 62-12 record.

### **RANK 'EM UP:**

Old Dominion has seen action against four Top 25 teams and six teams recieving votes in the polls so far. Old Dominion got its first win over one of those teams with a 72-55 win over Rutgers and followed with a 74-59 victory over CAA rival Hofstra. Other wins over teams in the "recieving votes" category include a 63-47 win Delaware on Feb. 11 that put ODU into second place in the CAA. Ranked teams on the schedule have included No. 5 Tennesee, No. Duke, No. 21 (AP)/24 (ESPN/USA Today) Kentucky, and No. 25 James Madison. ODU fell to the Wildcat squad 55-69 in their home opener back on November 18th, fell 40-89 to #5 Duke on their home court on November 30th, and was defeated by #5 Tennessee 59-75, although the game was tied with just 1:31 left in the first half. ODU was also edged by #25 JMU, 79-50. Virginia, Penn State, and Middle Tennessee have also been seen in the "receiving votes" categories in both polls. ODU fell 72-92 at Virginia in the season opener, lost at Penn State, 77-80, despite overcoming a 20point second half deficit, and was edged out 71-86 by Middle Tennessee.

### THE 500 CLUB:

With the 77-38 win over Chicago State on December 9th, Old Dominion head coach Wendy Larry became the 30th all-time Division I coach and 23rd active Division I coach to reach the 500-victory milestone. In 23 years as a head coach, she has compiled a 511-190 mark. Now in her 20th season at the helm of the Old Dominion program, Larry holds a 462-159 mark at her alma mater. Coach Larry just recently captured her 450th victory as the head coach at her alma mater with a 57-46 win over Delaware State on November 25.

### WELCOME BACK:

Earlier this season, Old Dominion welcomed back former Lady Monarch Angela Jackson, the head coach of the Chicago State Cougars. Jackson was a member of the Lady Monarchs in 1989 and 1990, helping the Old Dominion women's basketball team to two second round appearances in the NCAA. As a senior in 1990, she was named First Team All-Sun Belt averaging a team second best 16.6 points per game. Additionally in 1990, Jackson led the Lady Monarchs with 4.1 assists per game (126 total) and is tied with Sharese Grant on the senior all-time assist leaders list. As a junior, she poured in 513 points to rank sixth on the junior all-time scoring leaders list.

### FORMER LADY MONARCHS IN THE COACHING RANKS:

Former Lady Monarchs Wendy Larry ('77) Angela Jackson ('90) aren't the only Lady Monarch to have gone from player to coach. Chris Critelli ('80) - head coach Brock University in Canada, Maura McHugh ('75) head coach Stony Brook, Anne Donovan ('83) - head coach WNBA's Seattle Storm & US Senior National Team, Rhonda Rompola ('81) - head coach Southern Methodist, Kim McQuarter ('88) - head coach Malcolm X Junior College, Regina Miller ('84) - head coach UNLV, Inge Nissen ('80) - Co-Head Coach Florida International, Cindy Russo ('75) - Co-Head Coach Florida International, Aubrey Eblin ('99) - assistant coach University of San Diego.

### **WELCOME BACK MARIANNE:**

Another familiar face returned to Norfolk when Rutgers visited. Scarlet Knight assistant coach Marianne Stanley was at the helm of the Lady Monarch program from 1977-1987 leading Old Dominion to three national titles (1979 - AIAW, 1980 - AIAW, 1985 - NCAA) and coaching legends Nancy Lieberman, Inge Nissen, Anne Donovan, and Tracy Claxton. Coming to ODU in 1977, Stanley became one of the youngest Division I head coach in the country at the age of 23. By the time she left, she built the Lady Monarchs into one of the nation's premiere programs posting a 269-59 (.820) record.

### ONE FOR THE ROAD:

After beginning the season 0-5 away from the friendly confines of the Ted Constant Convocation Center, the Lady Monarchs earned its first road win with an 81-70 victory over Virginia Commonwealth at the Siegel Center in Richmond on January 4th.

# ENDING AND BEGINNING WITH RUTGERS:

Last season, guard Jen Nuzzo's season ended right before ODU's match-up at Rutgers with a stress fracture in her leg. This season, Nuzzo had a coming out party of sorts against the Scarlet Knights. Nuzzo served as a spark plug off the bench as the Lady Monarchs were down by 12 points in the first half. She ended the game with five points, two assists, three rebounds, and a steal in 16 minutes of action in what has been perhaps her best effort to date.

### **JUST LIKE MIKE:**

Junior guard T.J. Jordan has led the team in scoring in all but seven games this season - at #5 Duke, at Middle Tennessee, vs. #5 Tennessee, vs. Rutgers, vs. Georgia State, vs. William & Mary, Delaware. At Charlotte, Jordan collected her first career double-double with 16-points and a career-high 10 rebounds.

### **HOW LOW CAN YOU GO?:**

The 38 points scored by Chicago State were the fewest points collected by an ODU opponent since the Lady Monarchs' 85-33 win over William & Mary on February 26, 2006.

### THE DUNKS:

Tennessee's Candace Parker didn't dunk against the Lady Monarchs in their meeting, but ODU's homecourt will always be a special place for Parker. The Lady Vols played its first and second round games of the NCAA Tournament at the Ted Constant Convocation Center in 2006 enroute to the Elite Eight. It was during their first round game vs. Army that Parker collected her first dunk (and would dunk again). It was the first dunk in a women's game during NCAA Tournament action and the first time a woman dunked twice in a game.

### **NOT SEEN VERY OFTEN:**

In a rare occurrence, the opposition outrebounded Old Dominion in a victory. The East Carolina Pirates held a 45-33 advantage on the boards, which included holding the Lady Monarchs to just seven offensive rebounds. The Lady Monarchs were outrebounded in only nine of its 31 games last year and none by double digits. Five of the nine times Old Dominion was outrebounded resulted in a loss for the Lady Monarchs. In six of those nine occasions, the opponent outboarded Old Dominion by four rebounds or less. Florida International and James Madison, in the first meeting of the year, both held an eight board advantage over Old Dominion, the most of the season.

### CAA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

### T.J Jordan:

01/08/07: Jordan averaged 21.5 points per game last week as she led the Lady Monarchs to their first two conference victories of the season. The third year Lady Monarch poured in a season-high 25 points against Virginia Commonwealth in ODU's CAA opener last Thursday. It was the fourth time this season she has scored 20 or more points in a game. She also shot a blistering 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from the floor, including a career-tying seven three-pointers. She was just two treys shy of tying the school record. Jordan followed with a game-high 18 points in the win over Drexel last Sunday in ODU's first home CAA win of the 2006-07 season. Against the Dragons she shot a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line, the fifth time Jordan has gone perfect from the charity stripe.

02/12/07: Junior guard T.J. Jordan set new records in school and CAA history as she helped the Lady Monarchs to victories over Northeastern and Delaware last week averaging 22.5 points per game. At Northeastern, Jordan ignited for 10 three-pointers setting new marks in both theODU and CAA record books in categories and finished with a career-high 34 points. It was the first time since March 11, 2005 when CAA Tournament MVP Shareese Grant exploded for 35 points that a Lady Monarch reached the 30 or more point mark. In the following game, Jordan battled a stomach bug to become one of four players in double digits in a victory over Delaware moving the Lady Monarchs into second place in the league race. Jordan notched 11 points.

## LESSON LEARNED - ON TO THE FUTURE:

Old Dominion has already put it 40-89 loss to #5 Duke behind them. The Lady Monarchs' 11 first half points tied the school record for fewest points scored in a half with the original record set back in December of 1972 with 11 second half points in a 23-12 victory over James Madison. The Lady Monarchs scored only 12 points in the first half of that game. Additionally, Old Dominion shot a low of 25.0 percent (13-of-52) from the floor, its lowest since shooting 26.0 percent (17-of-65) against Virginia in 1975. Old Dominion didn't repeat its poor performance when it came out in its next game against Penn State and shot 46.9 percent (30-of-64) against the Lady Lions.

### SO WE MEET FOR THE FIRST TIME:

When you look at the Old Dominion Lady Monarch schedule, you can always count on familiar teams such as Tennessee, Rutgers, and Penn State along with various other teams they play on again and off again. Three teams grace this years schedule who the Lady Monarchs have never met. First up is Delaware State, who the Lady Monarchs handed a 57-46 loss at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. ODU also had a 77-38. win over Chicago State in its first meeting with the Cougars. Old Dominion also took on Middle Tennessee for the first time in school history, falling 71-86 to the Blue Raiders in Murfreesboro.

### **KEEP SHOOTING PARTNER:**

Junior guard T.J. Jordan came off the bench in the 72-92 season opening loss at Virginia to net a team-high 21 points. Shooting 6-of-19 from the field, including 6-of-17 from threepoint range, the third year Lady Monarch set new career-highs in field goals and threepointers attempted. Against Penn State, the third year Lady Monarch reset her field goal attempt high by launching 20 shots from the floor and finishing with a season-high 24 points, her second 20+ point effort of the season. Jordan set a new season mark hitting eight field goals against Chicago State, just one shy of her career high. Against Charlotte, Jordan reset her field goal attempts mark for the third time this season taking 22 shots. The Lady Monarchs' three-point specialist, she holds the single season three-point attempt mark (2005-06 - 248).

### 0-2...SO WHAT?:

The Lady Monarchs may have started the 2006-07 season 0-2, but that's no reason to think the sky is falling. Last season, Old Dominion opened the season 0-2 and finished the year with a 22-9 overall mark and their 15th straight CAA title. The 2003-04 Lady Monarchs opened 0-2 and picked up ranked wins over #7 Penn State and #12/13 North Carolina. They finished 25-7 along with the CAA title. The 2002-03 Lady Monarchs opened 0-3 but managed a 20 win season going 21-9 with a CAA title. The 2000-01 season saw Old Dominion go 0-2 and also finished with a 21-9 mark and a CAA title. The 1992-93 women's team started the year off 0-4, but ended the year 22-8 overall, with yes...another CAA title and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

### OPEN THE DOOR:

The Lady Monarch women's basketball team helped the Virginia Cavaliers open their new building - The John Paul Jones Arena - in ODU's first regular season contest on Saturday, November 12th. It was Virginia back on November 22nd, 2002 that helped Old Dominion open the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

## BREAKING DOWN THE OPENERS:

The Lady Monarchs are 25-13 in season openers, suffering a 72-92 set back in this year's opener at Virginia. Of the previous 38 season openers, Old Dominion has opened the season three times with Virginia with a win in 1977, a loss in 2002 with the opening of ODU's Ted Constant Convocation Center, and a loss in 2006 at the opening of UVA's John Paul Jones Arena . In home openers, the Lady Monarchs are 27-11 including a 2-3 mark at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. Old Dominion fell to #21/24 Kentucky in its 2006-07 home debut, 55-69.

### **STREET & SMITH:**

Street and Smith Magazine has listed the Old Dominion women's basketball team at No. 18 in its in their annual College Basketball Yearbook which went on sale on Oct. 1. Included on this year's schedule are five teams also appearing in Street and Smith's list including No. 5 Tennessee, No. 7 Duke, No. 14 Rutgers, No. 15 Kentucky and No. 20 Virginia.

### **BACK TO THE POLLS:**

The Lady Monarchs received votes in both the Preseason Associated Press and WBCA/USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll. The Lady Monarchs have received votes over the last few seasons and are looking to return to the Top 25 in both polls. Old Dominion's last Top 25 ranking in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll was November 18th, 2003. Old Dominion's last appearance in the Associated Press Top 25 was the final poll of the 2002 season as the Lady Monarchs danced their way to the "Elite Eight".

# WHAT THE LADY MONARCHS WELCOME BACK:

The Old Dominion women's basketball team welcomes back four starters and nine letterwinners from last year's team that went 22-9 overall and captured its 15th consecutive Colonial Athletic Association title. Seventy two percent of the offense returns including four of the five leading scorers and three of the four leading rebounders from a season ago. This year's group of seniors - Tish Lyons, Sherida Triggs, Shantel Wilson - enter the 2006-07 season having collected three CAA titles, three NCAA appearances, a 69-25 overall record and 49-5 mark in CAA matchups. Triggs joins junior guard T.J. Jordan on the Preseason Second Team All-CAA list. Triggs led the CAA in field goal percentage. was second on the ODU squad in scoring, and led the Lady Monarch rebounding corps. Jordan led the team in scoring and reset the single season three-point attempt record.

### **UP NEXT:**

Old Dominion has just five games left on the slate following Thursday's match-up with Towson. The Lady Monarchs will travel to William & Mary on Sunday, Feberuary 18th and then return home for its final home games of the 2006-07 season. Old Dominion hosts George Mason on Thursday, February 22nd and James Madison on Sunday, February 25th.

The Lady Monarchs are in the NCAA record books for capturing the most consecutive conference championships. In league play, Old Dominion holds a 282-16 overall record, which includes eights seasons of undefeated play. The Lady Monarchs hold a 149-2 record at home and a 133-14 road record. Only two CAA losses have occurred on Old Dominion's homecourt. The first was back at the ODU Fieldhouse, the former Lady Monarch homecourt from 1969-2002, against Richmond, now of the Atlantic-10, with a 70-74 defeat on February 19, 1992 and the second versus Delaware with a 70-73 setback on January 9, 2005. Five schools in the league have yet to beat the Lady Monarchs - Georgia State (3-0), George Mason (40-0), Northeastern (3-0), UNC-Wilmington (33-0), and Towson (9-0).

NORFOLK, Va. — Old Dominion head women's basketball coach Wendy Larry earned her 450th win as head coach of the Lady Monarch program and moved to within one game of collecting her 500th career win as Old Dominion defeated Delaware State, 57-46, Saturday afternoon at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The 89 points scored by Old Dominion were the most netted this season by the team. Jordan was one of three Lady Monarchs in double figures. Joining Jordan were sophomore Tiffany Green (Chesapeake, Va.) with 15 and junior Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) with 11.

Green and senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) grabbed a team-high seven boards as the Lady Monarch outrebounded the Huskies 49-24.

Northeastern was led by Shaleyse Smallwood with 21 points and 11 assists. She was one of four in double figures for the Huskies. Lucia Pablos poured in 17 points, followed by Ashlee Feldmen with 16, and Stefanie Hodell with 12.

The first half endured seven ties before freshman Jessica Canaday (Williamsburg, Va.) gave the lead to the Lady Monarchs for good by hitting two free throws at the 4:42 mark. Old Dominion held a 41-38 advantage at the half.

Northeastern was able to get as close as two in the second half, but after a Pablos jumper at the 17:53 mark brought the score to 46-44, Old Dominion proceeded to outscore the Huskies, 25-7, to take a 20-point lead. The Lady Monarchs would go on to lead by as many as 22.

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team moved into second place in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) race as they handed the University of Delaware a 63-47 loss on Sunday afternoon at the Ted Constant Convocation

Center.

Delaware, who entered the game winners in 10 of their last 11, had a four-game win streak snapped as they fall to 20-4 overall and 11-2 in the CAA. The 47 points were the fewest the Blue Hens have scored all season and the fewest since netting only 41 in a 41-55 setback at UNC-Wilmington back on January 6th. Additionally it was Delaware's largest loss since a 27-point setback at James Madison, 57-84, back on February 1, 2004.

Old Dominion meanwhile upped its overall mark to 15-8 overall and 11-1 in the league.

A three-pointer by Fisher close the gap to 39-34 with 14:05 left in the game, but that would be the last points Delaware would see over the next six and half minutes. Old Dominion proceeded to take a 13-0 run and watch its lead go into double figures and remain there the rest of the game. Smith was able to break drought at the 6:01 mark hitting one of two free throws, but the Blue Hens would not see its first field goal since the ODU run began until 4:58 remained in the game thanks to an Irving lay-up. Six of the Blue Hens final eight points of the game came from the line.
