HITTER OF THE WEEK

STEVEN KRAFT, WKU

Sophomore, OF, Gainesville, Virginia
 Moving to the cleanup spot for the first time in his career, Kraft responded with a huge weekend at the plate in WKU's sweep over UTSA. He went 8-for-13 with seven RBI, three runs, two walks, a home run and a double to lead the Hilltoppers to three wins. The Gainesville, Virginia, native posted a .615 batting average, a .667 on-base percentage and a whopping .923 slugging percentage. He started the series with a 3-for-4 game to go along with a career-high four RBI, two runs and his team-high fourth homer of the year, while also reaching base for the fourth time with a walk. Kraft followed that with a four-hit, three-RBI performance in game two.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK

JOSH MACIEJEWSKI, CHARLOTTE

Sophomore, LHP, Morrisville, N.C.
 Maciejewski put together a career afternoon on Sunday throwing a complete-game, one-hitter in a 5-0 win over Marshall. The Morrisville, North Carolina, native faced the minimum in six of his nine innings, retiring 12 in a row at one point and 21-of-22 during innings two through eight. The lone hit surrendered was a leadoff bunt single in the top of the first and a double play ball would help him get out of the inning. From there, Maciejewski was unhittable, including throwing 17 first-pitch strikes. His seven strikeouts were one shy of tying his career high, while his complete game and one hit allowed set new personal bests.

C-USA NOTEBOOK

CHARLOTTE

The 49ers dropped a series to Marshall this past weekend, two games to one. Junior OF T.J. **Nichting** extended his hitting streak to 16 games on Sunday. Nichting also recorded his league-leading 17th double of the season. Sophomore 2B **Brett Netzer** had a 15-game hitting streak snapped on Friday. He came back with three hits on Saturday and a big game Sunday, doubling, homering and driving in a career-high four runs. Netzer now has 102 hits in first 80 games as a 49er. Sophomore LHP **Josh Maciejewski** picked up his team-leading fourth victory with his complete-game, one-hitter on Saturday. His seven strikeouts extended his team-leading total to 51 on the season.

FIU

FIU won its first series against Florida Atlantic since 2011, notching a pair of one-run victories in the first two games. The Panthers rallied from six runs down to win the series opener, 7-6. Junior OF **Kenny Meimerstorf** had three hits and junior IF **Nick Day** had two hits and two RBI in the victory. Meimerstorf now has a team-best 16 multiple-hit games. In Saturday's 4-3 win, Day went 3-for-4, including his team-leading seventh home run of the season, and he scored the game-winning run. Sophomore OF **Jack Schaaf** has reached base safely in seven straight games. Junior RHP **Chris Mourelle** picked up his team-leading fifth victory of the year on Saturday, allowing two earned runs over eight innings and fanning four.

(17) FLORIDA ATLANTIC

Florida Atlantic's highlight of the week came on April 20 as the Owls knocked off No. 1 Miami in Coral Gables, 4-3, a contest in which FAU never trailed. FAU posted a pair of doubles and Stephen Kerr hit a solo home run on the night. Junior closer **Cameron Ragsdale** earned his 11th save of the year to move into second place in the nation. Sophomore RHP **David McKay** struck out five in his six innings of work, retiring the entire UM lineup in order in the early innings. After dropping a pair of one-run games at FIU, FAU came back full-force on Sunday, posting nine runs. The Owls scored in the first inning of each game of the series and senior OF **Billy Endris** scored in each contest. For the season, Florida Atlantic has outscored opponents 256-136 with 74 doubles, nine triples and 22 home runs. FAU has at least eight hits in 32 of its 38 games played, averaging 10.3 hits and 6.74 runs per game. The Owls have drawn a total of 13 RBI walks on the year.

LOUISIANA TECH

The Bulldogs won their fourth Conference USA series of the season, taking two-of-three from Old Dominion to improve to 10-8 on the season. The 10 wins in league play already matches their total from last season. LA Tech finished off the series with a 12-0 run-rule victory on Sunday. Junior OF **Sean Ullrich** led the way with his second three-hit game of the season and he also scored three times. Junior DH **Jonathan Washam** has now reached base safely in 16 straight games after posting two hits and two RBI in the win. Junior RHP **Casey Sutton** improved to 5-0 on the season after tossing six shutout innings on Sunday, striking out four and not walking a batter. Sutton's streak of consecutive scoreless innings pitched has now reached 20 innings and he has posted a 1.11 ERA in 40.2 innings pitched this season.

MARSHALL

The Thundering Herd took two-of-three games at Charlotte over the weekend. That marked Marshall's third series won on the road in Conference USA play this season. By taking two of three, Marshall ties the best 37-game start (21-16) since the 1988 season that was coached by Jack Cook. The 1988 team finished the season with a 23-17 record. Junior OF **Corey Bird** hit safely in all three games of the series to extend his hitting streak to eight games. Marshall's two-through-four hitters in the lineup combined for 13 of the Herd's 17 RBI over the weekend. Senior IF **Aaron Bossi** had back-to-back games with three RBI, while senior OF **DJ Gee** recorded two RBIs in consecutive games. Junior IF **Tommy Lane** notched his 10th home run of the season on Saturday and finished the day with three RBI. Senior RHP **Chase Boster** is tied for seventh place all-time in wins at Marshall with 15 after his victory at Charlotte on Friday.

MIDDLE TENNESSEE

The Blue Raiders dropped all three games at UAB over the weekend. Junior SS **Riley Delgado** has been named to the Brooks Wallace Shortstop of the Year Watch List. Delgado is among the Top 35 in four national categories, and Top 25 in three. Senior RHP **Nate Hoffmann** did not make his scheduled start at UAB Friday, marking the first time of his Blue Raider career to miss a start. MT starts four true freshmen – LF **Blake Benefield**, OF/2B **Austin Dennis**, 3B **Drew Huff**, and DH/P **AJ Spencer**. The Blue Raiders have two starting pitchers who have thrown complete-game shutouts this season: Hoffmann and sophomore LHP **Jake Wyrick**. The Blue Raiders have played the 43rd toughest schedule nationally, according to NCAA.com.

OLD DOMINION

The Monarchs went 1-2 at Louisiana Tech this past weekend. Senior CF **Connor Myers** has now hit safely in 11 consecutive games, while Junior SS **Zach Rutherford** had his nine-game hitting streak snapped on Sunday. Myers is one of two players in C-USA to lead their team in the triple-crown categories of batting average (.329), home runs (5) and RBI (30). In Saturday's 4-2 win, senior RHP **Victor Diaz** allowed one run on three hits

over six innings to earn his fifth win of the season. He has a team-low 2.06 ERA (third in C-USA) and has walked just 10 batters in 52 innings pitched. Freshman IF **Seth Woodard** hit his first two collegiate home runs in the same game on April 19, going deep twice at VMI.

(15) RICE

Rice is in second place in the C-USA standings to start the week after going 1-2 at Southern Miss, losing both games by a single run. The Owls' 13-5 C-USA record is a full game ahead of where the team was through 18 league games last season, and the squad's overall ledger (25-13) is two games ahead of where it was through the same point (38 games) in 2015. Team-leading hitter **Charlie Warren** returned from the injured list after having been sidelined with a hand injury since April 3. He pinch-ran against the Golden Eagles on Sunday where he scored the Owls' lone run of the game in the top of the eighth inning. True freshman IF **Ford Proctor** extended his career-best hitting streak to 18-consecutive games. Senior IF **Connor Teykl** went 5-for-10 in the Southern Miss series with two doubles. In Saturday's game at Southern Miss, leadoff batter **Ryan Chandler** clubbed the first home run of his two-year collegiate career.

(14) SOUTHERN MISS

Southern Miss won its first-ever three-game set over Rice in Hattiesburg in six tries and just the second overall in 11 series dating back to 2006, as the two teams played three one-run games at Pete Taylor Park over the weekend. It was the fewest runs scored (13) in a three-game C-USA series at Pete Taylor Park since the Golden Eagles and Memphis combined for just eight tallies from April 20-22, 2012. Southern Miss in now 5-2 in one-run games this season. Pete Taylor Park's sixth-largest crowd ever, and largest for a Conference USA game of 4,950, saw the league's top two teams battle Saturday. The three-day series drew 11,871 at the park over the weekend. Senior RHP **Cord Cockrell** stymied another league opponent, fanning six over 5.2 innings with no walks to improve to a league-leading 7-0 with his victory over Rice on Friday night. Sophomore IF **Daniel Keating**'s game-winning, pinch-hit single in the ninth in the series finale was the third time this season that the Golden Eagles won in their last at bat this season. Southern Miss has outscored league foes 13-2 in the ninth inning this season in C-USA games.

UAB

The Blazers claimed their third C-USA series of the season by taking three from Middle Tennessee, beginning with a Saturday doubleheader. In game one, UAB blew open a pitchers duel with 10 runs over the final four innings to post a 10-1 victory. Senior C **Mitch Williams** reached base three times, doubling and driving in three runs, while freshman OF **Brewer Hicklen** scored twice and had two RBI. In a 5-2 win in game two, sophomore LHP **Ryan Ruggles** earned his fifth victory in 6.2 innings of work, giving up just one run on four hits and striking out five. He lowered his season ERA to 2.72. Senior RHP **Thomas Lowery** entered in the seventh and threw the last 2.1 innings to register his seventh save. Five of those saves have come in league play. Freshman OF **Brewer Hicklen** went 4-for-4 with a run scored and freshman RHP **Kyle Davis** earned the win in his first career start, allowing one run in five innings to complete the sweep with an 8-0 win Sunday, the Blazers seventh shutout of the season. Freshman RHP **Tanner Graham** picked up his second win of the season and first in conference play in game one Saturday. He allowed just five hits through six innings with and his five strikeouts was a career high.

UTSA

UTSA dropped all three games at WKU over the weekend. Sophomore IF **Skyler Valentine** had multiple hits in all three games of the series, doubling at least once in each outing. He finished the weekend 6-13 (.462) with four doubles and scored five runs. Freshman IF **Bryan Arias** was 4-for-5 with a double, two RBI and a run scored on Saturday and followed that up by going 3-for-5 with an RBI on Sunday. Senior OF **Matt Hilston**, who hit his third home run of the season Saturday, drew three more walks in the series and now ranks fourth among the national leaders with 43 walks in 42 games.

WKU

WKU won four of five games last week, with a midweek victory over Belmont and a sweep at home against UTSA. With the sweep of the Roadrunners and of Middle Tennessee earlier this year, it became the first time since 2013 that the Hilltoppers swept two league opponents in the same year and first time since joining C-USA. The Tops notched 29 runs on 36 hits and mashed 11 extra-base hits on the weekend, with the hits and runs being the most in a C-USA series this season for WKU. Senior 3B **Danny Hudzina**, who was named to the Golden Spikes Award midseason list last week, has now reached base in 45-straight games. Sophomore OF **Kaleb Duckworth** also had a productive showing against UTSA, tallying eight RBI, seven hits, four runs, three doubles and a triple. He had three hits and four RBI in each of the final two games of the series to go along with four extra-base hits in those contests. Junior RHP **Kevin Elder** picked up a win and two saves in four appearances last week. He only allowed one earned run in 9.1 innings pitched (0.96 ERA) and struck out seven batters while allowing just two walks.
