LADY MONARCH MOMENTS:

- Old Dominion won its sixth straight with a 69-49 win over the George Mason Patriots on Thursday night at the Patriot Center.
- With Thursday's loss, the Patriots remain winless against the Lady Monarchs. Old Dominion won its 40th consecutive game against George Mason making them one of five CAA teams still looking for a victory over the Lady Monarchs.
- The Patriots were held to 29.6 from the field, the second lowest field goal percentage by an ODU opponent in 2006-07. Additionally, it was the lowest field goal percentage by a CAA opponent this year.
- Old Dominion held a 38-17 half-time lead, the third time this season the Lady Monarchs held an opponent to under 20 points at a half. Old Dominion was just three points shy of scoring the most points in a first half.
- Junior Tay Ransburg captured her first double-double as a Lady Monarch in last Sunday's Hofstra win as she was one of six players to reach double digits against the Pride. Ransburg netted 13 points and hauled in a game-high 12 rebounds. In her previous outing against Georgia State, Ransburg only collected two points, but grabbed nine rebounds.
- Old Dominion won the battle of the boards against Hofstra, 40-36, after being outrebounded in the first half, 23-15.
- The Lady Monarchs shot a season-best 52.9 percent (27-of-51) from the field against the Pride, the second time this season Old Dominion has shot over .500 from the floor.

ABOUT OLD DOMINION:

Old Dominion women's basketball team cruised to its sixth straight win with a 69-49 victory over the George Mason Patriots on Thursday night at the Patriot Center as the Lady Monarchs extended its win streak over the Patriots to 40 consecutive contests. It was the third time this season the Lady Monarchs have held an opponent to under 20 points at the half as they led 38-17 at the intermission. Old Dominion was just three points shy of scoring their most points in a first half. Junior guard T.J. Jordan scored 17 of her game-high 19 points in the opening-half connecting on five three-pointers. Junior Tay Ransburg also hauled in six of her game-high eight boards in the opening stanza. Jordan was one of three Lady Monarchs reaching double figures. Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) poured in 14, with 10 of those points coming in the second half. Ransburg netted 10 and was just two boards shy of her second straight double-double. Also narrowly missing a double-double was Green who scored nine points and grabbed seven rebounds. The Patriots were held to 29.6 from the field, the second lowest field goal percentage by an ODU opponent in 2006-07. The game also marked the fourth time the Lady Monarchs held an opponent to under 50 points in a game this season. Jordan leads the way for the Lady Monarchs with 15.3 points per game, ranking sixth in the league in scoring and 15th in field goal percentage. She is third in the country in three-point field goals made hitting an average of 3.3 per contest. Green leads ODU in the rebounding department at 6.1 boards per game.

ABOUT DREXEL:

The Drexel Dragons have dropped five straight and enter Sunday's contest with a 5-12 overall and still looking for conference win number one with an 0-6 CAA mark. The Dragons' last win came at American on December 30th win a 61-58 victory. Drexel is led by freshman forward Gabriela Marginean and junior guard Narissa Suber at 13.9 points per game. Suber is second behind Lady Monarch T.J. Jordan in three-point field goals made a game, sinking 2.82 trey a game. Margienan and senior guard Kira Karlstrom lead the Dragons in rebounds averaging 6.6 boards per game.

SERIES WITH DREXEL:

Old Dominion holds a 10-1 record against Drexel as these two teams became annual rivals when the Dragons enter the CAA conference for the 2001-02 season. The Dragons' lone victory came up the Daskalakis Center in the 2005 regular season finale with Drexel holding on to a 71-68 victory. However, in the rematch, Old Dominion edged out Drexel, 64-63, in the CAA Tournament semifinals enroute to the Lady Monarchs' 14th straight CAA title. The Lady Monarchs won the last meeting on the Dragons' homecourt, 63-53.

LAST TIME VS. GEORGE MASON:

The Old Dominion women's basketball team won their third game of their current six-game win streak as they defeated Drexel, 70-45, on January 7th at the Ted Constant Convocation Center in their CAA home opener. Old Dominion led much of the way. After a back and forth battle in the opening minutes, junior Tay Ransburg collected the first of her nine points on a bucket which would give the Lady Monarchs the lead for good. Her jumper put the Lady Monarchs ahead, 5-4, with 17:23 on the clock. Leading by only two, 11-9, Lady Monarch leading scorer T.J. Jordan sunk one of her trademark three-pointers to spark a 10-0 run. With six minutes remaining in the half, Old Dominion had established a 12 point lead, 21-9. Drexel managed to cut their deficit to five thanks to consecutive three pointers by Narissa Suber. Her second three gave Old Dominion only a 24-19 edge with 4:03 to go. Old Dominion held tough during the final minutes of the first half, outscoring Drexel 8-3 during those final four minutes to re-establish a double figure lead and enter the lockerroom up 33-22. The Dragons held the Lady Monarchs without a bucket during the opening three minutes of the second half and pulled to within five once again. Nicole McCombs, who only played four minutes of the first half for Drexel due to foul trouble, started off the second rattling off six straight points. She went 4-of-4 from the free throw line and added in a jumper to close the gap to 33-28. However, that would be the closest the Dragons would get the rest of the afternoon. Ahead by nine, 44-35, with 12:03 left in the game, the Lady Monarchs used another 10-0 run to go ahead by double digits for good. The run saw senior Tish Lyons go a perfect 4-of-4 from the line and sophomore Jen Nuzzo come off the bench to sink a three. By the end of the Drexel scoring drought, Old Dominion had a 19-point 54-35 lead that they would continue to expand by as much as 25. The foul plagued second half saw the Lady Monarchs go to the line 13 times, making 11 shots. They shot 84.6 for the half from the charity stripe and a season-high 76.0 percent for the game. Jordan once again led the Lady Monarchs in scoring pouring in a game-high 18 points which included a perfect 5-of-5 effort from the line and three made shots from downtown. Drexel had two in double figures with Gabriela Marginean and Narissa Suber each contributing 10 points each. Old Dominion held a slight edge on the boards, 36-34.

AT THE DAC:

Old Dominion head coach Wendy Larry captured her 500th victory this season, however it was career win number 400 that took place at the Daskalakis Center back on February 24, 2002 with a 90-57 win over the Dragons.

ON THE GLASS:

Although junior Tay Ransburg was held to only two points, both from the line, she hauled in a nine boards as Old Dominion outrebounded Georgia State, 47-31, last Thursday. She followed that performance with her first double-double as a Lady Monarch netting 13 points and grabbing a season-high 12 rebounds. She helped Old Dominion win the battle of the boards against the Pride, 40-36, after the Lady Monarchs were outrebounded in the first half, 23-15.

HOT HANDS:

Old Dominion shot a season-high 52.9 percent (27-of-51) against Hofstra last Sunday, only the second time the Lady Monarchs have shot over 50 percent from the field this season.

LOOKING AT THE BENCH:

Since beginning CAA action on January 4th, the Lady Monarch bench as been producing twice the amount as the opponent bench. Through five conference games, ODU's bench has collected 127 points as compared to their opponent's 49. Against Georgia State, ODU outscored the Lady Panther bench, 32-6, and outscored Hofstra's bench 24-4.

FROM THE LINE:

Old Dominion, who has struggled from the line this season, had its best game from the free throw line this season in the CAA home opener against Drexel. The Lady Monarchs got to the line 25 times, making 19 shots against the Dragons. They shot 84.6 in the second half, hitting 11-of-13 from the charity stripe and a season-high 76.0 percent for the game. Three Lady Monarchs went perfect at the line, including junior T.J. Jordan who went a perfect 5-of-5. It was the fifth time this season she sunk all her attempts from the charity stripe. Old Dominion also had a hot hand at the free throw line in the second half of last Sunday's contest against Hofstra. In that half, the Lady Monarchs shot 91.7 percent hitting 11-of-12 from the stripe.

FORCING TURNOVERS:

Old Dominion is working on cutting down on its turnovers, but against Drexel in the CAA home opener, the Lady Monarchs forced the turnovers. The Dragons committed 30 miscues leading to 26 Lady Monarch points. The 30 turnovers are the most committed by a Lady Monarch opponent this season. ODU followed as the Lady Monarchs managed to collect 31 points off of 25 Georgia State miscues the following game.

STARTING FIVE:

With the Lady Monarch roster as deep as it is in recent memory, its hard to pick just which Lady Monarch will get the starting nod. Through sixteen games, nine different starting combos have been used with Sherida Triggs being the only Lady Monarch to have started every single game. The line-up of Triggs, Tay Ransburg, Shahida Williams, T.J. Jordan, and Jazzmin Walters have started the last seven games going 6-1 with wins over Rutgers, VCU, Drexel, Georgia State, Hofstra, and George Mason.

HOME SWEET HOME:

Since the doors opened at the Ted Constant Convocation Center in 2002, the Lady Monarchs have enjoyed a 59-12 record.

RANK 'EM UP:

Old Dominion got its first win in seven attempts over a team either ranked for receiving votes in the AP or USA Today Poll with a 72-55 win over Rutgers and followed with a 74-59 victory over CAA rival Hofstra. Tennessee marked the third ranked team, and second in the Top Five, the Lady Monarchs faced this season. The Lady Monarchs have already faced Kentucky, falling to a #21 (AP)/24 (ESPN/USA Today) Wildcat squad 55-69 in their home opener back on November 18th, fell 40-89 to #5 Duke on their home court on November 30th, and was defeated by #5 Tennessee 59-75, although the game was tied with just 1:31 left in the first half. Virginia, Penn State, and Middle Tennessee along CAA rivals Hofstra and

Delaware have also been seen in the "receiving votes" categories in both polls. Old Dominion fell 72-92 at Virginia in the season opener, lost at Penn State, 77-80, despite overcoming a 20-point second half deficit, and was edged out 71-86 by Middle Tennessee. Still up for the Lady Monarchs on the poll front is Delaware, who comes to the Constant Center on February 11th.

HALFTIME HIGHS & LOWS:

Old Dominion held a 34-16 first half advantage against Georgia State marking the lowest scoring output by a Lady Monarch opponent this season. The 18-point ODU halftime lead also tied the Lady Monarchs largest halftime lead this year. Old Dominion also held an 18-point, 35-17 advantage over Chicago State in head coach Wendy Larry's 500th career victory over Chicago State back on December 9th. Additionally, the Lady Panthers tied its season low for scoring in a half with its 16 points.

HEAR ME ROAR:

Senior Tish Lyons started the year's first eight games, but for the last seven games has come off the bench. As a starter she only averaged 7.3 points and 2.8 rebounds a game but from coming off the bench beginning with the contest at Middle Tennessee State, Lyons averaged 10.1 points and 3.0 rebounds per game. Against Rutgers and in the CAA opener at Virginia Commonwealth, she poured in a season-high 14 points and also dished out a career-high six assists against the Rams.

T.J. FOR THREE....:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan tied her career mark as she took seven three-points in the first meeting against Virginia Commonwealth enroute to a season-high 25 points. Six of her treys came in the first half. She also achieved the same number at Delaware (2/11/05) and at George Mason (2/10/06). It was against the Fightin' Blue Hens she collected her career-high - 28 points.

THE MOST WE'VE SCORED:

The 81 points collected by the Lady Monarchs in its CAA opening win at Virginia Commonwealth was the largest scoring output since their 94-73 victory over Hofstra in the semifinals of the CAA Tournament at the Patriot Center in Fairfax, Va. on March 9, 2006.

THE 500 CLUB:

With the 77-38 win over Chicago State on December 9th, Old Dominion head coach Wendy Larry became the 30th all-time Division I coach and 23rd active Division I coach to reach the 500-victory milestone. In 23 years as a head coach, she has compiled a 505-189 mark. Now in her 20th season at the helm of the Old Dominion program, Larry holds a 456-158 mark at her alma mater. Coach Larry just recently captured her 450th victory as the head coach at her alma mater with a 57-46 win over Delaware State on November 25.

D-D-D-DEFENSE:

In their 57-46 win over Delaware State, the Lady Monarchs held the Hornets to 29.0 percent (18-of-62) from the floor, the lowest percentage by an ODU opponent this season.

THE DUNKS:

Tennessee's Candace Parker didn't dunk against the Lady Monarchs in their meeting, but ODU's homecourt will always be a special place for Parker. The Lady Vols played its first and second round games of the NCAA Tournament at the Ted Constant Convocation Center in 2006 enroute to the Elite Eight. It was during their first round game vs. Army that Parker collected her first dunk (and would dunk again). It was the first dunk in a women's game during NCAA Tournament action and the first time a woman dunked twice in a game.

ENDING AND BEGINNING WITH RUTGERS:

Last season, guard Jen Nuzzo's season ended right before ODU's match-up at Rutgers with a stress fracture in her leg. This season, Nuzzo had a coming out party of sorts against the Scarlet Knights. Nuzzo served as a spark plug off the bench as the Lady Monarchs were down by 12 points in the first half. She ended the game with five points, two assists, three rebounds, and a steal in 16 minutes of action in what has been perhaps her best effort to date.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE:

Redshirt sophomore Tiffany Green became the first Lady Monarch to perform a double-double this season with a 17-point, 12-rebound effort against Chicago State on Dec. 9th. She followed with her second double-double in the following game with 11 points and 10 rebounds on Dec. 17 at Charlotte.

KEEPING THE BALL:

Old Dominion's 32 turnovers at Charlotte and 29 turnovers at Middle Tennessee certainly aren't numbers it would like to see on the stat sheet again this season. The good news is those were not school records. The most turnovers in a game in Lady Monarch history was 37. That happen twice - against Kansas on January 20, 1978 and against Tennessee on January 13, 1994.

STREAKING:

The Charlotte 49ers won their 15th straight home contests dating back to last season with its 68-64 win over Old Dominion on December 17th. The streak began right after Old Dominion beat the 49ers 79-69 back on December 18th, 2005. The Lady Monarchs certainly know about streaks. Old Dominion held a 115 game CAA win streak from 1992 to 2001 and currently have a 44 game CAA Tournament win streak with 15 straight CAA titles. Additionally, Old Dominion had a 64 home game win streak at the old ODU Fieldhouse from 1976 to 1981. Also the Lady Monarchs had a 122 game CAA home win streak from 1992 until 2005.

BOARDING:

The Lady Monarchs have collected a season-high 27 board rebounding margin. Old Dominion collected 56 rebounds against both Charlotte and Chicago State while holding both teams to just 29 boards.

WELCOME BACK:

Earlier this season, Old Dominion welcomed back former Lady Monarch Angela Jackson, the head coach of the Chicago State Cougars. Jackson was a member of the Lady Monarchs in 1989 and 1990, helping the Old Dominion women's basketball team to two second round appearances in the NCAA. As a senior in 1990, she was named First Team All-Sun Belt averaging a team second best 16.6 points per

game. Additionally in 1990, Jackson led the Lady Monarchs with 4.1 assists per game (126 total) and is tied with Sharese Grant on the senior all-time assist leaders list. As a junior, she poured in 513 points to rank sixth on the junior all-time scoring leaders list.

FORMER LADY MONARCHS IN THE COACHING RANKS:

Former Lady Monarchs Wendy Larry ('77) Angela Jackson ('90) aren't the only Lady Monarch to have gone from player to coach. Chris Critelli ('80) - head coach Brock University in Canada, Maura McHugh ('75) - head coach Stony Brook, Anne Donovan ('83) - head coach WNBA's Seattle Storm & US Senior National Team, Rhonda Rompolo ('81) - head coach Southern Methodist, Kim McQuarter ('88) - head coach Malcolm X Junior College, Regina Miller ('84) - head coach UNLV, Inge Nissen ('80) - Co-Head Coach Florida International, Cindy Russo ('75) - Co-Head Coach Florida International, Aubrey Eblin ('99) - assistant coach University of San Diego.

WELCOME BACK MARIANNE:

Another familiar face returned to Norfolk when Rutgers visited. Scarlet Knight assistant coach Marianne Stanley was at the helm of the Lady Monarch program from 1977-1987 leading Old Dominion to three national titles (1979 - AIAW, 1980 - AIAW, 1985 - NCAA) and coaching legends Nancy Lieberman, Inge Nissen, Anne Donovan, and Tracy Claxton. Coming to ODU in 1977, Stanley became one of the youngest Division I head coach in the country at the age of 23. By the time she left, she built the Lady Monarchs into one of the nation's premiere programs posting a 269-59 (.820) record.

HOW LOW CAN YOU GO?:

The 38 points scored by Chicago State were the fewest points collected by an ODU opponent since the Lady Monarchs' 85-33 win over William & Mary on February 26, 2006.

JUST LIKE MIKE:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan has led the team in scoring in all but five games this season - at #5 Duke, at Middle Tennessee, vs. #5 Tennessee, vs. Rutgers, vs. Georgia State. At Charlotte, Jordan collected her first career double-double with 16-points and a career-high 10 rebounds. Additionally she set a new career mark with 22 field goals attempted.

NOT SEEN VERY OFTEN:

In a rare occurrence, the opposition outrebounded Old Dominion in a victory. The East Carolina Pirates held a 45-33 advantage on the boards, which included holding the Lady Monarchs to just seven offensive rebounds. The Lady Monarchs were outrebounded in only nine of its 31 games last year and none by double digits. Five of the nine times Old

Dominion was outrebounded resulted in a loss for the Lady Monarchs. In six of those nine occasions, the opponent outboarded Old Dominion by four rebounds or less. Florida International and James Madison, in the first meeting of the year, both held an eight board advantage over Old Dominion, the most of the season.

LESSON LEARNED - ON TO THE FUTURE:

Old Dominion has already put it 40-89 loss to #5 Duke behind them. The Lady Monarchs' 11 first half points tied the school record for fewest points scored in a half with the original record set back in December of 1972 with 11 second half points in a 23-12 victory over James Madison. The Lady Monarchs scored only 12 points in the first half of that game. Additionally, Old Dominion shot a low of 25.0 percent (13-of-52) from the floor, its lowest since shooting 26.0 percent (17-of-65) against Virginia in 1975. Old Dominion didn't repeat its poor performance when it came out in its next game against Penn State and shot 46.9 percent (30-of-64) against the Lady Lions.

KEEP SHOOTING PARTNER:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan came off the bench in the 72-92 season opening loss at Virginia to net a team-high 21 points. Shooting 6-of-19 from the field, including 6-of-17 from three-point range, the third year Lady Monarch set new career-highs in field goals and three-pointers attempted. Against Penn State, the third year Lady Monarch reset her field goal attempt high by launching 20 shots from the floor and finishing with a season-high 24 points, her second 20+ point effort of the season. Jordan set a new season mark hitting eight field goals against Chicago State, just one shy of her career high. Against Charlotte, Jordan reset her field goal attempts mark for the third time this season taking 22 shots. The Lady Monarchs' three-point specialist, she holds the single season three-point attempt mark (2005-06 - 248).

SO WE MEET FOR THE FIRST TIME:

When you look at the Old Dominion Lady Monarch schedule, you can always count on familiar teams such as Tennessee, Rutgers, and Penn State along with various other teams they play on again and off again. Three teams grace this years schedule who the Lady Monarchs have never met. First up is Delaware State, who the Lady Monarchs handed a 57-46 loss at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. ODU also had a 77-38 win over Chicago State in its first meeting with the Cougars. Old Dominion also took on Middle Tennessee for the first time in school history, falling 71-86 to the Blue Raiders in Murfreesboro.

0-2...SO WHAT?:

The Lady Monarchs may have started the 2006-07 season 0-2, but that's no reason to

think the sky is falling. Last season, Old Dominion opened the season 0-2 and finished the year with a 22-9 overall mark and their 15th straight CAA title. The 2003-04 Lady Monarchs opened 0-2 and picked up ranked wins over #7 Penn State and #12/13 North Carolina. They finished 25-7 along with the CAA title. The 2002-03 Lady Monarchs opened 0-3 but managed a 20 win season going 21-9 with a CAA title. The 2000-01 season saw Old Dominion go 0-2 and also finished with a 21-9 mark and a CAA title. The 1992-93 women's team started the year off 0-4, but ended the year 22-8 overall, with yes...another CAA title and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

OPEN THE DOOR:

The Lady Monarch women's basketball team helped the Virginia Cavaliers open their new building - The John Paul Jones Arena - in ODU's first regular season contest on Saturday, November 12th. It was Virginia back on November 22nd, 2002 that helped Old Dominion open the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

BREAKING DOWN THE OPENERS:

The Lady Monarchs are 25-13 in season openers, suffering a 72-92 set back in this year's opener at Virginia. Of the previous 38 season openers, Old Dominion has opened the season three times with Virginia with a win in 1977, a loss in 2002 with the opening of ODU's Ted Constant Convocation Center, and a loss in 2006 at the opening of UVA's John Paul Jones Arena. In home openers, the Lady Monarchs are 27-11 including a 2-3 mark at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. Old Dominion fell to #21/24 Kentucky in its 2006-07 home debut, 55-69.

STREET & SMITH:

Street and Smith Magazine has listed the Old Dominion women's basketball team at No. 18 in its in their annual College Basketball Yearbook which went on sale on Oct. 1. Included on this year's schedule are five teams also appearing in Street and Smith's list including No. 5 Tennessee, No. 7 Duke, No. 14 Rutgers, No. 15 Kentucky and No. 20 Virginia.

BACK TO THE POLLS:

The Lady Monarchs received votes in both the Preseason Associated Press and WBCA/USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll. The Lady Monarchs have received votes over the last few seasons and are looking to return to the Top 25 in both polls. Old Dominion's last Top 25 ranking in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll was November 18th, 2003. Old Dominion's last appearance in the Associated Press Top 25 was the final poll of the 2002 season as the Lady Monarchs danced their way to the "Elite Eight".

CAA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

T.J. Jordan:

01/08/07: Jordan averaged 21.5 points per game last week as she led the Lady Monarchs to their first two conference victories of the season. The third year Lady Monarch poured in a season-high 25 points against Virginia Commonwealth in ODU's CAA opener last Thursday. It was the fourth time this season she has scored 20 or more points in a game. She also shot a blistering 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from the floor, including a career-tying seven three-pointers. She was just two treys shy of tying the school record. Jordan followed with a game-high 18 points in the win over Drexel last Sunday in ODU's first home CAA win of the 2006-07 season. Against the Dragons she shot a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line, the fifth time Jordan has gone perfect from the charity stripe.

WHAT THE LADY MONARCHS WELCOME BACK:

The Old Dominion women's basketball team welcomes back four starters and nine letter-winners from last year's team that went 22-9 overall and captured its 15th consecutive Colonial Athletic Association title. Seventy two percent of the offense returns including four of the five leading scorers and three of the four leading rebounders from a season ago. This year's group of seniors - Tish Lyons, Sherida Triggs, Shantel Wilson - enter the 2006-07 season having collected three CAA titles, three NCAA appearances, a 69-25 overall record and 49-5 mark in CAA match-ups. Triggs joins junior guard T.J. Jordan on the Preseason Second Team All-CAA list. Triggs led the CAA in field goal percentage, was second on the ODU squad in scoring, and led the Lady Monarch rebounding corps. Jordan led the team in scoring and reset the single season three-point attempt record.

UP NEXT:

The Lady Monarchs return home next week for two home games. Old Dominion closes out the season series with Virginia Commonwealth on Thursday, January 25th and then meets up with William & Mary in their first of two contests on Sunday, January 28th.

COLONIAL DOMINANCE: Old Dominion has captured 15-straight Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles since joining the league from the Sun Belt Conference during the 1991-92 season. The Lady Monarchs are in the NCAA record books for capturing the most consecutive conference championships. In league play, Old Dominion holds a 276-15 overall record, which includes eight seasons of undefeated play. The Lady Monarchs hold a 146-2 record at home and a 130-13 road record. Only two CAA losses have occurred on Old Dominion's homecourt. The first was back at the ODU Fieldhouse, the former Lady Monarch homecourt from 1969-2002, against Richmond, now of the Atlantic-10, with a 70-74 defeat on February 19, 1992 and the second versus Delaware with a 70-73 setback on January 9, 2005. Five schools in the league have yet to beat the Lady Monarchs - Georgia State (3-0), George Mason (40-0), Northeastern (2-0), UNC-Wilmington (33-0), and Towson (9-0).

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team opened the 2006-07 season with a 92-72 loss at in-state rival Virginia on Sunday afternoon at the brand new John Paul Jones Arena.

The game marked the opening of the Cavaliers brand new facility. Virginia had helped open ODU's new home, the Ted Constant Convocation Center, back when the door opened in 2002.

The loss dropped Old Dominion to 0-1 in their first showing of the regular season. Virginia improved to 2-0.

Virginia jumped out to a 14-point lead, 24-10. The Cavaliers built its lead to 21 points, 36-15 with 6:38 to go in the half, and entered the locker room with a 14-point edge, 44-30, paced by senior Siedah Williams' 15 points.

In the second half, Virginia maintained its double-digit lead, going ahead by as many as 21 points.

Junior guard T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) led the Lady Monarch squad with 21 points, all coming from three-point range. The third-year Lady Monarch shot 6-of-19 from the field, including 6-of-17 from three-point range setting new career-highs in field goals and three-pointers attempted.

Senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) sat out most of the first half in foul trouble and scored all 15 of her points in the second half.

Redshirt sophomore Tiffany Green (Chesapeake, Va.) collected a game-high 10 boards as Virginia only held a slight one rebound margin over Old Dominion, 43-42.

Sophomore Lynda Littles led Virginia with a career-high 23 points and 12 rebounds for her second double-double of the season and seventh of her career. She went 13-of-14 from the line. Williams followed with 21 points. Junior Denesha Kenton came off the bench for a career-high 13 points, while freshman Monica Wright rounded out the double-figure scoring with 11 points. The frosh also added six boards, four assists, and three steals in her second start.

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team fell to 0-2 on the season falling, 55-69, to No. 21 (AP)24 (ESPNU/USA Today) Kentucky on Homecoming at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The Wildcats improved to 2-1 on the season and picked up their first victory in Norfolk in five trips to Hampton Roads.

In the first half, neither team enjoyed more than a five-point lead. Old Dominion led for much of the first half holding on to a 15-12 edge with 8:19 left in the half. From there Kentucky took a 7-0 run to take over a lead they would never relinquish. Old Dominion did manage to tie the game up late in the half. A T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) lay-up with 1:36 remaining tied the game at 23-23 and the Lady Monarchs ended the half down only 27-23.

Kentucky had a hot hand in the second half. After the Lady Monarch defense held the Wildcats to just 27.3 percent shooting in half number one, Kentucky ignited for 15-of-23 to hit 65.2 percent from the floor in the second half.

Old Dominion cut the Kentucky edge down to one twice in the opening minutes of the second half, but the Wildcats bumped up their margin to eight, 27-39, with 13:16 remaining. The Lady Monarchs only managed to nudge the Wildcats lead down to five. On the next two plays, a Jordan free-throw and a Sherida Triggs lay-up, Old Dominion got as close to the Kentucky lead, 47-42, as it would get the rest of the game.

Guards Carly Ormerod and Samantha Mahoney helped Kentucky take a 6-0 run to give the Wildcats a double digit lead it would hold on for almost the rest of the game. Senior forward Jennifer Humphrey hit two free throws giving the Wildcats its largest lead of the game, a 16-point 45-49 advantage.

Jordan was the team's leading scorer for the second straight game and the lone Lady Monarch in double figures. Jordan netted 11 with six points coming from the line. Sophomore Jazzmin Walters (Norfolk, Va.) added in nine.

Kentucky's Jenny Pfeiffer came off the Wildcat bench to lead all scorers with 22 points. Two other Wildcats joined Pfeiffer with double digit scoring. Ormerod added in 18 points, while Mahoney poured in 12.

Old Dominion won the battle of the boards by one, 42-41. Junior Megan Pym (Newfield, N.Y.) hauled in seven rebounds in just six minutes, but missed the rest of the game will an injury.

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball team got its first win of the 2006-07 season by handing former CAA rival East Carolina a 77-66 loss at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The win snapped a two-game losing streak for the Lady Monarchs as they head into Saturday's game with Delaware State sporting a 1-2 record. East Carolina, in their first appearance against Old Dominion since switching from the CAA to Conference USA, fell to 1-3 overall.

Junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) led the team in scoring for the third straight game with 16 points, connecting on 4-of-7 from the field, 3-of-6 from three-point range, and a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line. Junior Tay Ransburg (Kansas City, Mo.) netted 14, while senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) added 11 with 10 of those points coming in the first half.

East Carolina also saw three in double figures with Cherie Mills leading the way with 17 points. Jasmine Young collected 16 points, while LaCoya Terry dropped in 13.

In a rare occurrence, the opposition outrebounded Old Dominion. The Pirates held a 45-33 advantage on the boards, which included holding the Lady Monarchs to just seven offensive rebounds. Ransburg led the squad on the glass with six rebounds. East Carolina saw Mills and Jessica Slack record nine.

Old Dominion had a 39-27 lead at the half and led by as many as 18 in the opening stanza. Sophomore Jen Nuzzo (Newport News, Va.) came off the bench to hit one of her two treys of the evening to give the Lady Monarchs a 12-9 edge and the lead for good at the 14:31 mark.

The Lady Monarchs managed to hold off a second half comeback by the Pirates. With Old Dominion leading 46-33 and enjoying a 13-point edge, East Carolina used a 12-2 run to pull within three with 9:56 left in the game. Ahead 48-45, Old Dominion turned the table and took a run of its own. Outsourcing the Pirates 13-2 sparked by nine straight points by Jordan, the Lady Monarchs pushed their lead to 14, 61-47, with 5:50 left. During the run, Jordan hit two three's and was fouled on an attempt where she went to the line to hit all three free throw attempts. Additionally, senior Shantel Wilson (Washington, D.C.) went perfect from the line as well.

The Pirates did not go away and still had another run left in them. Ransburg helped the Lady Monarchs to their largest lead of the half on a jumper to give ODU a 15-point advantage, 68-53, with just 2:43 remaining in the game. Over the next minute and a half, East Carolina outsourced Old Dominion 10-2, making it a seven-point ball game. The Pirates would only score three more points in the game and would foul the Lady Monarchs to close out the game. While Mills only connected on one of a three-shot award from the line and Slack put in a lay-up, the Lady Monarchs went 7-of-10 from the stripe to hold on to the win.

NORFOLK, Va. -- Old Dominion head women's basketball coach Wendy Larry earned her 450th win as head coach of the Lady Monarch program and moved to within one game of collecting her 500th career win as Old Dominion defeated Delaware State, 57-46, Saturday afternoon at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The win, ODU's second straight, improved the Lady Monarchs to 2-2 overall, while the Hornets fell to 1-2. The game marked the first ever meeting between the two schools.

Junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) and senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) led Old Dominion with 12 points each. Jordan has been ODU's leading scorer in all four contests thus far. Junior Tay Ransburg (Kansas City, Mo.) had all her nine points in the second half. Sophomore Tiffany Green (Chesapeake, Va.) also netted nine in the victory.

Old Dominion never trailed in the contest. Back-to-back three pointers by Jordan gave the Lady Monarchs a 27-12 lead with 4:51 left in the first half. The 15-point edge would be Old Dominion's largest as the Hornets began to chip away at the lead late in the first half and continued to close the gap in the second.

Over the final 4:51 of the first half, Delaware State held Old Dominion without field goal, only allowing the Lady Monarchs to capture two more points coming from the line. The Hornets closed out the first half on a 10-2 run, only letting freshman Jessica Canady (Jamestown, Va.) hit two free throws during the span. Old Dominion held on to a 29-22 lead at the half.

Old Dominion came out of the locker room and after missing their first two shots at the rim, Triggs collected the rebound and was fouled. Her traditional three-point play pushed the Lady Monarchs lead to 10 with Old Dominion ahead 32-22. However a 10-point lead quickly became only a two-point lead three minutes later.

Delaware State proceeded to take a 9-1 run, which was helped by Old Dominion's performance from the line. During the Hornet run, the Lady Monarchs got to the free throw line four times, but only connected on one attempt. A Jordan three helped stop the drought and Delaware State would get no closer than trailing 36-33 with 15:09 remaining.

Ahead 39-35 with the clock reading 11:11, the Lady Monarchs held the Hornets scoreless over the next four and half minutes while rattling off eight unanswered points. Ransburg capped the ODU run with two of her nine second half points to return a double figure edge back to the Lady Monarchs. Old Dominion went ahead 47-35 at the 6:58 mark and kept a double digit advantage over Delaware State for almost the rest of the way.

Old Dominion shot 42.2 (19-of-45) from the floor, but only shot 45.7 percent from the free throw line (16-of-35). Triggs did manage to get perfect hitting all four free throw attempts. The Lady Monarchs held the Hornets to 29.0 percent (18-of-62) from the floor, the lowest percentage by an ODU opponent this season.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The Lady Monarchs rallied from a 20-point second half deficit and outscored the Lady Lions, 44-33, in the second half in its 77-50 loss to Penn State on Sunday afternoon at the Bryce Jordan Center.
Behind 55-35 a minute and a half into the second half, Old Dominion proceeded to take a 16-4 run to cut the Lady Lion lead to single digits. During the final stretch of the run, Old Dominion managed to score 10 unanswered points to trail just 59-51 with 12:30 remaining in the game.
Free throws by Amanda Brown and a jumper by Kamela Gissendanner helped Penn State bump their lead to 12, 63-51 at the 11:33 mark, but Old Dominion managed to take another run and cut into the Lady Lion lead. Old Dominion outscored Penn State, 7-2, over the course of the next two minutes. Junior Tay Ransburg (Kansas City, Mo.) converted the traditional three-point play to pull the Lady Monarchs to within three, 65-62, with 9:23 left.
The Lady Monarchs refused to go away and continued to chip away at the lead until junior Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) converted her jumper to tie the game at 68-68. After each team traded baskets on respective turns down the court, junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) drained one of her five three's to give Old Dominion its first lead since 13:41 mark of the first half. Jordan's trey gave the Lady Monarchs a 73-72 advantage with 5:02 remaining in the game.
The final 2:14 saw two ties, two lead changes, and ten free throws, with eight of them taken by Penn State going 6-of-8. A 77-76 Lady Monarch lead at the 1:13 mark would be Old Dominion's final of the night. Penn State closed out the game hitting free throws to regain the lead and win. Meanwhile, Jordan had two different looks at shots from beyond the arc to try and win the game for the Lady Monarchs. NORFOLK, Va. - Head coach Wendy Larry collected career win number 500 on Saturday night at the Ted Constant Convocation Center as the Old Dominion women's basketball team defeated Chicago State, 77-38.
The win, which snaps a two-game losing streak, improves Old Dominion to 3-4 overall. Chicago State, coached by former Lady Monarch Angela Jackson, falls to 3-6 overall.
With the win, Larry becomes the 30th all-time Division I coach and 23rd active Division I coach to reach the 500 victory milestone. In 23 years as a head coach, she has compiled a 500-186 mark. Now in her 20th season at the helm of the Old Dominion program, Larry holds a 451-155 mark at her alma mater.
Sophomore Tiffany Green became the first Lady Monarch this season to perform a double-double. Green netted 17 points, which included a 7-of-7 mark from the field. She also hauled in 12 rebounds.
Joining Green in double figures was junior T.J. Jordan with a game-high 21 points. For the second straight game and third time this season, Jordan had a 20+ point game.
Old Dominion collected a season-high 56 rebounds - 23 offensive, 33 defensive - as they out-rebounded the Cougars by 27.
The Lady Monarchs held a two point lead, 14-12, with 8:53 remaining in the first before exploding for a 21-5 run to close out the half. Junior Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) got the run started as Old Dominion scored 10 unanswered points to begin. Williams would also score at the 4:28 mark to give Old Dominion a double figure lead for good. The Lady Monarchs entered the half up, 35-17.
Old Dominion outscored Chicago State, 42-21, in the second half registering a game-high 41-point lead in the late in the game.
The 38 points scored by Chicago State were the fewest points collected by an ODU opponent since the Lady Monarchs' 85-33 win over William & Mary on February 26, 2006.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - Charlotte overcame a 16-point first half deficit and saw Old Dominion commit 32 turnovers as the Lady Monarchs led 68-64 to the 49ers at Halton Arena on Sunday afternoon. The win was Charlotte's 15th straight home victory that began after Old Dominion defeated them in December of 2005.
The Lady Monarchs fell to 3-5 overall, while the 49ers improve to 500 at 5-5.
Junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) and sophomore Tiffany Green (Chesapeake, Va.) both posted double-doubles in the loss. Jordan tallied a team-high 16 points and grabbed 10 boards. Green, in her second straight double figure scoring and rebounding performance, added 11 points and 10 rebounds. Junior Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) was the other Lady Monarch in double figures with 14.
Old Dominion held a 16-point edge, 30-14, with 4:47 remaining in the first half and entered the locker room with a 34-26 lead.
The second half saw the 49ers open on a 10-2 run and tie the game at 36-36 within the first three minutes of the second half. The lead quickly returned in favor of Old Dominion as the Lady Monarchs scored seven unanswered points. The Lady Monarch run started by two fast break lay-ups by sophomore Jazzmin Walters (Norfolk, Va.) gave ODU a 43-36 edge with 13:56 remaining in the game.
During the next four minutes, Charlotte would cut the Old Dominion to two, 46-44. After a 49ers miss, Old Dominion look to have regained momentum. The Lady Monarchs came down the court and had four opportunities for a bucket, but managed to retain possession after three of those misses. Jordan missed a three-point arc and grabbed her own rebound. Junior Megan Pym (Newfield, N.Y.) missed two jumpers, but was able to grab her missed shot back. Then Jordan missed on another three-point attempt. After Charlotte finally managed a defensive rebound, Traci Ray missed a three-pointer and Old Dominion capitalized as Jordan found senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) for a lay-up. Triggs' two points had Old Dominion up by four, 48-44, with 7:23 to go. However, momentum then swung the other way.
The 49ers' Ray didn't miss her next time down the court and a fast break by Danielle Burgin erased ODU's four-point lead and gave Charlotte its first lead since early part of the first half. On the following play, Triggs would go for a lay-up and hit two free throws, but the 50-49 lead would be the final Old Dominion would see.
Charlotte scored eight points in the span of a minute to take control of the game for good. Ray would hit two more three's during that span as the 49ers held on to a 57-50 lead with 4:46 remaining. Down the stretch, Charlotte went 2-of-4 from the field and 7-of-8 from the line.

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. — Middle Tennessee State used a late second half run to earn a 87-71 victory over the Lady Monarchs Tuesday night at the Murphy Center.

Old Dominion drops its second straight contest falling to 3-6 overall, while Middle Tennessee improves to 9-3 overall.

The Lady Monarchs were led by starting point guard Jazzmin Walters (Norfolk, Va.) with a career-high 13 points along with four steals and three assists. Both juniors Shahida Williams (Newark, N.J.) and T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) added in 12.

NORFOLK, Va. (AP) — Candace Parker had 32 points and 10 rebounds and No. 5 Tennessee overcame a stiff defensive test from longtime rival Old Dominion on Friday, beating the Lady Monarchs for the 11th consecutive time, 75-59.

Parker, who made history in Norfolk last season when she dunked twice in an NCAA tournament game against Army, entered the game with three dunks this season, but was booed by the crowd when she passed on a chance for another one late in the first half.

Tennessee (11-1) won its fourth in a row since a 13-point loss at second-ranked North Carolina on Dec. 3. It improved to 31-9 in its history against Old Dominion.

The Lady Monarchs (3-7) lost for the fifth time in six games. Coming off a 15-point loss at Middle Tennessee State, Old Dominion will host Rutgers next Saturday before moving into Colonial Athletic Association play seeking its 16th consecutive tie.

Sherida Triggs led the Lady Monarchs with 13 points, and T.J. Jordan had 11, all in the first half. Old Dominion forced 18 turnovers, but committed 24.

Tennessee led 38-33 at halftime and didn't move comfortably in front until Parker's three-point play and jumper sparked an 11-2 run to give the Lady Vols a 58-45 lead.

Parker was 12-for-18 from the field and 8-for-8 at the foul line.

The Lady Monarchs closed within 10 twice shortly thereafter, but Tennessee finally pulled away, using a significant height advantage and more depth to wear out ODU.

Shannon Bobbitt added 13 points and Alexis Hornbuckle 10 for Tennessee.

The game drew a crowd of 7,108, the third-largest for a women's game at the Constant Convocation Center. The largest - 7,758 - also came for Tennessee on Jan. 7, 2003, the year the arena opened.

Before the game, Tennessee coach Pat Summitt took part in a ceremony to present Old Dominion coach Wendy Larry with the game ball from her 500th career victory, which came Dec. 9 against Chicago State.

The Lady Vols scored the last five points of the first half to lead 38-33. The last two came on a steal and breakaway layup by Parker, who drew boos when she didn't dunk. The game was tied at 31-31 with 1:31 left in the first half.

NORFOLK, Va. — The Old Dominion women's basketball team returned to the win column on Saturday afternoon at the Ted Constant Convocation Center with a 72-55 victory over Rutgers, a team receiving votes in both national polls.

The win snaps a three-game ODU losing streak as the Lady Monarchs improve to 4-7. It was the first game in seven tries that that Old Dominion walked away the winner in teams either ranked or receiving votes in the Associated Press or ESPN/USA Today polls. The Scarlet Knights meanwhile fell to 500 at 5-5.

The visiting Scarlet Knights held a 12-point, 25-13, lead with 5:41 left in the first before the Lady Monarch came storming back. Senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) sparked a 16-2 run with the traditional three-point play to tie the game at 29-29 with 2:18 remaining in the half. Rutgers did manage to close out the half on a 6-0 run and entered the locker room ahead, 35-29.

Rutgers led by as many as eight in the second half, but after Brittany Ray hit a three to give the Scarlet Knights a 45-37 advantage with 16:52 left, Old Dominion took over the game. From that point, the Lady Monarchs would outscore the Scarlet Knights, 35-10.

Following Ray's three, Old Dominion went on a 17-2 run holding Rutgers without a field goal for over five minutes. Triggs, who went perfect from the line, returned the lead for good to Old Dominion hitting four consecutive free throws. Her final shot from the charity stripe gave Old Dominion a 48-47 lead at the 12:59 mark and from there the lead only grew for the Lady Monarchs.

After Triggs' points from the line, Old Dominion went ahead by seven, 54-47, before Rutgers' Kia Vaughan finally put an end to their scoring drought. The Scarlet Knights would only score six more points in the game over the final 9:50. Down the stretch Rutgers was held to only one field goal and shot just 4-of-10 from the free throw line.

Old Dominion shot 47.9 percent for the game including a blistering 52.2 percent in the second half. Rutgers was held to 22.2 percent shooting from floor in half number two after hitting 48.1 percent in the first half.

The Lady Monarchs also had a hot hand from the free throw line. After shooting just 33.3 percent (2-of-6) from the charity stripe in the first half, Old Dominion connected on 78.3 percent (18-of-23) from the line in the second. Triggs hit 6-of-6, while sophomore Jazzmin Walters (Norfolk, Va.) went 4-of-4.

Overall four Lady Monarchs registered double figures. Senior Tish Lyons (Newport News, Va.) came off the bench to tie Triggs with a team-high 14. Junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) and sophomore Tiffany Green (Chesapeake, Va.) each scored 10.
