

IMPORTANT DATES IN CONSTANT CENTER HISTORY

1999

February 23: Old Dominion University President James V. Koch announced a \$5

million gift from Virginia Beach resident Theodore "Ted" Constant that will support the 75-acre University Village east of Hampton Boulevard. The President will recommend to the Board of Visitors that ODU's new convocation center be named the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

June 17: Groundbreaking ceremony for the construction of the Ted Constant

2001

December 6: Old Dominion University names Global Spectrum manager and operator

of the Ted Constant Convocation Center

2002

October 25: Dedication ceremonies held for the Ted Constant Convocation Center

October 28: First event in Constant Center history is Counting Crows

November 17: Roberta Flack and The Virginia Symphony perform at the Constant

Center's dedication event

November 22: First regular season Women's Basketball game – ODU loses to the

University of Virginia, 63-55

November 24: First regular season Men's Basketball game – ODU loses to the University of North Carolina, 67-

59, in front of a sell-out crowd.

2003

February 15: Rapper 50 Cent plays to a sell-out crowd

March 9: The World Famous Harlem Globetrotters play to a sell-out crowd

March 12-15: CAA Women's Basketball Tournament held at the Constant Center. ODU Lady Monarchs win

CAA championship with a victory over the University of Delaware, 66-58, and receive automatic

berth to the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament.

March 22 & 24: NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament 1st and 2nd Round Games held

at the Constant Center. ODU Lady Monarchs fall to Boston College in the 1st Round, 74-73.

March 26: Dave Matthews plays to a sell-out crowd. The concert sold out in 16

minutes and is recorded as the fastest sell-out in Constant Center history.

September 13: Rapper Lil John plays to a sell-out crowd.

October 20: The New Orleans Hornets defeat the Philadelphia 76ers, 102-85, in an NBA exhibition game in

front of a sellout crowd. The 76ers are owned by Global Spectrum parent company, Comcast-Spectacor.

November 6: Comedian Chris Rock performs to a sell-out crowd

2004

January 23: Music group 3 Doors Down plays to a sell-out crowd

March 28 & 30: NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament Regional Finals held at

the Constant Center. University of Minnesota advances to the NCAA Women's Basketball Final 4.

October 1: Comedian Dave Chappelle performs to a sell-out crowd

2005

February 12: ODU Monarchs defeat in-state rival Virginia Commonwealth, 82-76, in front of a sell-out crowd. It

marked the venue's first game on ESPN 2.

February 20: Comedian Larry The Cable Guy performs to a sell-out crowd

March 28: Maroon 5 plays to a sell-out crowd

April 22: Music group Green Day plays to a sell-out crowd

November 11: Rocker Bruce Springsteen plays to a sell-out crowd

November 19: Country artist Keith Urban plays to a sell-out crowd

2006

February 18: ODU Monarchs defeat Marist, 84-71, in the first annual ESPN Bracketbuster Tournament played

in front of a nationally televised audience and a sell-out crowd at the Constant Center that were

all wearing white in honor of the "White Out" promotion.

March 19 & 21: NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament 1st and 2nd Round Games held

at the Constant Center. ODU Lady Monarchs fall to George Washington University in the 1st

round, 87-72.

March 19: Tennessee forward Candace Parker is the first female player ever

to slam dunk in a women's basketball NCAA Tournament game and the first female to dunk twice

in one game.

March 20: ODU Men's Basketball team defeats Manhattan, 70-66, to advance to

the quarterfinals of the NIT Tournament. It was the first and only, thus far, Men's Basketball post-

season game played at the Constant Center.

May 3: Fall Out Boy plays to a sell-out crowd.

September 15: American Idols Live plays to a sell-out crowd. The concert sold out in

less than one hour.

October 15: Cheetah Girls with Hannah Montana plays to a sell-out crowd.

December 9: Lady Monarchs Head Coach Wendy Larry records her 500th career

victory with a 77-38 victory over Chicago State University.

<u>2007</u>

March 2: Blue Man Group performs to a sell-out crowd.

July 25: Old Dominion University renews contract with Global Spectrum, manager

and operator of the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

September 18: Cox Communications places name on venue's ticketing company. Name

of ticketing company becomes COX Tix.
