### QUICK HITTERS

**KEYDETS RETURN TO NORFOLK** – VMI finishes the 2018 slate with a road contest at Old Dominion Saturday. It will be the first time VMI has faced an in-state opponent since the 2015 season when VMI played Richmond at Robins Stadium on September 10. This will also be only the second time since 2011 that VMI has closed out its season on the road. Although only the second time VMI has played ODU in Norfolk and the first time since 2009, Keydet football is well familiar with Foreman Field at Ballard Stadium as it participated in numerous Oyster Bowls – the charity event sponsored by the Shriners to support its hospitals. VMI hosted the last six college Division I Oyster Bowls played from 1990-95 and participated in several more dating back to the 50's. Overall since 1901, VMI has played 29 games in Norfolk during its football history.

**THE UDINSKI RECORD REPORT** – More records fell last Saturday against Furman as sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski passed Al Cobb (2014) for most passing yards in a season and now has 2,988. Udinski also tied Cobb's 2014 season mark for most touchdown passes (20) and also established a new school mark for most total plays with 570. He currently stands second in VMI season most total yards gained and is 279 yards away from tying the school record of 3,095 yards held by Cobb.

**LARA GOES LONG (AGAIN)** – VMI's best deep threat at wideout, junior Javeon Lara, turned in another long scoring play last Saturday as he hauled in a 60-yard TD strike from Reece Udinski in the first quarter against Furman. Lara over his career now has six TD pass receptions over 54 yards for his career.

### A VMI Win against Old Dominion would ...

- Be VMI's first win over the Monarchs in the series.

## - SATURDAY'S GAME VERSUS OLD DOMINION -

**THE SERIES:** Saturday's meeting between VMI and ODU will be the third meeting between the schools. They first met in both the 2009 and 2010 seasons with the Monarchs prevailing both times, 42-35 in 2009 in Lexington and 45-28 in Norfolk in 2010.

## - VMI-FURMAN GAME NOTES -

---Sophomore wide receiver Kris Thornton has 81 receptions for the year and needs three more catches to tie the VMI single season mark of 84 receptions set by Aaron Sanders in 2015. Thornton's 112 career receptions slides him into the #8 spot on the VMI career list.

---Thornton extended his consecutive games reception streak to 17.

---With a team high seven touchdown receptions, junior wide receiver Javeon Lara is two off the school single season mark held by three former Keydets – Mark Stock (1988), Carl Rhodes (1965) and Dick Evans (1959).

---Freshman QB Chance Newman tossed his first career TD pass with a 25-yard play to Lara early in the fourth quarter.

## Head Coach Scott Wachenheim - Fourth Season

Scott Wachenheim enters his fourth season as VMI's head football coach, and he continues to guide the program with a steady hand in one of the toughest conferences in FCS. The program continues to build a solid foundation with young personnel, and since his debut season in 2015, Wachenheim has transformed expectations and attitudes within the VMI football program and has shown that sustainable success can be attained with enthusiasm, hard work, resilience and dedication.

Two years ago, the Keydet football program showed such potential in Wachenheim's second season that the Keydets were significantly more competitive in a Southern Conference that produced four teams that reached the FCS playoffs. Overall, the scoring margin improved from -11.9 in 2015 to -7.3 and the Keydets started the season 3-2 for the first time since 2003 and in the process won back-to-back road games for the first time in 35 years. The three wins also were the most in a season since 2010.

In that same 2016 year, VMI allowed 7.3 points less per game than in 2015 and the fewest opponent points in a season since 2003. The defense also ranked third in opponents third down conversions allowed. VMI was the least penalized team in the conference and improved its turnover margin +12 from a year ago. Nine VMI football players earned postseason awards from the Southern Conference.

Off the field, Wachenheim's cadet-athletes have excelled thanks to better execution of their daily activities and the results have fostered an improved team GPA, better retention rates, and a full commitment to "winning the VMI way."

A 1984 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy and veteran coach with over 25 years of experience in the college ranks, Wachenheim came to VMI from the University of Virginia where he had served for five seasons, including being the Cavaliers offensive line coach since 2011. Prior to his tenure in Charlottesville, Wachenheim was the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Liberty University for three seasons (2006-08).

Wachenheim graduated from the Air Force Academy with a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering and was a four-year starter from 1980-83. He earned first team All-WAC and honorable mention All-America honors his senior year.

and sixth of his career. He has also caught a pass in 15 consecutive games.

---Freshman wide receiver Jakob Herres caught seven passes for a career high 118 yards and posted his second straight 100-yard receiving game. A touchdown reception on the first play of the second quarter gave him five for the season which tied him with Javeon Lara for the team lead in that category.

---Sophomore defensive back A.J. Smith posted nine tackles against the Mocs giving him five games of at least none tackles on the season. He is tied with redshirt sophomore linebacker Elliott Brewster for most tackles on the Keydet defensive charts with 65.

### - VMI-TUSCULUM GAME NOTES -

---Redshirt sophomore running back Alex Ramsey turned in a career-high 133 yards on 23 carries against Tusculum. It was the first 100-yard game by a Keydet back since Daz Palmer's 126 yards against Catawba on September 9, 2017.

--- VMI's 173 yards rushing vs. Tusculum Saturday was the most team rushing posted in a contest since 180 yards logged against Catawba on September 9, 2017.

--- Freshman linebacker Brett Howell made his second start at inside linebacker and was credited with a career-high 16 tackles and one tackle-for-loss against the Pioneers.

--- Sophomore wide receiver Kris Thornton snagged eight passes for 83 yards and extended his consecutive games reception streak to 16.

--- The 11 points allowed Tusculum was the lowest an opponent since VMI surrendered seven points against ETSU (37-7) on October 8, 2016.

--- The Keydets posted a season-high five sacks (-36 yds) against Tusculum.

### - VMI-CHATTANOOGA GAME NOTES -

---Sophomore linebacker Tyren Cloyd's 29-yard interception return for a touchdown in the first quarter at Chattanooga was VMI's second pick six of the season and Cloyd's first career interception.

Through eight games, VMI had intercepted eight passes, twice the entire 2017 total of four picks.

---Sophomore wide receiver Kris Thornton moved over the 1,000 yard career receiving mark with nine catches for 116 yards and also posted his fifth 100-yard receiving game of the season

### This Day in VMI Football History

**November 17, 1990** - VMI closes out the 1990 campaign with a 21-20 win at ETSU in Johnson City, Tennessee. The Keydets, behind running back Marcus Mines' 102 yards rushing and a touchdown, rolled up 311 yards on the ground versus the Bucs. Quarterback Tony Scales' 7-yard TD rush with 1:18 left proved to be the game winner.

---Redshirt junior running back Quan Myers scored on a one-yard TD run against Chattanooga, giving him eight rushing touchdowns on the season. It's the most rushing TD's by a Keydet since Derrick Ziglar's 10 compiled during the 2015 season.

#### **- VMI-THE CITADEL GAME NOTES -**

---Sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski continued to rewrite the VMI record book against The Citadel October 20 when he broke his own mark for single game total offense 456 and passes completed with 49. Udinski now owns three of the four 400-yard passing performances in school history and his 447 yards against The Bulldogs was the second highest in school history.

--- Sophomore wide receiver Kris Thornton pushed his Citadel postgame total to 949 career yards receiving and posted his fourth career 100-yard receiving game with 11 catches for 146 yards with two touchdowns against The Citadel October 20. He also extended his consecutive games reception streak to 14 contests.

---VMI kicked off to open the game for the first time in seven games this season after The Citadel won the toss and elected to receive.

---Senior defensive tackle Zach Baker finished with seven tackles – one off his career-high and recovered a fumble in the second half for the first of his career.

---With 32 points, the Keydets topped the 30-point mark for the third time over the last four games.

---With a career-high five touchdown passes vs. The Citadel, Udinski became the first VMI QB to finish with five TD passes in a game since Bobby Mitchell against Buffalo in 1961. Al Cobb (2014-16) holds the VMI single game mark with six TD passes against Gardner-Webb in 2014. Through seven games in 2018, Udinski has 14 TD passes thrown which is the fourth highest single season total in school history.

#### **- VMI-SAMFORD GAME NOTES -**

---Junior wide receiver Javeon Lara put together a prolific 100-yard receiving games stretch with three contests with 434 yards total – which surpassed his entire 2017 receiving total of 283 yards. Lara had 143 yards against WCU, 150 yards against Mercer, and 141 yards against Samford.

---Sophomore defensive back Will Bunton made his first college start against Samford.

---VMI opened the game on offense for the sixth time this season and has started all the 2018 games with possession of the ball.

---Redshirt sophomore linebacker Elliott Brewster intercepted his first career pass and returned it 47 yards to set up a second quarter VMI touchdown. It was the sixth interception of the year by the Keydet defense after netting just four total during the 2017 season.

---Sophomore wide receiver Kris Thornton extended his consecutive game receptions streak to 13 games.

#### **- VMI-MERCER GAME NOTES -**

--- Sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski threw for over 400 yards in both the WCU and Mercer games and set the SoCon mark for most passing yards in consecutive games with 925 surpassing the old mark set by Elon's Scott Riddle in 2007 by a margin of 10 yards. That mark was surpassed two weeks later by Samford's Devlin Hodges.

---Senior kick return specialist Mason Dermott moved into the top spot on the VMI career lists with 2,223 kick return yards and 104 kickoff returns.

---Sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski's 434 yards passing was then the second highest single game passing mark in school history and only the third 400-yard passing game in school history.

---Freshman wide receiver Jakob Herres caught TD passes in consecutive games (WCU, Mercer) to give him three for the season. He is the first frosh wideout to catch three touchdown passes in a season since Dontae Mauck caught three scores in 2015.

--- Sophomore wide receiver Kris Thornton has caught a pass in 12 consecutive games dating back to last season.

---Sophomore defensive tackle Chuck Weatherman's safety vs. Mercer the first time VMI's defense recorded a safety since a team safety was credited when Richmond stepped out of the end zone on September 27, 2011.

#### **- VMI-WESTERN CAROLINA GAME NOTES -**

--- VMI sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski was named Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against Western Carolina. The sophomore slinger from North Wales, Pennsylvania, set three program records in the Keydets' 52-50 loss to the Catamounts on Saturday, posting new school standards in completions (43), attempts (72) and passing yards (491). His nearly 500 yards through the air were good for seventh in a game in SoCon history, while he added four touchdown passes on the day. The weekly award also marks the first time a VMI offensive player has achieved the honor since wide receiver Aaron Sanders accomplished the feat on October 26, 2015.

--- The 50 points tallied by VMI Sept. 22 vs. WCU was the most scored by the Keydets in a game since September 13, 2014 when VMI defeated Davidson, 52-7. It was also the most points in a SoCon game since 1975 when the Keydets beat Davidson 55-0 in their SoCon opener.

--- Redshirt junior running back Quan Myers scored three rushing touchdowns in the first half against Western Carolina becoming the first VMI back to score three rushing TDs in a game since Alex Keyes scored three against Mercer on October 1, 2016.

---Javeon Lara produced a career-high 143 yards on a career-high nine receptions vs. Western Carolina marking the second straight week that VMI receivers had achieved a 100-yard receiving game. Lara has two 100-yard receiving games, both at Western Carolina as he netted 100 yards in the 2016 contest in Cullowhee.

---Redshirt freshman Colin Loftis had three interceptions after picking off two passes against Western Carolina on Sept. 22. Loftis is the first VMI defender to pick off two passes in a game since Adam Morgan picked off two passes against Presbyterian College on October 6, 2012. Through four games of the 2018 season, VMI had five interceptions, one more than the four interceptions logged during the entire 2017 season.

---Sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski became the first VMI quarterback to throw four touchdown passes in a game since Al Cobb threw six TD passes against Gardner-Webb on October 18, 2014.

---Punter Reed King punted three times for a career-high average 48.7 yards per punt. King continues to lead the SoCon in punting with a 44.6 yards per punt average and has 8 punts of 50+ yards. His career-long 65 yarder against Toledo in the season opener is the longest by a punter in the SoCon this year.

---VMI converted six of 10 fourth down conversions against Western Carolina and is 9 for 17 on the year for 52.9%. The Keydets converted just six of 18 fourth down conversions for the entire 2017 campaign.

**VMI-ETSU GAME NOTES**

---Redshirt sophomore Devin Carper's "pick six" against the Bucs was his first career interception and the first interception returned for a touchdown by a Keydet since Allan Cratsenberg returned a pass 60 yards for a score at Mercer September 30, 2017.

---Sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski threw for a career-high 305 yards and was the first VMI QB to produce a 300-yard passing game since Al Cobb tossed for 370 yards against Wofford on October 31, 2015.

---Udinski's 60 pass attempts vs. ETSU set a new VMI single game record surpassing the 57 pass attempts by Joey Gibson against ETSU in 2001.

---Sophomore wide receiver Kris Thornton collected his second 100-yard receiving game with a career-high 119 yards which was the first 100-yard receiving game by a Keydet since Thornton had 108 yards against Wofford on November 11, 2017.

**- VMI-WOFFORD GAME NOTES -**

---Junior Javeon Lara set a new career high in receptions against Wofford with seven catches surpassing his previous high of four receptions set twice earlier.

---Receivers Jakob Herres and Matt Blaser both both caught their first career TD receptions. Herres had a four-yard grab to put VMI on the board with 4:09 left in the second quarter while Blaser capped the game's scoring in the fourth quarter with a 12-yard scoring pass.

---Redshirt freshman Collin Loftis made his first career start at cornerback and freshman Ethan Caselberry made his first career start at safety.

---VMI played three quarterbacks against Wofford with true freshman Chance Newman seeing his first action as a Keydet along with starter Reece Udinski and Austin Coulling.

---Austin Coulling's 10-yard touchdown pass to Matt Blaser with 4:00 left in the fourth quarter was his first TD pass thrown since a six-yard pass to Tyain Smith against Western Carolina on November 5, 2016.

---Junior punter Reed King produced strong numbers against Wofford with eight punts for a career-high 44.9 YPP average including a long of 64 yards.

---Junior tight end Ryan Clark, a converted defensive lineman in preseason camp, caught his first pass as a receiver by hauling in an 18-yard gain from punter Reed King out of a punt formation to extend a VMI second quarter drive.

**VMI-TOLEDO GAME NOTES**

---VMI played 12 true freshman including three starters in the opener against Toledo. Appearing in their first college game were RB Korey Bridy, LS Robert Soderholm, LB, Ethan Casselberry, LB Liam Kauthen, DB Jaelen Adkins (starter), LB, Carter Johnson, LB Brett Howell, DL Eric Weaver, DL Warren Dabney (starter), OL Marshall Gill (starter), WR Michael Jackson, and WR Jakob Herres.

---Junior Reed King handled both placekicking and punting chores against Toledo. King booted a 28-yard field goal for his first make since a career-long 41 yarder at Western Carolina on November 5, 2016. King also punted nine times for a 43.6 yards per punt average against the Rockets in his first game in that role.

--- Sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski set new career highs with 25 completions and 42 attempts against Toledo surpassing his previous highs against Wofford last year of 24 completions and 39 attempts.

---Sophomore wideout Kris Thornton had 20 catches over consecutive games after snagging eight passes in the opener against Toledo. Thornton had a career-high 12 receptions for 108 yards and two touchdowns in the 2017 season finale against Wofford.

### **VMI PRESEASON NOTES**

**FIVE-YEAR MARK** - 2018 marks the fifth season that VMI will compete in the Southern Conference since returning to its longtime conference home. VMI was a member of the Southern Conference for 79 years from 1924-2003 and captured seven league football crowns during that time before competing in the Big South Conference for 11 seasons from 2003 through 2013.

**KEEPING IT CLEAN** – VMI was the 2017 NCAA FCS statistical champion in three categories involving penalties. VMI Keydets were assessed the fewest total penalties during the season (38) and had the fewest total penalty yards (332) as well as the fewest penalty yards per game (30.18).

**DAVIS EARNS PRESEASON HONOR** - VMI offensive lineman Brad Davis (Victoria, Va./Fuqua School) was named to the 2018 preseason second team All-SoCon on offense. Davis, a 6-4, 301 pound tackle was tabbed one of the most improved players on offense in VMI 2018 spring practice and has added 40+ pounds while emerging as a projected starter on the offensive line. Davis lettered as a true freshman and played in six games seeing action as a reserve in 2017 with action against Air Force, Catawba, Robert Morris, Chattanooga, Furman, and Western Carolina.

Davis is a Dean's List mechanical engineering major and was named to the Southern Conference Academic Honor Roll.

Davis made his first college start at right tackle in against Toledo in the 2018 season opener.

**NEW FACES, NEW PLACES** – Two Keydets made position switches in August preseason camp and are both

listed in the season opener two-deep in their new homes. Ryan Clark, a 6-6, 235, junior from Alcoa, Tennessee, has moved from defensive end to tight end. Clark moved into the starting lineup on the defensive front in 2017 and appeared in all 11 games and finished the year with 30 tackles. Michael Tomaso, who was an offensive lineman during his true freshman year in 2017, moved to defensive line midway through August camp and is listed as the backup at nose tackle.

**EXPERIENCE AT WIDEOUT** - The VMI receiving corps returns virtually intact from a year ago as nine of the top 10 wideouts in catches from 2017 return. Topping the list is sophomore Kris Thornton, who hauled in a team leading 33 receptions for 340 yards and two touchdowns and was named to the All-Freshman Southern Conference team on offense. Junior Rohan Martin (26 catches, 149 yards) and Javeon Lara (12 catches, two touchdowns) are both experienced returnees while other lettermen include senior Isaiah Parker and Kendrick Jackson.

**MYERS HEALTHY, HOPEFUL** – VMI redshirt junior Quan Myers finds himself in the same spot he was at this time two years – atop the depth chart at running back for the season opener. Myers was the 2016 season opener starter at Akron but injuries curtailed the rest of the season. He saw action in only seven games in the 2017 season. In the 2018 season opener at Toledo, Myers led the Keydets in rushing with 43 yards on 12 carries.

**APR HONOR** - The VMI football program was recognized for improved academics by the Division I FCS Athletics Directors Association during the recent convention held in Washington, D.C. in late June.

The Keydet gridders were awarded with a plaque for having the most improved Academic Progress Rate (APR) score in the Southern Conference. The APR measures eligibility, graduation and retention each semester or academic term and provides a clear picture of the academic performance for each team in every sport.

All teams must meet an academic threshold of 930 to qualify for the postseason and can face penalties for continued low academic performance. The most recent APRs are multiyear rates based on scores from the 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17 academic years.

“We are, of course, very proud of the football team’s academic performance and appreciate the steady leadership Coach Wachenheim has provided in underscoring excellence in the classroom,” said VMI Athletics Director Dr. Dave Diles. “The team deserves to be commended for this accomplishment.”

More than two-thirds of the Southern Conference’s sponsored sports beat last year’s averages in the most recent Academic Progress Rate data released by the NCAA, with the league’s

nine football-playing members combining to rank third among all Division I conferences nationally.

SoCon football teams combined for a 982 APR, good for third in the FCS and overall in Division I.

**TWO FBS FOES** – VMI will play two FBS opponents in 2018 with the opener September 2 at Toledo and the season finale at Old Dominion November 17. It marks the first time since 2010 that VMI played two FBS teams in the same year as the Keydets traveled to Virginia and Army.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT CONTINUES** – The 2018 VMI Football roster continues to have a youthful appearance as 56 of the 86 on the current roster are freshman and sophomores. Of the freshman on the roster, 28 are true freshman. The Keydets have just eight seniors on the 2018 roster with three listed as redshirt seniors.

**NEW FACES ON STAFF** – Seven new coaches assistant coaches have joined head coach Scott Wachenheim's staff for 2018. The group includes offensive coordinator Brian Sheppard, defensive line coach Seth Payne, running backs coach Albert Reid, outside linebackers coach Jeff Sejour, cornerbacks coach Tarron Williams, wide receivers coach Billy Cosh, and tight ends coach Penn Stephenson.

**VMI ON ESPN3/ESPN+** - VMI will have all its 2018 games carried on either ESPN3 or ESPN+. The Keydets will appear on ESPN3 against Toledo Sept.2, Mercer Sept. 29, and The Citadel Oct. 20. All other eight games will be on ESPN+. ESPN3 can be free of charge accessed with a qualifying cable or internet provider while ESPN+ requires a monthly \$4.99 subscription fee.

# Last Meeting with Old Dominion - November 13, 2010

## Keydets Fall to Old Dominion, 45-28

NORFOLK, Va. - Old Dominion rallied from a first half deficit with 31 straight points and redshirt junior quarterback Thomas Demarco tossed three touchdowns to lead the Monarchs to a 45-28 win over VMI before 19,782 spectators at Foreman Field Saturday afternoon.

Despite the loss, the VMI offense posted its best numbers of the season in total offense rolling up 370 total yards. The 140 yards rushing was also a season best and the 235 yards passing was the second highest mark in 2010.

Junior receiver T.J. Talley caught three passes for 79 yards and scored two touchdowns while redshirt junior quarterback Chaz Jones turned in VMI's first 100-yard rushing effort of the season with 114 yards and a touchdown.

VMI freshman quarterback Eric Kordenbrock started the game and completed 12 of 22 passes for 175 yards and a touchdown in the first half, but exited the game with injury on the first play from scrimmage in the second half after an interception. Redshirt junior quarterback Cam Jones took over for the rest of the day and completed seven of 15 passes for 55 yards and threw two touchdown passes.

The Keydets jumped out to early 7-0 and 14-7 leads but the Monarchs (7-3) capitalized on two turnovers and two missed field goals by the visitors to seize the lead in the second quarter and move on to the victory..

VMI scored first taking advantage of an ODU fumble on the game's opening drive that was recovered by redshirt junior linebacker Eric Church at the ODU 27. Chaz Jones slammed in from the one-yard line for a TD, his fifth carry on the possession that helped account for his 23 yards on the ground and VMI took a 7-0 lead with 11:34 remaining in the first quarter following Jeff Sexton's extra point.

The Monarchs tied the game with a 10-play, 68-yard drive that was capped by a Desmond Williams 3-yard touchdown rush off an option pitch and Jarod Brown's extra point knotted the score at 7-7 with 8:16 left in the opening quarter. Demarco accounted for most of the yardage off the scoring drive with four carries for 31 yards rushing and three of four pass completions for 34 yards through the air.

VMI retook the lead with 6:30 remaining in the first quarter after T.J. Talley snagged a Kordenbrock swing pass in the left flat and raced down the boundary for a 55-yard scoring play. It was VMI's second longest pass play of the year and a career-long reception by Talley.

Old Dominion closed within 14-10 at the 9:23 mark of the second quarter after Brown converted a 24-yard field goal to close a drive that featured a 48-yard pass completion on a third-and-18 from the ODU 12 to junior wideout Prentice Gill.

# Game 1 - VMI at Toledo - Sept. 1

## Keydets Fall in Season Opener at Toledo

TOLEDO, Ohio - The Toledo Rockets soared in their 2018 opener, handing VMI a 66-3 setback before 24,136 spectators Saturday night at the Glass Bowl.



Toledo, the defending MAC champions, piled up over 600 yards of total offense, racing out to a 42-3 halftime lead and never looking back.

Things went awry for the Keydets from the beginning. VMI's first two drives mustered negative yardage, and with 10:38 to play in the first quarter, Toledo's Cody Thompson blocked a punt and returned it three yards for the first score of the game. By the time the first half ended, the Rockets had found the end zone five more times to race out to the huge halftime lead.

VMI's only threat came midway through the second period. Thanks to a 38-yard completion from sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski to sophomore Kris Thornton, VMI marched all the way to the Toledo 10-yard line. But the drive stalled there, and the Keydets had to settle for junior Reed King's 28-yard field goal that cut the Toledo lead to 28-3 with 8:42 to play before intermission.

Udinski, who closed last season with a 200-yard passing performance in the 2017 finale, opened 2018 by completing 25 of 42 passes for 151 yards. Udinski completed passes to 11 different receivers, including Thornton, who hauled in eight of those throws for 57 yards.

However, a pair of interceptions proved costly and Toledo registered four sacks. The Keydets also lost a fumble to run their turnover total for the game to three, and VMI managed only 61 yards rushing on 31 attempts.

Toledo, which tacked on three more touchdowns in the third quarter to really put the game out of reach, rushed for 213 yards and added 390 more through the air. Bryant Koback ran for 67 yards on nine carries and scored a pair of rushing touchdowns for the Rockets, while Shakif Seymour chipped in with two rushing TDs of his own.

Toledo quarterback Mitchell Guadagni threw only 16 passes in the game, but he completed 11 of them for 265 yards and three touchdowns to three different receivers.

# Game 2 - VMI at No. 7 Wofford - Sept. 8

## Keydets Fall to No. 7 Wofford on the Road

SPARTANBURG, S.C. - With a balanced offensive attack that piled up nearly 700 yards of total offense, Wofford knocked off VMI, 59-14, Saturday night in Spartanburg, South Carolina, in the Southern Conference football opener for both teams.



The Terriers, the defending SoCon champions and among the nation's leaders in rushing offense, again turned in a stellar performance with its option offense, grinding out 450 yards on the ground. In all, 14 different players carried the ball for Wofford, and five of them ran for touchdowns. Leading the way was Nathan Walker, who netted 92 yards and a touchdown on just nine rushing attempts.

However, it was through the air that the Terriers struck first. Wofford quarterback Joe Newman tossed a 25-yard scoring pass to Jason Hill with 7:25 remaining in the first quarter to get Wofford on the board for the first time, and he later connected with Landon Parker for a 21-yard touchdown pass to push the Terrier lead to 28-0 early in the second period.

The Wofford lead grew to 35-0 before VMI scored its first touchdown of the 2018 season. The Keydets, who opened the game with a 12-play drive that resulted in a missed field goal, needed just 2:33 to march 75 yards late in the first half, and sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski finished off the 11-play drive with a 4-yard TD pass to freshman Jakob Herress. Junior Reed King added the PAT kick, and VMI cut the deficit to 35-7.

Udinski was not the only VMI quarterback to toss a TD pass Saturday night. With 4:00 to play in the game, redshirt junior Austin Coulling came off the bench to lead an 11-play, 73-yard drive, finishing it with a 12-yard scoring toss to redshirt sophomore Matt Blaser.

Udinski completed 21 of his 35 pass attempts in the game for 162 yards and the touchdown. Coulling was 7-for-11 through the air for the Keydets, finishing the game with 54 yards, the touchdown and an interception.

Junior Javeon Lara was the beneficiary of most of those aeriels, hauling in seven passes for 76 yards. Sophomore Devone Humphrey had four receptions.

Defensively, the Keydets were led by redshirt sophomore linebacker Devin Carper, who was in on 10 tackles for VMI. Freshman linebacker Ethan Caselberry recorded nine stops.

# Game 3 - VMI vs. ETSU - Sept. 14

## Keydets Fall to ETSU in Home Opener



LEXINGTON, Va. - Despite a career-high 305 passing yards from sophomore Reece Udinski and a 17-13 lead at the half, the VMI football team fell by a 27-24 score to visiting ETSU Friday evening at Foster Stadium in a game that was rescheduled due to the incoming Hurricane Florence.

With the loss, the Keydets fall to 0-3 on the season, 0-2 in the Southern Conference, while the Buccaneers improve to 2-1 overall, 1-0 in league play. In their third year of NCAA competition after restoring the program in 2016, the Bucs earned their first SoCon road victory since the 2002 season.

Udinski set a VMI school record for passing attempts with 60 during the game as he completed a career-high 27 attempts and threw for a career-high 305 yards. He broke the former record of 57 set by quarterback Joey Gibson against ETSU in 2001. The last time a VMI QB threw for 300 yards was October 31, 2015, when Al Cobb threw for 370 against Wofford. His 27 completions also ties for 10th in program history for a single game.

Keydet receiver Kris Thornton also played a solid game as he set a career high with 119 receiving yards, topping his 108 in the Wofford game last season.

Defensively, AJ Smith set a career high with 11 tackles while Collin Loftis also set a new personal mark with six stops in the game. Uzoma Kpaduwa (10 tackles) and Elliott Brewster (8) also set personal bests in tackles for a single game.

The Keydets recovered from a slow start after ETSU returned a punt return 69 yards for a touchdown 1:26 into the game and the offense failed to find rhythm during the opening quarter. Things picked up for VMI in the second quarter when Quan Myers capped a 15-play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard run at the 14:00 mark. Seconds later, the VMI defense stepped up when Devin Carper intercepted a pass at the ETSU 15-yard line and ran it in for a touchdown to put VMI up, 14-7. The teams exchanged field goals the remainder of the period to put the Keydets up, 17-13, at the break.

Down 27-24 early in the fourth quarter following a Quay Holmes TD scamper for ETSU, the Keydets attempted several rallies in the final 11 minutes of regulation but could not find the endzone. In the final drive, the Keydets were aided by a string of ETSU penalties and a 29-yard pass completion from Udinski to Javeon Lara to put VMI at the ETSU 31, but the Keydets could not move the ball farther in what resulted in a turnover on downs with 45 seconds to play.

# Game 4 - VMI at Western Carolina - Sept. 22

## Keydets Fall to Western Carolina in Shootout

CULLOWHEE, N.C. - Western

Carolina scored the first two touchdowns of the second half and held off a spirited VMI rally to hand the Keydets their second-straight heartbreaking defeat in Southern Conference football action, 52-50, Saturday afternoon in Cullowhee, North Carolina.



With VMI trailing by eight points, 45-37, WCU intercepted a Reece Udinski pass and returned it 46 yards for a touchdown and the game looked bleak for the Keydets down 52-37, but VMI refused to fold.

Udinski led VMI on a 9-play drive that culminated with a 10-yard touchdown pass to junior Javeon Lara to cut the Catamount lead to 52-44, and just one play later the Keydets got the ball back when redshirt freshman Collin Loftis intercepted a pass to set VMI up at its own 38-yard line.

Fifteen plays later, the Keydets found the end zone again. Udinski fired a scoring strike to freshman tight end Jakob Herres from 12 yards out to pull VMI to within 52-50 with just 22 seconds remaining in the contest. The 50 points scored was the most for VMI since totaling 52 against Davidson in 2014.

VMI fell short on its bid to tie the game, however. Udinski's two-point pass fell incomplete, and WCU escaped with the victory.

After setting a career-high in passing last week against East Tennessee State, Udinski rewrote the VMI record books Saturday against the Catamounts, setting new single-game marks for completions, attempts and yards. The sophomore went 43-for-72 through the air for 491 yards and four touchdowns in the game.

Lara was his favorite target, snagging nine passes for 143 yards, both career bests, and a pair of scores as nine different Keydets recorded receptions. Sophomore Kris Thornton finished with eight catches for 82 yards, and junior running back Quan Myers had seven grabs. Devone Humphrey hauled in six passes.

The game was a shootout from the beginning. The two teams exchanged touchdowns early in the contest, but VMI took the lead in the second period when Myers, who led VMI with 76 rushing yards on 23 attempts and scored a one-yard touchdown late in the first quarter, scored the second of his three touchdowns from a two yards out. Reed King added the PAT kick, and the Keydets had a 21-14 advantage.

With the loss, VMI falls to 0-4 on the season, 0-2 in conference play. Western Carolina improves to 3-0, 1-0.

# Game 5 - VMI vs. Mercer - Sept. 29

## Keydets Outlasted by Mercer, 48-38



LEXINGTON, Va. - Down 41-20 at the end of the third quarter, the VMI football team rallied to cut the Mercer advantage to 41-38 with two minutes remaining but could not quite pull off the comeback as the Bears escaped with a 48-38 victory Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium.

The VMI (0-5, 0-4 SoCon) defense started the rally with a Chuck Weatherman safety with just under 10 minutes left to play. In the ensuing possession the Keydets executed an 8-play, 67-yard drive in 2:22 as sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski found freshman Jakob Herres in the endzone to cut the Bear lead to 41-30.

The Keydets forced a punt on Mercer's possession and took the ball with under 5:00 left and drove down the field for another score, this time with Udinski finding Kris Thornton for a 3-yard touchdown pass to cap a 6-play, 75-yard drive.

Mercer was able to recover a VMI onside kick and took a short field to work with to their advantage as Tyray Devezin put the game away with a 34-yard touchdown scamper up the middle to clinch the Mercer victory.

Udinski finished the game with 434 yards passing going 37-for-70 on the day. All three totals were the second-best marks of his career following last week's performance at Western Carolina. On VMI's first touchdown of the day he connected with Javeon Lara for a 59-yard strike, the longest pass play to this point of his VMI career.

Thornton and Lara earned career highs in receiving yards as Thornton totaled 155 yards on the day and Lara tallied 150 receiving yards. Lara and junior Rohan Martin also earned career highs in number of catches with 10 and 7, respectively.

Mason Dermott had a strong day on special teams as he returned six kickoffs for a total of 162 yards including returns of 34 and 49 yards. With the totals he became VMI all-time career leader for the category in both kickoff return yards (2,233) and career kickoff returns (104).

The Keydets look to take a week off to heal with a bye week next Saturday, Oct. 6. VMI will return to the field on Oct. 13 with a SoCon away game at Samford at 3 p.m. in Birmingham, Alabama.

# Game 6 - VMI at Samford - Oct. 13

## Samford Pulls Away to Top Keydets

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. - Averaging over 35 points per game entering Saturday's Southern Conference football matchup with VMI, Samford's prolific offense kept rolling against the Keydets as the Bulldogs earned a 73-22 win Saturday afternoon in Birmingham, Alabama.



Although the Keydets kept the game close in the first half, the Bulldogs scored on their first seven possessions of the second half and pulled away for the victory.

The Keydets (0-6, 0-5 SoCon) played toe-to-toe with their host for most of the first half. VMI took a 3-0 lead midway through the first quarter when junior Grant Clemons booted a 40-yard field goal, and the Keydets enjoyed a 9-7 advantage after sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski connected with junior Javeon Lara to complete a 72-yard touchdown pass with 6:53 to play in the opening period.

The Bulldogs (3-5, 2-2) responded with three straight scores to take a 28-9 lead, but VMI roared back. Udinski and Lara teamed up again for an 18-yard TD pass at the 8:17 mark of the second quarter. Less than two minutes later, the Keydets struck again, this time with redshirt junior Quan Myers bulling his way into the end zone from a yard out to trim the Samford lead to 28-22.

The Bulldogs scored twice more before intermission and then had the seven straight scores to start the second half to pull away.

After scoring 66 points a week ago, Samford piled up 776 yards of total offense. Quarterback Devlin Hodges accounted for much of that total, completing 32 of his 41 pass attempts for 476 yards and seven touchdowns. He also carried the ball nine times for 32 yards and a score.

The Bulldogs also ground out 289 rushing yards. Running back Demarcus Ware finished the game with 128 yards and a pair of touchdowns on just 10 carries, while Roland Adams tallied 90 yards on 10 tries.

VMI's offense found the going tough after halftime. The Keydets crossed midfield just twice in the final two quarters, and their deepest threat ended at the Samford 9-yard line as time expired.

Udinski, who threw for over 400 yards in each of VMI's last two contests, finished Saturday's game 22-for-34 through the air for 270 yards and the two touchdowns. Lara, VMI's leading receiver, finished the game with five catches for 141 yards.

Defensively, VMI was led by redshirt sophomore linebacker Elliot Brewster, who had 11 tackles and an interception in the second quarter that led to VMI's final touchdown of the half. Freshman safety Ethan Caselberry notched on 10 tackles.

## Keydets Come Up Short Against The Citadel, 34-32

LEXINGTON, Va. - Looking to return the Silver Shako back to Lexington after an 11-year drought, the VMI football team came up just short as The Citadel escaped with a 34-32 win over the Keydets Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium.



Down 31-20 with just over nine minutes to play in the game, the Keydets battled back with a quick 65-yard touchdown strike from Reece Udinski to Kris Thornton to trim the Bulldog lead to 31-26 but the two-point pass conversion failed as the ball was batted down at the goal line. After a Citadel field goal with 2:30 to play to make the score 34-26, the Keydets marched down the field and scored on a 27-yard reception from Udinski to freshman Jakob Herres, but the two-point play to tie the game was unsuccessful as Udinski's pass sailed a little high over Devone Humphrey's hands. The Bulldogs took a knee in the ensuing possession to result in the game's final 34-32 score.

Udinski set a single game program record with 456 yards of total offense. He also set a new program standard with 49 completions during the game in addition to throwing a career-best five touchdown passes. Leading receiver Kris Thornton caught 11 passes for 146 yards including the 65-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter, the longest reception of his VMI career.

Defensively, Elliott Brewster led the way for the Keydets with a career-best 15 tackles including two tackles for loss.

The Citadel quarterback Jordan Black led all rushers with 155 net yards for the day on 23 carries including a 71-yard touchdown run in the third quarter.

Herres finished the game with 117 receiving yards for second most on the VMI offense while Alex Ramsey caught eight passes for 36 yards. All five of VMI's touchdowns came through the air as Thornton had two and Rohan Martin, Quan Myers and Herres each tallied one for the day.

The Keydets return to SoCon action next Saturday on the road as they travel to Chattanooga to take on the Mocs in a 3 p.m. kickoff in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

# Game 8 - VMI at Chattanooga - Oct. 27

## VMI Rally not Enough in Loss at Chattanooga

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. - Despite a 14-point lead in the first half, the VMI football team came up a little short of its first victory of the season as host Chattanooga built enough defense to hold off the Keydets, 34-27, Saturday evening at Finley Stadium in Chattanooga, Tennessee.



The Keydets (0-8, 0-7 SoCon) took the early lead when redshirt junior Quan Myers capped a 13-play, 70-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run. Then, just over a minute later, sophomore linebacker Tyren Cloyd intercepted a Chattanooga pass and returned it 29 yards for a score. The PAT kick from junior Grant Clemons gave VMI a 14-0 lead with 6:38 remaining in the first quarter.

The Mocs (6-2, 4-2 SoCon) got on the board when quarterback Nick Tiano completed a 64-yard touchdown pass to Bryce Nunnelly to trim the VMI lead to 14-7. But the Keydets responded with another long drive.

Marching 79 yards in 13 plays and chewing up over five minutes of the game clock, the Keydets found the end zone again, with sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski finding freshman wideout Jakob Herres for a 7-yard touchdown pass. The Clemons kick put VMI back in front by two touchdowns, 21-7, with just five seconds gone in the second period.

Chattanooga scored the next two touchdowns of the half to tie the game, 21-21, at intermission. After the break, the Moc defense took over.

Udinski was sacked for a 9-yard loss on the first play of the third quarter, and VMI managed just three first downs until a late touchdown drive in the fourth quarter. For the game, the Mocs recorded seven quarterback sacks and held VMI to only seven plays and zero total yards in the third quarter.

Meanwhile, Chattanooga, which held the ball for over 14 minutes on its two second-half scoring drives, took the lead when Tyrell Price plunged into the end zone from five yards out. Alex Trotter added a 19-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to give the hosts a 34-21 advantage.

VMI made it interesting late in the game. Going 91 yards in just over two minutes, the Keydets cut the lead to seven points when Udinski connected with sophomore wide receiver Devone Humphrey on a 2-yard touchdown pass with just over a minute remaining in the game. But Chattanooga recovered the ensuing onside kick and ran out the clock to preserve the victory.

## Keydets Take Down Tusculum, 20-11

LEXINGTON, Va. - The VMI football team picked up its first win of the season as the Keydets took down visiting Tusculum College by a 20-11 score Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium.

With the win came additional broken records for the program as sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski threw 17 pass completions to make his season total 271, surpassing the previous mark of 269 set by Al Cobb in 2014.

The Keydets (1-8, 0-7) went away from their traditional air attack by rushing the ball 45 times today, including 23 carries from Alex Ramsey for 134 yards as both were new career highs for the redshirt sophomore.

Defensively, freshman linebacker Brett Howell set a new season and career high with 16 tackles for the day, including one tackle for loss.

After both teams went scoreless in the opening quarter, the Keydets struck first with 5:33 to play before the half as Udinski took it into the endzone on his own on a one-yard rush. The Pioneers (5-4) would trim the VMI lead to 7-3 with a 48-yard field goal by Joe Defatta just four seconds before halftime.

The Keydets extended the lead to 14-3 late in the third quarter when Udinski connected with Devone Humphrey for an 11-yard touchdown reception. On the ensuing Tusculum drive, the Keydet defense stepped up as defensive lineman Chuck Weatherman sacked Tommy Pistone and forced a fumble recovered by Tyren Cloyd at the Tusculum 39-yard line to give the Keydets a short field.

The VMI offense responded by going down and scoring a touchdown by Quan Myers on a two-yard scamper to put the Keydets up, 20-3.

Tusculum would go on to earn a safety and touchdown midway through the final quarter but the rally was insufficient as VMI held on for the win.

The Keydets return to Southern Conference action next Saturday by hosting Furman for Senior Day to mark the final home game of the 2018 season.

# Game 10 - VMI vs. Furman - Nov. 10

## Furman Runs for 49-13 Victory over VMI

LEXINGTON, Va. – Devin Wynn and Corey Watkins combined for 191 yards and five touchdowns Saturday afternoon to lead Furman University to a 49-13 victory over VMI at Foster Stadium in a Southern Conference contest.



VMI sophomore quarterback Reece Udinski set the school single-season record for yards, and tied the program top mark for touchdowns. He now has 2,988 yards, passing Al Cobb's 2,971 in 2014, and tied Cobb's mark in 2014 with 20 touchdowns on the year. Udinski already owns the program mark for most completions in a single season. He also set the school total plays record in a season with 570 plays and is second for most yards of total offense. He has 2,817 yards currently and needs 279 to break the record against Old Dominion University next Saturday.

Wynn scored twice and Harris Roberts found Jake Walker for a 33-yard score as the Paladins opened a 21-0 lead late in the first quarter. The Keydets answered back with 1:08 left in the first quarter on a 60-yard toss from Udinski to Javeon Lara.

Watkins ran it in from five yards out midway through the second period and Roberts and Walker connected again, this time from 69 yards out, to make the score 35-7 at intermission.

Furman added two more touchdowns in the third. Lara caught a 25-yard touchdown pass from Chance Newman to end the scoring.

Udinski completed 21-of-33 passes for 224 yards and one TD. Lara caught seven balls for 120 yards and the two touchdowns while Kris Thornton made eight receptions for 62 yards.

Brett Howell led the Keydets with 11 total tackles. A.J. Smith had nine stops and Ethan Caselberry had eight.

Wynn finished the day with 113 yards and three touchdowns on 15 carries. Watkins had 13 totes for 78 yards and two scores as the Paladins ran for 288 total yards on the afternoon. Roberts completed 13-of-17 passes for 261 yards and Adrian Hope made six tackles with two sacks and one forced fumble for Furman (5-4/5-2 SoCon). Furman converted on 11-of-14 third-down conversions, to VMI's 4-of-12.

VMI's 14 seniors were honored in a pre-game ceremony on Senior Day.
