CAA CHAMPION OLD DOMINION

- Old Dominion has won six-straight games including a 63-35 win over Coastal Carolina in the second round of the FCS playoffs last week. No. 4 seed Old Dominion hosts No. 5 seed Georgia Southern in the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs.
- Georgia Southern defeated Central Arkansas 24-16 last Saturday to advance in the playoffs. The two teams met last year in Statesboro, with Georgia Southern winning 55-48.
- Taylor Heinicke set an FCS Playoff record with 542 yards of total offense in ODU's 63-35 win over Coastal Carolina. Heinicke passed for 497 yards and rushed for 45 yards. He tied the playoff record of six touchdown passes. He tied Mike Smith of Northern Iowa (1987) and Clemente Gordon of Grambling (1989).
- With his 497 passing yards against Coastal, Heinicke now has 4,655 passing yards this season, just 208 from tying Steve McNair's (Alcorn State) single-season passing yardage record of 4,863 yards that he set in 1994.
- The Monarchs lead all FCS schools in Total Offense (549.42), passing offense (391.58) and in scoring offense (46.00).
- Sophomore quarterback Taylor Heinicke was named one of three finalists invited to Philadelphia for the Walter Payton Award. Joining Heinicke are Wofford fullback Eric Breitenstein and Stony Brook running back Miguel Maysonet.
- Heinicke leads the nation in passing yards per game with 387.92, passing yards, 4,655, total offense, 423.08, points responsible for, 26.17 and touchdown passes with 41.

Taylor Heinicke:****Heinicke Lights up Record Books**

ODU sophomore quarterback Taylor Heinicke is on the verge of becoming the FCS single-season passing yardage leader and record holder in several other categories.

Heinicke has passed for 300 yards eight times and 400 yards four times this year. He has tossed three TD passes eight times, four TD's six times and five or more three times, including an FCS playoff record tying six in last week's win over Coastal Carolina.

The sophomore is a finalist for the Walter Payton Award given to the top player in the FCS. He is invited to Philadelphia for the awards ceremony along with Wofford fullback Eric Breitenstein and Stony Brook running back Miguel Maysonet.

He is also a finalist for the Dudley Award, given to the best Division I Player in the state of Virginia. The other two finalists are James Madison linebacker Stephen Robertson and Virginia linebacker Steve Greer. If he wins, Heinicke would become just third FCS player to win the award, joining JMU's Rodney Landers in 2008 and Richmond's Marc Megna in 1998.

Heinicke Making History

- ODU quarterback Taylor Heinicke leads the nation in passing yards per game, passing yards, total offense, points responsible for and touchdown passes.

- His high accolades don't stop there, his 4,655 passing yards and 5,077 yards of total offense are the second most in a single-season in FCS history. He needs just 209 yards passing to surpass Steve McNair for the single-season record.

RISING UP THE RANKS:

It took the ODU Football Monarchs until year three and 27 games to receive its first Top 25 ranking on October 3, 2011, coming in at No. 21 in The Sports Network Poll. Looking at other recent start-up programs, it took Coastal Carolina 32 games to achieve a national ranking when they came in at No. 24 in The Sports Network Poll in their third year on Nov. 8, 2005. That season the Chanticleers finished 9-2 and were the Big South co-champions. The Monarchs enter Saturday ranked No. 5 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 5 in The Sports Network Poll.

In another first for the ODU Football program, the Monarchs were ranked in the Top-25 for the first time in school history coming in at No. 21 in The Sports Network/Fathead.com FCS Top-25 College Football Poll following a 48-33 win over then-#20 UMass, the Monarchs first ever CAA and Top-25 victory. Following ODU's 31-23 victory over Rhode Island the next weekend, ODU made its FCS Coaches Poll debut during week seven coming in at No. 22. ODU steadily moved up the ranks until it cracked the Top-10 at the conclusion of the season with a 35-31 win at nearby William & Mary to end the regular season on a four-game win streak and a 9-2 overall and a 6-2 record in its inaugural season of CAA play.

MOST AND LEAST:

The 70 points scored by the Monarchs in week three against Campbell set a record for most points in a game. The 70 points surpassed the previous record of 57 tied in week one in the 57-23 victory over Duquesne along with the Monarchs' 57-9 victory over Savannah State on November 6, 2010. ODU added to the list in the week four CAA opener with 64 points against New Hampshire.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS:

Taylor Heinicke put his name all over the game passing records in the week one win over Duquesne.

- Heinicke's 492 yards passed the previous high of 407 yards by Thomas DeMarco at Monmouth back on September 25, 2010 and his previous high of 373 against Richmond back on November 5, 2011.

- Heinicke's 41 completions passed the previous high of 34 which he had set against Richmond on November 5, 2011.

- Heinicke's 63 attempts replaced the previous high of 57 attempts made by Thomas DeMarco against Cal Poly in 2010 and his own previous high of 47 against Richmond on November 5, 2011.

- Heinicke also set school mark with 530 yards of total offense (492 pass, 38 rush) with a record 74 plays. He surpasses his previous record of 421 yards of total offense against Richmond back on November 5, 2011 and the previous high of 73 plays set by former Monarch Thomas DeMarco against Cal Poly on October 9, 2010.

In week three against Campbell, Heinicke found another place to put his name.

- Heinicke reset his own school record for touchdown passes in a game with seven in the victory over Campbell. Heinicke surpassed the previous record of five TD passes in both of last year's playoff games vs. Norfolk State on Nov. 26, 2011 and at Georgia Southern on Dec. 3, 2011.

- The quarterback's passing yards were the 10th-highest total in CAA Football history, while his seven TD-passes were one shy from equaling the league mark last done in 2004.

Then in week four against New Hampshire in the CAA Opener, the ODU, FCS, and Division I record books blew up.

PASSING YARDS IN A QUARTER: Heinicke's 293-yard fourth quarter eclipsed the FCS record of 284 set by Western Illinois' Sam Clemons in the second quarter versus Indiana State in 2001.

PASSING YARDS IN A HALF: Heinicke's 480-yard second half dismantled the FCS record of 383 set by Marshall's Michael Payton in the first half against VMI in 1991. The Division I record is 517 by Houston's Andre Ware against SMU in 1989.

PASSING YARDS IN A GAME: As noted Saturday, Heinicke's 730 yards bests the Division I record of Houston's David Klingler, who threw for 716 against Arizona State in 1990, but just misses the all-division record of 736 by Sam Durlay of Eureka College (DII) in a 62-55 comeback win over Knox College earlier this season. The FCS record was 624 by Weber State's Jamie Martin against Idaho State in 1991.

PASSES IN A GAME WITHOUT AN INTERCEPTION: Heinicke's 79 breaks the all-division record of 77 set by Justin Peery of Division III Westminster of Missouri against MacMurray in 1998. The Division I record of 76 was shared by Eastern Michigan's Andy Schmitt (versus Temple in 2008) and Houston's Case Keenum (against UTEP in 2009).

TOTAL OFFENSE IN A QUARTER: Heinicke's 293 yards in the fourth, all through the air, breaks the FCS record of 278 set by Mississippi Valley State's Willie Totten in the second quarter against Kentucky State in 1984.

TOTAL OFFENSE IN A HALF: Heinicke had 496 after intermission (480 passing, 16 rushing), lapping the FCS record of 404 set by Stephen F. Austin's Todd Hammel in the first quarter against Louisiana-Monroe in 1989.

TOTAL OFFENSE IN A GAME: Also as noted Saturday, Heinicke's 791 yards (730 passing, 61 rushing) are an NCAA record, besting Klingler's 732 (716 passing, 16 rushing) versus Arizona State in 1990. The FCS record was 668 by Jackson State's Robert Kent (595 passing, 73 rushing) against Alabama State in 2001.

A RECORD NOT TO BE OVER LOOKED EITHER:

Blair Roberts' three touchdown receptions against the Camels in week three were the most by a Monarch in a game in ODU's 38-game history and Nick Mayers tied the record in week four with a trio of TDs in the win over New Hampshire.

Mayers and redshirt sophomore Antonio Vaughan also tied the school record with 12 receptions in the week four game with New Hampshire.

AND LET'S NOT FORGET THESE RECORDS TOO:

These were also records set in week four against New Hampshire:

FIRST DOWNS PASSING: The Monarchs' 37 breaks the Division I record of 33 set by Idaho against Middle Tennessee State in 2001. Montana owned the FCS

record, with 32 versus Weber State in 1999.

COMBINED FIRST DOWNS: ODU (39) and New Hampshire (35) had 74, breaking the FCS record of 72 set by Bethune-Cookman (40) and Howard (32) in 1987. Houston (40) and Louisiana Tech (48) set the Division I record of 78 two weeks ago.

COMBINED TOTAL OFFENSE: The Monarchs (825) and Wildcats (724) teamed for 1,529 yards, crushing the FCS mark of 1,423 held by Murray State (816) and Missouri State (607) since 2010. But Murray State and Missouri State set their record in a mere 134 plays (10.6 yards per snap), while ODU and New Hampshire had 195 (7.8 yards per play). The all-divisions record is 1,640 yards set by San Jose State (849) and Nevada (791) in 2001.

BLOCK THAT KICK:

Special teams has 25 blocks to its credit in its four seasons, including a pair of blocked PATs this season.

GETTING A GROUND GAME

Sophomore tailback Tyree Lee has produced a rushing attack the last three games that ODU had not previously had. He rushed for 128 yards against Delaware, 126 at Georgia State and set a new career-best in the win over W&M with 166. He is the first ODU runner to rush for 100 yards in three-straight games.

UNDER THE RADAR

Sophomore defensive tackle Dominique Guinn-Bailey has started the last five games at tackle for ODU and has helped the Monarchs stop the run. With Guinn-Bailey starting inside, it allowed Erik Saylor to move outside to end where he has helped with the pass rush.

The CAA coaches noticed Guinn-Bailey's solid play as he was selected to the All-CAA third-team.

DEFENSIVE LEADERS

Seniors Craig Wilkins and Chris Burnette once again had solid seasons on the defensive front seven.

Wilkins led the team with 77 sacks, tied for second in the CAA with 5.5 sacks and third in the league with 12.0 tackles for loss.

Burnette led all CAA defensive linemen with 66 tackles and is second on the team with four sacks.

Burnette earned first-team All-CAA honors while Wilkins received second-team accolades.

HOME/AWAY:

Old Dominion is currently 22-6 all-time and 6-1 this season on its home turf of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. The Monarchs had won six-straight on its home turf until last week's homecoming loss to Villanova.

ODU is 16-3 all-time on the road. Last season, the Monarchs went 4-2 on the road in 2011 with losses at Delaware and Georgia Southern, with both teams being ranked in the nation's top-10 at the time of play.

The Monarchs improved to 2-0 all-time against Hampton at Armstrong Stadium in the week two 45-7 win over the Pirates. ODU will also be returning to the

Georgia Dome where they defeated the Panthers last season, 40-17.

ANOTHER IT'S A MOST MOMENT:

In last season's contest with the Pirates, Craig Wilkins led the ODU defense with 17 tackles replacing his previous high of 11 stops in the 2010 game with nationally-ranked Cal Poly. It still stands as a record for stops by a Monarch defender in a game

Football Puts Up 47 Points in Second Half, Storms Past Duquesne, 57-23

NORFOLK, Va. -- The #8/6 Football Monarchs scored 47 second half points as Taylor Heinicke threw for a school record 492 yards and tossed four touchdowns to lead the Monarchs to a 57-23 victory over Duquesne in front of a sold out crowd Saturday night at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

The Dukes took a 20-10 advantage at halftime but ODU stormed out of the locker room to open the second half with 17-straight points. The Monarchs outscore Duquesne 37-3 in the second half.

Angus Harper capped a 12-play, 69-yard drive with a two-yard score to cut the Duquesne lead to 20-17.

Jarod Brown tied the score with a 31-yard field goal and Nick Mayers gave ODU the lead for good with an 11-yard pass from Heinicke.

Charlie Leventry kicked an 18-yard field goal to cut the ODU lead to 27-23 but the Monarchs got a 75-yard catch and run touchdown from Heinicke to Mayers and two Tyree Lee touchdown runs to put the game away.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by Erik Saylor with six tackles (1 solo, 5 assisted). Saylor also had a blocked PAT midway through the second quarter for the Monarchs' 24th blocked kick in its four-year history. Chris Burnette and Devon Simmons each had five stops in the win.

Football Monarchs Take Rain Shortened 45-7 Victory over Hampton

HAMPTON, Va. -- #7/5 Old Dominion rattled off 31 unanswered points and held Hampton to just one touchdown score in the Football Monarchs' 45-7 victory over the Pirates in a rain shorten game on Saturday night at Armstrong Stadium.

The win improved the Monarchs to 2-0 on the year, while the Pirates fell to 0-2 overall.

ODU stormed out to a fast start scoring 28 first quarter points as Heinicke was a part of all four touchdowns. Heinicke started the scoring on a 13-yard run and threw touchdown passes to Antonio Vaughan, Angus Harper and Blair Roberts for the 28 point lead.

**RECORD BOOKS SHATTERED: #5 ODU With
64-61 Victory Over #18/19 UNH
Taylor Heinicke Throws for an NCAA Division I
Record 730 yard**

NORFOLK, Va. -- #5 Old Dominion University quarterback Taylor Heinicke threw for a Division I record 730 yards and five touchdowns as Jarod Brown kicked a 25-yard field goal with 41 seconds left and Andre Simmons intercepted a pass to clinch the 64-61 win over #18/19 New Hampshire Saturday afternoon.

Heinicke's 730 yards are an NCAA Division I record and just one yard shy of the all-division record set by Zamir Amin of Menlo (Div. III) who passed for 731 yards against Cal Lutheran in 2000. Heinicke's 730-yards passes the previous Division I record of 716 yards by David Kilinger of Houston in 1990 against Arizona State. The previous FCS high was 624 set by Weber State's Jamie Martin against Idaho State in 1991.

Passing yards weren't the only Division I record set by Heinicke either. The sophomore signal caller who also ran the ball 11 times for a team-leading 61 yards totaled 791 yards of total offense surpassing the FBS record of 732 by David Klingler of Houston against Arizona State in 1990 and the FCS record 668 by Robert Kent of Jackson State vs. Alabama in 2001.

ODU, which trailed by as many as 20 and was behind 40-24 at the break, scored three-straight touchdowns to start the fourth quarter. Two touchdowns from Nick Mayers and a two-yard run from Angus Harper gave ODU its first lead of the game, 61-54, with 4:39 left in the game.

Less than a minute later, the Wildcats knotted the game at 61-61 with Andy Vailas on a 45-yard pass to R.J. Harris.

On the Monarchs following drive, ODU traveled 74 yards in 11 plays to set up Brown's game-winning field goal.

Mayers collected a school record 271 yards receiving with a trio of touchdowns also tying the mark for catches in a game with 12. Antonio Vaughan also tied the school record with his 12 catches for 143 yards.

For the Wildcats, Nico Steriti ran the ball for 201 yards on 21 carries, while quarterback Andy Vailas connected on 23 of his 38 attempts for 336 yards.

#4/4 ODU Footballs Runs to 45-37 Win Over Richmond Head into Bye Week Undefeated at 5-0

RICHMOND, Va. -- Old Dominion improved to 5-0 overall and 2-0 in CAA play with a 45-37 victory over the Richmond Spiders at Robins Stadium.

Seven different Monarchs got the nation's No. 1 scoring offense into the scoring mix as Old Dominion led by as many as 28 points entering the fourth quarter. Although the Spiders managed to score 20 points in the span of 3:21 in the fourth quarter to cut their deficit to eight, Old Dominion methodically wound down the clock over the game's final six minutes and 40 seconds for the win.

Old Dominion struck first covering 52 yards in four plays in a matter of 48 seconds on their second drive of the game. Junior running back Colby Goodwyn, one of three running backs to score for the Monarchs, lit up the scoreboard with a 27-yard touchdown run.

The Spiders tied the game on their ensuing possession. Richmond quarterback John Laub connected with Ben Edwards for a 39-yard touchdown with 9:14 left in the opening quarter.

However, just as the Monarchs have done all season, they struck back fast and furious going ahead 24-7 by the opening minutes of the second quarter.

Following the Richmond score, ODU ran 10 plays in under three minutes capped by signal caller Taylor Heinicke needing just five yards to cross into the end zone to give ODU the 14-7 lead.

The Monarch defense kept Richmond from moving past its own seven on the next drive. The Spiders were forced to punt giving ODU field position in Richmond territory resulting in a 26-yard field goal for Jarod Brown.

Nick Mayers put the Monarchs up 24-7 in the third play of second quarter. Mayers, tying his season-high in TD receptions at seven in just ODU's fifth game of the season, caught the seven-yard pass at the left corner of the goal line.

The Spiders put their second touchdown of the game up on the board at the 10 minute mark of the second half. Laub lobbed the ball over the Monarch defense to back of the end zone and into the hand of Kevin Finney.

However, the Monarchs weren't finished scoring and added a pair of touchdowns before the intermission.

A 46-yard reception by Larry Pinkard managed to get the Monarchs back onto the Richmond side of the field at the Spiders' own nine. Running back Tyree Lee helped ODU inch closer and closer to a score until Heinicke connected with Marquel Thomas on a short 1-yard pass. Sophomore running back Angus Harper later punched the ball in on a 12-play 80-yard drive with less than a minute left in the second quarter for the 38-14 advantage.

Alex Arain closed out the first half of action forcing a fumble resulting in an 11-yard sack.

The Spiders had a chance to cut into the deficit early in the third quarter, but a pair of Laub passes to Edwards and Stephen Barnette were incomplete in the end zone. Richmond would settle for the field goal with sophomore Remington Hinshaw putting a career-high 38 thru the uprights, but it still had his squad trailing the Monarchs 38-17 with nine minutes remaining in the third quarter.

Old Dominion responded immediately with another scoring drive to surpass last year's total of 42 against Richmond. Sophomore Tyree Lee got into the scoring mix with a trio of carries including a 14 yard rush to bring the Monarchs into the red zone and a seven-yard touchdown for a 45-17 edge with just over five minutes left in third quarter.

Richmond kept it interesting in outscoring the Monarchs 20-0 in the fourth quarter. The Spider's Doug Howell intercepted a Heinicke pass and returned it 22 yards for a score in the early moments of the final quarter. On their next possession, Richmond managed to move down field 94-yards in seven plays ending with a seven-yard touchdown run for Jovan Smith. The Spiders' extra point, however, was blocked by Chris Burnette, the Monarchs' second blocked PAT of the season.

It was four and out for the Monarchs next followed by Richmond needing only four plays to pull within single digits, 45-37. Edwards got in a 25-yard return to get the Spiders to mid-field and later tore down field 33 yards, setting up Laub to cross into the end zone.

Old Dominion took its time moving down field running out the final 6:40 left in the game.

Villanova Spoils Homecoming, 38-14 Wildcats Score 38 Unanswered Points and Keep Monarchs Scoreless After the First Quarter

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Villanova Wildcats handed the #3/3 Football Monarchs their first loss of the 2012 campaign with a 38-14 win over ODU on its Homecoming.

The Monarchs, who had won nine of their last 10 games dating back to October 22nd of last season and were riding a six-game home win streak, fall to 5-1 on the year and 2-1 in Colonial Athletic Association action.

The Wildcats, winners of the 2009 FCS National Championship, improve to 5-2 overall and 3-1 in league action.

Old Dominion struck fast needing only four plays to get on the scoreboard and tying the school mark for fastest touchdown. The Monarchs' four-play, 88-yard opening drive took just 1:07 capped by a 17-yard reception by Nick Mayers.

The Football Monarchs took a 14-0 lead at just under the five minute mark on a 47-yard pass to Kirk Spellman for his first career touchdown.

The Monarchs went up 14-0 with just under five minutes remaining in the first quarter, but Villanova would go on to score 31 unanswered points behind three rushing touchdowns by quarterback John Robertson.

The Wildcats got onto the scoreboard on their next drive, right before the end of the opening quarter. Mark Hamilton connected on a 26-yard field goal after missing a 32-attempt midway through the first quarter.

Villanova started off the second quarter from its own seven, but found its way downfield field with Robertson hitting Norman White for a 44-yard touchdown reception with 10 minutes remaining in the second quarter and Old Dominion leading 14-10 at the half.

Robertson found his way into the end zone in back-to-back drives to kick off the third quarter with 25 and 15 yard runs.

A Monarch fumble at the end of the third quarter set up another scoring drive for the Wildcats with Robertson punching in his third touchdown of the game to start the fourth quarter.

ODU's opening drive of the final stanza saw the Monarchs get down to the Wildcats' 18 at fourth and three, but quarterback Taylor Heinicke's pass was incomplete to Nick Mayers turning the ball back over Villanova.

Just like what the Monarchs did to Richmond two weeks ago, Villanova methodically wore down the clock and using nearly eight minutes to run 14-plays and go 82-yards for its final score of the contest on a 25-yard run by Kevin Monangai. Monangai finished the game with 188 yards on 26 carries.

Robertson finished the game with 151 yards passing and a game-high 189 yards rushing.

Monarch signal caller Taylor Heinicke threw for 239 yards completing 16 of his 32 passes with one interception.

The Football Monarchs return to action at Towson, last year's CAA Champion, on Saturday October 20th. Kick-off is set for 7:00 p.m.

No. 7/8 Monarchs Handle No. 18/19 Towson, 31-20

ODU stormed out to 10-0 lead in first six minutes of the game.

TOWSON, Md. - Old Dominion University football raced out to a 10-0 lead and pushed its lead to as big as 31-6 en route to a 31-20 victory at Towson Saturday night.

With the win, the Monarchs improve to 6-1 overall and 3-1 in CAA play while the Tigers drop to 3-4 overall and 2-2 in conference play.

ODU took the first lead of the game, taking the opening kickoff and driving 61 yards in 13 plays capped off by a 27-yard Jarod Brown field goal for the 3-0 Monarch advantage.

The ensuing kickoff Fred Credle forced a fumble that Malique Johnson recovered to give the Monarchs the ball at the 22-yardline and ODU cashed in the turnover as Taylor Heinicke hit Vaughan for an 11-yard strike to put ODU up 10-0.

D.J. Soven kicked a 30-yard field goal to cut the ODU lead to 10-3 before the Monarchs responded with a nine play, 78-yard drive capped off by a Heinicke six-yard scamper to give ODU a 17-3 lead.

Soven kicked his second field goal of the game, this one a 40-yarder with seven seconds left in the first half as ODU took a 17-6 lead into the break.

The Monarchs' defense forced a three and out on the first possession of the second half and ODU increased its lead to 24-6 on a 36-yard run from Heinicke, his second rushing TD of the night.

Midway through the third quarter Towson failed to convert a fourth down at its own 43 and the Monarchs took over and scored as Angus Harper fumbled at the one but Blair Roberts was there to recover the ball in the end zone to put ODU on top 31-6.

Grant Enders capped a 71-yard drive for Towson with a one-yard score to cut the ODU lead to 31-13.

Enders tossed a touchdown pass to Cory Kirby in the fourth quarter to make the final score 31-20.

Heinicke finished the night 26-of-39 passing for 264 yards and a touchdown while rushing for a season-best 71 yards and a single-game best two rushing scores.

Jakwail Bailey caught eight passes for 79 yards with Nick Mayers catching six passes for 60 yards.

NORFOLK, Va. - Taylor Heinicke threw for 375 yards and ran for three touchdowns while Tyree Lee rushed for a career-high 128 yards and a touchdown as No. 6/7 Old Dominion University football defeated No. 20/16 Delaware 31-26 on a windy Saturday afternoon at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

At the end of the first quarter the rain picked up but both teams were able to move the ball offensively, with ODU picking up 499 total yards while Delaware finished with 370.

After a Tyree Lee touchdown put ODU on top 28-17 midway through the third quarter, the Blue Hens pulled to within 28-26 on a Sean Baner 28-yard field goal and a Nihja White 13-yard TD pass. After White's touchdown, UD went for two but Hurley was sacked by Erik Saylor. Heinicke was 36-for-45 in the air for 375 yards and ran for three scores while Nick Mayers caught 11 passes, one short of tying his career-high, for 131 yards while Blair Roberts had six catches for 52 yards and Larry Pinkard caught five for 75.

Heinicke was named the MVP of the Oyster Game.

Andrew Pierce ran for 72 yards on 12 carries while Julian Laing had 64 yards on 10 rushes.

Hurley was 12-of-20 for 134 yards and two touchdowns with Michael Johnson grabbing five catches for 36 yards.

Caleb Taylor led ODU with 12 tackles while Craig Wilkins had 10 tackles and 1.5 sacks.

The Monarchs are on the road next weekend to face Georgia State.

Devon Simmons clinched the game with an interception.

ODU scored 32-straight to open the game.

ATLANTA, Ga. - Old Dominion stormed out to a 32-0 halftime lead on the way to a 53-27 victory Saturday evening at the Georgia Dome.

ODU put up two touchdowns in the first quarter and two more in the second to go along with a Jarod Brown field goal to the half.

The Monarchs drove the opening kickoff down the field with ease, going 67 yards in nine plays capped by a Taylor Heinicke to Marquel Thomas nine-yard touchdown pass. Heinicke rolled to the right and found Thomas just across the goal line for the score. Nate Ong flipped a pass to Kai Blanco for the two-point conversion to put ODU on top 8-0.

After Alex Johnson forced and recovered a GSU fumble, Tyree Lee capped a 34 yard drive in just four plays on an 11-yard rush to give ODU a 15-0 lead.

ODU started the second quarter with a one-yard Angus Harper TD run, capping off a 69 yard drive in just five plays, as the drive was highlighted by a Heinicke to Larry Pinkard 34-yard pass play.

Pinkard increased ODU's lead to 29-0 at the five minute mark of the first half after Devon Simmons intercepted a Ben McLane pass at the GSU 29. Heinicke hit Pinkard from four-yards out with a lob pass over the defender.

Angus Harper added a seven-yard TD run with two minutes to go for the final margin.

Heinicke was 28-of-42 in the air with three touchdowns while Marquel Thomas caught a career-high six passes for 72-yards and a TD while Larry Pinkard had six catches for 92-yards and a score.

Tyree Lee carried a career-high 25 times for 126 yards, just two yards shy of his career-high that he set just last week.

McLane was 13-of-32 for GSU for 226 yards and a TD.

John Darr had a team-best six tackles while Devon Simmons and Craig Wilkins recorded interceptions. Simmons' INT was his second-straight game with one and he is ODU's all-time leader with nine.

Old Dominion returns home next week to host William and Mary. The Monarchs will honor their 18 seniors in a pregame ceremony.

NORFOLK, Va. - Tyree Lee ran for a career-high 166 yards while Taylor Heinicke threw four touchdown passes as No. 4 Old Dominion came from behind to defeat William and Mary 41-31 Saturday afternoon at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

ODU moves to 9-1 on the year and 6-1 in the CAA while the Tribe fall to 2-8 overall and 1-6 in league play

After a high scoring first half that finished with a 28-27 W&M lead, all that was on the board in the third quarter was a 19-yard field goal by John Carpenter to give the Tribe a 31-27 lead.

The Monarchs came through in the fourth quarter as Heinicke tossed his fourth TD pass of the game, this one an 18-yarder to Antonio Vaughan to complete a nine play, 79-yard drive and give ODU a 34-31 lead.

On the following drive, senior defensive back picked off William and Mary's Michael Graham in the end zone and the Monarch offense drove 80 yards in eight plays and scored on a Lee 16-yard run to push the lead to 41-31. The Monarch defense came up with one more stop to ice the game.

The Tribe got on the board first as Michael Graham hit Sean Ballard down the middle of the field for a 51-yard touchdown pass.

Old Dominion returned the favor quickly going 70-yards in just five plays capped by a 39-yard TD strike from Taylor Heinicke to Nick Mayers. Mayers broke free down the left sideline and Heinicke hit Mayers in stride for the score.

William and Mary retook the lead on the ensuing possession needing just one play, as Graham found Tre McBride down the left sideline for a 72-yard catch and run for a 14-7 Tribe lead.

The Monarchs struck back again as Heinicke hit Mayers for a 19-yard score to make the score 14-13, but ODU went for two and failed. After the Monarchs forced a W&M punt, Antonio Vaughan picked up a rolling boot from Drake Kuhn at the ODU 30, bounced out to the left and raced 70 yards for an ODU score and the first punt return TD in school history to put the Monarchs on top 20-14.

The ODU came up big again as Craig Wilkins picked off Michael Graham on the Tribe's next possession and returned it to the 16 and the Monarchs capitalized as Heinicke connected with Blair Roberts for six yards to give ODU a 27-14 advantage.

The Tribe came back to score the final 14 points of the first half with a seven and four yard TD passes from Graham to Tre McBride.

Lee finished his career day with 166 yards on a career- best 28 carries and a score while Heinicke had 43 yards on the ground as well as going 28-of-43 through the air for 291 yards and four touchdowns.

Mayers caught nine passes for 131 yards and two touchdowns while Lee had four receptions for 44 yards and Larry Pinkard had four catches for 34 yards.

Craig Wilkins, Carvin Powell and Paul Morant all had interceptions for ODU while John Darr had a team-best nine tackles.

The Monarchs are on the road next week for the final regular season game of the season as they travel to James Madison for a 7 p.m. kick-off.

Tyree Lee ran for 166 yards in the win over W&M, going over 100 yards for the third-straight game.

Huge Second Half Propels Monarchs Over James Madison, 38-28

HARRISONBURG, Va. - Taylor Heinicke threw for 357 and four second half touchdowns as Old Dominion University football scored 28 second half points to come back from a 21-10 halftime deficit to defeat James Madison 38-28 Saturday night in Harrisonburg.

Old Dominion improves to 10-1 overall and 7-1 in the CAA, and stands alone atop the conference standings. With his 357 passing yards, Heinicke finished the regular season with 4,158 yards, ranking him 13th on the single-season passing yards list in FCS history.

After gaining just 117 yards at halftime and trailing 21-10, ODU exploded for 21 points in the second half.

The Monarchs completed a four play, 41-yard drive in just 1:23 to close the gap to 21-17 on a Heinicke to Nick Mayers nine-yard score.

Justin Thorpe recorded his third rushing TD of the night, this a five-yard run, to put the Dukes on top 28-17, but Old Dominion bounced right back with a quick strike from Heinicke to Vaughan to make the score 28-24. This was the play Heinicke went over 4,000 yards on the year.

ODU took the lead and never gave it back just four minutes later, when after another defensive stop, Heinicke hit Larry Pinkard down the seam for 17 yards and a 31-28 lead for ODU.

The Monarchs capped the scoring with a 50-yard drive that took just 1:50 as Heinicke hit Mayers for another nine-yard score to make the score 38-28.

Old Dominion finishes atop the CAA with a 7-1 mark, but is ineligible for the leagues automatic bid.

James Madison took the opening drive 73 yards in 13 plays to take a 7-0 lead capped off with a nine-yard run from Thorpe.

The Monarchs also put points on the board with their opening drive, using a 43-yard kickoff return from Aaron Evans and a 19-yard pass from Heinicke to Tyree Lee to help set up a 47-yard field goal from Jarod Brown.

Thorpe added his second rushing touchdown of the day to give JMU a 14-3 lead, going in from a yard out. He had the big play in the drive with a 45-yard run to get the Dukes to the ODU 15.

Colby Goodwyn pulled the Monarchs back to within four as he capped off an eight play, 48-yard drive with a five yard run up the middle to make the score 14-10.

James Madison struck back quickly with a 50-yard pass from Thorpe to Dae'Quan Scott. Scott wheeled out of the left side of the backfield and Thorpe hit him in stride down the left sideline for the score.

Heinicke finished the day 32-of-45 through the air for 357 yards and four touchdowns. Vaughan caught 10 passes for 123 yards and a score while Tyree Lee caught a career-high seven passes with Blair Roberts grabbing six for 82 yards.

Caleb Taylor and Paul Morant each had a game-high 11 tackles, while Taylor and Craig Wilkins had 1.5 sacks. Chris Burnette, Alex Johnson and Erik Saylor all recorded sacks.

Taylor Heinicke became the 18th FCS quarterback to throw for 4,000 yards in a season in the win over JMU.

ODU Scores 28 Unanswered Points To Put Away Coastal Carolina, 63-35

Norfolk, Va.- Taylor Heinicke broke the single-game NCAA FCS Playoff record for total offense with 542 yards as No. 4 seed Old Dominion defeated Coastal Carolina 63-35 in the second round of the FCS Playoffs.

Heinicke threw for 497 yards and tied a playoff record with six touchdown passes, three to Larry Pinkard who recorded a career-high 154 yards receiving on six catches.

Heinicke broke Todd Hammel's (Stephen F. Austin) record of 539 yards of total offense that he set in 1989 against Grambling. Heinicke was 32-of-44 passing for 497 yards and six TD's and also added 45 yards on the ground.

The Monarchs took a huge surge of momentum into halftime as the Monarch defense stopped Coastal from on the one-yard line three times in the final minute, the final time Chris Burnette forced and recovered a Marcus Whitener fumble at the one as ODU took a 28-21 half-time lead.

ODU came out of the break and drove 69 yards in six plays as Heinicke hit Pinkard for a 50-yard pass to increase the lead to 35-21.

Coastal came back to tie the score as Aramis Hillary hit DeMario Bennett for an 11-yard score and after an ODU fumble the Chanticleers tied the score as Travis Small ran from 18-yards out.

That was the final time CCU got on the board, as ODU tallied the final 28 points of the night. It started with a six-yard TD pass to Pinkard to put ODU on top 42-35. The drive was highlighted by a 39-yard pass from Heinicke to Mayers.

After the Monarchs forced a Coastal punt, Heinicke hit Pinkard down the middle of the field on the first play of the fourth quarter for 73 yards to give ODU a 49-35 advantage.

Aramis Hillary ran in from three yards out to put Coastal on the board first, capping a 71-yard drive highlighted by a Jeremy Height 28-yard run and 29-yard completion from Hillary to Matt Hazel.

The Monarchs struck right back as Taylor Heinicke connected with Blair Roberts on fourth and one for a two-yard touchdown pass to knot the score at seven.

Reggie Owens intercepted Hillary on fourth and one at the ODU eight yard line. The Monarchs responded by going 92-yards in 14 plays capped off with a six-yard run by Heinicke to give ODU a 14-7 lead.

ODU intercepted Hillary for the second-straight series as Craig Wilkins picked off Hillary on a pass over the middle. The Monarchs went 48 yards in eight plays as Heinicke ran in again for a score, this time from eight yards out to give ODU a 21-7 advantage.

The Chanticleers responded with an 81-yard scoring drive as Hillary hit Matt Hazel for a 15-yard touchdown pass to cut the lead to 21-14.

Coastal forced an ODU punt and followed with an 80-yard scoring drive as Hillary hit Hazel for a one-yard pass on fourth and goal from the one to tie the score at 21.

The Monarchs responded in just three plays as Heinicke hit Roberts for 35-yards down the right sideline to give ODU the lead back. Tyree Lee had a big 28-yard run to get the drive started.
