PANTHERS FAST START TIED TO DEFENSE

Georgia State s 8-3 start is primarily a credit to the defensive efforts. This season is only the seventh time of the Panthers' 38-season history that they had started by winning 8 of its first 10 games. GSU had its eight-game home win streak snapped by 12-1 Toledo on Sunday and the Panthers are 7-1 at home this season.

GSU's defense has held seven of the 11 opponents under 50 points this season and allow just 55.9 points a game despite forcing an up-tempo, fast-paced game.

If one wants to know primarily why GSU is winning, just look at the national NCAA rankings of the 345 Division I teams on Monday, Dec. 31 and one will see the impact the Panthers' aggressiveness is having:

- No. 6 in the NCAA in 3-point field goal defense (.222)
- No. 13 in the NCAA in all field goal defense (.323)
- No. 30 in the NCAA in blocked shots per game (5.2)
- No. 50 in the NCAA in rebound margin (+6.8)
- No. 64 in the NCAA in points allowed (55.9)
- No. 97 in the NCAA in steals per game (10.4)

The Panthers are shooting offensively at a 42.0 percent rate, No. 63 in the NCAA, while scoring 66.1 points a game to sit No. 108 in the NCAA.

In the CAA, GSU is No. 1 in five categories: rebounding average (44.7), rebounding advantage (+6.8), blocked shots (5.2), FG defense (32.3) and 3-point FG Defense (22.2). The Panthers are No. 3 in the league in scoring (65.1) and FG percentage (42.0). GSU is No. 5 in steals (10.4), points allowed (55.9) and assists (12.7).

Individually, center Cody Paulk leads the CAA in blocked shots (2.9 per game), while sitting at No. 2 in FG pct. (55.3%), No. 3 in offensive rebounds (3.8), No. 6 in the CAA in rebounding (8.3). Point guard Ashley Watson's 3.2 assists make her No. 6 in the CAA.2.3). Kendra Long is No. 6 in 3-point baskets made and No. 9 in steals.

COACH SHARON BALDWIN-TENER

Sharon Baldwin-Tener, named GSU's head coach in April of 2010, has known how to win as both a collegiate player and collegiate coach.

Now in her third season at GSU, the recruiting has shown some pieces are in place for a solid future.

She picked up her 200th career win as a head coach on Dec. 29, 2010 vs. Mississippi Valley State (91-65) and guided GSU to the 500th all-time win in school



history on Jan. 9, 2011 in a win over Hofstra (84-70)

In eight years, she turned the East Carolina women's basket-ball program around, winning 126 games, while earning post-season bids to the NCAA and WNIT tournaments. The Lady Pirates of ECU won the C-USA Tournament in 2007.

Atlanta is a homecoming for Baldwin-Tener as she played her prep ball in Smyrna and her college ball at both Kennesaw State and the University of Georgia. She was an assistant coach at Georgia and a head coach at Life University in Marietta

Those eight years at ECU followed her 2001-02 season as the Atlantic Sun Conference Coach of the Year honor in her only season at Mercer University in Macon.

She first gained notice as the NAIA National Coach of the Year at Life University, where she began that program with a final No. 7 ranking in its first year and produced a team ranked No. 1 in the national polls in her second season (2001). Her assistant coaching career was highlighted by being named the Naismith National Assistant Coach of the Year (1997) while she was in her seventh and final year at the University of Georgia under head coach Andy Landers. Baldwin-Tener enjoyed a successful playing career at both the high school and collegiate levels. At Wills High School (merged with Campbell High) in Smyrna, Ga., she averaged 21 points per contest as a senior and was named the 1985 Georgia Class 4A State Player-of-the-Year.

Baldwin-Tener earned a bachelor's degree from Georgia in 1991 and completed her master's of education in 1997, also at Georgia. She and her husband, Matt, have two children: Luke (8, Feb. 4, 2004) and Samantha (7, Oct. 28, 2005).

GEORGIA STATE-ODU SERIES HISTORY

Old Dominion won last year's games 68-59 and 71-60 to up the series advantage to 13-1 since the Panthers became CAA members for the 2005-06 season.

Georgia State's win came in Atlanta on Jan. 29, 2009 by a 75-62 margin.

A QUICK LOOK AT OLD DOMINION

Located in Norfolk, Va., Old Dominion is under the guidance of second-year head coach Karen Barefoot, a former ODU assistant. Barefoot has almost equalled last year's win total (11-21) in her first year at the helm. She replaced legendary Wendy Larry, who abruptly resigned in May of 2011 after 24 years and 559 wins. ODU won 17 straight conference titles and NCAA bids under Coach Larry.

With seven returning letterwinners and three starters leading the way, ODU has jumped out to its 9-3 start with some solid defense. Much like GSU, ODU is No. 19 in 3-point defense (.240), No. 26 in field goal percentage (.337), No. 39 in scoring (53.4), No. 53 in blocks (4.6) and No. 66 in steals (11.2).

Senior Jackie Cook paces the scoring with her 17.6 average to rank No. 56 in the NCAA, while adding 20 3-point baskets. Sophomore transfer forward Shae Kelley has made a major impact.

ODU is 3-0 on the road this season.

FAST STARTS ARE FIRST KEY TO SUCCESS

Georgia State has started strong from the opening tip to get the tempo the way it likes and get a lead it won't relinquish:

- Fla. A&M 8-0, 16-3, 32-12 and 41-18 at halftime (+23)
- Kennesaw 7-0, 11-2, 16-6, 33-12, 33-15 at halftime (+18)
- Morehead 13-2, 24-8, and 28-17 at halftime (+11)
- Western Carolina 9-2, 20-12, 30-18 and 34-19 half (+15)

In the two road losses at Florida and Belmont, GSU trailed at the half by 12 at UF 11 at Belmont. GSU led Toledo by 2 at the half after 4 ties, but Toledo won by 3.

BALANCE HAS BEEN AN ASSET

Georgia State has used all 10 players who dress out on a regular basis throughout the season.

- All 10 have played 148 or more minutes (148 low-to-309 high) and all averaged more than 13.5 minutes a game (13.5-to-28.1).
- All 10 have scored at least 6 points in a game, 9 have scored 9 or more points in a game.
- Seven have scored in double figures, four different ones have scored 15 or more points in a game.
- Four different players already have had a double-figure rebound game.
 - Eight of the 10 are averaging 5.0 or more points a game.
- Nine of the 10 have 5 or more assists; All 10 have already blocked a shot.

GEORGIA STATE GAME NOTES

PAULK'S SWAT MARKS

Senior center Cody Paulk is working her way toward the top of the GSU all-time list for blocked shots. With 165 she needs 1 to tie the school mark that has stood for 16 years. She has moved into the Top 10 in CAA all-time history. She needs 10 to move into 9th, 11 into 8th.

She is the only GSU player to have two 50-plus block seasons and will be looking for make that three in a row as well.

The Alabama native will be counted on to pick up where she left off down the stretch last season when she averaged 12.7 points per game and 5.8 rebounds over the final nine games of the season.

Paulk had personal-best scoring games of 23 and 21 points, shooting better than 50% in six of those nine games.

She is a Capital One CoSIDA Acaemica All-District honoree as a chemistry major and math minor.

Junior Kendra Long has a great name for being an outstanding three-point shooter.

In her first two years at GSU, she has become the only player in school history with two 50 or more three-point baskets made seasons.

Her 129 made has already moved her into third place on the school's all-time list.

The Atlanta native needs 25 more to tie the existing school career mark set just five years ago.

Long has made five three-point shots in a game four times and is obviously a marked target for opposing defenses.

RUGGED PREP MAY HELP

GSU played Georgia (12-1) and Auburn (11-2) in the closed exhibition season. They played a third SEC team (Florida, 11-3) in regular season and just played Toledo (12-1).

In the RPI, Toledo is No. 20, Georgia No. 22, Florida No. 28 and Auburn No. 87, so those four teams gave the young Panthers some stronger competition for improvement.

GSU battled Toledo to a 46-43 loss after leading half the game. The Panthers stayed with the Gators for most of the first half before foul trouble caught up.

"CENTERS" OF ATTENTION

GSU's rotates its two centers, Cody Paulk and Maryam Dogo.

Paulk averages 9.0 points and 8.3 rebounds on the season; Dogo 6.3 points and 6.4 rebounds to make it a combined 15.3 points and 14.7 rebounds from that one center position. They've combined for 42 blocked shots in the 11 games.

DIVISION-1 TRANSFERS ADDED

GSU has added a pair of Division I transfers who are practicing with the team this season to play next season. Both have all-conference potential and are major additions.

KYRA CROSBY was a starter last year at Alabama after having been the NJCAA Player of the Year at Gulf Coast Community College. Crosby started 15 games last year in the SEC at Alabama, averaging 9.1 points and 4.3 rebounds. She came back from injury to play in all 16 SEC games and had 13 double-figure scoring games for the Crimson Tide. Crosby averaged 19.5 points and 8.5 rebounds at Gulf Coast CC on a 35-1 team that won the national title.

ALISHA ANDREWS was a two-time All-CAA point guard at UNCW. She was also a two-time All-Defensive Team honoree.

Andrews led UNCW in scoring (11.9), as well as assists and steals. She made 132 three-point baskets in her two seasons with UNCW.

The quick point guard was the catalyst on their 24- and 20-win WNIT teams, producing 40 career double-figure scoring games. She had been the CAA Rookie of the Year.

In the second half, GSU built the lead to 20 points quickly at 48-28 and had the largest lead of the night of 24 points at 52-28 with 16:24 to go.

GSU shot 43 percent for the game, after starting out making 10 of its first 19 shots. GSU finished with a 43-41 rebounding advantage and got 10 points off second-chance offensive rebounds.

GSU got 50 minutes of support from the five bench players in this evening's opener. The Panthers finished with a 43-41 rebound advantage.

Kayla Nolan led GSU with 13 points, while Kendra Long netted 11 points, despite making just 5-of-18 shots. Cody Paulk led with 12 rebounds and also added nine points.

Florida (2-0) got 19 points from All-SEC forward Jennifer George in her first game of the season, while guard Jaterra Bonds added 17 more points.

Georgia State trailed 37-25 at halftime, with Florida breaking from a 10-10 tie at 12:06 to a 25-12 advantage at 7:07 with a 15-2 run. GSU attempted 41 shots to the Gators' 29, but made just 11 for a 26.8 shooting percentage. Hustling GSU held a 30-20 rebound first half rebound advantage.

The game was 8-8 after the first seven minutes and 10-10 thru eight minutes. The Panthers trailed 16-12 after 11 minutes against the No. 24 RPI Gators.

Center Cody Paulk scored 18 points, grabbed 12 rebounds and blocked 6 shots to lead GSU to a 73-48 victory over Georgia Southern in the opening game of Georgia State Thanksgiving Tournament.

GSU will now advance to play Florida A&M in the championship game at 4 p.m. on Saturday. Georgia Southern will play Kent State in the consolation game at 2 p.m. Saturday. Florida A&M came from behind at halftime to defeat Kent State, 70-56.

Georgia State (3-1) used its aggressive defense to open a quick 14-4 lead and a 22-7 advantage through the game's first 11 minutes. GSU led 34-18 at halftime by holding visiting Georgia Southern to 14.3 percent shooting (4-of-28). Georgia State finished by holding the Eagles to just 34.2 percent for the game (15-of-62).

"I think our defensive pressure affected them early on and was a big key in today's win," coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener said. "We rushed them into some bad shots and that helped us get the job done on defense today."

Georgia State's defense has held all three opponents to 50 points or fewer in starting the season 3-1. Today, GSU forced 15 turnovers and blocked 10 shots.

Offensively, GSU had three players in double figures, led by Paulk's 18 on 8-of-12 shooting in her 22 minutes. Sophomore guard Kayla Nolan added 15 points in her 23 minutes and freshman guard Ashlee Cole contributed 13 more points in her 22 minutes. The Panthers shot 47 percent for the game.

Georgia State dominated the boards with a 52-37 rebound advantage, paced by Paulk's 12 rebounds and Maryam Dogo's 11 caroms. Georgia State's bench scored 41 of the 73 points today. "We have extra firepower off the bench no matter who starts or who comes in later. Everyone is contributing when they are in the game."

"We are not depending on one person to lead us in scoring this year and we have plenty of firepower." Baldwin-Tener added. "Paulk was solid on defense and altered a lot of their shot selection today. Offensively, she has the range to shoot those mid-range jumpers as well as drive to the rim."

Georgia State improved to 4-1 and won its the GSU Thanksgiving Tournament with a 77-58 win over Florida A&M on Saturday afternoon. In the earlier consolation game, Georgia Southern defeated Kent State, 71-47.

The script for GSU was the same as in all four wins, pounce quickly with aggressive defense to build a double-digit lead. The host Panthers struck with vengeance, taking an 8-0 lead in two and a half minutes and making it 16-3 through the first seven minutes. GSU never let up until it had a 41-18 halftime cushion by holding the Rattlers to 18 percent first half shooting.

Four players scored in double figures, led by sophomore forward Maryam Dogo's 16 points, 11 rebounds and two blocked shots coming off the bench. Sophomore guard Kendra Long netted 13 points, grabbed seven rebounds, made four assists and had three steals. Senior center Cody Paulk added 12 more points to go with seven rebounds and three blocked shots. Sophomore point guard Ashley Watson contributed 12 points and seven assists.

Florida A&M was led by Jasmine Grice, who scored 30 points by making 13 of her 30 shots with 21 of those point coming in the second half.

GSU held Florida A&M to 32 percent shooting for the game, while dominating the Rattlers on the boards with a 55-32 rebound advantage that included 20 offensive caroms. The host Panthers were effective from the free throw line, making 21 of their 25 shots for an 84 percent rate.

"Our first-half defense was solid and the key to our win today," head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener noted. "This was a team win with the defense sparking the quick start and the offense being aggressive to get second-chance baskets if we needed."

Cody Paulk was named the Thanksgiving Tournament Most Valuable Player with 40 points, 19 rebounds and nine blocked shots in the two games. Joining her on the All-Tournament team were teammates Maryam Dogo and Kendra Long, along with Florida A&M's Jasmine Grice, Georgia Southern's Mimi DuBose and Kent State's Melanee Stubbs.

Georgia State held Kennesaw State to 27 percent shooting in carving out a fourth straight win, 63-42, Sunday afternoon.

State started with a 7-0 lead and didn't allow KSU its first basket until 13:26 in the first half and was never seriously threatened. GSU led 16-6 in allowing only three baskets after 12 minutes of play. KSU had a six-point surge to close to 20-12 at 4:43, but GSU went on a decisive 13-0 run to make it 33-12 with one minute left in the first half. A trey by KSU made it 33-15 at halftime.

In the second half, the Panthers built the lead into the twenty-point range and held a 47-27 advantage at 10:58 when KSU made its final try to narrow it to 14 points at 47-33 with 8:52. GSU scored six straight to push it back to 20 points at 53-33 with 6:39. The host Panthers built the largest lead of 27 points at 63-36 with 1:45.

GSU's defense, No. 18 in the nation in field goal defense (31.8) dropped that even lower with today's 15-of-55 stops at the 27.3 rate. Outside the arc, GSU is No. 3 in the nation at 15.9 percent and KSU managed just 16.7 percent today on 2 of 12.

Georgia State forced 19 Kennesaw turnovers, made 10 steals and blocked four shots. GSU held a 38-35 rebound advantage.

For the winners, Cody Paulk had 11 points, 7 rebounds and two blocked shots, Kayla Nolan had 11 points and three steals, while Kendra Long added 10 more points to lead GSU. Tiffany Anderson had eight rebounds to lead the team today and freshman Morgan Jackson had a personal-best sven rebounds coming off the bench.

Kennesaw got 12 points and nine rebounds from Sametria Gideon as she closed with a pair of layups in the closing minute to get into double figures.

Georgia State shot 50.8 percent on offense, making 30 of its 59 shots, including 57.7 percent in the first half. GSU pounded the ball inside with 42 points scored in the paint.

"We tried to be intense and aggressive, forcing them to take hurried or bad shots and for the most part were pretty effective," coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener said.

Georgia State, who led the nation in 3-point field goal defense allowing 16 percent, ran into a red-hot Belmont team that made 9-of-15 3-pointers (60 percent). That was a major difference in Belmont's 85-62 win in a noon game.

The game turned at the 14-minute mark. Belmont was holding a 48-45 lead when whistles started blowing frequently. GSU had four personals in about 50 seconds, plus a pair of technicals in a five-minute span on Coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener that led to her ejection. That 48-45 lead grews to 62-45 at 9:22 with Molly Ernst hitting three consecutive three-point baskets for Belmont in its 17-0 five-minute run.

An 11-day layoff for finals showed early for GSU as their pressure defense did not force a Belmont turnover until 13 minutes into the game. The Panthers, who came into the game shooting 43.3 percent, hit just 39.6 percent today. Ernest, who averaged 8 points a game coming in, scored 23 today with 7-of-10 three-point baskets today.

The loss ends Georgia State's four-game winning streak. The win for Belmont followed its win over Indiana and ran its winning streak to three games.

Georgia State got 13 points and six rebounds from sophomore guard Kayla Nolan. Maryam Dogo added 10 points and eight rebounds off the bench, while junior guard Kendra Long added 10 more points.

The Panthers started with a 4-0 lead and the game was tied at 14-14 after seven minutes. A Belmont 12-0 scoring run gave the Bruins a 26-14 lead at 8:41. GSU closed to 37-31, but Belmont took a 42-31 lead into halftime.

In the second half, GSU came out stronger on defense and outscored Belmont 14-4 to make it 48-45 when the whistles helped Belmont gain a lot more momentum.

The game included 39 fouls, plus two technicals, with 53 free throw attempts combined. But, for all the calls, it was probably the non-calls that had Coach Baldwin-Tener agitated the most in her rare ejection during her 14-year career.

Georgia State held a 35-34 rebound advantage, but forced just 11 turnovers, almost half its normal average. GSU had eight steals and four blocked shots.

GEORGIA STATE 61, MOREHEAD STATE 47

Kayla Nolan notched her second career double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds to lead a balanced effort as Georgia State defeated Morehead State, 61-47, on Sunday

Tiffany Anderson contributed 11 points and six rebounds for the Panthers, who improved to 6-2 on the season. Cody Paulk added nine points, seven boards, three steals and two blocked shots for GSU.

"Tiffany Anderson really showed a lot of leadership today," said GSU assistant coach Adrienne Shuler. "She was aggressive, offensively and on the boards, and that generated a lot of second and third opportunities. When she plays like that, she is huge for us."

Shuler served as head coach for this game with GSU head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener serving a one-game suspension, per Colonial Athletic Association policy, after she received two technical fouls in the Panthers' last game.

Georgia State used aggressive defense to force 21 Morehead State turnovers and limit the Eagles to 28 percent shooting from the field, including just 6-for-36 from three-point range. The Panthers also held the advantage on the boards, 50-37.

GSU led 28-18 at the half after holding the Eagles to just 6-for-29 shooting from the field and forcing 16 MSU turnovers. The Panthers led 24-8 with seven minutes to play in the first half before allowing Morehead State to close the gap with a 9-4 run.

Early in the second half, Morehead State pulled within six points at 33-27, but Georgia State quickly responded with eight straight points in less than a minute to reestablish a 14-point lead. The run was fueled by back-to-back steals in the back-court by Kendra Long and Miranda Smith that produced easy layups. The Panthers maintained their double-digit advantage the rest of the way.

Terrice Robinson led Morehead State with 10 points, and Casey Ryans added nine points and rebounds but the Eagles fell to 1-9

The Panthers improved to 5-0 at home by holding a fifth team under 30% shooting and a fifth team under 50 points scored on the season.

GEORGIA STATE 64, WESTERN CAROLINA 45

Georgia State improved to 6-0 at home and 7-2 overall with a 64-45 win over Western Carolina on Friday evening.

As the storylines for its seven wins have all gone this year, Georgia State built a big double-digit halftime lead with its good defense and coasted on to the victory. Tonight, GSU opened a 34-19 halftime lead and never looked back.

"When you hold a team to 19 points in the first half, you certainly put yourself in a position to go get a win," head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener noted. "Having all 10 players contribute significantly helps us in all facets of the wins. But you can win with good defense, whether it is at the start of a game or making the key stop in the last 30 seconds of a game, so defense has always been a point of emphasis for us."

In shutting down the Catamounts in the first half, GSU forced 16 turnovers, made 10 steals, blocked 3 shots and held WCU to 28% in the opening half. The Panthers went on to finish with 20 forced turnovers, 12 steals, 5 blocks and allowed WCU to convert on just 31.6% of its shots, 23.1% outside the 3-point arc.

Junior guard Kendra Long led GSU's scoring with 13 points, buoyed by 3-of-4 baskets outside the 3-point line. Freshman forward Morgan Jackson came off the bench to add nine points and grab five rebounds in 20 minutes. Senior center Cody Paulk was working towards a double-double with eight points and eight rebounds in her 25 minutes.

Western Carolina had its only lead of the night on the first basket of the game and then Georgia State went on a 9-0 run to take the 9-2 lead at 15:30. At the midway point of the first half it was 17-8 as the Panthers held the Catamounts to single digits in those first 10 minutes. The Panthers got the first double-digit lead of the game at 30-18 with 2:00 to go on a trey by Long. GSU took the 34-19 lead into the halftime intermission. The lead remained in double figures the rest of the way.

In the second half, the teams traded baskets for the first nine minutes, with GSU still holding the 15-point lead at 44-29 with 11 minutes to play. A quick 5-0 run by Long upped GSU's margin to 49-31 with nine minutes to play and the Panthers coasted in with the victory.

Georgia State opened its Holiday & Hoops Tournament with a 76-60 win over Mississippi Valley State Saturday afternoon.

Host GSU ran its home court record to a perfect 7-0 this season and overall record to 8-2 with today's tournament win. GSU advances to the championship game Sunday at 4 p.m. against Toledo, while MVSU will play in the consolation game at 2 p.m. against Charlotte. Toledo is No. 19 in the national RPI.

Four Panthers scored in double figures, topped by Tiffany Anderson and Kendra Long with 12 points each. Anderson had a double-double with 12 points, 11 rebounds, while adding five assists and three steals.

GSU started the game with a 13-0 run over the first four minutes before MVSU finally scored at 15:25. The host Panthers led 31-11 with five minutes to go in the half. GSU led 47-22 at the half. The Panthers built the lead to as large as 32 points, 58-26, before MVSU kept chipping away to the finish.

GSU's bench logged 90 minutes and the starters 110 minutes as Coach Baldwin-Tener used everybody extensively.

Georgia State held a 44-28 rebound advantage, while the Panther defense forced 21 turnovers and made 11 steals. GSU made 7-of-15 three-point baskets today, including 5-of-9 in the first half.

"We have got to have the same intensity whether we are up 30 points or down 30 points and we didn't have that all 40 minutes today," Coach Baldwin-Tener said. "I am glad to win by double figures, but I didn't like the way we finished in the second half."

"Tiffany Anderson had a good game and am proud of her leadership," Baldwin-Tener said. "She made the extra pass, she hit the boards, the shot the ball well and led the team when she was in the game."

"Our aggressive defense again got us started strong, but we tried other defenses with the young kids and we didn't figure those defenses out very quickly," Baldwin-Tener added. "We were too sloppy on both ends in the final 10 minutes."

The Panthers have led in double figures at halftime in all eight wins. The 25-point first half margin topped the 23-point lead against Florida A&M earlier this season.

Toledo (12-1) came from behind to defeat Georgia State, 46-43, to win the Holiday & Hoops Tournament.

GSU led from the 4-minute mark in the first half and didn't lose the lead until 8:06 left in the game, a span of 16 minutes with the upper hand. With the score tied at 15 in the first half, GSU got the lead, 17-15, and then led 22-20 at halftime. GSU built its lead to seven at 27-20 and still led by six at 36-30 with 10:48 to play. When Ashlee Cole hit a jumper with 8:33 to make it 38-35, that would be GSU's final basket until 1:50. That basket at 1:50 brought GSU back to within 42-40.

The win was Toledo's 11th consecutive (No. 14 Dayton).

The physical game was won at the free throw line as Toledo converted 11-of-16 charity tosses to just 2-of-6 for the home Panthers. GSU suffered with three players having four fouls, including Tiffany Anderson, who had three in the first half as she tried to follow yesterday's double-double game, but spent more time on the bench, playing just six minutes of the first half. Anderson did not score today.

Georgia State, ranked in the top 25 in many defensive categories, held Toledo, who is No. 19 in national RPI rankings in check for most of the game. GSU limited Toledo to just 25.8% field goals (16-of-62), to just 3-of-15 (20%) outside the arc, while making 8 steals and blocking 7 shots against the bigger and more physical Rockets.

But, GSU struggled itself against Toledo's tough defense. GSU shot just 19-of-60 (31.7%) and had 17 turnovers. Toledo ended up with a 47-43 rebound advantage.

Nolan had a double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds. Cody Paulk tied her personal best with six blocked shots to move into the Top 10 in CAA history with 165 career blocks. Paulk is one shy of the GSU school career record.

After Toledo jumped out to a 5-0 lead, GSU came right back to tie the game at 9-9. The score was tied three more times at 11, 13 and 15 before Georgia State got the lead it would maintain until the closing minutes.

The Holiday & Hoops All-Tournament team included Charlotte's Hillary Sigmon and Jennifer Halley, Georgia State's Tiffany Anderson and Cody Paulk, along with Toledo's Yolanda Richarson. Toledo's Zangoura was Tournament MVP.
