Nationally Ranked

ODU continues to open eyes around the country with five starters nationally ranked in the new year. The team finished higher than nationally ranked Pittsburgh at the Southern Scuffle and two Monarchs broke into the InterMat Top 20. Sophomore David Mendoza, already ranked in the WrestlingReport.com polls, is now 20th in InterMat's with a 5th place effort at the Scuffle. True freshman Jesse Strawn joined the four other nationally ranked Monarchs at 20th in the InterMat poll after going 7-2 at the Scuffle on his way to fourth place. Adam Koballa (133) remains in the WrestlingReport.com rankings at 29th in the nation. Chris Brown (157) has maintained his position at 17th in the Amateur Wrestling News rankings and Ryan Williams is listed as the 26th best 141pounder by WrestlingReport.com.

Champions Developing the Future

Head Coach Steve Martin has led the Monarchs to a 23-12-1 mark as he enters his third year at the helm. In the CAA the Monarchs have dominated with a 12-3-1 mark. Martin comes from a powerhouse of high school wrestling in Great Bridge High School in Chesapeake. In 14 years as head coach, the Great Bridge Wildcats won 13 state championships.

Martin is assisted by Lee Pritts, Mike Dixon, and Jon Sioredas. Pritts left a solid position at Missouri to come to the building ODU program and has been with Martin since his inception. Pritts, an All-American wrestler, has coached six NCAA All-Americans and two finalists.

Dixon brings great recruiting skills and knowledge of the CAA coming from James Madison. He has experience coaching championship contenders while at the University of Indianapolis

Sioredas is a first-year coach with a wealth of knowledge about the sport. Named an All-American and ranked as high as 2nd nationally, Sioredas is now using his skills to teach.

All four coaches are wrestling champions in their own right and are building a championship future.

Rockin' Rookies

Coach Steve Martin has called upon his inexperienced grapplers early and many are answering to that call. The Monarchs continue to test themselves early with one of the toughest schedules in collegiate wrestling. The Monarchs continue to throw a very young team on the mat and continue to get significant results.

True freshman Jesse Strawn has placed in all four tournaments he has participated with a 4th place finish at the tough Southern Scuffle tournament. Adam Koballa has placed in three tournaments so far this season while two other true freshmen have placed in James Nicholson (una.) and Kyle Hutter at 125.

ODU also has a bevy of redshirt freshmen wrestling well this season. Chris Brown is making a big name for himself this season. Brown has also placed in three tournaments this season including a 2nd place finish at the MSU Open. Cam Watkins and Kaylen Baxter are the other redshirts that have placed.

Finally, the sophomores. Ryan Williams continues right where he left off last season as an NCAA Qualifier by winning three places and crushing opponents while at the Mat Town Open. Meanwhile, sophomore David Mendoza wants some of the spotlight as well as he took first in his weight class at Mat Town and most recently, Mendoza finished 5th in the Southern Scuffle. Mendoza has disposed of two nationally ranked foes this season.



Toppling The Top Tier

Old Dominion has made it a habit to rise against top competition this season. Before the Southern Scuffle four nationally ranked opponents had fallen at the hands of Monarch grapplers. After the Scuffle, ODU can add four more names to the hit list.

Kyle Hutter (125) knocked Kent State's Chad Sportelli (ranked as high as 14th) out of the tournament with an 8-2 decision in the wrestlebacks. Kaylen Baxter (149) then did the same to Lehigh's top ranked grappler Trevor Chinn (ranked in the top ten) in an 11-4 decision.

Another Kent State wrestler fell to Jesse Strawn when Eric Chine (24th nationally) in an 11-6 decision. Finally, David Mendoza earned a victory by default over Cornell's Jerry Rinaldi, ranked second in the nation.

At the Penn State Open James Nicholson (unattached) toppled Lehigh's nationally ranked Matt Fisk 3-2. Fisk was ranked 15th. At the same tournament Kaylen Baxter tallied 10 points in a decision against the number seven 149-pounder in the nation, John Cox (Navy).

After the Penn State Open came the George Mason Dual with two nationally ranked wrestlers appearing against the Monarchs. Nick Pullano won 7-3 over Tyler Tisdell, the 17th ranked 165-pounder and David Mendoza pinned Harry Zander, the 15th ranked 197-lb. individual.

Conference Rookie of the Week

Chris Brown was named the Colonial Athletic Association's Rookie of the Week for all competition up to the 4th of December. Brown's efforts to place in the top four of all three tournaments he competed and his 12-4 record gave him the award. Brown has only lost to nationally ranked opponents this season and only by a combined 7 points overall.

Brown was joined by Hofstra's Lou Ruggirello as Co-Rookie of the Week.

By Weight Class

125: True freshman Kyle Hutter will be the full-time starter. He was a 2005 and 2006 Junior National Champion and Fila Cadet All-American. He recently knocked 14-ranked Chad Sportelli out of the national rankings.

133: Adam Koballa started the season on fire with a third, fourth, and fifth place finish in three tournaments this season. B.J. Compton is sure to factor into this weight class throughout the season as well ranked 2nd in the conference at 133.

141: Ryan Williams earned a ranking in his new weight class within the first week. He has since been ranked as high as 20th and currently 26th by WrestlingReport.com. Williams led the team in pins last season and has the best record at 13-3 early this season.

149: Kaylen Baxter and Joey Metzler will fight for the spot at 149. Baxter knocked off nationally ranked Trevor Chinn and Metzler is a high school state champ and should make an immediate impact.

157: Chris Brown is currently ranked 17th by Amateur Wrestling News. Brown wrestled for Martin at Great Bridge High School and continues learning under the coach at ODU. Brown has placed three times this season and was named the CAA Rookie of the Week on Dec. 4th.

165: Nick Pullano has become a mainstay in the ODU lineup and will be Martin's go-to at 165. He has a 3-0 dual record and leads the team with 3 technical falls. Pullano also wrestled under Martin in high school.

174: Red-shirt freshman Bryan Koz and true freshman Derek Coffey will battle for this spot. Both were state finalists in high school and Coach Martin expects this to be a very highly competitive weight class.

184: Jesse Strawn, a high school All-American, has turned heads already in this weight class. He leads the team with seven pins and has most recently knocked off nationally ranked Kent State grappler Eric Chine while inserting himself into the national rankings. Strawn was a two-time state champion and was selected to the CAA's preseason All-Rookie team.

197: David is already ranked in his new weight class after winning his weight class at Mat Town and pinning nationally ranked Harry Zander. He also finished 5th at the Southern Scuffle.

Hwt: Matt Pellar should solidify the lineup for Martin at the 285 slot. He has gone a perfect 9-0 in tournament competition as an unattached wrestler this season with a victory at Mat Town

Junior Nick Pullano and sophomore Ryan Williams were the only two grapplers with more than two days of official collegiate experience at the Bar. Rookies Adam Koballa, Jesse Strawn and red shirt freshman Chris Brown stepped up to the challenge. Koballa ran the table in the wrestlebacks to steal 3rd from the man who knocked him out of the championship bracket, William Simpson (Army). The four placewinners for the Monarchs also placed at the MSU Open and have garnered national attention for Coach Martin this season.

David Mendoza, Adam Koballa and Jesse Strawn all placed for the Monarchs on the first weekend of competition in 2006.

ODU sent just nine wrestlers to the intense field at Penn State. Two freshman knocked off nationally ranked opponents on their way to placing for the Monarchs. James Nicholson, wrestling unattached, came home with fourth place in the 125 lb. division after knocking off Lehigh's nationally ranked grappler Matt Fisk 3-2. Nicholson would then lose the Penn State's Matthew McKnight who was named the meet's Outstanding Wrestler. Kaylen Baxter, a possible starter for the Monarchs as a red-shirt freshman this season also knocked off a nationally ranked wrestler en route to 5th place in the Open. The 6th ranked wrestler in the nation John Cox fell to Baxter in the wrestlebacks 10-8. Baxter went 7-1 at the tournament and scored all kinds of points.

ODU hosted their first CAA dual of the year and made a statement to the conference with a 38-12 win over the Patriots. George Mason boasted two nationally ranked wrestlers before David Mendoza and Nick Pullano disposed of each. ODU's tough schedule has put them on the map. Three Monarch starters were ranked nationally coming into the dual and a fourth in Adam Koballa joined his teammates after adding his third pin on the season. ODU tallied four pins and a technical fall in the victory.
