LAST TIME OUT

Senior Gerald Lee and junior Keyon Carter combined for 24 second half points as Old Dominion pulled away late in a 75-62 road CAA win at Georgia State Tuesday evening.

Old Dominion (22-8, 14-3 CAA) shot 54.2 from the field to improve to 7-0 this season when hitting at least half of its field goals.

Carter finished with a team-high tying 14 points, including 12 in the second half. Sophomore Kent Bazemore also hit for 14 points on 7-of-9 shooting, while dishing out five assists.

Senior's Lee and Marsharee Neely also posted double-figures with 12 and 13 points respectively. Junior Darius James scored nine points and handed out a game-high six assists, while not committing a single turnover.

ODU dished out 16 assists and shot 53.8 percent (7-of-13) from beyond the arc in the victory.

The Monarchs shot 60-percent in the first half and Bazemore paced the squad with 10 points on 5-of-5 shooting. The sophomore also added four assists to his stat line in the opening frame.

SERIES VS. VCU

VCU leads 42-38.

The Rams won the last meeting back on Feb. 6, 70-58 in the Siegel Center. K Pischalnikov and Larry Sanders both scored 14 points. Sanders also Hauled down 12 rebounds. ODU was led by Kent Bazemore with 12 points and Frank Hassell with 10. VCU outrebounded ODU 39-37 and the Monarchs Committed 16 turnovers to the Rams' 8. VCU last beat ODU in the Ted 2007-08, 78-68. That year, ODU beat VCU in Richmond.

MONARCH SIGN TWO RECRUITS

Head coach Blaine Taylor and the ODU men's basketball team announced the signing of two players to National Letters of Intent.

Dimitri Batten (Newport News, Va.) and Richard Ross (Wichita Falls, Texas). "I couldn't be more pleased with the two kids we attracted to our program this fall," said Taylor. "They are really good kids, coachable kids; young men that really fit in well here academically and of course, talent-wise."

Batten, a Hampton Roads native, will come to Old Dominion as a 6-3 guard from Kecoughtan High School in Hampton. In his junior season, he averaged 21 points per game, adding seven boards, six assists and three steals per contest. Batten is a two-time All-Peninsula player for the Canes.

Also joining the Monarchs in 2010 will be 6-6 forward Richard Ross. Ross currently plays for Coach Don Hedge at Hirschi HS in Wichita Falls, Texas; Hedge played for Coach Taylor during his time at the University of Montana. A two-time First Team All-District in his sophomore and junior years, he was also named 2009 Offensive Player of the Year in the district. He has averaged a double-double in each of the last two seasons and also finished second in the state track meet in the high jump (6'10").

Haraldsdottir also won 11 medals participating in the Small Nation Games in 2003, 2005, and 2007. She brought home a total of seven gold and four silver.

Arni Mar Arnason (Mosfellsbaer, Iceland) swam the 50 free in Beijing for Iceland this past summer. Arnason holds the Icelandic record in the event having captured a time of 22.81. An Icelandic champion multiple times throughout his career, he won the Nordic Junior Championships in the 100 breast in 2005 and also competed at the European Junior Championships.





The pride of Old Dominion University and its athletic programs reflects the...

Recognition of the excellence of our program...

- For more than 30 years, 90% of Old Dominion's student-athletes that have exhausted their eligibility have graduated, a percentage far above the national average.
- Old Dominion University athletic teams have captured 28 team national championships and four individual titles, including a men's basketball crown in Division II in 1975, three titles in women's basketball, nine in field hockey, 15 in sailing, and individual championships in wrestling and women's tennis.
- Old Dominion has been the site of five NCAA women's national championships including the 1982 and 1983 basketball "Final Four" and the 1985, 1986 & 2000 field hockey tournaments.
- Old Dominion was selected as one of 45 institutions nationally for the NCAA Pilot Certification Program, a
 pioneer program that looked at the athletic department's overall operations, including philosophy, academic
 requirements, competition, etc.
- Old Dominion was among one of the first institutions to implement a successful drug testing and education program, now entering its 13th year.
- The SACS Committee commended the University and the Athletic Department on its program of high integrity, honesty, fiscal soundness and effective management, noting that excellent people, facilities and services are in place
- Old Dominion University was the first institution in Virginia to offer grants-in-aid for women athletes, beginning in 1974.
- Öld Dominion's nine national titles in field hockey are unprecedented in NCAA record books for most titles in that sport by the same school.
- Old Dominion has had 107 first team All-Americans and 124 Academic All-Americans since 1976.
- Old Dominion has been the host site of four ICSA Sailing national championships, including 1985 Team Race, Dinghy, Women 1993 Team Race, 2001 men's and women's singlehanded and the 2007 Women's Dinghy.

Reaching the pinnacle of achievement and honor within sport...

- Seven former Old Dominion coaches or athletes have been inducted into national sports halls of fame. Former Old Dominion basketball standout and three-time Olympian Anne Donovan was inducted into the GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American Hall of Fame in May of 1994, was inducted into the Hall of Fame on May 15, 1995, and received the NCAA 25 year award in 2008. Nancy Lieberman-Cline was inducted into the Basketball Naismith Hall of Fame in 1996 and both Nancy and Anne were in the first class of inductees in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 1998. In 2002, former women's basketball coach Marianne Stanley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Holf of Fame. Retired wrestling coach Gray Simons is an inductee of the U.S. Wrestling Hall of Fame, Beth Anders is enshrined in the U.S. Field Hockey Association Hall of Fame, and the late Bud Metheny is remembered in the Collegiate Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame. Sue Stahl, named Lacrosse Magazine's Coach of the Century, was inducted into Virginia Lacrosse Hall of Fame and the United States Lacrosse Hall of Fame.
- Twelve Monarch coaches and athletes have been enshrined in the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame in Portsmouth, Va.- Bud Metheny, Paul Webb, Gray Simons, Dave Twardzik, Nancy Lieberman, Tom Scott, Anne Donovan, Yogi Hightower-Boothe, Joseph "Scrap" Chandler, Lou Plummer and Mark West and Kelli James.
- Three former Old Dominion University women's basketball players have been recognized as national players
 of the year; Nancy Lieberman 1979 and 1980 Wade Trophy winner and Honda-Broderick Cup winner in 1980
 (nation's top female athlete); Anne Donovan 1983 Naismith Award winner; and Ticha Penicherio 1998 Wade
 Trophy winner.
- Seven women athletes have earned the Honda award as the nation's top athlete in their sport. Nancy Lieberman won the award in 1979 and 1980 in women's basketball, Anne Donovan in 1983, while Yogi Hightower, Kelli James, Chrisy Morgan, Mimi Smith, Marina Digiacomo and Tiffany Snow were named the Honda Award winners for field hockey in 1983, 1984, 1993, 1998, 2000 and 2002.
- In 2007, former sailor, Sally Barkow was named Rolex USA Sailor of the Year.
- Anna Tunnicliffe-Funk and Terry Hutchinson were named 2008 Rolex Yachtsman and Yachtswoman
 of the Year.
