Gateway Grappling

For the second straight year, the Monarchs qualified a program-high to the NCAA Tournament, with six participants. ODU had three conference champions, plus two more earn automatic bids with their performances. Junior Kyle Hutter earned an at-large bid awarded by the NCAA Committee.

Leading the way for ODU are returning All-American James Nicholson (35-2; ranked 6th) and lone senior Ryan Williams (35-2; ranked 3rd). Both won their weight at the CAA Tournament for the second straight year and neither has lost since January 9.

The other Qualifiers are CAA Champion Chris Brown (27-6; ranked 9th), Jesse Strawn (33-11; ranked 16th), and Eric Decker (26-17). The Monarchs have six of the CAA's 25 NCAA Qualifiers in St. Louis for the tournament.

Wrestling is set to begin at 11:00 am on Thursday, March 19, and session II will begin at 6:30 pm. On Friday, wrestling begins at 10:00 am with Session IV is at 6:00 pm. The All-American round begins at 5:30 on Saturday.

Halting Hofstra

At the CAA Duals the Monarchs halted Hofstra's 63-match conference unbeaten streak by defeating the Pride, 17-15. The streak dated back to the 98-99 season when the Pride was a member of the ECWA and continued through their joining the CAA in the 01-02 season. It was the first ever Colonial Athletic Association loss the Pride suffered.

About the Monarchs

Old Dominion has been nationally ranked since the pre-season polls, marking the first time in school history the Monarchs were ranked headed into the year. In the final two polls, ODU earned its highest ever team ranking, at 16th in the nation.

ODU posted 17 dual victories this year, including wins over #24 Kent State, #18 Hofstra, #14 Virginia Tech and Purdue, who was receiving votes in the national rankings. The Monarchs have suffered six losses, but all have come to nationally ranked opponents, including five in the top twelve.

ODU's lone senior this year, Ryan Williams, is ranked higher than any wrestler ever has under Coach Martin, coming in at 3rd in the country in his final campaign. The three-time NCAA Qualifier is 35-3 on the season and is now second on the All-Time ODU Wins List.

RS Sophomore James Nicholson is 35-2 this season and is also ranked in the top ten in the nation. He's already beat five nationally ranked wrestlers this year.

Nicholson and Williams lead the way in the top ten, while Chris Brown and Jesse Strawn are also ranked nationally in the Top 20. Kyle Hutter is also ranked by a pair of polls after falling out of the major rankings for the first time all year. Eric Decker is ranked by wrestlingreport.com.

All six of the aforementioned Monarchs were ranked in the final coaches panel rankings, used by the NCAA Committee to determine seeding and at-large bids for the NCAA Tournament. James Nicholson ranks the highest in the coaches poll, at 6th, while also posting the best RPI, at #2.

Champions Developing the Future

Head Coach Steve Martin has led the Monarchs to a 52-22-1 mark through his fourth year at the helm. In the CAA the Monarchs have dominated with a 22-5-1 mark. Martin comes from a powerhouse of high school wrestling in Great Bridge High School in Chesapeake. In 14 years as head coach, the Great Bridge Wildcats won 13 state championships.

Martin is assisted by Mike Dixon, Jon Sioredas and Matt Storniolo. Dixon brings great recruiting skills and knowledge of the CAA coming from James Madison. He has experience coaching championship contenders while at the University of Indianapolis.

Sioredas is a third-year coach with a wealth of knowledge about the sport. Named an All-American and ranked as high as 2nd nationally at the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga, Sioredas is now using his skills to teach.

Storniolo is mirroring Sioredas' career, jumping right into coaching after graduation. He was a two-time All-American at the University of Oklahoma, as well as the Big East Rookie of the Year at Penn State.

All four coaches are wrestling champions in their own right and are building a championship future.

About The NCAA Qualifiers:

Willy's Winning Ways

Ryan Williams, called "Willy" by his team and coaches, has been one of the most consistent wrestlers under head coach Steve Martin since he took over the starting job midway through his freshman year. He's the go-to at 141 lbs and is now a three-time NCAA Qualifier. In last years CAA Tournament, he dropped former CAA Champion and NCAA All-American Charles Griffin in the title match. Doing so, he was named the CAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler.

He has a career .769 winning percentage with 133 wins paired with just 40 losses. He is currently 2nd all-time in wins in ODU program history and needs just two wins this weekend to tie the all-time mark, set by Jeff Rusak at 135.

Williams is riding one of the longest win streaks in the nation, at 21 straight. He also has 26 wins in his last 27 matches. The senior ranks third in the country, earning the highest individual ranking ever under Coach Martin.

James Nicholson: All-American

After a run at the podium in last years NCAA Tournament, James Nicholson, a redshirt sophomore from Des Moines, Iowa, has led ODU with an impressive campaign this year. Named the Virginia Sports Information Directors Rookie AND Wrestler of the Year in 2007-08, Nicholson also earned CAA Rookie of the Year honors.

This season, Nicholson has not skipped a beat since finishing eighth at the NCAA Tournament, going 35-2 this season. He has beat five nationally ranked opponents, including #5 Obenson Blanc (Ok State) and #7 Scotti Sentes (Central Michigan) and he himself has been ranked in the top ten all season long.

Nicholson boasts the #2 RPI in the country, having faced an extremely difficult schedule. He went 14-2 in the regular season against 2009 NCAA Qualifiers and will be looking for a consecutive All-American honor.

Hometown Brown

Redshirt sophomore Chris Brown, from nearby Chesapeake, Virginia, has again impressed onlookers in his third year. Earlier this season, Brown bested the national number one, Nick Marable (Missouri), in an overtime thriller. The win comes a year after, almost to the day, his win over #1 Mark Perry (Iowa) in his sophomore season. He added another top ten topple to his belt later in the year, posting a sudden victory win over #9 Luke Manuel (Purdue).

The big wins powered Brown into the top ten for the first time in his career and has ranked as high as ninth this season. In almost three complete years of wrestling, he has piled up 102 career wins, posting a 75% win percentage. Brown finished second at the Michigan State Open earlier this season and won his second consecutive CAA Championship last weekend.

Decking the Competition

Junior transfer Eric Decker has made his mark in his first year in a Monarch singlet, earning his second career trip to the NCAA Tournament. Decker qualified as a freshman for the Virginia Tech Hokies and will head to the NCAA Tournament two years later for the Monarchs.

Decker has faced stiff competition this year, including 17 matches against this years tournament field at 174 lbs. He won five of those matches and lost by no more than two points in all but two of them. He has battled with the best in the country and will likely have a shot at a solid tournament in St. Louis.

Decker finished his first year for the Monrchs with an 26-18 record overall, including three major decisions and one pin.

Second Straight for Strawn

Last season, Jesse Strawn earned a trip to the NCAA Tournament at 184 lbs and will return this season at his new weight, the 197 lb class. Jesse boasts the most regular season bouts against 2009 NCAA Qualifiers for the Monarchs, wrestling in 19 matches against the field. He won nine of those bouts, including the most impressive win of his career, a pin of 7th ranked Hudson Taylor from Maryland.

Strawn leads the team in pins with 13, and is one of three Monarch wrestlers to post a 30-win season. Sixteen of his 33 wins have come in bonus-point fashion as he has helped lead ODU to one of its finest seasons in school history.

The Monarchs 197-pounder went 0-2 in his first appearance at the Big Dance and will look to improve on that this season.

At-Large Qualifier: Kyle Hutter

Kyle Hutter was able to breathe a sigh of relief last week as the Monarchs 133-pounder was named as an at-large qualifier for the NCAA Tournament. He became the sixth NCAA Qualifier for the Monarchs as they send six for the second year in a row.

Hutter earned the trip after going 22-12 this season with ten bonus point victories. He had five pins, four major decisions and one technical fall on the year. He also beat 2009 NCAA Qualifiers David Marble (Bucknell) and Conor Beebe (Central Michigan).

Last season, Hutter went 1-2 in his first ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament. He faced 11-seeded Joe Baker (Navy) in the first round, falling 12-5, but bounced back with a 2-1 win over Stephen Hromada (Chattanooga) in the wrestlebacks. Reece Humphrey (Ohio State) won in the second round of consolations to bounce Hutter from the tournament.

ODU opened the 2008-09 season with an impressive showing at the Michigan State Open, especially from senior Ryan Williams at 141 lbs. Williams won the weight class at the MSU Open and in doing so, broke the 100-win mark for his career, becoming just the eighth Monarch in school history to reach the 100-win plateau. Kyle Hutter defeated Bucknell's nationally ranked David Marble for the second time in his career in the tournament and faced the #3 133-pounder, Franklin Gomez (Michigan State). Chris Brown (165) and Joey Metzler (149) placed as well, while Joe Budi made a run in the freshman/sophomore bracket for a second place finish in his first career tournament.
