FLORIDA ATLANTIC AT OLD DOMINION

Only team in America - Florida Atlantic University's football team was the only team in the country to play two Top 20 teams in back-to-back weeks to open the 2019 season. FAU opened with No. 5 Ohio State and played No. 18 UCF the following week.

The Take Away - Florida Atlantic is 4-3 on the season. Halfway through 2019 they are one win shy of the team's total wins a year ago. What is the difference?

Blocking the Way - Former Texas defensive lineman Marcel Southall recorded a tackle for loss and blocked an extra point attempt against UCF; FAU's now blocked a kick in six of its last nine games dating back to 2018.

Tight End Duo - Senior tight ends Harrison Bryant and John Raine have snagged a combined 53 receptions through seven games, tops among all FBS tight end duos. Raine has four TDs.

First Among Linebackers - While Akileis Leroy didn't rush the passer much in 2018, he's dominating in that role this year. The junior has 3.5 sacks in seven games - tied for first among FBS linebackers. He also is tied third nationally in tackles for a loss with 8.5.

Making the Grade - Quarterback Chris Robison completed 80.5 percent of his passes against Ball State, the third highest mark of his career.

Protecting the Ball Equals Wins - Robison struggled to protect the ball as a freshman. In his first campaign, he had tossed three INT through three games and ended the year with 12. He has lessened the

mistakes in 2019, to just three. Through 18 starts, the Owls are 6-1 when he throws no INTs and 3-8 when opponents record a pick.

Right Place, Right Time, All Game - That's the only way to describe linebacker Rashad Smith's early-season play. He recovered two fumbles against Ball State, increasing his season total to three. He added an interception versus Wagner and another versus MT. Smith has the most turnovers created among FBS linebackers.

Surpassing a High - Wide receiver John Mitchell came into the year with only 129 career receiving yards. He nearly eclipsed that number in the Ball State game alone, breaking out to the tune of 124 yards and three touchdowns on eight receptions. He currently is second on the squad with 56.14 yards per game. He has 51 catches for 393 yards and four TDs.

Four Score - USF graduate transfer DeAngelo Antoine followed John Mitchell's program-record tying Week Three performance - three touchdowns - with a record-breaking one of his own. Against Wagner, Antoine snagged an FAU-high four scores, along with 173 yards and 11 catches.

Painting the Field with Receptions - Deangelo Antoine caught four TD receptions versus Wagner. He is one of only six FBS players with four receiving touchdowns in a single game this season. His game also marked the eighth time in C-USA history that a player caught four or more TDs in a game. Two players have caught five and Antoine is the sixth player to catch four in a game and the first since 2016. Antoine earned C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors for his efforts (9/23/19).

The Road Victory - The Owls' 41-31 win over Ball State was the first non-conference road win since 2013 versus USF. Outside the state of Florida the last non-conference road win was 2010 versus UAB.

Harrison Bryant Named Preseason C-USA

Florida Atlantic University senior tight end Harrison Bryant was named to the 2019 Conference USA Football Preseason Team, as announced by the league on July 12. The team was chosen by the league's 14 head coaches.

Bryant is expected to return and hold down his role as the Owls' starting tight end for the third consecutive season. Bryant started each of the team's 12 games a year ago and finished his junior campaign with the second most receiving yards and the second most receiving touchdowns on the team. The Georgia native uses his size to provide protection, and consistent hands to make him a quarterback favorite. He has played in 35 games over the last three seasons, improving his production in each. Bryant has a career total of 1,133 yards receiving and nine scores.

"I want to thank the coaches that selected me for this award as well as my teammates, coaches and support staff that has helped me grow on and off the field the past for years," said Bryant.

- Six of FAU's previous preseason selections have been drafted or signed a NFL free agent contract

C-USA Media Predicts a Third Place Eastern Division Finish for the FAU Owls

Florida Atlantic University football has been picked to finish third among the Conference USA Eastern Division members, by the league's selected media members, announced C-USA on July 16.

The Owls, who received three first place votes, finished 2018 with a 5-7 record and posted a 3-5 mark in C-USA play. FAU is predicted to finish behind Marshall, picked to win the East with 14 first place votes, and FIU, which had nine votes.

FAU will host both Marshall and FIU in 2019. The Owls will play host to Marshall on Friday, Oct. 18 at 6:30 p.m. and will host FIU, in the 18th Annual Shula Bowl, on Saturday, Nov. 9 at 6 p.m. CBS Sports Network will carry the Marshall contest while STADIUM is scheduled to broadcast the Shula Bowl, an event that the Owls have won 12 of the 17 meetings, including a 49-14 victory a year ago, in Miami.

The Owls are expected to be led by seniors Harrison Bryant (TE), who was a preseason C-USA selection, and Rashad Smith (LB). The duo represented FAU at the 2019 Football C-USA Media Day event held in Dallas, Wednesday, July 17 and Thursday, July 18.

FAU will open its season Saturday, August 31 at Ohio State. The noon game will be broadcast on Fox. The C-USA season opener is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 28 at Charlotte. That Charlotte contest will be the first FAU game to air on NFL Network. It also marks the first time the Owls ended a conference season versus the same opponent that they opened league play with the following season. Regardless of the back-to-back league encounters, both teams will be vying for the opportunity to play in the Saturday, Dec. 7 C-USA Championship game.

THE LATEST NEWS/TRENDS

Back-to-Back C-USA Top Recruiting Classes - Lane Kiffin surprised prognosticators his first season with the quality of recruits attracted in such a short span. The question seemed to be whether he repeat in years to come. With the opportunity to recruit to FAU for a full season and with the success of the 2017 team, the Owls accumulated the No. 1 recruiting class in C-USA. Following a 5-7 season, those same prognosticators anticipated a drop. With his cards held close to the vest and no official announcement of signees, the Owls once again built a class tabbed as C-USA's best. Recently, Rivals tweeted its top-five high school football states: 1. State of south Florida, 2. Florida, 3. Texas, 4. California, 5. Georgia. FAU's summer roster has 83 members from the state of Florida, including 23 from the state of "south Florida" (Broward and Miami-Dade Counties).

In Two Seasons - In two seasons at FAU under the direction of Lane Kiffin the Owls tallied a 16-10 mark, broke 54 records (either program, conference or NCAA) and were one of just two schools to have two running backs drafted in 2019 (FAU and Alabama). Kiffin orchestrated this while building a new staff each of the three years. Just **Kevin Smith** (running backs) and **Clint Trickett** (tight ends) have been on staff as an assistant coach each of the first two seasons. Both **DJ McCarthy** (wide receivers) and **Jeff Norrid** (offensive line) have been with the program for one season each as analyst and step into the role of assistant coach in 2019. **Charlie Weis, Jr** (offensive coordinator), **Jaron Fairman** (special teams coordinator) and Wes Neighbors will begin their second season as coordinators/assistant coaches. It will be Fairman's third season with the Owls. His first was as an analyst. The Owls welcome **Glenn Spencer** (defensive coordinator/LBs), **Lance Thompson** (DL/recruiting coordinator) and **Jason Jones** (cornerbacks) to the staff in 2019.

Owls' Defense - **Glenn Spencer** joined the Owls in the spring of 2019 with a heavy task: Return the Owls' defense to its stingy 2017 nature and do so after losing four of the team's top seven tacklers to graduation, three of which are vying for an NFL roster spot. The Owls will return Rashad Smith who led the Owls with 86 total tackles and four interceptions.

STADIUM OF BROTHERLY LOVE

Since the program's inception in 2001, there have been five sets of brothers to play for FAU: Adam ('03-'04) and Peter ('03-'07) Pantelakos, Kris ('04-'07) and Marcus ('07-'11) Bartels, Kevin Fischer ('01-'04) and Joe ('13-'14) Fischer, Ricaldo ('10) and Nicaldo ('12) Henry (Twins), Jensen ('12-'15) and Jake ('14-'18) Stoshak

AND NOW:

Rashad ('16-'19) and Rahmod ('19-) Smith, Tyler ('15-'16) and Ryan ('19-) Cameron, Grant ('13-'14) and Jordan ('16-) Helm

The Bartels brothers were the first set to play the same positions. Currently, the Camerons and the Helms are playing the same position. All of the others have been on opposite sides of the ball.

Head Coach Lane Kiffin and his brother Chris, FAU's defensive coordinator, were on the 2017 staff together. They too were on opposite sides of the ball.

Making the Grades - PFF College rated C-USA returning tight ends, with senior **Harrison Bryant** leading the class by a substantial margin with an 87.0 percentage. The next highest with more than 25 targets, is Jordan Myers from Rice at 73.5 percent.

Aussie Connection - Confidence in the kicking game was not something the Owls headed into the offseason with. The Owls looked down under for the answer by signing punter Matt Hayball. Hayball, whose more natural bo2015ot is a rugby style, tallied nine punts in game one, with a long of 70 yards. His 47.2 yard average was critical in the first half, a half that saw his number called eight times. In the Owls' 19-year history, just one other player has used a rugby style. Mickey Groody (2007-11) adopted the style late in his career to avoid pressure. The only other international kicker to dot FAU's roster was Greg Joseph (2013-17) was born in South Africa, but grew up in Boca Raton and played American football in high school at nearby American Heritage-Delray.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Since coming to FAU in 2017, head coach Lane Kiffin has shown a definite thread that runs through many of his hires and players. That thread is spun through family members that have played or coached at the highest level. For example: in 2017 Monte, Lane and Chris Kiffin were on staff.

Breaking in the Backs - Florida Atlantic has a rich tradition of freshmen running backs taking the stage and freshman running back Larry McCammon III is next in line. Currently, McCammon is on pace for a 200-carry, nine-touchdown regular season. Should he stay on pace the Alabama native would shatter Doug Parker's 2001 career record (158) and approach Devin Singletary's 2016 12-TD total. Here is a look at FAU freshman running back history:



Larry McCammon, 2019: 82 attempts for 287 yards and six touchdowns; averaging 3.5 yards per carry, 41.0 yards per game and has a long carry of 20.

Devin Singletary, 2016: 152 attempts for 1021 yards and 12 touchdowns; averaged 6.7 yards per carry, 85.1 yards per game and had a long of 66. Appeared in 12 games.

Buddy Howell, 2014: 50 attempts for 253 yards and one touchdown; averaged 5.1 yards per carry, 84.3 yards per game and had a long of 22. Appeared in three games.

Jay Warren, 2013: 71 attempts for 340 yards and two touchdowns; averaged 4.8 yards per carry, 34 yards per game and had a long of 47. Appeared in 10 games.

Alfred Morris, 2008: Seven attempts for 23 yards and zero touchdowns; averaged 3.3 yards per carry, 2.1 yards per game and had a long of nine. Appeared in 11 games.

Doug Parker, 2001: 158 attempts for 572 yards and eight touchdowns; averaged 3.6 yards per carry, 57.2 yards per game and had a long of 30. Appeared in 10 games.

Year One versus Year Two - Quarterback Chris Robison is improving mightily in his second year as the Owls' starter. He tied an FAU record with five passing touchdowns against Wagner, totaling nine versus Wagner and Ball State. Among FBS passers with at least 13 touchdowns, Robison is tied for fifth in touchdown-to-interception ratio.

Breakout Speed: Sophomore Malcolm Davidson shows break away speed and has used that speed to break into the starting lineup. Davidson has the longest carries despite being sidelined with injury early on. He is second on the team with 55 attempts, but first with 347 yards. Davidson averages 6.3 yards per carry and he has added three touchdowns. His longest run of the year is a 57 yard score versus Middle Tennessee. His freshman season was filled with specials teams work with two NFL

back playing in front of him.

Recovering the Ball - Senior linebacker Rashad Smith led the team in sacks in 2017 with 6.0. He led the team in 2018 with four interceptions. He tallied a program-tying three fumble recoveries just three games into 2019. Smith is listed No. 1 nationally in fumble recoveries, and has added two interceptions and 1.5 sacks in 2019.

Becoming a Leader - Senior safety Da'Von Brown transformed himself in the offseason, knowing the Owls needed a leader. Brown dove into his playbook in the offseason, learned the new system under a new defensive coordinator (his fourth in as many years), and drew his first collegiate start versus Ohio State and his second versus UCF. Brown backed up his vocal leadership with eight tackles including one for a loss of a yard at OSU. He added six versus UCF and eight at Ball State, with a forced fumble and eight stops in the FAU win over Middle Tennessee. He is currently third on the squad with 44 TT.

Production X 3 - FAU's offense was consistently productive against Charlotte, scoring at least 10 points in each of the first three quarters. The last time it did that was Week 7, 2017, a 69-31 victory over North Texas. The Owls are outscoring opponents 222-207 through seven games. They have been outscored by 28 points in the first quarter but make up the rest of the game by nearly a 20 point margin in each of the remaining three quarters.

One-Two Punch - Sophomore running back Malcolm Davidson broke out for 113 all-purpose yards and two scores in Week 5, forming a dangerous one-two punch with freshman Larry McCammon. Week 6, versus Middle Tennessee, Davidson had 149 yards, to average 131 yards per C-USA game to that point. The duo has combined for 10 rushing touchdowns this season.

Safety Patrol - Safety Zyon Gilbert patrolled the middle of the field with ease against Charlotte, breaking up three passes and adding an interception. The four passes defended is tied for a single-game high among C-USA defenders. In his second C-USA game of 2019 he tied for the team lead with eight tackles, including six solo. He currently has 30 total tackles.

Sack Attack - Known for his run-stuffing, defensive tackle Ray Ellis is showing he has some pass-rushing chops as well. Ellis notched only two sacks over his first 34 games; he matched that number in 2019 Week 5 alone. Ellis is now second on the squad with 3.5 sacks for a loss of 26 yards.

Robison Streaks - The Owls' four-game win streak was spearheaded by the play of Chris Robison who has completed 63.94% of his passes. Through the four wins, Robison was 93-134 for 1,202 yards, 13 TDs and just two INTs. Robison averaged 259.50 passing yards per game in the same span.

C-USA Selects



Deangelo Antoine was named Conference USA Offensive Player of the Week, as announced by the league on Monday, Sept. 23rd. Antoine's honor is the second C-USA Player of the Week award in as many weeks and after as many victories for the Owls. Last week, Rashad Smith got the nod for his defensive efforts and this week it is bestowed to the offensive side.

Antoine, the first FAU wide receiver to earn C-USA player of the week honors, joined the Owls after a four-year playing career at USEF, where he saw time at both receiver and defensive back. Last week, the graduate transfer was asked to move from wide receiver to slot and the move was not only breakout, it was record-breaking. Antoine, who has also been named the C-USA Offensive Player of the Week by College Sports Madness, found the end zone in 36% of his catches, as he went for 11 receptions for 173 yards and four touchdowns.

His four TDs marked just the eighth time in C-USA's 25-year history that a player has caught four or more TDs in a game. Two players have caught five and Antoine is the sixth player to catch four in a game and the first since 2016. The four TDs one-upped the bar set by teammate John Mitchell, who had three a week ago at Ball State, and set a new single-game record for FAU, breaking the previous mark of three set by Cortez Gent in 2008 and equaled by Mitchell. Antoine's TD receptions were for 37, 17, 28 and 57 yards and most were made after the catch. Antoine's efforts helped FAU towards a 42-7 win over Wagner.



Rashad Smith, a senior linebacker on the Florida Atlantic University football team, has been named the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week, as announced by the C-USA office on Monday, Sept. 16.

Smith's performance in the Owls' win over Ball State could best be described as opportunistic. Smith, from Florida City, Florida, tallied six tackles, including a sack for a loss of eight yards, a tackle for a loss of two yards, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries, including one in the end zone to prevent a Ball State score. The victory marked the first time since 2013 that the Owls recorded a non-conference road victory.

Smith began the contest with the Owls' first tackle and it was for a loss. He assisted on FAU's second tackle of the day, which again prevented BSU from gaining even one yard and following an incomplection, the Owls had forced a three-and-out. On BSU's seventh play of the day they met once more with Smith via a fumble recovery and a four-yard return at the Ball State 31, which set up the first scoring drive of the game, putting FAU on the scoreboard first. Smith's third tackle ended a four-yard run. His fourth was two plays later stopping BSU at the 24.

Potentially his biggest play of the day concluded the scoring drive that BSU began at their 17 and then marched 76 yards down field. On 1st and 10 at the 17, BSU rushed for 13 yards before FAU senior safety Da'Von Brown made a tackle and forced the ball free and into the end zone, where a trailing Smith dove on the ball. The Owls would use that game-swinging momentum to drive 80 yards, score and take a 28-17 lead. In BSU's opening drive of the four quarter, Smith would record a tackle and force a fumble, which FAU recovered and again used to score. His last tackle of the day, an assist, was part of BSU's last drive as Smith has been asked to play nearly every defensive play in FAU's first three games.

The Owls' most consistent defender. In 2018, tallied a team-high 86 tackles, including 5.5 for a loss of 16, one sack, a team-high four INTs and one fumble recovery, at FIU. Has picked up 2019 with a team-high 49 tackles. Defense includes three FR, 1 FF, 1 QBH, 2 INT and 1.5 sack.



Vocal leader who has made the transition from a special teams player to an everyday starter. Leads the team with 8.5 tackles for a loss of 20 yards, including 3.5 sacks for a loss of 12 yards. Has 49 tackles in 2019.

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN (55-34)



Lane Kiffin was named Florida Atlantic University's head football coach on Dec. 13, 2016 and stated in his introductory press conference that "to do the impossible, you must see the invisible."

Few saw the invisible; however Kiffin's extensive college and professional coaching experience allowed him to see what FAU could be, the impossible. That December day he began his task to accelerate the development of the university's ambitions to transform college football in South Florida all while continuing the Owls' football team's classroom successes.

By the first Wednesday in February, Kiffin had assembled one of the best and most highly-acclaimed coaching staffs in the country. That staff built the highest-rated recruiting class in Conference USA. The returning players had begun to learn the "fourth quarter program" and collectively the staff was not done seeking out players that would contribute in 2017.

Spring practice began, which was the first opportunity for the staff work with the returning players on the practice field. They evaluated and hit the recruiting trails once more, filling gaps and building a future. That process continued through preseason camp when the Owls were joined by several transfers and the team was assembled.

FAU would stumble in a six-hour Navy game and then travel to Wisconsin, where they remained for five days due to a hurricane and its damage to South Florida. Upon returning, the Owls defeated Bethune-Cookman to garner Kiffin his first win. A trip to Buffalo that dealt FAU its third loss may have been the team's turning point, as FAU then tallied a program-high 10 consecutive convincing victories, the second longest active streak in the coun-

try. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. Along the way, 41 individual or team records were amassed, and an FAU-record 21 players earned All-Conference USA recognition. Devin Singletary, who rushed for 32 touchdowns, the third most all-time nationally, became the first FAU player to receive AP All-America honors and was named C-USA's MVP. The Owls captured their second conference title, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3. Statistically, the Owls finished in the top-25 in 16 team categories, including: No. 2 in passes intercepted, No. 5 in first down offense, No. 6 in rushing offense, No. 8 in kickoff return defense, red zone offense and turnovers lost, and No. 9 in total offense and turnover margin (by comparison, FAU was No. 72 the previous season in total offense and No. 99 in turnovers gained). Individually, Singletary led the nation in touchdowns and points scored, Jalen Young was No. 2 in interceptions and Azeem Al-Shaair was No. 5 in total tackles. Kiffin was named Palm Beach County Coach of the Year in March of 2018 for his efforts in guiding the team to its 11-3 mark, C-USA crown and Boca Bowl victory.

Kiffin, who remained on the National Coach of the Year ballot through much of the season, brought unparalleled attention to FAU. While every game was televised, he became a regular on "ESPN's Game Day" as did "phathead" images and videos of a "Lane Train" moving through campus.

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to a SEC Title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the year and the SEC Freshman of the Year. He was a finalist for the Manning Award, the Earl

Campbell Tyler Rose Award, a semifinalist for the Walter Camp Player of the Year and the Davey O'Brien Award, presented annually to the nation's top quarterback. Hurts completed 240 passes for a total of 2,780 yards compared to just nine INTs. He tossed 23 touchdowns and scored another 13 with his feet and was a 1,161-yard rusher.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranks as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school- and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns. Henry's 2,219 yards was also the fifth-most rushing yards in a single season in college football history.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying a starting quarterback and then developing Blake Sims in 2014. With three-year starter and All-American AJ McCarron off to the NFL, Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards and 3,837 yards of total offense while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. He ranked tied for fourth nationally in total QBR (83.7) and seventh in passing efficiency (157.9). Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

Kiffin's offense ranked 17th nationally in total offense per game (484.5) while scoring an average of 36.9 points per game. The passing game averaged a school-record 277.9 yards per game (3,890) to rank 28th nationally and fourth in the SEC. Amari Cooper won the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's best receiver, after catching a school- and SEC-record 124 passes for a UA-record 1,727 receiving yards and 16 touchdowns.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise

Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year. Quarterback Matt Barkley, who won the Wuerffel Trophy, set conference records for passing yards and passing touchdowns.

Kiffin led the Trojans to a 10-2 record in 2011 and a sixth-place finish in the final Associated Press poll. The team finished first in the Pac-12 South with a 7-2 mark. His 2011 USC offense produced a 3,500-yard passer, a pair of 1,000-yard receivers and a 1,000-yard rusher. Three Trojans earned First Team All-America honors (Matt Kalil, Robert Woods and T.J. McDonald) and five were named Freshman All-Americans.

In his first year as the head coach at USC, Kiffin led the Trojans to an 8-5 record (5-4 Pac-10). Before his arrival, the Trojans were averaging 26.5 points per game in scoring offense and 389.1 yards per game in total offense. In his first two seasons, those numbers increased to 31.0 points per game and 431.5 yards in 2011 and 35.8 points and 456.8 yards in 2012.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Volunteers' offense jumped at least 34 places in every national statistical category over the 2008 figures. Tennessee improved from 17.3 to 29.3 points per game while going from 268.8 to 383.5 yards per game in total offense.

Kiffin came to Tennessee from the Oakland Raiders, where he served as head coach from 2007-08. At 31, he was the youngest head coach in the NFL's modern era. Oakland's offense significantly improved in his first year, up 7.2 points per game and 48.6 yards per game from 2006.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including

two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). During his first tenure with the Trojans, USC captured two national championships and compiled a 65-12 record. Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

He took over as USC's offensive coordinator in 2005 and led the Trojans to a scoring average of 49.1 points per game and 579.8 yards per game of total offense during his two years as offensive coordinator. Kiffin started at USC in 2001 as the tight ends coach and then coached the wide receivers during his remaining five years.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998. He moved on to Colorado State in 1999 as offensive line assistant. He spent the 2000 season as defensive quality control assistant with the Jacksonville Jaguars under Tom Coughlin.

Kiffin attended Bloomington (Minn.) Jefferson High, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

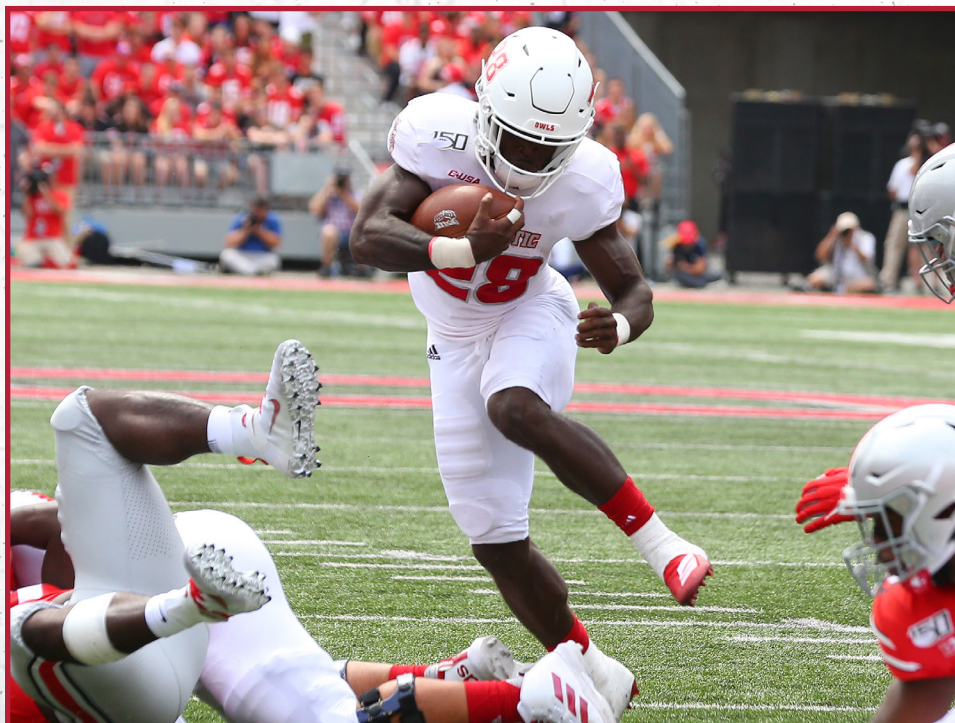

Quick Hits

- FAU (0-1) won the toss but deferred.
- Ohio State (1-0) needed four plays on the opening drive, with a 51-yard run for the score
- After the Owls were held to a three-and-out, a long punt return gave OSU a short field

- Two plays later, a 25-yard touchdown pass doubled the lead, and the next Buckeye drive ended in 31-yard passing score for to make it 21-0
- A fourth 1st quarter score for OSU came on a 29-yard pass
- Akileis Leroy smothered the Buckeyes' quarterback to eventually force a punt late in the period
- James Charles moved the chains as the Owls took possession into the 2nd quarter
- OSU was forced into a second straight punt when a Korel Smith blitz flushed the QB out of the pocket and Leighton McCarthy pushed him out of bounds for a sack
- Matt Hayball boomed a 70-yard punt to pin OSU to their own 11
- Again, Leroy continued to be a presence in the backfield, picking up the Owls' second sack of the day. On the next play, Damian Horton got pressure to earn a QB hurry
- FAU recorded with the first turnover of the game, as a backwards pass was mishandled and Quran Hafiz came up with the fumble recovery midway through the 2nd
- Jaylen Joyner was the next defensive lineman with a hurry, leading to another OSU punt
- The next Buckeye drive also ended in a turnover, as on a rush, Leroy forced a fumble, recovered by Rashad Smith
- That gave FAU good field position, at the OSU 25, and Chris Robison found Harrison Bryant for back-to-back completions, of six yards and seven yards, to move it to the 12
- Vladimir Rivas put the Owls on the board, splitting the uprights with a 28-yard field goal with 33 seconds left to go in the half
- FAU got the ball to start the 3rd, and picked up back-to-back 1st downs on a screen pass to Larry McCammon III (12 yards) and a catch by John Raine (14 yards)
- Robinson found Bryant on a beautiful leaping snag for 26 yards, and coupled with a roughing-the-passer penalty on the same play, the Owls had a 1st down on the OSU 12
- Four plays later, Rivas made good again, again from the same 28-yard distance
- On the ensuing drive, Da'Von Brown flew to the line of scrimmage for a tackle for no gain, and a one-yard loss, on consecutive plays
- Late in the 3rd, OSU scored for the first time in over two quarters, after the Owls had held them out of the end zone for six straight possessions
- After the TD, the Owls moved the ball downfield. Robison connected with John Mitchell and Bryant for twin 12-yard receptions, and hit Tavaris Harrison for eight yards and then six more for a 1st down
- Robison rushed for seven and James Charles for five, and Raine made a sliding catch for 12 yards and an apparent first down, but it was overturned upon review
- Heading into the quarter break, the Owls lined up for a field goal, but coming out, elected to go for it on 4th down. Robison found Charles for eight yards and the 1st
- A nine-yard Charles rush brought up 2nd-and-inches
- Two plays later, true freshman McCammon punched it from three yards, and Robison hit John Mitchell for a wide-open two-point conversion to make it 35-14
- The Owls attempted an onside kick but it went out of bounds. Beginning in FAU territory, OSU scored seven plays later
- The longest FAU gain of the afternoon came when Robison floated a pass to "Pico" Tavaris Harrison for 38 yards
- After a 9-yard run by Robison, and six yards from McCammon, a play later, Bryant hauled in a 16-yard pass to move within the 10
- Three plays after that, Robison got his first TD pass of the day, a three-yard completion to Raine. Rivas' extra point pulled the Owls back to within three scores 42-21
- With OSU milking the clock, James Pierre stuffed a QB rush for a loss of five
- The Owls' defense held the Buckeyes to a field goal attempt, which was good from 46
- Backup quarterback Justin Agner came on for the final Owl drive, making his

FAU debut. He completed his first two passes, and three of his first four, before a diving interception gave the ball back to the Buckeyes

- The attendance of 103,228 is the largest FAU has ever played in front of (eclipsing 101,821 at Alabama on Sept. 22, 2012)
- Bryant and Raine led all receivers on the day in catches with six, and Bryant paced all players in receiving yards with 79

- Robison made good on 65 percent of his past attempts (22-for-34) for 178 yards
- McCammon's score was the first of his career
- Defensively, Smith was in double digits with a game-high tally of tackles on either side, with 11, seven of which were solo

- Leroy had six stops, a sack and tackle for loss, plus the forced fumble

- The first two Cardinal plays were for naught: Rashad Smith hit a receiver as soon as he caught the first pass for a loss, and he and Ray Ellis bottled up a back right at the line of scrimmage
- After a completion on 3rd down from Chris

- Robison to Tavaris Harrison, the Owls went for it on their own 34. Larry McCammon III went for eight yards on 4th-and-1 to move the chains
- Smith continued to shine, picking up a fumble on a missed connection when Ball State was attempting a reverse
- That gave the ball to the Owls on the BSU 31. The drive began on a six-yard successful shovel pass to Deangelo Antoine; then, Robison found John Mitchell for nine yards and a first down, to the 16
- The Owls then continue to move the ball in chunks: James Charles on the ground for four yards and five; Robison got three on a keeper for the first down; and then Robison put FAU on the board with a four-yard slant to John Raine for the score

- The Owls' defense continued to succeed, as Akileis Leroy notch the Owls' third sack of the day, the very play before James Pierre picked off the BSU QB

Founded in 1961, Florida Atlantic University is a comprehensive public university that is currently serving more than 30,000 undergraduate and graduate students at sites strategically located along the state's southeastern coastline. Long known as an outstanding teaching institution, FAU is undergoing rapid development as a center of cutting-edge research, particularly in the biomedical arena. The process has been accelerated by the University's partnerships with two internationally known biomedical research organizations: The Scripps Research Institute and the Max Planck Florida Institute for Neuroscience. Additionally, FAU's Charles E. Schmidt College of Medicine recently welcomed its fourth class of students.

Through a well-developed network of partner campuses, FAU serves students at locations and sites throughout its six-county service region in southeast Florida as well as through distance learning.
