The 2012 Old Dominion University Football Media Supplement has been designed for use by local and national media and Monarch fans. Additional information including press releases, photos, and video footage is available by request to accredited media outlets. Any questions not covered in this publication can be directed to the Old Dominion University Sports Information Office.

CREDENTIALS

Credentials for Old Dominion University home games are issued to working media only and must be visible as all times for access to the press box. Requests should be made as soon as possible, to Kimberly Zivkovich, Associate Director of Sports Information at Room 1102, Athletic Administration Building, Old Dominion University, Norfolk, VA 23529 or kzivkovi@odu.edu. Season credentials will be granted to daily newspapers and television/radio stations that cover the Monarchs on a regular basis. Other media outlets will be granted credentials on a single-game, space available basis at the discretion of the Sports Information Office. Requests for single-game credentials should arrive no later than 48 hours prior to the day of the game.

Credentials will be mailed if time permits or can be picked up at the Sports Information Office in Room 1102 of the Athletic Administration Building, until 5:00 p.m. the day before the game. Otherwise, they will be left at the media will-call at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium located on Bluestone Ave.

PARKING

Parking will be issued as credential requests are received. As space allows, media will be issued a tag for the Red Parking Garage located at the corner of 49th Street and Bluestone Ave. Overflow parking is located in the L.R. Hill Sports Complex Parking Lot at the corner of Powhatan Avenue and 43rd Street.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Following a brief cooling-off period, the visiting team's head coach and selected student-athletes will be available in the media room followed by Coach Wilder and requested ODU student-athletes. Requests for players will be collected in the press box, midway through the fourth quarter. The media room is located underneath section 103. PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographers will not be allowed on the sideline without a visible credential and armband issued by the Old Dominion University Sports Information Office. Under NCAA and Colonial Athletic Association guidelines, photographers are not allowed between the 25-yard lines. Credential holders not working will be asked to leave the sidelines.

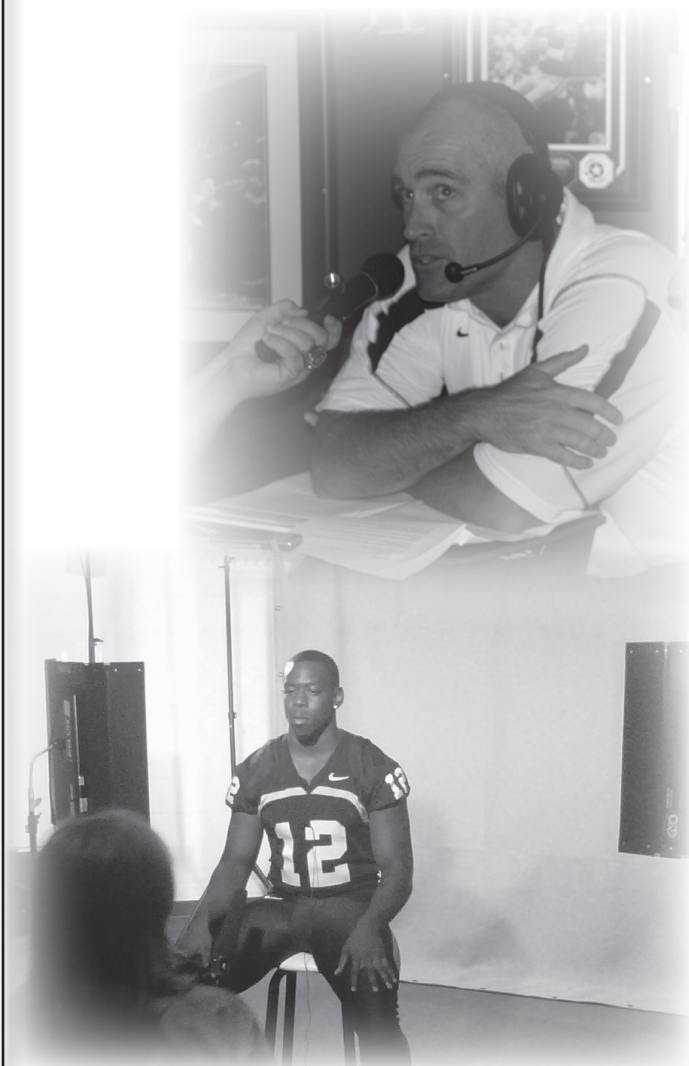
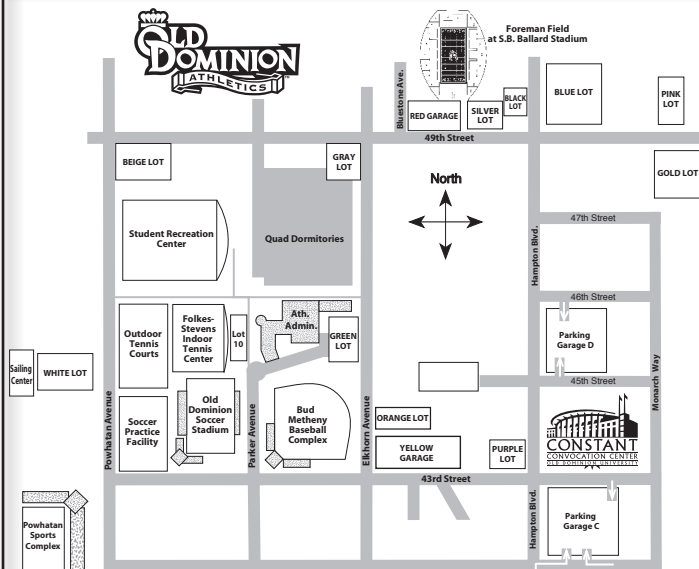

JOHN R. BRODERICK

John R. Broderick has served as the eighth president of Old Dominion University since 2008.

As president, he guides the University's six colleges, more than 10 economic development and research centers, and numerous partnerships with government, military and business organizations and agencies. He oversees an operating budget in excess of \$526 million and more than 2,500 faculty and staff members. More than \$338 million in new buildings and building renovations have been authorized or completed on his watch.

His leadership on campus has resulted in several initiatives to position Old Dominion as Virginia's forward-focused, public doctoral research university, efforts which have also attracted attention at the state and national levels. Broderick serves as one of six college presidents on the Governor's Commission on Higher Education Reform, Innovation and Investment, and in 2012 was appointed to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities Council of State Representatives. Additionally, the university has been named a Chronicle of Higher Education's "Great Place to Work" for two consecutive years.

Shortly after becoming president, Broderick introduced a University-wide initiative to set a new standard for student success and student learning, which included a \$10.2 million Student Success Center and Learning Commons and the creation of a vice president position and division for student engagement and enrollment services. Additionally, he has led efforts to keep the university affordable and accessible, while maintaining academic standards.

To support his vision of Old Dominion as a leader in local and statewide economic development and the go-to solutions provider for Hampton Roads and beyond, the University launched the ODU Business Gateway as a business-friendly entry point to the University, and the Innovation Foundation to streamline processes by which the University, its faculty and its students can participate in commercial endeavors.

Broderick's pursuit of parity in state funding and responsiveness to legislative calls for more efficiency, affordability and access in higher education have led to historic levels of state funding for Old Dominion and several of its initiatives, in particular modeling and simulation, bioelectrics, increased STEM degrees and online programs, and student financial aid, among others. Over the past two years, Old Dominion received more than \$30 million in additional funding from the General Assembly.

Private support for Old Dominion has also increased during Broderick's tenure. The university's endowment has increased \$50 million, and private support has helped fund endowed chairs in research and sciences, as well as new or expanded facilities for every arts-related program.

Broderick oversaw the renewal of football at Old Dominion in 2009, with the Monarchs posting the most successful record of any start-up team in FCS history. He served on the NCAA board of directors and as chair of the President's Football Championship Series advisory committee. This past spring, the University announced a membership agreement with Conference USA and a reclassification of its football program from the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision to the Football Bowl Subdivision.

The University's Board of Visitors voted in 2012 to extend his contract to 2017.

Prior to becoming president, Broderick served as vice president of institutional advancement and admissions and chief of staff to the president. His areas of responsibility included admissions, athletics, community and governmental relations, marketing, media relations, military affairs and student financial aid.

In addition to his administrative duties, Broderick annually teaches graduate courses in the Darden College of Education. He also has lectured on leadership for a variety of institutions and organizations, including the University of Bologna and the Virginia Chamber of Commerce Executive Association.

Broderick has been recognized for his contributions to higher education and the Hampton Roads community with the Virginia Center for Inclusive Communities' Humanitarian Award, the Urban League of Hampton Roads' Marian Palmer Capps Award, the College Communicators Association Distinguished Service Award, Lead Hampton Roads' Julian F. Hirst Award for excellence in community, civic and professional leadership, and a 2011 Visionary Award from the Hampton Roads Chamber of Commerce.

Throughout his career, Broderick has been actively engaged in numerous community and professional organizations. He currently is a board member of the Virginia Business Higher Education Council, Hampton Roads Partnership, Urban League and MacArthur Foundation, and served for many years as a youth soccer league coach in Chesapeake.

Prior to joining Old Dominion University, Broderick was a faculty member in the University of Pittsburgh system and an administrator at St. Bonaventure University. He received a bachelor's degree from Northeastern University and a graduate degree from St. Bonaventure. He is a native of Bristol, Conn.

DR. CAMDEN WOOD SELIG



Camden Wood Selig became the director of athletics for Old Dominion University on July 1, 2010.

Dr. Selig hit the ground running with a new strategic plan implemented for the department, upgraded athletic facilities, and spearheaded fund raising projects for a new basketball practice facility and baseball and soccer stadium enhancements. Most recently Selig assisted ODU President John Broderick in announcing the Monarchs move to Conference USA in 2013 while elevating the football program to the FBS level in 2014.

Under his leadership, the 2011-12 athletic year was another brilliant year competitively for ODU teams and student-athletes defining “Championship Effort” on the fields of competition. The 2011-12 year was highlighted by NCAA post season appearances in men’s basketball, football (second round), men’s soccer (second round), wrestling, men’s swimming, and field hockey (Final Four). ODU student-athletes received six CAA Players of the Year, three CAA Defenders of the Year, two CAA Rookies of the Year, three CAA tournament MVP’s, and three scholar Athletes of the Year honors. At the conclusion of the 2011-12 season, ODU athletics was ranked as the 79th best Division I program in the nation among the 340 Division I programs and highest in the CAA.

Additionally, ODU’s student-athletes did a masterful job in the classroom as over half earned a 3.0 or better last semester. Almost 5% of all ODU student athletes earned a perfect 4.0 last fall as the department continues to graduate about 92% of student-athletes who exhaust their eligibility.

With Selig’s direction, Old Dominion Athletic Foundation members and donors helped athletics achieve a record setting philanthropic year with annual giving exceeding \$3 million and membership hitting an all time high of nearly 3,000 donors. Collectively, private giving to the ODAF exceeded \$6 million in 2011 and funds are over half way toward the \$8 million fundraising goal to construct a new, state of the art men’s and women’s basketball practice facility.

“I am excited about our intercollegiate athletic future,” says Selig. “We all have a role in our success, from student-athletes, parents, coaches, athletic staff, University faculty/staff, corporate sponsors, our fans and donors. It is a shared responsibility embraced by all and I know we are collectively up for this challenge. We look forward to a successful final year in the CAA and our exciting Conference USA future.”

A native of Norfolk, Selig spent 11 years directing the Western Kentucky University Hilltopper program, which won 70 Sun Belt Conference championships since from 2000-2010 and a national- record 19 crowns during the 2008-10 seasons. He was a key figure in guiding the WKU football program’s move from NCAA Division I-AA to I-A in 2007, and he spearheaded more than \$100 million in new construction and renovations of Hilltopper facilities. The Hilltoppers also won more individual Sun Belt academic honors than any other league school from 2005-2010, and every men’s and women’s athletic team exceeded the NCAA-required 925 Academic Progress Rate.

“The appointment of Dr. Selig ensures that we will not only maintain ODU’s success, but also provide our program with the direction it needs to continue to grow and prosper. His experience as a strong fundraiser, along with his personnel and business leadership abilities and his background in sales and marketing, made him a solid choice for our search committee,” said ODU President John R. Broderick regarding Dr. Selig’s appointment in 2010.

Selig was a four year member (2006-2010) of the NCAA Women’s Basketball Committee and served as chair for both the Sun Belt Conference Athletic Directors and the Men’s Basketball Committees during his tenure at WKU. He recently served on the prestigious Division I Championships/ Sports Management Cabinet as the CAA’s representative. Locally, he serves on the Board of Trustees for Norfolk Collegiate School and the board of the Norfolk Forum.

Selig earned a bachelor’s degree in psychology from Washington and Lee University, a master’s in sports administration from Ohio University and a doctorate in educational leadership from the University of Virginia with a minor in business from the Darden School of Business.

Selig and his wife, Ellen Miller Selig of Annapolis MD, have three children, Lex, 15, Nick, 13, and Julianna, 8.

On September 13, 2008, Old Dominion University officially opened the L.R. Hill Sports Complex, a 58,000 square foot facility that houses the Monarch football program, as well as Lady Monarch field hockey and lacrosse.

Arguably one of the top Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) facilities in the country, the first level houses a 6,000 square foot strength & conditioning area, a 3,000 square foot athletic training room, a players' lounge and players' and coaches' locker rooms. The players' locker room features the most efficient lockers available, with room for up to 98 players and six high-definition flat screen televisions. The lockers are 32 inches wide and feature helmet and shoulder pad racks with fans atop each unit, allowing equipment to dry overnight.

The second level houses the coaches' offices, staff meeting rooms, a team meeting room that can be divided into three sections with four projection video screens, and a video room featuring a state-of-the-art editing system. Just behind the facility lies two AstroTurf GameDay Grass 3D fields that the Monarchs use for practice.

The GameDay Grass 3D fields were supplied by GeneralSports Venue (GSV), a certified minority business enterprise and the exclusive U.S. marketer of AstroTurf-branded products. GameDay Grass 3D is one of the most advanced synthetic turf products, featuring best-in-class performance and safety benefits, and characteristics that closely mimic the look and feel of natural grass.

FROM DREAMS TO REALITY

Foreman Field was named after Norfolk attorney A.H. Foreman, a member of William and Mary's board of visitors and one of the founders of the Norfolk Division of William & Mary, which later became Old Dominion University.

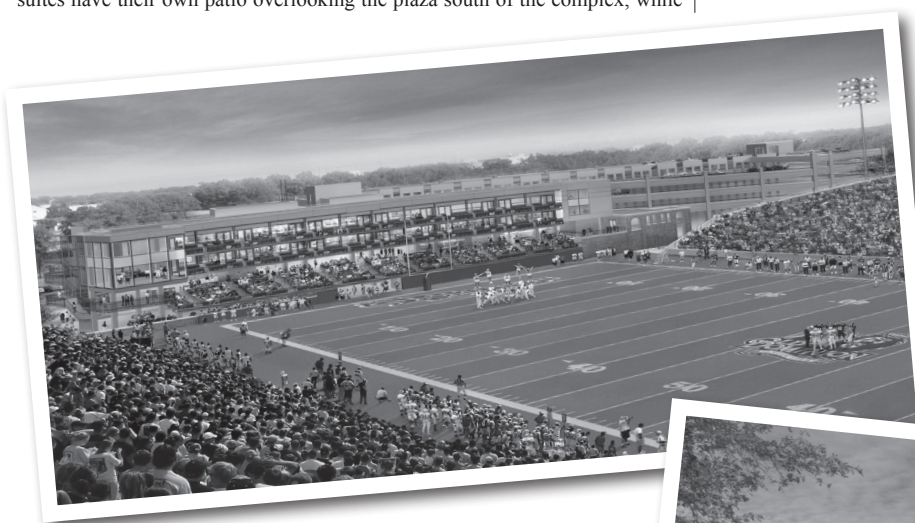
Originally intended as the home of the Norfolk Division football program, it found new life as the home to other college and community sports programs when football was originally dropped in 1941. Built in 1936, with state and federal funds provided during the Great Depression, Foreman Field has undergone a \$24.8 million dollar renovation over the last year with the help of SB Ballard Construction Company and Clark Nexsen Architecture and Engineering.

The renovation to the game day home of the football Monarchs includes a new state-of-the-art game day building, field surface, scoreboard, sound system, field enclosure and a contiguous parking garage.

The Ainslie Football Complex features 26 luxury suites and 390 loge seats in 100 mini boxes, in addition to recruiting and hospitality facilities and game day locker rooms for Monarch student-athletes and coaches. Twelve of the suites have their own patio overlooking the plaza south of the complex, while

the loge seating area also includes an 8,000 square foot covered patio on the second level of the facility. Another 7,500 square foot enclosed terrace looks directly out over the south end zone. The playing surface at Foreman Field has been replaced by AstroTurf GameDay Grass 3D.

The stadium has been named S.B. Ballard Stadium at Foreman Field in honor of Stephen and B.J. Ballard and SB Construction, the company responsible for many on-campus construction projects, including Foreman Field. The Ainslie Football Complex, the new game-day building that houses concessions and suites, has been named for Jeffrey W. Ainslie ('83). The Alcaraz-Weinstein Family Plaza, the plaza entrance for the Monarch football team and fans, is in honor of the Gary Alcaraz ('84) and Lee Weinstein families.

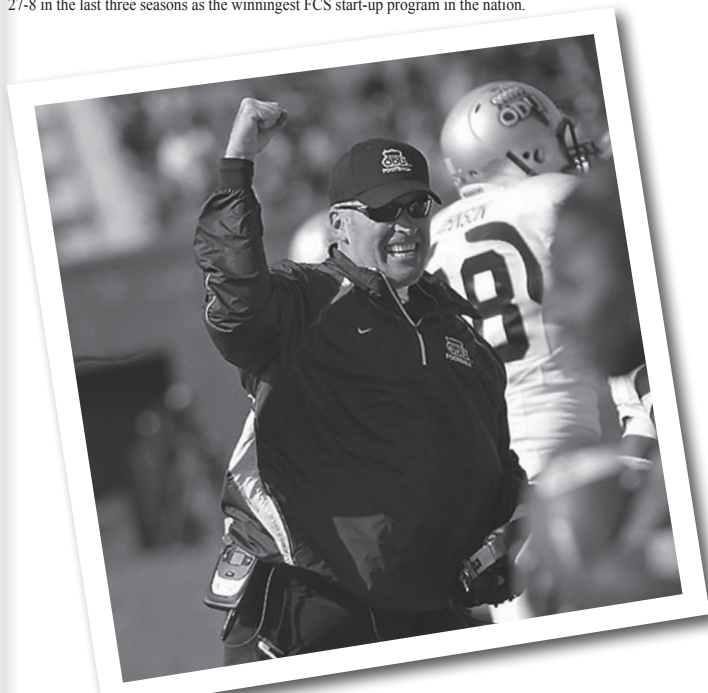
When he was hired on February 13, 2007, Bobby Wilder's goal was to "AIM HIGH" in everything he did in resurrecting the Old Dominion football team from a 69-year absence. After three years of orchestrating every piece of the puzzle, Wilder's vision has become reality as he has built a program that has not only been the buzz of the Hampton Roads community, but has become the most successful start-up FCS program in history.

Since restarting its football team in 2009, Old Dominion has compiled a three-year total of 27 wins and only eight losses and in its third year of play has already climbed the polls to a top-10 ranking and a playoff appearance.

In 2011, the Monarchs concluded the year at 10-3 overall and ranked No. 10 in both The Sports Network/Fathead.com and FCS Coaches Final Polls, the fastest climb to the top-10 of any start-up program. In just their first season of conference play in the Colonial Athletic Association, considered by many the toughest FCS conference in the nation, ODU went 6-2 against league opponents. Picked to finish 10th in the CAA Preseason Poll, ODU ended the year in a tie for second place in the CAA, a conference which sent five teams to the post-season. The Monarchs were among those five teams advancing to the FCS playoffs where they defeated MEAC Champions Norfolk State in first round action and advanced to the second round of the playoffs against Georgia Southern in one of the most thrilling games of the Division I Football Championships.

The 2011 season also brought a host of accolades for the program. In addition to 11 Monarchs being honored as All-CAA student-athletes on the field and 15 Monarchs named Academic All-CAA for their performance in the classroom, senior defensive lineman Ronnie Cameron was named the CAA Defensive Player of the Year and CAA Football's

Since restarting the ODU football program in 2009, Wilder and the Monarchs have gone 27-8 in the last three seasons as the winningest FCS start-up program in the nation.

Student-Athlete of the Year. Cameron and punter Jonathan Plisco brought home numerous All-America honors and freshman quarterback Taylor Heinicke was the runner-up for The Sport Network's Jerry Rice Award as the FCS' top freshman and was honored as the College Football Performance Awards' National Performer of the Year. Additionally, Wilder was named College Sports Madness' National Coach of the Year, finished third in voting for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year, and was named the J. Roy Rodman Memorial award winner, an annual honor given to Virginia's Outstanding Collegiate Coach by the Norfolk Sports Club.

Among all the FCS programs, Old Dominion finished in the top-10 in total offense, scoring offense, and net punting, while concluding the 2011 campaign in the top-20 in passing offense, turnover margin, passing efficiency, and sacks as well. Plisco continued to shine as one the country's top punters ranking second in the nation and redshirt freshman Erik Lewis tied for ninth among FCS defenders in interceptions. The Monarchs also continued to be the hot ticket in town finishing sixth nationally in attendance with capacity crowds at all seven home contests and extending its streak to 21 consecutive sellouts at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

The success of the 2011 campaign was due in large part to the foundation Wilder, the coaching staff, and the Monarchs laid in the second season of football in 2010. The Monarchs, who upgraded their schedule in year two in preparation for joining the CAA, added a pair of ranked opponents in #12/13 William & Mary and #14/16 Cal Poly, and played their way to a 8-3 mark.

Statistically speaking, the Monarchs finished their second season of gridiron action fourth in kickoff returns, ranked eighth in scoring offense, eighth in sacks allowed, and 15th in passing offense. Under Wilder's tutelage, punter Jonathan Plisco ranked second nationally in punting, quarterback Thomas DeMarco continued to rank among the top 10 in total offense, newcomer Colby Goodwyn ran his way to third nationally in punt returns, and Ronnie Cameron pushed his way into eighth overall among FCS defenders in tackles for loss.

Wilder and his staff's inaugural season of play at the Football Championship Subdivision level went well beyond expectations. From the celebrated kickoff versus Chowan, to the heart pounding first FCS victory against Jacksonville, to ensuring a winning season at Savannah State, to extending the win-streak to six in the season finale at VMI, history was made every step of the way. The Monarchs concluded the 2009 season at 9-2 overall writing their way into history.

"I consider it to be an honor and a privilege to be the head football coach at Old Dominion University. I am grateful to our President John Broderick (Co-Chair of the Head Coach Selection Committee) for this tremendous opportunity I have been given. I am also excited to work with Wood Selig, our Athletic Director. He has a remarkable vision for our athletic programs and our student-athletes."

The Monarchs finished the year ranked in the top ten in five statistical categories as a team including second in sacks allowed, third in scoring offense, turnover margin, and net punting, and ninth in rushing offense. Individually, ODU had its first football All-Americans named in punter Jonathan Plisco and long snapper Dustin Phillips with Plisco leading the nation in punt yardage averaging 44.84 yards per contest. Quarterback Thomas DeMarco was also ranked in the top ten in scoring and was the second leading FCS signal caller in rushing. Wilder meanwhile received the Tom Fergusson Memorial Award at the 65th Norfolk Sports Club Jamboree named as the Metropolitan Person of the Year in Sports

In addition to his recruiting efforts, Wilder has also been an essential part in the planning and development of what are among the top football facilities in the country. The state-of-the-art \$17 million L.R. Hill Sports Complex that houses the ODU football offices, athletic and strength training areas, locker rooms and two practice fields with artificial surface and the \$24.8 million Foreman Field Football Complex, which includes the Ainslie Game Day Building, Astoturf GameDay Grass 3D field surface, scoreboard, sound system, field enclosure and a contiguous parking garage, are among the best the FCS has to offer.

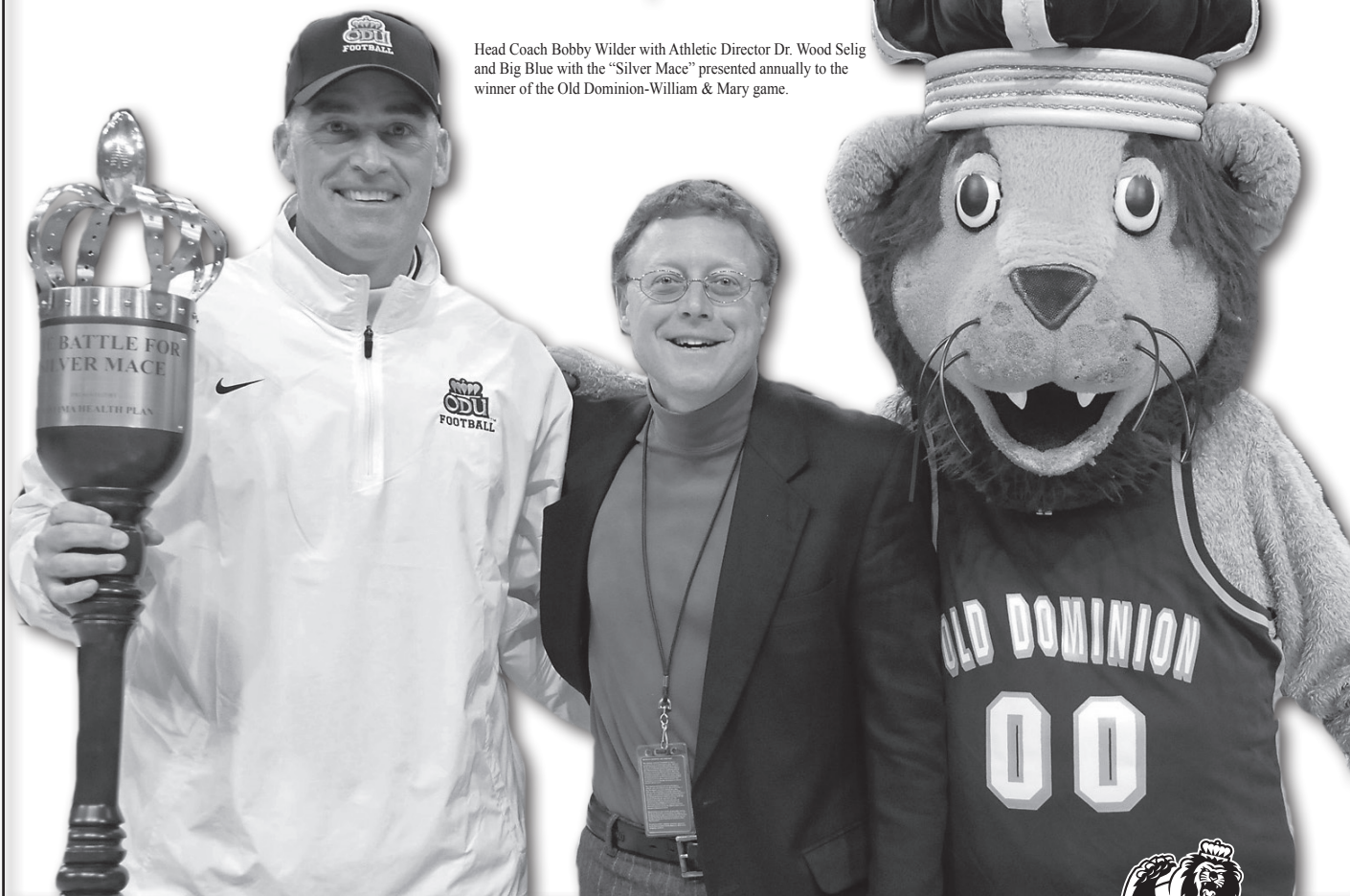

Since arriving in Norfolk, Wilder has hit the ground running and has not stopped in his quest to make Old Dominion a championship caliber program. Both on and off the field, the Monarch head coach is always making sure that the Old Dominion football program is visible throughout the campus, the community and the state. He has honored over 400 speaking engagements to a variety of organizations, but his most important talks have come with high schools coaches throughout the state. Wilder and his staff have made it a point to build a fence around the Hampton Roads community and the state of Virginia, with plans of building a first rate program with players a stones throw from the ODU campus.

Wilder has also been instrumental in getting his team active in the Hampton Roads Community. In what has become an annual event, the ODU Football Monarchs host a bone marrow registry drive and to date has helped register over 650 members of the ODU student body, faculty/staff, and the Hampton Roads community to the registry in an attempt to help save lives from life-threatening diseases nationwide. The Monarchs have also been active volunteering with Special Olympics, hosting youth clinics, and participating at reading and career days at many of the area's elementary and middle schools.

RECORDS & HISTORY

Prior to his arrival at ODU, Wilder served on the Maine staff for the past 17 years and was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator in 2000 before moving to associate head coach in 2001.

As coordinator, Wilder orchestrated a balanced attack. The Black Bears averaged 29.1 points per game in 2004, and scored 29 or more in seven of 11 games. Wilder helped tutor running back Marcus Williams, who rushed for 1,077 yards during his senior season, which moved him into first place in school history for career rushing yards. Maine also threw the ball a lot during the campaign as eight different receivers each had double-digit receptions. Ron Whitcomb was at the head of the passing attack as his completions (213) and attempts (350) were the fourth most in a single season since 1950. His 22 touchdown tosses were tied for third most since 1950. Overall, the offense averaged an impressive 5.2 yards per play.

Wilder was named the Assistant Coach of the Year by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston in 2004, which is presented annually to the top assistant coach in New England.

In 2003, the Black Bears had over 2,000 yards rushing and passing with 4,142 total yards. The ground game was anchored by Williams and the passing game was in the hands of then-freshman Ron Whitcomb, who was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year as he posted 2,428 yards - the fifth most in a season at Maine.

The 2002 Black Bears finished the season with 4,702 yards in total offense, the most since a school-record 4,861 yards in 1989. In 2001, for the first time in school history, the offense boasted a 2,000-yard passer in Jake Eaton, a 1,000-yard rusher in Royston English, and a 1,000-yard receiver in Stefan Gomes.

Prior to moving to the coordinator post, Wilder served as quarterbacks coach during one of the most explosive eras in Maine history for Black Bear quarterbacks. Wilder guided four-year starter Mickey Fein to 17 University marks, including the two highest season totals for touchdown passes. Fein ended his career as Maine's second all-time leading passer.

In 2000, Wilder's first full season as offensive coordinator, the Black Bears ranked third in the Atlantic 10 with 29.0 points per game. The rushing game increased its output by 41 yards per game from the previous season and Eaton garnered All-New England honors. Two wide receivers from that team, Dwayne Wilmot and Phil McGeoghan, signed pro contracts and were in NFL camps in 2001. In 2002, Maine tight end Chad Hayes signed with the Kansas City Chiefs and then played briefly with the Cincinnati Bengals.

A 1987 graduate of Maine with a degree in physical education, Wilder captained the Black Bears to the Yankee Conference Championship his senior year. An All-New England quarterback in 1985, he left Maine as the school's all-time leading passer with 4,493 yards, and is currently sixth behind Mike Buck, Emilio Colon, Fein, Eaton and Whitcomb on the career passing list. Wilder coached four of those former players and played with the fifth.

A 1982 graduate of Madison High School in Madison, Maine, Wilder was a highly recruited quarterback his senior year. He opted to attend Maine and in his sophomore year led the Black Bears to their first of five consecutive winning seasons.

Upon graduation, Wilder served as a graduate assistant coach for two seasons under Jack Bicknell at Boston College, where he earned his master's degree in educational administration in 1990.

Wilder and his wife, Pam, live in Norfolk with their sons, Derek (16) and Drew (11).

Brian Scott, a standout quarterback at Maine from 1995-1999, is the offensive coordinator at Old Dominion beginning his sixth season with the program in the Fall of 2012.

Scott was elevated to Associate Head Coach following the Monarchs' 2011 campaign that saw ODU reach new heights with a 10-3 overall mark, a No. 10 national ranking, and a berth to the NCAA Division I Football Championships.

In 2011, Scott's offense not only was among the top of the highly competitive Colonial Athletic Association, but the nation yet again. The Monarch offensive line helped pave the way for ODU to rank fifth nationally and lead the CAA in scoring offense at 36.69 points per game as well as 10th nationally among FCS schools and top the league in total offense averaging 439.08 yards per contest. ODU averaged 168.15 yards of rushing offense, third in the league, and 270.92 yards of passing offense, second in the league and 18th in the country. Four Monarchs from the offense earned All-CAA honors in ODU's first season in the league

The second season of Old Dominion football in 2010 saw the Monarchs collect an 8-3 mark in its final season of playing independent football before moving to the CAA. The Monarchs ranked eighth in the country in scoring offense fueled by quarterback and Walter Payton Award Watch List member Thomas DeMarco who finished seventh in the nation in total offense. The Monarch offense averaged 33.55 points per game.

After helping head coach Bobby Wilder and his team to a 9-2 overall mark in the inaugural campaign for Old Dominion in 2009, Scott was among the four finalists for FootballScoop.com's D-1AA Coordinator of the Year.

Under Scott's leadership in the inaugural campaign, the ODU offense finished third nationally in scoring offense averaging 35 points per contest and 18th nationally in total offense averaging just under 400 yards per game. Additionally, the Monarchs ranked second nationally in sacks allowed and ninth among all FCS schools in fewest turnovers on the year with 14. ODU's offensive efforts saw the Monarchs score 28 touchdowns in 39 red zone opportunities.

Prior to joining the Monarch coaching staff, Scott had served as recruiting coordinator, offensive line, running back and tight ends coach at Maine since 2003. In his first season as the offensive line coach, he helped tutor senior co-captain and center Ben Lazarski, who was named an Associated Press third-team All-American. He also tutored Josh Radulski who earned second team All-Atlantic 10 honors in 2004 as he totaled 29 receptions for 271 yards and five touchdowns.

Scott coached the wide receivers, tight ends, and kickoff return team during the 2001 season at the University of Tennessee-Martin. Two of his receivers finished in the top five in receptions per game in the Ohio Valley Conference. He also guided the Skyhawks kickoff return team from last place in the nine-team league in 2002 to third place in the league in 2003.

Before Tennessee-Martin, Scott served as the quarterback coach in 2002 at the University of Massachusetts-Lowell, an NCAA Division II institution. He was instrumental in developing a new passing scheme that set new school records for completions, pass attempts and passing yards in a single season.

In 2000 and 2001, Scott was the offensive coordinator and quarterback coach at Cony High School in Augusta, Maine. He implemented a new offensive game plan that helped Cony reach the Class A State playoffs for the first time in 10 years.

After a brilliant high school career as a quarterback at Waterville High School, Scott joined the Maine football team in 1995. He served as a back-up quarterback for three seasons before getting the nod as the starter in 1999. He won the Maine Sports Hall of Fame Special Achievement Award, and is the tenth all-time leading passer at the school.

Scott earned a B.S. in Communications from the University of Maine in 2000.

"I am happy to be a part of the rebirth of Old Dominion football. Offensively we will be wide open. We'll look to recruit the top players in the state and let them showcase their ability in front of 20,000 people at Foreman Field. We will run the "spread" offense similar to Florida, and try to create mismatches for our playmakers. We will constantly put pressure on the defense with our up-tempo style of play. Our fans will be excited to watch the style of offense we will play."

Bill Dee - Defensive Coordinator

Bill Dee, former Christopher Newport assistant and four-time state championship Phoebus High School coach, will start his second season with the Monarchs and his first as Old Dominion's Defensive Coordinator.

Dee joined the coaching staff in the spring of 2011 and patrolled the sidelines overseeing the offensive line. The

Monarchs garnered a 10-3 overall mark, its first ever national ranking finished the season at No. 10 in the country, and advanced to the second round of the FCS playoffs.

In ODU's first season in the Colonial Athletic Association, considered by many the top FCS conference in the nation. The Monarch offensive line helped the team top the league standings in scoring offense and rank fifth nationally at 36.69 points per game. Additionally, the offensive line helped the team rank first in CAA in total offense and ranked 10th in the country racking up 439.08 yards each time the Monarchs took the field and rank third among all conference schools and 18th in the country gaining 270.92 yards of passing offense.

Under Dee's leadership, Jeremy Hensley, the Monarchs' center, was a Third Team All-CAA honoree.

Dee joined the Monarchs after a two-year stint at Division III Christopher Newport in Newport News where he coached the inside linebackers and defensive line. The Captains won the 2010 USA South Conference title and competed in the NCAA Division III playoffs.

A legendary high school coach in Virginia, Dee led Hampton-based Phoebus to four state championships and compiled a 243-76-1 record during his 24-year career. Capturing a .761 winning percentage, he helped the Phantoms to nine district and seven regional championships in addition to his four state titles.

In his final game, Phoebus defeated Dinwiddie, 37-13, at Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium in 2008, completing a 15-0 season. His team ended ranked #3 in the nation by Rivals.com.

Beginning his coaching career at Greene High School in New York, Dee served as the defensive coordinator for four seasons before moving to the Hampton Roads region and spending a year at Denbigh High School in a similar capacity. Dee's first head coaching job was at Southampton High School from 1981-1984 before his illustrious 24-year career at Phoebus.

Dee is a 1975 Mansfield State graduate where he played four seasons at offensive guard.

Dealton Cotton begins his fifth season as a member of the Monarch Football coaching staff. Cotton oversees the Monarchs' defensive line and also added the title of Assistant Head Coach to his name in the Fall of 2011.

During his time at Old Dominion, Cotton has helped the Monarchs to a 27-8 mark in three seasons as the winningest start-up FCS program. In 2011, the Monarchs not only achieved its first-ever national ranking, but finished the season 10th in the country in both the Sports Network/Fathead.com and FCS Coaches Polls. Playing in their first season in the nationally renowned Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), Old Dominion finished second with a 6-2 record.

Under Cotton's tutelage, defensive tackle Ronnie Cameron became the most decorated Monarch in the school's brief history. Cameron earned not only All-America honors from seven different publications in 2011, but was named the CAA's Defensive Player of the Year and the CAA Student-Athlete of the Year for his contributions on the field, in the classroom, and around the community.

Additionally, Chris Burnette earned Third Team All-CAA honors in the Monarchs' inaugural season in the league.

A native of Norfolk, Cotton spent 13 years coaching high school football, including the last five as a head coach. Before joining the Monarch coaching staff, Cotton was at the helm of the Maury High School program, coaching the Commodores to a four-year mark of 30-15. He earned District Coach of the Year and NFL State Coach of the Year honors in 2005 after posting a mark of 10-2.

Cotton's first head coaching stint came at Hertford County High School in North Carolina where he earned another District Coach of the Year distinction in 2003 after taking the Bears from 5-5 the previous season to a mark of 10-2.

Cotton holds three degrees from East Carolina University including a bachelor's in criminal justice and a bachelor's and master's degree in social work. A four-year letterman at nose guard for the Pirates' football team, Cotton helped guide ECU to appearances in the 1992 Peach Bowl and the 1994 Liberty Bowl.

Marc Bacote will begin his second season as a member of the Old Dominion Football coaching staff overseeing the Monarchs' defensive backs.

In Bacote's first season with Old Dominion, the Monarchs made a splash in both their first season of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), but the national scene as well. With a 10-3 overall record and 6-2 conference mark, ODU finished with a No. 10

national ranking in both the FCS Coaches and Sports

Network/Fathead.com Polls and second in the CAA. The Monarchs advanced to their first ever post-season appearance reaching the second round of the FCS playoffs.

Under Bacote's guidance, cornerback Eriq Lewis became a Second Team All-CAA honoree.

Bacote joined the Monarch coaching staff from Rutgers University where he worked in player development, including assisting with the defensive backs and specials teams under former coach and current Tampa Bay head coach Greg Schiano.

Prior to joining the Scarlet Knight staff, Bacote spent two seasons at Morehead State coaching the wide receivers.

A standout at both Hampton High School and Fork Union Military Academy, Bacote was a four-year letterwinner at wide receiver for James Madison from 1997-2000, including the Dukes' 1999 Atlantic-10 co-championship and NCAA playoff appearance. He caught 48 passes for 602 yards and four touchdowns in his career.

A native of nearby Virginia Beach, Zohn Burden, one of the original members of the Monarch coaching staff, returns to the Old Dominion staff to tutor the wide receivers, one of the deepest and most experienced positions for the Football Monarchs heading into the second season of Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) action.

Burden returns to the Monarchs after spending the 2011 season coaching the wide receivers at the University of Richmond. Among those under Burden's watch included All-CAA First Teamer Tre Gray.

Originally joining the start-up Old Dominion program in 2007, Burden helped to build the Monarch program from the ground-up. On the sidelines coaching the defensive backs, he helped Old Dominion capture a 9-2 overall record in their first season of play in 2009 and a 8-3 mark in 2010 as the Monarchs became the winningest start-up program in FCS history.

Prior to coming to Old Dominion, Burden spent a season as an assistant at Fork Union Military Academy where he worked with the wide receivers and defensive backs, while also serving as the passing game coordinator and recruiting liaison.

Burden earned his undergraduate degree in psychology in 2006 from Virginia Military Institute where he played wide receiver for the Keydets. His name is still listed among the Big South's all-time leaders in receptions and receiving yards. The three-time all-conference honoree also held the school record with a reception in 34 consecutive games.

Burden is the father of Zaria and Zamir.

Corey Hetherman begins his third season with the Football Monarchs in the Fall of 2012. After two seasons of coaching the rovers, Hetherman was elevated to Defensive Run Game Coordinator following the Monarchs' successful 2011 campaign and will continue to coach the linebackers.

Old Dominion played its way to a 10-3 overall mark in Hetherman's second year on staff, which included a second place finish in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) at 6-2, a

top-10 ranking in the national polls, and a second round appearance in the NCAA Division I Football Championships.

Under the guidance of Hetherman, linebacker Craig Wilkins was a First Team All-CAA honoree in the Monarchs' first season of competition in the league. Wilkins became the first Monarch to crack the century mark in tackles in a season and ranked 12th among the league's defenders.

In his first year on the Monarch staff, Old Dominion captured an 8-3 overall mark playing their final season of independent football before making the move to the CAA, the nation's toughest FCS conference. Under Hetherman's watch, linebacker Wilkins led the defense with 74 tackles (35 solo, 39 assisted) along with a team-leading five fumble recoveries.

Hetherman came to Old Dominion from Western New England College where he served as the Offensive and Recruiting Coordinator, having joined the staff after Northeastern disbanded its football program. At Northeastern, he coached the outside linebackers, including two-time CAA Freshman of the Week Kyle Hunte and Jason Vega, who signed with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League. Hetherman was also a graduate assistant at Springfield College and interned with the King's College football program.

Hetherman was the starting quarterback for Fitchburg State College from 2003-2005 guiding the Falcons to an overall record of 21-11. During his career, Fitchburg State were two-time MASCAC Champions, two-time NEFC Bogan Division Champions, and made two ECAC Bowl appearances. He captained the Falcons during his senior year and was a three-time MASCAC and NEFC All-Scholastic Team honoree. He graduated in 2006 with a degree in secondary education.

Following graduation, Hetherman was the starting quarterback for the Austrian Football League's Carinthian Black Lions and the German Football League's Wuerzburg Panthers. Hetherman also spent 2007 as the Offensive Coordinator with the Panthers.

Keita Malloy, who is entering his fifth season as a member of the Monarch coaching staff this Fall, enters his first season as the Assistant Defensive Coordinator overseeing the ODU secondary.

Prior to moving to the defensive side of the game, Malloy spent the last four seasons tutoring the wide receivers and tight ends developing one of the deepest positions on the ODU roster. In 2010, he also added Pass Game Coordinator to his title as well.

In 2011, Malloy's receiving corps ranked 18th nationally in passing offense capturing over 270 yards as the Monarchs captured a 10-3 overall mark, played their way to a second place finish in their first season in the Colonial Athletic Association, and advanced to the second round of the FCS playoff. The receivers were led by Frist Team All-CAA honoree Nick Mayers and Third Team All-CAA selection Reid Evans. Mayers and Evans were among the league's top receivers with Mayer posting seven touchdowns and nearly 700 receiving yards in the Monarchs' 13 games. Together Malloy's pupils helped the Monarchs rank fifth among all FCS schools in scoring averaging almost 37 points per contest.

In year number two, the Monarchs went 8-3 continuing its success as the winningest start-up FCS program with ODU ranking eighth in scoring offense generating 33.55 points per game.

In the first season of Division I football at Old Dominion, Malloy helped coach the Monarchs to the winningest start-up FCS record in the nation at 9-2. Malloy's wide receivers and tight ends helped the Monarchs average just under 400 yards per game in total offense, ranking the team among the top 20 nationally in total offense.

Malloy came to ODU after having spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut.

While on staff with the Bantams, he worked with two all-conference wide receivers in Chris Olenoski and Joe Clark. He served as the tight ends coach (2003) and running backs coach (2004 & 2005) at Fordham University, where he also oversaw the team's academics. While at Fordham in 2005, Malloy helped James Prydatko earn Second Team All-Patriot League honors as he became just the second Ram running back to rush for more than 1,000 yards on the I-AA level. In 2004, he guided freshman Jonte Coven to the Patriot League Rookie of the Year award.

Malloy also served as an assistant coach at West Georgia State University and Lafayette College. At West Georgia he coached wide receivers and a kickoff return team that set a school record with a 99-yard touchdown return. In addition, he guided receiver Detron Harris to a single-season record 63 catches in 2002, helping him earn an invitation to training camp with the Tennessee Titans. Malloy also served as the recruiting coordinator and pro liaison at West Georgia.

At Lafayette College in 2000, Malloy coached the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year, Phil Yarberough, who set the school's career receiving records. He then moved on to Washburn University in 2001 where he coached the running backs and wide receivers, as well as directing the kickoff return team. At Washburn, Malloy helped Colon McNeal to second team all-conference honors as well as an appearance in the Cactus Bowl, the NCAA Division II All-Star Game.

A 1995 graduate of the University of Delaware where he was a three-year letterwinner, Malloy played wide receiver and defensive back for the Blue Hens. He was an all-conference wide receiver while helping Delaware win back-to-back league titles and earn three NCAA Division I-AA playoff bids. Malloy, who also holds a master's degree in education from American Intercontinental University, played professionally in the Arena Football League from 1994 to 1996 for the Massachusetts Marauders, the Albany Firebirds, and the Texas Terror.

Ron Whitcomb will begin his fifth year with the Old Dominion University football program in the Fall of 2012. Since joining the staff as the quarterbacks coach in 2007, he has been elevated to Recruiting Coordinator and Offensive Pass Game Coordinator following the success of the 2011 season.

Under Whitcomb's watch, over the last three seasons the Monarchs have a two-time Walter Payton Watch List member in Thomas DeMarco in 2010 and 2011 and the College Football Performance Awards FCS National Performer of the Year, Jerry Rice Award Runner-Up, and Walter Payton Watch List member in Taylor Heinicke.

In the Monarchs' first season of FCS play, Whitcomb tutored quarterback Thomas DeMarco, who went on to become the second leading quarterback in the FCS in rushing behind Florida A&M's Curtis Pulley and seventh among FCS student-athletes in scoring, averaging 9.45 points per contest. DeMarco completed 137 of his 255 attempts throwing for 21 touchdown passes and making only four interceptions as the Monarchs finished at 9-2 as the winningest FCS start-up program in history.

Whitcomb's tutelage of signal caller Thomas DeMarco continued in year two and resulted in the Monarch quarterback being named to the prestigious Walter Payton Award Watch List in the preseason and ending the 2010 campaign ranked seventh in the nation in total offense.

Success continued for the Monarch signal callers in 2011 with DeMarco being named to the Walter Payton Watch list for the second straight season and Heinicke, as a true freshman, having a breakout year completing 211 of his 307 passes with just one interception. Although Heinicke did not appear in the minimum 75% of games plays to have his name listed among the national stats, Heinicke would have ranked 18th nationally in passing yards, fifth nationally in pass efficiency rating, and 10th among all FCS athletes in total offense per contest.

Before joining the Old Dominion staff, Whitcomb was a four-year starter at the University of Maine where he played under Coach Wilder from 2003-2006.

Whitcomb, departed as the Black Bears' all-time leader in completions (755), total offense (8,801) and touchdown passes (68). His 8,183 passing yards ranked second, as did his .592 completion percentage. One of three senior captains at Maine in 2006, Whitcomb was named the Atlantic-10 and Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Rookie of the Year as a redshirt freshman after passing for 2,428 yards and 21 touchdowns. The passing yardage was the most by a freshman in Atlantic-10 history and he also established a new school record with touchdown passes in 11 straight games.

A standout off the field as well, Whitcomb was honored as the 2006-07 Atlantic-10 Student-Athlete of the Year. He earned his B.S. in Education from Maine in 2006 and a M.S. Ed. in Educational Leadership at Old Dominion University in 2009.

For the last three seasons, Whitcomb has participated in the annual Lauren's First and Goal Football Camp at Lafayette College. The one-day clinic features nearly 275 college coaches who volunteer their time to teach aspiring football players the in-and-outs of the game and raise money for Lauren's First and Goal, a charitable organization created to support pediatric brain tumor research and support local pediatric cancer services.

Michael Zyskowski enters his fifth season this Fall as the Monarchs's special teams coordinator and after tutoring the running backs the past four seasons, he will now assist with the offensive line.

Under Zyskowski's tutelage on special teams, punter Jonathan Plisco has earned nine All-America honors and the Monarchs have been among the nation's leaders in blocked kicks.

As the Monarchs concluded the 2011 campaign at 10-3 overall and 6-2 in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), Plisco earned six All-America distinctions as the nation's No. 2 punter for the second consecutive season. Additionally the Monarchs topped the FCS blocked kicks list with 11. Along with First Team All-CAA honors for Plisco, punt returner Reid Evans was also named Third Team-All Conference.



Year number two of Monarch football was just as successful for the special teams unit. Plisco ranked second among FCS punters, just missing being the top FCS punter by .05 yards. True freshman Colby Goodwyn, who was named First Team All-State as a return specialist, ranked fourth among all FCS kick returners and set the Division I record (FBS or FCS) for kickoff return yardage in a game with 333 yards in his nine returns against #14/16 Cal Poly. In addition to the individual NCAA kick return record, Old Dominion also set the record for most kickoff return yardage by a team (365 yards on 11 returns) against the nationally-ranked Mustangs.

Old Dominion boasted two All-Americans in its first season of FCS play in 2009 coming from the special teams unit. Plisco, who led the nation in punting at a 44.84 yards per punt, earned All-American honors by the Associated Press, The Sports Network, and the College Sporting News, while long snapper Dustin Phillips was among 50 student-athletes named to the 2009 edition of the Fabulous Fifty Team for Division I FCS All-American honors from The College Sporting News.

Zyskowski joined the Monarch coaching staff after spending the previous four seasons at the University of Maine where he coached the running backs and served as the Co-Special Team's Coordinator in 2007.

In his final season at Maine in 2007, Zyskowski guided the school's eighth 1,000-yard back in Jhamal Fluellen to all-conference honors after finishing in the top six in both rushing and all-purpose yardage. A year earlier he helped mentor tailback Arel Gordon, who earned Second Team All-Atlantic 10 honors after ranking seventh in the league in rushing and second in all-purpose yards per game. As a team, the Black Bears finished 33rd nationally out of 119 teams in the FCS in rushing yards per game at 169.6.

In 2005, Zyskowski tutored Montell Owens who was entering his first season as a starter at tailback. Owens became a durable runner for the Black Bears who finished the season with 779 yards rushing and nine touchdowns. Owens finished the season ninth in the Atlantic 10 in rushing yards per game and tied for third in rushing touchdowns. In 2006, Owens signed as a rookie free agent with the Jacksonville Jaguars and has since become a two-time Pro-Bowl Selection and Team Captain.

In addition to coaching football, Zyskowski also gained important experience in the spring of 2005 as he served as a student-assistant coach for the Black Bear baseball team, which won the America East Tournament championship and qualified for the Oxford Regional in the NCAA Tournament. Zyskowski's younger brother, Josh, was a pitcher on the squad.

For the last three seasons, Zyskowski has participated in the annual Lauren's First and Goal Football Camp at Lafayette College. The one-day clinic features nearly 275 college coaches who volunteer their time to teach aspiring football players the in-and-outs of the game and raise money for Lauren's First and Goal, a charitable organization created to support pediatric brain tumor research and support local pediatric cancer services.

A senior captain who played fullback, Zyskowski, helped lead the way for running back Marcus Williams to rush for 1,284 yards during the 2003 season and eventually into first place in school history for career rushing yards.

He earned his B.S. in landscape horticulture from Maine in 2006. He currently resides in Norfolk with his wife Becky and their daughter Marley (5) and son Brandon (1).

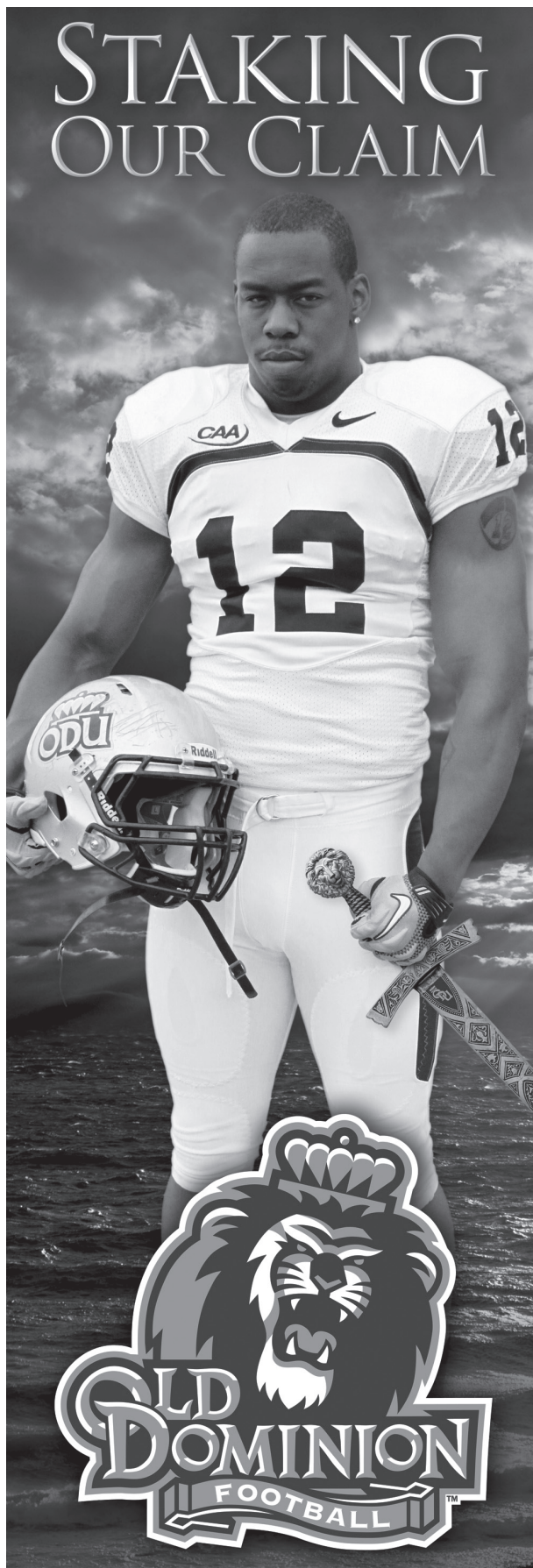

In another first for the ODU Football program, the Monarchs were ranked in the Top-25 for the first time in school history coming in at No. 21 in The Sports Network/Fathead.com FCS Top-25 College Football Poll following a 48-33 win over then-#20 UMass, the Monarchs first ever CAA and Top-25 victory. Following ODU's 31-23 victory over Rhode Island the next weekend, ODU made its FCS Coaches Poll debut during week seven coming in at No. 22. ODU steadily moved up the ranks until it cracked the Top-10 at the conclusion of the season with a 35-31 win at nearby William & Mary to end the regular season on a four-game win streak and a 9-2 overall and a 6-2 record in its inaugural season of CAA play.

BLOCK THAT KICK:

Special teams now has 23 blocks to its credit in the last three seasons, including 10 in the 2011 season, which according to an unofficial poll of FCS schools led the nation for the most blocks by a school this season.

CAA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

9/12 - Running Back - Colby Goodwyn

Sophomore Colby Goodwyn picked up CAA Football Offensive Player of the Week honors and was named the College Football Performance Award National Running Back of the Week after leading Old Dominion to a 40-17 win at Georgia State during week two. The sophomore carried the ball 26 times for 184 yards and a touchdown, marking the second-highest rushing total in ODU's short program history. The yardage mark is also the highest CAA Football total since Delaware's Andrew Pierce rattled off 200 yards against Duquesne on Sept. 18 last season. Goodwyn, who also hauled in one catch for five yards, logged three rushes of 20-or-more yards in the win including a 53-yarder in the fourth quarter.

CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:

9/5 - Wide Receiver - #5 Antonio Vaughan

Redshirt freshman wide receiver Antonio Vaughan was rewarded for his impressive Monarch debut against Campbell in week by being named CAA Football's Rookie of the Week finishing his Monarch debut with 191 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns in ODU's 41-14 win over Campbell in week one. He hauled in six catches for 97 yards, including a 34-yard second-quarter touchdown pass from Thomas DeMarco. Vaughan later showed his ground skills by scampering 30 yards to paydirt in the third quarter, boosting the ODU lead to 38-7. The CAA Football Rookie of the Week was also effective in the Monarchs' return game posting a 16-yard punt return and two kickoff returns for 48 yards. Vaughan was ODU's first ever CAA weekly award winner.

10/3 - Quarterback - #14 Taylor Heinicke

True freshman Taylor Heinicke was inserted into the Monarch offense after signal caller Thomas DeMarco, who had started all 26 games to-date was sidelined with an injury in the second half, to throw for 119 yards and two touchdowns in helping ODU to its first-ever CAA victory and first win over a ranked team in week five's 48-33 win over #20 UMass in week five. Heinicke completed eight of his 11 attempts, which included a then-school record 56-yard touchdown pass to Reid Evans. The true freshman also found Larry Pinkard on a 38-yard touchdown throw to kick off the first of three fourth quarter touchdowns. Heinicke also ran the ball five times for 24 yards in his Monarch debut.

10/31 - Quarterback - #14 Taylor Heinicke

The true freshman signal caller Taylor Heinicke helped lead his Old Dominion football squad to its first Top 10 victory in school history with a 23-20 victory over #9/10 James Madison in week nine. Heinicke was named the Oyster Most Valuable Player after passing for 236 yards and two touchdowns and was the Monarchs' leading rusher with 50 yards on 11 carries. The Atlanta, Georgia native connected with Larry Pinkard twice - first on a 17-yard pass to open up scoring and the second a 23-yard pass after scrambling well behind the line of scrimmage on fourth and two and lofting the ball to Pinkard near the end line in the second quarter.

11/7 - Quarterback - #14 Taylor Heinicke

Earning back-to-back CAA Rookie of the Week honors and his third overall CAA weekly honor, Taylor Heinicke continued to lead the Monarchs by throwing for a season-high 373 yards and three touchdowns in the Monarchs' 42-28 victory over Richmond in week ten. Heinicke completed 34 of his 47 attempts and posted his second 300+ passing game of his six appearances thus far. Heinicke opened up scoring by connecting with Larry Pinkard on a 14-yard pass and added a 29-yard touchdown throw to Prentice Gill with five minutes remaining in the second quarter. Having allowed the Minutemen to rattle off 26 unanswered points after the Monarchs had achieved a 25-0 lead, Bailey's blocked punt and safety gave ODU a 27-26 edge and a lead they would not relinquish.

CAA DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

11/14 - Cornerback - Eriq Lewis

Redshirt freshman Eriq Lewis became Old Dominion's first ever CAA Defensive Player of the Week as his two pivotal interceptions during William & Mary's final two drives helped seal a 35-31 victory for the Football Monarchs in Week 11. Lewis' first pick came on the Tribe's second-to-last drive of the game after ODU had taken a four-point lead. His second pick ended the game as William and Mary was again marching down the field in search of a game-winning touchdown with less than 30 seconds left on the clock. Lewis became the first Monarch to ever record two interceptions in one game. The redshirt freshman also forced a fumble on the Monarch goaline in the first quarter. The turnover, recovered by Carvin Powell, halted an eventual touchdown and resulted in a touchback.

2011 Recap - Campbell

SEASON OPENING VICTORY: Football Monarchs Dominate Campbell, 41-14

NORFOLK, Va. -- Antonio Vaughan had 191 all-purpose yards and scored two touchdowns as Old Dominion dominated Campbell 41-14 at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Vaughan, in his Monarch debut, ran for 30 yards, picked up 97 yards receiving, and racked up 48 yards on kick returns. He caught a 43-yard pass from Thomas DeMarco on the first play of the game, and only improved from there as he scored on a 34-yard pass reception with four minutes remaining in the second quarter and later scoring on a 30-yard run to increase the Monarchs' lead to 38-7 with 10 minutes left in the third quarter.

Campbell scored first on a 15-yard pass from Braden Smith to Preston Dodson, capping an opening drive that saw the Camels cover nearly 60 yards. However, ODU came right back with a seven yard TD pass from DeMarco to Kai Blanco while defensively, ODU would only allow Campbell to gain three yards on their next drive and be pushed back for negative yardage on the following drive.

Angus Harper gave ODU its first lead with an 11-yard score while Demarco added a seven yard scamper before Vaughan's first score of the night.

Vaughan's first score of the night increased ODU's lead to 28-7 which it would take into halftime.

ODU came out of halftime and tacked onto the lead with a 32-yard field goal by Jarod Brown.

On the kickoff return following Brown's field goal, Keenen Terry forced the Camels' Brandon Chandler to fumble the ball with John Darr on the recovery setting up the Monarchs at the Campbell 30. On the next play DeMarco handed off the ball to Vaughan who tore 30-yards downfield for his second touchdown of the night.

Jordan Cramer caught a three-yard pass from Smith to get Campbell on the board in the second half, but it would be the only other time the Camels would score.

Brown added his second field goal of the night, with a 45-yarder to complete the scoring late in the third quarter.

DeMarco finished the night 29-of-38, for 310 yards with two touchdowns through the air, and one on the ground.

Lorenzo Smith led ODU with 14 carries for 65 yards on the ground while Harper had seven catches for 58 yards.

Ronnie Cameron led the defense with nine tackles and half a sack, with Devon Simmons making seven stops for the Monarch defense, and Chad King collecting six tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss resulting in the Camels losing 11 yards.

Smith completed 20-of-40 passes for the Camels, for 172 yards and two scores.

2011 Recap - Georgia State

Football Monarchs Pounce Panthers, 40-17

ATLANTA, Ga. - The Old Dominion Monarchs won their seventh straight game with a 40-17 victory over future Colonial Athletic Association rival Georgia State at the Georgia Dome.

The win, ODU's seventh straight, improves the squad to 2-0 on the year.

Jarod Brown drilled a pair of field goals in the opening quarter giving Old Dominion a quick 6-0 edge. Brown's first field goal, a 51-yarder on the Monarchs' opening drive, was the longest of his career, surpassing his previous high of 48 in last year's season finale at N.C. Central.

Turnovers would result in Georgia State getting onto the scoreboard.

The Panthers' score came following ODU fumbling after a punt. While Georgia State recovered the ball at the ODU 15, the Monarch defense would not allow the Panthers to go on further than the nine-yard line forcing the Panthers to kick a field goal. Christian Benvenuto's attempt was good from 26-yards cutting the Monarch advantage with 6-3 with 6:07 remaining on the clock in the first quarter.

ODU quickly responded though. In just over two minutes, Colby Goodwyn punctuated a six-play, 32-yard drive to give the Monarchs' a 13-3 advantage heading into quarter number two.

Devon Simmons quickly returned possession back to the Monarchs following Goodwyn's touchdown. Simmons had a 32-yard interception return, but as the Monarchs' worked their way into the red zone, ODU fumbled the ball at their own one-yard line with the fumble return setting up the Panthers up at the Monarchs' own seven-yard line. Donald Russell finished off the drive to give GSU its first touchdown, cutting the ODU lead to 13-10 in the closing moments of the opening quarter.

Old Dominion's "All-Star" team lit up the scoreboard to start the second quarter. Paul Morant blocked the punt and freshman Blair Roberts recovered and ran into the end zone to put ODU ahead 20-10. It was ODU's 13th block in history.

Each team would add another touchdown before concluding the opening half of action. Georgia State cut the deficit to three, 20-17, with six minutes remaining in the second quarter on a run by Travis Evans. Then with just over two minutes, ODU wide receiver Reid Evans lifted ODU to a 27-17 lead heading into the half.

Old Dominion captured the lone points of the third quarter. Quarterback Thomas DeMarco registered the 27th touchdown of his career to cap an 87-yard drive by the Monarchs to give ODU a 33-17 edge with just under five minutes remaining in the quarter.

The Panthers threatened to score in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter. At the ODU 12 on second and nine, the Monarchs' managed to flip the field as Eriq Lewis captured his first career interception.

On the ensuing drive, Colby Goodwyn raced downfield for 50 yards, setting up DeMarco to punch in the ball from two yards out and add to the ODU margin. With just over 10 minutes remaining in the game, ODU led 40-17.

Before the game was over, Carvin Powell would add another interception to keep the Panthers scoreless in the second half.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by Craig Wilkins with nine tackles (6 solo, 3 assisted) and John Darr with seven tackles (3 solo, 4 assisted). Ronnie Cameron also added a pair of sacks totaling 16 yards lost for the Panthers.

DeMarco finished the game completing 13 of his 21 attempts for 126 yards.

Goodwyn ended the game with 26 carries for 190 yards, the second most rushing yardage by a Monarch in the school's young history.

2011 Recap - Hampton

Football Monarchs Hang On for 45-42 Win Over Hampton

NORFOLK, Va. -- Larry Pinkard returned a blocked punt five yards and Thomas DeMarco ran for two touchdowns in the last seven minutes as Old Dominion hung on to defeat Hampton 45-42 in Norfolk.

With Penn falling to Lafayette, 37-12, Old Dominion now brings the nation's longest win streak among FCS schools to its first Colonial Athletic Association contest at Delaware next week. The Monarchs have won eight straight games dating back to its 50-37 set back to nationally ranked Cal Poly back on November 9th of last season. They also improved to 12-4 all-time and 2-0 this season at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium and take a 20-5 record into their first conference contest.

The Hampton Pirates meanwhile dropped to 2-1 on the season.

ODU held a 17-14 halftime lead and quickly stretched the lead to 10 on a five-yard Angus Harper touchdown, but Hampton came right back, catapulted by a Justin Blake interception, with 13-straight points, two field goals by Taurean Durham and a 42-yard fumble return by Jeremy Jermin to take a 27-24 lead.

The Monarchs retook the lead as James Faircloth blocked a Jordan Stovall punt and Larry Pinkard returned it five yards for the 31-27 lead. It was the Monarchs' 15th blocked punt and the third time in the two meetings with the Pirates that ODU has blocked a punt.

The Pirates' Jorrian Washington gave Hampton the lead back briefly with a nine yard run, but DeMarco led ODU on two scoring drives, one a 14 play, 67-yard drive and the other a 10-yard drive after Edmon McClam sacked Hampton quarterback David LeGree and forced a fumble.

Hampton scored with just over a minute left, but the ensuing onsidess kick went out of bounds.

DeMarco finished the night 20-of-29 passing, with 172 yards, while rushing for 29 yards with two scores. Angus Harper and Colby Goodwyn comined to run for 199 yards, with Harper leading the way with 111 and two scores.

LeGree finished 25-of-35 passing for the Pirates for 260 yards with a touchdown. He also rushed for 66 yards and a score.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by redshirt junior linebacker Craig Wilkins with 17 stops, while Chad King recorded eight tackles, and Eriq Lewis had seven. McClam also finished the night with a pair of sacks.

ODU Football Falls To #7/6 Delaware In CAA Debut

NEWARK, Del. -- The Old Dominion Football Monarchs had their eight-game win streak snapped with a 27-17 loss at Delaware in their Colonial Athletic Association debut at Tubby Raymond Field at Delaware Stadium.

The first quarter of CAA Football for the Monarchs was nothing short of exciting.

On Delaware's opening drive and the Blue Hens in Monarch territory at the ODU27, Eriq Lewis forced David Hayes to fumble and return possession back to the Monarchs with Carvin Powell coming up with the ball.

While Old Dominion did not score on its possession, the Monarchs' "All-Star Team", special teams, would end up putting the Monarchs on the board first.

The Blue Hens, who had outscored its opponents at home 35-0 in the first quarter, saw the Monarchs jump out to a 7-0 lead as Chris Lovitt returned a fumble made by the Blue Hen's punt team 18 yards for a touchdown with 6:39 remaining in the first quarter.

As Delaware made its way downfield on their next drive, the Blue Hens attempted a 48-yard field goal, but the Monarchs' "All-Star Team" added another notch to its blocked kicks tally stopping Sean Baner's kick from going through the uprights and preserving ODU's 7-0 lead.

The momentum was short lived however as on the first play of ODU's ensuing drive, Thomas DeMarco's pass was intercepted. Delaware would find the uprights this time and score on a 40-yard field goal as Old Dominion led 7-3 at the end of the first quarter.

Delaware closed its deficit to one with Baner's second field goal of the afternoon, a 39-yard attempt with 9:13 left in the second quarter. Then as the second quarter was coming to close Nihja White capped of a 11-play, 64-yard-drive to put Delaware ahead 13-7 into the half.

The Blue Hens had a chance to add to the lead in the early minutes of the third quarter, however Baner's 25-yard attempt went wide right.

The Monarchs' followed by connecting on a field goal as Jarod Brown's attempt from 20-yards out was good and improved his mark to 6-of-6 for the year in field goals.

Baner had another crack at the uprights, as Delaware capitalized on an ODU fumble at their own 20 in the closing seconds of the third quarter. With the drive continuing into the fourth quarter, Baner this time connected on a 20-yard attempt extending Delaware's lead to 16-10 entering the final quarter of play.

On the next drive, Old Dominion wasn't able to find its way past its own 23 and brought the punt team to the field. Plisco, who averaged 48.6 yards per punt in the game, ran the ball instead and continued the ODU drive. Back-to-back passes to Reid Evans, one 12-yards and another 28-yards, helped flip the field setting up freshman Antonio Vaughan for a nine-yard reception, his second of the season.

Delaware punched right back though with a 60-kickoff return and followed with a Rob Jones 32-yard reception in the end zone. The Blue Hens made the two-point conversion and went ahead 24-17 with less than 10 minutes left in the game.

Old Dominion was four and out on its next drive and despite being able to move the chains twice on their next drive, the Monarchs were unable to get into Blue Hen territory.

Baner added a 43-yard field goal for Delaware in the closing minute for the final 27-17 margin.

WILD RIDE: ODU Scores 23-Straight to Pull Away, Tops No. 20 UMass 48-33

NORFOLK, Va. -- Old Dominion University football scored the first 25 points and after UMass took a 26-25 lead, scored 23-straight to take command and beat No. 20 UMass 48-33 at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Old Dominion established a quick 3-0 lead off a 43-yard field goal by Jarod Brown on its first drive of the night and would go on to rattle off 25 unanswered points and keep the Minutemen scoreless until the final two minutes of the second quarter.

Nick Mayers, who did not have a touchdown last season for the Monarchs, captured two during the Monarchs' 25-0 run, which included a 17-yard and 35-yard pass from Thomas DeMarco. Also getting into the scoring was Larry Pinkard posting his first career touchdown.

Massachusetts scored late in the second quarter for the 25-12 halftime margin.

Kellen Page connected with tight end Emil Igwenagu to cap a 14-play, 80-yard drive for the Minutemen. Although UMass missed the extra point, on ODU's next drive, Demarco threw an interception to return possession to the Minutemen. Five plays later, UMass's Julian Talley was in the endzone.

The Monarchs would have to look to a new signal caller in the second half when DeMarco was sidelined with a leg injury. True freshman Taylor Heinicke was inserted into the offense and the Georgia Old Spice Player of the Year would shine in his debut. Heinicke would finish the game connecting on eight of his 11 attempts for 119 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

The second half of action between the Monarchs and Minutemen proved to be a battle. The Minutemen racked up 149 yards of total offense in the third quarter alone including a pair of touchdowns to take the lead. Julien Julmiste had a 20-yard touchdown reception and Jonathan Hernandez added an eight-yard carry over the endline to give UMass a 26-25 edge with 5:30 in the third quarter.

However after UMass's 26 unanswered points, the Monarchs punched back by blocking a punt and registering a safety and three touchdowns to regain the lead and the victory.

The Monarchs finally stopped the Minutemen scoring barrage blocking their fourth punt of the season. Jakwail Bailey was the member of the "All-Star Team" making the block in the endzone and capturing the safety to return the lead to Old Dominion, 27-26, and return momentum back to the Monarchs' side.

The fourth quarter then started with Heinicke connecting with Pinkard for an 38-yard touchdown reception. It was Pinkard's second touchdown of the night.

Then at the midway point, Reid Evans posted a 56-yard touchdown catch, the longest in school history to put ODU up 41-26. True freshman Tyree Lee also got into the mix with his first career touchdown with three minutes remaining in the game on a 13-yard run.

The Minutemen scored in the game's final minute, but the contest was already out of reach.

2011 Recap - Rhode Island

FIRST CAA ROAD WIN: No. 21 ODU Defeats Rhode Island, 31-23

KINGSTON, R.I. -- The No. 21 Old Dominion Football Monarchs picked up their first win as a ranked squad and their first Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) road win in a 31-23 win over Rhode Island at Meade Stadium.

Monarchs wasted no time in establishing a lead. After a four and out on their opening drive, it was only four plays before the Monarchs regained possession. Craig Wilkins' first interception of the year put the Monarchs in Ram territory and six plays later true freshman quarterback Taylor Heinicke scored his first career touchdown run to put ODU up 7-0 at the 10 minute mark of the opening quarter.

However, Rhode Island tied the game up a little under seven minutes later using a 15-play, 76-yard drive with Ram quarterback Steve Probst connecting with wide receiver Trevor Turner in the end zone to tie the game at 7-7.

Scoring continued for the Rams early in the second half with Probst finding Frazier for an 11-yard touchdown reception and Rhode Island taking a 14-7 lead within the second quarter's first two minutes.

Before the half, the Monarchs were able to tie the game at 14-14. After possession was traded seven times, it became the two-minute drill for the Monarchs. ODU made its way down field 68-yards capped by a seven-yard Larry Pinkard touchdown catch to tie the score heading into the locker room.

The Rams took the lead over to start off the third quarter. After a failed on-side kick attempt by the Monarchs, the Rams started their first drive after the half at the ODU 38. Moments later, Anthony Baskerville ran the ball four yards over the end line. The Rams' PAT attempt was no good and ODU trailed 20-14.

On ODU's next possession, the Monarchs took back the lead. Pinkard made his second touchdown reception of the game giving the Monarchs a 21-20 edge with 9:57 left in the third quarter.

But just like that, a 38-yard field goal gave the Rams a 23-21 advantage with 6:46 left in the third quarter.

The Monarchs punched back through on their next possession. Nick Mayers, on a nine-yard pass from Heinicke, capped the 11-play, 62-yard drive to give ODU a 28-23 lead.

In the only scoring in the fourth quarter, Jarod Brown sailed a 22-yard field goal through the uprights for the final 31-23 margin.

Heinicke, making his first career start, passed for 205 yards and three touchdowns along with running the ball eight times, including a score. Angus Harper led the ground attack with 45 yards on 15 carries, while Mayers had eight catches for 66 yards and Reid Evans finished the afternoon with 60 yards on six receptions.

The Rams' Steve Probst passed for 143 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by safety Carvin Powell and linebacker J.J. Williams, each with eight stops. All eight of Powell's tackles were solo stops. Linebacker Craig Wilkins added seven tackles, including 3.5 for loss as well as his interception.

No. 18/22 Football Drops Heartbreaker to No. 17/23 Towson, 39-35

NORFOLK, Va. -- Grant Enders hit Tom Ryan on fourth and 29 for a 63-yard touchdown pass to lift Towson over Old Dominion 39-35 in CAA action in Norfolk.

ODU sacked Enders and backup quarterback Peter Athens on consecutive plays to push the Tigers into third and long, but Enders came back in for fourth down and hit Ryan over the middle, who broke a tackle and just broke the goalline for the touchdown.

The Monarchs hoping to make last second comeback saw Taylor Heinicke's pass intercepted by Frank Beltre to clinch the game for the Tigers.

ODU took a 35-24 lead at the end of the third quarter. Starting first and 10 at their own four, Heinicke hit Nick Mayers down the left sideline, Mayers ran all the way to the Towson three, where he fumbled and Prentice Gill recovered in the end zone. The 93-yard play is the longest play in school history.

With time running down in the fourth quarter, the Tigers closed the gap when Enders capped a nine play, 75-yard drive with an eight yard run. Leon Kinnard converted a halfback option pass to Mike Evans for the two-point conversion to make the score 35-32 setting up the winning score for Towson.

Terrance West started the scoring in the first quarter for Towson with a 47-yard run.

ODU came right back as Tyree Lee capped a 10-play, 60-yard drive with a three-yard run to knot the score.

West came right back for Towson with a 54-yard score but ODU fought back again with a 64-yarder from Angus Harper to open the second quarter.

ODU gained its first lead of the night when Mayers hauled in a 36-yard TD pass from Heinicke.

D.J. Soven kicked a career-best 47-yard field goal with less than two minutes remaining in the first half to make the halftime score 21-17 in favor of the Monarchs.

In a game of back and forth, Towson got the opening kickoff of the second half and marched 64 yards in eight plays as Enders hit Tyler Wharton for a 26-yard score to regain the lead for the Tigers, but ODU punched right back as the Monarchs drove down the field and a 75-yard scoring drive was finished with a 14-yard pass from Heinicke to Gill for a 28-24 Monarch lead.

With Towson driving near the end of the third quarter, Carvin Powell intercepted Enders at the goalline and advanced the ball to the four to set up Gill's fumble recovery touchdown.

Heinicke finished the day with 360-yards passing on 22-of-37 with three scores and an interception, while Enders was 24-of-37 for 314 yards, throwing two TD's and a pick.

Harper rushed for 68 yards on just six carries for ODU and a touchdown while Terrance West carried 16 times for 151 yards and two touchdowns for Towson. Mayers finished the day with seven catches for a career-high 166 yards and a touchdown.

Kenton Powell had a team best eight tackles for Towson while Craig Wilkins had a game-high 13 tackles and a sack and Ronnie Cameron had 11 tackles and 2.5 sacks for ODU.

No. 21/22 ODU Football Returns to the Win Column With 37-14 Win Over Villanova

VILLANOVA, Pa. -- The #21/22 Old Dominion Football Monarchs returned to their winning ways with its 37-14 win over the Villanova Wildcats Saturday in CAA Football action.

On the opening Wildcat drive, B.J. McLaughlin forced the Wildcat fumble with Devon Simmons on the recovery to return possession back to the Monarchs. On the next play, the Monarchs lit up the scoreboard as Antonio Vaughan raced 42-yards downfield for the score. ODU tried for the two-point conversion, but Kai Blanco's run was just short of the goal line.

On the next possession, following the Wildcat punt into the end zone and the Monarchs starting at their own 20, Lorenzo Smith capped a seven-play, 80 yard drive by taking off for 54-yards for his first career score.

Joe Price got the Wildcats onto the scoreboard with a six-yard touchdown reception late in the opening quarter to cut the ODU lead to 13-7.

Two quick scores gave ODU a 23-7 edge midway through the second quarter. Jarod Brown connected on a 32-yard field goal and on Villanova's first play from scrimmage following the field goal, Devon Simmons stripped the ball while sacking signal caller Dustin Thomas. Linebacker Craig Wilkins recovered the ball for the Monarchs at the Wildcat three and three plays later Taylor Heinicke carried in the ball for a one-yard touchdown.

The Wildcats added their second touchdown of the afternoon using over five minutes to take the ball down field on an 11-play, 77-yard drive. Austin Medley broke through for a 23-yard touchdown.

The Monarchs however went up by another touchdown and had a 16-point advantage heading into the half. In the closing moments of the second quarter, Heinicke connected with Nick Mayers for 16-yard touchdown and a 30-14 edge heading into the locker rooms.

On the first ODU drive of the third quarter, the Monarchs used a fake punt by Jonathan Plisco to help move the chains into Wildcat territory but they were unable to move past the Villanova 45. Heinicke punted the ball 34-yards, but on the next play, Villanova quarterback Dustin Thomas got the ball into the hands of ODU's Craig Wilkins at the Wildcat 16. It was fourth and goal at the one before Angus Harper broke through to give ODU the 37-14 lead with 6:56 left in the third.

Heinicke finished the game passing for 204 yards and two touchdowns completing 23 of his 32 passes. For the receiving corps, Mayers had six catches for 51 yards, while Vaughan hauled in five catches for 75 yards. Smith led the run game with 76 yards on nine carries.

Defensively, 25 Monarchs got into the mix led by Aaron Evans and John Darr with four stops each. The ODU defense racked up five sacks and eight tackles for loss.

Dustin Thomas passed for 82 yards, connecting on 10 of his 17 passes for the Wildcats before Chris Polony came in late in the game passing for 61 yards. Polony also rushed for 52 yards.

OYSTER BOWL VICTORY: Monarchs Down #9/10 JMU, 23-20

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Old Dominion football program garnered its first Top 10 victory with a 23-20 Oyster Bowl win over the #9/10 James Madison Dukes.

Old Dominion quarterback Taylor Heinicke was named the Oyster Bowl's "Most Outstanding Player" earning the Melvin Blassingham Trophy, named after the Shriner Potentate who created the Oyster Bowl back in 1946. Heinicke finished the game with 236 yards completing 22 of his 35 passes with a pair of touchdowns. The Atlanta, Georgia native was also the Monarchs' leading rusher with 11 carries for 50 yards.

Old Dominion wasted no time scoring on its opening drive for the third time this season as Pinkard collected a 17-yard pass from Heinicke on the first of his two touchdowns of the afternoon.

James Madison drove to as close as the ODU 10 on their first drive, but the Monarchs defense would not break. A number of the Monarch defenders got into the mix holding the Dukes from posting a touchdown including J.J. Williams, Keenan Terry, Craig Wilkins, Dominique Guinn Bailey, and Fred Credle, resulting in the Dukes having to go to the field goal unit and kick a 32-yard attempt by Cameron Starke.

The Dukes then closed the quarter with a Dae'Quan Scott touchdown to go ahead 10-7.

Pinkard put the Monarchs ahead again on his second touchdown reception of the game. The Duke defense forced Heinicke to scramble deep into the backfield, looking to get rid of the ball and prevent ODU from a massive amount of loss of yardage, Heinicke spotted Pinkard in the end zone. The ball sailed through the air where Pinkard jumped right at the back line amid two JMU defenders to complete the 23-yard touchdown pass and give ODU a 14-10 advantage with 12:57.

Scott punched the ball in on the following drive for his second score of the day, giving JMU a 17-14 lead, one which they would hold until second half action.

Right before the half, James Madison got themselves deep into ODU territory. At third and one at the Monarch two, Markell Wilkins and Ronnie Cameron came up big pushing back Scott for a loss of four yards and forcing out the Duke field goal unit again. A 23-yard field attempt by Starke gave increased the JMU lead to 20-14.

With time left, the Monarchs had one last shot at cutting into the James Madison lead before the intermission. As time expired, Jarod Brown's 42-yard field goal was blocked by JMU's Teveion Cuffee.

Old Dominion reclaimed the lead thanks to a trio of field goals by Brown and holding the JMU offense scoreless in second half play.

Six minutes into the third quarter, Brown's 19-yard field goal sailed through the uprights cutting the Monarch deficit 20-17 with 9:45 and then with just over two minutes remaining in the quarter, Brown had a 40-yard attempt that tied the game at 20-20. Then with 12:14 left in the game, the Monarch kicker connected on his third straight field goal, this time from 25-yards out, to give Old Dominion a 23-20 edge.

Twice, the Dukes attempted field goals to tie the game but were unsuccessful. With 8:55 remaining, James Madison looked to tie the game on a 51-yard field goal attempt by Starke. The attempt, which was Starke's longest of the season, was short. Then on the last play of the game, Starke's 47-yarder was blocked by Craig Wilkins to seal the victory.

Jace Edwards passed for 239 yards for James Madison, with Brian Barlow making eight catches for 79 yards in the loss. Scott led the Dukes' run game with 77 yards and his two touchdowns. James Madison, who came into Saturday's games as the CAA's leading rushing offense at 242.7 yards per game and 5.0 yards per play, was held to 103 yards and 2.7 yards per carry.

Senior Day Victory: No. 12 ODU Downs Richmond, 42-28

NORFOLK, Va. — The No. 12 Old Dominion Football Monarchs improved to 8-2 overall and 5-2 in the Colonial Athletic Association with a 42-28 win over Richmond at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium in the Monarchs' regular season home finale.

Junior redshirt wide receiver Reid Evans posted a career-high 149 receiving yards and a school record 12 catches in the Monarchs' regular season finale. Colby Goodwyn led the ground attack with 83 yards on 18 carries. Quarterback Taylor Heinicke finished the game completing 34 of his 47 passes for a season-high 373 yards.

For the second straight contest ODU struck on a Taylor Heinicke-Larry Pinkard combo to open up scoring. Heinicke, the reigning CAA Rookie of the Week, targeted Pinkard with a 14-yard touchdown throw and Thomas DeMarco then helped to put the Monarchs up 8-0 by diving into the end zone for the two-point conversion.

On their next drive, ODU took a 11-0 lead as Jarod Brown hit a 37-yard field goal.

The Spiders got onto the scoreboard before the quarter ended though needing just three plays. Aaron Corp found Kevin Finney for a 17-yard score with 1:01 left and Sam Roller made the two-point conversion on a pass from John Laub as the Monarchs led 11-8 at the end of one quarter of play.

Second quarter action saw scoring go back and forth between the two squads.

The Monarchs continued its drive to open the second quarter and moved downfield 83-yards over the course of nine minutes to extend its lead. ODU leading rusher Angus Harper tallied his sixth touchdown of the year for the 18-8 Monarch lead.

Richmond responded with its next possession though and cut the ODU lead to three with 8:50 remaining until the half. The Spiders got out of trouble at third and 10 on the ODU 48 with a 25-yard reception by Tre Grey. Capping the drive was Ben Edwards on a five-yard touchdown reception for the 18-15 score.

Old Dominion punched right back on its next opportunity. Prentice Gill, who was one of the eight seniors honored prior to the game, gave his ODU squad a 25-15 edge on a 29-yard pass from Heinicke.

The Spiders had another attempt to cut their deficit before the intermission. Corp was sacked by Devon Simmons in the closing moments and after fumbling the ball, the Spiders were faced with second and 21 with time running out. The Spiders' Will Kamin attempted a 41-yard field goal, but it went wide right for the Monarchs to hold on to a 25-15 halftime lead.

ODU took a 28-15 advantage midway through the third quarter. A 30-yard catch by Reid Evans, who tried his best to keep his momentum from going out of bounds, got the Monarchs into the red zone and then saw Brown sail a 23-yard field goal through the uprights for his second field goal of the afternoon.

On the ensuing possession, the Spiders were unable to move the ball past their own 45. On the punt, Jakwail Bailey blocked his second punt of the season and the fifth punt block by the Monarchs in 2011. Starting at the Spider 46, the Monarchs got to within striking distance thanks to a 19-yard run by Antonio Vaughan and a 12-yard catch by Evans. Heinicke just missed finding Pinkard for the second time in the end zone. On the next play, the Monarchs fumbled and Doug Howell recovered the ball to run it back 96-yard for a Spider touchdown. With 5:14 left in the third, the Monarchs still led 28-22.

On their next time down the field, Brown's field goal attempt wide sailed left for ODU, while the Spiders Stephen Barnette one handed a catch in the end zone to tie the game at 28-28. The extra point after Barnette's touchdown would have given Richmond its first lead of the game, but the ball hit the right upright and the two teams were tied at 28 all in the final quarter of action.

The Monarchs regained the lead immediately and even added on. Eleven plays after the Spiders tied the score, ODU took a 35-28 lead capped by an Antonio Vaughan touchdown reception. On the next Richmond drive, a Paul Morant interception put the Monarchs back on offense and Colby Goodwyn capped a six-play, 70-drive to give ODU the 42-28 edge with just over five minutes remaining in the game.

2011 Recap - William & Mary

Football Monarchs Victorious in Battle of the Silver Mace

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. -- The No. 11 Old Dominion Football Monarchs concluded the 2011 regular season at 9-2 overall and 6-2 in Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) action with its 35-31 victory over William & Mary at Zable Stadium.

Angus Harper, who finished the game with a trio of touchdowns, broke a tackle on a seven-yard run with just under three minutes remaining in the game to give the Monarchs the 35-31 edge and corner Eriq Lewis, back after missing the last three games with a high ankle sprain, intercepted a pair of passes from Brent Caprio in the Tribes' final two drives in the closing minutes of the game.

After recovering a William & Mary fumble in their own end zone and keeping the Tribe deep in their own territory on the next time down the field, ODU opened up scoring. The Monarchs needed just four plays to cover 58 yards and go up 7-0 at the 4:27 mark. Starting their first scoring drive from their own 42, Taylor Heinicke connected with Larry Pinkard for a five-yard gain and followed by hitting Mayers for a 31-yard reception to the Tribe 11. Angus Harper then ran 11-yards to collect his seventh touchdown of the 2011 campaign to put ODU up 7-0.

William & Mary tied the game up at 7-7 on the ensuing possession to close out first quarter action. Leading rusher Jonathan Grimes, who ended the game with 227 yards on 38 carries, tore downfield for 25 yards to the left corner of the end zone for the first score on the day for the Tribe.

Heinicke, the three-time CAA Rookie of the Week, put the Monarchs back on top running and spinning into the end zone with the second quarter drive start. Making his third rushing touchdown of the season at the 12:15 mark of the second quarter, Heinicke saw the Monarchs use seven plays over 60 yards to take the lead 14-7.

However, just like Old Dominion's first score, the Tribe answered. Grimes punched in his second touchdown of the game with 8:53 remaining in the second quarter.

Both schools blocked field goals to keep the score knotted at 14-14. The Monarchs made their third blocked field goal of the season as Chris Burnette kept Drake Kuhn's 35-yard attempt from going through the uprights. Old Dominion had a chance to go ahead at the half with a 57-yard field goal attempt by Jarod Brown. The field goal, which would have been Browns' career mark, was blocked by Quincey Septemeber and the teams went into the intermission tied at 14-14.

The Tribe kicked off scoring in the third quarter. William & Mary took nearly five and half minutes on the drive to go ahead 21-14 for its first lead of the game. D.J. Managas capped the 11-play, 79-yard drive with a four-yard touchdown reception at the back of the end zone.

Old Dominion answered pulling out another play from its bag of tricks. Wide receiver Antonio Vaughan threw a 27-yard pass to Reid Evans to tie the game up at 21-21 with 6:49 on the clock.

William & Mary made its way deep into ODU territory to close out the third quarter and continued its possession into the fourth quarter with Grimes pushing his way over the end line for his third touchdown of the season. Tying his career mark, he gave the Tribe a 28-21 advantage with 12:36 left in the game.

The Tribe's lead only lasted one minute and 43 seconds though. The Monarchs quickly got the ball down field in six plays and ended with Angus Harper posting his second touchdown of the day.

However, William & Mary took a 31-28 lead on a 31-yard field goal with 6:44 left.

Harper carried the ball five times accounting for 42 of the Monarchs' following 74 yard drive resulting in the redshirt freshman's third and game-winning touchdown. The ODU charge downfield that gave ODU the 35-31 edge was aiding by a 15-yard reception by Nick Mayers, and Hensley recovering a fumble by the Monarchs inside the red zone.

There was still time on the clock though for William & Mary to use. The Tribe had 2:48 to work with and got to within striking distance at the Monarchs' own 33. However, Tribe quarterback Brent Caprio's pass landed in the hands of Eriq Lewis.

ODU punter Jonathan Plisco made his first appearance of the game after the Monarchs were unable to move the chains. Punting the ball 35 yards, the Tribe still had a chance for the game starting at their own 41 with 1:23 remaining.

The Tribe again got to within striking distance at the ODU 37. Caprio went deep but found ODU's Eriq Lewis yet again to seal the victory for the Monarchs.

2011 Recap - Norfolk State (First Round Playoffs)

Monarchs Defeat Norfolk State, 35-18 In NCAA First Round Taylor Heinicke passes for five TD's

NORFOLK, Va. -- Old Dominion University freshman quarterback Taylor Heinicke threw for five touchdowns and passed for 269 yards to lead the Monarchs to a 35-18 victory over crosstown rival Norfolk State in the first round of the NCAA FCS Championships in front of a sold out crowd of 19,818 in Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

Norfolk State, the MEAC Champions who along with Old Dominion were making their first FCS playoff appearance, ended the 2011 season at 9-3 overall.

The Spartans struck first on their longest touchdown in school history just one play into the game. Derrick Demps took off for 98-yards on a pass from Chris Walley to put the Monarchs' crosstown rival ahead 7-0 just two minutes into the game.

However, from that point it was all Old Dominion as the Monarchs put together the next five scores.

Following the Spartan touchdown, the Monarchs' knotted the score at 7-7 on their next possession. A 42-yard pass to Prentice Gill put ODU into Norfolk State territory for the first time in the game and four plays later Taylor Heinicke found Nick Mayers for the first of his two touchdowns to tie the game.

The Monarchs took the lead for good in the latter moments of the opening quarter. A Carvin Powell interception kicked the drive off and after 10-plays and 66 yards, Heinicke connected with Larry Pinkard to give ODU a 14-7 edge with 2:29 in the first quarter.

Eriq Lewis, who leads ODU in interceptions, added to his total to close out the half and the Monarchs went ahead 21-7 on the first play of quarter number two. Heinicke posted his third touchdown pass on a 24-yard throw to Gill, the first of the senior Monarchs two scores.

Midway through the second quarter, the Spartans had a chance to go back onto the scoreboard as Ryan Estep attempted a 37-yard field goal. However the Monarch All-Star Team added another block to its total with Chris Burnette thwarting the attempt, his fourth blocked field goal this season.

Old Dominion wasn't done blocking field goals though. Coming out of the half, Norfolk State's Estep went for a 50-yard attempt on the Spartans' opening drive. However Estep's kick failed to go through the uprights, blocked by ODU's Edmon McClam.

The Monarchs meanwhile put away two more touchdowns on their next two opportunities down field. Heinicke found both Mayers and Gill again and Old Dominion took a commanding 35-7 advantage with just over five minutes remaining in the third quarter.

The Spartans ended their scoring drought on their first drive of the fourth and final quarter with Everett Goldberg connecting on a 48-yard field goal attempt. Norfolk State, on their ensuing possession, added their first touchdown since their first offensive play of the game on a five-yard Victory Hairston reception, but trailed 35-18 with 3:13 remaining.

Defensively, the Monarchs only allowed the Spartans 43 yards on the ground thanks in part to a team-leading 11 tackles by safety Paul Morant and as a team racking up eight tackles that saw the Spartans lose 55 yards. Linebacker Craig Wilkins added in seven stops and cornerback Markell Wilkins contributed six tackles.

For Norfolk State, Chris Walley finished with 363 yards and a pair of touchdowns, completing 28 of his 43 attempts. Victory Hairston and Reggie Garrett both led the receiving unit with 63 yards each. Randy Maynes had seven carries for 35 yards.

Old Dominion was led on the ground by Colby Goodwyn with 14 carries for 41 yards. Mayers finished the game with six catches for 65 yards, Pinkard collected 95 yards on four catches, and Pinkard caught the ball three times for 56 yards.

WHAT A RIDE:

Monarchs Season Ends With Second Round Loss at Georgia Southern Monarchs Fall To Third-Seeded Eagles, 55-48

STATEBORO, Ga. -- The Old Dominion Football Monarchs' 2011 season came to a close on December 3, 2011 with a 55-48 second round playoff loss at third-seeded Georgia Southern at Paulson Stadium.

In just their third season of play, the Monarchs concluded the 2011 season at 10-3 overall.

COACHES

Six different Monarchs were in the scoring mix led by Prentice Gill with 154 yards receiving and two touchdowns. ODU quarterback Taylor Heinicke threw for five touchdowns and 341 yards.

Dominique Swope led the Eagles triple option offense with 255 yards on 31 carries with a pair of touchdowns. Georgia Southern totaled 477 yards on the ground.

The Monarchs and Eagles combined for 1167 yards of total offense. Old Dominion's 560 yards of offense were the most yards allowed by Georgia Southern this season.

PLAYERS

Quarterback Taylor Heinicke got the Monarchs to within a touchdown with 39 seconds left in the game at 55-48, but ODU's on-side kick went to Georgia Southern to seal the six-time national champions' way to the third round against fellow CAA member Maine.

After scoring occurred in nine of ten drives, going back to the game's opening quarter, the see-saw battle between ODU and Georgia Southern came to a lull late in third quarter with the Monarchs trailing 41-35. While ODU failed to convert at fourth and one at the GSU40, a fumble by the Eagles on the ensuing Georgia Southern possession at the ODU 2 in the early moments of the fourth quarter had the Monarchs recapture possession on the Craig Wilkins recovery.

Just as the Monarchs got into Eagle territory, ODU fumbled and resulted in Georgia Southern's Jaybo Shaw capturing his second touchdown of the game four plays later and the first back-to-back scoring by a team in the game. The two-point conversion gave Georgia Southern a 49-35 lead with 8:15 remaining.

Old Dominion cut into the lead with 6:21 remaining with a 19-yard touchdown reception by Prentice Gill, but Jarod Brown's PAT was blocked and the Monarchs' trailed 49-41.

The Monarchs tried their first on-side kick of the game, but the Eagles took possession in ODU territory. Swope fumbled the ball in the end zone, but Georgia Southern's Nico Hickey recovered the ball for the touchdown with just over two minutes left in the game giving the Eagles a 55-41 edge.

A minute and half later, the Monarchs were facing being down by just a touchdown. Looking at fourth and seven at their own 37, Heinicke found Prentice Gill for a 30-yard completion and then scrambled for 13 yards into the red zone and capped the drive with his 20-yard over the goal setting up the Monarchs to attempt on the on-side kick.

Defensively, Chad King lead all defenders with 10 tackles (7 solo, 3 assisted), a career-high for the senior Monarch. Linebacker John Darr also collected eight tackles, while safety Carvin Powell and defensive linemen Edmon McClam and Erik Saylor each had seven. Saylor also registered the Monarchs' 11th blocked kick of the year thwarting a Georgia State PAT attempt and halting the Eagles' Adrian Mora's string of a FCS record 151 consecutive made extra points.

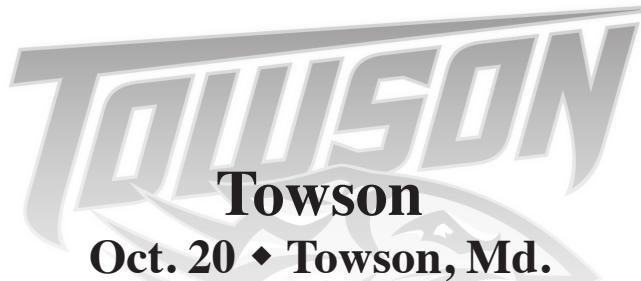

Old Dominion University President John R. Broderick announced on May 17, 2012 that the institution's athletic programs have entered into a membership agreement with Conference USA, and will seek reclassification of its football program from the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision to the Football Bowl Subdivision, effective July 1, 2013.

"We are very proud to announce a bold step forward for Old Dominion University to a well respected, established and successful conference. The future for ODU athletics is bright with Conference USA and full of opportunities for new levels of excellence," said Old Dominion University President John R. Broderick.

"Our University has performed considerable due diligence in examining the impact an NCAA reclassification of football and conference change could have on the university, overall student body and athletic programs, in particular ensuring that such a move could be made without an increase in student fees.

"The uncertain national landscape of conference membership necessitated a consideration of our future and, in particular, our football program. Conference USA's invitation provided the right opportunity at the right time to reclassify our football program and broaden the national footprint of our athletic program, and was supported by our Board of Visitors, as well as many of our donors and the community," added Broderick.

ODU joins 13 members in Conference USA, including Charlotte, East Carolina, FIU, Marshall, Louisiana Tech, North Texas, Rice, Southern Miss, Tulsa, Tulane, UAB, UTEP and UTSA. Members will compete in all sports beginning with the 2013-14 season, with the exception of ODU and Charlotte playing their first conference football schedules in 2015.

Broderick noted that Old Dominion's academic excellence, evidenced by a Rhodes Scholar, Truman Fellow and USA Today All Academic, as well as 26 State Council of Higher Education Outstanding Faculty Award winners, will complement the strong academic institutions of the C-USA.

Old Dominion University is Virginia's forward-focused metropolitan research university with rigorous academics, an energetic residential community, entrepreneurial research and collaboration, and initiatives that contribute nearly \$1 billion to the economy.

"I want to extend my appreciation to John Broderick for his leadership and guidance throughout our conference discussions and ultimately the strategic decision to join Conference USA," said ODU Athletic Director Dr. Wood Selig.

"When I was hired two years ago it was conveyed to me during the search process that one of my primary goals was to protect and guide our overall athletic program in the ever changing landscape of college athletics. I had no idea at the time that change would come about so quickly. What became critical factors for us in joining Conference USA was the ability to reclassify our football program to the highest NCAA competition level, placing us at the table in every national intercollegiate athletic discussion, while moving the majority of our 16 intercollegiate sports to new levels and competitive opportunities.

"By the same token, there were multiple critical factors that led to Conference USA's interest and ultimately an extension of a membership agreement to ODU. Those factors included the attractiveness of our University and its outstanding academic reputation and achievements, the amazing start-up success of our football program, our enthusiastic and growing fan base of season ticket holders, a strong base of corporate partners and rapidly multiplying donor base. Additionally, the significance of the metropolitan Hampton Roads market, that is well known for its sports appetite, the University's world class athletic facilities that compare favorably with other C-USA members and the overall success of our total athletic program played major roles in C-USA's evaluation of ODU," adds Selig.

Conference USA is an established, nationally recognized FBS Conference that sponsors 20 sport championships, which will be home for 12 of ODU's sport programs. While all of ODU's sport programs other than football have been competing on the Division I level since 1976, the reclassification of football to FBS (formerly known as I-A) status comes just three years after the university brought football back to the campus in 2009. The Monarchs have posted a 27-8 record

over that span, becoming one of the most successful FCS start-up programs in the history, and has been in the top five in FCS attendance with 21 consecutive sellouts of nearly 20,000 fans per game.

“We are extremely pleased with the addition of Old Dominion to Conference USA. They have a storied history with 32 team and individual national championships and enjoy the benefit of great leadership who possess a bold vision for future success. Old Dominion will be a terrific fit with the other universities in our conference,” says C-USA Commissioner Britton Banowsky.

In 2011, three C-USA teams were ranked in the nation’s Top 25 polls and five competed in bowls, earning the league more than \$4.5 million in payouts. The conference has seven bowl tie-ins with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, Beef ‘O’ Brady’s St. Petersburg Bowl, Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl, Military Bowl, R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, Sheraton Hawaii Bowl and the Ticket City Bowl.

C-USA teams and individuals have made nearly 700 NCAA championship appearances since the league’s inception in 1995-96. Sixty-seven football programs have earned bowl bids, 90 men’s basketball teams have participated in NCAA and NIT postseason play, 47 women’s basketball squads have appeared in the NCAA Tournament and 53 baseball programs have made NCAA tournament appearances, including 12 College World Series and a national crown for Rice in 2003. Additionally, 61 men’s and women’s soccer squads have participated in NCAA tournaments, with Charlotte competing for the men’s College Cup crown in 2011.

Conference USA members also enjoy significant national and regional television exposure and revenue sharing through a multi-tiered package that includes partnerships with CBS Sports Network, Fox Sports Media Group and ESPN. During 2011-12, C-USA football teams appeared on television more than 70 times, while 65 men’s basketball games were featured, and more than 40 baseball, softball, and women’s basketball games and conference championships were broadcast.

“The Presidents and Chancellors of Conference USA universities are pleased to include Old Dominion in our future plans,” says Dr. Scott Cowen, Tulane University president and Chair of Conference USA’s Board of Directors. “They possess all the attributes of a tremendous University and will make a great addition to our Conference. With the six new members in place, we are stable and poised for great things in the future.”

The Football Monarchs will compete this fall as an NCAA FCS member and be eligible to vie for a national championship. FBS reclassification is a two-year process, beginning in the fall of 2013 and concluding in the fall of 2014. Effective 2015, the Monarchs can compete for the C-USA championship and represent the league in bowl games.

Old Dominion has been a member of the Colonial Athletic Association since 1992, where it has enjoyed great success by winning 51 conference crowns, led by 17 straight women’s basketball titles from 1992 to 2009, 15 crowns in field hockey and six men’s basketball championships. In joining C-USA, the Monarchs will be reunited with former CAA member East Carolina, as well as Charlotte and UAB, both former members of the Sun Belt Conference where ODU was a member from 1982 - 1991. ODU elevated its athletic programs from NCAA Division II status to Division I in 1976 and competed as a member in the East Coast Athletic Conference (ECAC) from 1977-1982.

Conference USA sponsors championships in football, baseball, men’s and women’s basketball, men’s and women’s cross country, men’s and women’s soccer, men’s and women’s tennis, men’s and women’s golf, softball, women’s swimming, men’s and women’s indoor and outdoor track and field, women’s rowing, and women’s volleyball. ODU does not field teams for men’s and women’s cross country, men’s and women’s track and field, softball and women’s volleyball, and is also actively seeking associate conference membership for its women’s lacrosse, field hockey, wrestling and men’s swimming programs. ODU’s co-ed and women’s sailing programs compete as a non-scholarship member in the Intercollegiate Sailing Association.

Cameron, who joined the Monarchs after Hofstra disbanded its program, was the mainstay of the ODU defense in 2010 and 2011 and helped his team to an 18-6 mark in his two seasons with the program. In 2011 Cameron was named the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Defensive Player of the Year and was one of 11 Monarchs to earn All-CAA honors and one of four to be named First Team All-CAA. As a senior co-captain, he guided the team to a 10-3 overall record, a second-place 6-2 mark in the CAA after being picked to finish 10th in the preseason poll, a second round playoff berth, and not only ODU's first appearance in the national polls, but a top-10 ranking.

Cameron was second on the Monarch squad in 2011 with 73 tackles (28 solo, 45 assisted) along with a team-leading 17 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks. He averaged 5.6 tackles per game, which was fourth among defensive lineman in the CAA and finished second in the league in tackles for loss averaging 1.31 per contest. He captured a career-high 11 tackles along with a season-high 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks against CAA Champion Towson and also made 10 stops with three for loss against James Madison in ODU's first top-10 victory. His performance on the defensive line helped the Monarchs rank second in the league at the close of the regular season in rushing defense allowing 122.55 yards per contest.

Punter Jonathan Plisco became the first Old Dominion Football Monarch to earn All-American honors after leading the FCS in punting in ODU's historic inaugural season. Plisco, who would earn three All-America distinctions in ODU's first season of football in 69 years, finished the 2009 season averaging a nation-leading 44.84 yards per punt and consistently ranked among the top punters nationally in the FCS throughout the year. He made 57 punts with 18 going 50 yards more, 26 inside the opponent 20, and seven for a touchback. The left footer averaged over 50 yards per punt in games with Chowan and Savannah State and posted a career-high 76-yard punt in the victory over Campbell.

Plisco earned All-American accolades again as a junior as he was a part of the Monarchs' inaugural foray into the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in 2011. Plisco earned Second Team All-America by College Sports Madness after he led the CAA and ranked second in the nation averaging 46.2 yards per punt. Of his 51 punts on the year, 20 went the distance of 50 yards or more and 12 were placed inside the opponent 20. Additionally, the left footed punter was one of 11 Monarchs named to an all-conference team and one of four Monarchs who were bestowed First Team All-CAA honors.

Long snapper Dustin Phillips was among the 50 student-athletes named to the 2009 edition of the Fabulous Fifty Team for the Division I Football Championship Subdivision earning All-American honors from The College Sporting News. Phillips became the second Monarch in its first season of FCS play to earn All-American status. As a redshirt junior, he helped teammate, punter Jonathan Plisco, become the nation's top punter in the FCS and also helped snapped the ball to Monarch kicker Drew Hareza, who in turn scored 71 points for the Monarchs in 2009 going 7-of-13 on field goals and 50-of-51 on PATs.

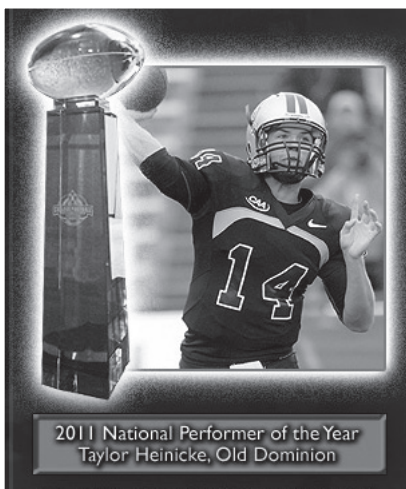

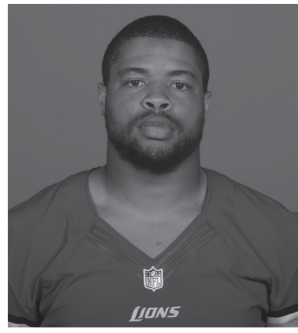
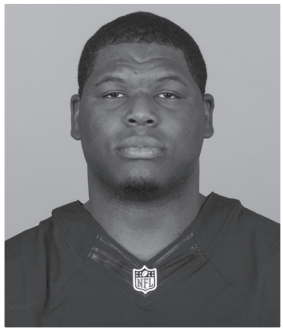
