- Old Dominion takes on Towson for the second consecutive time as the two teams met in the final regular season game, a 65-50 ODU win.
- ODU finished the CAA as the No. 8 seed while Towson is the No. 9 seed.
- The winner takes on No. 1 seed Delaware Friday at noon.
- Tia Lewis leads ODU with 16.5 points per game and in rebounds at 9.0 per game.
- Jackie Cook tied her career-best with 20 points in the win over Towson and is second on the team with 9.5 points per game.
- It is ODU's first time ever playing in the first round of the CAA Tournament.
- ODU head coach Karen Barefoot brings 13 years of head coaching experience and 200 plus wins in her first season as head coach of the Lady Monarchs. As head coach at the Apprentice School in 2001, she led the Builders to a National Championship while taking Lenoir-Rhyne the NCAA Tournament in the 2002-03 season. Last year while at Elon, she led the Phoenix to the WBI, the schools first ever women's basketball tournament appearance.

There were some loud cheers coming from fans at The Smith Center at George Washington University. But the fans were not screaming for the Colonials, who hosted Old Dominion University in a recent non-league women's basketball contest.

The cheers were for Tiffany Minor, who is from Upper Marlboro and is now a freshman for Division I ODU of the Colonial Athletic Association.

"It was very exciting. I felt very supported, even from people I didn't know," Minor said after the game, in which she scored seven points.

Minor, who played at The Maret School in Northwest Washington, said she had about 30 family and friends at the game at Foggy Bottom.

"I felt energy," said Minor, who made two three-point shots that drew cheers from fans behind the ODU bench.

The Monarchs, however, gave up a big second half lead and lost 58-52 in overtime Nov. 29 to GW and Brooke Wilson, who played at Eleanor Roosevelt High in Greenbelt.

Minor is one of three freshmen seeing a lot of action for ODU, which appeared in the NCAA title game in 1997 and won 17 CAA titles under former head coach Wendy Larry.

Under first-year head coach Karen Barefoot, a former assistant at the school, Minor is an outside threat who can also rebound.

"It has been a learning experience," she said of her freshman season. "I am taking it as a challenge. I just work hard in practice."

Minor was recruited by several Division I schools, including CAA rival James Madison, along with Temple and Clemson. But she ended up at ODU. "I like the family feeling. It is not too far from home and not too close," she said.

She has impressed associate head coach Amaka Agugua, who played at Oakton High in Northern Virginia and in the CAA with Hofstra.

"Tiffany is going to be a really integral part of what we do," Agugua said. "She has a great shot from the outside. She just has to get confidence. By the time she gets confidence she will be rolling."

Minor had two points, one assist and one steal in an 85-69 loss on Sunday at George Mason in Fairfax, VA. ODU is now 1-8 and Minor is averaging 15 minutes and 3.4 points per game.

George Mason point guard Bryon Allen had 10 points and three assists as the Patriots won, 65-53, on Saturday night at Towson. It was the first CAA

Amaka Agugua has been an assistant basketball coach at Division I women's programs such as Virginia Commonwealth, Indiana and now Old Dominion.

But she gives much credit to Fred Priester, her former coach at Oakton High, for her success.

"Oh man, he was a disciplinarian. He liked things a certain way. If you didn't do it that way you probably had to run or do something crazy," said Agugua, now the top assistant and recruiting coordinator under Karen Barefoot at ODU in Norfolk. "He is very, very smart when it comes to the basics of the game. He will increase your basketball IQ and all within the discipline of a team. He is a leader."

But Priester has helped the former Herndon resident in other ways as well, including the recruiting process and during her coaching career.

She was a top player at Oakton High but an injury scared off some college coaches before she signed to play with Division I Hofstra in New York.

"He helped me through my whole career. He was my coach for four years. I got dropped [from some schools] after the injury. He was with me through that process. He has always been on my side."

Priester told Oakton Patch on Thursday: "I just love her to death. She is like a daughter to me. When I first met her when she was 13, she was raw. She hurt her ankle as a junior. We lost in the state finals when she was a senior to Hampton. I was able to see her play at Hofstra and got to visit her in Indiana when I was visiting family. I am so proud of her, not just what she is doing as a coach but as the person she has become."

Agugua spoke to Patch late Wednesday night, after ODU blew a 10-point lead in the second half and lost at George Washington, 58-52, in overtime in non-league play. This is her first season as an assistant at ODU under head coach Barefoot in the Colonial Athletic Association after two years at Indiana.

"I am very familiar with the CAA as far as the coaches, referees and even some of the players because I coached at VCU before I went to Indiana," she said. "I am definitely glad to be at ODU. A lot of my family still lives in Northern Virginia. I am very close to home right now."

She had several friends on hand at the game at GW and also expects family and friends to be at the Patriot Center when ODU plays at Mason on Sunday, Dec. 4 at 2 p.m. The Monarchs are 1-7 so far this year with a young team.

Agugua was an all-Met and all-state player at Oakton and then played at Hofstra, where she was a three-year captain and scored 970 points with 568 rebounds in her career. She graduated from Hofstra in 2005 after she played in 95 games, with 82 starts, for the Pride.

Agugua got to know Barefoot when the Oakton grad was an assistant at VCU and Barefoot was an assistant at ODU. Both schools are in the CAA, as is Hofstra.

"I do a little bit of everything. As coach's top assistant I am her right-hand man. I am in charge of post players," Agugua said. "I would say my strength is player development and as my career has gone along I feel confident with my X's and O's [with strategy]. I feel I am old enough that the kids respect me but young enough they can relate."

Like many assistant coaches she would one day like to be a head coach.

"I definitely have those aspirations," she said. "I just believe everything happens in God's timing. I learn to take everything one day at a time."

For now she is glad to be at ODU after playing against the Monarchs as a visiting player and coach with Hofstra and then VCU.

"The support at ODU is amazing. The history is amazing," she said of a program that has produced several WNBA players and advanced to the NCAA title game in 1997. "It is amazing to be on the home side of the bench when we play at the Constant Convocation Center."

Freshman finds her footing on Lady Monarchs squad

NORFOLK

Ashley Betz-White would be the perfect sparkplug. Unfortunately, she's being asked to be Old Dominion's engine.

A freshman point guard, Betz-White is ninth in the CAA in minutes played (33 per game), tied with Delaware star Elena Delle Donne. She's among the top 30 in points, averaging 9.7, second on the Lady Monarchs, and has won CAA Rookie of the Week twice.

"No freshman is asked to do those things," said Tia Lewis, Old Dominion's only senior and leading scorer. "I mean (33) minutes? I think she's been amazing."

During a difficult start for the Lady Monarchs, the all-over-the-court point guard has been one of the more enjoyable players to watch, a statement that's a compliment to her and a condemnation of the team's 2-8 record.

Freshmen usually combine excitement with headaches, slick plays with rookie mistakes. Betz-White has been no different.

She's second in the conference with 50 turnovers, and the Lady Monarchs are last in the conference, turning it over 21.4 times per contest. Only North Carolina-Wilmington sophomore point Alisha Andrews, last year's Rookie of the Year, has turned over the ball at a higher rate (6.0 in eight games).

Betz-White is loathe to admit it, but the up-and-down nature of her season is expected from newcomers. She's having a good season - for a freshman.

"I don't like that 'for a freshman,' " Betz-White. "I'm trying to improve and get better. I'm not satisfied with being good 'for a freshman.' "

She is the only freshman in the CAA to start every game and averages nearly 10 minutes more than any other. Northeastern's Genevieve Gaboriault is second among newcomers in minutes played with 23.4 per game.

Old Dominion's only other viable option at point guard, Michelle Brandao, has not had her amateur status cleared by the NCAA, leaving Betz-White on the floor regardless of how well she's performing.

At times, like her 22-point outburst at Virginia Tech in ODU's opener, that hasn't been a problem. The next game, when she shot 1 for 11 and committed a season-high eight turnovers against Georgia Tech, Betz-White could have used some time to clear her head.

Betz-White was ticketed as a starter from the moment she arrived on campus, joining a program that graduated its three best ball-handling guards. But even she didn't expect to play such a prominent role.

"You come in as a freshman, you don't expect this," Betz-White said. "It's been a great opportunity."

The need for her to perform immediately has head coach Karen Barefoot teaching her at an accelerated pace.

With 10 contests already crunched into its schedule, Old Dominion has had little time for learning. Practices have been set up to prepare for opponents, not to teach fundamentals or correct mistakes.

That's left Barefoot and Betz-White poring over film on laptops on airplanes and in airport concourses. Barefoot alternates compliments to boost the freshman's spirits with criticisms to make her better.

The biggest adjustment, Betz-White said, are opponents who are faster and smarter than those she faced at Trinity High School (Mechanicsburg, Pa.).

Back then, getting into the lane would lead to lay-ups or easy kickouts. Now, at 5-foot-3, she's often trapped among taller opponents. Her entry passes into the post, once easily accomplished, must travel through a maze of arms and legs as she gets accustomed to creating better angles and spacing.

"You can see the frustration on her face sometimes," Lewis said. "Some players, they don't even try to get it to the post. She's frustrated when she's not able to."

Betz-White is so inexperienced that she hasn't even learned to sugarcoat her struggles yet, candidly admitting her first year has been overwhelming at times.

"It's nice that coach Barefoot is a point guard," Betz-White said. "She understands the pressure of the position."

The point guard's persona is a bit of fresh air as well.

The team recently taped promotional videos, shown on the Constant Center's video boards, in which players implore fans to get loud.

While many of her teammates were grouped together to create the proper amount of enthusiasm, Betz-White went solo, and her volume rings through the arena. She said it took no prompting from producers.

"I haven't seen it yet," Betz-White said. "But I've heard it."

She brings the same energy to the court.

During a defensive drill Thursday, she was chastised for too much effort, straying too far from her assignment to help a teammate, then scrambling back. She wears kneepads on both legs, a nod to her frequent trips to the floor in search of loose balls.

It's this aspect of Betz-White's game that Barefoot is putting the most belief in. More than any highlights or lowlights from Betz-White's freshman season, Barefoot believes it signifies the eventual direction of Old Dominion.

"She wants to be a leader on this team, to be the best in the conference," Barefoot said. "Sometimes she tries to do too much. She makes mistakes. But a lot of times, you don't notice them because she's playing so hard."

Past success lurks in ODU's shadows

This season, espnW will take a journey across America, bringing you an in-depth look at 16 women's college basketball programs -- our Sweet 16. We'll begin the first week of the season and conclude just before the conference tournaments. We'll visit powerhouse schools and those off the beaten path, programs that are emerging and those that were there from the beginning. At the end of these 16 weeks, we hope you'll have a true flavor of Hoops Across America.

NORFOLK, Va. -- Not so long ago, longtime Old Dominion athletic administrator Debbie White stepped into an elevator while on a trip in California.

"I was wearing a shirt with our logo on it, and a man glanced over at it and said, 'Great women's basketball,'" White said. "People still associate us with that."

And for good reason: Old Dominion won two Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women titles (1979, '80) and the 1985 NCAA championship. ODU is the alma mater of playing greats such as Nancy Lieberman, Anne Donovan, Inge Nissen, Medina Dixon, Tracy Claxton, Adrienne Goodson and Ticha Penicheiro.

The adage "Those who don't remember history are doomed to repeat it" applies in reverse to ODU. What if you know your history, chapter and verse, and are afraid you won't repeat it?

To tell the tale of Old Dominion women's basketball is to run again and again into that word: history. ODU was the first university in Virginia to offer women's athletic scholarships and, as such, was a power in basketball before most schools from bigger conferences made much of a commitment to the sport. But like Louisiana Tech, in the past 20 years Old Dominion has found itself fighting to hold on to its tradition despite a vastly changing college athletics world.

ODU had a renaissance of sorts in the mid-'90s by being at the forefront of another trend: recruiting top international players. The 1997 national runner-up team had two starters from Portugal (Penicheiro, Mery Andrade) and another from Mozambique (Clarisse Machanguana).

As recently as 2008, ODU was in the NCAA Sweet 16. But that's the last year the Lady Monarchs made the NCAA field. ODU currently is 5-10. And the ranked team making a buzz from the Colonial Athletic Association is Delaware.

It's a year of change at Old Dominion, and there will be perhaps several years of rebuilding.

ODU's highly successful past isn't the only lingering shadow on the program. There is the departure of former coach Wendy Larry, who resigned in May after 24 seasons following a public dispute with athletic director Wood Selig when he wouldn't extend her contract.

The ODU of today is not like the glory days. Then again, no one expects it to be right now. This is not the time to look for the old Monarchs magic.

"My nickname is 'the grinder,'" said Karen Barefoot, 39, who replaced Larry as head coach. "I will grind until I get the job done."

She will need to grind out a new path for ODU, because the one the Lady Monarchs took as a pioneering program in women's basketball in the 1970s isn't available anymore. Yet, she will need to keep in touch with that history, because it's part of what makes this program stand out.

Old Dominion's arena and practice gym have banners commemorating their championships and player legends. The players see that every day, but how much does it resonate with them?

"The game has changed. It's not the same as back in the day," ODU senior Tia Lewis said. "You want to keep the tradition going. But it's gotten tougher; we've been the target for so long."

Lewis scored a career-high 30 points in a 68-59 win over Georgia State on Jan. 4. After the game, she chided beat writer Chris Carlson of The Virginian-Pilot because he tweeted a prediction that Georgia State would win.

Lewis wasn't joking, either. The prediction clearly irritated her and perhaps even motivated her.

ODU next faces VCU in Richmond on Wednesday (7 p.m. ET, ESPN3).

"I think this generation wants to be challenged," Barefoot said. "As much as I say they kind of have it all and they take it for granted a little bit, they want something more. It's about getting to where they believe no matter how hard it is, they're going to get through it."

New era, new look

It's a different regime at ODU now. Jim Jarrett, the visionary athletic director who in the early 1970s foresaw the benefits of supporting women's basketball, retired in 2010. He was replaced by Selig, who grew up in Norfolk and is overseeing a changed athletic culture at ODU.

In 2009, the school restarted its football program, which had been disbanded after the 1941 season. Monarchs football has gone 27-8 in Bobby Wilder's three seasons, and that recently earned him a 10-year contract extension.

Observers sense that Selig, like most new ADs, wanted to put his stamp on everything, women's basketball included. Last season, ODU went 20-11 but missed the NCAA tournament for the third season in a row. This came after ODU had made the Big Dance in 20 of the previous 21 years.

For nearly two decades, one of the surest things in women's basketball was that ODU would win the CAA tournament and the accompanying automatic NCAA tourney bid. New classes of freshmen developed a mentality that "the streak won't end on our watch."

In 2009, it finally did after 17 years, with Drexel defeating James Madison for the tourney title. The past two seasons, JMU has been CAA champion.

This past March, ODU lost in the CAA tournament quarterfinals to Delaware and subsequently fell to Loyola in the WNIT first round. Selig told Larry he would not extend her contract before this season, news she decided to make public.

Perhaps Larry overplayed her hand; perhaps it wouldn't have mattered. It was a showdown at the ODU corral,

and this was a battle that the coach with so much history on her side didn't win. In May, facing a lame-duck season without an extension, Larry resigned after 24 seasons and a 559-203 record at ODU.

In came Barefoot, an ODU assistant from 2005 to 2008. She's a native of Newport News, across the water from Norfolk, and played at Menchville High School and Christopher Newport University.

"She had been here in a previous stop, so she knew the university and how to recruit here," Selig said. "She's from the area, and we felt that would be an asset. She'd been very successful and had done it at places with a lot less support and lot less from a facilities standpoint."

Old Dominion is considered a mid-major, but the places where Barefoot had been a head coach before were much smaller. She started her career building the women's hoops program at the Apprentice School, which is operated by Newport News Shipbuilding.

Barefoot's father, grandfather and uncle all had worked at the shipyard, a major employer for the region that dates to the 1800s.

"That program was probably the best job for me to start, because it wasn't easy," Barefoot said. "You've got 18-year-old players who are essentially in the real world, because they have a work week, they go to school and they play basketball. You have to prepare them and help them go through that."

Barefoot won a small-schools championship there, then went to Division II Lenoir Rhyne in Hickory, N.C. After her stay as ODU assistant, she spent three years as head coach at Elon, also in North Carolina. She was 37-59 at Elon, going 20-13 in 2010-11. It was the program's best mark since moving to Division I.

Whether all that has prepared Barefoot -- who hired former Lady Monarchs standout Goodson as one of her assistants -- for success at ODU remains to be seen.

Barefoot aspires to take ODU back to where it once was. She looks at players from Georgetown's Sugar Rodgers to Duke's Elizabeth Williams -- both from the Tidewater area -- and knows the Lady Monarchs must find ways to beat the big guns for more of the top local talent.

"I felt like we are still falling and haven't reached the bottom yet," Selig said. "I'm hopeful we're close to reaching that and then climbing back. We felt like getting Karen on board and improving our recruiting, our academic success and visibility in the community was something we wanted to get started right away.

"We've been up front with Karen in having very modest expectations of the program and of her for the first several years."

No doubt such statements will make Larry seethe, considering she was told that not meeting the program's longtime high expectations was part of why her contract wasn't extended.

Technically, she was announced as staying on at the university in a fundraising/administrative role, and she is drawing the final year of her coaching salary. Realistically, Larry is essentially divorced from her alma mater.

She doesn't go to ODU games nor have any dialogue with Barefoot or Selig. She considered visiting her

longtime friend, Tennessee coach Pat Summitt, when ODU played in Knoxville, Tenn., in December.

"But then I said, 'I'm not getting into that drama. I don't need to be there,'" Larry said, adding she'll go another time.

It's been awkward for many, including those alumni loyal to Larry who felt that the disappointments of the past three years didn't merit her departure. Judy Bowman, who's worked at ODU in academic affairs for nearly 30 years and been a fan of the Lady Monarchs even longer than that, acknowledged the bumpy transition.

"It's strange, still," said Bowman, who remains a strong supporter of the program. "Wendy is a local icon, a celebrity in our town."

The biggest celebrity associated with the program remains Lieberman. She interviewed when Larry resigned but said she was not very serious about taking the head-coaching job.

"Change is hard, because it's emotional," said Lieberman, a friend and former ODU teammate of Larry's. "I have tremendous respect for what Wendy did. But we are all going to be replaced one day. We have to get better, or get over it. Coaches get fired left and right in men's sports.

"Wendy's life has been at Old Dominion, and that made it more emotional. But it's a business, and you have to win. You're getting paid a lot of money now, and if we want to operate on the next level in women's basketball, we have to take the good with the bad."

A program of memories

There has been a whole lot of good at ODU. The program's peak years as a national contender came under Marianne Stanley, a trailblazing player at Immaculata before becoming a coach. She was in charge for ODU's three national championships. But among the most landmark games in Stanley's ODU tenure, which lasted from 1977-87, was an exhibition.

White, now ODU's senior associate athletic director, recalls Dec. 14, 1979, when she told herself to pause and soak in her surroundings, just in case she never saw anything quite like it again.

The Soviet women's basketball team -- led by 7-footer Uljana Semjonova -- was the equivalent of that nation's men's hockey team, which the U.S. would later beat in the "Miracle on Ice" in the 1980 Winter Olympics. Winners of the first Olympic women's hoops tournament, in 1976, the Soviets repeated in 1980 at the Moscow Games boycotted by the United States.

But on this night at Scope, an arena in downtown Norfolk, the Russians trailed at halftime against ODU, then the defending college champion.

"I tell people this, and it's no exaggeration: It was so loud, we thought the roof was going to cave in," White said. "It was the thing to do in Norfolk that night. People came who'd never been to a women's game before, high-society folks. What an interesting mix. It was a unique time with things changing in the world, but still very Cold War."

ODU lost 76-66 to the Soviets, and Lieberman recalled, "I remember coming down the court, and I could see all my teammates except one. I said, 'Where the heck is Anne?' And Inge [Nissen] says to me, 'She's behind Semjonova.'"

Indeed, the only player who could make the 6-8 Donovan "disappear" was the 7-foot Soviet, who retired in the mid-1980s having never lost an international game. But Donovan went on to win two Olympic gold medals (1984, '88) and coached the 2008 U.S. squad to Olympic victory. Now coach at Seton Hall, Donovan won a WNBA title leading Seattle in 2004.

How many women's basketball programs have memories and connections like that?

Most Lady Monarchs games, for many years, were played not at Scope but at the ODU Fieldhouse, where it felt as though fans were right on top of the court. The Constant Center is a bigger, more modern facility that's comfortable for spectators. But sometimes things are lost with progress.

"I was reticent about leaving the Fieldhouse," Larry said. "Just because when teams came in there, it had an effect on them. We used that to our advantage."

There are good memories in Constant Center, too, though. In 2008, the Lady Monarchs beat Virginia 88-85 on Jazzmin Walters' 3-pointer with 4.8 seconds left in overtime to advance to the NCAA Sweet 16. That felt like old times.

But waiting in the regional was UConn, which beat ODU 78-63 on March 30, 2008. That's ODU's last NCAA tournament game. Three years really isn't that much of a drought. But it was enough to end Larry's ODU career.

Selig points to the NCAA tournament success last season of mid-majors such as Gonzaga (Elite Eight) and Green Bay (Sweet 16) and says ODU should be able to do the same thing.

The irony, of course, is that Old Dominion long ago did all of that -- and far more. So will the Lady Monarchs in a new era be able to redefine fan expectations but have enough national success to build a bridge to the program's past?

Lieberman, the eternal optimist, says Barefoot just needs time. A bundle of live-wire energy on even her slowest days, Barefoot believes her blue-collar background prepared her for the long haul.

"I'm from here, and I love it here," Barefoot said. "For me, it was a natural instinct to say, 'I can do this.' I feel like Old Dominion is still an easy sell. There's so much talent in Virginia, and I think we still have a strong connection to international players.

"Recruiting is everything, our No. 1 priority. There's steps we have to take, but I really believe this is the perfect job."

It's hers now. And history, as always, will be the judge.

Barefoot is driven to succeed in all areas at ODU

Karen Barefoot provided a glimpse into her approach toward basketball and life the day she was introduced as Old Dominion's women's coach.

"I'm not going to be perfect," she said to a room full of folks at ODU's Constant Center last June, "but I'm never going to give you less than my best."

Barefoot has lived that mantra from her days as an indomitable whirlwind of a point guard in the Peninsula District, through a record-setting college career at Christopher Newport, three college head coaching positions, to a return home to a place that she calls a dream destination.

Barefoot took over for icon Wendy Larry after the longtime coach's publicly contentious departure. Her aim wasn't to replace one of the most respected coaches in women's basketball and a giant figure within the ODU community.

Rather, Barefoot wants to restore the legacy that Larry, and Marianne Stanley before her, began. She aims to build relationships with players and fans, and to win championships.


She inherited a rebuilding job at Old Dominion, a shadow of the program that won national championships in the 1980s and was an annual NCAA tournament presence through the first decade of the 21st century.

Though this season's record is disappointing, progress is evident. The Lady Monarchs won three games against CAA teams to which they lost the first meeting. After losing by 16 at George Mason in early December, they defeated the Patriots seven weeks later.

ODU captured two-point road wins at Hofstra and UNC Wilmington recently after enduring 20-point home losses to both in January. The Lady Monarchs were competitive in a loss to nationally-ranked Delaware and All-American Elena Delle Donne, giving the players encouragement that they could compete against the league's best teams.

Barefoot demonstrated that same determination throughout her playing and coaching careers. At CNU, she was the first player in college history — any division, man or woman — to amass 2,000 points and 1,000 assists.

At age 22, she helped start a program where none had existed, eventually winning an NSCAA national championship at the Apprentice School. She coached Lenoir-Rhyne to its first conference title and its first NCAA Division II tournament berth.

Barefoot assisted Larry, from 2005-08, during the Lady Monarchs' last dominant period in the CAA. She then engineered a 15-game turnaround in three seasons as head coach at Elon, taking the Phoenix from five wins to 20 her final year.

She came to Old Dominion believing that the Lady Monarchs again can be champions. What's required is passion and commitment, starting with the head coach. With Barefoot, that's a given.
