• Old Dominion hosts Coastal Carolina for the first time since the 2012 FCS playoffs as the Monarchs entertain the Chanticleers on Saturday, Nov. 4 at 3:30 p.m. on ESPN+.

• Old Dominion suffered a 30-27 setback at No. 25 James Madison last Saturday.

• Coastal defeated Marshall 34-6 in its Homecoming game.

• Quarterback Grant Wilson set career-highs at James Madison, completing 26-of-36 passes for 277 yards and two touchdowns. It was Wilson's third-straight game without throwing an interception.

• For the first time this season, James Madison allowed a team to rush for more than 100 yards as ODU rushed for 138 yards against the Dukes.

• Running backs Kadarius Calloway and Keshawn Wicks combined for 139 yards on 28 carries. Wicks had 11 carries for 74 yards, including a career-long 36 yards, while Calloway had 17 attempts for 65 yards.

• Safety Tahj Ra-El and linebacker Wayne Matthews each recorded 10 tackles at JMU. ODU has had at least two players every game this season register at least 10 tackles.

• ODU Head Coach Ricky Rahne has three new assistant coaches on staff. Offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Kevin Decker, offensive line coach Alex Huettel and cornerbacks coach Tarron Williams. Decker and Huettel came to ODU from Fordham, while Williams came from Richmond.

• Old Dominion's 58 newcomers are the seventh most of any FBS team in the country this season and 41 scholarship newcomers is also the seventh most in the country.

This is the third all-time meeting between the Monarchs and Chanticleers. ODU won the first meeting in 2012 in the second round of the FCS Playoffs. The Monarchs won in Conway last season, 49-21.

Captains

Head Coach Ricky Rahne named six captains for the 2023 season.

Grant Wilson: A transfer from Fordham, Wilson was named ODU's starting quarterback at ODU's media day and the opener at Virginia Tech will be his first career start.

Xavier Black: A former walk-on, Black started all 12 games at center last season for the Monarchs.

Javon Harvey: A two-year starter at wide receiver, Harvey is ODU's leading returning receiver with 30 catches last season.

Jason Henderson: Led the country with 186 tackles last year and was a second-team All-America selection.

Terry Jones: The Baltimore native started 15 games the last two years at safety and has back-to-back 60+ tackle seasons.

Ethan Duane: The Australian played his first football game ever in 2021 and last year led the Sun Belt in punts downed inside the 20.

Random Notes About Captains

Grant Wilson is the first ODU quarterback to be named a captain during Ricky Rahne's tenure.

Duane makes three-straight years under Rahne a specialist has been a captain. Kicker Nick Rice was a captain in 2021, long snapper BR Hatcher (Green Bay Packers) last year.

ODU and CCU Ties

Old Dominion Director of Sports Performance worked with a pair of Coastal coaches while at West Virginia.

Coastal offensive coordinator Travis Trickett was the inside wide receivers coach at WVU from 2019-21.

CCU running backs coach was also at WVU from 2019-21 as the wide receivers coach.

ODU Deputy AD and COO Bruce Stewart came to Norfolk after spending nine years at Coastal Carolina. Stewart filled multiple roles while at Coastal but ended as a senior associate AD that played a key role in adding football for the Chanticleers.

Coastal's Executive Director of Football, Joe Moglia, was the head coach of the Chanticleers in the first meeting between the two programs in the FCS playoffs in 2011, a 63-35 ODU win. Prior to joining Coastal, Moglia was hired as the head coach of the Virginia Beach based Virginia Destroyers of the UFL. Before coaching a game for the Destroyers he became the head coach for the Omaha Nighthawks of the same league. He coached the Nighthawks for a year before getting hired at Coastal.

Sixth Year Monarchs

For the third-straight year, Old Dominion will have multiple players in their sixth year on a college campus. Two of the players have spent all six years at ODU, while the other two have transferred in. Isaiah Spencer and Leroy Thomas have spent all six years at ODU, while Jahlil Taylor and Chris Chernak are in their sixth year and have transferred in this season.

Spencer is the only player on the current roster that played in both of ODU's wins over Virginia Tech (2018 and 2022).

Kadarius Calloway and Keshawn Wicks took different paths to Old Dominion, but have made a nice combo at running back for the Monarchs.

Calloway signed with Alabama out of high school as a defensive back before transferring to junior college and moving to running back. Wicks had just 49 carries since coming to ODU entering the 2023 season.

At JMU, Wicks had 11 carries for 74 yards and a career long 36-yard rush, while Calloway had 17 carries for 65 yards and a touchdown.

Returning All-American Jason Henderson

Junior linebacker Jason Henderson had eight tackles and two tackles for loss at James Madison. It was the first time this season he had less than 10 tackles in a game and first since he had two tackles last season at App State when he was injured in the first quarter.

Adding to his tackling prowess, Henderson has improved on the tackles for loss department. He already has 15 tackles for loss on the year, surpassing his total of 10 last season.

Last year Henderson led the country in tackles in 2022 with 186. He led the No. 2 tackler in the nation by 39 and the No. 2 tackler in the Sun Belt by 51.

A week after becoming the first Monarch defender to score two touchdowns in the same game, LaMareon James clinched the win for ODU against Commerce. James intercepted the two-point conversion attempt with 28 seconds left to seal the win.

Calloway Runs Wild

Kadarius Calloway had five carries for 25 yards going into last week's game at Marshall. Against the Thundering Herd he had 11 attempts for 236 yards and three touchdowns. He is the first player in ODU history to record three runs of 65+ yards in one game and the first played in ODU history to have two 70+yard runs.

Calloway had 214 yards on those three touchdown carries. His other eight carries he rushed for 22 yards.

His 236 yards are the third most by a player this season and his 75-yard run is the 11th longest run this season by an FBS player.

About Old Dominion University

Old Dominion University was founded in 1930 by the College of William and Mary, the second oldest university in the United States. Established as an extension of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia, and Virginia Tech, Old Dominion began educating teachers and engineers. The two-year school rapidly evolved into a four-year institution, and was granted independence in 1962 as Old Dominion College.

Considerable growth in enrollment, the expansion of research facilities and preparation for the addition of graduate programs led the Board of Visitors to approve the name change to Old Dominion University. Now Old Dominion is a powerhouse for higher education with six colleges: Arts and Letters, Business and Public Administration, Education, Engineering and Technology, Health Sciences and Sciences. Old Dominion has offered master's degrees since 1964, became Old Dominion University in 1969 and Ph.D.s since 1971.

Big Blue

When ODU became independent from the College of William & Mary in 1962, while there was no official mascot, Old Dominion College took on a mace and crown as their symbols in publications and athletics.

Big Blue made his debut during a basketball game in December 1971.

Ironically, the first costume was more orange than blue, and when trying to dye the costume made it more grey-green than blue, the university had to hire a seamstress to sew on powder blue fake fur to approximate the school colors at the time. Through the 1970s and into the 1980s, Big Blue evolved from a fierce lion into a soft, friendly lion. By the 1990s and early 2000s, Big Blue has morphed into his current look with little changes over the years.

In 2011, Big Blue was voted as the Capital One National Mascot of the Year.

In October 2013, a seven-foot-tall bronze sculpture of Big Blue was unveiled in Webb University Center to start a new campus tradition. Students take their photograph with Big Blue at the start and end of their Monarch journey. The statue was conceived by the Student Government Association (SGA) and created by sculptor Richard Stravitz. Throughout their time at Old Dominion, students can rub Big Blue's belly for good luck and prosperity.

Ricky Rahne is in his fourth season overall and prepares for his third season on the field as head football coach at Old Dominion.

Old Dominion went 3-9 in Rahne's second season on the field but the wins were two of the biggest in program history. ODU defeated Virginia Tech 20-17 in the season opener, marking the second win in program history over the Hokies. A few weeks later, the Monarchs defeated Arkansas State 29-26 in the first Sun Belt Conference game in program history. Two weeks later on national television, the Monarchs knocked off previously undefeated and eventual Sun Belt Division Champion Coastal Carolina, 49-21 in Conway, South Carolina.

In individual honors, linebacker Jason Henderson led the country in tackles and became ODU's first FBS All-American, earning the honor from five different publications. Wide receiver Ali Jennings finished third in the country in receiving yards, while right tackle Nick Saldiveri was selected to play in the Reese's Senior Bowl, just the third player in ODU history to play in the most prestigious college football all-star game.

ODU finished in the top-20 in the country in a handful of categories, including 12th in red zone defense, and in what has become a cornerstone of the program, special teams. ODU ranked 10th in the country in blocked kicks, 13th in punt return defense and 19th in net punting.

In his first season on the field in 2021, Rahne took a team that went 1-11 in 2019, and did not play in 2020, to a bowl game. ODU started the season 1-6 and won five-straight behind Rahne's 1-0 mentality, to earn a bid to the Myrtle Beach Bowl to play Tulsa. ODU became just the third team since 1936 (AP Poll era) to start the season 1-6 or worse and win six games.

Rahne helped lead Zack Kuntz to first-team All-Conference USA honors at tight end and 12 additional Monarchs to spots on the C-USA honorable mention team. Kuntz finished second in the country among tight ends with 73 receptions, while running back Blake Watson became the first ODU running back since 2016 to rush for over 1,000 yards and finished 22nd in the country with 101.1 yards per game.

ODU had its best scoring defense since 2016 and tied a school record by allowing 20 points or less five times. Linebacker Jordan Young broke the 100-tackle barrier for the first time in his career and set the ODU career record for tackles with 350. The Monarchs finished third in Conference USA and 35th in the country in rushing defense.

Rahne has built the Monarchs on being aggressive on the field and that was epitomized by the special teams units. ODU tied for the national lead with four blocked punts and six total blocked kicks. LaMareon James finished the season ranked ninth in the country with a 29.4 yard average on kickoff returns, and was one of two players to have two, 100-yard kickoff return touchdowns.

During ODU's winning streak, the Monarchs outscored teams by a 36-22 margin, and became bowl eligible in the regular season finale, dispatching Charlotte 56-34.

Rahne was the offensive coordinator at Penn State for two seasons and on the Nittany Lions coaching staff for six years.

For the past nine years, Rahne (pronounced ronnie) has developed an increasing national profile as a key component of Coach James

Franklin's staff at both Penn State and Vanderbilt. The coaching staff has guided those teams to bowl games in each of the nine years and have won nine or more games in six of the last eight seasons.

Rahne spent six seasons at Penn State, including two as offensive coordinator. Despite having a new starting quarterback, Rahne helped lead the Nittany Lion offense to 34 points per game during that season, while six offensive players earned all-Big10 honors this season.

Known as a terrific offensive mind that can adjust to his personnel, Rahne demonstrated that again in 2019. Despite the loss of the No. 2 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft (Saquon Barkley), Penn State rushed for the most yards per game in the last 10 years at 204.9. PSU had nine players earn all-conference accolades, and the Nittany Lions led the Big10 with 42 red zone touchdowns, good for 16th in FBS.

Rahne was the quarterbacks coach in four of his six seasons at Penn State, as both of the quarterbacks he worked with were drafted into the NFL. In 2015, Christian Hackenberg (Jets, 2016) became the all-time leader in career yards passing with 8,457 yards, Three years later, Rahne guided Trace McSorely (Ravens, 2019) past that mark in 2018 with 9,899 yards. He also coached the tight ends in 2016 and 2017, guiding Mike Gesicki who was drafted by the Miami Dolphins.

Penn State has played in a bowl game in every year Rahne was there, including a 2016 Big10 Championship and 2017 PlayStation Fiesta Bowl win over Washington. In that time, Penn State has had four-straight seasons of at least nine wins, and the Nittany Lions are one of five teams to rank in the Top-15 of the College Football Playoff final rankings in each of the last four years.

Prior to joining Penn State, Rahne was the quarterbacks coach at Vanderbilt for three years.

Prior to Rahne's time at Vanderbilt, the program had been to four bowl games in 121 years of football, none in consecutive seasons. The Commodores were ranked in the Top-25 in the final polls in 2012 and 2013 marking the first time they were ranked in back-to-back seasons in program history.

He spent five years at Kansas State, starting as an offensive graduate assistant before coaching the running backs and tight ends. He helped the Wildcats to two bowl appearances.

Rahne started his coaching career on the defensive side at Holy Cross coaching the defensive line. The following year he coached the running backs at his alma mater, Cornell.

He was a three-year starter at quarterback at Cornell (2002), and graduated as the Big Red's all-time leader in completions (678), passing yards (7,710), touchdown passes (54) and total offense (7,994). He was inducted into the Cornell Hall of Fame in 2014.

Rahne and his wife, Jennifer, have two sons, Ryder and Jake.

ODU Drops Season Opener at Virginia Tech, 36-17

BLACKSBURG, Va. – Old Dominion's new offense at times looked explosive and quarterback Grant Wilson played well in his debut as a starter. The defense was strong against the run, and a young ODU team with 58 new newcomers often played with poise.

But the Monarchs made far too many mistakes, including three turnovers and a punt snap that went out of the end zone, and fell to Virginia Tech, 36-17, Saturday night before a sellout crowd of 65,632, the largest ever to see an ODU football team play.

ODU fell behind 9-0, 16-7 and then 23-10, in the first three quarters and each time pulled back within six points. But ODU was unable to get much, if any, pressure on Tech quarterback Grant Wells, and the Hokies pulled away in the fourth quarter.

The game's key play came early in the third quarter. The Monarchs trailed 16-10 at halftime and after taking the second-half kickoff marched 44 yards to the Tech 31, when they committed their first turnover of the game that proved to be costly.

ODU running back Kararius Calloway had the ball knocked away by defensive back Derrick Canteen and it was recovered by safety Nasir Peoples.

The Hokies then marched 69 yards for a touchdown that gave them some breathing room, with Wells throwing six yards to Ali Jennings for the touchdown that gave Tech a 23-10 lead five minutes into the second half. Jennings, the transfer from ODU, caught two TD passes for the Hokies.

ODU's offense then punched back. The Monarchs drove 75 yards, with Wilson rushing six times for 34 yards and passing for 11 more, on a TD drive capped by his five-yard pass to running back Keshawn Wicks.

But then the Hokies responded, driving 65 yards on a drive capped by a one-yard TD run by Wells that returned the lead to 13 points, 30-17.

ODU never got close to scoring again, and the Hokies kicked two late field goals to win going away.

The game began poorly for ODU on offense and special teams. The Monarchs committed three early penalties, their offense had poor field position and a bad snap on an attempted punt rolled through the end zone and gave the Hokies a 2-0 lead on a safety.

ODU's offense generated just 24 yards in the first quarter, which was all negated by the 24 yards on the botched punt snap.

Yet, for the game, the yardage was fairly even. Tech had 368 yards to 295 for ODU.

ODU's defense avoided major damage after a costly penalty on Tech's second drive when defensive lineman Amorie Morrison was assessed a roughing the passer penalty, then tossed from the game for targeting.

That gave the Hokies a first down at the ODU 14. Seven plays later, the Hokies faced a fourth and goal at the two, but the Monarchs held, as a Wells pass fell incomplete. Six plays later ODU's punt snap went through the end zone to give Virginia Tech a 2-0 lead.

Tech took a 9-0 lead on the first play of the second quarter on a 20-yard pass from Wells to wide receiver Jaylin Lane.

Wilson engineered a 12-play, 83-yard touchdown drive capped by his 16-yard TD pass to Dominic Dutton, a former South Carolina track sprinter from Glen Allen, Virginia playing in his first college football game.

Jennings caught a 10-yard TD pass from Wells to make it 16-7 with 2:03 left in the first half.

ODU's offense then went into the two-minute drill, driving 66 yards to the Tech five, where they faced second and goal. Unable to get into the end zone, the Monarchs settled for a 28-yard Sanchez field goal which narrowed the lead to six at halftime.

ODU Tops Louisiana in SBC Opener, 38-31

NORFOLK, Va. – Old Dominion opened the home and conference slate with a 38-31 win over Louisiana on Saturday night.

After bogging down in the second half last week at Virginia Tech, ODU's new up-tempo offense delivered as promised as the Monarchs rallied to upend Louisiana, 38-31 in their home opener.

ODU did not win this game until the final seconds. After a pass interference penalty gave Louisiana a first and goal at the 6, the Monarch defense stood tall. Louisiana quarterback Ben Wooldridge was run out of bounds for no gain on first down, and then tossed two passes that fell incomplete.

On fourth down, he rolled out to his left, and his pass intended for Terrance Carter fell short. A vocal crowd of 18,154 that waited through an hour-long delay because of thunderstorms, and was drenched with rain showers through much of the first half, celebrated loudly at game's end.

The game was tied at the half, 17-17, after the Monarchs surrendered a late second-quarter touchdown. ODU's offense struck quickly as Wilson threw 39 yards for a touchdown to Reymello Murphy, the sophomore junior college transfer from Fremont, California. That capped a 65-yard drive that took just two minutes and 22 seconds.

It was the first career TD reception for Murphy, who celebrated by catching a 61-yard TD pass two drives later that gave ODU a 31-17 lead with 4:33 left in the third quarter.

Louisiana trimmed the margin to seven after rolling the dice and going for it on fourth down and 2 at the ODU 14. Wooldridge tossed a 10-yard pass to Peter LeBlanc, and two plays later, Williams ran a yard for a touchdown.

ODU built the lead back to 14 on a 36-yard touchdown pass from Wilson to Kelby Williams, a sophomore junior college wide receiver from Houston, Texas, who also caught his first career TD pass.

But once again, Louisiana gambled, going for it on fourth and 6 at the ODU 37, and it paid off as Wooldridge threw a 37-yard TD passed to Jacob Kidobi with 9:13 left.

Louisiana took the ball 75 yards for a touchdown on the game's first possession, a drive capped by a circus catch from freshman wide receiver Harvey Broussard, who hauled it in one-handed at the left corner of the end zone.

On first down, Wilson tossed a 25-yard pass to Isiah Paige, then after the Monarchs rushed back to the line of scrimmage, he threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to Ahmarian Granger, the first career TD for the sophomore from Norfolk's Maury High School, who gloved the ball one-handed.

Louisiana responded with a 54-yard drive and a 28-yard field goal from Kenny Almendares, but the key for ODU is that on third down, after completing nine passes in a row, Wooldridge could not find an open receiver and the pass went out of bounds.

Three minutes into the second quarter, ODU's Ethan Sanchez tied things up with a 39-yard field goal.

ODU then took its first lead of the year on a well-executed 65-yard drive in which the Monarchs established their running game. Wicks carried the first six plays for 52 yards.

After Obie Sanni, the 5-9 redshirt sophomore from Aurora, Colorado, rushed six yards to the three, Wilson then faked a handoff and rushed untouched around the right end for a touchdown and a 17-10 Monarch lead.

Louisiana tied the score just before halftime, as Wooldridge dropped a perfectly-thrown ball to wide receiver Charles Roberts, who hauled it in for what appeared to be a 44-yard TD pass. After the replay, the ball was moved back to the one, but Wooldridge ran around the right end for a TD that tied the score with 11 seconds left and set up what proved to be an epic second half for the Monarchs.

Game Three Recap - Wake Forest 27 ODU 24

ODU Falls Late to Wake Forest, 27-24

NORFOLK, Va. – Old Dominion was on the cusp of a remarkable victory, yet another home upset over an ACC team, when things fell apart for the Monarchs.

After bolting to a 17-0 lead over Wake Forest at halftime and then leading 24-7 midway through the third quarter, the Monarchs watched as the Demon Deacons staged a second half comeback and held off ODU, 27-24 on a sun-splashed afternoon at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

But the Deacs trailed most of the game and had ODU's offense not bogged down in the second half, the Monarchs might have won.

The difference in the two halves was stark. ODU had a healthy 277 offensive yards in the first half but just 23 in the second. Wake was limited to 127 in the first, but finished with 409.

ODU quarterback Grant Wilson was often rushed from the pocket and that was reflected in his passing stats. He completed 11 of 26 passes for a touchdown and an interception, but the bigger stat was that Wake Forest sacked him 10 times.

Overshadowed by the loss were two remarkable plays by cornerback LaMareon James, the junior from Indian River High School. He electrified the crowd and an ESPN2 national audience by returning a fumble and an interception for long touchdowns. He became the seventh player in FBS history to return a fumble and an interception for a touchdown in the same game and the first to do it since SMU's Jordan Wyatt did it in 2017 against Stephen F. Austin.

Trailing, 17-0, Wake Forest opener the second half with an impressive, 75-yard drive capped by a 27-yard pass from Griffis to Taylor Morin.

Wake Forest was driving again near midfield when Griffis was hit in the pocket by Shawn Asbury and tossed a poorly-thrown ball to James, who broke to his left and to his right to juke would-be tacklers for a 66-yard interception return that gave ODU a 24-7 lead.

Wake Forest got a pair of 36-yard field goals from Matthew Dennis to close the margin to 24-13 at the end of the third quarter.

The Deacs then dominated the fourth quarter, and with 6:35 left, Jahmal Banks gave Wake its first lead on a 4-yard touchdown grab.

ODU got two more possessions but could not move the ball.

On the plus side for the Monarchs, the defense gave the offense one last chance to win by game by stopping a Wake drive at the ODU 40.

The first half was a defensive struggle as neither team managed to put together any sustained drives and ODU had two early opportunities which the Monarchs squandered.

Linebacker EJ Green intercepted a Griffis pass at the ODU 41 on Wake's first possession, but after four downs, the Monarchs were forced to punt.

Six minutes later, Wilson passed 57 yards to Javon Harvey, which gave ODU a first down at the Wake 25. On fourth down and two at the 17, ODU elected to try a field goal and Ethan Sanchez missed it wide right.

Then, two minutes into the second quarter, Harvey pulled a double fake to get himself half a yard beyond the defender and Wilson threw a pass into his arms that he carried into the end zone for a 68-yard touchdown.

Harvey did not catch a pass in ODU's first two games. The junior from Norfolk's Lake Taylor High School had three receptions for a career high 166 yards.

ODU was driving deep in Wake territory when a turnover handed momentum back to the Deacons. On second down from the 18, Wake's Evan Slocum intercepted a pass and returned it 58 yards.

The Deacs appeared to be driving for the tying touchdown, with a first and goal at the three, when the momentum again slipped back in ODU's favor.

On first down, Amorie Morrison tackled Griffis and popped the ball loose. It was touched by several players and dribbled up the field, where James scooped it up and outran several Wake players 80 yards to the end zone.

Sanchez's extra point gave ODU a 14-0 lead with 9:38 left in the first half.

ODU expanded the lead to 17-0 on a career-long 49-yard field goal by Sanchez that gave the Monarchs a 17-0 lead, one they were not able to hold onto.

And although ODU's running game wasn't particularly productive, Devin Roche, the true freshman from Baltimore's Dunbar High School, rushed for a career-high 86 yards on 11 carries.

ODU Tops Texas A&M Commerce, 10-9

NORFOLK, Va. – Keith Miller caught a two-yard touchdown pass from Josh Magana with 28 seconds left in the game, but LaMareon James intercepted Texas A&M-Commerce’s two-point conversion attempt to preserve Old Dominion’s 10-9 win on Saturday night at Kornblau Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

The game was scoreless at halftime as both teams combined for 272 yards of total offense.

Texas A&M-Commerce got on the board first late in the third quarter on a 43-yard field goal from Emmanuel Adagbon.

Old Dominion answered right back with a five play, 84-yard drive capped off with a 40-yard touchdown pass from Jack Shields to Dominic Dutton. Kelby Williams had the big play of the drive, catching a 37-yard pass on a third and five.

The Monarchs pushed their lead to 10-3 with just over six minutes left in the fourth quarter on a 22-yard Ethan Sanchez field goal. Williams caught a 39-yard pass to set up ODU inside the 10 for the field goal.

With just under six minutes remaining in the game, the Lions drove 75 yards in 11 plays capped by Miller’s touchdown to pull Texas A&M-Commerce to within one. On the ensuing two-point conversion attempt, Magana rolled to his right and his pass intended for Jabari Khepera was intercepted by James to clinch the Monarch win.

Shields entered the game with 11 minutes remaining in the second quarter and completed 14-of-20 passes for 258 yards and a touchdown. Williams caught a game-high eight passes for 197 yards and a score.

Jason Henderson had a game-high 17 tackles, three tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. Shawn Asbury had a career-high 15 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and a pass breakup.

ODU Falls Short at Marshall, 41-35

HUNTINGTON, W. Va. – Old Dominion’s football team bolted to a 21-3 second-quarter lead over Marshall and had a chance to beat its long-time conference nemesis in the game’s final minutes.

After exploding for 28 unanswered points over a 15-minute stretch over the second and third quarters, Marshall was forced to hold off a late Monarch rally to defeat ODU, 41-35, Saturday in a Sun Belt Conference game at Joan C. Edwards Stadium.

ODU’s Kadarius Calloway, a junior college transfer from Philadelphia, Mississippi, had a breakout game for the Monarchs. The former Alabama signee rushed 11 times for 236 yards, the second-most yards in school history.

Marshall led, 24-21, in the third quarter when a key exchange of three turnovers in a minute and 23 seconds led to seven Herd points.

ODU was deep in its own territory when a Shields pass was intercepted by Elijah Alston and returned to the Monarch 24.

Three plays later, Marshall quarterback Cam Fancher tossed to the ball in the direction of running back Rasheen Ali, who thought it was an incomplete pass. ODU’s Wayne Matthews III knew differently, scooped up the fumble and sprinted 55 yards to the Marshall 14.

However, on third down from the 13, Shields was intercepted by Marshall’s Elijah Alston, who returned it 85 yards for a touchdown that gave the Herd a 31-21 lead.

ODU stayed with striking distance largely because of Calloway. He rushed 69 yards for a touchdown midway through the third quarter to trim the lead to three, 31-28.

Marshall responded with a 68-yard drive in which Fancher completed six passes on six plays in a row. Ali capped the drive with another 1-yard touchdown run with 2:59 left in the third quarter.

Place kicker Rece Verhoff then built the lead to 41-28 with 8:21 left.

But then Calloway exploded again, rushing 75 yards for a touchdown just 12 seconds later that trimmed the margin to six, 41-35.

ODU had two more chances to take the lead, but a Shields pass was intercepted by J.J. Roberts with 3:53 left and a fourth down pass with 1:18 left fell short.

ODU took the early 21-3 lead thanks to two long touchdown runs and a fumble recovery by safety Terry Jones that led to another TD.

Shields raced 66 yards for a touchdown on the game’s third play. It was a designed quarterback keeper that caught the Marshall defense off guard. ODU sent all its receivers wide and with the Herd in man coverage, Shields sprinted for the TD untouched.

Verhoff trimmed the lead to 7-3 with a 42-yard field goal with 5:26 left in the first quarter, but then ODU scored twice to build its lead to 21-3.

After Jones’ fumble recovery deep in Marshall territory, Shields passed 19 yards to Jordan Bly for the touchdown.

Calloway then burst for a 70-yard touchdown run, the first TD scored by a running back this season.

Marshall scored on its next possession, a 57-yard drive capped by a 1-yard TD pass from Fancher to Cade Conley that was aided by a 47-yard kickoff return by Jaden Harrison and a pass interference penalty on ODU.

On its next possession, Marshall caught the Monarchs in a blitz on third and seven and scored on a screen pass from Fancher to Caleb Coombs that went 23 yards for the TD.

The Herd flexed their muscle on the first drive of the second half, going 94 yards on nine plays in 4:42 to take the lead, 24-21. Ali gave the Herd the lead with a one-yard touchdown run.

ODU Defense Shuts Down USM in 17-13 Win

HATTIESBURG, Miss. – It wasn't pretty, but on a night when the Old Dominion football team desperately needed to win a game, the Monarchs claimed a hard-fought victory on the road.

The Monarchs rallied in the fourth quarter, ODU's defense preserved the victory with a late goal line stand, to defeat Southern Miss, 17-13, Saturday night at M.M. Roberts Stadium.

It was an historic night for ODU linebacker Jason Henderson, who became ODU's all-time leading tackler, an impressive feat for the junior from Dingmans Ferry, Pennsylvania, considering he did it in 2 ½ seasons.

The Monarch defense staged a goal line stand with 3:53 left, stopping the Golden Eagles (1-5, 0-3) half a yard short of the end zone. Henderson made the stop on fourth down.

Trailing, 13-10, Wilson guided ODU to its first lead of the game.

On second down from the ODU 45, Wilson passed 39 yards to Ahmarian Granger, the sophomore from Norfolk's Maury High School, to the Southern Miss 16.

Wicks then rushed 16 yards for the touchdown with 11:16 left in the game.

Ethan Sanchez's extra point gave the Monarchs a 17-13 lead, and meant the Golden Eagles had to have a touchdown.

The Golden Eagles were oh-so-close to scoring on their next possession as they drove from their 25 to the ODU two, where they faced third and goal.

On fourth down, with the Golden Eagles in the Wildcat formation, Henderson hauled down Frank Gore half a yard short of a touchdown.

The Monarchs needed two first downs to run out the clock and got the second first down when Wicks appeared to be tackled short of the first down while sweeping the right side. However, he wiggled away from two would-be tacklers and swept the left end for a nine-yard gain and the clinching first down.

ODU's offense struggled early-on, and the Golden Eagles took advantage to take a 10-0 lead.

Southern Miss drove 71 yards to the ODU four, where the drive stalled. Andrew Stein then kicked at 21-yard field goal to make it 3-0 with 2:26 left in the first quarter.

After holding ODU on downs, Southern Miss then made it 10-0.

Mims, the Southern Miss punt returner, fielded a short kick without breaking stride and raced for an 82-yard touchdown.

Wilson then replaced Shields at quarterback, and quickly sparked the Monarchs to their first touchdown.

Wilson lofted a long pass to Kelby Williams for 78 yards, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for the Monarchs. Wicks then carried three yards for a touchdown 36 seconds into the second quarter.

On ODU's next possession, Wilson passed 40 yards to Granger, which gave the Monarchs a first and goal at the five.

Facing fourth and goal at the six, Rahne sent Sanchez to kick a 21-yard field goal, which narrowed the lead to 13-10 with 12 seconds left in the third quarter.

Game Seven Recap: ODU 28 App St. 21

Wicks Late TD Lifts Monarchs Over App State, 28-21

NORFOLK, Va. – Old Dominion won a big football game Saturday night against a storied program that required a ton of toughness and poise down the stretch. And in the process, the Monarchs took a huge step toward postseason play, and perhaps a Sun Belt Conference championship.

ODU drove 69 yards in 11 plays in less than three minutes to score the game-winner with 48 seconds left, a 16-yard burst up the middle by Keshawn Wicks, in a 28-21 victory over App State. It was ODU's first victory in four tries against its storied Sun Belt Conference rival.

Pressured out of the pocket, Wilson eluded a would-be tackler and saw Javon Harvey streaking in front of him. He passed 19 yards to Taylor to the App State 21. It was ODU's first fourth down conversion of the season.

From there, running back Keshawn Wicks took over, rushing for five tough yards up the middle, and then 16 yards for the touchdown.

App State isolated 6-4 wide receiver Dalton Stroman one-on-one against Harris on the final two plays, and heaved the ball to him in the left corner of the end zone. Although he gave up six inches in height, and more in reach, Harris knocked the ball away from Stroman twice.

They were the first two pass breakups of his career, and the second led to an on-field celebration in which he was mobbed by his teammates, and to joyous celebration in the stands among the crowd of 20,017, largest of the season for ODU.

The Mountaineers took an early 7-0, on a 1-yard rush from quarterback Joey Aguilar on a bit of an App State gamble.

ODU finally got its offense untracked in the final minutes of the first quarter when the Monarchs began an 87-yard touchdown drive.

Three plays later, Harvey hauled in a 24-yard pass and the Monarch offense was finally into gear.

Wilson was under pressure on another third-down play when he heaved an off-balance pass to Reymello Murphy, who caught the pass while laying on the turf at the App State seven.

On second down, Wilson faked a run and instead threw a short shovel pass to Kadarius Calloway for a three-yard touchdown pass. Calloway rushed 13 times for 104 yards and caught three passes for 20 yards.

App then retook the lead on another fourth down, this time fourth-and-two at the ODU five, when tight end David Larkins hauled in a TD pass with 5:49 left in the half.

ODU then scored on its next three possessions, including two in the final 2:41 of the first half.

Wicks scored from 20 yards to cap a 92-yard drive with 2:41 left. Ethan Sanchez' conversion kicked knotted the score at 14-14.

Then, after ODU held the Mountaineers on downs, the Monarchs drove 35 yards to the App State 30, the last play a 19-yard Calloway run, that set up a 47-yard Sanchez field goal attempt with three seconds left. He made it with room to spare and the Monarchs led, 17-14, at the half.

ODU expanded the lead to 20-14 on a 46-yarder from Sanchez less than five minutes into the third quarter, but the Mountaineers retook the lead on another fourth-down play.

This time, on fourth and four at the ODU 17, Aguilar lofted a perfectly-thrown pass to Kaedin Robinson at the back of the end zone. Robinson was only open briefly and Aguilar had to thread the needle with 4:03 left in the third quarter.

ODU had three more possessions. One ended with two sacks and a second when an apparent first down pass reception was ruled incomplete in the replay booth.

Then, with 3:46 left, ODU took over at its own 31 yard-line knowing that it had to score to win. And under immense pressure, the Monarchs indeed scored.

Game Eight Recap: JMU 30 ODU 27

ODU Comes Up Just Short at JMU, 30-27

HARRISONBURG, Va. – The game was supposed to be a blowout. James Madison, the nation's 25th-ranked team, was a 20 ½-point favorite over Old Dominion, a team that prognosticators had picked to finished last in the Sun Belt East.

But the Monarchs did more than play well. In a game that was not decided until the final play, JMU held off the Monarchs, 30-27, before a Bridgeforth Stadium record crowd of 26,239 and a national TV audience.

The Monarchs (4-4 overall, 3-2 Sun Belt Conference) rushed for 138 yards, the most JMU has given up on the ground this season, and if you take out sack yards, ODU had 174 rushing yards.

The ODU defense shut JMU out on the Dukes' last four possessions and quarterback Grant Wilson played his best game of the season, completing 26 of 36 passes for 277 yards and two touchdowns.

JMU (8-0, 5-1) led at the half, 14-10, in what had been a back-and-forth game when things went south on the Monarchs early in the third quarter.

A bobbled ball on the opening kickoff backed ODU up to its five, then a penalty drove the Monarchs back to the three. Wilson was then sacked in the end zone for a safety that advanced the lead to 16-10.

Then, what had been a defensive struggle suddenly turned into a scoring fest.

The Dukes drove 65 yards on 11 plays, with quarterback Jordan McCloud throwing three yards to Elijah Sarratt for the touchdown and a 23-10 JMU lead.

The Monarchs then struck right back, driving eight plays and 75 yards, with a 45-yard reception by Reymello Murphy the big play of the drive. The Monarchs appeared to score on a short pass from Wilson to Javon Harvey, but it was nullified by a holding penalty.

Undaunted, the Monarchs scored two plays later on another Wilson pass to Harvey, this one for 10 yards that cut the lead back to six, 23-17.

Reggie Brown hauled in a 21-yard touchdown pass from McCloud to build the lead back to 30-17 with 3:55 left in the third quarter.

ODU then took less than two minutes to narrow it back to six on a 21-yard run by Kadarius Calloway.

Ethan Sanchez then narrowed the margin to three, 30-27, with a 23-yard field goal with 10:14 to play.

ODU's defense gave the offense plenty of shots to win in the fourth quarter, holding the Dukes scoreless.

The Monarchs trailed by three with 4:36 left and began a drive that appeared to have potential.

Wilson passed 30 yards to Javon Harvey to move the ball near mid-field. But on fourth and 11 at the ODU 46, a Wilson pass intended for Isiah Paige fell incomplete.

ODU's defense held again and the Monarchs got the ball back at their 10 with 32 seconds left but the game ended with JMU forcing a Wilson fumble.
