AND DOWN THE STRETCH THEY COME:

The Monarchs wrap up the 2010 season Saturday in Durham, North Carolina against N.C. Central. The Monarchs enter the game with a 7-3 mark in 2010 and are riding a four-game win-streak dating back to October 23rd and its 34-20 victory over Georgia State. Old Dominion sports a 16-5 overall mark since kicking off football last season.

FINAL TIME SUITING UP AS A MONARCH:

Eleven seniors will be suiting up for the Monarchs for the final time on Saturday. The 11 seniors, who were honored at home last weekend prior to the home finale against VMI, have helped build and establish the ODU program. Those seniors are:

HOME SWEET HOME:

Old Dominion improved its record to 4-3 this season at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium with the 45-28 win over VMI last Saturday. All three losses in 2010 have come at the hands of teams currently featured in the Top 25 including #6/6 Williams & Mary, #20/21 Jacksonville, and #23/23 Cal Poly. The Monarchs are 10-4 all-time on their home turf.

ON THE ROAD:

ODU is 6-1 all-time on the road in their young history and 3-0 in 2010 thanks to its 28-14 win over Hampton three weeks ago. In their inaugural season, the Monarchs went 3-1 on the road with wins at Jacksonville (28-27), Savannah State (38-17), and VMI (42-35). The lone setback away from the friendly confines of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium was a 34-29 loss at Fordham.

D-D-DEFENSE:

Cornerback T.J. Cowart's (Va Beach, Va.) 13 tackles in last Saturday's win against VMI is not only the most for by a Monarch this season, but ties the record for the most stops by a Monarch defender in a game. Cowart surpasses the previous season-high of 11 held by Cowart himself in the 35-21 win at Monmouth and Craig Wilkins versus Cal Poly in a 50-37 loss to the nationally ranked squad. Cowart ties the mark also held by former Monarch linebacker Mycheal McJunkins recorded in last year's 42-35 win at VMI. Additionally, the nine solo tackles Cowart had against the Keydets are the most by a Monarch in a single game.

WELCOMING A FELLOW NEWCOMER:

Head coach Bobby Wilder has announced the addition of start-up program Charlotte to the Football Monarchs' schedule in 2013 and 2014. The 49ers, who will begin their program in 2013 will travel to Norfolk and Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium on September 21st 2013 in their inaugural season, while September 6th, 2014 will serve as the return date to "Queen City" for the Monarchs.

MOST POINTS:

The 57 points scored by the Monarchs on November 6th against Savannah State were the most in the 20-game history of the program. The previous high was 49 in the 49-17 victory over Virginia Union back on September 12th, 2009. The previous high against a Division I opponent was 44 in the 44-13 win at Campbell on September 11th, 2010.

OPENING WITH A BANG:

And no, we're not talking about the howitzer you hear being shot off before the Monarchs run onto Foreman Field. Old Dominion has scored on its opening drive in five of its games this season and 12 times in the 21 game history of the program.

ABOUT N.C. CENTRAL:

- North Carolina Central University, like Old Dominion, concludes the 2010 football season on Saturday. Thirteen Eagle seniors will be recognized prior to the contest.
- A win for NCCU would equal the Eagles' final record in each of the past two seasons (4-7).
- A sluggish start and four turnovers led to Savannah State picking up its first win of 2010 as they defeated North Carolina Central 28-21, inside Memorial Stadium in Savannah, Ga. The Eagles' loss helped Savannah State snap its 11-game losing streak, longest losing streak in the NCAA Division I-FCS.
- Senior running back Tim Shankle, who leads the Eagles with 62.3 yards rushing per game and seven touchdowns, is the seventh Eagle in school history to rush for over 2,000 career yards. He needs 54 yards for fourth on the NCCU career rushing list.
- Darryl Bullock was elevated from assistant head coach to interim head coach at NCCU on Oct. 18. He began as offensive line coach at NCCU prior to the 2007 gridiron season. Following the 2007 campaign, he was promoted to the rank of assistant head coach, while also retaining his duties with the offensive line. Bullock, who has been coaching football since 1989, joined the Eagles after serving as offensive line/tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator at Tennessee State University for two seasons (2005-06).
- North Carolina Central will join the MEAC in 2011. NCCU is one of seven founding member institutions of the MEAC. The Eagles withdrew from the conference in 1979, opting to remain a Division II member when the conference reclassified to Division I. From 1979-2007, NCCU competed in the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA).

MILESTONE ALERT:

Running back Mario Crawford became the second Monarch to accumulate 1,000 or more rushing yards last Saturday against VMI with his 59 yards on 13 carries against the Keydets. Crawford now has 1050 career rushing yards in his two years as a Monarch. Thomas DeMarco was the first Monarch to reach the milestone and currently has 1320 rushing yards under his belt.

PASSING LAST YEAR'S NUMBERS:

With 122 passing yards against the Pirates on October 30th, redshirt junior quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) surpassed last year's total of 1921 yards. To date, DeMarco has totaled 2470 yards in the air. Additionally the three touchdown passes against the Keydets last weekend brought his season total to 22, surpassing last year's mark of 21 touchdowns thrown.

RISE AND SHINE:

Thomas DeMarco's eight yard touchdown run to kick off the game two weeks ago in the Monarchs' 57-9 win over Savannah State gave ODU its earliest score ever. Here's a list to show how early the Monarchs have scored over the last two years.

AND THE YOUTH SHALL LEAD YOU:

A trio of freshman put in some notable performances against Savannah State back on November 6th. Rookie Aaron Evans (Newport News, Va.), stepped in for the injured Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.) at kick returner, raced downfield 92-yards for the Monarchs' first ever kick return for a touchdown. Additionally, true freshman Rashad Manley (Hampton, Va.) served as the Monarchs' signal caller the entire second half, finishing the game completing eight of his 13 attempts for 89 yards. Defensively, freshman Rodney Hunter (Alpharetta, Ga.) made a team-leading 10 tackles.

BLOCK THAT KICK:

Special teams now has 12 blocks to its credit in the last two seasons.

Edmon McClam (Cowart, S.C.) blocked his sixth career PAT against Savannah State. McClam holds the FCS record for Blocked PATs in a Season (2009 - 5) and Blocked PATs in a Game (3 - Chowan). The FCS record for Blocked PATs in a Career is seven by Tim Hauck (Montana - 1987-89).

The Monarchs had two blocked punts against Hampton by Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.) and Desmond Williams (Windsor, N.C.) that both resulted in Monarch scores in the 28-14 win. Mayo also rushed the Pirate punter which led Hampton to punt the ball into its own player and set the Monarchs up for a touchdown run from two yards out. Hampton had not had a punt blocked since 2004.

In addition to the Hampton game, Mayo also had a blocked field goal during the first quarter vs Gardner-Webb to preserve ODU's 7-0 lead against the Runnin' Bulldogs.

Alex Arain (Va. Beach, Va.) blocked a punt, ODU's first blocked punt in history, at Monmouth during week four.

Chris Burnette (Randallstown, Md.) also has two blocked PATs from last season.

PICK SIX:

Redshirt sophomore linebacker Craig Wilkins (Washington, D.C.) became the first Monarch this season and second overall to return an interception for a score with his 25-yard INT return in the 57-9 victory over Savannah State. Former linebacker AT Aoleua has been the only other Monarchs to accomplish the feat. Aoleua's was a 77-yard return, also coming against Savannah State in 2009.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS STRIKES AGAIN:

Four Monarchs were honored for their performances against Savannah State by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA). Freshman Aaron Evans was named the National Kick Returner of the Week, while quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.), punter Jonathan Plisco (Newport News, Va.) and linebacker Craig Wilkins (Washington, D.C.) were Honorable Mention Players of the Week. Evans had a pair of kickoff returns in ODU's 57-9 win over the Tigers, including a 92-yard kick return for a touchdown. It was the Monarchs' first kick return for a score in the 20-game history of the Monarch program. DeMarco completed eight of his 13 attempts for the Monarchs, racking up 198 yards with a pair of touchdowns. Plisco meanwhile returned to the No. 1 spot in the nation in punting after averaging 49.5 yards on a pair of punts in last Saturday's game with Savannah State. Wilkins was also responsible for helping ODU to its largest point total in history with a 25-yard interception return for a touchdown. The redshirt sophomore co-captain also amassed seven stops and an 11-yard sack in last Saturday's win.

ITS OFFICIAL:

You might have noticed a change on the two-deep a few weeks ago as Rashad Manley was inserted as the No. 2 quarterback for the Monarchs. Dominique Blackman (Los Angeles, Calif.) will officially redshirt the 2010 season. Blackman, a sophomore out of Los Angeles Harbor College, dressed on the sidelines for the first eight games in case of injury to starting QB Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.). Manley made his debut against Savannah State on November 6th. He passed for 89 yards on completing eight of his 13 passes in playing the entire second half against the Tigers

CHANGE OF POSSESSION:

Donald Smith's (Chesapeake, Va.) interception in the second quarter against Hampton back on October 30th stopped ODU's defensive drought of picking off passes. Smith's INT against the Pirates was only the third for the Monarchs this season and was the first since Michael Williams' (Va. Beach, Va.) in the September 17th contest with William & Mary. Devon Simmons (Newport News, Va.) later added the fourth Monarch INT late in the game. His 37-yard return was the second longest in the Monarch record books.

Deron Jasper (Dunwoody, Va.) has the other ODU interception on the year from the Monarchs' season opener with now nationally-ranked Jacksonville. Craig Wilkins posted a 25-yard interception return for a touchdown against Savannah State two weeks ago for the Monarchs' fifth interception of 2010.

AMONG THE TOP:

The Monarchs enter Saturday's game ranked third in the nation in kickoff returns after leading the nation to straight weeks. ODU is averaging 25.90 yards per return. Rookie Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.), who will miss the final three games of the season due to an elbow injury suffered at Hampton back on October 30th, ranks ninth among all FCS kickoff returners averaging 29.83 yards per return.

PUNTING STATS:

Monarch punter Jonathan Plisco (Newport News, Va.), briefly dropped to No. 2 in the national rankings during week nine, but climbed up to back where he belongs and is back at No. 1 for the second consecutive week. Through the Monarchs' 10 games this season, the redshirt sophomore is averaging 44.98 yards per punt. On the season, Plisco has totaled 1672 yards on 37 punts with 15 of them reaching a distance of 50 yards or more.

NUMBERS GAME:

With three touchdown passes against VMI last weekend, quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) brought his career touchdown pass number to 43. The redshirt junior signal caller also has 25 career rushing touchdowns under his belt. He is currently ranked eighth in the nation in total offense at 289.80 yards a game.

PUTTING THE "D" IN DEFENSE:

Craig Wilkins (Washington, D.C.), J.J. Williams (Derby, Kan.), and Fred Credle (Chesapeake, Va.) each forced Georgia State fumbles back on October 23rd. The three forced fumbles ties the mark for the most in a game. The Monarchs also had three last season against Campbell.

Additionally, the four fumble recoveries - Alex Arain, Donald Smith and two by Wilkins, were the most by the Monarchs in a game thus far. The previous high of three came last season in a loss at Fordham.

Also, the Monarchs' 10 pass break-ups were the most by the team thus far. Led by T.J. Cowart's three, ODU surpasses its previous high of nine against Presbyterian last year.

BREAKING-UP IS HARD TO DO:

T.J. Cowart (Va. Beach, Va.) has registered three pass break-ups three times in ODU's 10 games played so far in 2010. Not only did he have a trio against the Panthers four weeks ago, but he also had them against William & Mary and Gardner-Webb, tying for the most in a game by a Monarch. Cowart has interrupted opponent quarterback throws 15 times in his two years at Old Dominion as the Monarchs' leader in the stat.

FINDING THE OPEN MAN:

Monty Smalley (Richmond, Va.) led the receiving corps against Georgia State in week eight with 61 yards on nine catches. The nine catches are the most by a Monarch in a game. The previous high was eight by Reid Evans in the 44-13 victory over Campbell back on September 11th.

THROUGH THE UPRIGHTS:

Jarod Brown's (Yorktown, Va.) 44-yard field goal in the 34-20 victory over Georgia State on October 23rd was his longest this season and the second longest field goal in the brief 21 game history of the ODU program. Drew Hareza still holds the record having converted a 48-yard attempt in the historic 2009 opener against Chowan. Brown has made eight of his 11 field goal attempts this year. His longest attempt came from 50-yards last weekend against VMI, although his kick sailed wide left.

ON THE MEND:

Center Jeremy Hensley will miss the remainder of the 2010 season after suffering a broken ankle against #14/#16 Cal Poly back on October 9th. Hensley had started all 17 ODU contests to date at center. Taking over duties is sophomore Brandon Carr, who made his first collegiate start at the position on October 23rd against Georgia State. Also helping to bolster the o-line was the return of sophomore Jack Lowney to the line-up. Lowney missed the pre-season and the first part of the 2010 season with a foot injury. Against the Panthers, he played all but one snap at right guard.

ADDING FOOTBALL:

Old Dominion and Georgia State are just a handful of programs that have brought football to their campuses the last few years. Here are some others who are starting up football:

It was just a year ago Old Dominion was in its first year as a FCS program and during week eight they took on the newest member of the FCS family and soon-to-be CAA family. Georgia State announced plans to start up football in 2008 and kicked off its first season this September. The Panthers will join the CAA in 2012.

KICKOFF RETURN RECORDS:

Old Dominion's Colby Goodwyn set the Division I record (FBS or FCS) for kickoff return yardage in a game with 333 yards in his nine returns against #14/16 Cal Poly in week six. The old mark was 326 by Eastern Washington's Bashir Livingston on Oct. 31, 1998. The FBS record is 319 by Iowa State's Leonard Johnson on Nov. 1, 2008. Old Dominion also set the record for most kickoff return yardage by a team (365 yards on 11 returns).

On top of Goodwyn's new NCAA marks, he managed to also put his name into the Monarch record book as well. His 89-yard kickoff return that lead to Reid Evans' touchdown reception in the second quarter against the Mustangs was the longest kick return by a Monarch to-date. Goodwyn would later have a 79-yard kick return that places his name again the record books, this time with the second-longest kick return in the brief history of ODU football. The previous high was a 76-yard return by Mario Crawford in ODU's historic opener against Chowan last year.

MAKING THE BIG STOPS:

The 14-7 victory over Gardner-Webb in week five showcased one of the best defensive efforts by the Monarchs to-date. The Runnin' Bulldogs got to within nine yards of a touchdown, on third and goal T.J. Cowart (Va. Beach, Va.) knocked down a pass intended for GWU's Jamal Patmon in the end zone, setting Gardner-Webb up for a 27-yard field goal attempt. Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.) swooped in and blocked the field goal attempt by the Bulldogs' Ryan Gates with Paul Morant (Hampton, Va.) returning the kick 11 yards to the 21. Another stellar play, included a 37-yard punt by College Football Performance Award's Punter of the Week, Jonathan Plisco, that pinned Gardner-Webb back at their own one-yard line to start their drive. Freshman Paul Morant (Hampton, Va.) Morant and linebacker J.J. Williams (Derby, Kan.) led a defense, which held the Bulldogs to 3 of 9 on third-down conversions and 24 yards of total offense in the second half. Both ended with a game-high 10 tackles.

MORE RECORD BOOK MATERIAL:

While the ODU Football program is only in its second year of existence and 20 games old, another set of records were broke in the Monarchs' 35-21 win over Monmouth on September 25th

Wide receiver Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) finished the game with 154 yards receiving, the most by a Monarch in a game and only the third time a Monarch receiver has recorded over 100 yards receiving. The junior transfer from LA Harbor College posted two touchdowns and also a two-point conversion on his six catches against the Hawks. He surpassed the previous receiving record of 103 yards held by Nick Mayers (Va. Beach, Va.) in the game last season at Fordham.

Quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) connected on 28 of his 47 attempts in the air, including four touchdowns, en-route to his first 400+ yard passing game of his career. The redshirt junior signal caller captured 407 yards in the air, surpassing his previous high of 334 yards registered in the season opener against Jacksonville.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING:

Despite the ODU offensive line allowing quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) to get sacked for the first time in 2010 against Monmouth the Monarchs are still among the top FCS schools in sacks allowed ranking eighth in the category. Old Dominion did not allow a sack in the first four contests of the 2010 season before the Hawks managed to take down DeMarco twice in the September 25th game.

JERSEY BOYS:

"In all due respect," this note isn't about ODU's trip up to New Jersey during week four. This note is about the new Nike uniforms brought out for the William & Mary game back on September 18th. The Monarchs warmed up in their normal dark blue jersey with white numbers, but right before kick head coach Bobby Wilder had a surprise for his team. Entering the locker room for one last time before the game started, the Monarchs walked in to see new black Nike uniforms with dark blue numbers sitting in each of their lockers. ODU also sported the "new look" against the then-#14/16 Cal Poly Mustangs. The Monarchs are 1-2 in their new look uni's. They earned their first win in the black with a 45-28 win against VMI.

CRYSTAL BALL:

September 18th was a glimpse into the future with the Monarchs' contest against William & Mary, a school that will be featured prominently on ODU's schedule as they join the CAA in 2011. The same tilt gave ODU a taste of the toughest FCS league in the nation. The Tribe also mark the first ranked team ODU faced in its young history. At game time, William & Mary ranked 12th in the FCS Coach's Poll and 13th in the Sports Network Poll.

MEMORABLE CAREER MOMENT:

Tight end Kai Blanco (Alexandria, Va.) gave the Monarchs a 6-0 edge over William & Mary back on week three with his first career touchdown reception. The 4-yard pass from Thomas DeMarco gave the Monarchs a lead over the #12/13 team in the FCS.

PLISCO HONORED BY COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS - AGAIN:

The Monarchs' Jonathan Plisco (Newport News, Va.) was named the Punter of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) for the second time this season. Plisco moved up to No. 1 in the FCS punting rankings after his performance against Gardner-Webb during week five. The redshirt sophomore booted the ball eight times against the Runnin' Bulldogs with an average of 47.2 yards per punt, including a long of 59 yards. Five of his eight punts were inside the Gardner-Webb 20, including a punt late in the fourth quarter that reached the Bulldog one-yard line.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS - PART TWO:

Punter Jonathan Plisco (Newport News, Va.) and defensive tackle Ronnie Cameron (Westbury, N.Y.) were honored as Players of the Week by the CFPA following the Monarchs' contest with William & Mary on September 18th. The two become the third and fourth Monarchs honored by the awards program this season.

Plisco was named the CFPA Punter of the Week after averaging 53.3 yards on six punts, including a long of 75.

Cameron was named the CFPA Defensive Lineman of the Week after leading the Monarchs with 10 tackles, including three tackles for loss. Among his three tackles for loss were 1.5 sacks that gave the Tribe 11 negative yards. To date, Cameron has totaled 529 tackles, 13.5 tackles for loss, and four sacks along with seven qb hurries.

12th MONARCH MOMENTS:

There may be 11 Monarchs on the field, but the 12th Monarch is in the stands. Thanks to all the noise of being "Loud and Proud" from the 12th Monarchs at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium, the opposition was charged with 41 penalties last season and 51 so far in 2010.

DRIVING:

While ODU certainly wished there was a different outcome in the opening week 35-25 loss to Jacksonville, the Monarchs were ready to learn from their mistakes and moved on. Head Coach Bobby Wilder has noted that some of the biggest improvement you see out of a team occur between weeks one and two. Coming out in game number two, the Monarchs scored in the first three drives of the game against Campbell and held a 20-0 advantage over the Camels at the half.

CATCHING IN THE END ZONE:

Prior to the Campbell game, only Nick Mayers had more than one touchdown reception in a game - at Fordham (10/3/09) and last season at home against Campbell (10/17/09). In the September 11th win at Campbell, Marquel Thomas (Va. Beach, Va.) and Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) joined Mayers in the category as each had a pair of TD catches. Junior Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) also put his name into the category with the victory at Monmouth on September 25th.

SEE COLBY RUN:

While everyone saw just how good Colby Goodwyn was running with his kick returns against Jacksonville during the opening week, Goodwyn showed his skills from the line of scrimmage against Campbell. Late in the fourth quarter, Goodwyn carried the ball 14 straight times for 49 yards for the entire Monarch drive that set up Jarod Brown for a 19-yard field goal attempt that gave the ODU-Campbell game its final margin, 44-13.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS - PART ONE:

Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.) was named the National Kick Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) for the week ending September 5th. Goodwyn totaled 86 yards on a pair of kickoff returns in last Saturday's season opener against Jacksonville. He dashed 68 yards in the second quarter, the second highest return in the brief history of the ODU program at the time. He currently ranks 12th nationally in kick returns at a 30.5 yard return average.

Thomas DeMarco was named Honorable Mention Quarterback of the Week by CFPA for the week ending September 12th. Against Campbell, DeMarco finished the game completing 26 of his 33 throws, including an interception. He racked up 273 passing yards for four touchdowns. He currently ranks fourth nationally in total offense averaging 338.50 yards per game.

TOUGHEST TICKET IN TOWN:

Response for Monarch football has been overwhelming. 14,377 season tickets were sold with season ticket applications made available in Feb. 2008. The school had to unfortunately turn away 296 season ticket orders for a total of 1,065 season tickets due to demand in the first season.

The Monarchs enjoyed a 92% percent renewal rate for year number two and went to the waiting list and promptly sold out of season tickets. A limited number of six-game packages were also available for purchase. Those tickets went on sale at 10 a.m. August 17th and sold out. Just under 500 tickets were scooped up in a little more than two hours.

Tickets are also heavily in demand among the student population. Over 1,200 ODU students were in line when distribution began on Monday, August 24th at 8 a.m. for the inaugural game vs. Chowan on September 5th and over 2,500 student tickets were handed out on the first day. By the next night, only approximately 100 student tickets were available. The Monarch student population one-upped themselves this year as ticket distribution for the home opener vs. Jacksonville on September 4th were made available on Monday, August 30th at 7 a.m. and were completely gone by 2:30 p.m. that day. When the ticket windows opened, the line wrapped around the Ted Constant Convocation Center as head coach Bobby Wilder, his assistant coaches, and the 2010 captains were on hand to hand out donuts to those first in line. Student tickets for William & Mary, Gardner-Webb, and Georgia State were all scooped up in less than 24 hours.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING:

The Monarchs made history on September 5th when a three-year dream became a reality. On May 31, 2006, the ODU board of visitors voted to add football and 1,293 days later, the Monarchs kicked off their first season of Division I FCS play. ODU played an 11-game schedule, including seven home dates at the \$24.8 million renovated Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. The schedule was a mix of both D-II and D-I FCS opponents to help the Monarchs transition into not only its first year of football, but also to get ready for entering the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in 2011, the toughest FCS conference in the nation.

Old Dominion Suffers Season Opener Loss To Jacksonville, 35-25

NORFOLK, Va.-- Old Dominion quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) was 22 of 40 for a career-high 334 yards and two touchdowns. DeMarco added another score on the ground after a 1-yard run, but three interceptions - two in the endzone - prevented the Monarchs from cutting into Jacksonville's lead.

Just like how the Monarchs started last year in a number of games, ODU struck on the first drive. Drew Hareza (McDonald, Pa.) sailed the ball through the uprights on a 24-yard kick capping an opening 13-play, 66-yard drive to give the Monarchs the early 3-0 lead.

Back-to-back touchdowns by Jacksonville however saw the Dolphins take control of the lead and the Monarchs trying to be the "Comeback Kids" for the second straight time against their opponent from Florida.

Chris Kuck had a four-yard catch with 10:44 on the clock and on their next possession the Dolphins had the 14-3 edge. The second scoring drive for Jacksonville had the Dolphins backed up to their own 12, but that's when last year's leading rusher, Rudell Small, tore down the field for 45 yards and two plays later he was in the end zone.

Small would end the night will 118 yards.

Old Dominion, however, ended the half on a high note with the "one-minute drill". DeMarco connected with Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) for a 19-yard reception as ODU covered 50 yards on seven plays in 45 seconds. Gill's touchdown, the Monarchs' first of the 2010 season and Gill's first as a Monarch, cut the ODU deficit to 14-10 at the intermission.

Both teams traded scores in the third quarter. After ODU missed a 32-yard field goal attempt, Jacksonville followed with Josh Philpart on the receiving end of a 32-yard touchdown throw from Josh McGregor. Old Dominion quickly struck back though on the next drive needing just three plays to pull within four, 21-17.

Monty Smalley (Richmond, Va.) provided ODU with a 24-yard kick return to start the drive, Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) followed with a 21-yard run, Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) had a 31-yard catch, and then Dorian Jackson (Colonial Heights, Va.), who scored last year's game-winning touchdown, had a 44-yard reception to keep the Monarchs in the hunt.

The fourth quarter opened with Jacksonville going ahead, 28-17, with Dolphins covering 80 yards to end with Small scoring his second touchdown of the evening.

The Monarchs were immediately poised to cut into the deficit again, but an interception in the end zone put a stop to the ODU comeback. DeMarco threw a 34-yard pass downfield intending to hit Chris Lovitt (Stafford, Va.) in the end zone, but the ball got into the hands of Jacksonville's Andre Addison for the touchdown.

ODU's next possession would indeed cut into the deficit and have the Monarchs trailing by just three points with 8:23 left in the game. The Dolphin's Logan Chipperfield managed just nine-yards on his punt and ODU started from their opponent's 34-yard line. Getting to the one-yard line, DeMarco ran the ball and Jackson was on the receiving end of the two-point conversion. The Monarchs trailed just 28-25 midway through the final quarter.

The next Jacksonville drive lasted just four downs before the Monarchs had the ball back. ODU made its way down the field, but another interception in the end zone, this time by the Dolphin's Jordan Dewhirst, thwarted ODU's chances again.

Jacksonville made the most of getting the ball back into its possession, scoring on a 19-yard pass to Philpart, his second touchdown catch of the game.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

OPENING WITH A BANG:

And no, we aren't talking about the howitzer you hear being shot off before the Monarchs run onto Foreman Field. Old Dominion scored on its first drive to kick off the 2010 season with Drew Hareza kicking the ball through the uprights for a field goal. The Monarchs have scored in their first drive in eight of its 12 total games played.

NOTABLE FIRSTS:

Linebacker Deron Jasper (Dunwoody, Ga.) had the first interception of the 2010 season while Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) had the first touchdown. Both notable were also the first for each in a Monarch uniform.

WHO'S WHO IN THE BOOKS:

Colby Goodwyn's (Hampton, Va.) kick return was the second highest return in the brief ODU history. He dashed 68 yards in the second quarter. Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) is ahead of Goodwyn on the list having returned a 76-yard kick in the historic Chowan game last year.

AIR RAID:

Redshirt quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) passed for a career-high 334 yards, the first time he has passed for over 300 yards in a game. It was the fourth time he had a 200+ yard passing game of his ODU career.

INTO THE WIN COLUMN: Monarchs Down Campbell, 44-13

BUIES CREEK, N.C. -- The Old Dominion football team found the end zone on its first three drives and never looked back en-route to its 44-13 win over Campbell University at Lane-Barker Stadium.

The victory improves the Monarchs to 1-1 on the year as ODU played in its first road game of the 2010 season.

Marquel Thomas (Va. Beach, Va.) and Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) led the Monarchs with a pair of touchdown receptions. Evans caught eight passes, the most by a Monarchs, ending the game with 65 yards. Thomas had 61 receiving yards on five receptions.

Thomas, who scored ODU's first-ever touchdown last season against Chowan, put the Monarchs up 7-0 early in the first quarter. Thomas' 22-yard reception from Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) put the Monarchs ahead with 10:51 on the clock.

The Camels only got off four plays, before the Monarchs regained possession. After a touchback on the punt, the Monarchs covered the 80-yards capping the drive with a 10-yard touchdown reception by Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.). Jarod Brown's (Yorktown, Va.) PAT went wide right, but with 5:32 left in the opening quarter, ODU held a 13-0 edge.

Evans did it again on the next ODU drive. The sophomore receiver registered his fifth TD reception of his career opening second quarter action. Evans' second touchdown of the afternoon came on an eight-yard throw from DeMarco giving his squad a commanding 20-0 lead.

A personal foul penalty put the Camels into the red zone late in the second quarter resulting in Campbell making its first score of the afternoon. Campbell quarterback Daniel Polk, who scored the Camel's two touchdowns in their opener at UVA-Wise, broke the line for a six-yard run into the end zone.

The half ended as Campbell regained control of the ball on an interception. While two plays later it looked as if the Monarchs would have their own interception, the Monarchs were called for roughing the passer and momentum continued for the Camels. As time expired in the opening half, Campbell's Adam Willets had a 46-yard field goal sail through the uprights and ODU headed into the intermission ahead 20-10.

Thomas got things started for the Monarchs after halftime giving ODU a 27-10 edge on his second touchdown reception and third of his career. His eight-yard catch from DeMarco capped the 11 play, 52-yard drive.

Campbell put up a field goal in the closing minutes of the third quarter. Willets posted his second three-point kick, this time a 38-yard attempt, cutting the Monarch lead to 27-13 with 2:37 left in the third.

Old Dominion wasted no time in responding. On the third play of the drive, Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) tore down the field gaining a 47 yard reception and bringing ODU to the Camel 10. The next play saw DeMarco with the QB keeper to the 1 and then jump over the end line on the next play to put the Monarchs up 34-13 with just 42 seconds left until the start of the final quarter.

Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.), last week's College Football Performance Awards' Kick Returner of the Week, also got into the scoring mix. He had an up and over a pile on the goal line put the Monarchs ahead 41-13 with 12:48 left in the game.

Goodwyn, who saw a majority of the carries in the fourth quarter, finished the game with 17 carries and 58 yards.

Scoring continued for the Monarchs late in the fourth quarter. Brown's 19-yard field goal was good giving ODU the final 44-13 score.

Defensively, ODU's Michael Colbert led the way with seven unassisted tackles. Transfer Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.) made six total stops, including a six-yard sack. Andrew Turner also took down Camel quarterback, Polk, pushing him back 11 yards.

DeMarco finished the game completing 26 of his 33 throws, including an interception. He racked up 273 passing yards for four touchdowns. Polk had just 68 yards on seven of 15 passing.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

CATCHING IN THE END ZONE:

Prior to the Campbell game, only Nick Mayers had more than one touchdown reception in a game - at Fordham (10/3/09) and last season at home against Campbell (10/17/09). In Saturday's win Marquel Thomas and Reid Evans joined Mayers in the category as each had a pair of TD catches.

PLAYING CATCH:

Reid Evans' eight receptions were the most by a Monarch. The previous high of six was held by Evans from last year's Jacksonville game.

TD'S FOR TD:

Thomas DeMarco on his 1-yard jaunt over the end line give ODU a 34-13 advantage with 42 seconds left in the third quarter was his 19th rushing touchdown as a Monarch.

Late Score Lifts #12/13 Tribe Past Football Monarchs, 21-17

NORFOLK, Va. -- Gareth Hissong caught a four-yard touchdown pass from Mike Callahan with less than five minutes to play to give #12/13 William & Mary (2-1) a come-from-behind 21-17 win over Old Dominion (1-2) Saturday night in front of a sold-out crowd at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

On third and goal, Callahan rolled out and hit Hissong in the flat for the winning score, which was Hissong's first career catch.

Jarod Brown had given ODU a 17-14 lead with a 20-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter.

ODU came out firing, taking the 7-0 lead on a four-yard touchdown pass from Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) to redshirt sophomore Kai Blanco (Alexandria, Va.). The drive was set-up after Michael Williams (Norfolk, Va.) returned an interception for 17-yards setting up the Monarchs at the Tribe's 48. A 33-yard pass to Marquel Thomas (Va. Beach, Va.) brought ODU into the red zone and four plays later Blanco put the Monarchs into an early lead.

The Tribe had a pair of chances to cut into the lead early in the second quarter. First, David Miller's 31-yard field goal attempt went wide right. With Old Dominion starting the following drive on its own 20, William & Mary quickly regained possession on a fumble on ODU's 17 on the Monarchs' first play. The defense held, which included a nine-yard sack by Deron May (Hampton, Va.) and Ronnie Cameron (Westbury, N.Y.) that put the Tribe at fourth and goal on the ODU 17. This time, Miller's kick hit the right upright and ODU held on to its 7-0 lead.

William & Mary did tie the score in the middle of the second quarter, with Jonathan Grimes capping off a six play, 84 yard drive with a 30-yard touchdown run.

The Monarchs quickly responded as Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.) ripped off a career long 41 yard touchdown run to put ODU back on top and go into halftime up 14-7.

It took just one offensive play in the third quarter to tie the game, as Callahan hit Chase Hill down the right sideline, and he broke two tackles to go in for the score.

The Monarchs reclaimed the lead with 9:41 left in the game. ODU had the ball at first and goal at the Tribe's own two-yard line, but the Monarchs were unable to find a gap in the William & Mary defense to cross the endline. Jarod Brown (Yorktown, Va.), however, managed to get points on the board and put ODU ahead 17-14 with his 20-yard field goal.

The following drive saw Hissong's touchdown that capped an eight-play, 66 yard drive for the Tribe.

Jonathan Grimes led the Tribe with 124 yards rushing and a touchdown. Thomas DeMarco was 21-of-40 passing for 186 yards and the touchdown, while Mario Crawford was his top target with seven catches for 44 yards. Ronnie Cameron (Westbury, N.Y.) and Michael Williams (Norfolk, Va.) led the Monarch defense with 10 tackles each.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

MEMORABLE CAREER MOMENT:

Kai Blanco gave the Monarchs a 6-0 edge over the Tribe in his first career touchdown reception. The 4-yard pass from DeMarco gave the Monarchs a lead over the #12/13 team in the FCS.

NUMBERS GAME:

With his 4-yard pass to Blanco for the first score of the game, DeMarco brought his career touchdown pass number to 28.

DEFENSIVE STAT LINES:

Michael Williams stat line for the night saw the redshirt sophomore linebacker rack up 10 total tackles, a 12-yard sack, two stops for loss of yardage, and a 17-yard interception.

BREAKING-UP IS HARD TO DO:

T.J. Cowart registered three pass break-ups, tying for the most in a game by a Monarch. Cowart has interrupted opponent quarterback throws seven times in his two years at Old Dominion.

ANOTHER FIRST:

Although the Monarchs do not join the league until next season, the Monarchs took on their first opponent from the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) and will travel up to Williamsburg, Va. to face the Tribe as an official member of the conference in 2011. Saturday's game also marked the first ranked opponent ODU has ever faced. The Tribe entered the game ranked #12 by The Sports Network Poll and #13 in the FCS Coach's Poll.

BACK ON TRACK: Football Monarchs Dominate Monmouth, 35-21

WEST LONG BRANCH, N.J. -- Wide receiver Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) posted a Monarch record 154 receiving yards and quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) threw for a career-high 407 yards in the Football Monarchs' 35-21 victory over Monmouth Saturday at Kessler Field.

ODU improves to 2-2 on the season. The Hawks, who were one of the two Monarch losses last season, falls to 0-3.

Gill finished the game with two touchdowns and also a two-point conversion. His 154 yards was the second time in ODU's brief history a Monarch captured 100+ receiving yards in a game. He also surpassed the previous record of 103 held by Nick Mayers (Va. Beach, Va.) in the game last season at Fordham.

DeMarco connected on 28 of his 47 attempts, including four touchdowns, for his first 400+ yard passing game of his career.

Defensively, the Monarchs' racked up 10 tackles resulting in the Hawks' losing 35 yards and three sacks having pushed back Monmouth quarterback Kyle Frasier 20 yards. T.J. Cowart (Va. Beach, Va.) led the charge with a career-high 10 stops, while Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.), Chris Burnette (Randallstown, Md.), and Edmon McClam (Cowart, S.C.) each had sacks.

Monmouth capitalize on an early ODU turnover for a touchdown on its first drive, but the rest of Saturday's football game was Old Dominion as the Monarchs scored 27 answered points.

The Hawks' Don Brooks intercepted one of DeMarco's passes at Monmouth 36 and six plays later, the home team was sporting a 7-0 lead.

Back-to-back field goals by Jarod Brown (Yorktown, Va.) would get scoring going for the Monarchs. On the drive following the Hawks' first touchdown run, Brown kicked a 23-yarder to put ODU onto the scoreboard with 4:43 left in the first quarter. Then on ODU's opening drive of the second quarter, the Monarchs got deep into Hawk territory thanks in part to a 26-yard reception by Nick Mayers. Mayers' catch got the Monarchs to the Monmouth three-yard line, but the Hawks defense held forcing Brown back onto the field for another field goal attempt. His 20-yard attempt sailed through the uprights helping the Monarchs to trail by just one point, 7-6, with 8:51 remaining in the opening half.

It wasn't long before ODU would collect its first touchdown and go ahead for good. The Hawks were unable to move the chains and the ball promptly was back to a Monarch possession. Starting at the Monmouth 33 thanks in part to a Hawk foul, DeMarco needed just a pair of passes to help lead his team into the end zone. His second pass, a 22-yard throw to Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.), gave the Monarchs a 13-7 edge, a lead they would not relinquish, and Evans' third touchdown catch of the year with just under seven minutes left in the half.

Gill added to the lead later in the quarter with his first appearance in the end zone. A 21-yard throw from DeMarco found its way into in Gills' hands in the right corner of the end zone to help give ODU a 20-7 lead.

The Monarchs would score on their next possession to head into the locker room with a dominating 27-7 advantage. ODU covered 87 yards in eight plays resulting in a Chris Lovitt (Stafford, Va.) four-yard touchdown reception.

Monmouth ended the scoring drought to end the third quarter on a five-yard run over the end line by Frazier capping the 15-play, 87-yard drive.

Both teams would trade scores in the fourth quarter for the final 35-21 margin. Gill posted his second touchdown reception with a 48-yard catch from DeMarco and converted the two-point conversion with 7:17 left in the game. Monmouth's final score came on their next drive on a 10-yard reception by Nick Romeo.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

ON THE ROAD:

ODU improved to 5-1 overall on the road including a 2-0 mark this season with wins over Monmouth and Campbell (44-13).

BATTLE OF THE PUNTERS:

Monmouth sported the nation's leader in Jack Daniels. Daniels entered today's game leading the nation at 46.73 yards per punt. Today is averaged 37.7 yards in his six punts The Monarchs' Jonathan Plisco (Newport News, Va.) led the nation in punting last year at 44.84 per punt. Entering Saturday's contest, he was averaging 50.0 yards, but does not compute into the NCAA rankings not having made the minimum 3.6 punts per game average through the first three games of the season. Plisco's services were only needed twice. Although his first attempt only traveled four years, his second punt went for 41 yards.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING:

Old Dominion was ranked number one in the nation in sacks allowed having not allowed an opponent to touch DeMarco entering Saturday's contest. However, the Hawks managed to take down DeMarco twice in Saturday's game.

NEARING THE CENTURY MARK:

Quarterback Thomas DeMarco surpassed the 1,000 career rushing mark. With 14 yards on 10 carries against the Hawks, he now has 1,010 yards in his 15 games at a Monarch.

BLOCK THAT KICK:

Alex Arain registered ODU's first block of the season and the eighth overall in the two-year program. Arain blocked the nation's leading punter, Jack Daniels, in third quarter.

BIG PLAY DAY:

Not only did T.J. Cowart lead the defense with his career-high 10 tackles, he also had a fumble recovery late in the first quarter.

Football Pushes Past Gardner-Webb, 14-7
Monty Smalley set up the game-winning score
with a 32 yard punt return

NORFOLK, Va. -- Thomas DeMarco scored the game-winning touchdown from five yards out late in the fourth quarter to give Old Dominion University football a 14-7 win over Gardner-Webb.

After the ODU stopped the Bulldogs deep in their own territory, Monty Smalley returned the punt 32 yards to the Bulldogs' 20, it took the Monarchs just three plays for DeMarco to his paydirt.

After both teams scored touchdowns in the opening quarter, it was a battle of field position, with ODU's punter Jonathan Plisco (Newport News, Va.) coming up big with a 47.2 yard average, and putting five punts inside the 20.

The ODU Football Monarchs garnered their first home victory with a 14-7 win over Gardner-Webb, after suffering losses to Jacksonville and nationally ranked William & Mary in their first two appearances at Foreman Field. They improve to 3-2 overall.

The injury plagued Gardner-Webb Bulldogs dropped their third-straight after their stunning victory over Akron. The loss dropped the Bulldogs to 2-3 on the year.

It was three and out for Gardner-Webb on the game's first possession and the next drive saw the Monarchs score on its opening drive for the third time this season. ODU covered 73 yards in nine plays ending with Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) claiming his first touchdown of the year, Crawford's touchdown run followed by Jarod Brown's point after (Yorktown, Va.) gave the Monarchs the early 7-0 edge with just 10:56 left in the opening quarter.

The Monarchs' on-side kick, recovered by Craig Wilkins (Washington, D.C.), looked to continue the momentum for ODU. Unfortunately, Gardner-Webb regained possession on the next Monarch snap as Cedric McGowan managed to intercept Thomas DeMarco's (Palm Desert, Calif.) first pass of the drive.

Although the Runnin' Bulldogs got to within nine yards of a touchdown, on third and goal T.J. Cowart (Va. Beach, Va.) knocked down a pass intended for Jamal Patmon in the end zone, setting Gardner-Webb up for a 27-yard field goal attempt. Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.) swooped in and blocked the field goal attempt by the Bulldogs' Ryan Gates with Paul Morant (Hampton, Va.) returning the kick 11 yards to the 21.

On the next Gardner-Webb drive, the Bulldogs tied the score up at 7-7 with 3:00 left in the first quarter.

After punter Jonathan Plisco (Newport News, Va.) booted the ball to 45 yards to the Monarchs' 45, the Bulldogs' James Perry III returned the ball 33 yards to flip the field for Gardner-Webb. Just four plays and 36 yards later, Richard Jules found the gap in the line for a nine-yard touchdown to help tie the game.

It wasn't until late in the fourth quarter that Monarchs managed to break the 7-7 stalemate for the win.

Monty Smalley's (Richmond, Va.) 32-yard punt return set up the Monarchs for their touchdown run taking ODU down the Bulldogs' 20 to start the drive. The Monarchs would need just three more plays after that.

Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) had another big run, tearing downfield for 13 yards putting the Monarchs at first and goal from the seven. A pair of carries by DeMarco would get the Monarchs over the end line. A five-yard run by DeMarco, followed by Brown's point-after gave the 14-7 final margin.

DeMarco, whose game-winning touchdown was his 20th rushing score, finished the game connecting on 15 of his 30 attempts in the air, gaining 130 yards.

Morant and linebacker J.J. Williams led a defense, which held the Bulldogs to 3 of 9 on third-down conversions and 24 yards of total offense in the second half. Both ended with a game-high 10 tackles.

Total, the ODU defense collected five sacks by six different Monarchs for 38 yards and 12 tackles for 49 negative yards for Gardner-Webb.

#14/16 Cal Poly Outlasts Football Monarchs, 50-37

Monarchs Fall To 3-3 Despite 442 Yards of Total Offense

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion football team finished the night with 442 yards of offense and pulled to within seven points of #14/16 Cal Poly with 10 minutes remaining in the game, but the Mustangs outlasted the Monarchs, 50-37, at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Cal Poly, ranked 14th in The Sports Network Poll and 16th in the FCS Coaches' Poll, were the second nationally-ranked squad the Monarchs have fallen to this season. ODU drops to 3-3 overall and heads into a bye-week. The Mustangs meanwhile improve to 4-2 on the year.

The high scoring affair saw David Mahr record 156 of Cal Poly's season-best 326 rushing yards and quarterback Andre Broadous pass for 212 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) threw for 327 yards and tied his career mark with four touchdown, two of which dropped into the hands of Marquel Thomas (Va. Beach, Va.). Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) collected 133 yards receiving on six catches.

Scoring opened early and happened often. As is the trend with the Monarchs, the opening drive resulted in an ODU score. With the Monarchs opening the game kicking off, Lee Daniel (Baltimore, Md.) recovered the on-side kick and five plays later, ODU was up 7-0. Desmond Williams (Windsor, N.C.) found his way into the end zone on a 10-yard run, giving the Monarchs their earliest score of the year.

The Mustangs responded immediately going on to score 20 straight points. On their first drive of the night, Jake West connected on a 28-yard field goal to cut into the ODU lead. Unfortunately for the Monarchs, Cal Poly would produce a pair of touchdowns, including a 75-yard end zone reception for Dominique Johnson, to go up 17-7 at the end of the opening quarter of play.

West put up another field goal, this time from 21-yards out, to put his Mustang squad up 20-7 with just under 10 minutes remaining in the third stanza.

From that point, each team traded scores until the mid-point of the fourth quarter. After a scoreless third quarter, the Monarchs and Mustangs combined for a 40-point fourth quarter.

Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.) got the Monarchs into the redzone with his 79-yard kick return to help set up Jarod Brown (Yorktown, Va.) for a 34-yard field goal attempt. After Brown's kick sailed through the uprights, the Monarchs trailed by just seven points, 37-30, with 9:04 remaining in the game.

Cal Poly, however, used back-to-back touchdowns to keep the game out of reach for the Monarchs. The Mustangs' Jake Romanelli rushed down field for 35-yards after the Monarchs fumbled on fourth and 10 to put Cal Poly up 50-30.

The Monarchs' Chris Lovitt (Stafford, Va.) caught a nine-yard pass from DeMarco to round out the night's scoring.

Defensively, Craig Wilkins (Washington, D.C.) led the way with 11 tackles, including a fumble recovery. Devon Simmons (Va. Beach, Va.) made 10 stops.

BATTLE OF THE NEWCOMERS: Football Monarchs' Win The Turnover Battle in 34-20 Win Over Georgia State

NORFOLK, Va. -- Old Dominion University football scored 34-straight points to turn a 6-0 deficit into a 34-6 lead and cruised to a 34-20 win over Georgia State Saturday evening at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

The Monarchs were down early to the first-year Georgia State program after a pair of Iain Vance field goals put Georgia State up 6-0.

The Panthers' opening drive saw the squad reach the ODU 2 thanks to a 30-yard run by Roosevelt Watson. However at first and goal, the Monarch defense clamped down forcing Georgia State to kick the field goal.

The next Georgia State drive produced Vance's second field goal. The Panthers were once again inside the red zone, but the ODU defense would not budge, forcing the 34-yard attempt from Vance.

The rest of the night then belonged to Old Dominion with the Monarchs going on a tear scoring 34 straight points and holding Georgia State scoreless for two quarters.

After the Monarchs gave up 126 yards of offense to the Panthers in the opening stanza, ODU only allowed the Panthers to gain 47 yards in the second half while racking of 163 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) got the Monarchs onto the scoreboard giving his Old Dominion team the lead for good. The Monarchs' leading rusher used a six-yard run for his second touchdown of 2010 to give ODU the 7-6 edge with 7:03 remaining in the second quarter.

After a three and out by the Panthers, Old Dominion found itself in the end zone yet again. Twice the Monarchs converted fourth down to continue its charge downfield capping the drive with a 18-yard reception by Marquel Thomas (Va. Beach, Va.).

Four plays later, the Monarchs got the ball back as Fred Credle (Chesapeake, Va.) caused Georgia State's Danny Williams to fumble the ball with Donald Smith (Chesapeake, Va.) right there for the recovery. With the ball back in possession, ODU extended its lead to 17-6 with a 44-yard field goal by Jarod Brown (Yorktown, Va.). Brown's 44-yard field goal was his longest and the second longest field goal in ODU's brief two-year history.

Old Dominion put up 15 more points in the third quarter.

Georgia State opened the third stanza with the ball and made its way down into ODU territory. With the Panthers on the ODU 42, Panther quarterback Drew Little threw 13-yards to Parris Lee, but J.J. Williams (Derby, Kan.) caused the opportunity to fumble. Craig Wilkins (Washington, D.C.) made the recovery setting up ODU for an eight-play, 71 yard drive resulting in a 23-yard touchdown run by Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.).

For Goodwyn, it was his third rushing touchdown of the season.

Another Georgia State fumble turned into another Monarch score later in the third quarter. As the nation's leading punter Jonathan Plisco (Newport News, Va.) booted the ball 47 yards, Panther punt returner Albert Wilson fumbled, giving the Monarchs' Alex Arain (Va. Beach, Va.) the opportunity to return the ball back to Old Dominion at the Panthers' own nine yard line.

Although the Monarchs were pushed back for negative yardage, Brown kicked to 29-yard field goal attempt through the uprights to give ODU the 27-6 advantage with 2:44 left in the quarter.

Scoring still wasn't over for the Monarchs as Georgia State fumbled again. Wilkins not only caused the fumble, but collected his second fumble recovery of the afternoon.

Starting deep into Panther territory, the Monarchs needed just five plays to find the end zone yet again. Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) on the qb keeper posted his team-leading fifth rushing touchdown this year to put ODU ahead 34-6 heading into the final quarter.

Georgia State notched a pair of touchdowns during the fourth quarter for the game's final score. Travis Evans had a 32-yard reception and Little found his way over the endline on a nine-play, 80 yard Georgia State drive midway through the quarter.

Defensively, the Monarchs had a big night from T.J. Cowart (Va. Beach, Va.) who led the way with 10 tackles, including eight solo stops, and three pass break-ups. Cowart, who also had three pass break-ups in games with nationally-ranked William & Mary and Gardner-Webb, has made 13 in his career as a Monarch.

Wilkins, who forced a pair of fumbles along with a fumble recovery that led to Monarch scores, finished the night with seven tackles, including 2.5 for seven negative yards for the Panthers.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

PUTTING THE "D" IN DEFENSE:

Craig Wilkins, J.J. Williams, and Fred Credle each forced Georgia State fumbles Saturday. The three force fumbles ties the mark for the most in a game. The Monarchs also had three last season against Campbell.

Additionally, the four fumble recoveries - Alex Arain, Donald Smith and two by Wilkins, were the most by the Monarchs in a game thus far. The previous high of three came last season in a loss at Fordham.

Also, the Monarchs' 10 pass break-ups were the most by the team. Led by Cowart's three, ODU surpasses its previous high of nine against Presbyterian last year.

Special Teams Shines in 28-14 Victory Over Hampton

HAMPTON, Va. -- The Monarch special teams unit blocked two punts and rushed Pirate punter Jordan Stoval to start a drive on Hampton's own one-yard line all by halftime in ODU's 28-14 win in its 15-mile road trip to Hampton.

The win ups ODU's overall mark to 5-3 overall and 6-1 all-time on the road. The Pirates meanwhile drop to 5-3 on the season.

Quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) passed for 182 yards and ran for a pair of touchdowns, while Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) led the receiving corps with 67 yards, seven receptions, and a score.

The Monarchs went up 14-0 within six minutes of the opening whistling, scoring a pair of touchdowns less than a minute apart, in what was a quick scoring opening stanza.

On Hampton's opening drive, the Pirates were forced to punt after being pinned back at their own 15. After the snap, ODU's Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.) saw the opening and rushed Stoval, forcing the Pirate punter to nick his own teammate on the kick. Mayo recovered the ball and the Monarchs started their drive four yards from the end line.

Two plays later, DeMarco found the end zone and the Monarchs were ahead for good.

On the Pirates' next drive, Old Dominion got a hand on the punt. Stoval's punt from his team's own two-yard line was blocked by Mayo and teammate Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.) recovered for the Monarch touchdown and the 14-0 advantage with just 10:20 on the clock in the game's opening quarter.

Nearly two minutes later Hampton got onto the scoreboard. On ODU's next possession, the Pirates' Darius Johnson forced Goodwyn to fumble and set Hampton up to start its run from the Monarchs' own 12. Antwon Chisholm capped the three play, 55 second drive to pull his squad to within in a touchdown.

Scoring wasn't over for the Monarchs in the first quarter though. DeMarco notched his second touchdown run with 4:07 on the clock as the Monarchs covered 76 yards in the drive for the 21-7 edge.

The Monarchs had the lone score of the second quarter, which was set up by another blocked punt. This time Desmond Williams (Windsor, N.C.) found the hole to stop Stoval's punt and ODU began its third touchdown drive from the Pirates' own nine. This time DeMarco connected on a nine-yard pass to Gill with 6:47 remaining in the first half.

The third quarter was scoreless, however it ended with the Pirates deep into ODU territory as the final play, an 18-yard catch by Javaris Brown, put Hampton at the Monarchs' one-yard line to kick off the final quarter of action.

The Pirate's Steve Robinson recorded the game's final score just seconds into the fourth stanza.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by Paul Morant (Hampton, Va.) and Ronnie Cameron (Westbury, N.Y.) with eight tackles each. Morant also had a pass break-up, while Cameron registered a pair of QB hurries. ODU also had a pair of interceptions, their first since its William & Mary contest. Devon Simmons (Newport News, Va.) made a 37-yard interception return during Hampton's final drive of the afternoon and Donald Smith (Chesapeake, Va.) had a five-yard return earlier in the day.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

ON THE ROAD:

ODU is now 6-1 on the road in their young history and 3-0 in 2010. In their inaugural season, the Monarchs went 3-1 on the road with wins at Jacksonville (28-27), Savannah State (38-17), and VMI (42-35). The lone setback away from the friendly confines of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium was a 34-29 loss at Fordham. Only one other road game awaits the Monarchs in a return date with North Carolina Central for the 2010 season finale on November 20th.

BLOCK THAT KICK:

Special teams now has 11 blocks to its credit in the last two seasons. Deron Mayo and Desmond Williams both blocked punts in the 28-14 win over Hampton Saturday. Mayo also had a blocked field goal during the first quarter vs Gardner-Webb to preserve ODU's 7-0 lead against the Runnin' Bulldogs. Alex Arain blocked a punt, ODU's first blocked punt, at Monmouth the previous weekend. Chris Burnette has two blocked PATs and Edmon McClam holds an FCS record with five blocked PATs from last season.

Hampton had not had a punt blocked since 2004.

CHANGE OF POSSESSION:

The Monarchs' Donald Smith interception in the second quarter was only the third for the Monarchs this season and the first since Michael Williams' in the September 17th contest with William & Mary. Devon Simmons added the fourth Monarch INT late in the game. His 37-yard return was the second longest in the Monarch record books.

Deron Jasper has the other ODU interception on the year from the Monarchs' season opener with now nationally-ranked Jacksonville.

AND WE'RE NUMBER ONE HERE TOO:

The Monarchs entered Saturday's game as the number one team in the nation in kickoff return averaging 26.77 yards per return in the category. ODU had 59 yards against the Pirates led by Colby Goodwyn with a long of 31.

Football Monarchs Cruise To 57-9 Win Over Savannah State

*Nine Different Monarchs Score in Victory
To Ensure Second Winning Season*

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion football team cruised to a 57-9 win over Savannah State Saturday afternoon at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium with nine different Monarchs getting into the scoring mix.

Old Dominion won its third straight and improved to 6-3 on the year and ensured themselves its second straight winning season. Additionally, the Monarchs improved their mark to 3-3 at home this season. Meanwhile, the Tigers remain winless as Savannah State drops to 0-9 on the year. ODU's 57 points are the most the Tigers have allowed this season.

A trio of freshman put in some notable performances. Rookie Aaron Evans (Newport News, Va.), stepping in for the injured Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.), raced downfield 92-yards for the Monarchs' first ever kick return for a touchdown. Additionally, true freshman Rashad Manley (Hampton, Va.) served as the Monarchs' signal caller the entire second half finishing the game completing eight of his 13 attempts for 89 yards. Defensively, freshman Rodney Hunter (Alpharetta, Ga.) made a team-leading 10 tackles.

The Monarchs established an early lead and held the Tigers scoreless until late in the second quarter. By then, ODU had established a sizeable 36-0 advantage.

The game started with ODU's collecting its fifth on-side kick and four plays later Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) running the first Monarchs' points into the end zone. It was Old Dominion's fastest score in the program's history occurring just one minute and seven seconds into the contest.

By the end of the first quarter, Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) posted his fourth touchdown reception of the year and Desmond Williams (Winsor, N.C.) took off for a 32-yard run to give the Monarchs' the 28-0 lead.

Just like the first stanza, the Monarchs struck early and managed to score in each of their drives in the second quarter.

ODU needed just three plays to open second quarter scoring. The final two plays of the drive saw Chris Lovitt (Stafford, Va.) combine for 70 yards receiving, including a 50-yard touchdown reception.

Following Lovitt's touchdown, the Monarchs were immediately back in control of the field. On Savannah State's first drive of the second half, Sheldon Barner fumbled the ball at the Tigers' own 41 with T.J. Cowart (Va. Beach, Va.) returning possession to the Monarchs leading to DeMarco's second touchdown run of the afternoon and a two-point conversion for the 43-0 edge.

The next drive saw Savannah State get deep into ODU territory, threatening to put the ball over the end line. At first and goal at Monarchs' own 2, the ODU defense thwarted the Tigers from the end zone with key stops that resulted in Savannah State having to settle for a 44-yard field goal. The defense clamped down starting with Devon Simmons (Newport News, Va.) holding the Tigers at the line of scrimmage, Craig Wilkins (Washington, D.C.) pushing back Tiger quarterback Antonio Bostick 11 yards, a delay of game resulting in a loss five yards for Savannah State, and Mateus Porter (Pacific, Calif.) and Michael Williams (Norfolk, Va.) forcing the Tiger offense back another nine yards for the fourth down. The Tigers' Derek Williams finally got the Tigers onto the scoreboard then with his 44-yard attempt.

The Monarchs punched right back with Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) capping a six-play, 78-yard drive on their next possession. Crawford, who finished the game with 20 yards on seven carries, is just nine yards shy of hitting the 1,000 yard career rushing mark.

The Tigers scored their lone touchdown of the day on the following drive. Bostick edged his way into the end zone, but when Savannah State went for the extra point, the Tigers were denied by Edmon McClam (Cownt, S.C.) blocking a PAT for the sixth time in his career.

ODU added in another dagger as Evans took Derek Williams kick 92-yards for a touchdown as the Monarchs entered halftime ahead 50-9.

Craig Wilkins recorded the lone touchdown of the second half to round out the afternoon's scoring. Wilkins picked off Bostick's pass for a 25-yard interception return for a touchdown, ODU's first of the season.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

MOST POINTS:

The 57 points scored by the Monarchs are the most in the 20-game history of the program. The previous high was 49 in the 49-17 victory over Virginia Union back on September 12th, 2009. The previous high against a Division I opponent was 44 in the 44-13 win at Campbell on September 11th, 2010.

RISE AND SHINE:

Thomas DeMarco's eight yard touchdown run to kick off the game gave the Monarchs' its earliest score ever.

THE PUNT GAME:

Jonathan Plisco, was No. 2 in the nation in punting this week, made a pair of punts to average 49.5 yards.

T.J. Cowart Registers Season-High 13 Tackles; Mario Crawford Surpasses 1000 Yard Career Rushing Mark

NORFOLK, Va. -- Old Dominion sent its 11 seniors out in style on Saturday at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium as the Monarchs defeated VMI, 45-28, in front of its 10th consecutive sellout crowd.

The Monarchs won their fourth-straight and end the 2010 home slate with a 4-3 mark and up their overall record to 7-3 on the year. The Keydets meanwhile fall to 3-7 overall in their third straight defeat.

Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) led the Monarchs with a pair of touchdowns and surpassed the 1,000 yard career rushing mark in the win. With 59 yards on 13 carries, Crawford became the second Monarch to reach the milestone.

On the other side of the ball, T.J. Cowart (Va. Beach, Va.) made a season-high 13 stops and collectively the Monarch defense registered three fumble recoveries, having forced four.

After a fumble led to a VMI touchdown on the opening Keydet drive and the Monarchs' trailed 14-7 at the end of one quarter, Old Dominion scored 31 unanswered points spanning the second and third quarters.

Two plays into the game, the Monarchs fumbled the ball at their own 27 leading the Keydets to strike first with Chaz Jones getting over the end line three and a half minutes into the contest.

The Monarchs struck back though on their next possession. The 10-play, 68-yard drive was capped by Desmond Williams' (Windsor, N.C.) three-yard run to tie the game at 7-7 midway through the opening quarter.

VMI answered immediately as Keydet quarterback Eric Kordenbrock completed a 55-yard pass to T.J. Talley less than two minutes later to give the ODU opponent a 14-7 edge heading into the second quarter.

From the second quarter on, it was all Old Dominion.

VMI failed to convert a field goal to kick things off in the second half. Jeff Sexton's 33-yard attempt sailed wide right.

The next two drives put ODU into the lead and started what would go on to be 31 unanswered points.

Jarod Brown (Yorktown, Va.) put his 24-yard field goal attempt through the uprights and was followed by the first of two Crawford touchdowns to give the Monarchs the lead for good with a ODU holding a 17-14 advantage with 8:09 remaining in the half.

Crawford's touchdown run was set-up by one of the four turnovers the Monarchs recovered in the game. Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.) sacked VMI QB Kordenbrock helping the Keydet signal caller to fumble and Craig Wilkins (Washington, D.C.) to pick the ball for a 15-yard return.

Kai Blanco (Alexandria, Va.) added to the Monarchs' second quarter scoring to give Old Dominion a 24-14 edge heading into halftime with a 10-yard reception.

Old Dominion posted another two touchdowns before VMI ended the drought. The third quarter opened with Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) throwing his second touchdown of the game, a six-yard pass to Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) and senior Mateus Porter (Pacifica, Calif.) recovering a fumble at the VMI 16 to set up DeMarco to connect with Chris Lovitt on another six-yard pass in the end zone.

The Keydets ended the Monarch scoring barrage late in the third quarter. Cameron Jones completed a 12-yard pass to Tracy Hairston, but ODU still led, 38-21, heading into the final quarter.

Crawford gave the Monarchs their final score of the game with just over six minutes remaining in the game. The sophomore running back capped a 10-play, 82-yard drive to punch the ball into the end zone on fourth and goal.

VMI's Talley gave the game its final 45-28 margin with a 19-yard catch on the next Keydet drive.

DeMarco led the Monarchs completing 20 of his 35 attempts in the air for 270 passing yards and three touchdowns. He also added a team-high 67 rushing yards.

Jones led the Keydets with 114 yards on the ground, while Talley totaled 79 receiving yards. Kordenbrock connected on 12 of his 23 passes for 175 yards.

HOME SWEET HOME:

Old Dominion improved its record to 4-3 this season at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium with the 45-28 win over VMI Saturday. All three losses in 2010 have come at the hands of teams currently featured in the Top 25 including #1/2 Williams & Mary, #19/18 Cal Poly, and #22/24 Jacksonville. The Monarchs are 10-4 all-time on their home turf.

D-D-DEFENSE:

T.J. Cowart's 13 tackles is not only the most for a Monarch this season, but ties the record for the most stops by a Monarch defender in a game. Cowart surpasses the previous season-high of 11 held by Cowart himself in the 35-21 win at Monmouth and Craig Wilkins versus Cal Poly in a 50-37 loss to the nationally ranked squad. Cowart ties the mark also held by former Monarch line-backer Mycheal McJunkins recorded in last year's 42-35 win at VMI.

MILESTONE ALERT:

Running back Mario Crawford, who entered Saturday's contest with 991 yards on 203 carries, became the second Monarch to accumulate 1,000 or more rushing yards in a career with 59 yards on 13 carries. Crawford now has 1050 career rushing yards in his two years as a Monarch.
