#### **CRYSTAL BALL:**

Saturday's game is a glimpse into the future as the Monarchs take on William & Mary, a school that will be featured prominently on ODU's schedule as they join the CAA in 2011. Saturday's game will give ODU a taste of the toughest FCS league in the nation. The Tribe will mark the first ranked team ODU will face in its young history. William & Mary ranks 12th in the FCS Coach's Poll and 13th in the Sports Network Poll heading into this weekend.

#### ON THE ROAD:

The ODU Football Monarchs hit the road for the first time in 2010, heading to Buies Creek, North Carolina to face Campbell last week and walked away with a 44-13 victory. In their inaugural season, the Monarchs went 3-1 on the road with wins at Jacksonville (28-27), Savannah State (38-17), and VMI (42-35). The lone setback away from the friendly confines of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium was a 34-29 loss at Fordham. With the 44-13 win, the Monarchs improved to 4-1 all-time on the road. Saturday's game was the first of four road games this season for the Monarchs, who have return dates with Monmouth and North Carolina Central, as well as a jaunt over the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel to face Hampton.

#### **OPENING WITH A BANG:**

And no, we're not talking about the howitzer you hear being shot off before the Monarchs run onto Foreman Field. Old Dominion scored on opening drive in both of its games of the 2010 season. Marquel Thomas' TD reception at the 10:51 of the first quarter at Campbell made it the ninth time in the 13 game history of the program the Monarchs have done so.

#### <u>DRIVING</u>

While ODU certainly wished there was a different outcome in the opening week 35-25 loss to Jacksonville, the Monarchs were ready to learn from their mistakes and moving on. Head Coach Bobby Wilder has noted that some of the biggest improvement you see out of a team occur between weeks one and two. Coming out in game number two, the Monarchs scored in the first three drives of the game against Campbell and held a 20-0 advantage over the Camels at the half.

#### **CATCHING IN THE END ZONE:**

Prior to the Campbell game, only Nick Mayers had more than one touchdown reception in a game - at Fordham (10/3/09) and last season at home against Campbell (10/17/09). In Saturday's win Marquel Thomas and Reid Evans joined Mayers in the category as each had a pair of TD catches

#### **PLAYING CATCH:**

Reid Evan's eight receptions are the most by a Monarch. The previous high of six was held by Evans from last year's Jacksonville game.

#### TD'S FOR TD:

Thomas DeMarco on his 1-yard jaunt over the end line to give ODU a 34-13 advantage over Campbell with 42 seconds left in the third quarter was his 19th rushing touchdown as a Monarch.

#### **ABOUT WILLIAM & MARY:**

- After earning a 45-0 victory against instate foe VMI last weekend, the No. 12/13 Tribe will look for its second consecutive win against a school from the Commonwealth when they play at Old Dominion this Saturday at 7 p.m.
- Having posted shutouts in three of its last eight games dating back to last season, W&M enters this weekend ranked eighth nationally in scoring defense by allowing just 13.5 points per game.
- Offensively, the College also ranks among the county's top 20 with 34.0 ppg.
- Senior quarterback Mike Callahan has performed well in the opening two games and ranks seventh nationally with a passing efficiency rating of 152.2.
- Junior running back Jonathan Grimes is coming off his second three-touchdown game in the last four contests dating back to last season.
- On the defensive side, sophomore linebacker Jabrel Mines leads the CAA and ranks tied for 11th in the country with 11.0 tackles per game, while punter/placekicker David Miller ranks fifth nationally with 45.9 yards per punt.

#### **HISTORY LESSON - The Beginnings of Football at Old Dominion:**

Foreman Field was dedicated amid much pageantry on Oct. 3, 1936. Fifteen thousand spectators gathered for a football game between the University of Virginia and William and Mary. Dean Hodges admonished the students in his High Hat column: "It is highly important for the Norfolk Division to both look its best and do its best tomorrow." Gov. George C. Peery, President John Stewart Bryan (who succeeded Chandler in 1934), and Mayor W.R.L. Taylor of Norfolk were among the guests at the game. The editor of The High Hat hailed the event as the beginning of a new era for the college. UVA's Cavaliers triumphed (7-0) in what a student writer described as "a rather dull game," but nevertheless, the crowd enjoyed the festivities and bright sunshine of a Saturday afternoon in early fall. That evening a football dance sponsored by the Norfolk Chamber of commerce was held at the 12th Street Armory.

Athletics played a major role at the Norfolk Division in the '30s. In July 1930, President Chandler appointed Thomas L. Scott athletic director and football coach at the Norfolk Division. "Tommy" Scott had been a three-sport star at Maury High School, and was one of the all-time athletic greats at Virginia Military Institute. He earned honorable mention on the 1930 Associated Press All-America Football team. Scott coached four sports at the Division – basketball, baseball, track, and football – until his resignation in 1940. Scott became a legendary figure. A coach who stressed integrity and manliness, he was genuinely interested in each of his players. They in turn felt warm affection for Scott, and many continue to remember him with fondness and respect. Rufus Tonelson recalls, "He was just like a father to me." In spring 1980 Scott was posthumously inducted as a charter member of the Old Dominion University Sports Hall of Fame.

During the '30s the Norfolk Division played mainly high-school, service and freshman teams. Football in particular received a great deal of attention during the college's first decade. The Division's first football game was played in Sept. 26, 2930, against Suffolk High School. Both teams wilted in the Indiansummer heat, and Suffolk High won, 7-0. However, Coach Scott declared himself pleased with the Braves' performance. The team was better prepared for its second game when they overwhelmed Oceana high School 47-0, and the "Scottmen" derived much satisfaction from a 13-6 victory over the William and Mary freshmen on Oct. 15th. Home games were played at Bain Field, on East 20th Street near Church Street. By the fall of 1931 a practice field had been cleared on the property south of Bolling Avenue.

Perhaps the most famous occurrence in the 11-year history of football at the Norfolk Division was a game that was not supposed to take place. In 1932 a letter from the University of Miami (Florida) arrived at the Norfolk Division, proposing a game with William and Mary. A blank contract was enclosed. What an opportunity! The Norfolk Division, a two-year school, could travel south to play the Miami Hurricanes varsity team. Miami, of course, really wanted to play the William and Mary Indians, but the contract was signed and mailed back before someone noticed that it had been misaddressed. Faculty sponsors came forward to assist the team financially, and the Braves were sent south in a Pullman car for the game. Coach Scott's men fought hard, but lost 6-2. Tradition has it that the game was the forerunner of the first Orange Bowl game played the next year. Actually, it was a regular season game, but it gave those involved memories to last a lifetime.

Football continued as an intercollegiate sport at the Division until 1941. On Nov. 22, 1940, Tommy Scott submitted his resignation. A schedule was prepared for the 1941 season, a new coach hired, and the team went through spring practice. Several factors that would doom football at the Division were at work, however. The Division in the '30s was a commuter school where students came to the campus mainly for classes, and sports did not generate much enthusiasm. Attendance at athletic events in the late '30s was sparse. Dr. Akers recalls a game at Foreman Field where the total attendance was "about 20, including 14 students." The faculty and students believed it was wrong to devote such a large part of the school's budget to athletics, Akers recalls. Indeed, football was costing the school money. The final blow was a Southern Conference ruling that, as a branch of William and Mary, the Division could not use freshmen. Obviously, sophomores alone could not constitute a representative team. That ruling, and a \$10,000 football debt, ended football at the Division. In the previous 10 years, Scott's football teams had won 62 games, lost 19, and tied four.

#### SEE COLBY RUN:

While everyone saw just how good Colby Goodwyn was running with his kick returns against Jacksonville two weeks ago, Goodwyn showed his skills from the line of scrimmage against Campbell. Late in the fourth quarter, Goodwyn carried the ball 14 straight times for 49 yards for the entire Monarch drive that set up Jarod Brown for a 19-yard field goal attempt that gave the ODU-Campbell game its final margin, 44-13.

#### WHITEOUT:

Old Dominion is asking all the 12th Monarchs to wear white to Saturday's William & Mary game to "White Out" Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium for the Comcast Cameras. Game Day White Out T-Shirts are currently available at the ODU Bookstore located on the corner of 45th street and Monarch Way. The White Out T-shirts are \$15.

#### **AIR RAID:**

Redshirt quarterback Thomas DeMarco passed for a career-high 334 yards in the season opener vs. Jacksonville, the first time he has passed for over 300 yards in a game. It was the fourth time he had a 200+ yard passing game of his ODU career

#### **COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS:**

Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.) was named the National Kick Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) for the week ending September 5th. Goodwyn totaled 86 yards on a pair of kickoff returns in last Saturday's season opener against Jacksonville. He dashed 68 yards in the second quarter, the second highest return in the brief history of the ODU program. He currently ranks 12th nationally in kick returns at a 30.5 yard return average.

Thomas DeMarco was named Honorable Metion Quarterback of the Week by CFPA for the week ending September 12th. Against Campbell, DeMarco finished the game completing 26 of his 33 throws, including an interception. He racked up 273 passing yards for four touchdowns. He currently ranks fourth nationally in in total offense averaging 338.50 yards per game.

#### **TOUGHEST TICKET IN TOWN:**

Response for Monarch football has been overwhelming. 14,377 season tickets were sold with season ticket applications made available in Feb. 2008. The school had to unfortunately turn away 296 season ticket orders for a total of 1,065 season tickets due to demand in the first season. The Monarchs enjoyed a 92% percent renewal rate for year number and went to the waiting list and promptly sold out of season tickets. A limited number of six-game packages were also available for purchase. Those tickets went on sale at 10 a.m. August 17th and sold out. Just under 500 tickets were scooped up in a little more than two hours. Tickets are also heavily in demand among the student population. Over 1,200 ODU students were in line when distribution began on Monday, August 24th at 8 a.m. for the inaugural game vs. Chowan on September 5th and over 2,500 student tickets were handed out on the first day. By the next night, only approximately 100 student tickets were available. The Monarch student population one-upped themselves this year as ticket distribution for the home opener vs. Jacksonville on September 4th were made available on Monday, August 30th at 7 a.m. and were completely gone by 2:30 p.m. that day. When the ticket windows opened, the line wrapped around the Ted Constant Convocation Center as head coach Bobby Wilder, his assistant coaches, and the 2010 captains were on hand to hand out donuts to those first in line.

#### **2010 NOTABLE FIRSTS:**

Linebacker Deron Jasper (Dunwoody, Ga.) had the first interception of the 2010 season, while Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) had the first touchdown. Both notables were also the first for each in a Monarch uniform.

#### **HISTORY IN THE MAKING:**

The Monarchs made history on September 5th when a three-year dream became a reality. On May 31, 2006, the ODU board of visitors voted to add football and 1,293 days later, the Monarchs kicked off their first season of Division I FCS play. ODU played an 11-game schedule, including seven home dates at the \$24.8 million renovated Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. The schedule was a mix of both D-II and D-I FCS opponents to help the Monarchs transition into not only its first year of football, but also to get ready for entering the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in 2011, the toughest FCS conference in the nation.

#### 12th MONARCH MOMENTS:

There may be 11 Monarchs on the field, but the 12th Monarch is in the stand. Thanks to all the noise of being "Loud and Proud" from the 12th Monarchs at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium, the opposition was charged with 41 penalties last season and seven so far in 2010.

#### **SO MANY MONARCHS, SO MANY OPTIONS:**

In 2009, 16 different Monarchs put points onto the scoreboard. "It's not necessarily one or two guys who are forcing the defense to defend multiple personnel and different personnel groupings," said head coach Bobby Wilder. "It's making us a team that's able to do different things. We're not an easy team to defend on offense right now." Through the first game of 2010, four different Monarchs have lit up the scoreboard.

#### **SERVING ON AND OFF THE FIELD:**

For the second straight year, redshirt junior defensive lineman Chad King (Springfield, Va.) was selected to attend the All American Bowl as an escort for this year's high school athletes. King, who is a cadet in ODU's Army ROTC program, is a member of a unit that encompasses six difference states and over 40 ROTC programs that are in South Carolina, North Carolina, Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, and West Virginia. Two cadets from the unit were selected as escorts with King ranked as number one cadet of those nominations submitted due to his athletic and academic successes. While at the All American Bowl, King will serve as a mentor to the high school athletes helping to escort the players throughout the weekend to each event and give advice to those about to enter the college ranks about the experiences of a collegiate student-athlete.

#### "HUMBLE AND HUNGRY":

The theme for the 2010 team is to be, "Humble and Hungry". "We are proud of what we accomplished in 2009. Having a 9-2 record, a six-game winning streak to end the season, and being recognized as the best first-year program in FCS history is something we are all proud of," explained head coach Bobby Wilder. "However, we realize that last year's success will not make a difference in the score of our games this year. If anything, we realize our opponents will look at our team differently in 2010." "We have all decided as a team we will be Humble based on our success last year," continued Wilder. "We will be grateful for the support we received. We think often of the 20,000 12th Monarchs that filled Foreman Field for seven Saturday's last fall. We will realize that we had success because we worked together as a team to accomplish our goals." "At the same time, we have decided we will be Hungry for more in 2010," noted Wilder. "We realize our schedule will be more challenging. We realize we have set the bar high for future success and expectations. We want to be the best team we can be in 2010 and we will work to improve everyday as people, students, and football players."

#### **OUT FOR THE SEASON:**

Sophomore cornerback Markwell Wilkins (Hampton, Va.) will miss the 2010 season will a torn ACL suffered while working out with Phoebus teammate Reid Evans last week. "You feel awful for the kid," said Wilder. "If there is a silver lining, he does have a redshirt year available." Last season, Wilkins appeared in all 11 games making 28 tackles, including 21 solo stops.

#### **I GET BY WITH A LITTLE HELP FROM MY FRIENDS:**

Head coach Bobby Wilder praised the improvement of his squad's communication this preseason, which is evident among many of the returning Monarchs. "What's great is that you see our veterans coaching up either the new guys or guys new to their position," he noted.

#### LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION - BSN ON CAMPUS:

Big Screen Network was on campus during the Monarchs' media day the first week of preseason to film many of the video elements fans will see up on the video board at today's game. ## Old Dominion Suffers Season Opener Loss To Jacksonville, 35-25

**NORFOLK, Va.-.** Old Dominion quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) was 22 of 40 for a career-high 334 yards and two touchdowns. DeMarco added another score on the ground after a 1-yard run, but three interceptions - two in the endzone - prevented the Monarchs from cutting into Jacksonville's lead.

Just like how the Monarchs started last in year in a number of games, ODU struck on the first drive. Drew Hareza (McDonald, Pa.) sailed the ball through the uprights on a 24-yard kick capping an opening 13-play, 66-yard drive to give the Monarchs the early 3-0 lead.

Back-to-back touchdowns by Jacksonville however saw the Dolphins take control of the lead for good and the Monarchs trying to be the "Comeback Kids" for the second straight time against their opponent from Florida.

Chris Kuck had a four-yard catch with 10:44 on the clock and on their next possession the Dolphins had the 14-3 edge. The second scoring drive for Jacksonville had the Dolphins backed up to their own 12, but that's when last year's leading rusher, Rudell Small, tore down the field for 45 yards and two plays later he was in the end zone.

Small would end the night will 118 yards.

Old Dominion, however, ended the half on a high note with the "one-minute drill". DeMarco connected with Prentice Gill (Los Angles, Calif.) for a 19-yard reception as ODU covered 50 yards on seven plays in 45 seconds. Gill's touchdown, the Monarchs' first of the 2010 season and Gill's first as a Monarch, cut the ODU deficit to 14-10 at the intermission.

Both teams traded scores in the third quarter. After ODU missed a 32-yard field goal attempt, Jacksonville followed with Josh Philpart on the receiving end of a 32-yard touchdown throw from Josh McGregor. Old Dominion quickly struck back though on the next drive needing just three plays to pull within four, 21-17.

Monty Smalley (Richmond, Va.) provided ODU with a 24-yard kick return to start the drive, Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) followed with a 21-yard run, Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) had a 31-yard catch, and then Dorian Jackson (Colonial Heights, Va.), who scored last year's game-winning touchdown, had a 44-yard reception to keep the Monarchs in the hunt.

The fourth quarter opened with Jacksonville going ahead, 28-17, with Dolphins covering 80 yards to end with Small scoring his second touchdown of the evening.

The Monarchs were immediately poised to cut into the deficit again, but an interception in the end zone put a stop to the ODU comeback. DeMarco threw a 34-yard pass downfield intending to hit Chris Lovitt (Stafford, Va.) in the end zone, but the ball got into the hands of Jacksonville's Andre Addison for the touchback.

ODU's next possession would indeed cut into the deficit and have the Monarchs trailing by just three points with 8:23 left in the game. The Dolphin's Logan Chipperfield managed just nine-yards on his punt and ODU started from their opponent's 34-yard line. Getting to the one-yard line, DeMarco ran the ball and Jackson was on the receiving end of the two-point conversion. The Monarchs trailed just 28-25 midway through the final quarter.

The next Jacksonville drive lasted just four downs before the Monarchs had the ball back. ODU made its way down the field, but another interception in the end zone, this time by the Dolphin's Jordan Dewhirst, thwarted ODU's chances again.

Jacksonville made the most of getting the ball back into its possession, scoring on a 19-yard pass to Philpart, his second touchdown catch of the game.

#### MONARCH MOMENTS:

#### OPENING WITH A BANG:

And no, we aren't talking about the howitzer you hear being shot off before the Monarchs run onto Foreman Field. Old Dominion scored on its first drive to kick off the 2010 season with Drew Hareza kicking the ball through the uprights for a field goal. The Monarchs have scored in their first drive in eight of its 12 total games played.

#### NOTABLE FIRSTS:

Linebacker Deron Jasper (Dunwoody, Ga.) had the first interception of the 2010 season while Prentice Gill (Los Angeles, Calif.) had the first touchdown. Both notables were also the first for each in a Monarch uniform.

#### WHO'S WHO IN THE BOOKS:

Colby Goodwyn's (Hampton, Va.) kick return was the second highest return in the brief ODU history. He dashed 68 yards in the second quarter. Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) is ahead of Goodwyn on the list having returned a 76-yard kick in the historic Chowan game last year.

#### AIR RAID:

Redshirt quarterback Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) passed for a careerhigh 334 yards, the first time he has passed for over 300 yards in a game. It was the fourth time he had a 200+ yard passing game of his ODU career.

# INTO THE WIN COLUMN: Monarchs Down Campbell, 44-13

**BUIES CREEK, N.C.** - The Old Dominion football team found the end zone on its first three drives and never looked back en-route to its 44-13 win over Campbell University at Lane-Barker Stadium.

The victory improves the Monarchs to 1-1 on the year as ODU played in its first road game of the 2010 season.

Marquel Thomas (Va. Beach, Va.) and Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.) led the Monarchs with a pair of touchdown receptions. Evans caught eight passes, the most by a Monarchs, ending the game with 65 yards. Thomas had 61 receiving yards on five receptions.

Thomas, who scored ODU's first-ever touchdown last season against Chowan, put the Monarchs up 7-0 early in the first quarter. Thomas' 22-yard reception from Thomas DeMarco (Palm Desert, Calif.) put the Monarchs ahead with 10:51 on the clock.

The Camels only got off four plays, before the Monarchs regained possession. After a touchback on the punt, the Monarchs covered the 80-yards capping the drive with a 10-yard touchdown reception by Reid Evans (Hampton, Va.). Jarod Brown's (Yorktown, Va.) PAT went wide right, but with 5:32 left in the opening quarter, ODU held a 13-0 edge.

Evans did it again on the next ODU drive. The sophomore receiver registered his fifth TD reception of his career opening second quarter action. Evans' second touchdown of the afternoon came on an eight-yard throw from DeMarco giving his squad a commanding 20-0 lead.

A personal foul penalty put the Camels into the red zone late in the second quarter resulting in Campbell making its first score of the afternoon. Campbell quarterback Daniel Polk, who scored the Camel's two touchdowns in their opener at UVA-Wise, broke the line for a six-yard run into the end zone.

The half ended as Campbell regained control of the ball on an interception. While two plays later it looked as if the Monarchs would have their own interception the Monarchs were called for roughing the passer and momentum continued for the Camels. As time expired in the opening half, Campbell's Adam Willetts had a 46-yard field goal sail through the uprights and ODU headed into the intermission ahead 20-10.

Thomas got things started for the Monarchs after halftime giving ODU a 27-10 edge on his second touchdown reception and third of his career. His eight-yard catch from DeMarco capped the 11 play, 52-yard drive.

Campbell put up a field goal in the closing minutes of the third quarter. Willets posted his second three-point kick, this time a 38-yard attempt, cutting the Monarch lead to 27-13 with 2:37 left in the third.

Old Dominion wasted no time in responding. On the third play of the drive, Mario Crawford (Detroit, Mich.) tore down the field gaining a 47 yard reception and bringing ODU to the Camel 10. The next play saw DeMarco with the QB keeper to the 1 and then jump over the end line on the next play to put the Monarchs up 34-13 with just 42 seconds left until the start of the final quarter.

Colby Goodwyn (Hampton, Va.), last week's College Football Performance Awards' Kick Returner of the Week, also got into the scoring mix. He had an up and over a pile on the goal line put the Monarchs ahead 41-13 with 12:48 left in the

Goodwyn, who saw a majority of the carries in the fourth quarter, finished the game with 17 carries and 58 yards.

Scoring continued for the Monarchs late in the fourth quarter. Brown's 19-yard field goal was good giving ODU the final 44-13 score.

Defensively, ODU's Michael Colbert led the way with seven unassisted tackles. Transfer Deron Mayo (Hampton, Va.) made six total stops, including a six-yard sack. Andrew Turner also took down Camel quarterback, Polk, pushing him back 11 yards.

DeMarco finished the game completing 26 of his 33 throws, including an interception. He racked up 273 passing yards for four touchdowns. Polk had just 68 yards on seven of 15 passing.

#### MONARCH MOMENTS:

#### **CATCHING IN THE END ZONE:**

Prior to the Campbell game, only Nick Mayers had more than one touchdown reception in a game - at Fordham (10/3/09) and last season at home against Campbell (10/17/09). In Saturday's win Marquel Thomas and Reid Evans joined Mayers in the category as each had a pair of TD catches.

#### PLAYING CATCH:

Reid Evan's eight receptions were the most by a Monarch. The previous high of six was held by Evans from last year's Jacksonville game.

#### TD'S FOR TD:

Thomas DeMarco on his 1-yard jaunt over the end line give ODU a 34-13 advantage with 42 seconds left in the third quarter was his19th rushing touchdown as a Monarch.
