NCAA Tournament Time

In 2008 the Monarchs have passed milestone after milestone and they didn't stop at the CAA Tournament. Old Dominion qualified more individuals to the national tournament than ever before, with six receiving automatic bids to the Championship. Old Dominion will have a wrestler at 125, 133, 141, 165, 184 and 285.

ODU won three weights at the conference tournament including the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler, Ryan Williams, at 141 lbs. Williams toppled the 2nd ranked wrestler in the nation, Charles Griffin (Hofstra), in the title bout to earn his second trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Also headed to St. Louis is 125-pounder James Nicholson, after earning the highest national ranking ever for a Monarch under head coach Steve Martin, at 9th in the nation. He swept through the 125-lb weight at the CAA Tournament with ease and beat the 11th ranked wrestler, Dave Tomasette (Hofstra), for the third time this season in the title bout.

Chris Brown is also primed for a run at the podium at 165 lbs, after winning the weight in his second season for the Monarchs. Earlier in the year he defeated #1 Mark Perry (lowa) and has not cowered in the face of other top competition in the past.

The three other Monarchs qualified for Nationals are 133-pounder Kyle Hutter, ranked 15th in the nation, 184-pounder Jesse Strawn and heavyweight Andy Totusek. If any CAA competitors are injured before the NCAA Tourney begins, junior 197 pounder David Mendoza is the first alternate for the conference.

Best Dual Season in 25 Years

The Monarchs finished the 2007-08 dual season with the best mark in head coach Steve Martin's short career, at 17-3 overall. It is the second best mark in the modern era for ODU, second to only the NCAA East Regional Championship team of 1983-84, who posted a 20-3-1 record. The 17 wins ranks as second most in the 51 years of Old Dominion wrestling

Top 25 Team

ODU earned its first national ranking since the 1990-91 season earlier this year as W.I.N. Magazine ranked the Monarchs 22nd in the nation. Since then, ODU has been a staple in the top 25 and has recently earned the programs best ever national ranking, at 18th in the nation by W.I.N.

The Monarchs now rank 19th by W.I.N. and in the USA Today/InterMat/NWCA rankings. In the Tournament rankings, ODU is coming in at T23rd by InterMat and 35th by W.I.N.

Nationally Ranked Individuals

For the first time in school history, Old Dominion had six grapplers ranked nationally by Amateur Wrestling News. Much of the starting lineup has been in the national polls for the duration of the season. Only at 157 and Hwt have the Monarchs not been listed by a poll at least once this season.

Three of the NCAA qualifiers are currently ranked by by all four national polls and a fourth is in three of the four. James Nicholson is ranked no lower than 10th by any of the major polls.

Champions Developing the Future

Head Coach Steve Martin has led the Monarchs to a 51-32-2 mark through his fourth year at the helm. In the CAA the Monarchs have dominated with a 22-5-1 mark. Martin comes from a powerhouse of high school wrestling in Great Bridge High School in Chesapeake. In 14 years as head coach, the Great Bridge Wildcats won 13 state championships.

Martin is assisted by Mike Dixon, Jon Sioredas and Matt Storniolo. Dixon brings great recruiting skills and knowledge of the CAA coming from James Madison. He has experience coaching championship contenders while at the University of Indianapolis.

Sioredas is a second-year coach with a wealth of knowledge about the sport. Named an All-American and ranked as high as 2nd nationally at the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga, Sioredas is now using his skills to teach.

Storniolo is mirroring Sioredas' career, jumping right into coaching after graduation. He was a two-time All-American at the University of Oklahoma, as well as the Big East Rookie of the Year at Penn State.

All four coaches are wrestling champions in their own right and are building a championship future.

A Will To Win

Ryan Williams has been the most consistent wrestler under head coach Steve Martin since he took over the starting job midway through his freshman year. He's the go-to at 141 lbs and was an NCAA Qualifier in 2006, just missing his second trip a year ago as he dropped a decision to CAA Champion and NCAA All-American Charles Griffin.

He has a career .735 winning percentage with 97 wins through this point in his junior season. He is currently 9th all-time in wins and if he finishes his career with the same consistency, he has the potential to become the Monarchs all-time leader in wins, currently set at 135 by Jeff Rusak.

Hut-Hut...

The Monarchs mainstay at 133 lbs this year was sophomore Kyle Hutter from Illinois. He's bettered his rookie season record of 31-17 by going 32-12 in his new weight class in 07-08. He's been ranked for most of the second half of the season after pinning the 15th ranked wrestler in the nation, David Marble (Bucknell) and beating NCAA Qualifiers Eric Albright (UVa) and Dan Mitcheff (Kent State).

First Year Bookends

The Monarchs have been using youth to win for several years and 2007-08 is no exception. True freshman Andy Totusek and redshirt freshman James Nicholson have been full-time starters for much of the season.

Totusek was wrestling unattached until halfway through the season, when the coaches decided to pull him out of his redshirt. The true freshman responded with his first tournament win, going 2-0 at the Virginia Intercollegiates. He went 26-15 this year capped off by a 3rd place effort at the CAA's, winning his True Second match to qualify for NCAA's.

At the other end of the scale, James Nicholson went 32-7 in his rookie season and was named the Most Outstanding Wrestler at the Virginia Intercollegiates. He's been named CAA Rookie of the Week four times and he recently became the highest ranked wrestler ever for head coach Steve Martin after winning the 125-pound weight at the CAA Tournament. He is ranked as high as 9th and no lower than 10th in the nation.

Hometown Brown

Redshirt sophomore Chris Brown, from nearby Chesapeake, Virginia, has continued to impress as a second-year wrestler. He is 31-9 with nine major decisions and two pins. Brown already has 71 wins in his short career and has slid up to the 165-lb weight class this season. He's maintained his success through this year much like he did a year ago, when he was named CAA Rookie of the Week three times. Brown leads the team in dual wins with 17 on the season and was 6-1 in CAA Duals this season.

By Weight Class:

125

RS freshmen James Nicholson is ranked higher than any other Monarch not named Christian Staylor under head coach Steve Martin. He's currently ranked as high as 10th in the nation with a 32-7 career record to this point. He is ranked first in the CAA and has upset Hofstra's Dave Tomasette thrice already. This will be his first attempt at the podium in his career.

133:

Kyle Hutter, after bumping up a weight class this season has inserted himself into the national rankings, as high as 14th by AWN, with wins over #13 Dan Mitcheff (Kent State), #15 Eric Albright (Virginia) and #15 David Marble (Bucknell). He's one of just three Monarchs currently ranked by all four national polls. With his second place effort at the CAA's, he will be headed to Nationals for the first time in his career

141:

Ryan Williams has been the most dependable starter in the lineup since taking over the job at 141 as a freshman. He was an NCAA Qualifier in 2006 and has been ranked in the Top 20 this season. He's notched his third straight 29-plus win season and has a career high 38 wins already this season. Williams earned his first conference title last week and will be headed to Nationals for the second time in his career.

165

Chris Brown, the team leader in wins and major decisions in 2006, slid up a weight class in 2007-08 and has not missed a beat. He has been nationally ranked by all four national polls and has already tallied 74 wins in his young career. He's got 30-plus wins for the second straight season. The sophomore is set to make a run at his first NCAA Tournament.

184:

Jesse Strawn continues to match his success from a year ago with 29 wins headed into this weekend. He had 11 pins as a true freshman and is tied for the team lead with six this season. Strawn's 29 wins is one better than what he had a year ago as a freshman and he will be looking to improve on his third place effort at the CAA Tournament a year ago. He just missed an opportunity at nationals last year and will try to take advantage of his second place finish at the conference tournament this year in his first trip to the NCAA's.

HWT:

True freshman Andy Totusek took over the starting job at heavyweight halfway through the season. Toto was 132-31 in high school and has won 26 bouts so far in his collegiate career including three pins and one major decision. The newcomer made a dominant run in the wrestlebacks at the CAA Tournament to finish 3rd place overall. He would win his True Second match against #1 seed Harry Zander (George Mason) to earn his first trip to the national tournament.

The win helped ODU separate from the Spartans, who had cut the lead down to two, 9-7, at the halfway point. Kaylen Baxter (149) sealed the victory for Old Dominion with an 8-5 win over Eddie Skowneski.

Roy Dragon III earned his first collegiate title as he won the heavyweight division at the Missouri Open. Five more Monarchs were in the championship bout, including the second appearance of the season in the title bout for Ryan Williams and Kaylen Baxter. Four of the five title bouts were lost to nationally ranked opponents including a slim two-point loss for James Nicholson to the No. 11 ranked 125 in the nation. Nine of the ten probable starters for ODU placed in the Missouri Open.

Kaylen Baxter (149) took home the championship in his weight class with a 4-0 effort. followed by Ryan Williams (141) and Roy Dragon III (Hwt.) taking runner-up honors. Eight nationally ranked programs were represented at the Michigan State Open Tournament, giving the Monarchs much needed experience against toptier competition early in the season. Jesse Strawn notched two major decisions at the event and was just one point shy of a third as he went 4-1 en route to a 3rd place finish.
