#### HITTER OF THE WEEK

##### TRISTAN GRAY, RICE

Sophomore, OF, Houston, Texas  
Gray batted a composite .462 (6-of-13) last week with two RBI and two runs scored to help the Owls go 4-0, taking a road game at longtime rival Texas State and sweeping C-USA foe WKU at home. He had a hit in every game to extend his current hitting streak to five-straight, and he clubbed two doubles for a team-best .615 slugging percentage. Gray doubled home an insurance run in the narrow 3-1 win at Texas State, then singled and scored the go-ahead run in the Friday series-opener against WKU. The Houston native tied a career-high with three hits in the second game of the WKU series, but it was his heads-up play in a rundown between first and second base that allowed the Owls' tying run to score from third (before he later drove in a run in the 5-2 victory).

#### PITCHER OF THE WEEK

##### JOSHUA SHAPIRO, MARSHALL

Sophomore, LHP, Columbus, Ohio  
Shapiro earned his first collegiate victory on Sunday over the No. 16 Florida Atlantic Owls with seven scoreless innings, while striking out five. The Columbus, Ohio native scattered four hits against one of the league's top hitting teams to lead Marshall to its first win over a ranked opponent in three years. Shapiro, who becomes the first Thundering Herd hurler to be named C-USA Pitcher of the Week since 2014, has a combined stat line of his last two starts of 12.2 innings pitched with 14 strikeouts and one earned run on four hits.

## C-USA NOTEBOOK

### CHARLOTTE

The 49ers were 1-2 at Middle Tennessee over the weekend. Sophomore 2B **Brett Netzer** extended his hitting streak to 14 games during the series and had a pair of doubles in Saturday's 8-4 victory. Netzer, who is one of five starters batting over .300, continues to lead the squad with a .368 average. Junior OF **T.J. Nichting**, who is second on the team with a .357 average, has hit safely in 12 consecutive outings. The Charlotte offense kept rolling on Saturday, registering their ninth-straight double-digit hit effort, although that streak was snapped on Sunday when they were held to a season-low three. The Niners have posted 10 or more hits 23 times this season. Freshman RHP **Colton Laws** picked up his third win of the year on Saturday, going the first six innings while fanning a career-high six. Sophomore LHP **Matt Horkey** registered his first career save, throwing the final three innings and tossing a two-hit shutout.

### FIU

The Panthers were 1-2 at Louisiana Tech in a pitching-dominated series. Junior RHP **Cody Crouse**, who had elbow surgery last year and was worked back slowly into the rotation this season by pitching midweek games on a pitch count, was finally back in his familiar Friday spot in the rotation and with no limitations delivered his best performance in an FIU uniform with a career-high 8.1 shutout innings. He struck out five and scattered five hits in a 1-0 victory. Crouse has made two career starts at Louisiana Tech. After throwing 8 1/3 scoreless innings Friday against the Bulldogs, Crouse now has pitched 14.2 shutout innings in Ruston. FIU continues its singles trend. In the last seven games the Panthers have 62 hits and 55 of those hits are singles.

### (17) FLORIDA ATLANTIC

The Owls won their fourth C-USA series of the season, taking the first two games against Marshall in Beckley, West Virginia over the weekend. Florida Atlantic still holds the best overall record in the league at 25-8 (11-4 in league play). Friday's series-opening 6-3 win in 11 innings marked the fourth extra-inning game in six outings for the Owls. Junior 3B **Austin Langham** had a strong series, going 6-for-13 (.462) with a double, two RBI and two runs scored. Junior RHP **Cameron Ragsdale** picked up his league-leading ninth save in the series opener. Saturday's 10-2 victory marked the 10th time this season that the Owls have scored double-digit runs in a game. FAU is averaging 6.9 runs per game.

### LOUISIANA TECH

The Bulldogs used strong pitching to take a series from FIU this past weekend, allowing two total runs in winning two-of-three games. In just his second start of the season, junior RHP **Casey Sutton** pitched a complete game shutout Sunday in a 5-0 series-clinching victory. Sutton improved to 4-0 after he allowed just three hits while walking one and striking out five. He retired 24 of the last 26 batters he faced, including retiring the last 10 batters over the final four innings. Sutton is now 4-0 (the best record of any LA Tech pitcher) and has posted a 1.30 ERA in 34.2 innings pitched this season, while holding opposing hitters to a .198 batting average. Junior RHP **Cameron Linck** started Saturday's 6-1 win and earned the victory after pitching 7.1 innings, his longest outing this season, while striking out a season-high 10 batters. He allowed just one run on four hits and did not walk a batter in earning his second win of the season.

### MARSHALL

The Thundering Herd closed out their series against No. 16 Florida Atlantic with a 7-2 victory, their first win over a ranked opponent since 2013. At 18-15 overall, Marshall has its best 33-game start to a season since a 19-14 mark in 2001. Junior OF **Corey Bird** hit safely in each game of the series, including posting his 13th multi-hit game of the year on Saturday. Sophomore 3B **Tyler Ratliff** posted his second straight multiple-hit game on Sunday and matched his career high with four RBI, notching three on his fourth homer of the season.

### MIDDLE TENNESSEE

The Blue Raiders won their weekend series over Charlotte, two games to one. Junior SS **Riley Delgado** has a streak of six straight multi-hit games and has a team-best 20 multi-hit games this season. He also has current nine-game hit streak after having a 14-game hit streak earlier in the season. Freshman **A.J. Spencer** responded favorably to his first career starts, earning his first career start against Vanderbilt Tuesday, and starting all three games of the Charlotte series at DH. Spencer connected on home runs against Charlotte in the Friday and Saturday games. The Blue Raiders improved to 5-0 in extra innings this season when they defeated Charlotte, 12-11, in 10 innings Friday. Middle Tennessee has won its last 10 extra-inning games overall, dating back to 2015. After going almost two years without a complete-game shutout, Middle Tennessee has had two in as many weeks. Sophomore LHP **Jake Wyrick** joined Nate Hoffmann as the only Blue Raiders with complete-game shutouts. Wyrick tossed a three-hit shutout against Charlotte in the rubber game of the series Sunday.

### OLD DOMINION

The Monarchs dropped two-of-three games at home against UTSA this past weekend. Senior CF **Connor Myers** had multiple hits in each game, finishing the series 6-for-13 (.462) with three RBI and a run scored. Myers leads the team in nearly every offensive category, including batting average, slugging percentage, hits, doubles, home runs, and runs scored. Junior SS **Zach Rutherford** hit safely in each game of the series.

### (13) RICE

Rice took three games from WKU in 24 hours Friday night and Saturday and is now tied for first place with a 12-3 league record. With the Owls' doubleheader sweep on Saturday, head coach **Wayne Graham** recorded his 1,100th win at the helm of the Rice program. Graham is in his 25th season with the Owls and he celebrated his 80th birthday earlier this month. The Blue & Gray tallied 15 hits in the opener of the WKU series, its highest single game total of the season. Sophomore reliever **Glenn Otto** earned saves in both games of the WKU double-header Saturday to give him a team-leading total of seven saves overall. The right-hander has not allowed a run in any of his eight C-USA appearances this season, where he has amassed a total of 21 strikeouts in 13.1 innings and held the league's hitters to a composite .140 batting average. Senior LHP **Blake Fox** tallied a career-high nine strikeouts while pitching a solid 8.0 innings that is the second-longest outing of his collegiate career in game one Saturday. The victory was Fox' 29th at Rice, moving him up to sole possession of sixth place on the school's all-time list for career wins. Junior OF **Dayne Wunderlich** blasted his first career grand slam Friday against WKU. The four RBI are the most by an Owl in a single game all year.

### (19) SOUTHERN MISS

Southern Miss finished the week with a 5-1 win at No. 8 Mississippi, the Golden Eagles dropped two of three at UAB over the weekend, their first C-USA series loss since April, 2015. In its 11-0, seven-inning victory over UAB in the series finale, the Golden Eagles utilized the 10-run rule for the third time this season in league play. The Golden Eagles left 35 runners stranded in the UAB series, including a season-high 14 against UAB in the middle game of the set. With senior **Michael Gilbert**'s grand slam on Sunday, the Golden Eagles now have 12 of 14 players who have homered at least one time this season. Southern Miss, among the nation's leaders in homers, has collected 44 this season including four in the UAB series. It also was the second grand slam that the Golden Eagles have hit this season. The Saturday 8-7 loss to UAB marked the team's first for a Saturday this season and also the first one-run game setback in four tries in 2016. It was also the first time in 21 games this season that the Golden Eagles led after seven inning and lost. Senior DH **Tim Lynch** has tied for the most RBI since the 2011 season as he currently has 42 on the season. With his seven strikeouts on Sunday, sophomore **Kirk McCarty** leads the team with 52 on the year.

### UAB

The Blazers won their second C-USA series of the season by taking the first two games against No. 18 Southern Miss at home this past weekend. Freshman DH **Jared Nixon** rode into the UAB baseball record books by way of a cycle Friday night, leading the Blazers to a 5-3 victory. Nixon was 4-for-5 with two RBI, knocked in the go-ahead run in the sixth, and recorded the first cycle hit by a Blazer since Matt Womble accomplished the feat May 8, 2002, against Birmingham-Southern. The home run and triple were each the first of his career. Nixon also walked and scored a run in Saturday's 8-7 win over the Golden Eagles. Senior RHP **Thomas Lowery** converted both save opportunities against Southern Miss on Friday and Saturday. He entered Saturday's game in the eighth, inheriting two runners with no outs, but escaped the inning with a double play and pop-up. The two saves bumped his season-total to six.

### UTSA

UTSA earned its first conference series win of 2016 as the Roadrunners won the last two games of the weekend tilt at Old Dominion behind strong pitching. Junior LHP **Karl Craigie** pitched his first career complete game shutout in a 3-0 decision Saturday, matching a season-best with five strikeouts for the second straight start. Sophomore RHP **Chance Kirby** went six innings and allowed two runs on eight hits for the win on Sunday, striking out three and gave up three walks. Freshman OF **Ryan Stacy** led the team in hitting (.462), slugging percentage (.615), hits (6) and sacrifice hits (3) last week. He collected his sixth and seventh game with multiple hits while matching season-bests with two hits against Incarnate Word and ODU (Friday). Senior OF **Matt Hilston** continues to lead Conference USA and rank fourth among the national leaders with 40 walks in 39 games.

### WKU

The Hilltoppers dropped four games to nationally-ranked opponents on the road last week, including a conference series at No. 19 Rice. Senior 3B **Danny Hudzina** had another great week at the tallying a hit, a RBI and a double in every game, pushing his reached-base streak to 40 games. He finished with seven hits, four doubles, four RBI and a walk. In the Saturday doubleheader, Hudzina went 5-for-7 with a pair of doubles and RBI to post a 1.000 slugging percentage and a .750 on-base percentage, notching three hits in the first game and two in the second. For the week, he hit .467 with a .500 on-base percentage and .733 slug. Junior LHP **Ryan Thurston** gave WKU another solid showing on the mound in the series finale, picking up his third quality start in C-USA action by going 7.2 innings and striking out seven at Rice. The 7.2 innings by Thurston tied for the longest outing of the year by a WKU pitcher. Junior closer **Jackson Sowell** has been lights out in the new role this season, ranking third in C-USA with seven saves, which tie for the fifth-most in a single season in school history. He has a team-best 0.96 ERA in 13 relief appearances as opposing batters have just a .138 average against him.

## USM'S BRALEY NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF MONTH

The National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) has released its National Player of the Month awards for February and Southern Miss sophomore third baseman Taylor Braley was named National Hitter of the Month.

Braley has started the season on a tear, homering five times in Southern Miss' first seven games – two more blasts than he had in all of 2015 – and posting a seven-game hitting streak. He boasts a .480 batting average, 12 RBI and 10 runs, a 1.160 slugging percentage and a .618 on-base mark to lead the Golden Eagles to a perfect 7-0 start. He homered in each game to lead Southern Miss to a three-game sweep of Eastern Illinois on opening weekend and finished last weekend's series against Northwestern State with dingers in each of the last two contests.
