HITTER OF THE WEEK

CHUCKIE ROBINSON, SOUTHERN MISS Junior, C, Danville, Illinois

Robinson started the weekend with career highs of five hits and seven RBI in the opener against WKU. His seven RBI in a game was the most by a Golden Eagle since current assistant coach B.A. Vollmuth did it against Rice on May 16, 2010. Dating back to the previous Saturday's contest at Florida Atlantic through the opening game of the Hilltopper series, Robinson had collected hits in 10 consecutive at bats (with a sacrifice fly as well) for 11 RBI over that three-game span. The Danville, Illinois, native has now hit safely in his last six games, tying his career best. Robinson hit a three-run homer in the opening game against the Hilltoppers and then added a solo shot in the second game of the set. He helped the Golden Eagles tie a season-high for runs scored in an inning with seven as he drove in two runs with a single in the seventh of the WKU series finale.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK

BLAKE FOX, RICE Senior, LHP, Bellaire, Texas

Fox posted the best game of his collegiate career, a complete-game, six-hit shutout with 10 strikeouts to help lead Rice to a 3-0 Conference USA road victory at FIU on Saturday. The left-hander from Bellaire, Texas, held the Panthers to five singles and one double on the way to his first complete game (as well as the first 9.0 inning shutout) of his Rice career. Not only did Fox not allow any walks, only three of the 31 batters he faced reached as many as three balls in the count. Only three FIU batters reached second base against the preseason C-USA Pitcher of the Year, including two that were in the first and second innings before being retired without any damage. Then after a two-out double in the bottom of the seventh, Fox ended that threat with one of his 10 strikeouts.

C-USA NOTEBOOK

CHARLOTTE

The 49ers won the series finale against Old Dominion after dropping the first two games. Junior LHP **Holden Capps** threw a career-high eight innings Sunday, allowing two runs on six hits with three strikeouts to improve to 4-1 on the season. Sophomore 2B **Brett Netzer** had his best career week, hitting .727 (8-for-11) vs. Old Dominion. He started the weekend with a perfect 3-for-3 night at the plate with a walk, RBI and run scored before adding a 3-for-4 performance with another walk and two runs scored on Saturday. On Sunday, Netzer posted a 2-for-4 outing with a double and run scored in Charlotte's 5-2 win. For the week, he had a double, RBI, four runs scored, two walks and stolen base. Junior OF **T.J. Nichting** and sophomore SS **Hunter Jones** each extended their hitting streaks to five on Sunday. Charlotte notched its 28th double-digit hit effort of the season on Saturday and added five more multi-hit games on Sunday to sit at 143 on the year.

FIU

The Panthers fell to No. 14 Rice in all three games this past weekend. Junior C **Zack Soria** and senior 3B **Austin Rodriguez** were the only FIU players to notch a hit in each game of the series. Rodriguez has now hit safely in his last seven games. Junior RHP **Cody Crouse** pitched his first career complete game in Friday's 2-0 defeat. He allowed 11 hits, two runs and walked three.

(17) FLORIDA ATLANTIC

Florida Atlantic improved to 33-13 on the season after splitting its season series with Miami with a 5-2 loss on Thursday and then sweeping Conference USA rival UTSA over the weekend. The Owls posted 37 hits and 23 runs over the four games and homered in each contest. FAU sits one game back of first place in the C-USA standings and holds the tiebreaker with a series win over Southern Miss. The Owls won a pair of close games vs. UTSA (5-4 and 3-1) and also saw its offense explode late in Saturday's showdown for a 13-5 victory, the 11th time FAU has reached double-digit scoring this spring. Senior OF **Billy Endris** went 5-for-6 on Saturday with two RBI, two doubles and two runs, sparking an eight-run eighth inning. Junior 1B **Esteban Puerta** had a strong all-around weekend, registering a hit, and RBI and a run scored in each outing, totaling five hits (including two home runs), five RBI and four runs.

LOUISIANA TECH

Louisiana Tech took all three games from Middle Tennessee over the weekend for its fifth consecutive series win in league play. It also marked the Bulldogs first conference sweep since 2012 when they were in the WAC. Louisiana Tech is now 31-14 on the season and it reached 30 wins on Saturday, the fastest the program has reached that mark since 1989. Junior RHP **Casey Sutton** threw a complete-game in Sunday's series finale, allowing just four hits in a 5-0 victory. Sutton has been dominant of late, allowing just three earned runs in his last 34.1 innings pitched. His shutout performance earned Sutton his sixth win of the season and moved him to a perfect 6-0 on the season with a 1.31 ERA. Junior OF **Sean Ullrich** extended his hitting streak to nine games after posting a hit in each game against Middle Tennessee. The Louisiana Tech pitching staff ranks third in C-USA with a 3.56 team ERA (down nearly one run per game from last season's 4.52 ERA) and is second in strikeouts with 362.

MARSHALL

Marshall won all three games against UAB over the weekend, giving the Thundering Herd back-to-back sweeps in Conference USA play for the first time in its 11 years in the league. Marshall's 15 wins in C-USA this season are the most the team has ever posted and it allowed the Herd to clinch a spot in the C-USA Championship for the first time since 2010. Marshall's 27 wins are tied for the second-most wins in program history. The Herd has won 9 of its last 10 C-USA games, its best 10-game stretch of play in league games since 1978. Junior SS **Leo Valenti** delivered a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11th inning of Saturday's 4-3 victory. In that win, senior IF **Tommy Lane** had the first two home run game since Alfredo Brito at Eastern Michigan on March 2, 2012. Senior RHP Chase Boster pitched his first collegiate career complete game by allowing just one run on seven hits and four strikeouts in Friday's 5-1 series opener. He improved to 5-2 this season and has won his last three starts. Boster's 17 career wins puts him tied for fourth all-time with Greg Kappas (1974-77) and Sean Reeder (1997-00).

MIDDLE TENNESSEE

The Blue Raiders dropped all three games at Louisiana Tech over the weekend. In Saturday's 2-1 loss, freshman RHP **Al Spencer** threw a career-high seven innings, scattering four hits and allowing two runs. He struck out four and walked one but suffered the tough setback. Junior SS **Riley Delgado** registered his team-leading 25th double-digit hit game on Saturday and enters this week with a .403 batting average (second in Conference USA) and a league-leading .495 on-base percentage. Senior RHP **Garrett Ring** has made 14 appearances and registered 40 strikeouts in 38.1 innings pitched.

OLD DOMINION

The Monarchs picked up their second straight series victory by taking two-of-three at Charlotte over the weekend. Old Dominion now sits at 12-12 in league play, three games ahead of teams tied for ninth place with six games remaining as it jockeys for position to earn a C-USA Championship berth. Junior OF **Turner Bishop** led the Monarchs with a team-leading seven hits in 11 at bats. He started the weekend with a 4-for-4 outing in

game one at Charlotte, which included a double and a home run. In game two, he went 2-for-3 and roped another double. Overall, he hit .545 over the three games and had a 1.000 slugging percentage and a .583 on base percentage. He was also 3-for-3 with two outs on the board and 1-for-1 with runners in scoring position. Junior SS **Zach Rutherford** was 7-for-13 (.538) with a double, two stolen bases, two RBI and two runs scored against Charlotte. Junior RHP **Nick Hartman** came in in relief in the sixth inning in game one at Charlotte and picked up his sixth save of the season. He fired 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing just one hit and striking out two without walking a batter.

(14) RICE

Over the weekend Rice pulled off a key C-USA sweep of a weekend road series at FIU to stay tied atop the league standings with Southern Miss. In the process the Owls also punched their ticket to play for C-USA Championship later this month. Rice posted back-to-back shutouts to start the FIU series and had a stretch of 24-consecutive scoreless innings dating back to the final inning of the midweek game vs. Lamar. The weekend began with an eight strikeout/8.1 inning performance by junior RHP **Jon Duplantier** on the way to his sixth win of the season. This season Duplantier has recorded 107 strikeouts in 86.0 innings and held all hitters to a composite .186 batting average. One the reason for the Owls' recent hitting success has been the healthy return of sophomore OF **Tristan Gray**. In Rice's last 15 games, Gray is 26-for-55 (.473) with four doubles and two triples (.618 slugging percentage). Speaking of triples, five different Rice hitters all recorded triples last week - including three in the Lamar game, and two of those three were in the same inning. Freshman SS **Ford Proctor** went 8-for-14 (.571) with two three-hit games last week, giving him a team-leading total of 13 multi-hit games this season. In addition to scoring six times and driving in five runs, he also had a triple and a double for a .857 slugging percentage. Proctor drew two walks and was hit by a pitch for a .611 on-base average, while stealing a base and recording a sacrifice fly.

(16) SOUTHERN MISS

The Golden Eagles improved to 22-3 at home this season after notching its fourth Conference USA sweep this season and sixth series win in eight weekends in 2016. With the 13-4 series finale victory over WKU, the Golden Eagles improved to 12-0 this year in final games of weekend series. Southern Miss started its final homestand of the season, a seven-game stretch, by outscoring the visitors 28-9 in the weekend set. USM continued its home run barrage with four more over the weekend to give it 56 for the year and it has homered in eight of the last nine games and 33 of 48 contests this spring, going 25-8 in those contests. The Golden Eagles faced the reigning C-USA Pitcher of the Week for the third time this season in the WKU series finale and chased Ryan Thurston in the second inning to improve to 3-0 on the year against that individual that won the league's individual pitching award the previous week. Senior 1B **Tim Lynch** needs one RBI to become the first Golden Eagle to reach at least 50 since B.A. Vollmuth tallied 70 in 2011. The Golden Eagles improved to 12-0 in games that sophomore LHP **Kirk McCarty** started this season while he improved to 5-0 on the year. It was the second shutout that McCarty has been a part of as he now has allowed just two earned runs over his last 25.2 innings pitched for a 0.70 ERA. McCarty retired the first 13 batters he faced before allowing a single and a batter to reach via an error. He tied a career-high with nine strikeouts, doing it for the third time this season.

UAB

The Blazers dropped all three games at Marshall over the weekend. Senior OF **Griffin Gum** hit a grand slam in a win at Ohio State on May 2 and then hit a two-run homer at Marshall on Saturday. He hit safely in all five games last week, totaling seven hits. Of the Blazers' 47 games played, freshmen OF **Brewer Hicklen** and 2B **Carter Pharis** have started every contest. Hicklen leads the UAB offense with a .298 average and .439 on-base percentage, totaling a team-high 51 hits and 34 walks. Pharis leads the charge in extra-bases with 13 doubles and has driven in a team-best 31 runs.

UTSA

The Roadrunners dropped all three games at No. 17 Florida Atlantic over the weekend. Junior 2B **C.J. Pickering** had a strong series for the Roadrunners, posting multiple-hits in each game and going 6-for-12 (.500) with a double and two RBI. He now has multiple hits in his last six Conference USA games and has reached base safely in each of his last nine outings. Sophomore OF **Skyler Valentine** also hit safely in each outing from his lead-off spot, doubling twice and notching his 15th multiple-hit game on Sunday.

WKU

The Hilltoppers dropped all three games at No. 14 Southern Miss over the weekend. Freshman SS **Steven DiPuglia** has pushed his hitting streak to a season-high eight games. He ended the weekend with the most hits on the team, finishing 5-for-11 (.455 average). Sophomore 1B **Harrison Scanlon** has been WKU's hottest hitter as of late, holding a career-long hitting streak (8) and reached-base streak (13). Over his last 11 games he has 16 hits, 10 RBI and eight runs scored. Senior LHP **John Harman** has been the Hilltoppers best reliever over the last month, lowering his ERA from 10.5 on March 29 to what he holds now at 3.93. He has yet to allow an earned run in conference play and has only given up one earned run over his last 13 appearances. Senior 3B **Danny Hudzina** saw his 50-game on-base streak come to an end over the weekend, which came in as the longest active streak in the country. During the streak, he batted for a .427 average, .617 slugging percentage and .479 on-base percentage.
