### ODU AND GEORGIA STATE TO MEET FOR FINAL TIME

Georgia State's women's team will head to Norfolk for a final time in hopes of leaving on a high note like the GSU men's team did on Saturday with a win. But, it is a usual tall order to win in Norfolk with ODU's rich history.

Old Dominion (12-5) has won three of its five CAA games, starting with a 72-66 win in Atlanta on Jan. 2 and most recently with an 83-72 loss at Hofstra Sunday.

GSU heads off to the Sun Belt for its football at FBS next year and ODU joins the Conference USA teams with its football program.

Memories of the Jan. 2 ODU-GSU game probably still give GSU head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener nightmares as the Panthers had a 20-point lead at 50-30 with 13 minutes to play and an 11-point lead with 8 and a half minutes. It was a one-point game with 47.8 seconds left when ODU's basket with 23 seconds made it a three-point game.

### DEFENSE HAS BEEN KEY TO GEORGIA STATE WINS

Georgia State's 9-7 start is primarily a credit to the defensive efforts. This season is only the seventh time of the Panthers' 38-season history that they had started by winning 8 of its first 10 games.

GSU's defense has held eight of the 16 opponents under 50 points this season and allow just 58 points a game despite forcing an up-tempo, fast-paced game.

If one wants to know primarily why GSU is winning, just look at the national NCAA rankings of the 345 Division I teams on Monday, Jan. 21 and one will see the impact the Panthers' aggressiveness is having:

- No. 16 in the NCAA in 3-point field goal defense (.254)
- No. 32 in the NCAA in all field goal defense (.346)
- No. 62 in the NCAA in blocked shots per game (4.3)
- No. 64 in the NCAA in rebound margin (+4.6)
- No. 75 in the NCAA in steals per game (10.5)
- No. 99 in the NCAA in points allowed (58.3)

## COACH SHARON BALDWIN-TENER

Sharon Baldwin-Tener, named GSU's head coach in April of 2010, has known how to win as both a collegiate player and collegiate coach.



Now in her third season at GSU, the recruiting has shown some pieces are in place for a solid future.

She picked up her 200th career win as a head coach on Dec. 29, 2010 vs. Mississippi Valley State (91-65) and guided GSU to the 500th all-time win in school history on Jan. 9, 2011 in a win over Hofstra (84-70)

In eight years, she turned the East Carolina women's basketball program around, winning 126 games, while earning post-season bids to the NCAA and WNIT tournaments. The Lady Pirates of ECU won the C-USA Tournament in 2007.

Atlanta is a homecoming for Baldwin-Tener as she played her prep ball in Smyrna and her college ball at both Kennesaw State and the University of Georgia. She was an assistant coach at Georgia and a head coach at Life University in Marietta

Those eight years at ECU followed her 2001-02 season as the Atlantic Sun Conference Coach of the Year honor in her only season at Mercer University in Macon.

She first gained notice as the NAIA National Coach of the Year at Life University, where she began that program with a final No. 7 ranking in its first year and produced a team ranked No. 1 in the national polls in her second season (2001). Her assistant coaching career was highlighted by being named the Naismith National Assistant Coach of the Year (1997) while she was in her seventh and final year at the University of Georgia under head coach Andy Landers. Baldwin-Tener enjoyed a successful playing career at both the high school and collegiate levels. At Wills High School (merged with Campbell High) in Smyrna, Ga., she averaged 21 points per contest as a senior and was named the 1985 Georgia Class 4A State Player-of-the-Year.

Baldwin-Tener earned a bachelor's degree from Georgia in 1991 and completed her master's of education in 1997, also at Georgia. She and her husband, Matt, have two children: Luke (8, Feb. 4, 2004) and Samantha (7, Oct. 28, 2005).

## GEORGIA STATE-OLD DOMINION SERIES HISTORY

Old Dominion won last year's games 68-59 and 71-60 and then this year's Jan. 2 game in the 72-66 comeback win. Georgia State's only win came in Atlanta on Jan. 29, 2009 by a 75-62 margin.

### A QUICK LOOK AT OLD DOMINION

Located in Norfolk, Va., Old Dominion is under the guidance of second-year head coach Karen Barefoot, a former ODU assistant. Barefoot has already passed last year's win total (11-21) in her first year at the helm. She replaced legendary Wendy Larry, who abruptly resigned in May of 2011 after 24 years and 559 wins. ODU won 17 straight conference titles and NCAA bids under Coach Larry.

The Monarchs have used their defensive pressure to force turnovers and their bench to stay fresh. A pair of freshmen have earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors coming in as reserves.

### FIRST HALF STARTS ARE BIG KEY TO SUCCESS

Georgia State has started strong from the opening tip to get the tempo the way it likes and get a lead:

- UCF – 4-0, 17-3, 31-13, 39-24 at halftime (+15)
- JSU – 13-2, 20-5, 30-10 and 43-28 at halftime (+15)
- Ga Southern – 4-0, 14-4, 22-7 and 34-18 at half (+16)
- Fla. A&M – 8-0, 16-3, 32-12 and 41-18 at halftime (+23)
- Kennesaw - 7-0, 11-2, 16-6, 33-12, 33-15 at halftime (+18)
- Morehead - 13-2, 24-8, and 28-17 at halftime (+11)
- Western Carolina - 9-2, 20-12, 30-18 and 34-19 half (+15)
- Old Dominion - 8-1, 28-18, 35-24 half (+11)
- Towson - 6-0. 16-8, 22-20 half (+2)

In the two road losses at Florida and Belmont, GSU trailed at the half by 12 at UF 11 at Belmont. GSU led Toledo by 2 at the half after 4 ties, but Toledo won by 3. GSU led ODU by 11 at half, but ODU rallied for a remarkable win. GSU led Hofstra by 5 in first half, but trailed by 17 in second and rallied to have chance to win with three final shots in the last minute and a half of the game.

### BALANCE HAS BEEN AN ASSET

Georgia State has used all 10 players who dress out on a regular basis throughout the season.

- **All 10 have played 193 or more minutes** and all averaged more than 12.9 minutes a game.
- All 10 have scored at least 9 or more points in a game.
- **Eight of the 10 have scored in double figures**, four different ones have scored 15 or more points in a game.
- Four different players already have had a double-figure rebound game.
- Eight of the 10 are averaging 4.2 or more points a game. All 10 have scored 43 or more on the season.
- **Nine of the 10 have 5 or more assists; All 10 have already blocked a shot.**

## GEORGIA STATE GAME NOTES

### PAULK'S SWAT MARKS

Senior center Cody Paulk worked her way toward the top of the GSU all-time list for blocked shots.

**With 175 blocks she owns the school mark that had stood for 16 years. She has moved into the Top 10 in CAA all-time history. She is tied for 9th and needs just one to tie for 8th in CAA history.**

She is the only GSU player to have two 50-plus block seasons and will be looking for make that three in a row as well.

The Alabama native has blocked 6 shots in a game five times, including two games this season. She has blocked 5 shots in a game four times, making it 10 games with 5 or more blocks. The school game record is 11, with a game of 8 and two players with games of 7 blocks.

Paulk has 25 career games in double-figure scoring, including a pair of CAA games over 20 points (VCU and Towson).

As a rebounder, she has six double-figure games and 10 games with nine or more rebounds. She's closing in on her 500th career rebound (435 and counting). She needs 6 points for 600 in her career.

With 107 steals on defense, she has reached that 100 miletstone.

She is a Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-District honoree as a chemistry major and math minor. She has been the CAA Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Junior Kendra Long has a great name for being an outstanding three-point shooter.

In her first two years at GSU, she has become the only player in school history with two 50 or more three-point baskets made seasons.

Her 134 made has already moved her into a tie for second place on the school's all-time list.

The Atlanta native needs 20 more to tie the existing school career mark set just five years ago.

Long has made five three-point shots in a game four times and is obviously a marked target for opposing defenses.

She has 35 double-figure scoring games, including 11 games this season.

GSU also then won its first-ever home game with a win over Troy.

**LARGE LEADS MAKE EASY FINISHES**

This season, the Panthers have gotten the big halftime leads and extended the leads into insurmountable advantages. In seven of the 12 games, GSU has led by 20 or more points during the game:

**CRASHING THE BOARDS**

GSU has held a rebound advantage in 11 of its 16 games this year.

The Panthers have 681 rebounds to the opponents 608 for a +73 (+4.6) per game.

GSU also has 229 offensive rebounds, an average of 14.3 per game.

**RUGGED PREP MAY HELP**

GSU played Georgia (16-3) and Auburn (13-6) in the closed exhibition season. They played a third SEC team (Florida, 13-6) in regular season and played Toledo (15-2).

In the RPI, Georgia No. 24, Florida, Toledo is No. 38, Florida is No. 47 and Auburn No. 68, so those four teams gave the young Panthers some stronger competition for improvement. In the CAA, GSU has lost to No. 109 JMU, No. 132 ODU, No. 134 Hofstra, No. 143 Northeastern, while winning at Towson.

**"CENTERS" OF ATTENTION**

GSU's rotates its two centers, Cody Paulk and Maryam Dogo.

Paulk averages 9.8 points and 8.1 rebounds on the season; Dogo 5.1 points and 5.2 rebounds to make it a **combined 15 points and 14 rebounds from that one center position.** They have combined for **53 blocked shots in the 14 games.**

**Sunday vs. JMU marked the first time they were on the floor together.**

**DIVISION-1 TRANSFERS ADDED**

GSU has added a pair of Division I transfers who are practicing with the team this season to play next season. Both have all-conference potential and are major additions.

**KYRA CROSBY** was a starter last year at Alabama after having been the NJCAA Player of the Year at Gulf Coast Community College. Crosby started 15 games last year in the SEC at Alabama, averaging 9.1 points and 4.3 rebounds. She came back from injury to play in all 16 SEC games and had 13 double-figure scoring games for the Crimson Tide. Crosby averaged 19.5 points and 8.5 rebounds at Gulf Coast CC on a 35-1 team that won the national title.

**ALISHA ANDREWS** was a two-time All-CAA point guard at UNCW. She was also a two-time All-Defensive Team honoree.

Andrews led UNCW in scoring (11.9), as well as assists and steals. She made 132 three-point baskets in her two seasons with UNCW.

The quick point guard was the catalyst on their 24- and 20-win WNIT teams, producing 40 career double-figure scoring games. She had been the CAA Rookie of the Year.

**JAMES MADISON 65, GEORGIA STATE 49**

GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta

The Georgia State women's basketball team fell to Colonial Athletic Association foe James Madison, 65-49, Sunday at the GSU Sports Arena.

The Panthers dropped to 9-7 overall, 1-4 in the CAA, while James Madison improved to 10-7, 4-1 in the CAA. The win was the seventh in the last eight games for JMU.

Georgia State trailed just 49-45 after a bucket by Cody Paulk with 5:50 left, but the Dukes scored the next 11 points, including three straight three-point plays, to push their advantage to 60-45 with less than three minutes to go. Tarik Hislop began that 11-0 run with back-to-back three-point plays, then Kirby Burkholder followed with another one, and Jazmon Gwaltney added a jumper.

The Panthers had closed to 38-37 at 10:50 on a drive by Nolan and had a chance to take the lead at 10:20, but missed the layup.

Both teams played solid defense as GSU held the Dukes to 20-for-58 shooting, while the Panthers were almost an identical 20-for-57. GSU did rebound to shoot 46.4% in the second half (13-of-28). But James Madison managed to sink 20 of 21 (96.2%) from the free throw line, compared to just 7-for-13 by GSU.

Kayla Nolan led the Panthers with 13 points, while Cody Paulk added 12 points. Freshman Gaby Moss came off the bench to contribute 10 points, four rebounds and five assists.

Hislop led a trio of Dukes in double figures with 20 points, while Precious Hall scored 18 points, and Burkholder added 17. James Madison had a 44-35 rebound advantage, the largest against GSU this season.

"We did some good things today and played a solid game, but they made plays down the stretch and we didn't. That was the difference in the game," said GSU head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener.

The first half featured a defensive battle with both teams shooting below 25 percent from the field, while forcing 25 turnovers between them. James Madison took a 23-17 lead into the locker room on the strength of its 10-for-10 performance from the free throw line, compared to just 2-for-2 for the Panthers.
