LADY MONARCH MOMENTS:

- The Lady Monarchs defeated William & Mary, 63-47, last Sunday at the Ted Constant Convocation Center The game marked ODU's ninth straight win overall, 12th straight win against CAA competition, and 30th consecutive CAA home victory.
- The victory over William & Mary also gave Old Dominion an 8-0 record during the month of January.
- Sophomore Tiffany Green hauled in 15 rebounds to tie her career mark against the Tribe as the Lady Monarch registered a season-high 57 boards.
- The victory over William & Mary also gave Old Dominion an 8-0 record during the month of January.
- The Old Dominion defense kept CAA Preseason Player of the Year Kyra Kaylor to just two points. Coming off a career-high equaling 30 point night in Thursday's victory at Georgia State, Kaylor was held scoreless through the first half and didn't notch her first points until the 15:20 mark of the second half. Kaylor entered the game averaging 14.6 points per game and was ninth in the league in scoring.
- Senior Sherida Triggs captured her first double-double and 10th of her career with 14 points and 10 rebounds in last Thursday night's victory over the Rams. Triggs is the third Lady Monarch to perform a double-double this season joining sophomore Tiffany Green and junior Tay Ransburg.
- Junior T.J. Jordan poured in a game-high 20 points against Virginia Commonwealth to lead all scorers. It was Jordan's fifth 20+ point game and the 13th time this season she has led the team in scoring. She is currently third nationally in three-pointers made averaging 3.3 per game.

- Sophomore Jazzmin Walters continues to grow in her role as the Lady Monarchs starting point guard. The second year Lady Monarch dished out eight assists, tying both her career and season-high while committing only one turnover against VCU.

ABOUT OLD DOMINION:

The Old Dominion women's basketball team extended its win streak to nine as they closed out the season series with Virginia Commonwealth and met up with William & Mary for its first meeting of the year. Last Thursday, the Lady Monarchs defeated VCU, 84-62, handing the Rams a loss for the second time this season. It was neck-and-neck for much of the first half with 10 ties, seven lead changes, and neither team able to establish more than a three-point lead until the final minutes of the half. Junior guard T.J. Jordan tied the game for the 10th and final time at the 1:29 mark knotting the score at 27-27. Her lay-up began a 8-0 run, with six consecutive points coming from Jordan. Old Dominion entered the half ahead, 33-27. In the first five minutes of the second half, Old Dominion held the Rams without a field goal. The Rams pulled no closed than ten in the second half. Senior Sherida Triggs posted her first double-double of the year and 10th of her career with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Jordan led the troops with 20 points, the fifth time she has poured in 20 or more points this season. Senior Tish Lyons was the other Lady Monarch in double figures with 10 points. Sophomore Jazzmin Walters dished out eight assists, tying both her season and career high. On Sunday, the Lady Monarchs team kept CAA Preseason Player Kyra Kaylor in check, holding her to two points total, as they collected their ninth straight victory in a 63-47 win over William & Mary. The game opened with the Lady Monarchs holding the Tribe without a bucket for seven and half minutes as they raced out to a 15-0 lead. William & Mary didn't reach double figure until 2:51 left in the half. Old Dominion held a 31-18 lead at intermission. The Lady Monarchs led by as many as 18 in the second half. The Lady Monarchs hauled in a season-high 57 rebounds and were led by the 15-board effort by sophomore Tiffany Green and 10-board performance of junior Tay Ransburg. Green's 15 rebounds tied her career mark which also occurred Drexel on February 15, 2005. The defensive effort held William & Mary to just 28.6 percent (18-of-63) from the floor, the lowest an ODU opponent has shot this season. Old Dominion managed to outscored the Tribe bench, 31-2. Sophomore Jazzmin Walters poured in 12 points to lead the lady Monarchs. Senior Tish Lyons added in 10 from off the bench, along six assist to tie her career-high.

ABOUT JAMES MADISON:

The James Madison Dukes enter Thursday's contest with a 17-2 overall mark and perfect 9-0 CAA record. The Dukes cracked the Top 25 in the Associated Press Poll this week at No. 25. James Madison, who had received votes in the AP poll the last three weeks, moved into the Top 25 for the first time since the final poll of the 1987-88 season, when they were 14th. The Dukes have four netting double figures led by senior Meredith Alexis who is averaging 18.5 points and 11.7 points

per game. She is 32nd in scoring and sixth in rebounding in the country and leads the CAA in both categories. Junior Tamera Young is pouring in 17.0 points per game ranking fourth among her CAA peers. Senior Shirely McCall is adding 11.3 points per outing followed by senior Lesley Dickinson at 11.1 points per game.

SERIES WITH JAMES MADISON:

The Lady Monarchs have faced no other opponent as many times as they have the Dukes. Thursday's game will represent the 62nd meeting between Old Dominion and James Madison with the Lady Monarchs owning a 47-14 advantage in the all-time series. Five of those 14 James Madison victories have occurred during CAA competition with probably the most memorable Duke win being the 49-48 victory which snapped ODU's 113 game CAA win-streak. James Madison handed Old Dominion its only loss last season in conference competition, 75-68, but in the rematch during the CAA Tournament, the Lady Monarchs walked away with a 58-54 win for their 15th straight conference crown.

LAST TIME VS. JAMES MADISON:

The Old Dominion Lady Monarchs edged the James Madison Dukes 58-54 on March 11th, 2006 in a thrilling title game to capture their record 15th-consecutive CAA championship. T.J. Jordan led the victors with 13 points in the game and was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Performer. Former Lady Monarch Paula Muxiri added 11 to join Jordan on the All-Tournament team, and Lawona Davis scored all nine of her points in the second half to aid the Lady Monarchs. Tamera Young and Meredith Alexis were also named to the All-Tournament team, with Young notching 10 points and Alexis recording a double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Andrea Benvenuto added 10 points for the Dukes. It was a back-and-forth battle in a first half that included six ties and 11 lead changes, with James Madison eventually claiming the advantage at the break 29-26. Neither team led in the period by more than five points. The Dukes took advantage of 11 ODU turnovers and converted 13 of 15 free throws to build the three-point intermission lead. Young led JMU with 10 points at the half, while Alexis contributed eight and five rebounds. Old Dominion held tight after receiving half of its points from the bench in the period, with Muxiri scoring six and Shahida Williams netting five. Jordan pitched in eight. Old Dominion jumped out of the gates in the second half with six quick points to claim a 32-29 lead, and continued on an 20-9 run in the first ten minutes to make it 46-38. That was as large as the lead would get, however, as James Madison battled back to cut it to three, 52-49, on a fast break layup by Benvenuto with 3:20 to go. The Dukes' defense then held strong on the next posses-

sion and forced an ODU shot clock violation to gain the ball back. Kisha Stokes gathered and offensive rebound and put it back in at 2:33. She was fouled on the play and converted the free throw to tie the score at 52. Muxiri answered with a three-pointer a minute later to regain a three-point lead for ODU. On the next trip down the court, the Dukes' shot clock was down to one second when Andrea Benvenuto was fouled by Muxiri when attempting a three-pointer of her own. She only made two of the three fouls shots, however, and the score was 55-54 in ODU's favor with 58 seconds to play. The Lady Monarchs' Shantel Wilson then committed a turnover with 35 seconds on the clock and JMU called a timeout. Jasmin Lawrence drove the lane in similar fashion to Friday's game-winning shot, but missed the layup and the ball deflected out of bounds to ODU. JMU's Shirley McCall fouled Davis on the inbounds pass with 7.2 seconds remaining. Davis made the first free throw to make it 56-54, but missed the second. Sherida Triggs was there to gather the carom, and was immediately fouled and sent to the line. She hit both shots to ice the championship, 58-54.

FIRST TEAM TARGETS:

Coming off a career-high equaling 30 point night in a win at Georgia State, Kaylor was held scoreless through the first half and didn't notch her first points until the 15:20 mark of the second half. Kaylor entered the game averaging 14.6 points per game and was ninth in the league in scoring.

CRASH:

Old Dominion hauled in a season-high 57 rebounds in its last game, a 63-47 win over William & Mary Sunday afternoon. Sophomore Tiffany Green hauled in 15 rebounds to tie her career mark.

STARTING FIVE:

With the Lady Monarch roster as deep as it is in recent memory, its hard to pick just which Lady Monarch will get the starting nod. Through nineteen games, nine different starting combos have been used with Sherida Triggs being the only Lady Monarch to have started every single game. The line-up of Triggs, Tay Ransburg, Shahida Williams, T.J. Jordan, and Jazzmin Walters have started the last nine games going 9-1 with wins over Rutgers, VCU, Drexel, Georgia State, Hofstra, George Mason, and William & Mary.

HOME SWEET HOME:

Since the doors opened at the Ted Constant Convocation Center in 2002, the Lady Monarchs have enjoyed a 61-12 record.

RANK 'EM UP:

Old Dominion got its first win in seven attempts over a team either ranked for receiving votes in the AP or USA Today Poll with a 72-55 win over Rutgers and followed with a 74-59 victory over CAA rival Hofstra. Tennessee marked the third ranked team, and second in the Top Five, the Lady Monarchs faced this season. The Lady Monarchs have already faced Kentucky, falling to a #21 (AP)/24 (ESPN/USA Today) Wildcat squad 55-69 in their home opener back on November 18th, fell 40-89 to #5 Duke on their home court on November 30th, and was defeated by #5 Tennessee 59-75, although the game was tied with just 1:31 left in the first half. Virginia, Penn State, and Middle Tennessee along CAA rivals Hofstra and

Delaware have also been seen in the "receiving votes" categories in both polls. Old Dominion fell 72-92 at Virginia in the season opener, lost at Penn State, 77-80, despite overcoming a 20-point second half deficit, and was edged out 71-86 by Middle Tennessee. Still up for the Lady Monarchs on the poll front is Delaware, who comes to the Constant Center on February 11th.

LOOKING AT THE BENCH:

Since beginning CAA action on January 4th, the Lady Monarch bench has been producing three times the amount as the opponent bench. Through seven conference games, ODU's bench has collected 188 points as compared to their opponent's 63. Against Georgia State, ODU outscored the Lady Panther bench, 32-6, and outscored Hofstra's bench 24-4 the following game.

DISH IT TO ME:

Sophomore Jazzmin Walters continues to grow in her role as the Lady Monarchs starting point guard. The second year Lady Monarch dished out eight assists, tying both her career and season-high while committing only one turnover against Virginia Commonwealth on January 25th. Additionally she tied her season and career high with four steals. Walters needs five more assists to crack the top 10 sophomore assist leaders list. She currently has 74.

THE MOST WE'VE SCORED:

Old Dominion scored over 80 points in back-to-back games in late January. The 84 points collected in last Thursday's victory over Virginia Commonwealth were the most scored by the team this season, surpassing the previous high of 83 points collected in the previous Sunday's win at Drexel. The Lady Monarchs have reached the 80-point three times this season. They first collected 80 points in an 81-70 CAA opening win at Virginia Commonwealth back on January 4th.

HOT HANDS:

Old Dominion shot a season-high 52.9 percent (27-of-51) against Hofstra on January 14th, only the third time the Lady Monarchs have shot over 50 percent from the field this season.

THE 500 CLUB:

With the 77-38 win over Chicago State on December 9th, Old Dominion head coach Wendy Larry became the 30th all-time Division I coach and 23rd active Division I coach to reach the 500-victory milestone. In 23 years as a head coach, she has compiled a 508-189 mark. Now in her 20th season at the helm of the Old Dominion program, Larry holds a 459-158 mark at her alma mater. Coach Larry just recently captured her 450th victory as the head coach at her alma mater with a 57-46 win over Delaware State on November 25.

Wendy Larry Win Timeline:

FROM DOWNTOWN:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan is third in the country in three-point field goals made with 3.3 per game and is 74th in three-point field goal percentage at .365. She has 902 career points which puts on track to reach 1,000 points in about seven games (or so). She has 62 three-point field goals this season and 202 for her career. Aubrey Eblin holds the school record in both categories with 97 treys made during the 1997-98 season and 250 made during her career.

TALE OF THE TURNOVER:

Old Dominion is working on cutting down on its turnovers, but in the season series against Drexel, the Lady Monarchs forced the turnovers. The Dragons committed 30 miscues leading to 26 Lady Monarch points in the 70-45 first meeting in Norfolk and then committed another 30 against ODU in the 83-51 meeting in Philadelphia resulting in 46 Lady Monarch points. The 30 turnovers are the most committed by a Lady Monarch opponent this season. ODU followed the first Dragon meeting by collecting 31 points off of 25 Georgia State miscues the following game.

ON THE GLASS:

Although junior Tay Ransburg was held to only two points, both from the line, she hauled in a nine boards as Old Dominion outrebounded Georgia State, 47-31, on January 11th. She followed that performance with her first double-double as a Lady Monarch netting 13 points and grabbing a season-high 12 rebounds. She helped Old Dominion win the battle of the boards against the Pride, 40-36, after the Lady Monarchs were outrebounded in the first half, 23-15.

HALFTIME HIGHS & LOWS:

Old Dominion held a 34-16 first half advantage against Georgia State marking the lowest scoring output by a Lady Monarch opponent this season. The 18-point ODU halftime lead also tied the Lady Monarchs largest halftime lead this year. Old Dominion also held an 18-point, 35-17 advantage over Chicago State in head coach Wendy Larry's 500th career victory over Chicago State back on December 9th. Additionally, the Lady Panthers tied its season low for scoring in a half with its 16 points.

T.J. FOR THREE....:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan tied her career mark as she took seven three-points in the first meeting against Virginia Commonwealth en route to a season-high 25 points. Six of her treys came in the first half. She also achieved the same number at Delaware (2/11/05) and at George Mason (2/10/06). It was against the Fightin' Blue Hens she collected her career-high - 28 points.

FROM THE LINE:

Old Dominion, who struggled early this season from the line, has definitely shown signs of improvement. The Lady Monarchs had two of their best games from the free throw line this season against Drexel in both in the CAA home opener against Drexel on January 7th and the second meeting on January 21st. In the second meeting, Old Dominion shot a season-high 76.2 percent going 16-of-21. In the second half, the Lady Monarchs went 13-of-16 shooting 81.3 percent making their first eight attempts. In the first meeting with the Dragons, ODU hit 76.0 percent. The Lady Monarchs got to the line 25 times, making 19 shots against the Dragons. They shot 84.6 in the second half, hitting 11-of-13 from the charity stripe. Three Lady Monarchs went perfect at the line, including junior T.J. Jordan who went a perfect 5-of-5. Old Dominion also had a hot hand at the free throw line in the second half of the January 14th contest against Hofstra. In that half, the Lady Monarchs shot 91.7 percent hitting 11-of-12 from the stripe. Focused effort at the charity stripe also came in handy at the end of last Thursday's game against Virginia Commonwealth. Old Dominion outscored the Rams over the final 2:30, 14-2, as the Lady Monarchs went 11-of-11 from the line.

HEAR ME ROAR:

Senior Tish Lyons started the year's first eight games, but for the last seven games has come off the bench. As a starter she only averaged 7.3 points and 2.8 rebounds a game but from coming off the bench beginning with the contest at Middle Tennessee State, Lyons averaged 9.8 points and 2.9 rebounds per game. Against Rutgers and in the CAA opener at Virginia Commonwealth, she poured in a season-high 14 points and also dished out a career-high six assists against the Rams.

ONE FOR THE ROAD:

After beginning the season 0-5 away from the friendly confines of the Ted Constant Convocation Center, the Lady Monarchs earned its first road win with an 81-70 victory over Virginia Commonwealth at the Siegel Center in Richmond on January 4th.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE:

Three Lady Monarchs have double-doubles under their belt. Redshirt sophomore Tiffany Green became the first Lady Monarch to perform a double-double this season with a 17-point, 12-rebound effort against Chicago State on Dec. 9th. She followed with her second double-double in the following game with 11 points and 10 rebounds on Dec. 17 at Charlotte. Junior Tay Ransburg 13 points and 12 rebounds on Jan. 11 against Georgia State for her first double point and rebounding effort as a Lady Monarch. Senior Sherida Triggs had 14 points and 10 boards in the series finale with VCU on Jan. 25th for her first double of the year and 10th of her career.

ENDING AND BEGINNING WITH RUTGERS:

Last season, guard Jen Nuzzo's season ended right before ODU's match-up at Rutgers with a stress fracture in her leg. This season, Nuzzo had a coming out party of sorts against the Scarlet Knights. Nuzzo served as a spark plug off the bench as the Lady Monarchs were down by 12 points in the first half. She ended the game with five points, two assists, three rebounds, and a steal in 16 minutes of action in what has been perhaps her best effort to date.

KEEPING THE BALL:

Old Dominion's 32 turnovers at Charlotte and 29 turnovers at Middle Tennessee certainly aren't numbers it would like to see on the stat sheet again this season. The good news is those were not school records. The most turnovers in a game in Lady Monarch history was 37. That happen twice - against Kansas on January 20, 1978 and against Tennessee on January 13, 1994.

STREAKING:

The Charlotte 49ers won their 15th straight home contests dating back to last season with its 68-64 win over Old Dominion on December 17th. The streak began right after Old Dominion beat the 49ers 79-69 back on December 18th, 2005. The Lady Monarchs certainly know about streaks. Old Dominion held a 115 game CAA win streak from 1992 to 2001 and currently have a 44 game CAA Tournament win streak with 15 straight CAA titles. Additionally, Old Dominion had a 64 home game win streak at the old ODU Fieldhouse from 1976 to 1981. Also the Lady Monarchs had a 122 game CAA home win streak from 1992 until 2005.

BOARDING:

The Lady Monarchs have collected a season-high 27 board rebounding margin. Old Dominion collected 56 rebounds against both Charlotte and Chicago State while holding both teams to just 29 boards.

WELCOME BACK:

Earlier this season, Old Dominion welcomed back former Lady Monarch Angela Jackson, the head coach of the Chicago State Cougars. Jackson was a member of the Lady Monarchs in 1989 and 1990, helping the Old Dominion women's basketball team to two second round appearances in the NCAA. As a senior in 1990, she was named First Team All-Sun Belt averaging a team second best 16.6 points per game. Additionally in 1990, Jackson led the Lady Monarchs with 4.1 assists per game (126 total) and is tied with Sharese Grant on the senior all-time assist leaders list. As a junior, she poured in 513 points to rank sixth on the junior all-time scoring leaders list.

FORMER LADY MONARCHS IN THE COACHING RANKS:

Former Lady Monarchs Wendy Larry ('77) Angela Jackson ('90) aren't the only Lady Monarch to have gone from player to coach. Chris Critelli ('80) - head coach Brock University in Canada, Maura McHugh ('75) - head coach Stony Brook, Anne Donovan ('83) - head coach WNBA's Seattle Storm & US Senior National Team, Rhonda Rompolo ('81) - head coach Southern Methodist, Kim McQuarter ('88) - head coach Malcolm X Junior College, Regina Miller ('84) - head coach UNLV, Inge Nissen ('80) - Co-Head Coach Florida International, Cindy Russo ('75) - Co-Head Coach Florida International, Aubrey Eblin ('99) - assistant coach University of San Diego.

WELCOME BACK MARIANNE:

Another familiar face returned to Norfolk when Rutgers visited. Scarlet Knight assistant coach Marianne Stanley was at the helm of the Lady Monarch program from 1977-1987 leading Old Dominion to three national titles (1979 - AIAW, 1980 - AIAW, 1985 - NCAA) and

coaching legends Nancy Lieberman, Inge Nissen, Anne Donovan, and Tracy Claxton. Coming to ODU in 1977, Stanley became one of the youngest Division I head coach in the country at the age of 23. By the time she left, she built the Lady Monarchs into one of the nation's premiere programs posting a 269-59 (.820) record.

JUST LIKE MIKE:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan has led the team in scoring in all but six games this season - at #5 Duke, at Middle Tennessee, vs. #5 Tennessee, vs. Rutgers, vs. Georgia State, vs. William & Mary. At Charlotte, Jordan collected her first career double-double with 16-points and a career-high 10 rebounds. Additionally she set a new career mark with 22 field goals attempted.

D-D-D-DEFENSE:

In their 57-46 win over Delaware State, the Lady Monarchs held the Hornets to 29.0 percent (18-of-62) from the floor, the lowest percentage by an ODU opponent this season.

HOW LOW CAN YOU GO?:

The 38 points scored by Chicago State were the fewest points collected by an ODU opponent since the Lady Monarchs' 85-33 win over William & Mary on February 26, 2006.

THE DUNKS:

Tennessee's Candace Parker didn't dunk against the Lady Monarchs in their meeting, but ODU's homecourt will always be a special place for Parker. The Lady Vols played its first and second round games of the NCAA Tournament at the Ted Constant Convocation Center in 2006 enroute to the Elite Eight. It was during their first round game vs. Army that Parker collected her first dunk (and would dunk again). It was the first dunk in a women's game during NCAA Tournament action and the first time a woman dunked twice in a game.

NOT SEEN VERY OFTEN:

In a rare occurrence, the opposition outrebounded Old Dominion in a victory. The East Carolina Pirates held a 45-33 advantage on the boards, which included holding the Lady Monarchs to just seven offensive rebounds. The Lady Monarchs were outrebounded in only nine of its 31 games last year and none by double digits. Five of the nine times Old Dominion was outrebounded resulted in a loss for the Lady Monarchs. In six of those nine occasions, the opponent outboarded Old Dominion by four rebounds or less. Florida International and James Madison, in the first meeting of the year, both held an eight board advantage over Old Dominion, the most of the season.

CAA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

T.J. Jordan:

01/08/07: Jordan averaged 21.5 points per game last week as she led the Lady Monarchs to their first two conference victories of the season. The third year Lady Monarch poured in a season-high 25 points against Virginia Commonwealth in ODU's CAA opener last Thursday. It was the fourth time this season she has scored 20 or more points in a game. She also shot a blistering 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from the floor, including a career-tying seven three-pointers. She was just two treys shy of tying the school record. Jordan followed with a game-high 18 points in the win over Drexel last Sunday in ODU's first home CAA win of the 2006-07 season. Against the Dragons she shot a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line, the fifth time Jordan has gone perfect from the charity stripe.

LESSON LEARNED - ON TO THE FUTURE:

Old Dominion has already put it 40-89 loss to #5 Duke behind them. The Lady Monarchs' 11 first half points tied the school record for fewest points scored in a half with the original record set back in December of 1972 with 11 second half points in a 23-12 victory over James Madison. The Lady Monarchs scored only 12 points in the first half of that game. Additionally, Old Dominion shot a low of 25.0 percent (13-of-52) from the floor, its lowest since shooting 26.0 percent (17-of-65) against Virginia in 1975. Old Dominion didn't repeat its poor performance when it came out in its next game against Penn State and shot 46.9 percent (30-of-64) against the Lady Lions.

SO WE MEET FOR THE FIRST TIME:

When you look at the Old Dominion Lady Monarch schedule, you can always count on familiar teams such as Tennessee, Rutgers, and Penn State along with various other teams they play on again and off again. Three teams grace this years schedule who the Lady Monarchs have never met. First up is Delaware State, who the Lady Monarchs handed a 57-46 loss at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. ODU also had a 77-38. win over Chicago State in its first meeting with the Cougars. Old Dominion also took on Middle Tennessee for the first time in school history, falling 71-86 to the Blue Raiders in Murfreesboro.

KEEP SHOOTING PARTNER:

Junior guard T.J. Jordan came off the bench in the 72-92 season opening loss at Virginia to net a team-high 21 points. Shooting 6-of-19 from the field, including 6-of-17 from three-point range, the third year Lady Monarch set new career-highs in field goals and three-pointers attempted. Against Penn State, the third year Lady Monarch reset her field goal attempt high by launching 20 shots from the floor and finishing with a season-high 24 points, her second 20+ point effort of the season. Jordan set a new season mark hitting eight field goals against Chicago State, just one shy of her career high. Against Charlotte, Jordan reset her field goal attempts mark for the third time this season taking 22 shots. The Lady Monarchs' three-point specialist, she holds the single season three-point attempt mark (2005-06 - 248).

0-2...SO WHAT?:

The Lady Monarchs may have started the 2006-07 season 0-2, but that's no reason to think the sky is falling. Last season, Old Dominion opened the season 0-2 and finished the year with a 22-9 overall mark and their 15th straight CAA title. The 2003-04 Lady Monarchs opened 0-2 and picked up ranked wins over #7 Penn State and #12/13 North Carolina. They finished 25-7 along with the CAA title. The 2002-03 Lady Monarchs opened 0-3 but managed a 20 win season going 21-9 with a CAA title. The 2000-01 season saw Old Dominion go 0-2 and also finished with a 21-9 mark and a CAA title. The 1992-93 women's team started the year off 0-4, but ended the year 22-8 overall, with yes...another CAA title and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

OPEN THE DOOR:

The Lady Monarch women's basketball team helped the Virginia Cavaliers open their new building - The John Paul Jones Arena - in ODU's first regular season contest on Saturday, November 12th. It was Virginia back on November 22nd, 2002 that helped Old Dominion open the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

BREAKING DOWN THE OPENERS:

The Lady Monarchs are 25-13 in season openers, suffering a 72-92 set back in this year's opener at Virginia. Of the previous 38 season openers, Old Dominion has opened the season three times with Virginia with a win in 1977, a loss in 2002 with the opening of ODU's Ted Constant Convocation Center, and a loss in 2006 at the opening of UVA's John Paul Jones Arena. In home openers, the Lady Monarchs are 27-11 including a 2-3 mark at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. Old Dominion fell to #21/24 Kentucky in its 2006-07 home debut, 55-69.

STREET & SMITH:

Street and Smith Magazine has listed the Old Dominion women's basketball team at No. 18 in its in their annual College Basketball Yearbook which went on sale on Oct. 1. Included on this year's schedule are five teams also appearing in Street and Smith's list including No. 5 Tennessee, No. 7 Duke, No. 14 Rutgers, No. 15 Kentucky and No. 20 Virginia.

BACK TO THE POLLS:

The Lady Monarchs received votes in both the Preseason Associated Press and WBCA/USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll. The Lady Monarchs have received votes over the last few seasons and are looking to return to the Top 25 in both polls. Old Dominion's last Top 25 ranking in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll was November 18th, 2003. Old Dominion's last appearance in the Associated Press Top 25 was the final poll of the 2002 season as the Lady Monarchs danced their way to the "Elite Eight".

WHAT THE LADY MONARCHS WELCOME BACK:

The Old Dominion women's basketball team welcomes back four starters and nine letter-winners from last year's team that went 22-9 overall and captured its 15th consecutive Colonial Athletic Association title. Seventy two percent of the offense returns including four of the five leading scorers and three of the four leading rebounders from a season ago. This year's group of seniors - Tish Lyons, Sherida Triggs, Shantel Wilson - enter the 2006-07 season having collected three CAA titles, three NCAA appearances, a 69-25 overall record and 49-5 mark in CAA matchups. Triggs joins junior guard T.J. Jordan on the Preseason Second Team All-CAA list. Triggs led the CAA in field goal percentage, was second on the ODU squad in scoring, and led the Lady Monarch rebounding corps. Jordan led the team in scoring and reset the single season three-point attempt record.

UP NEXT:

The Lady Monarchs have two more games in their three-game road swing. Old Dominion heads to Hofstra on Sunday, February 4th to close out the season series with the Pride and then heads to Northeastern on Thursday, February 8th. It will be the first trip to the Huskies' home floor of Solomon Court in Boston.

COLONIAL DOMINANCE: Old Dominion has captured 15-straight Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles since joining the league from the Sun Belt Conference during the 1991-92 season. The Lady Monarchs are in the NCAA record books for capturing the most consecutive conference championships. In league play, Old Dominion holds a 279-15 overall record, which includes eight seasons of undefeated play. The Lady Monarchs hold a 148-2 record at home and a 131-13 road record. Only two CAA losses have occurred on Old Dominion's homecourt. The first was back at the ODU Fieldhouse, the former Lady Monarch homecourt from 1969-2002, against Richmond, now of the Atlantic-10, with a 70-74 defeat on February 19, 1992 and the second versus Delaware with a 70-73 setback on January 9, 2005. Five schools in the league have yet to beat the Lady Monarchs - Georgia State (3-0), George Mason (40-0), Northeastern (2-0), UNC-Wilmington (33-0), and Towson (9-0).

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. -- The Old Dominion basketball team opened Sunday afternoon's game on an 11-0 run and never looked back as they won their seventh straight in an 83-51 victory over the Drexel Dragons at the Daskalakis Athletic Center.

Old Dominion swept the season series with the Dragons after taking the previous meeting back on January 7th, 70-45. The 83 points are the most netted by the Lady Monarchs this season and the team also collected a season-high 22 steals. Additionally, the Dragons turned the ball over 30 times for the second time against the Lady Monarchs this season which resulted in 46 Old Dominion points.

The win improves Old Dominion to 10-7 overall and 6-0 in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). Drexel meanwhile falls to 5-13 and winless in the CAA at 0-7.

Although it took three minutes for a team to score, the outcome was never in doubt as Old Dominion rattled off 11 unanswered points to start the game. The Dragons were held to only six field goals in the opening half and didn't manage to score until the 14:58 mark. The Lady Monarchs held as much as a 21-point lead late in the half en route to a 37-18 advantage. It was the fourth time this year Old Dominion has held an opponent to under 20 at the half and the third time against an opponent from the CAA.

Drexel never got closer than 16 in the second half. After Old Dominion established a 25-point, 51-26 lead, the Dragons went on a 9-0 to cut it to 16. Dragon leading scorer Gabriela Marginean capped the run hitting one of two free throws as Drexel trailed, 51-35, with 12:11 remaining.

From there, Old Dominion took a run of its own. The Lady Monarchs rattled off 11 straight points to bump its lead to 31 points. Junior Tay Ransburg (Kansas City, Mo.) kicked off the run collecting seven points during the spurt and was capped by freshman Jessica Canady (Williamsburg, Va.) putting the ball up and in for a 66-35 ODU edge with 9:06 left. Sophomore Jazzmin Walters (Norfolk, Va.) dropped in two free throws two and a half minutes later to put Old Dominion ahead by at least 30 the rest of the way.

Three Lady Monarchs were in double figures led by junior T.J. Jordan (Portsmouth, Va.) with 18 points. Senior Tish Lyons (Newport News, Va.) poured in 13 from off the bench, while Ransburg dropped in 12. Senior Sherida Triggs (Norcross, Ga.) led Old Dominion on the boards with seven.

Drexel's Gabriela Marginean led her team with 15 points and seven rebounds. Narissa Suber added in 14 points while committing nine turnovers.

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion women's basketball captured another series sweep as they scored a season-high in points with its 84-62 victory over Virginia Commonwealth Thursday night at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

The Lady Monarchs, who won their first meeting 81-70 in Richmond back on January 4th, improve to 11-7 overall and 7-0 in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) having won their last eight games. Old Dominion and James Madison are the only teams left with an unblemished conference mark as the Dukes defeated Delaware this evening in Harrisonburg.
