CAA HAS FOUR TEAMS IN THE MID MAJOR PRE-SEASON POLL

Hofstra, George Mason, Drexel and Old Dominion are all ranked in the first CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll for the 2006-07 campaign. The CAA and Missouri Valley led all conferences with four teams in the poll.

Hofstra tops all CAA members with a #3 ranking, followed by George Mason at #7, Drexel at #15 and Old Dominion at #21. UNC Wilmington was the top team among others receiving votes, while VCU and Towson also got votes.

The CAA is coming off the best season in league history, with four teams earning post-season berths and the conference earning a #8 ranking in the final RPI. The CAA was the only conference in the nation with four teams that posted 24 or more victories. George Mason reached the NCAA Final Four, while ODU reached the NIT semi-finals, Hofstra the NIT quarterfinals. Drexel was in the pre-season NIT semi-finals and UNC Wilmington won the CAA title and competed in the NCAA tournament.



MONARCHS SIGN TWO IN EARLY PERIOD

Old Dominion University head basketball coach Blaine Taylor announced the signing of standout recruits in Etoile Imama a 6-3, 195-pound guard from Montreal's Champlain St. Lambert and 6-5, 185 guard/forward Kent Bazemore (Windsor, NC.) from Bertie High School in Bertie, NC. ODU also added 6-9 David McClenny from Raleigh, NC. He transferred from UNC Greensboro where he was selected to the Southern Conference All-Rookie team last year. He averaged 5.2 points and 2.8 rebounds per game as a freshman. He will be eligible after the fall semester in the 2007-08 season.

Imama, a point guard was a member of Canada's under-19 team this past summer. he averaged 11.1 points, 6-5 assists and 4.2 rebounds per game as a junior at Canadian powerhouse Champlain St. Lambert which is coached by John Dangelas. Imama earned three All-Star tournament selections and was a first team All-Conference pick. He helped lead Champlain St. Lambert to the Conference finals and a third place finish in all of Canada. Champlain St. Lambert defeated New England Prep champion Bridgeton and Worcester Academy.

Bazemore averaged 22.9 points and 9.8 rebounds per game as a junior for head coach Calvin Moore at Bertie High School. Bazemore was the Northeast North Carolina Coastal Conference Player-of-the-Year and the Roanoke-Chowan District Player of the Year as a junior.

DIFFERENT LINEUPS

Only Drew Williamson has started every game thus far this season. Eight different Monarchs have started at least one game.

Oliver Purnell ('75-Asst. coach with Team USA Men's Basketball (Bronze Medal), Anne Donovan ('83) -Asst. coach with Team USA Women's Basketball (Gold Medal), Charles Ogletree ('89) – Sailor on Team USA Tornado class (Silver Medal), Marina DiGiacomo ('01)-Argentina field hockey team (Bronze Medal), Macha va der Vaart ('91) – Netherlands field hockey team (Silver Medal)

In all, 21 ODU alumni have competed in past Olympic games.

ESPN Sportscenter anchor Jay Harris is a 1987 ODU graduate.

Bob Pritchett ('68) who scored 67 points in a game against RPI and and 47 in a game against Hampden-Sydney in 1968 currently lives in Grove City, Ohio (outside Columbus). He is Deputy Supervisor for a juvenile correction facility there.

In 1994-95, ODU played four top-25 teams. The Monarchs defeated #9 Villanova, 89-81 in triple overtime in the NCAA first round. During the regular season, ODU played at #14 Virginia, and #14 Arizona State and host #1 North Carolina .

Assistant coach Jim Corrigan is in his 20th year as an assistant on the collegiate level, all in the CAA.

Assistant coach Rob Wilkes is the son of legendary Stetson head Coach Glenn Wilkes.

Assistant coach Travis DeCuire played for Taylor at Montana from 1991-94 and earned All-Big Sky honors in 1993 and 1994.

Of the eight Monarchs who have played in the NBA, two were first round draft picks. Chris Gatling (16th overall in 1991 by Golden State) and Cal Bowdler (17th overall in 1999 by Atlanta). Gatling played in the 1997 NBA all-star game. Both are currently playing overseas (Gatling in Russia).

The nickname of the state of Virginia is the "Old Dominion."


