HITTERS OF THE WEEK

ZACK SORIA, FIU

Junior, C, Homer Glen, Illinois

Soria batted .579 (11-for-19) in four games, adding a pair of walks for .619 on-base percentage. He opened the week with a career-high five hits at Bethune-Cookman on March 29 and added a pair of multiple-hit games in the weekend series win at UTSA. Soria homered twice, doubled once and drove in six runs on the week. The Homer Glen, Illinois, native also scored seven runs, notching four at Bethune-Cookman, two in Saturday's win at UTSA and one in the series-clinching victory on Sunday.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK

NATE HOFFMAN, MIDDLE TENNESSEE

Senior, RHP, Sun Prairie, Wisconsin

Hoffmann pitched a complete-game shutout against Rice on Friday night, outdueling reigning C-USA Pitcher of the Week Jon Duplantier to lead Middle Tennessee to a 3-0 win. It was the first complete game and the first shutout of his Blue Raider career and MT's first shutout since Zac Curtis blanked FIU on May 9, 2014. Hoffman posted a season-high six strikeouts, the second-highest total of MT career, and allowed just three singles in the game. The Sun Prairie, Wisconsin, native retired 10-straight during one stretch from the second to fifth innings and then retired 12-straight with two outs in fifth until a two-out walk in ninth.

C-USA NOTEBOOK

CHARLOTTE

The 49ers dropped all three games against Southern Miss over the weekend. Freshman OF **Reece Hampton** has pushed his new hitting streak to eight-straight games and has now hit safely in 26 of 28 games. Sophomore 2B **Brett Netzer**'s hit streak stayed at seven after a walk and hit-by-pitch while junior OF **Zach Jarrett** has now hit safely in five straight outings. Charlotte posted another double-digit hit performance on Sunday with 11, giving them 14 double-digit attacks as a team in 2016. The 49ers have three players better .350 or above. Junior OF **T.J. Nichtig** leads the way at .357, followed by Netzer at .350 and Hampton at .350.

FIU

The Panthers were 3-1 last week, including their first series win in C-USA play this season, taking two-of-three at UTSA. FIU opened the week by hitting a season-high five home runs and had a season-high 26 hits in a 21-8 rout of Bethune-Cookman on March 29. The 21 runs and 26 hits were the most of any C-USA team this season. The Panthers sent 14 batters to the plate in a nine-run fifth inning to break open the game. Sophomore 2B **Eddie Silva** leads the Panthers with a .368 average, 42 hits and 11 doubles, while junior DH **Nick Day** leads the team with six home runs after hitting two round trippers this week. Junior C **Zack Soria** had a terrific week, going 11 for 19 with two home runs, six RBI and seven runs scored. Junior OF **Kenny Meimerstorf** took over the team lead in RBI with 22 after driving home four runs Sunday. Junior LHP **Alex Demchak** continues to lead the Panthers in several pitching categories. He has a team-leading 1.78 ERA and is tied for the team lead in saves with two. Demchak is also second on the team with three wins.

(13) FLORIDA ATLANTIC

Florida Atlantic posted its second straight sweep in conference play after taking three games at Old Dominion this past weekend. At 22-4 overall, the Owls enter this week tied for the fourth-best winning percentage in Division I. Junior 1B **Esteban Puerta** drove in five runs in the Old Dominion series, boasting an on-base percentage of .571, while slugging .833 with a double and a home run. He improved his hitting streak to eight games and brought his season average back up to .367. In Sunday's series finale, junior LHP **Sean Labsan** struck out two batters in each of the first four innings, dealing a total of six frames with three hits and one walk allowed as he improved to 4-0, leading FAU to its fifth shutout of the year. Sophomore RHP **Marc Stewart** dealt a no-hitter into the seventh inning on Saturday, striking out five and retiring a streak of 15 consecutive ODU batters. The newcomer allowed one run on three hits in the seventh in his longest career outing. FAU's four losses have each come by two or fewer runs while the win margin is an average of 4.9 runs each.

LOUISIANA TECH

The Bulldogs dropped two-of-three at Marshall this past weekend. Junior 1B **Cody Daigle** had five hits and four RBI in the final two games of the series and now has a team-best eight multiple hit games this season. Junior **Jordan Washam** had back-to-back games with two-RBI pinch hits on Friday and Saturday. Senior RHP **Adam Atkins** improved to 3-0 on the season by striking out four in 2.2 innings of relief in Saturday's 10-6 win. In 10 appearances this season, Atkins has a 1.02 ERA with 19 strikeouts and just five walks over 17.2 innings pitched.

MARSHALL

Marshall won its second straight Conference USA series, taking two-of-three vs. Louisiana Tech and are now tied for fourth place with a 5-4 league ledger. The Thundering Herd's 10-4 series-clinching win Sunday was powered by a career day for senior 2B **Aaron Bossi**, who became the first player under head coach **Jeff Waggoner**'s tenure to hit for the cycle. Even more impressive is that he did it in only six innings. Bossi had a single in the first, a triple in the second, a home run in the fifth and double to left field to complete the cycle in the sixth. Senior OF **DJ Gee** had his team-leading 12th multi-hit game for the Herd on Sunday. Junior 1B **Tommy Lane** has now reached base safely in 24 straight games. Midway through his first year with the Herd, Lane has a .327 batting average and leads the team with 8 homers and 22 RBI. His home run total is already more than any Herd player has hit in an entire season since Rhett Stafford blasted 10 long balls in 2011.

MIDDLE TENNESSEE

The Blue Raiders went 1-2 against Rice, posting a 3-0 victory in the series-opener on Friday night. Senior RHP **Nate Hoffmann** pitched a three-hit, complete game shutout against Rice, becoming the first Blue Raider to throw a complete-game shutout since Zac Curtis blanked FIU, May 9, 2014. Hoffmann improved to 2-0 in his career vs. the Owls. Middle Tennessee's starting pitchers posted a 1.61 ERA in 22-1/3 innings in the series vs. Rice. MT pitching posted 16 consecutive scoreless innings vs. Rice before the Owls scored on a sac fly in the top of the eighth for a 1-0 win in the Saturday game. The series was tied 1-1, despite Blue Raiders pitching allowing one run and just five hits in the first two games. Rice won the second game of the series with just two hits, both coming off of the bat of Charlie Warren, who scored the winning run after reaching on an infield hit. Junior SS **Riley Delgado** registered his team-leading 13th multi-hit game Sunday vs. Rice, going 2-for-4 with a double. Middle Tennessee is starting three freshmen in the everyday lineup – LF **Blake Benefield**, 3B **Drew Huff** and RF **Austin Dennis**.

OLD DOMINION

Old Dominion finished last week with a 1-3 record, posting the win over defending National Champion Virginia. The 5-4 come-from-behind win last Wednesday was the Monarchs fourth straight against UVA, ranked No. 14 at the time they played. That was ODU's second win over a nationally-ranked ACC school this season. Junior UT **Kurt Sinnen** notched five hits last week and drove in four runs in the series opener against Florida Atlantic. Sophomore SS **Zach Rutherford** hit safely in each game vs. FAU.

(25) RICE

The Owls are coming off a win of the weekend road series at Middle Tennessee, two-games-to-one. Rice has claimed each of the three C-USA series this season, and a total of seven-straight league series dating back almost a full calendar year. Senior LHP **Blake Fox** posted a win with 7.0 shutout innings against Middle Tennessee on Saturday (April 2). He scattered six singles and walked three while striking out five to help the Owls bounce back from a loss in the series-opener on Friday night. He held 30 batters faced to a composite .200 average in the game. With only one run of support from his teammates on the offensive side, Fox (along with **Glenn Otto**) had a solid game to make the margin stand. Senior 1B **Connor Teykl** paced the team at the plate last week, going a combined 4-for-10 to help the Blue & Gray register a 3-1 record. For the full season the Owls have been led by sophomore CF **Ryan Chandler**'s .333 average. Chandler owns nine games with two or more hits, and earlier maintained an 11-game hitting streak.

SOUTHERN MISS

Southern Miss registered its second consecutive league sweep, winning at Charlotte over the weekend. The Golden Eagles have now won 18 of their last 19 regular-season league games and their last six league series dating back to last season. The Golden Eagles collected 47 hits in the Charlotte series, including a season-best 17 hits in the series finale. The program has now won back-to-back 10-run rule affairs in the final game of its last two league series, winning both games in eight innings. Senior SS **Nick Dawson**, the team's No. 9 hitter, was 8-for-13 last week with three doubles and four RBI for a .615 week to raise his team-best batting average to .398. Southern Miss has now hit home runs in each of the last 12 games and have posted 39 on the season, including a team-best 10 from sophomore 3B **Taylor Braley**. Braley, who went deep twice in Friday's opener, is the first Southern Miss player to notch double-digit homers in a season since Blake Brown tallied 10 in 2013. Southern Miss plays its 10th and final game in a minor league ballpark this week when they take on Ole Miss at Trustmark Park in Pearl, Mississippi, on Tuesday night. The Golden Eagles are 5-4 in those contests.

UAB

The Blazers won the series-opener against WKU before dropping a pair of one-run contests in a pitching-dominated series over the weekend. UAB held the strong-hitting Hilltoppers to eight runs on 17 hits in the series, the majority of which came in Sunday's 6-5 extra-inning win. Sophomore LHP **Ryan Ruggles** tossed 8.1 innings of one-hit baseball in Saturday's 2-0 game one win, coming up just two outs shy of the complete-game shutout due to high pitch count. He had a stretch of 11 Toppers retired in a row and an error in the seventh and walk in the ninth represented the only two WKU batters to reach base beyond the third inning. Freshman OF **Brewer Hicklen** hit safely in all four games last week, driving in four runs in a win over Alabama A&M on March 29.

UTSA

The Roadrunners were 1-2 against FIU last weekend, opening the series with a 6-0 win Friday night for the team's first shutout this season. Senior RHP **Aaron Burns** (5.1 IP) picked up his third win of the season and junior RHP **Andrew Shewcraft** (3.2 IP) earned his first save in the combined shutout. Junior 3B **C.J. Pickering** was the team's top hitter over the weekend, registering four hits and driving in at least two hits in each game (seven total). Senior OF **Matt Hilston** hit safely and scored a run in all three games.

WKU

WKU claimed its second-consecutive conference series by taking the final two games at UAB. Pitching was again the theme for the second C-USA series win for the Hilltoppers, as all three starting pitchers had quality starts and allowed three or less runs. Senior RHP **Josh Bartley** pitched the longest outing of the year by a WKU pitcher by throwing 7.2 innings of shutout baseball to pick up his fourth win of the season in game two Saturday. It was the first time in Bartley's four-year career where he went seven-plus innings and did not allow a run. This performance was also the latest he had gone into a game since going eight innings against Louisiana-Monroe on May 3, 2014. In his last two starts, he is 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA to go along with eight strikeouts in 12.2 IP. Junior LHP **Ryan Thurston** followed Bartley with another solid start on Sunday, striking out six in 6.1 innings pitching. He is 1-0 with a 2.89 ERA and 14 strikeouts in conference play. Senior 3B **Danny Hudzina**, who leads the nation in hits, came through with the biggest hit of the weekend, a game-tying home run in the ninth inning to send the series finale into extras. Hudzina saw his hitting streak halted at 29 games in game one Saturday, which was the second-longest streak in school history, but has still reached base in 32-straight.

USM'S BRALEY NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF MONTH

The National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) has released its National Player of the Month awards for February and Southern Miss sophomore third baseman Taylor Braley was named National Hitter of the Month.

Braley has started the season on a tear, homering five times in Southern Miss' first seven games – two more blasts than he had in all of 2015 – and posting a seven-game hitting streak. He boasts a .480 batting average, 12 RBI and 10 runs, a 1.160 slugging percentage and a .618 on-base mark to lead the Golden Eagles to a perfect 7-0 start. He homered in each game to lead Southern Miss to a three-game sweep of Eastern Illinois on opening weekend and finished last weekend's series against Northwestern State with dingers in each of the last two contests.

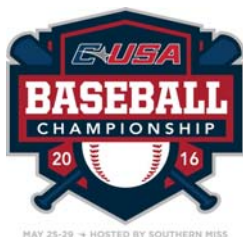

- Conference USA has been ranked as the No. 5 baseball conference in the RPI in seven of the past 10 seasons. It was the No. 8 ranked conference in 2015.
- C-USA has placed at least four teams in the NCAA Championship nine times in the past 14 years, producing five teams on two occasions. The league placed three teams in the 2015 NCAA field.
- Rice made its 21st consecutive NCAA Regional appearance in 2015, the fourth-longest active streak in the nation.
- Rice spent the entire 2015 season nationally ranked and was joined in nearly all of the regular season rankings by Florida Atlantic. Both schools were in the final top 25.
