BLAINE TAYLOR **ODU'S ALL-TIME WINNINGEST**

Blaine Taylor became ODU's all-time winningest coach with the 49-34 win over Northeastern on Jan. 5. He then joined the 200 win club at ODU with a 69-65 win against George Mason, on Jan. 8, 2011 in the Constant Center. He is 215-110 in 10 years (.666) at ODU, and 356-176 in 17 yrs overall (.669).

BATTLE FOR THE SILVER MACE

Beginning this year there is a new tradition between ODU and William and Mary; two staples of the Colonial Athletic Association. During the athletic season of 2011-12 this historic rivalry will come to a pinnacle in the "Optima Health Challenge." Sponsored by Hampton Roads based Optima Health, the trophy will be presented annually to the school which accumulates the most points in head-to-head competitions in all sports.

Along with the all sports challenge, the annual football contest will be the "Battle for the Silver Mace", with the winner presented a replica of the Norfolk Mace. The Mace is currently being held in the Chrysler Museum of Art, located in Downtown Norfolk. The Norfolk Mace was presented in the Norfolk Common Council by Royal Lt. Governor Robert Dinwiddle in 1754 to acknowledge that Norfolk was one of the most loyal provinces to King William.

The Monarchs won the first meting in the now annual "Battle for the Silver Mace" in Williamsburg on Nov. 12th with a 35-31 victory.

Points Format

During the year, the CAA foes will face off 15 times, with each even being worth 10 points. The Monarchs and Tribe will compete head-to-head in football, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, field hockey, baseball, and women's lacrosse. With the potential of meeting also in CAA tournaments. The winner will be the first to reach 80 total points.

Recorded double-doubles in three of the four games, including 17 points and 12 boards in a 10-point loss to #2 Kentucky. Also had 13 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Howard and 10 points and 11 boards in a victory over LIU. Blocked seven shots and made six steals.

MONARCHS SIGN A PAIR TO NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT

Head Basketball coach Blaine Taylor announced four standout recruits who will be joining the Monarch basketball family after signing National Letters of intent today. They are: 6-1 guard Keenan Palmore (Atlanta, Ga.), 6-9 post player, Ekene Anachebe (Fayette County, Ga.), 6-3 guard Deion Clark (Naples, Fla.) and 6-5 Aaron Bacote (Hampton, Va.).

Keenan Palmore averaged 20.8 points, 10.3 rebounds, 3.5 steals and 2.5 assists per game for coach Jo Jo Cadray of Paideia School in Atlanta, Ga. Palmore led Team Georgia Elite 17-under squad to the Southern Shootout title and was named tournament MVP as he averaged 19 points per game in the event. His mother, Debra Miller Palmore was a standout basketball player at Boston University. She was selected to the U.S. Olympic team in 1980.

Taylor on Palmore "Personified our recruiting class in that we identified what we wanted, who we wanted and were fortunately enough to have things fall into place. He fits the description of a point guard. He understands the game, plays very unselfishly, and can really defend his position."

Ekene Anachebe averaged 11 points, 8.5 rebounds and 7.1 blocked shots per game last year for Fayette County High School and head coach Andre Flynn in Georgia. He helped lead the squad to a 30-3 record and advanced to the 4A state semi-finals.

Taylor on Anachebe "Ekene is an eye-opening young man to meet and greet. He comes from a very nice family, carries himself very politely and yet possesses a physical make-up that has tremendous potential. We are very much looking forward to developing Ekene in every respect."

Aaron Bacote, a 6-5 wing who averaged 15.2 points, 5.1 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game for head coach Craig Brehon and Bethel High School. Bacote shot 83 percent from the free throw line and 51 percent from the floor. He had seven games of at least 20 points, including a 32 point effort against Atlantic Shores. He also scored 24 points in a two-point loss to Oscar Smith in the Eastern Region Tournament.

Taylor on Bacote "We have for years been looking for the right guy to come out of Craig Brehons program at Bethel to add to our program. Aaron was perfect. Hard nosed, and a good defender. Winning comes first and of course a tremendous student and ambassador for academics and the game of basketball."

Deon Clark, a 6-4 shooting guard for Barron Collier High School in Naples Fla. was the Daily News Player Of the Year. Clark averaged 22.3 points, 6.4 rebounds and 6.2 assists per game and was selected to the Class 4A All-State squad. Clark started for a Florida elite team that won the USSA national championship. He scored a career high 40 points in the district semifinals and averaged 30 points a game in both the District and regional playoffs as Barron Collier compiled a 24-6 record.

Taylor on Clark "Deon fits with this group like bread and butter. His versatility is going to be so valuable in regards to making many different combinations of players productive. He can play all over the court positionally, and play in all areas of the court productively. Every chance he has had to step up in competition he has flourished. All-in-all his future is very bright."

"This group is going to have the luxury of adding to our program at a time when numerous players in recent years have graduated, which opens the door for an exciting opportunity to contribute. Additionally we are going to go on a foreign tour in August which will help blend this group with our returning players in preparation for next season."


