WELCOME TO THE TOP 25:

When the ODU Football Monarchs take the field on Saturday at Villanova, it will be as a nationally-ranked team in both The Sports Network/Fathead.com and FCS Coaches Polls for the second consecutive week.

In another first for the ODU Football program, the Monarchs were ranked in the Top 25 for the first time in school history coming in at No. 21 two weeks ago in The Sports Network/Fathead.com FCS Top-25 College Football Poll. The Monarchs, made the jump after defeating then-#20 Massachusetts and rose to No. 18 following its 31-23 victory over Rhode Island on week six. Following the Monarchs victory over the Rams, ODU made its FCS Coaches Poll debut this week coming in at No. 22.

Following week seven's loss to Towson, the Monarchs dropped three spots in the TSN Poll to No. 21, while remaining at No. 22 in the Coaches Poll.

NINE TEAMS RANKED IN THE CAA:

Nine CAA Football teams appeared in this week's Top 25. It is the first time ever a league has had as many as nine teams in one week's poll at the FCS level. Prior to this week's ranking release, the CAA had eight teams in the rankings. CAA Football was the only conference to ever boast seven among TSN's rankings in a single week having done that 14 times.

RISING UP THE RANKS:

It took the ODU Football Monarchs until year three and 27 games to receive its first Top 25 ranking. Looking at other recent start-up programs, it took Coastal Carolina 32 games to achieve a national ranking when they came in at No. 24 in The Sports Network Poll in their third year on Nov. 8, 2005. That season the Chanticleers finished 9-2 and were the Big South co-champions.

LONGEST PLAY FROM SCRIMMAGE:

Angus Harpers' 64-yard touchdown run last week against Towson was the longest play from scrimmage in ODU's history. But that record stood just briefly when Nick Mayers had a 93-yard reception from Taylor Heinicke late in third quarter.

The previous longest run from scrimmage was a 53-yard run by Colby Goodwyn at Georgia State this season, while the longest pass completion was 62-yards by Thomas DeMarco to Prentice Gill against Cal Poly on Oct 9, 2011. The play was also the longest by a Towson opponent this season.



"The Quick Hits"

- Old Dominion enters Saturday's game having drooped back three spots in The Sports Network/FatHead.Com Top 25 Poll to No. 21, while the Monarchs held steady in the FCS Coaches Poll this week at No. 22.
- ODU dropped its first home CAA contest with last weekend's 39-35 heartbreaker to #18/23 Towson. The Monarchs picked up their first road CAA win and first win as a nationally-ranked program in week six at Rhode Island with a 31-23 victory. ODU's first CAA win and first victory over a nationally ranked opponent in week five's 48-33 win over then-#20 UMass.
- Old Dominion restarted its football program in 2009 after a 69-year absence and in its three years has compiled an 22-7 overall mark as the best start-up in FCS history.
- Old Dominion went 9-2 in its inauguaral season, 8-3 in 2010, and currently stands at 5-2 this season with victories over Campbell, Georgia State, Hampton, #20 UMass, and Rhode Island.
- After playing two years as an independent in the FCS, the Monarchs join the CAA, considered by many to be the best FCS conference in the nation, and holds a 2-2 mark in the league. Seven of the CAA's 11 programs were ranked in the national preseason polls and nine are ranked this week Delaware, New Hampshire, James Madison, Richmond, Towson, Old Dominion, and Maine.
- With week seven's loss to Towson, the Monarchs improved to 5-2 on the season, 2-2 in the CAA, 3-1 at home and 13-5 all-time at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.
- Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium continues to be the place to be in Hampton Roads on Saturdays. The Monarchs' 18 home games, all have been sellouts. While the last two season's have averaged 19,782, additional seating has brought Foreman Field's capacity to 19,818. ODU is currently seventh in average attendance through week six.
- As a team through week six, the Monarchs are ranked in the Top 25 nationally in Sacks (5th 3.57), Scoring Offense (5th 36.71), Tackles for Loss (11th 8.14), Net Punting (13th 38.02), Total Offense (20th 419.29), and Rushing Offense (23 114.14).
- Individually in the national stats this season Jonathan Plisco ranks second in punting (46.84) and defensive lineman Ronnie Cameron ranks 15th in TFLs (1.71).

VILLANOVA OUTLOOK:

The Villanova Wildcats, who brought home an FCS National Championship in 2009, have one of the youngest teams in the CAA taking the field on Saturday. Against New Hampshire two weeks ago, the Wildcats, who are 1-6 overall and still looking for their first CAA win at 0-4, played 17 first- year players, including 11 true freshmen, five redshirt freshmen and a transer. In that game, Villanova started seven true freshmen and one redshirt freshman in the game. Entering this season, Villanova is coming off a three-year run where they tallied a 33-9 overall record and a 19-5 CAA mark.

HAPPY HOMECOMING:

The Monarchs serve as Villanova's homecoming opponent this season.

WATCH LIST:

Wildcat freshman linebacker Dillon Lucas joins the Monarchs' Eriq Lewis on the Jerry Rice Watch List for National Freshman of the Year. Lucas is second on the Wildcat defense with 59 tackles and ranks 15th in the conference.

LAST TIME OUT FOR THE WILCATS:

Villanova dropped a 34-10 decision to the No. 13 James Madison in Harrisonburg last week, as the Dukes scored 28 unanswered points in the game's last 23 minutes. Redshirt freshman quarterback Dustin Thomas returned to action after missing four games with an injury and threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to junior wide receiver Kenny Miles to put the Wildcats ahead 7-0 near the midpoint of the second quarter and Villanova also led 10-6 after junior Mark Hamilton kicked a 41-yard field goal early in the second half. Hamilton added another field goal following the half but the Dukes offense took off from there.

Thomas finished the day 11-of-24 for 127 yards and the touchdown pass to Miles, while also throwing two incerceptions. He also carried the ball 12 times, including breaking away for a 26-yard run early in the fourth quarter.

Junior wide receiver Dorian Wells had four catches for 25 yards, while freshman wide receiver Clay Horne had two receptions for 36 yards.

Junior defensive back Ronnie Akins had a gamehigh 12 tackles and led three Villanova players that tallied at least 10 stops.

HONORED MONARCHS:

CAA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

9/12 - Running Back - Colby Goodwyn

Sophomore Colby Goodwyn picked up CAA Football Offensive Player of the Week honors and was named the College Football Performance Award National Running Back of the Week after leading Old Dominion to a 40-17 win at Georgia State during week two. The sophomore carried the ball 26 times for 184 yards and a touchdown, marking the second-highest rushing total in ODU's short program history. The yardage mark is also the highest CAA Football total since Delaware's Andrew Pierce rattled off 200 yards against Duquesne on Sept. 18 last season. Goodwyn, who also hauled in one catch for five yards, logged three rushes of 20-or-more yards in the win including a 53-yarder in the fourth quarter.

CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

9/5 - Wide Receiver - #5 Anotonio Vaughan

Redshirt freshman wide receiver Antonio Vaughan was rewarded for his impressive Monarch debut against Campbell in week by being named CAA Football's Rookie of the Week finishing his Monarch debut with 191 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns in ODU's 41-14 win over Campbell. He hauled in six catches for 97 yards, including a 34-yard second-quarter touchdown pass from Thomas DeMarco. Vaughan later showed his ground skills by scampering 30 yards to paydirt in the third quarter, boosting the ODU lead to 38-7. The CAA Football Rookie of the Week was also effective in the Monarchs' return game posting a 16-yard punt return and two kickoff returns for 48 yards. Vaughan was ODU's first ever CAA weekly award winner.

10/3 - Quarterback - #14 Taylor Heinicke

True freshman Taylor Heinicke was inserted into the Monarch offense after signal caller Thomas DeMarco, who had started all 26 games to-date was sidelined with injury in the second half, to throw for 119 yards and two touchdowns in helping ODU to its first-ever CAA victory and first win over a ranked team in week five's 48-33 win over #20 UMass. Heinicke completed eight of his 11 attempts, which included a school record 56-yard touchdown pass to Reid Evans. The true freshman also found Larry Pinkard on a 38-yard touchdown throw to kick off the first of three fourth quarter touchdowns. Heinicke also ran the ball five times for 24 yards in his Monarch debut.

CAA SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

10/3 - Wide Receiver - #81 Jakwail Bailey

True freshman Jakwail Bailey blocked a UMass punt that led to a safety and returned the lead for good in ODU's 48-33 win over the #20 Minutement in the Monarchs' first ever CAA win and win over a ranked opponent in week five. With the Minutemen at 4th and 12 and pinned back at their own 10-yard line, Bailey blocked the Monarchs' fourth punt this season. Having allowed the Minutemen to rattle off 26 unanswered points after the Monarchs had achieved a 25-0 lead, Bailey's blocked punt and safety gave ODU a 27-26 edge and a lead they would not relinquish.

CFPA NATIONAL RUNNING BACK OF THE WEEK:

9/12 - Running Back - Colby Goodwyn

Coldby Goodwyn, who earned CAA Offensive Player of the Week honors as well, carried the ball 26 times for 190 yards and a touchdown, marking the second-highest rushing total in ODU's short program history in ODU's week two win at Georgia State. The yardage mark is also the highest CAA Football total since New Hampshire's Dontra Peters rattled off 197 yards against Central Connecticut State Sept. 4 last season. Goodwyn logged three rushes of 20-ormore yards in the win including a 53-yarder in the fourth quarter.

CFPA NATIONAL LINEBACKER OF THE WEEK:

10/10 - Linebacker - Craig Wilkins

Redshirt junior linebacker Craig Wilkinss made seven tackles (4 solo, 3 assisted), including 3.5 for loss, in week six's victory at Rhode Island, which gave the Monarchs their first ever CAA road win. The Monarch co-captain also had a 12-yard interception return that lead to the Monarchs' first scoring drive of the game.

DOUBLE DIGIT STOPS:

Linebacker Craig Wilkins, who earned CFPA National Linebacker of the Week following his performance in week six against Rhode Island, led the Monarchs with double digit tackles for the second time this season. The Washington, D.C. native had six solo and seven assisted tackles for 13 total against the Tigers in week seven.

Wilkins also had 17 stops against Hampton in week three as he led the ODU defense with 17 tackles replacing his previous high of 11 stops in last year's game with nationally-ranked Cal Poly. It was also a new record for stops by a Monarch defender in a game, replacing the previous of 14 by Ronnie Cameron in last year's season finale at N.C. Central.

He currently leads the Monarchs with 70 total tackles over the course of the Monarchs' seven games this season ranking sixth among the conference's defenders.

SACK IT TO ME:

The six sacks, led by 2.5 by defensive lineman Ronnie Cameron, recorded by the Monarch defense last week against Towson were the most this season. Previous high was five against Campbell and then-#20 UMass.

Cameron, who is averaging .86 quarterback takedowns a game is third in the CAA in the category and 15th nationally.

PASSING MARK:

Taylor Heinicke's 360 passing yard are the second most in ODU history just below Thomas DeMarco's 407 yards at Monmouth on September 25 2010.

Last time the Monarchs threw for over 300 yards in a game was when redshirt senior Thomas DeMarco, who is working his way back from a high ankle sprain, passed for 310 yards in a week one victory over Campbell.

Over the course of the Monarchs' 29 games play thus far, Old Dominion has passed for over 300 yards five times.

RECEIVING MARK:

Nick Mayer's 166 receiving yards versus the Tigers last weekend was another school record. The previous high was 154 yards by Prentice Gill at Monmouth on Sept. 25 of last season.

It was Mayers' second 100+ yard receiving game. He was the first Monarchs to catch for 100 yards having done so in the Monarchs' loss at Fordham in 2009.

Through ODU's 29 total games play, a Monarchs has registered 100 or more yards of receiving six times.

SCORING AGAINST THE MONARCHS:

Prior to Towson's Terrance West's 47 and 54-yard touchdown runs, the longest scores against Old Dominion this season came from Hampton's Jeremy Jermin as he had a 42-yard fumble recovery and from Delaware on a Tim Donnelly to Rob Jones 32-yard pass.

WOW...WHAT A PLAY:

Midway through the thid quarter in last week's game against Towson, the Monarchs took a 35-24 lead on one of the wildest plays in ODU history. Safety Carvin Powell intercepted a Tiger pass in the endzone setting up the Monarch drive to start at their own four-yard line. Then rookie Taylor Heinicke threw a 93-yard pass to Nick Mayers who tore down field but had the ball stripped at the Towson 3. As the ball rolled its way into the endzone, senior Prentice Gill jumped on top of it to score the touchdown for the Monarchs.

STOPPING THE RUN:

The Monarchs are second behind James Madison in the CAA in rush defense. Take a look at how ODU has shut down its opponent's run game.

MORE SCHOOL RECORDS:

Taylor Heinicke's 56-yard pass to Reid Evans midway through the fourth quarter in week five's win over then #20 UMass was the longest in touchdown school history and the fourth 50+ passing touchdown in the Monarchs' young three year history.

RINSE, REPEAT:

The Monarchs have had a player with two touchdown receptions in a game three times this season. With a pair of catches in the end zone against the Rams in week five, it marked the second time Larry Pinkard has had two touchdown receptions in a game, also doing so in week five's win over UMass. Nick Mayers also had a pair of touchdown receptions against the Minutemen in week five as well.

A TOUGH PLACE TO PLAY:

The Monarchs picked up a win in a place that's been tough to win for Ram opponents. Entering week six's game, Rhode Island was 5-1 over their last six game at Meade Stadium. The Rams have also been known to provide the upset in the CAA as last year they picked up wins over #8 New Hampshire, #3 Villanova, and #19 UMass in 2010.

MORE NEWBIES:

Making first appearance for the Monarchs were true freshman running back Tyree Lee and quarterback Taylor Heinicke in the Monarchs' week five victory over then-#20 UMass. Heinicke started the entire second half of the game throwing for 119 yards and two touchdowns en-route to CAA Rookie of the Week honores. Lee finished the game with 11 carries for the 38 yards. ODU has had 10 true freshmen taking the field this season, which also includes offensive lineman Josh Mann, running back Lorenzo Smith, wide receiver Blair Roberts, long snapper Rick Lovato, as well as Jakwail Bailey, Mitch Castlebery, James Faircloth, and Neal Anthony Hale on special teams.

JERRY RICE AWARD WATCH LIST:

Redshirt freshman Eriq Lewis is among 15 freshmen comprising the first Watch List for the inaugural Jerry Rice Award. The Rice Award, presented by The Sports Network and sponsored by Fathead.com, will honor the outstanding freshman in the Football Championship Subdivision. The legendary Rice, who played in the FCS (then Division I-AA) at Mississippi Valley State, will present the award at the national awards banquet on Jan. 6 in Frisco, Texas. The new award allows Rice to join three other football legends whose names adorn the top individual awards in the FCS: the Walter Payton (FCS outstanding player) - of which quarterback Thomas DeMarco is a watch list honoree, Eddie Robinson (FCS coach of the year) awards, and the Buck Buchanan Award (FCS outstanding defensive player).

BLOCK THAT KICK:

Special teams now has 17 blocks to its credit in the last three seasons, including five already in the 2011 season, which according to an unofficial poll of FCS schools are the second most blocks by a school this season. In week five, Jakwail Bailey blocked a UMass punt that results in a safety, giving the Monarchs a 26-25 lead they would not relinquish late in the third quarter. For his efforts, Bailey was named the CAA Special Teams Player of the Week. The Monarchs have made a block in four of the last six contests.

The Monarchs also blocked a 48-yard Delaware field goal attempt, recording a block for its third consecutive contest.

In week three's game with Hampton true freshman James Faircloth blocked a Pirate punt resulting in Larry Pinkard returning the ball five-yards for a touchdown to open up the fourth quarter in the 45-42 victory. It was the third time in the two-game series with the Pirates that ODU has blocked a punt attempted by Hampton.

In week two's 40-17 win at Georgia State, Alex Arain blocked his second career punt that was picked up by Blair Roberts and returned for a touchdown. Additionally, Paul Morant blocked a punt in the victory.

HOME/AWAY:

Old Dominion is currently 13-5 all-time and 3-1 this season at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium following its 39-35 setback to #17/23 Towson last weekend. The Monarchs had won six straight at home with their last loss occcuring on Oct. 9th in a 50-37 setback to Cal Poly. In their last road outing, a 31-23 victory over Rhode Island, ODU improved to 9-2 all-time on the road. ODU's last road loss was a a 27-17 setback at #6/7 Delaware on Sept. 24 of this season after having won seven straight away from the friendly confines of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. Prior to the Blue Hen loss, the Monarchs last loss on the road was a 34-29 setback at Fordham on Oct. 3, 2009.

UPDATING THE NUMBERS - POST TOWSON:

Tyree Lee nabbed his second touchdown run of the year as he tied the game at 7-7....Angus Harper has his fourth touchdown run of the season...Nick Mayers had his fourth touchdown reception of the year and 11th of his career to give the Monarchs the 21-17 lead...Prentice Gill's 14-yard touchdown reception to give ODU a 28-24 lead was his first of the 2011 season...With this 14-yard td reception and fumble recovery in the endzone, he brought his career touchdown total to seven...Carvin Powell has his second interception of the season...

PLAYING THE RANKED TEAMS:

Towson was be the fifth ranked team the Monarchs has faced in its three-year history and third in the 2011 campaign. ODU is 1-2 this season against the Top 25 and 1-4 all-time.

Also testing the Monarchs in their first season of competition in the CAA will be #13 James Madison, #16/15 William & Mary, and #20/25 Richmond.

WIN STREAK SNAPPED:

With the 27-17 loss to Delaware in the Monarchs' CAA debut in week four, Old Dominion saw it's FCS leading eight-game win streak come to an end. The Monarchs had not lost a game prior to the Blue Hen loss since a 50-37 setback to Cal Poly on October 9, 2010. ODU does have another win streak going though. The Monarchs have won five straight games at home dating back to the loss to the nationally ranked Mustangs.

FUMBLE TO POINTS:

Chris Lovitt's fumble recovery in week four's contest with Delaware was his first and only the Monarchs' second fumble recovery that has led to a touchdown. Marquis Johnson had a fumble recovery that led to a score in ODU's loss at Fordham in 2009 recovering the ball in the end zone following a punt by the Rams.

TWO-MINUTE DRILL:

Head coach Bobby Wilder has compared ODU's scoring drives to "two-minute drills" since that's usually how fast the Monarchs score once they have the ball. Old Dominion averaged roughly 2:25 to score against Hampton in week three. Against Georgia State in week two, the Monarchs' scoring drives roughly lasted 2:46. Against Campbell in week one, the average Monarch scoring drive was 1:50.

RAIN, RAIN GO AWAY:

It was only the third game in their 28-game history the Football Monarchs have encountered inclement weather in its 45-42 week three-win over Hampton. In 2009 ODU defeated Campbell, 28-17, on an overcast and drizzling October 17, 2009 afternoon at Foreman Field while a comeback against Fordham fell short, 34-29, at a soggy Jack Coffey Field on Oct 3, 2009.

FUMBLE, FUMBLIA, FUMBLEROOKSI:

Old Dominion had four forced fumbles and a pair of fumble recoveries in week three's win over Hampton. The four forced fumbles, which included a pair by senior defensive end Edmon McClam, were the most by the Monarchs in their three-year history.

FLYING THROUGH THE UPRIGHTS:

Jarod Brown had a 51-yard field goal in the opening ODU drive at Georgia State in week two as well as a 45-yarder. His 51-yard field goal capping off the Monarchs' ODU opening drive was the longest in school history. He surpasses his previous high of 48 at N.C. Central in last year's season finale.

OPENING WITH A BANG:

And no, we're not talking about the howitzer you hear being shot off before the Monarchs run onto Foreman Field. Old Dominion scored on its opening drive twice this season and 15 times in the 27 game history of the program. Jarod Brown opening scoring in last week's UMass game with a 43-yard field goal and also drilled a school record 51-yard field goal to open up scoring in week two's 40-17 win at Georgia State.

I-N-T:

The Monarchs had three interceptions in its win over Georgia State in week two - Devon Simmons, Eriq Lewis, and Carvin Powell. The three int's were second most in school history. The school record is four against Presbyterian on Oct. 10, 2009.

COMING BACK AT YOU:

Devon Simmons captured a 32-yard interception return in the second quarter in week two's contest at Georgia State. It was Simmons' fifth interception, having had four in the inaugural season in 2009. It ties for the fourth longest interception return. Simmons's longest was a 37-yard interception return against Hampton, last season.

IT'S OKAY, YOU CAN SCORE FIRST:

The Hampton Pirates struck first in the Monarchs' week three contest, the seventh time overall and second time this season the opponents have scored first in the Monarchs' 28-game history. However all seven times ended in victory for the Monarchs including this year's season opener with Campbell, 2010 games with Monmouth, Georgia State, and VMI, as well as 2009 contests with Jacksonville and Presbyterian.

IMPRESSIVE DEBUT:

Wide receiver Antonio Vaughan finished his Monarch debut with 191 all-purpose yards (30 rush, 97 rec., 48 kick return, 16 punt return), the third highest total in the Monarchs' young history. Only Thomas DeMarco (224 yds. vs. N.C. Central - 2009) and Colby Goodwyn (356 yds. vs. Cal Poly - 2010) have had more. Vaughan gave ODU the 28-7 edge with 4:36 remaining in the second quarter, with his first career touchdown. He had his second touchdown on the play following a fumble forced by Keenan Terry and recovery by John Darr in the third quarter

FIRST SCORING OF THE YEAR:

Kai Blanco scored the first ODU touchdown of the 2011 season. It was his third touchdown of his career. He also had scores against William & Mary and VMI last season. Other first touchdowns of the season came by Marquel Thomas in 2009 and Prentice Gill in 2010 versus Jacksonville.

WELCOME NEWBIES

While the coaching staff has been excited about a veteran team taking the field for the 2011 inaugural CAA season, you can't forget about the newcomers who are making an impact already after week one. 19 Monarchs took their first snaps in the 41-14 win over Campbell in week one and among them were a trio of starters in redshirt freshmen wide receiver Antonio Vaughan, running back Angus Harper and safety Eriq Lewis. Vaughan received CAA Rookie of the Week honors after collecting 191 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns and making six catches for 97 yards and two touchdowns. Harper ran the ball 10 times for 28 yards and a touchdown. Lewis made four tackles and had a pass breakup. Also getting into the mix were true freshman Josh Mann, a local product from nearby Virginia Beach and Ocean Lakes High School, who played at right guard and Lorenzo Smith, who lead the rushing corps with 14 carries for 65 yards. Smith had only been a member of the running back crew for the last two weeks of preseason after moving from cornerback during preseason camp due to the injury to Mario Crawford. Through week four, 21 true or redshirt freshmen have taken snaps for the Monarchs.

MORE PEOPLE WATCH THE MONARCHS WIN:

A new attendance mark was set in the Monarchs' home opener against Campbell in week one thanks to new seats in the loge level of the Ainslie Game Day Building. 19,818 people were in attendance to witness the Monarchs' 41-14 victory over the Camels.

SOLD OUT:

The Old Dominion University football program begins its third season of competition and its first as an official member of the Colonial Athletic Association this fall, and for the third consecutive year the Monarchs have sold through their season ticket allocations at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Since starting football in 2009, Old Dominion University has sold out of all available season tickets, setting national attendance records for start-up Football Championship Subdivision programs. The Monarchs ranked fourth in both accumulated and average attendance in 2010 and a total of 296,766 fans have entered through the turnstiles in the 23-games played at Foreman Field the last three seasons.

ODU fans purchased more than 14,000 season tickets for the 2011 season, with 400 of those tickets sold to 140 members of the football waiting list. The waiting list, created in 2009, currently has 1,710 members who are the first group contacted when season tickets become available.

WELCOME TO THE CAA:

Entering its inaugural season in the CAA, the ODU Football Monarchs were picked 10th in the conference's Preseason Poll announced at CAA Football Media Day at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore, Md.

JOB WELL DONE:

Old Dominion football Coach Bobby Wilder has announced four promotions on his coaching staff this preseason. Dealton Cotton has been elevated to Assistant Head Coach, Keita Malloy has added the title Pass Game Coordinator, Ron Whitcomb will serve as the Monarchs' Recruiting Coordinator, and Jarod Dodson will add Assistant Defensive Coordinator to his duties.

PAYTON AWARD:

Old Dominion quarterback Thomas DeMarco is a nominee for the Walter Payton Award for the Football Championship Subdivision's (FCS) top individual honor. The Payton Award will celebrate its 25th anniversary this season and be presented to the FCS' outstanding player at the national awards banquet Thursday night, Jan. 5 in Frisco, Texas.

The initial 2011 Watch List included 11 quarterbacks. Joining DeMarco on the list are seniors DeAndre Presley of Appalachian State, Casey Therriault of Jackson State, Mike Brown of Liberty, B.J. Coleman of Chattanooga, Josh McGregor of Jacksonville, Bo Levi Mitchell of reigning FCS champion Eastern Washington and Tirrell Rennie of Northern Iowa, juniors Casey Brockman of Murray State, and Brad Sorensen of Southern Utah, and sophomore DeNarius McGhee of Montana State.

Also included on the list were senior running backs Jonathan Grimes of William & Mary, Mike Mayhew of North Carolina A&T and D.J. McNorton of North Dakota State, as well as junior Jamaine Cook of Youngstown State and sophomores Nate Eachus of Colgate and Andrew Pierce of Delaware along with junior fullback Eric Breitenstein from Wofford.

The Watch List also includds two wide receivers, Liberty senior Chris Summers and Eastern Washington junior Brandon Kaufman.

Entering the 2011 inaugural Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) season, the Monarch signal caller has already garnered some preseason attention. DeMarco is a Preseason Honorable Mention All-American by the Consensus Draft Services and was named to the College Football Performance Awards Quarterbacks Watch List in addition to be listed as one of the Top FCS Quarterbacks by The Sports Network.

A member of the Walter Payton Watch List for the second straight season, DeMarco averaged 250.5 yards passing per contest including passing for a career-high 407 yards at Monmouth. He also passed for over 300 yards against Jacksonville and #14/16 Cal-Poly and threw for a career-high four touchdowns in games at Campbell, at Monmouth, and vs. #14/16 Cal Poly. On the ground, the two-year starting Monarch QB ran for 423 yards and a team-leading eight touchdowns as the Monarchs' second leading rusher. He averaged 38.5 yards rushing per game, running for a pair of touchdowns at Hampton and versus Savannah State.

GOOD WORK RONNIE CAMERON:

Old Dominion defensive tackle Ronnie Cameron was among the record 132 nominees announced for the 2011 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. The award recognizes the selfless contributions to volunteerism and community service made by college football student-athletes across the nation.

This year marks the program's 20th year honoring college football players at all levels of competition who stand out for their "good works" in the community. Since 1992, selection to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has become the gold standard for off-the-field character and leadership for college football players. The honor is widely considered the sport's pre-eminent community service award.

Entering last season as a "Transfer to Watch" by the Sports Network after joining the ODU program from Hofstra, Cameron started all 11 games at tackle for the Monarchs and ended the year second on the ODU defense with 72 tackles (28 solo, 44 assisted). The Second Team All-State honoree was tied for eighth among FCS defenders in tackles for loss, averaging 1.73 TFL's a game and was second on the squad with 5.5 sacks. Cameron also led ODU with eight QB hurries, captured forced fumbles against VMI and N.C. Central and had a career-high 14 stops in the season finale at N.C. Central.

Away from the field, Cameron is active in the numerous Monarch Reachout programs including the annual National Marrow Donor Registry and the annual "Little Feet Meet" with ODU Special Olympics and has also participated in activities with the Make-A-Wish Foundation of Greater Virginia and the summer clinic with the Boys & Girls Club of Southeast Virginia. Cameron has also served as a volunteer at the United Methodist Church, homeless shelters and at the Westbury Recreation Center and volunteered at Leesville Middle School and Larchmont Recreation Center.

A Dean's List student, Cameron finished his undergraduate degree in three years and is currently working towards his MBA. In addition to being a captain of the ODU Football Monarchs, he is also a member of the ODU MBA Association and is a recipient of the Luke Hillier Endowment for academic and athletic success. Cameron also helped led, organize, and was a keynote speaker at the third annual Black Male Summit.

FIRST MONARCH NFL SIGNEE:

Former Old Dominion defensive end Deron Mayo signed a free agent contract with the National Football League's Denver Broncos becoming the first Monarch to do so.

Mayo's impact at Old Dominion was immediate from the time he set foot on campus. Choosing to play his final season of collegiate football at ODU after Hofstra University disbanded its program, Mayo was named a "Transfer to Watch" by the Sports Network and in a vote by his teammates, was named a Co-Captain, showing their respect for the defensive end with Mayo not even having played a game in the Monarch uniform.

In 2010, Mayo was third on the ODU defense making 70 tackles and made five or more stops in 10 of the Monarchs' 11 games. He led the Monarchs in sacks, was second on the team in tackles for loss, forced a team-leading three fumbles, recorded a team second-best seven QB hurries, and tied for third among teammates with three pass break-ups. As a member of the special teams unit, Mayo blocked two kicks, including a punt at Hampton resulting in a Monarch score.

Mayo was released by the Broncos on Aug. 29.

TO THE MAX:

When the Monarchs reported to preseson camp on Aug. 7th, the roster was at the NCAA maximum for the first time in the ODU program's history as 95 Football Monarchs reported.

SEASON OPENING VICTORY: Football Monarchs Dominate Campbell, 41-14

NORFOLK, Va. -- Antonio Vaughan had 191 all-purpose yards and scored two touchdowns as Old Dominion dominated Campbell 41-14 Saturday night at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Vaughan, in his Monarch debut, ran for 30 yards, picked up 97 yards receiving, and racked up 48 yards on kick returns. He caught a 43-yard pass from Thomas DeMarco on the first play of the game, and only improved from there as he scored on a 34-yard pass reception with four minutes remaining in the second quarter and later scoring on a 30-yard run to increase the Monarchs' lead to 38-7 with 10 minutes left in the third quarter.

Campbell scored first on a 15-yard pass from Braden Smith to Preston Dodson, capping an opening drive that saw the Camels cover nearly 60 yards. However, ODU came right back with a seven yard TD pass from DeMarco to Kai Blanco while defensively, ODU would only allow Campbell to gain three yards on their next drive and be pushed back for negative yardage on the following drive.

Angus Harper gave ODU its first lead with an 11-yard score while Demarco added a seven yard scamper before Vaughan's first score of the night.

Vaughan's first score of the night increased ODU's lead to 28-7 which it would take into halftime.

ODU came out of halftime and tacked onto the lead with a 32-yard field goal by Jarod Brown.

On the kickoff return following Brown's field goal, Keenen Terry forced the Camels' Brandon Chandler to fumble the ball with John Darr on the recovery setting up the Monarchs at the Campbell 30. On the next play DeMarco handed off the ball to Vaughan who tore 30-yards downfield for his second touchdown of the night.

Jordan Cramer caught a three-yard from Smith to get Campbell on the board in the second half, but it would be the only other time the Camels would score.

Brown added his second field goal of the night, with a 45-yarder to complete the scoring late in the third quarter.

DeMarco finished the night 29-of-38, for 310 yards with two touchdowns through the air, and one on the ground.

Lorenzo Smith led ODU with 14 carries for 65 yards on the ground while Harper had seven catches for 58 yards.

Ronnie Cameron led the defense with nine tackles and half a sack, with Devon Simmons making seven stops for the Monarch defense, and Chad King collecting six tackles, including 1.5 tackles for resulting in the Camels losing 11 yards.

Smith completed 20-of-40 passes for the Camels, for 172 yards and two scores.

2011 Recaps - Georgia State

Football Monarchs Pounce Panthers, 40-17

NORFOLK, Va. -- ATLANTA, Ga. - The Old Dominion Monarchs won their seventh straight game with a 40-17 victory over future Colonial Athletic Association rival Georgia State at the Georgia Dome Saturday.

The win, ODU's seventh straight, improves the squad to 2-0 on the year.

Jarod Brown drilled a pair of field goals in the opening quarter giving Old Dominion a guick 6-0 edge. Brown's first field goal, a 51-yarder on the Monarchs' opening drive, was the longest of his career, surpassing his previous high of 48 in last year's season finale at N.C. Central.

Turnovers would result in Georgia State getting onto the scoreboard.

The Panthers' score came following ODU fumbling after a punt. While Georgia State recovered the ball at the ODU 15, the Monarch defense would not allow the Panthers to go on further than the nine-yard line forcing the Panthers to kick a field goal. Christian Benvenuto's attempt was good from 26-yards cutting the Monarch advantage with 6-3 with 6:07 remaining on the clock in the first quarter.

ODU quickly responded though. In just over two minutes, Colby Goodwyn punctuated a six-play, 32-yard drive to give the Monarchs' a 13-3 advantage heading into quarter number two.

Devon Simmons quickly returned possession back to the Monarchs following Goodwyn's touchdown. Simmons had a 32-yard interception return, but as the Monarchs' worked their way into the red zone, ODU fumbled the ball at their own one-yard line with the fumble return setting up the Panthers up at the Monarchs' own seven-yard line. Donald Russell finished off the drive to give GSU its first touchdown, cutting the ODU lead to 13-10 in the closing moments of the opening guarter.

Old Dominion's "All-Star" team lit up the scoreboard to start the second quarter. Paul Morant blocked the punt and freshman Blair Roberts recovered and ran into the end zone to put ODU ahead 20-10. It was ODU's 13th block in history.

Each team would add another touchdown before concluding the opening half of action. Georgia State cut the deficit to three, 20-17, with six minutes remaining in the second quarter on a run by Travis Evans. Then with just over two minutes, ODU wide receiver Reid Evans lifted ODU to a 27-17 lead heading into the half.

Old Dominion captured the lone points of the third quarter. Quarterback Thomas DeMarco registered the 27th touchdown of his career to cap an 87-yard drive by the Monarchs to give ODU a 33-17 edge with just under five minutes remaining in the quarter.

The Panthers threatened to score in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter. At the ODU 12 on second and nine, the Monarchs' managed to flip the field as Eriq Lewis captured his first career interception.

On the ensuing drive, Colby Goodwyn raced downfield for 50 yards, setting up DeMarco to punch in the ball from two yards out and add to the ODU margin. With just over 10 minutes remaining in the game, ODU led 40-17.

Before the game was over, Carvin Powell would add another interception to keep the Panthers scoreless in the second half.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by Craig Wilkins with nine tackles (6) solo, 3 assisted) and John Darr with seven tackles (3 solo, 4 assisted). Ronnie Cameron also added a pair of sacks totaling 16 yards lost for the

DeMarco finished the game completing 13 of his 21 attempts for 126 yards.

Goodwyn ended the game with 26 carries for 190 yards, the second most rushing yardage by a Monarch in the school's young history.

Football Monarchs Hang On for 45-42 Win Over Hampton

NORFOLK, Va. -- Larry Pinkard returned a blocked punt five yards and Thomas DeMarco ran for two touchdowns in the last seven minutes as Old Dominion hung on to defeat Hampton 45-42 night in Norfolk.

With Penn falling to Lafayette, 37-12, Old Dominion now brings the nation's longest win streak among FCS schools to its first Colonial Athletic Association contest at Delaware next week. The Monarchs have won eight straight games dating back to its 50-37 set back to nationally ranked Cal Poly back on November 9th of last season. They also improved to 12-4 all-time and 2-0 this season at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium and take a 20-5 record into their first conference contest.

The Hampton Pirates meanwhile dropped to 2-1 on the season.

ODU held a 17-14 halftime lead and quickly stretched the lead to 10 on a five-yard Angus Harper touchdown, but Hampton came right back, cata-pulted by a Justin Blake interception, with 13-straight points, two field goals by Taurean Durham and a 42-yard fumble return by Jeremy Jermin to take a 27-24 lead.

The Monarchs retook the lead as James Faircloth blocked a Jordan Stovall punt and Larry Pinkard returned it five yards for the 31-27 lead. It was the Monarchs' 15th blocked punt and the third time in the two meetings with the Pirates that ODU has blocked a punt.

The Pirates' Jorrian Washington gave Hampton the lead back briefly with a nine yard run, but DeMarco led ODU on two scoring drives, one a 14 play, 67-yard drive and the other a 10-yard drive after Edmon McClam sacked Hampton quarterback David LeGree and forced a fumble.

Hampton scored with just over a minute left, but the ensuing onsides kick went out of bounds.

DeMarco finished the night 20-of-29 passing, with 172 yards, while rushing for 29 yards with two scores. Angus Harper and Colby Goodwyn comined to run for 199 yards, with Harper leading the way with 111 and two scores.

LeGree finished 25-of-35 passing for the Pirates for 260 yards with a touchdown. He also rushed for 66 yards and a score.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by redshirt junior linebacker Craig Wilkins with 17 stops, while Chad King recorded eight tackles, and Eriq Lewis had seven. McClam also finished the night with a pair of sacks.

Football Fall To #7/6 Delaware In CAA Debut

NEWARK, Del. -- The Old Dominion Football Monarchs had their eight-game win streak snapped with a 27-17 loss at Delaware in their Colonial Athletic Association debut on Saturday at Tubby Raymond Field at Delaware Stadium.

The first quarter of CAA Football for the Monarchs was nothing short of exciting.

On Delaware's opening drive and the Blue Hens in Monarch territory at the ODU27, Eriq Lewis forced David Hayes to fumble and return possession back to the Monarchs with Carvin Powell coming up with the ball.

While Old Dominion did not score on its possession, the Monarchs' "All-Star Team", special teams, would end up putting the Monarchs on the board first.

The Blue Hens, who had outscored its opponents at home 35-0 in the first quarter, saw the Monarchs jump out to a 7-0 lead as Chris Lovitt returned a fumble made by the Blue Hen's punt team 18 -yards for a touchdown with 6:39 remaining in the first quarter.

As Delaware made its way downfield on their next drive, the Blue Hens attempted a 48-yard field goal, but the Monarchs' "All-Star Team" added another notch to its blocked kicks tally stopping Sean Baner's kick from going through the uprights and persevering ODU's 7-0 lead.

The momentum was shorted lived however as on the first play of ODU's ensuing drive, Thomas DeMarco's pass was intercepted. Delaware would find the uprights this time and score on a 40-yard field goal as Old Dominion led 7-3 at the end of the first guarter.

Delaware closed their deficit to one with Baner's second field goal of the afternoon, a 39-yard attempt with 9:13 left in the second quarter. Then as the second quarter was coming to close Nihja White capped of a 11-play, 64-yard-drive to put Delaware ahead 13-7 into the half.

The Blue Hens had a chance to add to the lead in the early minutes of the third quarter, however Baner's 25-yard attempt went wide right.

The Monarchs' followed by connecting on a field goal as Jarod Brown's attempt from 20-yards out was good and improved his mark to 6-of-6 for the year in field goals.

Baner had another crack at the uprights, as Delaware capitalizing a an ODU fumble at their own 20 in the closing seconds of the third quarter. With the drive continuing into the fourth quarter, Baner this time connected on a 20-yard attempt extending Delaware's lead to 16-10 entering the final quarter of play.

On the next drive, Old Dominion wasn't able to find its way past its own 23 and brought the punt team to the field. Plisco, who averaged 48.6 yards per punt in the game, ran the ball instead and continued the ODU drive. Back-to-back passes to Reid Evans, one 12-yards and another 28-yards, helped flip the field setting up freshman Antonio Vaughan for nine-yard reception, his second of the season.

Delaware punched right back though with a 60-kickoff return and followed with a Rob Jones 32-yard reception in the end zone. The Blue Hens made the two-point conversion and went ahead 24-17 with less than 10 minutes left in the game.

Old Dominion was four and out on its next drive and despite being able to move the chains twice on their next drive, the Monarchs were unable to get into Blue Hen territory.

Baner added a 43-yard field goal for Delaware in the closing minute for the final 27-17 margin.

WILD RIDE: ODU Scores 23-Straight to Pull Away, Tops No. 20 UMass 48-33

NORFOLK, Va. -- Old Dominion University football scored the first 25 points and after UMASS took a 26-25 lead, scored 23-straight to take command and beat No. 20 UMass 48-33 Saturday night at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Old Dominion established a quick 3-0 lead off a 43-yard field goal by Jarod Brown on its first drive of the night and would go on to rattle off 25 unanswered points and keep the Minutemen scoreless until the final two minutes of the second quarter.

Nick Mayers, who did not have a touchdown last season for the Monnarchs, captured two during the Monarchs' 25-0 run, which included a 17-yard and 35-yard pass from Thomas DeMarco. Also getting into the scoring was Larry Pinkard posting his first career touchdown.

Masschusetts scored late in the second quarter for the 25-12 halftime margin.

Kellen Page connected with tight end Emil Igwengau to cap a 14-play, 80-yard drive for the Minutemen. Although UMass missed the extra point, on ODU's next drive, Demarco threw an interception to return possession to the Minutemen. Five plays later, UMass's Julian Talley was in the end-zone.

The Monarchs would have to look to a new signal caller in the second half when DeMarco was sidelined with a leg injury. True freshman Taylor Heinicke was inserted into the offense and the Georgia Old Spice Player of the Year would shine in his debut. Heinicke would finish the game connecting on eight of his 11 attempts for 119 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

The second half of action between the Monarchs and Minutement proved to be a battle. The Minutemen racked up 149 yards of total offense in the third quarter alone including a pair of touchdowns to take the lead. Julien Julmiste had a 20-yard touchdown reception and Jonathan Hernandez added an eight-yard carry over the endline to give UMass a 26-25 edge with 5:30 in the third quarter.

However after UMass's 26 unanswered points, the Monarchs punched back with by blocking a punt and registering a safety and three touchdowns to regain the lead and the victory.

The Monarchs finally stopped the Minutemen scoring barrage blocking their fourth punt of the season. Jakwail Bailey was the member of the "All-Star Team" making the block in the endzone and capturing the safety to return the lead to Old Dominion, 27-26, and return momentum back to the Monarchs' side.

The fourth quarter then started with Heinicke connecting with Pinkard for an 38-yard touchdown reception. It was Pinkard's second touchdown of the night.

Then at the midway point, Reid Evans posted a 56-yard touchdown catch, the longest in school history to put ODU up 41-26. True freshman Tyree Lee also got into the mix with his first career touchdown with three minutes remaining in the game on a 13-yard run.

The Minutemen scored in the game's final minute, but the contest was already out of reach.

FIRST CAA ROAD WIN: No. 21 ODU Defeats Rhode Island, 31-23

KINGSTON, R.I.. The No. 21 Old Dominion Football Monarchs picked up their first win as a ranked squad and their first Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) road win in a 31-23 win over Rhode Island on Saturday at Meade Stadium.

Monarchs wasted no time in establishing a lead. After four and out on their opening drive, it was only four plays before the Monarchs regained possession. Craig Wilkins' first interception of the year put the Monarchs in Ram territory and six plays later true freshman quarterback Taylor Heinicke scored his first career touchdown run to put ODU up 7-0 at the 10 minute mark of the opening quarter.

However, Rhode Island tied the game up a little under seven minutes later using a 15-play, 76-yard drive with Ram quarterback Steve Probst connecting with wide receiver Trevor Turner in the end zone to tie the game at 7-7.

Scoring continued for the Rams early in the second half with Probst finding Frazier for an 11-yard touchdown reception and Rhode Island taking a 14-7 lead within the second quarter's first two minutes.

Before the half, the Monarchs were able to tie the game at 14-14. After possession was traded seven times, it became the two-minute drill for the Monarchs. ODU made its way down field 68-yards capped by a seven-yard Larry Pinkard touchdown catch to tie the score heading into the locker room.

The Rams took the lead over to start off the third quarter. After a failed on-sides kick attempt by the Monarchs, the Rams started their first drive after the half at the ODU 38. Moments later, Anthony Baskerville ran the ball four yards over the end line. The Rams' PAT attempt was no good and ODU trailed 20-14.

On ODU's next possession, the Monarchs took back the lead. Pinkard made his second touchdown reception of the game giving the Monarchs a 21-20 edge with 9:57 left in the third quarter.

But just like that, a 38-yard field goal gave the Rams a 23-21 advantage with 6:46 left in the third quarter.

The Monarchs punched back though on their next possession. Nick Mayers, on a nine-yard pass from Heinicke, capped the 11-play, 62-yard drive to give ODU a 28-23 lead.

In the only scoring in the fourth quarter, Jarod Brown sailed a 22-yard field goal through the uprights for the final 31-23 margin.

Heinicke, making his first career start, passed for 205 yards and three touchdowns along with running the ball eight times, including a score. Angus Harper led the ground attack with 45 yards on 15 carries, while Mayers had eight catches for 66 yards and Reid Evans finished the afternoon with 60 yards on six receptions.

The Rams' Steve Probst passed for 143 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by safety Carvin Powell and line-backer J.J. Williams, each with eight stops. All eight of Powell's tackles were solo stops. Linebacker Craig Wilkins added seven tackles, including 3.5 for loss as well as his interception.

No. 18/22 Football Drops Heartbreaker to No. 17/23 Towson, 39-35

NORFOLK, Va. -- Grant Enders hit Tom Ryan on fourth and 29 for a 63-yard touchdown pass to lift Towson over Old Dominion 39-35 in CAA action Saturday evening in Norfolk.

ODU sacked Enders and backup quarterback Peter Athens on conzecutive plays to push the Tigers into third and long, but Enders came back in for fourth down and hit Ryan over the middle, who broke a tackle and just broke the goalline for the touchdown.

The Monarchs hoping to make last second comeback saw Taylor Heinicke's pass intercepted by Frank Beltre to clinch the game for the Tigers.

ODU took a 35-24 lead at the end of the third quarter. Starting first and 10 at their own four, Heinicke hit Nick Mayers down the left sideline, Mayers ran all the way to the Towson three, where he fumbled and Prentice Gill recovered in the end zone. The 93-yard play is the longest play in school history.

With time running down in the fourth quarter, the Tigers closed the gap when Enders capped a nine play, 75-yard drive with an eight yard run. Leon Kinnard converted a halfback option pass to Mike Evans for the two-point conversion to make the score 35-32 setting up the winning score for Towson.

Terrance West started the scoring in the first quarter for Towson with a 47-yard run.

ODU came right back as Tyree Lee capped a 10-play, 60-yard drive with a three-yard run to knot the score.

West came right back for Towson with a 54-yard score but ODU fought back again with a 64-yarder from Angus Harper to open the second quarter

ODU gained its first lead of the night when Mayers hauled in a 36-yard TD pass from Heinicke.

D.J. Soven kicked a career-best 47-yard field goal with less than two minutes remaining in the first half to make the halftime score 21-17 in favor of the Monarchs.

In a game of back and forth, Towson got the opening kickoff of the second half and marched 64 yards in eight plays as Enders hit Tyler Wharton for a 26-yard score to regain the lead for the Tigers, but ODU punched right back as the Monarchs drove down the field and a 75-yard scoring drive was finished with a 14-yard pass from Heinicke to Gill for a 28-24 Monarch lead.

With Towson driving near the end of the third quarter, Carvin Powell intercepted Enders at the goalline and advanced the ball to the four to set up Gill's fumble recovery touchdown.

Heinicke finished the day with 360-yards passing on 22-of-37 with three scores and an interception, while Enders was 24-of-37 for 314 yards, throwing two TD's and a pick.

Harper rushed for 68 yards on just six carries for ODU and a touchdown while Terrance West carried 16 times for 151 and two touchdowns for Towson. Mayers finished the day with seven catches for a career-high 166 yards and a touchdown.

Kenton Powell had a team best eight tackles for Towson while Craig Wilkins had a game-high 13 tackles and a sack and Ronnie Cameron had 11 tackles and 2.5 sacks for ODU.

HEAD COACH

BOBBY WILDER





When he was hired on February 13, 2007, Bobby Wilder's goal was to "AIM HIGH" in everything he did in resurrecting the Old Dominion football team from a 69-year absence. After two years of orchestrating every piece of the puzzle, Wilder's vision has become reality as he has built a program that has not only been the buzz of the Hampton Roads community, but has become the most successful start-up FCS program in history.

Wilder and his staff's inaugural season of play at the Football Championship Subdivision level went well beyond expectations. From the celebrated kickoff versus Chowan, to the heart pounding first FCS victory against Jacksonville, to ensuring a winning season at Savannah State, to extending the win-streak to six in the season finale at VMI, history was made every step of the way. The Monarchs concluded the 2009 season at 9-2 overall writing their way into history.

The Monarchs finished the year ranked in the top ten in five statistical categories as a team including second in sacks allowed, third in scoring offense, turnover margin, and net punting, and ninth in rushing offense. Individually, ODU had its first football All-Americans named in punter Jonathan Plisco and long snapper Dustin Phillips with Plisco leading the nation in punt yardage averaging 44.84 yards per contest. Quarterback Thomas DeMarco was also ranked in the top ten in scoring and was the second leading FCS signal caller in rushing. Wilder meanwhile received the Tom Fergusson Memorial Award at the 65th Norfolk Sports Club Jamboree named as the Metropolitan Person of the Year in Sports.

Year two proved to be just as successful. The Old Dominion football team finished its second season of football at 8-3 in 2010 and over the last two seasons has combined for a 17-5 mark as the winningest FCS start-up program in the books. The Monarchs, who upgraded their schedule in year two in preparation for joining the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), added a pair of ranked opponents in #12/13 William & Mary and #14/16 Cal Poly and continued to play in front of capacity crowds of 19,782 in all seven of its home games. Statistically speaking, the Monarchs finished their second season of gridiron action fourth in kickoff returns, ranked eighth in scoring offense, eighth in sacks allowed, and 15th in passing offense. Under Wilder's tutelage, punter Jonathan Plisco ranked second nationally in punting, quarterback Thomas DeMarco continued to rank among the top 10 in total offense, newcomer Colby Goodwyn ran this way to third nationally in punt returns, and Ronnie Cameron pushed his way into eighth overall among FCS defenders in tackles for loss.

In addition to his recruiting efforts, Wilder has also been an essential part in the planning and development of what are among the top football facilities in the country. The state-of-the-art \$17 million Powhatan Sports Complex that houses the ODU football offices,

athletic and strength training areas, locker rooms and two practice fields with artificial surface and the \$24.8 million Foreman Field Football Complex, which includes the Ainslie Game Day Building, Astoturf GameDay Grass 3D field surface, scoreboard, sound system, field enclosure and a contiguous parking garage, are among the best the FCS has to offer.

Wilder, his coaching staff, and the football Monarchs now gear up for the biggest challenge yet in 2011. The squad joins the CAA in 2011, the toughest FCS conference in the nation that featured four teams in this past season's playoffs including runner-up Delaware, as well as 2009 FCS champion Villanova, along with William & Mary and New Hampshire.

Since arriving in Norfolk, Wilder has hit the ground running and has not stopped in his quest to make Old Dominion one of the top programs in the country. Both on and off the field, the Monarch head coach is always making sure that the Old Dominion football program is visible throughout the campus, the community and the state. He has honored over 300 speaking engagements to a variety of organizations, but his most important talks have come with high schools coaches throughout the state. Wilder and his staff have made it a point to build a fence around the Hampton Roads community and the state of Virginia, with plans of building a first rate program with players a stones throw from the ODU campus.

Wilder has also been instrumental in getting his team active in the Hampton Roads Community. In what has become an annual event, the ODU Football Monarchs host a bone marrow registry drive and to date has helped register over 450 members of the ODU student body, faculty/staff, and the Hampton Roads community to the registry in an attempt to help save lives from life-threatening diseases nationwide. The Monarchs have also been active volunteering with Special Olympics, hosting youth clinics, and participating at reading and career days at many of the area's elementary and middle schools.





As coordinator, Wilder has orchestrated a balanced attack. The Black Bears averaged 29.1 points per game in 2004, and scored 29 or more in seven of 11 games. Wilder helped tutor running back Marcus Williams, who rushed for 1,077 yards during his senior season, which moved him into first place in school history for career rushing yards. Maine also threw the ball a lot during the campaign as eight different receivers each had double-digit receptions. Ron Whitcomb was at the head of the passing attack as his completions (213) and attempts (350) were the fourth most in a single season since 1950. His 22 touchdown tosses were tied for third most since 1950. Overall, the offense averaged an impressive 5.2 yards per play.

Wilder was named the Assistant Coach of the Year by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston in 2004, which is presented annually to the top assistant coach in New England.

In 2003, the Black Bears had over 2,000 yards rushing and passing with 4,142 total yards. The ground game was anchored by Williams and the passing game was in the hands of then-freshman Ron Whitcomb, who was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year as he posted 2,428 yards - the fifth most in a season at Maine.

The 2002 Black Bears finished the season with 4,702 yards in total offense, the most since a school-record 4,861 yards in 1989. In 2001, for the first time in school history, the offense boasted a 2,000-yard passer in Jake Eaton, a 1,000-yard rusher in Royston English, and a 1,000-yard receiver in Stefan Gomes.

Prior to moving to the coordinator post, Wilder served as quarterbacks coach during one of the most explosive eras in Maine history for Black Bear quarterbacks.

Wilder guided four-year starter Mickey Fein to 17 University marks, including the two highest season totals for touchdown passes. Fein ended his career as Maine's second all-time leading passer.

In 2000, Wilder's first full season as offensive coordinator, the Black Bears ranked third in the Atlantic 10 with 29.0 points per game. The rushing game increased its output by 41 yards per game from the previous season and Eaton garnered All-New England honors. Two wide receivers from that team, Dwayne Wilmot and Phil McGeoghan, signed pro contracts and were in NFL camps in 2001. In 2002, Maine tight end Chad Hayes signed with the Kansas City Chiefs and then played briefly with the Cincinnati Bengals.

A 1987 graduate of Maine with a degree in physical education, Wilder captained the Black Bears to the Yankee Conference Championship his senior year. An All-New England quarterback in 1985, he left Maine as the school's all-time leading passer with 4,493 yards, and

A 1982 graduate of Madison High School in Madison, Maine, Wilder was a highly recruited quarterback his senior year. He opted to attend Maine and in his sophomore year and led the Black Bears to their first of five consecutive winning seasons.

Upon graduation, Wilder served as a graduate assistant coach for two seasons under Jack Bicknell at Boston College, where he earned his master's degree in educational administration in 1990.

Wilder and his wife, Pam, live in Norfolk with their sons, Derek (15) and Drew (10).


