ON THE ROAD:

The ODU Football Monarchs hit the road for the second time in 2010, heading to West Long Branch, New Jersey to face the Monmouth Hawks. In their first road outing of the year two weeks ago, the Monarchs walked away with a 44-13 victory at Campbell. Overall, ODU is 4-1 on the road in their young history. In their inaugural season, the Monarchs went 3-1 on the road with wins at Jacksonville (28-27), Savannah State (38-17), and VMI (42-35). The lone setback away from the friend-

ly confines of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium was a 34-29 loss at Fordham. Other road trips this season include a return date with North Carolina Central, as well as a jaunt over the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel to face Hampton.

COACH TO CURE MD:

For the third year in a row, college football coaches nationwide will join together in support of the Coach to Cure MD program, which will be held during games of Saturday, September 25, 2010. The rapidly growing annual effort has raised more than half a million dollars to battle Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. On September 25th, American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) members across the nation, including both the ODU and Monmouth staffs will wear a Coach to Cure MD logo patch on the sidelines and college football fans will be asked to donate to research projects supported by Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy, the largest nonprofit organization in the U.S. focused entirely on Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. Football fans can donate to Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy research by either going online to www.CoachtoCureMD.org or by texting the word CURE to 90999 (a \$5 donation will automatically be added to your next phone bill). Last year, more than 5,200 college coaches at 351 different institutions participated in the Coach to Cure MD event.

BATTLE OF THE PUNTERS:

Monmouth currently sports the nation's leader in punting in Jack Daniels. Daniels leads the nation at 46.73. The Monarchs' Jonathan Plisco (Newport News, Va.) led the nation in punting last year at 44.84 per punt. He is currently averaging 50.0 yards, but does not compute into the NCAA rankings not having made the minimum 3.6 punts per game average through the first three games of the season. Of Plisco's nine punts in 2010, six have been 50 yards or more and three have registered inside the opponent 20.

WE'RE NUMBER ONE:

The o-line has certainly done its job in protecting Thomas DeMarco so far as Old Dominion is ranked number one in the nation in sacks allowed having not allowed an opponent to touch DeMarco. The o-line was certainly a concern for the Monarchs with a myriad of injuries having plagued the line during preseason. Among the changes the coaching staff had to make during the preseason was moving tight end Matt Carrillo (La Miranda, Calif.) to right tackle.

JERSEY BOYS:

"In all due respect," this note isn't about ODU's trip up to New Jersey this weekend. This note is about the new Nike uniforms brought out for the William & Mary game last weekend. The Monarchs warmed up in their normal dark blue jersey with white numbers, but right before kick head coach Bobby Wilder had a surprise for his team. Entering the locker room for one last time before the game started, the Monarchs walked in to see new black Nike uniforms with dark blue numbers sitting in each of their lockers.

CRYSTAL BALL:

Last Saturday's game was a glimpse into the future with its contest against William & Mary, a school that will be featured prominently on ODU's schedule as they join the CAA in 2011. Last weekend's game gave ODU a taste of the toughest FCS league in the nation. The Tribe also mark the first ranked team ODU faced in its young history. At game time, William & Mary ranked 12th in the FCS Coach's Poll and 13th in the Sports Network Poll.

NEARING THE CENTURY MARK:

Quarterback Thomas DeMarco enters Saturday's game with 962 rushing yards and crept closer to the 1,000 career yardage mark with 34 yards on 13 carries against the Tribe last Saturday. In 14 games as a Monarch, the redshirt junior Californian has totaled 996 rushing yards.

ABOUT MONMOUTH:

- The Hawks have had two weeks to prepare for Saturday's contest with the Monarchs after suffering losses to #22 Colgate (29-30) and Maine (23-31). Monmouth has only started a season 0-3 just six times in school history.
- Monmouth was one of two teams (Fordham being the other) that handed the Monarchs a loss in their inaugural season. The Hawks were ODU's only home loss in 2009.
- Monmouth graduated David Sinsi, who had a pair of touchdown runs to go with his career-high 41 carries and season-high 216 yards. He ended the season as the NCAA's active career leader in scoring, rushing yards and carries per game.
- Hawk quarterback Kyle Fraiser is averaging 172.5 yards per game having completed 30 of his 52 passes in 2010. In their last game, Frazier recorded a career-high in completion, attempts, and rushing yards against Maine. He accounted for 304 yards of total offense.
- Monmouth punter Jack Daniels currently leads the nation in the category at 46.72 yards per punt.

MEMORABLE CAREER MOMENT:

Kai Blanco gave the Monarchs a 6-0 edge over William & Mary with his first career touchdown reception. The 4-yard pass from DeMarco gave the Monarchs a lead over the #12/13 team in the FCS.

NUMBERS GAME:

With his 4-yard pass to Blanco for the first score of the game, DeMarco brought his career touchdown pass number to 28. Demarco also has 19 rushing touchdowns to his name, his last coming with a 1-yard jaunt over the endline for the final touchdown in the 44-13 victory at Campbell two weeks ago. He is currently ranked ninth in the nation in total offense at 299.0 yards a game.

BREAKING-UP IS HARD TO DO:

T.J. Cowart registered three pass break-ups, tying for the most in a game by a Monarch. Cowart has interrupted opponent quarterback throws seven times in his two years at Old Dominion.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS - PART TWO:

Punter Jonathan Plisco (Newport News, Va.) and defensive tackle Ronnie Cameron (Westbury, N.Y.) were honored as Players of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following the Monarchs' contest with William & Mary. The two become the third and fourth Monarchs honored by the awards program this season. At least one Monarch has been honored by the CFPA each week this season.

Plisco was named the CFPA Punter of the Week after averaging 53.3 yards on six punts, including a long of 75. To date, Plisco is averaging 50.0 yards per punt.

Cameron was named the CFPA Defensive Lineman of the Week after leading the Monarchs with 10 tackles, including three tackles for loss. Among his three tackles for loss were 1.5 sacks that gave the Tribe 11 negative yards. To date, Cameron has totaled 19 tackles, five tackles for loss, and a pair of sacks along with two qb hurries.

12th MONARCH MOMENTS:

There may be 11 Monarchs on the field, but the 12th Monarch is in the stand. Thanks to all the noise of being "Loud and Proud" from the 12th Monarchs at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium, the opposition was charged with 41 penalties last season and 15 so far in 2010.

OPENING WITH A BANG:

And no, we're not talking about the howitzer you hear being shot off before the Monarchs run onto Foreman Field. Old Dominion scored on opening drive in two of its games of the 2010 season. Last opening drive score was Marquel Thomas' TD reception at the 10:51 of the first quarter at Campbell made it the ninth time in the 13 game history of the program the Monarchs have done so.

DRIVING:

While ODU certainly wished there was a different outcome in the opening week 35-25 loss to Jacksonville, the Monarchs were ready to learn from their mistakes and moving on. Head Coach Bobby Wilder has noted that some of the biggest improvement you see out of a team occur between weeks one and two. Coming out in game number two, the Monarchs scored in the first three drives of the game against Campbell and held a 20-0 advantage over the Camels at the half.

CATCHING IN THE END ZONE:

Prior to the Campbell game, only Nick Mayers had more than one touchdown reception in a game - at Fordham (10/3/09) and last season at home against Campbell (10/17/09). In Saturday's win Marquel Thomas and Reid Evans joined Mayers in the category as each had a pair of TD catches.

PLAYING CATCH:

Reid Evan's eight receptions at Campbell two weeks ago were the most by a Monarch in a game. The previous high of six was held by Evans from last year's Jacksonville game, ODU's first FCS and road victory.

SEE COLBY RUN:

While everyone saw just how good Colby Goodwyn was running with his kick returns against Jacksonville two weeks ago, Goodwyn showed his skills from the line of scrimmage against Campbell. Late in the fourth quarter, Goodwyn carried the ball 14 straight times for 49 yards for the entire Monarch drive that set up Jarod Brown for a 19-yard field goal attempt that gave the ODU-Campbell game its final margin, 44-13.

AIR RAID:

Redshirt quarterback Thomas DeMarco passed for a career-high 334 yards in the season opener vs. Jacksonville, the first time he has passed for over 300 yards in a game. It was the fourth time he had a 200+ yard passing game of his ODU career.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS - PART TWO:

Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.) was named the National Kick Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) for the week ending September 5th. Goodwyn totaled 86 yards on a pair of kickoff returns in last Saturday's season opener against Jacksonville. He dashed 68 yards in the second quarter, the second highest return in the brief history of the ODU program. He currently ranks 12th nationally in kick returns at a 30.5 yard return average.

Thomas DeMarco was named Honorable Mention Quarterback of the Week by CFPA for the week ending September 12th. Against Campbell, DeMarco finished the game completing 26 of his 33 throws, including an interception. He racked up 273 passing yards for four touchdowns. He currently ranks fourth nationally in total offense averaging 338.50 yards per game.

TOUGHEST TICKET IN TOWN:

Response for Monarch football has been overwhelming. 14,377 season tickets were sold with season ticket applications made available in Feb. 2008. The school had to unfortunately turn away 296 season ticket orders for a total of 1,065 season tickets due to demand in the first season. The Monarchs enjoyed a 92% percent renewal rate for year number and went to the waiting list and promptly sold out of season tickets. A limited number of six-game packages were also available for purchase. Those tickets went on sale at 10 a.m. August 17th and sold out. Just under 500 tickets were scooped up in a little more than two hours. Tickets are also heavily in demand among the student population. Over 1,200 ODU students were in line when distribution began on Monday, August 24th at 8 a.m. for the inaugural game vs. Chowan on September 5th and over 2,500 student tickets were handed out on the first day. By the next night, only approximately 100 student tickets were available. The Monarch student population one-upped themselves this year as ticket distribution for the home opener vs. Jacksonville on September 4th were made available on Monday, August 30th at 7 a.m. and were completely gone by 2:30 p.m. that day. When the ticket windows opened, the line wrapped around the Ted Constant Convocation Center as head coach Bobby Wilder, his assistant coaches, and the 2010 captains were on hand to hand out donuts to those first in line.

2010 NOTABLE FIRSTS:

Linebacker Deron Jasper (Dunwoody, Ga.) had the first interception of the 2010 season, while Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) had the first touchdown. Both notables were also the first for each in a Monarch uniform.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING:

The Monarchs made history on September 5th when a three-year dream became a reality. On May 31, 2006, the ODU board of visitors voted to add football and 1,293 days later, the Monarchs kicked off their first season of Division I FCS play. ODU played an 11-game schedule, including seven home dates at the \$24.8 million renovated Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. The schedule was a mix of both D-II and D-I FCS opponents to help the Monarchs transition into not only its first year of football, but also to get ready for entering the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in 2011, the toughest FCS conference in the nation.

SO MANY MONARCHS, SO MANY OPTIONS:

In 2009, 16 different Monarchs put points onto the scoreboard. "It's not necessarily one or two guys who are forcing the defense to defend multiple personnel and different personnel groupings," said head coach Bobby Wilder. "It's making us a team that's able to do different things. We're not an easy team to defend on offense right now." Through the first three games of 2010, seven different Monarchs have lit up the scoreboard.

SERVING ON AND OFF THE FIELD:

For the second straight year, redshirt junior defensive lineman Chad King (Springfield, Va.) was selected to attend the All American Bowl as an escort for this year's high school athletes. King, who is a cadet in ODU's Army ROTC program, is a member of a unit that encompasses six different states and over 40 ROTC programs that are in South Carolina, North Carolina, Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, and West Virginia. Two cadets from the unit were selected as escorts with King ranked as number one cadet of those nominations submitted due to his athletic and academic successes. While at the All American Bowl, King will serve as a mentor to the high school athletes helping to escort the players throughout the weekend to each event and give advice to those about to enter the college ranks about the experiences of a collegiate student-athlete.

"HUMBLE AND HUNGRY":

The theme for the 2010 team is to be, "Humble and Hungry". "We are proud of what we accomplished in 2009. Having a 9-2 record, a six-game winning streak to end the season, and being recognized as the best first-year program in FCS history is something we are all proud of," explained head coach Bobby Wilder. "However, we realize that last year's success will not make a difference in the score of our games this year. If anything, we realize our opponents will look at our team differently in 2010." "We have all decided as a team we will be Humble based on our success last year," continued Wilder. "We will be grateful for the support we received. We think often of the 20,000 12th Monarchs that filled Foreman Field for seven Saturdays last fall. We will realize that we had success because we worked together as a team to accomplish our goals." "At the same time, we have decided we will be Hungry for more in 2010," noted Wilder. "We realize our schedule will be more challenging. We realize we have set the bar high for future success and expectations. We want to be the best team we can be in 2010 and we will work to improve everyday as people, students, and football players."

The Monarchs' game with William and Mary on September 18th will be a "White Out" and the Homecoming Game on October 23rd against Georgia State will be a "Blue Out". The ODU Bookstore will be producing a game specific shirt for each game and will be available in the Bookstore starting in early September.

OUT FOR THE SEASON:

Sophomore cornerback Markwell Wilkins (Hampton, Va.) will miss the 2010 season with a torn ACL suffered while working out with Phoebus teammate Reid Evans last week. "You feel awful for the kid," said Wilder. "If there is a silver lining, he does have a redshirt year available." Last season, Wilkins appeared in all 11 games making 28 tackles, including 21 solo stops.

I GET BY WITH A LITTLE HELP FROM MY FRIENDS:

Head coach Bobby Wilder praised the improvement of his squad's communication this preseason, which is evident among many of the returning Monarchs. "What's great is that you see our veterans coaching up either the new guys or guys new to their position," he noted.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION - BSN ON CAMPUS:

Big Screen Network was on campus during the Monarchs' media day the first week of preseason to film many of the video elements fans will see up on the video board at today's game. BSN is an award-winning production company that has produced, developed, and directed in-stadium shows for nearly every major event in sports including the Olympics, NFL, and NCAA Championships.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS:

FOX43 and ODU Football have teamed up to debut The Old Dominion Football Show with Bruce Rader and Coach Bobby Wilder on Friday September 10th. Sponsored in its entirety by Priority Automotive, the weekly show will be broadcast every Friday night at 10:45 pm during the college football season exclusively on FOX43 and WAVY.com.

MAYDAY:

Last year coach Wilder would yell out "Sudden Change", throwing the squad into drills they sometimes were not expecting. Today "Mayday" was called out and that sent the PAT/Field goal team scrambling onto the turf. "If we need a field goal to win, don't have any timeouts, and say we were at third down and were tackled inbounds, we will yell "Mayday" and that alerts the PAT/Field Goal team to run out. We don't have time to call the protection, we just have to get set and kick the field goal to win the game."

ROAD TRIP?:

The Old Dominion University athletic department is offering season ticket holders the opportunity to order away-game tickets for the 2010 football season. The university will allocate tickets and assign locations based on the ticket priority order listing below. Requests will be processed based on priority points within giving levels, beginning with Royal Monarch members and on through Blue Lion members. All ticket orders must be received with payment three weeks prior to each game. Should any tickets remain after the allocation for donors, requests from non-donor season ticket holders, followed by alumni requests, will then be processed. To request season ticket holders' away-game tickets, click access the request form at ODUSports.Com. This form must be returned to the box office by the deadline noted above for the order to be processed.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN:

In a vote by their teammates, linebacker Craig Wilkins (Washington, D.C.), quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.), defensive end Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.), and defensive tackle Ronnie Cameron (Westbury, N.Y.) were named captains. Wilkins, who also served as a captain in the Monarchs' inaugural season in 2009, is ODU's returning leading defender having made 65 tackles, three interceptions, and seven pass break-ups a season ago. DeMarco, who is on the Walter Payton Award watch list, was the second leading FCS quarterback in rushing throwing for 21 touchdowns and running another 17 into the endzone. Mayo and Cameron both begin their first season on the Monarch roster after transferring from the disbanded Hofstra program and were among the Top FCS Transfers to Watch by The Sports Network

Old Dominion Suffers Season Opener Loss To Jacksonville, 35-25

NORFOLK, Va.-- Old Dominion quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) was 22 of 40 for a career-high 334 yards and two touchdowns. DeMarco added another score on the ground after a 1-yard run, but three interceptions - two in the endzone - prevented the Monarchs from cutting into Jacksonville's lead.

Just like how the Monarchs started last year in a number of games, ODU struck on the first drive. Drew Hareza (McDonald, Pa.) sailed the ball through the uprights on a 24-yard kick capping an opening 13-play, 66-yard drive to give the Monarchs the early 3-0 lead.

Back-to-back touchdowns by Jacksonville however saw the Dolphins take control of the lead and the Monarchs trying to be the "Comeback Kids" for the second straight time against their opponent from Florida.

Chris Kuck had a four-yard catch with 10:44 on the clock and on their next possession the Dolphins had the 14-3 edge. The second scoring drive for Jacksonville had the Dolphins backed up to their own 12, but that's when last year's leading rusher, Rudell Small, tore down the field for 45 yards and two plays later he was in the end zone.

Small would end the night will 118 yards.

Old Dominion, however, ended the half on a high note with the "one-minute drill". DeMarco connected with Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) for a 19-yard reception as ODU covered 50 yards on seven plays in 45 seconds. Gill's touchdown, the Monarchs' first of the 2010 season and Gill's first as a Monarch, cut the ODU deficit to 14-10 at the intermission.

Both teams traded scores in the third quarter. After ODU missed a 32-yard field goal attempt, Jacksonville followed with Josh Philpart on the receiving end of a 32-yard touchdown throw from Josh McGregor. Old Dominion quickly struck back though on the next drive needing just three plays to pull within four, 21-17.

Monty Smalley (Richmond, Va.) provided ODU with a 24-yard kick return to start the drive, Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) followed with a 21-yard run, Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) had a 31-yard catch, and then Dorian Jackson (Colonial Heights, Va.), who scored last year's game-winning touchdown, had a 44-yard reception to keep the Monarchs in the hunt.

The fourth quarter opened with Jacksonville going ahead, 28-17, with Dolphins covering 80 yards to end with Small scoring his second touchdown of the evening.

The Monarchs were immediately poised to cut into the deficit again, but an interception in the end zone put a stop to the ODU comeback. DeMarco threw a 34-yard pass downfield intending to hit Chris Lovitt (Stafford, Va.) in the end zone, but the ball got into the hands of Jacksonville's Andre Addison for the touchdown.

ODU's next possession would indeed cut into the deficit and have the Monarchs trailing by just three points with 8:23 left in the game. The Dolphin's Logan Chipperfield managed just nine-yards on his punt and ODU started from their opponent's 34-yard line. Getting to the one-yard line, DeMarco ran the ball and Jackson was on the receiving end of the two-point conversion. The Monarchs trailed just 28-25 midway through the final quarter.

The next Jacksonville drive lasted just four downs before the Monarchs had the ball back. ODU made its way down the field, but another interception in the end zone, this time by the Dolphin's Jordan Dewhirst, thwarted ODU's chances again.

Jacksonville made the most of getting the ball back into its possession, scoring on a 19-yard pass to Philpart, his second touchdown catch of the game.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

OPENING WITH A BANG:

And no, we aren't talking about the howitzer you hear being shot off before the Monarchs run onto Foreman Field. Old Dominion scored on its first drive to kick off the 2010 season with Drew Hareza kicking the ball through the uprights for a field goal. The Monarchs have scored in their first drive in eight of its 12 total games played.

NOTABLE FIRSTS:

Linebacker Deron Jasper (Dunwoody, Ga.) had the first interception of the 2010 season while Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) had the first touchdown. Both notables were also the first for each in a Monarch uniform.

WHO'S WHO IN THE BOOKS:

Colby Goodwyn's (Hampton, Va.) kick return was the second highest return in the brief ODU history. He dashed 68 yards in the second quarter. Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) is ahead of Goodwyn on the list having returned a 76-yard kick in the historic Chowan game last year.

AIR RAID:

Redshirt quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) passed for a career-high 334 yards, the first time he has passed for over 300 yards in a game. It was the fourth time he had a 200+ yard passing game of his ODU career.

INTO THE WIN COLUMN: Monarchs Down Campbell, 44-13

BUIES CREEK, N.C. -- The Old Dominion football team found the end zone on its first three drives and never looked back en-route to its 44-13 win over Campbell University at Lane-Barker Stadium.

The victory improves the Monarchs to 1-1 on the year as ODU played in its first road game of the 2010 season.

Marquel Thomas (Va. Beach, Va.) and Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) led the Monarchs with a pair of touchdown receptions. Evans caught eight passes, the most by a Monarchs, ending the game with 65 yards. Thomas had 61 receiving yards on five receptions.

Thomas, who scored ODU's first-ever touchdown last season against Chowan, put the Monarchs up 7-0 early in the first quarter. Thomas' 22-yard reception from Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) put the Monarchs ahead with 10:51 on the clock.

The Camels only got off four plays, before the Monarchs regained possession. After a touchback on the punt, the Monarchs covered the 80-yards capping the drive with a 10-yard touchdown reception by Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.). Jarod Brown's (Yorktown, Va.) PAT went wide right, but with 5:32 left in the opening quarter, ODU held a 13-0 edge.

Evans did it again on the next ODU drive. The sophomore receiver registered his fifth TD reception of his career opening second quarter action. Evans' second touchdown of the afternoon came on an eight-yard throw from DeMarco giving his squad a commanding 20-0 lead.

A personal foul penalty put the Camels into the red zone late in the second quarter resulting in Campbell making its first score of the afternoon. Campbell quarterback Daniel Polk, who scored the Camel's two touchdowns in their opener at UVA-Wise, broke the line for a six-yard run into the end zone.

The half ended as Campbell regained control of the ball on an interception. While two plays later it looked as if the Monarchs would have their own interception, the Monarchs were called for roughing the passer and momentum continued for the Camels. As time expired in the opening half, Campbell's Adam Willets had a 46-yard field goal sail through the uprights and ODU headed into the intermission ahead 20-10.

Thomas got things started for the Monarchs after halftime giving ODU a 27-10 edge on his second touchdown reception and third of his career. His eight-yard catch from DeMarco capped the 11 play, 52-yard drive.

Campbell put up a field goal in the closing minutes of the third quarter. Willets posted his second three-point kick, this time a 38-yard attempt, cutting the Monarch lead to 27-13 with 2:37 left in the third.

Old Dominion wasted no time in responding. On the third play of the drive, Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) tore down the field gaining a 47 yard reception and bringing ODU to the Camel 10. The next play saw DeMarco with the QB keeper to the 1 and then jump over the end line on the next play to put the Monarchs up 34-13 with just 42 seconds left until the start of the final quarter.

Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.), last week's College Football Performance Awards' Kick Returner of the Week, also got into the scoring mix. He had an up and over a pile on the goal line put the Monarchs ahead 41-13 with 12:48 left in the game.

Goodwyn, who saw a majority of the carries in the fourth quarter, finished the game with 17 carries and 58 yards.

Scoring continued for the Monarchs late in the fourth quarter. Brown's 19-yard field goal was good giving ODU the final 44-13 score.

Defensively, ODU's Michael Colbert led the way with seven unassisted tackles. Transfer Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.) made six total stops, including a six-yard sack. Andrew Turner also took down Camel quarterback, Polk, pushing him back 11 yards.

DeMarco finished the game completing 26 of his 33 throws, including an interception. He racked up 273 passing yards for four touchdowns. Polk had just 68 yards on seven of 15 passing.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

CATCHING IN THE END ZONE:

Prior to the Campbell game, only Nick Mayers had more than one touchdown reception in a game - at Fordham (10/3/09) and last season at home against Campbell (10/17/09). In Saturday's win Marquel Thomas and Reid Evans joined Mayers in the category as each had a pair of TD catches.

PLAYING CATCH:

Reid Evan's eight receptions were the most by a Monarch. The previous high of six was held by Evans from last year's Jacksonville game.

TD'S FOR TD:

Thomas DeMarco on his 1-yard jaunt over the end line give ODU a 34-13 advantage with 42 seconds left in the third quarter was his 19th rushing touchdown as a Monarch.

Late Score Lifts #12/13 Tribe Past Football Monarchs, 21-17

NORFOLK, Va. -- Gareth Hissong caught a four-yard touchdown pass from Mike Callahan with less than five minutes to play to give #12/13 William & Mary (2-1) a come-from-behind 21-17 win over Old Dominion (1-2) Saturday night in front of a sold-out crowd at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

On third and goal, Callahan rolled out and hit Hissong in the flat for the winning score, which was Hissong's first career catch.

Jarod Brown had given ODU a 17-14 lead with a 20-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter.

ODU came out firing, taking the 7-0 lead on a four-yard touchdown pass from Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) to redshirt sophomore Kai Blanco (Alexandria, Va.). The drive was set-up after Michael Williams (Norfolk, Va.) returned an interception for 17-yards setting up the Monarchs at the Tribe's 48. A 33-yard pass to Marquel Thomas (Va. Beach, Va.) brought ODU into the red zone and four plays later Blanco put the Monarchs into an early lead.

The Tribe had a pair of chances to cut into the lead early in the second quarter. First, David Miller's 31-yard field goal attempt went wide right. With Old Dominion starting the following drive on its own 20, William & Mary quickly regained possession on a fumble on ODU's 17 on the Monarchs' first play. The defense held, which included a nine-yard sack by Deron May (Hampton, Va.) and Ronnie Cameron (Westbury, N.Y.) that put the Tribe at fourth and goal on the ODU 17. This time, Miller's kick hit the right upright and ODU held on to its 7-0 lead.

William & Mary did tie the score in the middle of the second quarter, with Jonathan Grimes capping off a six play, 84 yard drive with a 30-yard touchdown run.

The Monarchs quickly responded as Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.) ripped off a career long 41 yard touchdown run to put ODU back on top and go into halftime up 14-7.

It took just one offensive play in the third quarter to tie the game, as Callahan hit Chase Hill down the right sideline, and he broke two tackles to go in for the score.

The Monarchs reclaimed the lead with 9:41 left in the game. ODU had the ball at first and goal at the Tribe's own two-yard line, but the Monarchs were unable to find a gap in the William & Mary defense to cross the endline. Jarod Brown (Yorktown, Va.), however, managed to get points on the board and put ODU ahead 17-14 with his 20-yard field goal.

The following drive saw Hissong's touchdown that capped an eight-play, 66 yard drive for the Tribe.

Jonathan Grimes led the Tribe with 124 yards rushing and a touchdown. Thomas DeMarco was 21-of-40 passing for 186 yards and the touchdown, while Mario Crawford was his top target with seven catches for 44 yards. Ronnie Cameron (Westbury, N.Y.) and Michael Williams (Norfolk, Va.) led the Monarch defense with 10 tackles each.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

MEMORABLE CAREER MOMENT:

Kai Blanco gave the Monarchs a 6-0 edge over the Tribe in his first career touchdown reception. The 4-yard pass from DeMarco gave the Monarchs a lead over the #12/13 team in the FCS.

With his 4-yard pass to Blanco for the first score of the game, DeMarco brought his career touchdown pass number to 28.

DEFENSIVE STAT LINES:

Michael Williams stat line for the night saw the redshirt sophomore linebacker rack up 10 total tackles, a 12-yard sack, two stops for loss of yardage, and a 17-yard interception.

BREAKING-UP IS HARD TO DO:

T.J. Cowart registered three pass break-ups, tying for the most in a game by a Monarch. Cowart has interrupted opponent quarterback throws seven times in his two years at Old Dominion.

Monarchs Suffer Lone Home Defeat of 2009 With 31-29 Loss To Monmouth

NORFOLK, Va.-- The Old Dominion football team dropped its first game of the 2009 with a 31-28 setback to Monmouth back on September 26th at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium's third sellout.

The loss was the Monarchs' first, as the squad fell to 3-1 on the year. Meanwhile, the Hawks, playing in their final non-conference contest, upped their mark to 2-2 overall.

Monmouth's David Sinisi, the nation's active leader in rushing touchdowns, had a pair of touchdown runs to go with his career-high 41 carries and season-high 216 yards. Sinisi and crew were also able to punch through on third down converting 11 of 16 attempts.

Old Dominion started the game off with bang. Within the first three minutes of the game, the Monarchs had a pair of touchdowns and the quick 14-0 lead.

Nick Mayers (Va. Beach, Va.) ran 55 yards on ODU's first drive of the game. Mayers started in place of the injured Marquell Thomas (Va. Beach, Va.), who missed his second straight contest with a knee injury. A minute later, Carlos Davis (Ft. Washington, Md.) then leaped over the end zone corner on Thomas DeMarco's (Palm Desert, Calif.) fifth touchdown pass of the year.

Sinisi drove in career touchdown number 56 for the Hawks' first score of the evening. Sinisi's eight-yard run brought the score to 14-7 with 9:34 remaining in the first quarter.

Monmouth scored again midway through the second quarter to send the game into the intermission tied at 14-14. With Old Dominion at the Hawks' 18-yard line on fourth and sixth, kicker Drew Hareza (McDonald, Pa.) came off the sideline to attempt a field goal. The snap was thrown past Hareza's grip, but he was able to gain possession of the ball. Under pressure from the Monmouth defense, he looked to get rid of the ball, but Hareza's pass found its way into the hands of Monmouth's Joe Valenti for an 11-yard interception return.

On the ensuing drive, Sinisi ran the ball on six of the Hawks' eight plays for 32 yards en-route to capturing his second touchdown run and career TD number 57 with 7:36 left in the opening half.

Monmouth took the lead at the 10:25 mark of the third quarter. Jake Delvento's 31-yard field goal gave the Hawks the 17-14 advantage.

Two drives later, the Monarchs would only need three plays to regain the lead. DeMarco's nine-yard rush for his fifth touchdown run of the year capped the 49-yard drive. Starting at the the Hawks' 39, DeMarco started with a 27-yard pass to James Edwards (Va. Beach, Va.) followed by Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) heading another 13 yards downfield to inside the Monmouth 10. DeMarco then crossed the end line on the third and final play of the drive that from start to finish too just 46 seconds.

Before the quarter would end though the Hawks would go ahead for good. With just a over a minute left in the third, the Monmouth offense tossed the ball over a pack of players for an Kyle Frazier in the endzone for 32-yard interception.

The Hawks opened the fourth quarter with the ball and Tyler George then upped the score to 31-21 for Monmouth with 10:10 remaining in the contest. Working their way in from thier own 12-yard line, the Hawks used nine plays over 88 yards with George catching an eight-yard pass from Sinisi for the 10-point edge.

The Monarchs simply did not sit back though and made it a three-point game with just under seven minutes left. Monmouth's Kenny Amsel fumbled a punt return as Marquis Johnson recovered at the Hawk's 15. On the next play, Desmond Williams took off for 15 yards and Hareza's PAT had the Monarchs trailing just 31-28.

Monmouth controlled possession the rest of the way however as the Monarchs were unable to garner another scoring opportunity.

DeMarco finished the game with a then-season-high 215 yards completing 16 of his 25 passes. Frazier meanwhile connected on 14 of his 19 attempts for 138 yards for the Hawks.

Sinisi accounted for 216 of the Hawks 259 yards on the ground. Crawford led the Monarchs with nine carries and 64 yards.

Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) led the Monarch receiving coprs with five recep-tions and 71 yards. Mayers, who had ODU's first touchdown of the night, had three catches for 81 yards. Giles led the Hawks with 47 yards on four catches.

Defensively, Devon Simmons (Newport News, Va.) and Mychael McJunkins (Kansas City, Kan.) each had nine tackles apiece for ODU.

MONARCH MOMENTS:

THE LONGEST YARD:

Quarterback Thomas DeMarco captured over 200 passing yards in a game for the first time in his Monarch career, throwing for 215 yards. His 55-yard pass to Nick Mayers for the Monarchs first touchdown was his longest pass of the season.

BACK YOU GO:

Edmon McClam may not have blocked a kick that week, but the redshirt sophomore defensive lineman recorded a 15-yard sack for the Monarchs.

PLISCO'S PUNTS:
