#CAAHOOPS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

PRECIOUS HALL Redshirt Senior | Guard | Tallahassee, Fla. James Madison University



Redshirt senior guard Precious Hall made her return to the hardwood in a big way for James Madison, averaging 31.5 points, 5.0 rebounds, and 1.5 assists in two games. Hall a career-high 39 points against No. 13/14 Tennessee, her first game back to action after missing the 2015-16 season due to injury. The

mark was the second-highest single-game total in JMU history. She led the Dukes against St. Francis Brooklyn with 24 points, including 13 of the first 17 JMU points in the contest.

In her first weekend as a JMU Duke, guard Kamiah Smalls averaged 15.5 points on 63.2 percent shooting and 9.5 rebounds in two games. In her collegiate debut against No. 13/14 Tennessee, she notched a double-double posting 15 points and a team-high 12 rebounds. She followed that up with seven rebounds and 16

points on 6-of-9 shooting from the floor and a 4-for-4 performance from the free-throw line against St. Francis Brooklyn.

#CAAHOOPS REWIND

- College of Charleston (0-1): The Cougars opened the year with a tough loss to Charlotte. Bre Bolden pawed away a career-best eight steals, which vaulted her to the top of the CofC's career steals list (243). Bolden also added a team-high 16 points as well as eight rebounds. Redshirt junior Tanisha Brown added 10 points and 12 rebounds for her first double-double of the year.
- Delaware (1-0): The Blue Hens opened the year with a 67-51 win over George Mason. Four
 players were in double digits, including Sade Chatman, who had 15 points, nine rebounds and
 seven assists and sophomore Nicole Enabosi, who had 15 points and seven points. Rookie Bailey
 Kargo had 10 points in the win.
- Drexel (2-0): The Dragons went 2-0 to open the season, picking up an 83-60 win over Penn State and a 69-44 victory over Delaware State. Senior Jessica Pellechio averaged 20 points over the two games. She matched a career high with 30 points, with a program-record eight three-pointers, against Penn State. She added 10 points and a career-high eight against Delaware State. Rookie Bailey Greenberg started both of Drexel's games to open the season, averaging 10.5 points per game. She's the first Dragon to reach double-digit scoring in her first two games as a freshman since Gabriela Marginean in 2007-08.
- Hofstra (1-0): Junior Ashunae Durant picked up right where she left off last season, posting a game-high 19 points to help the Pride to a 62-42 win over Marist in the season opener. Rookie guard Sandra Karsten got her first taste of collegiate action on Friday, scoring eight points and picking up a rebound in 15 minutes. Sydni Epps got the starting nod as well, grabbing 11 boards.
- James Madison (1-1): The Dukes went 1-1 to open the season, falling to No. 13/14 Tennessee at the Convocation Center before defeating St. Francis Brooklyn to give Head Coach Sean O'Regan his first win at the helm. The Dukes also announced that 2016 CAA Rookie of the Year Kayla Cooper-Williams would miss all of 2016-17 with a torn ACL which she sustained in the preseason.
- UNCW (1-0): It was a total team effort in the Seahawks' 64-56 win over Norfolk State, with 10 of the 12 players who saw action scoring at least one point. Junior transfer Jenny DeGraaf had a memorable debut, setting career highs by scoring 15 points and grabbing 15 rebounds in the. Rebekah Banks just missed a double-double, finishing with 10 rebounds and nine points.
- Northeastern (2-0): The Huskies are off to a 2-0 start for the seconds-straight season, picking up a 78-59 win over Boston University and an 83-59 road win at Canisius. Sophomore guard Jess Genco averaged 22.0 points, 6.0 assists and 4.0 rebounds in the win victories. She scored 27 points in the season-opening win over BU, tying the program single-game record with seven three-pointers. Head coach Kelly Cole is 5-0 all-time at Northeastern (three seasons) during the opening weekend of the season.
- Towson (1-0): Senior Raven Bankston led the Tigers to their first win in a season opener since the 2012-13 season. She exploded for 31 points, on 11-of-15 shooting, with four steals, three assists and two rebounds. Bankston's performance allowed the Tigers to score their most points in a game since 2003-04 in the 90-56 win over UMass Lowell.
- William & Mary (0-1): Three players scored in double-figures, but the William & Mary was clipped by St. John's. Seniors Marlena Tremba and Alexandra Masaquel led the way with 13 points apiece. Tremba added four assists, and three rebounds, while Masaquel chipped in with a career-high eight steals, picking up four boards, and an assist. Junior Abby Rendle added 10 points, while adding seven rebounds in her first game since January 22, 2016. Dating back to last year it is the eighth straight game in which Rendle has scored in double-figures.

#CAAHOOPS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- The CAA is 9-4 in non-league play to start the season.
- The CAA went a combined 61-56 against non-conference opponents in 2015-16.

TIP-OFF TIME

- The CAA went a combined 9-4 on opening weekend.
- The 2016-17 season tipped off on November 11 with seven games, six of which were home games. The CAA went 5-2 in those contests, including 5-1 at home.

HOME SWEET HOME

- The CAA is 8-3 at home so far this season.
- Collectively, CAA teams went 85-54 at home in 2015-16. In non-league play, the CAA was 35-15 at home last season.
- James Madison had its 16-game home win streak snapped by No. 13/14 Tennessee on November 11.
- The Dukes have welcomed 2,000+ fans to the JMU Convocation Center in 41 consecutive games.
- In six seasons under Head Coach Charlotte Smith, the Phoenix is 53-18 at Alumni Gym and have never lost more than five home games in a single season.

WEEKLY REPORT

SOLID STARTS

• For the second straight year, Northeastern is off to a 2-0 start. Last season, NU got off to its first 3-0 start in 33 years (1982-83).

#CAAHOOPS IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

- Elon is the CAA's representative in the 2016 Preseason WNIT.
- The Phoenix drew a road game with Green Bay in the first round on November 11 and fell, 74-53.
- Elon travels to Mount Pleasant, Mich. for the consolation rounds. The Phoenix take on Eastern Washington on November 18 followed by either Central Michigan or Furman on November 19.
- Elon is one of 16 teams that selected to participate in the field which includes: Abilene Christian (Southland); Central Michigan (MAC); Colorado State (MWC); Eastern Washington (Big Sky); Fordham (Atlantic 10); Furman (Southern); Green Bay (Horizon); Little Rock (Sun Belt); Missouri (SEC); Nebraska (Big Ten); North Texas (C-USA); Notre Dame (ACC); Omaha (Summit), UT-Rio Grande Valley (WAC); and Washington (Pac-12).
- Last season, Drexel University represented the CAA in the Preseason WNIT, advancing to the second round after defeating Dartmouth in Philadelphia. Drexel fell at No. 19/20 South Florida in the second round, but posted a victory at home over St. Bonaventure in the consolation bracket.
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 13-16 in Preseason WNIT action.

THE BIG 3-0

- Three players registered 30-point efforts on opening night.
- JMU's Precious Hall, the CAA Preseason Player of the Year, poured in 39 points in the loss to No. 13/14
 Tennessee.
- Towson's Raven Bankston posted 31 points in the 90-56 win over UMass Lowell.
- Drexel's Jessica Pellechio dropped in a career-high 30 points, including eight three-pointers, in the 83-60 win against Penn State.

HOT SHOTS AROUND #CAAHOOPS

- CofC senior Bre Bolden picked up her 243rd career steal against Charlotte to set the Cougar career record.
 Bolden is the CAA's career active leader.
- Towson dropped in 90 points in the season-opener against UMass Lowell. It was the most points scored by the Tigers since the 2003-04 season. It was the 16th time in program history in which Towson has hit the 90 points.
- Drexel went 22-for-22 from the free throw line against Penn State on November 11. The percentage tied
 the CAA single record, but the Dragons are the only team to go 22-for-22 at the line.
- William & Mary's Alexandra Masaquel and Abby Rendle are both riding double-digit scoring streaks going back to last season. Masaquel has scored in 10 straight while Rendle has scored in eight straight.

TWO TEAMS SELECTED FOR CANCUN CHALLENGE

- Northeastern and James Madison are two of 10 teams that will open next basketball season in the 2016
 Cancun Challenge in Puerto Aventuras, Mexico, as announced by tournament officials on February 10.
- The Dukes will face Idaho State and Iowa as part of the Riviera Division in pre-set matchups. Davidson,
 Toledo and UCLA comprise the rest of the division. JMU will be making its fourth trip to the tournament (2008, 2010,2012).
- Northeastern will play in the tournament's Mayan Division along with Stanford, Purdue, and Wichita State. The Huskies will play three round-robin games against those opponents, November 24-26, with official start times being announced later this year.

#CAAHOOPS TV PACKAGE ON THE ASN

- The CAA Women's Basketball television package features five games on the American Sports Network.
- The package begins on January 15 with Drexel at Elon at 3 p.m.
- Elon, James Madison, and Drexel will be featured twice while Delaware, Hofstra and William & Mary will
 also make an appearance.

CAA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP FUTURE SITES ANNOUNCED

- The future sites of the next three CAA Women's Basketball Championships were announced by the league.
- The tournament returns to campus sites with James Madison hosting in 2017, Drexel hosting in 2018, and Delaware hosting in 2019.
- The CAA Women's Basketball Championship has been held at 10 different sites in the league's 31 years.
- The tournament was last held on campus in 2010 before moving to the Show Place Arena in 2012.
- James Madison has hosted the CAA Championship on six occasions, with the last time coming in 2010.
 Delaware has hosted the CAA Championship twice in 2007 and 2008. This will be the first time Drexel has hosted CAA postseason action.

HIGH SCORERS RETURN

• The offense in the CAA will be plentiful once again this season as 10 of the top-20 scorers from 2015-16 will be back on the hardwood for their respective teams. Out of that group, seven are seniors, two are juniors, and one is a sophomore.

TOP HONORS RETURN

 Eight of the 15 All-CAA honorees from last year return for the 2016-17 season, including the two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year, Bre Bolden from CofC, and the CAA Rookie of the Year, Kayla Cooper-Williams from James Madison. The 2014-15 CAA Player of the Year, Precious Hall of James Madison, returns for her final season after missing the entirety of 2015-16 with an injury.

#CAAHOOPS PRESEASON RUNDOWN

- James Madison was predicted to finish atop the conference for the fourth consecutive season.
- It was close voting at the top with the Dukes as the overall favorite with 76 points, Elon in second with 70 points and Drexel in third with 68 points.
- It was also close among the next four teams. Hofstra (49) was picked fourth, Delaware and William & Mary were tied for fifth with 47 points apiece while Northeastern was seventh with 41 points. Rounding out the 10 teams were College of Charleston (19), UNCW (17) and Towson (16).
- After missing all of the 2015-16 season with an injury, redshirt senior guard Precious Hall is back to lead James Madison and was tabbed as the 2016-17 CAA Preseason Player of the Year. During 2014-15, Hall averaged 20.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per game and was the unanimous choice for CAA Player of the Year.
