## STORYLINES

- This is the first meeting between Buffalo and Old Dominion.
- Three members of the UB football team hail from Norfolk, VA, including running back **Kevin Marks** (Norview), cornerback **Isaiah King** (Norview) and wide receiver **Khamron Laborn** (Maury).
- **Taylor Riggins** has 17.5 career sacks, good for seventh in program history. He is a half sack behind Dave May (1983-86) and Malcolm Koonce (2017-20) for sixth place and a full sack behind Steven Means (2009-12) for fifth place.
- **Kevin Marks** is two rushing touchdowns shy of tying Branden Oliver (2010-13) for third in school history with 33.
- **Alex McNulty** (139) is eight points shy of Dallas Pelz (2000-03) for fourth place in program history in career scoring by a kicker.
- UB is one of only two teams in the country to not allow a sack this season (SMU). Quarterback **Kyle Vantrease** has only been sacked twice in the last 17 games.
- The Bulls lead the MAC in scoring offense (32.3) and scoring defense (21.0).
- **Kevin Marks** is 158 yards shy of becoming just the sixth player in program history to rush for 3,000 career yards.
- Tight Ends coach **Ron Whitcomb** was the quarterbacks coach at Old Dominion from 2008-19.
- This is Buffalo's first trip to the state of Virginia since playing at Virginia on November 13, 1999.

For the past six seasons, the number 41 jersey has been worn by a different player each game to honor the legacy of former Bull Solomon Jackson who passed away in 2016.

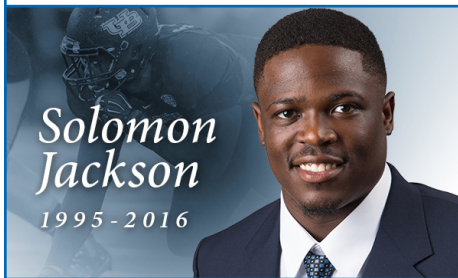
In 2016 and 2017, players were chosen by the coaching staff to wear "41" for the entire year. Cornerback Boise Ross wore it for the 2016 season, while linebacker Jarrett Franklin wore it in 2017.

This is the fourth season the coaching staff will rotate #41 on a weekly basis.

Solomon Jackson passed away unexpectedly following an offseason workout on February 29, 2016. Jackson, respected and beloved by his teammates, played both linebacker and defensive end over his career. The slogan ALL41 is a prominent fixture throughout the Murchie Family Football Center to honor his legacy.

### Bulls Close Out Non-Conference Play at Old Dominion on Saturday

The University at Buffalo football team will conclude non-conference play when they play at Old Dominion on Saturday night.

Buffalo is coming off a hard-fought 28-25 loss to #16 Coastal Carolina last Saturday. Defensive end **Taylor Riggins** led the Bulls with seven tackles, two sacks, three tackles for loss and two forced fumbles.

Old Dominion is 1-2 on the season and is coming off a 45-17 loss at Liberty last Saturday. The Monarchs are led by running back Elijah Davis who has rushed for 235 yards and two touchdowns on the season.

This is the first meeting between the schools.

### Welcome Back Taylor

After a breakout season in 2019, **Taylor Riggins** missed the entire 2020 campaign with an injury. The Bulls' defensive end is now healthy and returning to his All-MAC form.

Riggins was a first-team All-MAC selection in 2019 after posting 50 tackles, 10.5 tackles for loss and 8.5 sacks. He ranked second in the conference in sacks in 2019.

Riggins is tied for the MAC lead with four sacks through three games. He now has 17.5 career sacks - good for seventh in school history. He was named the MAC East Defensive Player of the Week following his standout performance against Coastal Carolina.

### Johnson Stepping Up

Since making the move from quarterback to wide receiver prior to the 2019 season, **Dominic Johnson** is enjoying his best season at his new position. Johnson was originally recruited as a quarterback and played the position from 2016-18. But with a crowded quarterback room, the athletic Johnson was given the opportunity to get on the field as a wide receiver.

Against Coastal Carolina, the sixth-year senior had six catches for 66 yards - both career highs. His six receptions were one more than he had all of last season.

He is the Bulls' second leading receiver with 11 catches for 120 yards. His 11 receptions are one more than the total from his first two seasons playing the position.

### Buffalo vs. C-USA

The Bulls are 6-8 all-time against schools from Conference USA. The Bulls beat Charlotte in the 2019 Bahamas Bowl, are 2-0 against Florida Atlantic (2015, 2017) and 2-0 against UTEP (2008, 2009). Buffalo is 1-8 against Marshall. However, those nine meetings were all before the Thundering Herd joined C-USA, with most coming as Mid-American Conference foes.

### Homecoming for Three Bulls

Saturday's game will be a homecoming for three Bulls who hail from Norfolk, VA. Running back **Kevin Marks**, cornerback **Isaiah King** and wide receiver **Khamron Laborn** are all from the Mermaid City.

Marks and King were teammates at Norview High School. Marks rushed for 2,364 and 36 touchdowns his senior season. King, who played wide receiver for Pilots, had 523 receiving yards and seven touchdowns his senior season.

Laborn, a graduate of Maury High School, scored 44 touchdowns over his career.

### Ball Control

Through three games this season, the Bulls have run more plays and won the time of possession against each opponent.

The Bulls ran 28 more plays than Wagner, 22 more plays than Nebraska and seven more plays than Coastal Carolina.

In terms of time of possession, the Bulls were +8:08 against Wagner, +4:00 against Nebraska and +3:08 against Coastal Carolina.

### Moving the Chains

The Bulls lead the MAC and rank 12th nationally in third down conversions at 54.9 percent (28-of-51). Buffalo was 8-of-13 against Wagner, 11-of-22 against Nebraska and 9-of-16 against Coastal Carolina.

Neon Quian

There were a lot of question marks surrounding the wide receiver position entering the 2021 campaign. Enter Quian Williams - a graduate transfer from Eastern Michigan.

Williams was the Bulls' leading receiver in each of the first two games. He had five catches for 96 yards in the opener against Wagner and followed that up with a 8-catch, 93-yard performance at Nebraska.

He is the Bulls' leading receiver with 15 catches for 212 yards.

In two seasons at Eastern Michigan, Williams had 76 catches for 983 yards and eight touchdowns.

Bulls Win Big in Linguist Debut

It was an impressive debut for head coach Maurice Linguist on September 2 as the Bulls easily disposed of Wagner, 69-7.

UB scored on each of its first 11 possessions of the game. The Bulls were in victory formation on their 12th possession. It was the third most points ever scored by a UB team and the most ever in a season opener.

The Bulls rolled up 569 yards of offense - 320 yards rushing and 257 yards passing. It was first time since 2014 against Akron that the Bulls rushed for

300 yards and passed for 200 yards in the same game.

Defensively, UB only allowed 97 yards of total offense, its fewest allowed since giving up only 84 yards against Hofstra on Oct. 24, 1992.

On Your Marks

UB running back Kevin Marks is in his first season as the Bulls' starting running back after splitting time with All-American Jaret Patterson over the last three seasons.

Despite only starting seven games over his career, Marks ranks fifth in program history in career rushing yards with 2,784 and fourth in program history in career rushing touchdowns with 31. An All-MAC Third Team selection in 2020, Marks is 1,209 yards shy of breaking Branden Oliver's school record of 4,049 career rushing yards.

Marks was on the preseason watch list for the Maxwell and Doak Walker Awards.

Home Sweet Home

The Bulls have built quite the home field advantage over the last few seasons. UB is 16-3 in its last 19 games played at UB Stadium.

### Vantrease Using His Arm and Leg

In UB's game at Nebraska, quarterback **Kyle Vantrease** lined up in the shotgun formation and surprised the Huskers by punting the ball. All he did was boot the ball 81 yards - tying the second longest punt in program history. It was three yards shy of the program record. It was also the fourth longest punt in the history of Memorial Stadium.

### Winning Ways

Since the 2017 season, the Bulls have more wins than any other school in the Mid-American Conference. Buffalo has 31 wins over that span. Toledo is second with 29 followed by Ohio which has 27.

### Linebacker U

UB has had a number of standout linebackers in recent years, most notably Khalil Mack who was an All-American and now an NFL All-Pro.

The Bulls have had 12 linebackers named All-MAC over the last 10 years, including each of the last 10 seasons. Buffalo has two All-MAC linebackers on its current roster. **James Patterson** was named to the first team in 2020 and **Kadofi Wright** was a second team selection in 2019.

Rounding out the list are Khalil Hodge (2018, 2017, 2016), Brandon Berry (2015), Okezie Alozie (2015), Lee Skinner (2014), Adam Redden (2014), Khalil Mack (2013, 2012, 2011).

### Nice to Meet You

The Bulls have three opponents on their schedule this season they are playing for the first time. Following the opener against Wagner, an opponent they haven't faced since 1987, the Bulls will play Nebraska, Coastal Carolina and Old Dominion - all first-time matchups.

### Back for a Sixth Year

The Bulls have six players on the roster who took advantage of their extra year of eligibility due to Covid and are playing their sixth year.

Offensive linemen **Jake Fuzak** and **Jack Klenk**, tight end **Jake Molinich**, wide receiver **Dominic Johnson**, linebacker **Kadofi Wright** and defensive end **Taylor Riggins** are all in their sixth year.

To quote Fuzak; "We are playing under our third president."

### Vantrease Back Under Center

The Bulls will have a veteran presence under center again this season as **Kyle Vantrease** will be the Bulls' starting quarterback for the third straight season. After entering the starting lineup midway through the 2019 campaign, Vantrease has started the last 15 games at quarterback for UB.

The Stow, OH native threw for 1,193 yards and eight touchdowns in 2019 and 1,326 yards and seven touchdowns in a Covid-shortened 2020.

Last season, he threw for 353 yards

against Miami (OH) and 365 yards against Ball State, becoming just the second quarterback in UB's FBS era (since 1999) to throw for 350+ yards twice in the same season (Joe Licata was the other in 2014).

In the opener against Wagner, Vantrease was 15-for-19 for 231 yards and a touchdown and was named the MAC East Offensive Player of the Week.

### International Flavor

The Bulls have six international players on this year's roster.

Buffalo has four players who hail from Canada, including **Dominic Johnson** (Ontario), **Cole Burniston** (Ontario), **Gabe Wallace** (BC) and **Deondre Doiron** (Ontario). In addition, the Bulls have two players from Europe, **Fabian Weitz** (Germany) and **Alain Schaerer** (Switzerland).

### Klenk Named Campbell Trophy Nominee

Sixth-year offensive lineman **Jack Klenk** is a nominee for the William V. Campbell Trophy. Given annually to college football's top student-athlete, the Campbell Trophy is also known as the Academic Heisman.

Klenk graduated Summa Cum Laude with degrees in communication and social science interdisciplinary. He posted a 3.823 grade point average. He is a currently working towards a masters degree in real estate development.

He is a two-time Academic All-MAC selection and earned the Mid-American Conference Medal of Excellence in 2021.

# HEAD COACH MAURICE LINGUIST

Considered by many as one of the top young minds in all of college football, Maurice Linguist was named the University at Buffalo's 26th head coach on May 8, 2021. It is a homecoming of sorts for Linguist who was the Bulls' defensive backs coach in 2012 and 2013.

"It's my honor to welcome our new Head Football Coach, Maurice "Mo" Linguist and his family back to Buffalo," said Alnutt. "He is a person

of high integrity, a great family man, a relentless recruiter and a proven winner who checked all the boxes during this critical time for UB Football. His ability to connect with young men and develop them to excel both on and off the field has been proven throughout his career. He is a rising star in this business who is more than prepared to lead our football program to greater heights. I'm extremely excited for the future of UB Football!"

Linguist is regarded as one of the nation's top recruiters and has excelled in coaching at both the Power Five level and the NFL. He came to UB from Michigan where he served a brief stint as defensive backs coach/co-defensive coordinator since January. He joined the U-M coaching staff after spending the 2020 season as cornerbacks coach with the NFL's Dallas Cowboys.

In Dallas, Linguist directed a secondary that forced 10 interceptions while allowing the fifth-fewest passing first downs in the league (180). The Cowboys were also ranked in the top half of the league in pass yards allowed (11th), completion percentage against (10th), and takeaways (ninth). Linguist coached rookie cornerback Trevon Diggs (three interceptions) to a strong first season in the league. Three of Dallas' four leading tacklers in 2020 were starters in the secondary, including former Wolverine Jourdan Lewis who set a career-high with 59 stops.

Linguist has worked with college secondaries at nine programs. Prior to heading to the NFL, he coached cornerbacks at Texas A&M (2018-19), defensive backs at Minnesota (2017), safeties at Mississippi State (2016) and defensive backs at Iowa State (2014-15)

At A&M, Linguist's secondaries limited opportunities for opponents and played tight coverage in key situations. Teams converted just 31.2 percent of third down tries (102-of-326) over his two seasons and A&M ranked ninth nationally in that category in 2018. The Aggies intercepted their opponents 19 times in his two seasons and made a habit of getting off the field. During the 2018 season, the defense was top-15 nationally in first downs allowed (221) and faced the fewest snaps against among all SEC teams.

Linguist helped the Aggies produce back-to-back top-six recruiting classes nationally in 2019 and 2020. He was the lead recruiter for five-star safety Jaylon Jones, the first five-star defensive back to sign with Texas A&M.

In his season at Minnesota, Linguist's secondary helped anchor a defense that finished No. 11 nationally with 174.5 yards allowed per game after listing 73rd in the NCAA a year earlier. The unit surrendered 16 touchdowns, a top-25 figure nationally and also ranked among the nation's best in first downs allowed (11th) and total defense (30th). Linguist was the lead recruiter for Rashod Bateman, the Big Ten's Wide Receiver of the Year. Linguist was promoted to assistant head coach following the 2017 season before accepting a position at Texas A&M.

At Mississippi State, Linguist led the safeties group which was responsible for seven of the team's 14 interceptions. Three safeties eclipsed the 50-tackle mark for the Bulldogs: Brandon Bryant (62, three PBUs), Kivon Coman (58, four PBUs), and Mark McLaurin (51, seven PBUs) were among the team's leading tacklers. The defense scored four touchdowns (No. 8, NCAA) and totaled 14 interceptions (No. 35, NCAA) during the 2016 season.

Prior to his time in Starkville, Linguist coached defensive backs at Iowa State (2014-15). He coached players to three All-Big 12 honors in his two seasons at Iowa State, including safety Kamari Cotton-Moya, a first-team All-American freshman team selection by the Football Writers' Association of America (FWAA). Cotton-Moya led the team in tackles and was named the conference's Freshman of the Year on defense. Linguist would help direct cornerback Brian Peavy to be a finalist for the award the following year.

In his time at UB, Linguist helped the Bulls finish second in the MAC East and reach the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl in 2013, at the time, the program's second bowl appearance. The unit ranked second in the league in interceptions (15), points per game allowed (24.4), and yards per game allowed (382.2). Linguist coached Najja Johnson to first-team all-conference honors and a career total of 38 pass breakups, second in program history. Johnson led the MAC in interceptions the year earlier as part of a Bulls unit that was tops in the conference in pass completion percentage allowed while ranking second in pass defense.

Linguist spent three years at James Madison, helping the program pull in the top FCS recruiting class during the 2012 cycle while the team reached the second round of the NCAA Football Championship Series Playoffs. Linguist's first full-time position was at Valdosta State, working with defensive backs and special teams. The Blazers went 9-3 and earned a No. 12 national ranking in Division II.

Linguist began as a graduate assistant at Baylor, his alma mater, working as a graduate assistant with the strong safeties and rover backs. During his career at Baylor, he was a defensive MVP and honorable mention All-Big 12 selection. He made 24 starts in 42 appearances as a strong safety from 2003-06. A native of Dallas, Texas, Linguist graduated from Baylor with degrees in communications (2006) and a master's in health, human performance and recreation (2007). He was an Academic All-Big 12 honoree.

Linguist and his wife, Stacie, have one daughter, Maura, and one son, Lance.

## BUFFALO 69, WAGNER 7

SEPT. 2, 2021 • UB STADIUM • BUFFALO, NY

BUFFALO, NY – It was a successful debut for new UB football head coach Maurice Linguist as the Bulls easily disposed of Wagner, 69-7, at UB Stadium on Thursday night. The Bulls scored on each of their first 11 possessions and never looked back.

Buffalo rolled up 569 yards of total offense and held the Seahawks to just 97 yards. The Bulls outgained Wagner, 312-18, in rushing yards. Seven different players scored touchdowns for the Bulls.

Quarterback Kyle Vantrease looked polished under center for the Bulls. The senior signal-caller finished 15-for-19 for 231 yards and a touchdown. He hit Jovany Ruiz in stride for a 63-yard touchdown on the game's second play to quickly put the Bulls ahead, 7-0.

From there, UB did most of its damage on the ground. Kevin Marks, Jr. rushed for a pair of touchdowns as did Dylan McDuffie. Jake Molinich rumbled in for his first career touchdown and Tajay Ahmed capped the scoring with a six-yard touchdown run.

Ron Cook, Jr. was the Bulls' leading rusher with a career-best 94 yards on 14 carries and a 6-yard TD. Marks finished with 72 yards to move into sixth place in school history in career rushing yards with 2,693. He also moved into fourth place in program history with 30 career rushing touchdowns.

Matt Myers entered the game at quarterback in the third quarter and his first pass was a 26-yard touchdown to Marylyn Johnson.

While the offense got most of the spotlight on Thursday night, the defense was quite stout. The Bulls had five sacks and nine tackles for loss in the game.

Taylor Riggins, who missed last season with an injury, led the way with six tackles and two sacks on the night. Newcomer Daishon Folsom was also strong up front with five tackles, a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss. George Wolo, Kadofi Wright (0.5) and Max Michel (0.5) also added sacks for the Bulls.

The 69 points were the most ever scored by a UB team in a season opener and the 62-point differential was the highest in UB's FBS era (since 1999).

BUFFALO, NY – It was a successful debut for new UB football head coach Maurice Linguist as the Bulls easily disposed of Wagner, 69-7, at UB Stadium on Thursday night. The Bulls scored on each of their first 11 possessions and never looked back.

Buffalo rolled up 569 yards of total offense and held the Seahawks to just 97 yards. The Bulls outgained Wagner, 312-18, in rushing yards. Seven different players scored touchdowns for the Bulls.

Quarterback Kyle Vantrease looked polished under center for the Bulls. The senior signal-caller finished 15-for-19 for 231 yards and a touchdown. He hit Jovany Ruiz in stride for a 63-yard touchdown on the game's second play to quickly put the Bulls ahead, 7-0.

From there, UB did most of its damage on the ground. Kevin Marks, Jr. rushed for a pair of touchdowns as did Dylan McDuffie. Jake Molinich rumbled in for his first career touchdown and Tajay Ahmed capped the scoring with a six-yard touchdown run.

Ron Cook, Jr. was the Bulls' leading rusher with a career-best 94 yards on 14 carries and a 6-yard TD. Marks finished with 72 yards to move into sixth place in school history in career rushing yards with 2,693. He also moved into fourth place in program history with 30 career rushing touchdowns.

Matt Myers entered the game at quarterback in the third quarter and his first pass was a 26-yard touchdown to Marylyn Johnson.

While the offense got most of the spotlight on Thursday night, the defense was quite stout. The Bulls had five sacks and nine tackles for loss in the game.

Taylor Riggins, who missed last season with an injury, led the way with six tackles and two sacks on the night. Newcomer Daishon Folsom was also strong up front with five tackles, a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss. George Wolo, Kadofi Wright (0.5) and Max Michel (0.5) also added sacks for the Bulls.

The 69 points were the most ever scored by a UB team in a season opener and the 62-point differential was the highest in UB's FBS era (since 1999).

## #16 COASTAL CAROLINA 28, BUFFALO 25

BUFFALO, NY - The University at Buffalo football team went toe-to-toe with the 16th-ranked team in the country, but came up just short to Coastal Carolina, 28-25, at UB Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Chanticleers looked the part at the start of the game as they drove 55 yards and scored a touchdown on their first possession of the day. However, the Bulls answered right back as they mounted a 12-play, 86-yard drive on their ensuing possession, capped by a Dylan McDuffie 2-yard run to tie the game at 7-7.

UB scored again on its next possession as quarterback Matt Myers rushed up the middle for a 13-yard touchdown to give the Bulls a 14-7 lead at the end of the first quarter. The key to that scoring drive was a heads-up play by Ron Cook, Jr. The junior running back scooped up a UB fumble and scampered 63 yards to the Coastal 21-yard line.

Coastal Carolina answered right back, scoring a touchdown on its next possession to tie the game, 14-14. The game remained tied at the half.

The Chanticleers scored on their opening drive of the second half to take a 21-14.

UB was able to get points on its ensuing possession as Alex McNulty knocked home a 36-yard field goal to cut the Coastal lead to 21-17 with 6:08 left in the third quarter.

Coastal Carolina took an 11-point advantage early in the fourth quarter and after getting the ball back and looking to score again, had an opportunity to put the game away. However, Logic Hudgens picked a good time for his first career interception. The sophomore cornerback picked off Coastal quarterback Grayson McCall in the endzone to give the Bulls life.

Buffalo capitalized as it drove 92 yards and scored on a 7-yard run by Kevin Marks, Jr. and got the two-point conversion when Kyle Vantrease connected with Quian Williams. The Bulls trailed, 28-25, with 2:41 remaining.

Unfortunately, Coastal Carolina was able to earn a couple key first downs and ran out the clock for the victory.

The Bulls relied heavy on the run game, rolling up 262 yards on the ground. McDuffie led the way with a career-high 92 yards on 15 carries. Cook rushed for 85 yards on only six carries and Marks added 64 yards.

Vantrease was efficient, finishing 13-of-20 for 146 yards. His favorite target was Dominic Johnson who had six catches for 66 yards, both career highs. Cook and Williams each added a pair of catches for the Bulls.

The defense held the Chanticleers' high-octane offense to a season-low 444 yards of total offense, including a season-low 212 yards on the ground.

Defensive end Taylor Riggins was a beast for the Bulls, finishing with seven tackles, two sacks, three tackles for loss and two forced fumbles. It was the second straight double-digit tackle performance for James Patterson as the senior linebacker finished with 11 stops. Safety E.J. Brown had a career-high 10 tackles in the game.

# University History

## Here is how the years add up to something big.

Through a steady succession of big ideas, big ventures and big achievements, UB has advanced dramatically over the past century and a half. Starting in 1846 as a small, private medical school, we've grown to become the largest institution in the State University of New York system, and we're charging toward world renown as a top-rated public research university. Our history is proud and prodigious—just like UB itself.

### Through continual growth

**1** First was medicine, then pharmacy, followed by law and dentistry: UB in its earliest days was a series of professional schools. The creation of the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) in 1913 made the university all the richer with its focus on the arts and humanities, natural sciences and social sciences. Students today can choose from 13 schools and colleges, of which CAS is the largest, with 27 departments.

### By breaking new ground

**2** As UB has evolved through the decades, so has our physical presence. The original downtown medical school moved north in 1953 to join the largely E.B. Green-designed Main Street Campus (now the South Campus). Land for the North Campus in suburban Amherst was purchased in 1964. Our newest campus, in downtown Buffalo, has brought the medical school full circle, this time to anchor the city's first academic medical center.

1846: The UB Medical School is founded in downtown Buffalo

1886: The School of Pharmacy is established, with the schools of law and dentistry to follow

1930: UB more fully coalesces on what is now known as the South Campus

1953: UB opens three dormitories to become a residential university

1962: The University of Buffalo merges with the State University of New York

1968: Ground is broken in Amherst on what will become UB's largest campus

2013: Ground is broken in downtown Buffalo for the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences

#### DID YOU KNOW?

UB has presidential connections! Millard Fillmore, a lawyer and congressman, was named UB's first chancellor in 1846. Still acting in that capacity, he was sworn in as 13th president of the United States on July 10, 1850.

### Through pioneering progress

**3** Major discoveries are nothing new to UB. From the invention of the implantable cardiac pacemaker to the sequencing of the genome of a common coffee plant, our history is one of continual breakthroughs and innovations by big thinkers in relentless pursuit of answers. Over the years, UB faculty have won the Nobel Prize, the Pulitzer Prize, the National Book Award, the National Medal of Science and the National Medal of Technology.

### With an ever-expanding vista

**4** UB has always been international in outlook and reach. In 1980, we were the first U.S. university to partner with a Chinese university following the normalization of relations between the two countries, and have since founded ongoing partnerships in Singapore, India, Poland, Latvia, Japan and Canada. Meanwhile, UB is consistently among the top 20 universities in the country for international student enrollment.

### With an eye on the future

**5** Throughout the years, leadership has maintained an ever-evolving and ambitious vision for UB. "UB 2020" was launched in 2004 to increase our economic impact, invest in student growth, foster innovative partnerships and advance research that improves life for people across the globe. The related Communities of Excellence initiative, launched in 2015, leverages our passion for innovation and commitment to collaboration to address the most challenging issues facing the planet today.
